## DEH Launches New Radio Campaign

Last Wednesday (1 May 2019), the Department of Environmental Health (DEH) began to intensify its ongoing public education program aimed at increasing residents' awareness about the importance of adequately packaging and handling household garbage, through a new radio campaign.

The three-month campaign, with the core message of 'Keep your Neighbourhood Clean,' includes public service announcements on Radio Cayman, Z99 FM and Irie 98.9; and targets households.

"We can only achieve a smooth garbage collection process through public

education," says DEH Acting Director Richard Simms. "This will equip residents with the necessary tools to ensure that they practice proper waste packaging and handling techniques."

Additionally, DEH officials will make the rounds at local media houses and use informational flyers, video and social media to promote an awareness of these issues and to foster collaboration throughout this campaign.

# Airport Airfield Upgrade Project to Commence this Summer

The Cayman Islands Airports Authority (CIAA), which owns and operates the Owen Roberts International Airport (ORIA) and the Charles Kirkconnell International Airport (CKIA), is ramping up to begin works on the airfield upgrade project this summer as part of the next phase of continued improvements in operations and safety standards at the airport.

The airfield upgrade project consists of five sub-projects, namely:

- Milling and Re-Paving of the existing Runway surface
- Runway Extension of 124 meters to the west of threshold 08
- Filling of the ponds within the airfield perimeter
- Establishing a robust airfield perimeter road
- Expanding the International Ramp in an easterly direction to accommodate either a single CODE E hardstand, or two CODE C hardstands

“With the transition into the new Owen Roberts International Airport terminal nearing full completion, despite the many challenges we faced with operations during all of the construction phases, we now turn our focus to implementing the ORIA airfield upgrades,” said CIAA CEO Mr. Albert Anderson. “The project has progressed past the 100% design phase and is currently into the tendering phase and bid evaluations, followed thereafter with contract award.”

Mr. Anderson explained that careful planning and consideration have been given to completing the runway works in a timely, safe manner to provide the highest quality end product.

“With only one runway serving ORIA, the options were to complete the runway works at night over some 20 weeks, or to have closures during low traffic days and completed in a shorter timeframe and to a higher quality,” he said. “Ultimately, the decision was made to have closures during the day in order to meet the key objectives of the Airport and its Airline partners. We are grateful for the airlines’ full support of this project, which will take approximately eight weeks to complete.”

Eight consecutive runway closures are planned for September and October, occurring every Monday evening at 10:00 p.m. local time (after the last flight movement of the day) and reopening the following Wednesday at 6:00 a.m. local time (before the first flight movement of the day), thus enabling a continuous period of 31 hours of work each week. Contingencies will be in place for emergency flight operations during these closures. All other sub projects will fall outside of the runway closures and will have limited effect on arrivals/departures at ORIA.

The dates for the scheduled ORIA runway closures are as follows:

- Closure 1: Monday, 2 September 10:00 p.m. – Wednesday, 4 September 6:00 a.m.
- Closure 2: Monday, 9 September 10:00 p.m. – Wednesday, 11 September 6:00 a.m.
- Closure 3 Monday, 16 September 10:00 p.m. Wednesday, 18 September 6:00 a.m.




- Closure 4: Monday, 23 September 10:00 p.m. – Wednesday, 25 September 6:00 a.m.
- Closure 5: Monday, 30 September 10:00 p.m. – Wednesday, 2 October 6:00 a.m.
- Closure 6: Monday, 7 October 10:00 p.m. – Wednesday, 9 October 6:00 a.m.
- Closure 7: Monday, 14 October 10:00 p.m. – Wednesday, 16 October 6:00 a.m.
- Closure 8: Monday, 21 October 10:00 p.m. – Wednesday, 23 October 6:00 a.m.

These scheduled runway closure dates have been selected due to historical data, which identifies this eight-week period as having the least demand for air carrier service at ORIA. Any unforeseen project delays due to inclement weather or other complications beyond

the control of the CIAA that could otherwise negate the ability to complete the runway surface work during any of the above-mentioned dates will not result in further closures of the ORIA runway.

Furthermore, any additional time needed to complete the runway rehabilitation will occur during the periods at night, commencing after the last scheduled air carrier service in/out of ORIA and re-open the following day prior to the first scheduled air carrier service in/out of ORIA.

“We are very grateful for the traveling public’s ongoing cooperation as we work to improve the infrastructure at ORIA, and in particular for their support of this initiative to reduce the timeframe and increase the safety of this necessary runway pavement work,” said Mr. Anderson. 🌐

ronment into action by shipping used Yello directories to our sustainability partner GreenFiber.

**FUN FACT: In 2018, Yello collected over 13,000 used directories, that translated into GreenFiber insulation for approximately 10 homes! Goal in 2019, 15 homes!**

### SO HOW DOES YELLO DO IT?

#### Step One: Education and Awareness

Yello shares the benefits of recycling with primary schools and encourages schools, students and parents to participate in the Yello2Green School Challenge. In addition, Yello places Yello2Green recycling bins at Foster's IGA and Hurley's.

#### Step Two: Packaging and Shipping

Yello palletizes the books and ships to GreenFiber's Tampa facility, which is closest to Cayman Islands. "It's a costly endeavor, but absolutely worth the investment" says Marketing Manager, Melanie Shambaugh.

#### Step Three: Recycling at GreenFiber

GreenFiber makes its home insulation from blends of various paper products in order to accommodate different housing needs. Directories are blended with cardboard, newspapers, shredded papers, confidential documents, etc. The manufacturing process consists of shredding and fiberizing the paper back to original fibers before being treated with natural chemicals to make it fire retardant and pest resistant. Then it's packaged for retail! Green Fiber supplies insulation to home improvement stores including Home Depot and Lowes along with big builders who are working on developments. They also sell to private homeowners who choose DIY!

#### Yello2Green School Challenge

Primary schools compete in a friendly challenge to win prizes. The school that collects the most directories, per student body, wins! Prizes include \$1,500 for 1st Place, \$1000 for 2nd Place and \$700 for 3rd Place. In addition, each participat-

ing primary school will reward the class that collects the most directories with a celebratory Subway sandwich party. In addition, the student to collect the most directories at each school, will win a \$100 gift certificate for school supplies. To date, we have nine primary schools participating in Grand Cayman and three schools in Cayman Brac.

# The Importance of Understanding Blood Pressure

## World Hypertension Day 2019 reminds us to 'Know Your Numbers'

Hypertension, or high blood pressure, is considered a leading risk factor for disease on a global level. Often called the "silent killer," many individuals may not be aware that anything is wrong while the damage is occurring within the body. Chronic hypertension can potentially lead to serious conditions like stroke, heart attack, heart failure, or kidney disease. For World Hypertension Day 2019, celebrated internationally on May 17, the theme is "Know Your Numbers" - raising awareness about the importance of knowing what your blood pressure measurement is.

Blood pressure is the measurement of the pressure or force of blood pushing against blood vessel walls. The following is a breakdown by Cleveland Clinic of blood pressure variations and what each variation indicates:

- Normal Blood Pressure:
  - \* Systolic mm Hg (upper number): less than 120
  - \* and Diastolic mm Hg (lower number): less than 80
- Elevated Blood Pressure:
  - \* Systolic mm Hg (upper number): 120 - 129
  - \* or Diastolic mm Hg (lower number): less than 80
- Hypertension - Stage 1:
  - \* Systolic mm Hg (upper number): 130 - 139
  - \* or Diastolic mm Hg (lower number): 80 - 89
- Hypertension - Stage 2:
  - \* Systolic mm Hg (upper number): 140 or higher
  - \* or Diastolic mm Hg (lower number): 90 or higher

The goal of hypertension treatment is to lower harmful high blood pressures and protect important organs, such as the brain, heart, and kidneys. Studies have associated successful treatment for hypertension with reductions in stroke (reduced an average of 35 percent to 40 percent), heart attack (20 percent to 25 percent), and heart failure (more than 50 percent).

Hypertension heightens the risk of developing a serious condition, like the ones mentioned above and others, if untreated. According to the American Heart Association, strokes are 4 to 6 times more likely to occur in people with high blood pressure and 6 times more likely for those with heart disease. Approximately 10 million people die annually globally because of raised/elevated blood pressure, according to the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO).

"We recognize high blood pressure is extremely prevalent in Cayman, and one of the leading causes of heart disease, so we support efforts such as these to get closer to our goal of eradicating cardiovascular disease," says Dr Bella Beraha, Vice Chairperson for the Cayman Heart Fund.

"Hypertension can cause serious damage to arteries throughout the body, causing them to burst or clog more easily," says Dr David Lopez, MD at Cleveland Clinic Florida, which is part of the Cleveland Clinic health system based in Ohio - a leader in Cardiology and Heart Surgery for the last 24 years. "A stroke occurs when a blood vessel to the brain is either blocked by a clot (ischemic) or bursts (hemorrhagic). Since the brain controls one's movements and thoughts, it can affect a person's ability to think, move and function, and also a person's speech, memory and vision."

It is important to discuss an individual's normal target blood pressure with their doctor and conduct regular blood pressure checks at home. Taking blood pressure management medications as a doctor prescribes can keep blood pressure in check. People with family members who have high blood pressure, cardiovascular disease, or diabetes are at a higher risk of developing hypertension, as well as certain ethnic groups. Inactivity, poor diet, excessive alcohol consumption or smoking are also risk factors.

If you are concerned about your own heart health or that of family members,



Cayman Heart Fund, a local non-profit organization, can assist you with more information and initial screening as part of their preventative programs.

"One of the core missions of the Cayman Heart Fund is to educate the public in hopes to decrease cardiovascular disease. We do this through delivering preventative programs, providing free health screenings and more," says Dr Beraha.

Other recommendations include practicing stress reduction techniques such as meditation, yoga, sleeping well, and breathing deeply. Aerobic activities such as walking, biking, or swimming can also help control and reduce hypertension. It is recommended to start slowly and increase activity grad-

ually. Activity can be done in 10-minute sessions to add up to 30-45 minutes total.

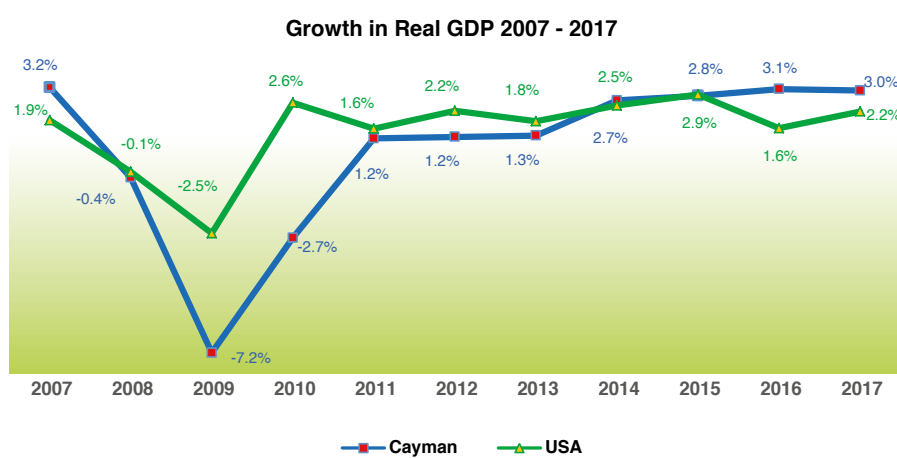

## Update on the Status of Dogs Taken from Prospect Home

As part of its ongoing efforts to care for and address the medical conditions of the dogs seized last week, the Department of Agriculture (DOA) on Tuesday May 14, invited the senior veterinarians from the three longest established Veterinary practices, Cayman Animal Hospital, Island Veterinary services and The Vet Clinic, to consult with the DOA's veterinary staff on the veterinary care of these animals. The veterinarians met with the DOA's team at the Animal Rescue Shelter on Wednesday afternoon.

"The DOA is grateful to the local private veterinarians, Drs. Benjamin, Dr. Bush and Dr. Watler, for meeting with us to determine the best course of action for the dogs," said Brian Crichlow Assistant Director, DOA. "These veterinarians brought a wealth of knowledge and years of experience in small animal veterinary care in the Cayman Islands to our discussion, helping to ensure that the dogs in the Department's care are receiving the best possible veterinary care under challenging circumstances."

The first and most pressing matter that the veterinarians addressed is the presence of Parvovirus among the animals that were taken. The first case of Parvovirus was confirmed last Thursday evening and immediate measures were put in place to address the disease, including separating animals based on their at-risk factors and introducing rigorous sanitation protocols. Regrettably to date three of the dogs have succumbed to the disease. The veterinary team reviewed and concurred with the protocols implemented, and agreed that given the contagious nature of Parvovirus, it is in the best interest of the general canine population of the Cayman Islands that the DOA shelter should continue to be quarantined with no dogs going in or out until the threat from the Parvovirus is resolved.

Additionally the team of veterinarians discussed and agreed on the appropriate course of action for addressing the general health and medical needs of the

dogs as well as the specific needs of those dogs with more serious and chronic medical challenges. Care of these animals will have to follow a gradual approach to address the various medical issues the dogs have, as the poor state of the dogs' general health rules out more aggressive medical treatment. On a positive note, the veterinarians who have been attending to these animals from the beginning report significant improvement in the overall health and condition of the dogs since arriving to the shelter. The private veterinarians who were seeing the dogs for the first time expressed that they were in better condition than they expected them to be, based on what they had seen in the media.

The DOA has been receiving numerous requests and offers to adopt these dogs. Although the ultimate goal remains to find forever homes for these animals, adoptions cannot be initiated until the Parvovirus outbreak has been successfully resolved and the quarantine is lifted. This could take several weeks. Eventual decisions about adoption will depend on the overall health of the dogs and when they can undergo spaying and neutering, which is required prior to any final adoptions. The DOA will continue to work closely with the private veterinary clinics as it moves through this process.

"The DOA is very appreciative of the assistance and support received from the private veterinary clinics, not only in terms of the time and advice given by the veterinarians, but also for the very kind donations of certain needed services, veterinary drugs and medical supplies," said Mr. Crichlow. "The DOA's veterinary services are targeted exclusively to large animal / livestock veterinary services, and as such we do not stock some of the particular drugs or supplies used primarily in small animal care. Their donations have been a big help."

"The improvement of these dogs to date is testimony to the hard work and dedication of the team at the DOA and the private vets who have been assisting us from the beginning. I particular I would like to acknowledge



the efforts of DOA's Veterinary Officer Dr. Dorman, and Drs. Alfred and Olivia Benjamin, the Senior Animal Welfare Officer and the Department's two Animal Control Officers, who have all gone above and beyond to manage this situation," continued Mr. Crichlow.

Managing the health needs of this number of animals has demanded the full resources and time of the DOA's team, especially during this initial quarantine phase. Accordingly, the DOA has had to close the Animal Rescue shelter and suspend normal operations, including the collection of strays and trapping of feral chickens. The collection of strays can not resume until the quarantine on the shelter has been lifted and space is again available. The DOA is exploring alternatives for assisting the public with the control of feral chickens and will provide an update shortly.

The Department appreciates the offers of assistance received by the various Animal Charities and the general public, and is actively looking at ways that these charities and the public may be able to assist with the care of these dogs. On the veterinarian's advice and once the logistics have been worked out, the DOA will provide additional information on what and how help can be provided and accepted.

# Barbados PM Tightlipped on Sale of Country's Majority Shares in LIAT

As LIAT shareholder governments struggle to come up with a viable solution to keep the island-hopping carrier in the skies, Prime Minister Mia Mottley is remaining tight-lipped on the talks while a fellow shareholder suggests Barbados wants to offload its majority stake.

Mottley stopped short of saying whether Government would dispose of its 49 per cent interest in the cash-strapped carrier, declaring instead that she will not be having any discussions in the public domain.

She would only say that she was focused on ensuring reliable and affordable regional transport.

The Prime Minister was responding to a question during the annual luncheon of the Barbados Employers' Confederation (BEC) at the Lloyd Erskine Sandiford Centre yesterday.

Mottley said: "Let's just say we agree on the mission, and the mission is that there must always be reliable affordable access for travel in the region as there must be nationally. And I can assure you and the country that we are working on this every day."

"But you also have to take the reality of an existence as you find it and then determine whether the modality that

you have is the best mechanism by which to deliver on that objective."

Her comments come amid speculation that Bridgetown intends to give up its shares so it could start its own airline. It's been a week since fellow shareholder, the government of Antigua and Barbuda, confirmed that it had officially submitted a document to authorities in Barbados indicating interest in buying its shares.

According to reports out of St John's, following a recent meeting of the airline's shareholder governments at which Mottley was not present, Prime Minister Gaston Browne said a proposal was submitted to the Barbados Government on May 7, and he was anticipating a favourable response.

The Barbados representative reportedly indicated that the proposal would be examined.

While sources have indicated that the Barbados Government was willing to sell its shares, responding to the question for an update on regional transport and issues relating to LIAT today, Mottley said she would speak on the matter at an "appropriate time", suggesting that discussions were at a delicate stage.

"I have been in public life long enough to know that when discussions are at a

sensitive stage that the worst thing you can do is up the ante by trying to have some kind of public expression that may well lead to hardened positions and an inability for people to negotiate in good faith," she said.

"Suffice it to say that the government of Barbados, at the appropriate time, when discussions are concluded with stakeholders at all levels, will speak to the country."

"Whatever means we choose, whether existing or other, there will be a commitment to providing affordable, reliable air travel between those in the Caribbean because without that we accept that there will be a serious constraints on our people. But there are multiple ways of being able to do that in the context within which we operate."

Mottley added: "Similarly, we are not the only player so that we also have to be mindful of that. Fortunately, the feminine genes in me do not require of me, the need to beat chest in public."

In addition to Barbados and Antigua and Barbuda where the airline is based, the other major shareholding governments are St Vincent and the Grenadines and Dominica. After years of coaxing, Grenada last week announced that it was officially a shareholder.

The four territories together make up just over 94 per cent shareholding interest.

The remaining shareholders are made up of private companies, other Caribbean governments and employees.

LIAT and other officials have been engaged in back-to-back meetings trying to find a solution to keep the airline afloat, while exploring the possibility of a minimum guarantee scheme, which would see countries benefiting from the airline services contributing financially.

LIAT currently employs over 600 people and operates 491 flights weekly across 15 destinations. (*Barbados Today*) 🌐

# Legislation Passed to Make it Easier to Do Business in Guyana

People and businesses involved in trade and transport can expect an improved "ease of doing business" in Guyana.

This follows yesterday's passage of the Customs and Trade Single Window System Bill 2019 which provides for a single submission of documents electronically for fees, levies, duties, and taxes due to the government on goods which are imported or exported.

Finance Minister Winston Jordan who presented the Bill in the National Assembly, explained that the legislation allows parties involved in trade and transport to lodge standardized information and document with a single-entry point to fulfil all import, export and transit-related regulatory requirements.

There are currently 20 ministries and departments that deal with import and export in Guyana. The majority of these agencies are paper-driven and the system is costly and time-consuming.

"International trade requires [the provision of information] and documents through customs and other regulatory agencies in compliance with laws and regulations...In Guyana, information is submitted and processed numerous times through Customs and other entities, be it on paper, automated or both," Jordan noted.

He said while there was an attempt to implement the new system under the former administration, no progress was made up to 2015.

Recognizing the importance of such legislation, Jordan said, the coalition government resuscitated the project when it took office.

To date, the government has been able to secure a loan of US\$6 million to aid the implementation of the Single-Window System.

The project will be implemented in phases. Phase One deals with modernizing the regulatory

environment. The Cabinet also approved the establishment of a steering committee comprising the main border regulatory agencies. The committee is chaired by the Guyana Revenue Authority (GRA) and the Ministry of Business.

The GRA will be responsible for the management of the system and will define the expected roles, responsibilities and obligations of all agencies that will be involved in providing legal and technical assistance with its creation and operation.

The agency will have to adopt relevant internationally accepted standards, procedures, documents, technical details and formalities for the effective implementation of the single-window system.

Processes and technical aspects of the system will conform to the principles of transparency in relations to procedures being undertaken through the system; security of trade data information exchange, simplicity and accessibility, confidentiality and privacy, reality, trust and consistency and efficiency. 🌐

# Anguilla Has A Record-Breaking Winter Season

Anguilla has recorded its best winter season in over 27 years. The island logged yet another record-breaking month in March, with 11,940 tourist stayover arrivals. This marks not only the highest March in history, but also the highest monthly total in the history of Anguilla's tourism industry.

The figure represents a 29.16 per cent increase over the same period in 2017, and a 22.55 per cent increase over March 2016, the month that until now held the record for the most tourist arrivals.

April continued this winning streak, as the 9,790 arrivals recorded is the largest number of tourist arrivals for any month of April dating back as far as 1993. The first quarter tourist arrivals (January to March 2019) at 30,135, was the highest recorded since the Anguilla Tourist Board began tracking arrivals.

During the first four months of the year, just under 40,000 guests spent one or more nights on Anguilla. The island has to date attracted almost 50 per cent of the total tourist arrivals for 2016, the island's best year to date for tourist arrivals.

"Let us celebrate but not become complacent," said Donna Banks, Chairperson of the Anguilla Tourist Board. "There is still much work to be done; our goal remains a 20 per cent increase in tourist arrivals over 2016. We appreciate and value the continued support and cooperation of all our stakeholders, and the people of Anguilla, in helping us to achieve these significant milestones for our industry." 🌐

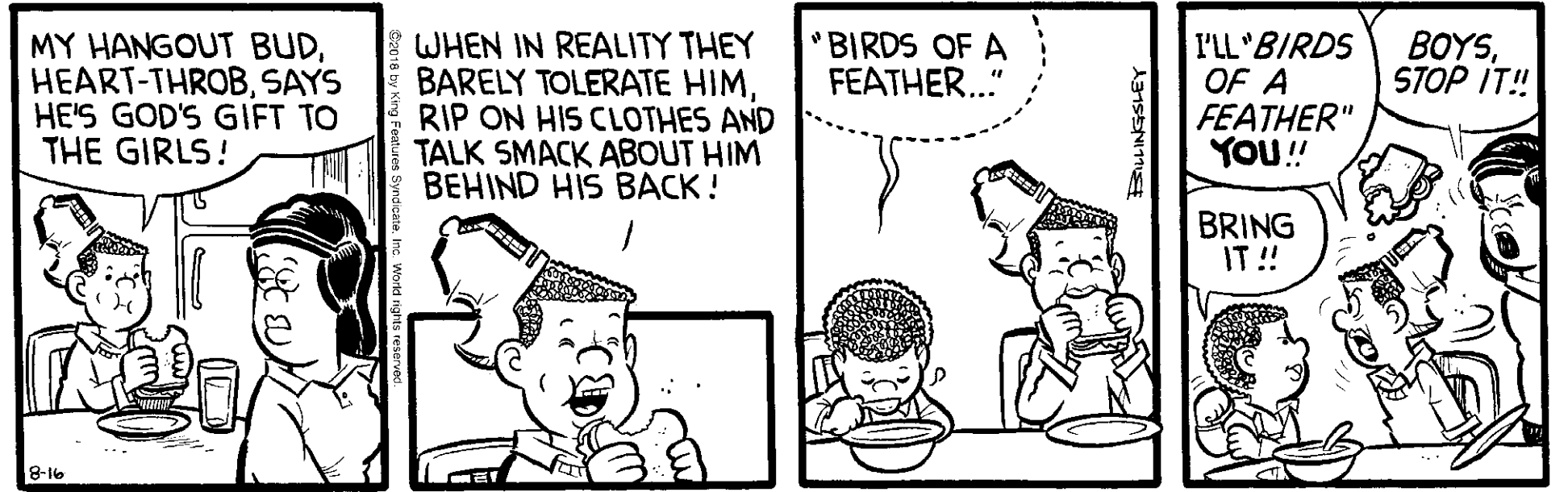

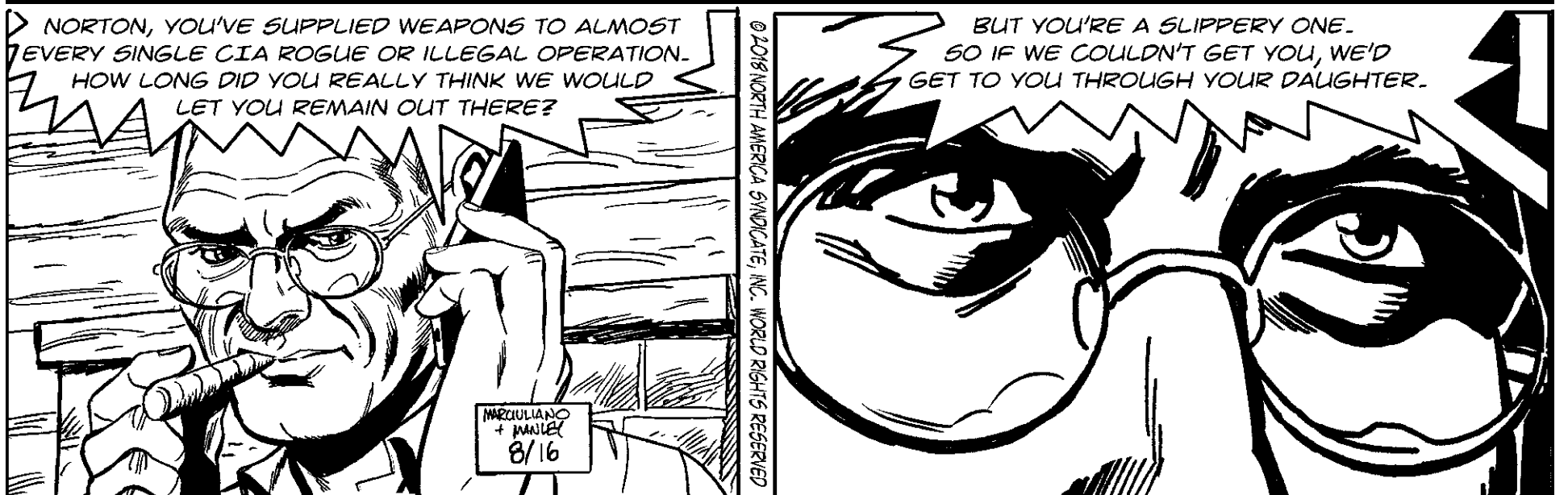
