Eastern Districts Entrepreneurs to Get Tourism Concessions

Caymanians who want to develop tourism-based businesses in Bodden Town, East End and North Side will soon be entitled to incentives through concessions which will include the removal of government development fees, trade and business licensing fees, import duty and tourism related fees.

The concessions will be available for any Caymanian entrepreneur proposing small tourism business developments, where their construction value falls below CI\$500,000 or

where the business does not have greater than CI\$500,000 gross revenue per year.

This package of concessions was agreed in the Legislative Assembly during the passage of Private Members Motion #11 of 2018/19, "Concessions for Tourist related Businesses". which was brought by MLA Mr. Arden Mclean (EE) and seconded by MLA Mr. Christopher Saunders (BTW).

Premier concerned over Hon Ezzard Miller Resignation

Premier Alden McLaughlin stated this week that he was troubled to learn of the recent resignation of MLA Ezzard Miller as the Leader of the Opposition.

"For that reason, it is not so much the resignation of Mr. Miller that concerns me," he said, "but more the political infighting and personal ambition riddling the current opposition group. This, I believe, does not serve well the long-term interests of our country."

The remainder of his statement fol-

In any democracy, the Leader of the Opposition is a serious role. In the Cayman Islands, not only is the Leader of the Opposition an important constitutional office, required under Section 68 of the Constitution, but the Leader of the Opposition plays several key roles, including serving as a member of the National Security Council and as Chair of the Public Accounts Committee. And of course the Leader of the Opposition serves a significant role in leading and speaking for Opposition members inside and outside of the Legislative As-

British Prime Minister Benjamin Disraeli wrote, "No government can be long secure without a formidable opposition."

To better explain, let me review what has transpired.

In giving notice of his resignation Mr. Miller commented that:

"Effectively performing this role demands dedication on the part of a committed team. It has become increasingly clear that the level of cohesion, industry and commitment necessary for any opposition to serve in the best interest of all the people of these Islands is not possible given the current slate of independent members who made up the group."

Mr. Miller's resignation follows a letter to him in April from other members of his Opposition team who advised that they were content for him to remain as opposition leader but asked that "where the general public is concerned, we are requesting that you do not speak on our behalf.... We believe that this request is necessary to maintain our independence and the political platform we are all elected on."

In the media reports Mr. Miller outlined his challenge coping with a "steep learning curve navigating among some very strong personalities" and he went on to speak of leadership struggles on the Opposition Benches. And of course shortly following these comments MLA Alva Suckoo resigned as Deputy Leader of the Opposition.

Mother's Day (Founding)

The modern holiday of Mother's Day was first celebrated in 1908, when Anna Jarvis held a memorial for her mother in Grafton, West Virginia.

She then began a campaign to make "Mother's Day" a recognized holiday in the United States. Although she was successful in 1914, she was already disappointed with its commercializa-



tion by the 1920s. Jarvis' holiday was adopted by other countries and it is now celebrated all over the world. In this tradition, each person offers a gift, card, or remembrance toward their mothers, grandmothers, and/ or maternal figure on mother's day.

Various observances honoring mothers existed in America during the 1870s and the 1880s, but these never had resonance beyond the local level. Jarvis never mentioned Julia Ward Howe's attempts in the 1870s to establish a "Mother's Day for Peace", nor any connection to the Protestant school celebrations that included "Children's Day" amongst others. Neither did she mention the traditional festival of Mothering Sunday. Jarvis always said that the creation was hers alone. ③

Ministry of Tourism Urges Public to Disregard Cruise Berthing Rumours

Rumours circulating on various radio talk shows that the Cayman Islands Government has prematurely entered into an agreement with a contractor to build the cruise berthing facility are completely untrue and the public is urged to pay no attention to such claims.

The rumours, which amount to nothing more than deliberate gossip and untruths, are being circulated as part of an ongoing campaign to spread misinformation regarding the cruise berthing project and to cause confusion in the minds of the public.

Referring to the rumours, Hon Moses Kirkconnell stated. "As Minister of Tourism, with the responsibility for overseeing the development of the cruise berthing and enhanced cargo port facility project, I can confirm that neither the Major Project Office nor the Cayman Islands Government have entered into any deal with any company bidding to design, build, finance and maintain the piers."

In November 2018 the three bidders on the project were invited by government to prepare and submit their final tenders to design, build, finance and maintain the project. The cruise berth-

ing project is therefore in the final stages of procurement and only once all of the bids have been received and evaluated will the successful bidder be selected and announced.

"I addressed similar rumours in August of last year and they were as false then as they are now. It is unfortunate that I have to address them again in response to persons whose agenda seems intent on derailing this project by any means possible," said the Minister.

"As every significant milestone in the process has been achieved, the public has been kept informed either by my Ministry or the Honourable Premier. We will continue to provide updates on the project's progress and urge the public to disregard information on the cruise berthing project that does not originate from official government channels."

Statement by Minister of Health, Environment, Culture and Housing, Hon. Dwayne Seymour

Cabinet recently approved a coastal works application made by Mr Marcus Cumber to facilitate the construction of a private dock.

Originally submitted in 2014, the final application was the result of considerable dialogue between Mr Cumber and public sector officials, including experts from the Department of Environment and the Port Authority.

Government's input was reflected in changes to the project made following the initial application. These included down-sizing the scale of dredging to roughly 10% of the area first requested.

Adjustments were also made to accommodate neighbours using the same canal. It is also worth noting that the length of the dock was never in breach of restrictions as has been publicly reported.

While Mr Cumber has confirmed that I have never had a business relationship with him, I would also like to note that the only business that I own is regis-

tered at the Legislative Assembly, where it is available by appointment for public review.

In the end the matter was only unanimously approved by the requisite quorum of members of Cabinet after the applicant repeatedly demonstrated that he was willing to take on board input from Government and the community. 🏵

The motion asked the Government to agree a package of concessions designed to stimulate tourism development in the Eastern districts with an emphasis on smaller bed and breakfast and other similar establishments.

The motion, which originally asked for the threshold to qualify for concessions to be set at CI\$300,000, was amended by Hon. Minister Moses Kirkconnell, increasing the threshold to CI\$500,000. A second amendment was then proposed safeguarding the concessions to only Caymanian entrepreneurs. The motion received unanimous support from the Legislature.

Speaking during the debate Mr. Mclean said that, "for years the Eastern districts have suffered from the lack of tourism related businesses, and I believe it has come about because we have not been as active in promoting the Eastern districts as we should have been, for a long time".

He went on to remark on the success experienced by existing businesses but noted that, "there is so much more to be done, to be seen in those districts".

Mr. Mclean added that very little is known about the Eastern districts by existing operators in the market, and that the Eastern districts did not receive their fair share of tourist visitors because the lack of development did not align with the focus of those businesses who have focused their tourism products and services on the Western side of Grand Cayman. He noted that if the people of the Eastern districts were given the incentives through concessions, East End, North Side and Bodden Town would capture a much larger share of the tourism market.





Teams, Political Parties and Independent Candidates

The independent countries of the English-speaking Caribbean gave birth to political parties in the late 1930's and these organizations, for the most part, became permanent features of the political landscapes of these countries.

On the other hand, Cayman did not have its first party until 1958. Its brief attempt at two-party politics ended soon and by the general election of 1972 'Teams had replaced political parties in Cayman Islands politics until the more recent advent of the People's Progressive Movement (PPM) formed in 2002 and the United Democratic Party (UDP) now Cayman Democratic Party (CDP) formed in 2001.

The main teams in Cayman's politics have included the Unity Team of 1976; the Dignity Team of 1980 and the National Team of 1992. It should be pretty straightforward to say how teams are

different from and similar to political parties. But is it all that obvious? And which has more advantages?

As I have written before, teams, like political parties, are principally political organizations which have as their main objective control of the machinery of government. Both are political organizations in the sense that they are concerned with the issue of power and its utilization at the level of the nation-state. Political parties, like teams, have to be concerned with the broad agenda of issues facing the societies in which they operate and the larger global environment which have direct and indirect bearing on local realities. Political parties, like teams, work not just to influence policy but ultimately to have control of the government apparatus in order to be in charge of the formulation

Political parties can also be defined by their functions. They provide opportunities for people with similar political philosophies and ideas to meet, organize and campaign in order to place their members in Government, but if not, at least in Opposition. In doing this political parties are the main institutions which provide candidates for elections and by extension provide the nation's political leaders. Political parties recruit and nominate candidates who the leaders think will win in elections. They help their candidates to win elections and while not in office they monitor the actions of office holders. Teams, to some extent, also provide these functions but are limited by the fact that they tend to be 'transitory'.


Another distinguishing feature of a political party is desire for permanence. It seems to me that only in this respect were the Teams which dominated the local political scene prior to the formation of the UDP and PPM, not political parties. As I have written before, those who form political parties usually do so with a desire that they become a permanent part of their societies. That many disappear after at most two years does not mean that that was the intention.

Because political parties are characterized by an intention to be permanent, there is need for a constitution, formal constituency organization, a system of voting to change party leaders and so on. Political parties are thus much more formal organizations. Teams are by their nature organizations in transition- they are formed around election time and participants, as far as I can tell, understand their transitory nature.

As political parties are permanent political organizations, they strive to have an organizational structure that can facilitate the recruitment of members, develop policy, raise campaign funds to educate the electorate about campaign issues, and other such activities. They develop views, positions and policies and communicate these to the electorate not only, but especially during election campaigns.

In addition, because political parties are permanent organizations, the voting and general public knows way beforehand what they are getting. They know that that the party in Opposition or simply not in government, is striving to do so. The public knows beforehand that if the leader of the party in Opposition were to win the election, he or she will be leading the country. There are no surprises with political parties as persons contesting are likely to be in the public domain for some time.

Take for example, a serious Opposition Party, will announce a 'Shadow Cabinet.' So the party that forms the Government has a Cabinet of Ministers who runs var-

ious Ministries. There is a Minister of Education, Finance, Tourism, and so on. The party in Opposition, though not in government, knows that an important function of an Opposition party is also to consistently critique Government and to present alternative positions and possibilities in a consistent, organized and credible way that demonstrates that the party in Opposition is thinking through current issues and is in touch with what is happening.

This is usually best done by a 'Shadow Cabinet' of persons appointed by the Leader of the Opposition to speak on specified portfolios. So there is a Shadow Minister of Education, of Finance, of Tourism, or however, else the Leader of the Opposition might indicate he intends to call the various Ministries. Apart from providing cut and thrust in political life, the appointment of a Shadow Cabinet by a serious Opposition Party, is also a signal to the public as to who would likely be Minsters if the Opposition Party were to become Government.

The public can scrutinize way ahead of time what it desires and Opposition Spokespersons while providing to the public a 'Government in Waiting', also get useful experience critiquing, agreeing with, and proposing new policy directions that they would undertake so the public knows what are the other policy options likely to be taken if the party in Opposition were in Government. Hopefully, if they became Government, they should be able to 'hit the ground running' being to some extent already familiar with the issue and challenges in their respective portfolios.

Running a country is serious business and is best served by persons who have

spent time thinking about the issues and proposing ideas and position papers way before an election. The political novice, not saddled with the responsibil-

ity of running a government, may believe that the issues are simple and clear and solutions obvious, but in government soon learns that the issues are far more complex and that getting things done requires the art of working with multiple constituencies and of learning how to survive on far less sleep. The inexperienced, now at the helm of government, immediately agrees with Shakespeare's Henry IV, who, bemoaning

his position as King and his inability to rest, even on the quietest of nights, begrudges the 'wet sea boy', who perched on a mast, amid wind and waves, nods of easily. 'Uneasy lies the head that wears the crown' he concluded.



Political parties are superior organizations to teams. Nonetheless, political parties, to be taken seriously, must function as modern organizations. They must resist personality politics in favour of party transparency. They must be

faithful to their constitutions and must engage in continued renewal of persons and ideas and so on. Their aim should not be only to win and maintain governmental power, but must embrace an active and permanent identity in the community by engaging in research, civic education and training and routinely forging strong cross-party networks and discussions with government, communities and NGO's. 🏵

Cayman Carnival Batabano pays homage to Cayman's turtling heritage at Junior Batabano

Junior Batabano is set to hit the streets of George Town on Saturday May 11, 2019 with the theme "Once Upon A Turtle", which pays homage to Cayman's turtling heritage.

"One of our new marketing initiatives for Cayman Carnival Batabano overall going forward is to reconnect the carnival in creative ways with the original meaning of the word 'Batabano', which is the native Caymanian term for the tracks left in the sand when turtles go ashore to nest during nesting season,

"With the turtle nesting season being all about the emergence of turtle hatchlings, it was only fitting that we launch this new initiative with the Juniors."

This year's Junior Batabano costumes were therefore designed and created by returning costume designer, Richard Bartholomew of Trinidad, along with Shane James. Each school's costume(s) will represent some aspect of Cayman's turtling heritage, as well as a few fantasy turtles.

There are six schools and more than 400 children and teens participating





this year from the following schools: Cayman International School will have 25 students donning the costume design called "Sailing in Las Tortugas"; Red Bay Primary School will have 39 students wearing costumes called "Save The Turtles"; Savannah Primary School will have 66 students in the "My Favourite Turtle Souveneir" costume; and George Town Primary will have 49 students in two sections wearing

costumes called "Have You Ever Seen A Flying Turtle" and "Sir Turtle Playing Mas".

St. Ignatius Catholic School's entry this year will have 147 students in four different costume sections under the theme "The Turtle Cycle". The sections are called: "Emerging At Full Moon"; "The Race For Survival"; "Batabano In The Sand"; and "A Nest Of Eggs".

John A. Cumber Primary School is returning to the Junior Batabano parade after an eight-year hiatus, and will have 77 students sporting the costume design called "Hidden In The Kelp".

The Cayman Islands Boy Scouts will also be in the Junior Batabano parade, as well as a local group of young beauty queens.

The Junior Batabano participating schools are competing for



the following prizes again this year: Junior Batabano Band of the Year; Second Runner Up; Third Runner Up; and Spirit of Junior Batabano.





Many people complain that the reason they're gaining weight into the 40s and 50s is due to a slow metabolism, but really, that slow metabolism is happening (partly) because they are losing muscle. The muscle gains you achieve with a proper strength training program can help reverse this process and actually INCREASE metabolism!

Strength Training and Bone Health

As a person grows older, bone loss is inevitable, especially for women after menopause. This can lead to bones breaking more easily, feelings of fatigue and weakness, and reduced tolerance to physical activity. Weight-bearing exercises strengthen bones, helping minimize natural bone loss and reducing the risk of injury.

While other outdoor activities may be weight bearing in nature and still help with bone strength and formation, no other exercise is more weight bearing than strength training.

To be honest, we've all been on both sides such conversations. Such efforts find us just talking past one another rather than effectively communicating.

The thing missing in such instances is a lack of knowledge about the presuppositions of one another. In fact, honest communication is impossible without each person knowing what shapes the others' way of looking at and understanding the world. We all pre-suppose, so we all have presuppositions. They undergird, shape, and inform our world-view.

We suppose that water is wet because we've been told it is and because we've experienced it. We suppose that water from the sea is salty and that from the bottle isn't because we've experienced it.

So, it is with matters of faith and the way that we live them out.

People who believe that God is all powerful, all knowing, and unchangeable and that He

has communicated to mankind through His created order; most specifically through Jesus and then the bible, look at the world through that lens. Those that believe mankind is the source of all knowledge and that popular science should dictate our approach to life and morals look through that lens and order their lives accordingly.

The two sides can understand one another if they honour each other's presuppositions but they will never agree because those views are mutually exclusive. They butt heads like two big rams fighting over the ewes. Neither will cease until the other surrenders.

Jesus' disciples were at first, slow to understand. Prior to his crucifixion, he told them on multiple occasions that he must be betrayed, killed, and that he would rise again on the third day, yet on the day of his resurrection, with the

Cayman in the Throes of Moulting What Gains and Losses?

To anyone alive and attentive to life in these fomented Cayman Islands, it is obvious that we are at another major moult, pulsating to shed the now-considered outgrown skin that is linked to a unique past in order to move into a more propitious future. Not being masters of our own destiny, however, we appear to have given insufficient thought to what is being promised by the purveyors of the "Emperor's new clothes," nor have we carefully counted the cost associated with this exchange. To this observer, one thing that is being jettisoned (or has been jettisoned) by my people is our value system that gave priority to community over individualism, and objective truth over personal (subjective) preferences.

Since all decisions are values-based decisions, we do not need to judge what people's values are; they show us what they are by their actions. And my people have shown by their actions what their "new skin" represents. Our society now celebrates the great value that is placed on personal choice and individual happiness, despite the reality that with many of these choices there is a high risk of danger to the individual and society at large. The dominant outlook and approach is that the autonomy of persons cannot be trumped by any other (imposed) value. Instead of religion and morality being viewed as wise masters in the school of life, they are now viewed as nuisances, or (at best) relics of a past era to be venerated, but of no current value—like yesteryear's pounds, shillings and pence.

The dominant values in western culture are clearly those of personal happiness and material prosperity. Cayman is but a microcosm of western culture, in which both multi-generational Caymanians and newly arrived residents and transient (guest) workers relentlessly scramble to fill their baskets with trophies from the fields of pleasure and prosperity, like so many children in an Easter egg hunt.

The sobering reality is that in this cultural crucible, a kind of personality disorder on a socie-



ty-wide scale is slowly burning away multi-generational values, like magma from an erupting distant volcano. This disorder manifests itself in the simultaneous embrace of social and environmental consciousness and a rejection of traditional (Christian-based) morality. We want to save the earth and feed our future, but apparently have not have seen how this is at odds with the agenda being promoted in certain quarters to sacrifice the life of the unborn for our personal comfort and convenience, or how the current emphasis on personal happiness and boundary-less sexual practices is a growing canker on the central organ of society, the human family. ③

USA 2020

It's early days yet but already US President DonaldTrump and former vice-president Joe Biden are squaring off to go head for next year's US presidential election.

President Trump is banking on a second term. He's been campaigning for it ever since he took office.

He has tweeted that two years of his current term were "stollen" (sic) due to the investigation into his 2016 campaign by Special Counsel Robert Mueller's investigation.

Furthermore, House Speaker Nancy Pelosi thinks that Trump will refuse to leave the White House unless the Democrats win by a "big" enough margin in 2020 as he might contest the results and prolong his presidency.

It's been an incessant flow of campaign stomping by the president; between golfing holidays, highly questionable forays into foreign affairs, inflammatory utterances, controversial domestic policies, personal crises, the Mueller investigation, calls for his impeachment, being seemingly obsessed with erasing any trace of achievement during the Obama presidency...and that wall.

In spite of all that, the US economy is showing considerable growth with record-level employment rates.

President Trump basks in the spotlight and takes credit for it, almost as expected. And there's no question that the 'Trump factor' has had a positive impact on the profit-pursuit in America's business boardrooms.

But some economists and many Democrats have deep reservations about the sustainability of the current trend in the US economy, and more importantly, are worried about the size of the ballooning national debt.

For the Democrats, once they figure out which one of the twenty and counting declared candidates will challenge him at the polls, they will need to brace for the onslaught of the Trump re-election juggernaut.

Former vice-president Joe Biden, who some tout as the most likely of the Democrats to wade through their field of candidates and face off with Trump, is getting in a few early blows.

In addition to calling the president 'a clown', he claims that any economic gains Trump is taking credit for are the result of a foundation laid before by the Obama-Biden administration.

President Trump, not known to shy away from a confrontation, calls 76-years-old Biden 'Sleepy Joe'.

Mr Trump who is 72 recently said he feels "young" and "vibrant", adding that "I'm so young I can't believe it" and that he could easily beat Biden (at the polls).

And that's only in the prospect of a Trump-Biden showdown.



Considering other Democrats in the line-up for the presidential bid, Trump has already labelled Senator Kamala Harris "a nasty wit" over her excoriation of his Attorney General William Barr at the Congressional hearing into the Mueller report.

She is now stepping up the pressure by calling for a probe into whether President Trump himself urged the Attorney General to investigate his opponents.

About his old nemesis 77-year-old Bernie Sanders, the 72 years-old Trump says he "talks a lot and doesn't get it done" and brushes aside young rising star Beto O'Rourke as soon to be "a thing of the past".

But it's the popular, youthful, 36 years old gay candidate Pete Buttigieg who is in a same-sex marriage, that Mr Trump seems to have a watchful eye on.

While he says that Buttigieg might not make it past the primaries, Trump has surprisingly declared that he is "rooting" for him and that he would like to run against the young mayor.

Could it be that he thinks the US might

not be ready for a same-sex couple in the White House so Buttigieg might be an easy walkover?

If so, then which does fear most; opposition from a female candidate or another septuagenarian?

Mr Trump is now invoking God, claiming that his belief carried him through "the ordeal" of Special Counsel Robert Mueller's investigation.

At the same time though, he was firing off tweets in support of individuals banned by Facebook for hate-speech.

The US 2020 presidential election is already shaping up to be quite a show.



Former T&T Attorney General and Opposition Senator Appear in Court on Corruption Charges

Former Attorney General Anand Ramlogan and United National Congress (UNC) Senator and attorney Gerald Ramdeen appeared in court this morning on corruption charges, five days after being held for questioning by police over an alleged conspiracy to financially reward themselves with fees from legal briefs from the State.

But Ramlogan says life will continue for him as normal, even as he fights the charges.

The two were charged late Friday. At that time, Ramlogan was granted TT\$1.2 million (US\$ 177,450) bail while Ramdeen was released on TT \$1.5 million (US\$ 221,812) bail.

At their first court appearance before Chief Magistrate Maria Busby Earle-Caddle in the Port of Spain Magistrates Court today, neither was required to plea as their charges are indictable.

It is alleged that they conspired with Jamaica-born Queen's Counsel Vincent Nelson for Ramlogan to misbehave in public office by accepting sums of money from Nelson for granting him State briefs; conspired for Ramdeen to receive,

conceal, and transfer criminal property which represented corrupt rewards given to Ramlogan by Nelson for the State briefs; and conspired for Nelson to give ten per cent of the paid legal fees to Ramlogan as a "gift" or "reward" for being granted those State briefs. The offences occurred on various dates between October 1, 2010 and September 9, 2015.

Nelson, who has entered into a plea deal with the prosecution and will testify against his co-conspirators, appeared in court last Friday and was granted bail. He is set to return to court later this month.

Ramlogan and Ramdeen, meantime, will make another court appearance on June 28.

While Ramdeen did not speak with the media either before or after leaving the court today, a smiling Ramlogan de-

clared after his court appearance that "at the end the day truth will emerge", and in the meantime it would be business as usual for him.

"I know at the end of the day the truth will emerge and I anxiously await my time and my day in court. Matters that are subject to the court, of course I can't comment. However I will be going to court myself to represent my clients. I will be back at my law firm tomorrow and I intend to live my life as normal. No weapon formed against me shall prosper," he said.

Attorney-at-law Pamela Elder who leads Ramlogan's legal team, told reporters that she had heard that Nelson, the State's star witness, was ailing and she

hoped he would receive the best medical treatment and would be able to testify.

"I hope...he keeps in good health and does not go to the hereafter before we get an opportunity to cross-examine him with respect to these allegations he has made against two senior members of the Crown," Elder said, adding that she had confidence in the Director of Public Prosecutions Roger Gaspard that he would make all necessary disclosures and do everything in his power to make sure the matter is dealt with expeditiously.

Ramlogan was arrested last Wednesday at Piarco International Airport while Ramdeen surrendered to police later that day after learning there was a warrant for his arrest. They were questioned by officers from the Anti-Corruption Investigative Bureau before being charged last Friday night.

ExxonMobil Moving into Phase Two of Oil Development Off Guyana

ExxonMobil is moving ahead with a second phase of oil development offshore Guvana.

It said it has funded the Liza Phase 2 development after receiving government and regulatory approvals.

The company said the Phase 2 startup, which is expected in mid-2022, will produce up to 220,000 barrels of oil per day and further capitalize on the development potential of the Stabroek Block, where ExxonMobil estimates it could produce more than 750,000 barrels of oil per day by 2025.

A total of six drill centres are planned, as well as approximately 30 wells, including 15 production, nine water injection and six gas injection wells. Liza Phase 2 is expected to cost US\$6 billion.

Exxon said a final investment decision is expected later this year for a third phase of development, Payara, which is expected to produce between 180,000 and 220,000 barrels per day with startup as early as

Liza Phase 1, meantime, remains on track to achieve first oil by the first quarter of 2020. It will produce up to 120,000 barrels of oil per day at peak rates.

ExxonMobil says it is also evaluating additional development potential in other areas of the Stabroek Block, including at the Turbot area and Hammerhead.

The Stabroek Block is 26,800 square kilometres. The current discovered recoverable resources are



estimated at more than 5 billion barrels of oil equivalent. The 13 discoveries on the block to date have established the potential for at least five floating production, storage and offloading (FPSO) vessels producing more than 750,000 barrels of oil per day by 2025

ExxonMobil's affiliate, Esso Exploration and Production Guyana Limited is the operator and holds 45 per cent interest in the Stabroek Block. Hess Guyana Exploration Ltd. holds 30 per cent interest and CNOOC Petroleum Guyana Limited, a wholly-owned subsidiary of CNOOC Limited, holds 25 per cent interest


Small Earthquake Recorded off Trinidad

Business magnate Sir Richard Branson is reported to be interested in investing in cash-strapped regional airline

Chief of Staff within the Office of the Prime Minister in Antigua and Barbuda, Lionel Hurst, told reporters following a Cabinet meeting that discussions had been held with the British business magnate, investor and philanthropist. He said the talks involved helping the Antigua-based LIAT out of its struggling financial situation to become a profit-making enterprise.

"The entrepreneur has proposed investing several million dollars. He would wet lease several aircraft – jets – and they would fly from Fort Lauderdale to Jamaica, Haiti and down into Antigua and Barbados. The whole idea is to enlarge LIAT, rather than collapse LIAT or making it a smaller entity," Hurst said, explaining that this would allow the air carrier to fly to destinations outside the region.

He added that the Virgin Group founder would put his resources into a smaller LIAT that would not be able to achieve a profitable status.

"There just is not [enough] passengers and other kinds of possibilities to make LIAT profitable within the Caribbean," Hurst said.

Meanwhile, according to the Antigua Observer newspaper, the Antigua and Barbuda is having discussions with Barbados – LIAT's largest shareholder – to purchase its shares in the regional carrier.

The newspaper quoted Hurst as saying that Barbados has indicated its shares in LIAT have been a burden on the country.

However, he said the value of Barbados' shares in LIAT has not yet been determined.

LIAT shareholders met in Antigua last week and agreed to further examine a proposal by host Prime Minister Gaston Browne regarding the future direction of the airline.

Canada has money laundering problem

Canada has become a magnet for money laundering because of its lax monitoring of dirty finance, according to a new report.

The report by the C.D. Howe Institute, a Canadian think-tank, claims 99.9 percent of money launderers in the country are never caught.

And as British Columbia begins to crack down on the washing of dirty money, the author of the new report, retired corporate

lawyer Kevin Comeau, says failure to change national laws just means the crime will go elsewhere in the country.

"It's highly unfair to law enforcement agencies to say that they've been ignoring it," said r Comeau, a member of Transparency International Canada's working group on beneficial ownership transparency. "The problem is that they don't have the tools to address it."

Ironically, it is Canada's reliable rule of law system that attracts the money launderers. Dirty money can come from crime anywhere in the world, including Canada. But much of it is funnelled out of poor countries and autocratic regimes.

But whether the source is drug crimes or political bribery and theft, the people with the money claim they don't want to keep it in those autocratic countries because a more powerful leader could simply take it.

Not so in liberal democracies like Canada where, once you have the legal right of ownership, the law firmly protects that right.

For that reason, laundered money in Canada is much more valuable than dirty money elsewhere. And that is why money launderers are pleased to pay well over asking for high-priced real estate, where multimillion-dollar blocks of cash can be cleansed in a single deal.

Honduras suspends reforms after riots

The Honduran Congress has suspended ratification of new health and education reforms that critics say would lead to privatization and job losses, after mass protests the policies left three people wounded and several buildings aflame.

Marches and roadblocks continued in Honduras' capital city last week with some

schools and hospitals halting classes and some services after teachers and medical unions called for opposition to two health and education reforms approved in Congress that they said would encourage privatization and job dismissals.

Officials from the government of President Juan Orlando Hernandez denied that the bills, which must still be ratified in Congress, would lead to such outcomes.

"We have decided to suspend and archive those laws and to invite dialogue with the leaders of the health and teaching associations, with the aim of bringing peace," Mauricio Oliva, president of Congress, who leads Mr Hernandez's National Party in the chamber, said.

Leaders of the teachers and medical unions said they accepted the invitation for dialogue.

But they said they will maintain pressure on the government with roadblocks across the country and in Tegucigalpa's commercial centre, where supporters including high school and university students were taking to the streets.

Anti-riot police clashed with protesters, some of them hooded and armed with stones, sticks and Molotov cocktails last week.

At least three people were injured in the historic centre of the capital and three public and one private building were partially burned down, according to the Fire Department and the Ministry of Security.

Cuba visitors rise, despite Trump ban

Despite the Trump administration's pressure on Cuba and threats to impose a "full and complete embargo", US tourists have been flocking to the country in record numbers, according to data provided by Cuban authorities.

Washington is working hard to portray Cuba as an opponent to the ascent of democracy in Venezuela by

keeping the crisis-hit country under "occupation." However, that doesn't seem to do much to discourage US tourists from swarming the island's world-famous white sand beaches

Michel Bernal, commercial director at Cuba's tourism ministry, said that there has been an almost twofold increase in visitors from the US in the first four months of the year. He said 93.5 percent more US citizens visited Cuba from January to April than during the same period of last year.

That has made the US one of the top two countries that supply tourists to Cuba. The US only trails behind its northern neighbour, Canada.

Cuba saw a seven percent increase in total tourist arrivals compared to the previous year. Mr Bernal noted that,

while choosing their holiday destination, visitors apparently paid no heed to Washington's hostile rhetoric.

"Despite defamatory campaigns against Cuba, 13.5 percent of tourists that visit us say they chose the island for its safety," he said.

A total of 1.93 million foreign visitors visited the country in the first quarter of 2019 although European visitors have dropped slightly. The number of visitors from Germany, Italy, Spain and Britain decreased on average by 10-13 percent, while the number of tourists from Russia grew.

As its quest to oust Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro from power stalls, the Trump administration has been piling pressure on Cuba and Russia, the main allies of Caracas.

Whistle blower accuses Duterte of drugs

An anonymous whistle-blower who appeared shrouded by darkness in videos accusing Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte's family of taking millions from a drug syndicate has stunned the nation by revealing his identity.

The hooded figure known as Bikoy on Monday unveiled himself as a bald, round-faced man with glasses, after claiming in the clips that he used to keep finan-

cial records for a drug syndicate called the "Quadrangle Group" which included members of the president's family and a close aide.

Peter Joemel Advincula said he was the man seen in five YouTube videos implicating the president's son and former aide as "principal" operators in the country's drug trade.

Reaction was swift from Malacanang Palace, the president's official residence. Spokesman Salvador Panelo said: "As far as we are concerned, the video is black propaganda against the government."

Mr Advincula, who appears to be in his 30s or 40s, said he decided to surface so he could take legal action after

he received death threats, and because his conscience weighed on him. "I saw how families have been shattered because of drugs," he said.

He denied any links with the country's political opposition, but the accusations come at the height of midterm election campaigning.

On Monday, up to 61.8 million voters are set to cast ballots for thousands of local government representatives, 303 congressmen and 12 senators.

Eight of Mr Duterte's candidates, including his former presidential aide Christopher Go, who is among those accused of being a drug operator by Mr Advincula, are likely to emerge winners.

Maduro still has military's backing

One week after Venezuelan opposition leader Juan Guaidó's calls for mass protests failed to incite a military uprising and force Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro out of office, Mr Guaidó has suggested that he is open to a US military intervention in his country.

"We are open to options that offer a low social cost and that will grant us the ability and the stability to hold a truly free election," Mr

Guaidó said. "We want the best exit out of this conflict, and if there are options we have to consider and alternatives, then we will."

But it seems the United States isn't Mr Guaidó's only option. A member of his team said that they are in touch with Russian officials, which Mr Guaidó confirmed. He said those talks were happening in an unofficial capacity, with various officials from high to low levels in the Moscow government.

The US and Russia accuse each other of interfering in the Venezuelan crisis. On Monday, speaking from Moscow, Venezuela's foreign minister said his country may expand the amount of Russian specialists there.

President Trump's top aides say all options - including military action - remain an option.

Mr Guaidó said: "I want a free election now, no dictatorship, for kids in Venezuela not to starve to death."

Vice President Mike Pence is expected to announce new incentives this week to try and convince Venezuelan military commanders to abandon Mr Maduro.

Mr Maduro has called Guaidó a puppet of the American government. But even with Venezuela's crippling economic crisis, and inflation at more than one million percent, most armed forces have remained loyal to Mr Maduro. Mr Guaidó insists that will change.

US marvels at royal baby

News of the British royal baby has delighted many people around the world - and been prominently covered by media outlets from the US, the birthplace of the Duchess of Sussex. Americans have always been known to be obsessed with British Royals - but the fact that Meghan is now one of them has particularly boosted their enthusiasm.

US media have been keen

to explain all the possible facts about the baby - from the fact he is a dual UK-US citizen, to the likelihood that he will have red hair.

Broadcaster ABC published close to 20 online reports about the royal baby on Monday, with headlines including: "Prince Harry, Meghan Markle's son is a Taurus: Here's what that means" and "#ParentGoals: Looking back at Harry and Meghan's cutest moments with kids".

Many US websites appeared to approve of how the Duke and Duchess of Sussex chose to "break with tradition" by demanding more privacy during the birth of their child.

They echoed TV host Oprah Winfrey, who recently said she was "so proud"

of Meghan's decision to "say 'this is what I really want for my baby and my family."

US news outlets also reacted warmly to Prince Harry's words with the media following the birth.

The Washington Post wrote: "Harry endeared himself to mums everywhere when he gushed: 'It's been the most amazing experience I could ever have possibly imagined. How any woman does what they do is beyond comprehension.'

"Harry's wonder at the miracle of birth — and the great effort involved — stood in contrast to how Prince William and Catherine, the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge, have played it."







Tucker humbled by NBA failure

PJ Tucker has been the outstanding Houston Rockets player in the second-round playoff series against the Golden State Warriors, which is remarkable considering the uncertain start of his NBA career. Although Tucker is a 12-year NBA veteran, with over 600 games played, he approaches each game as if making his debut - and it is his last.

When Tucker first entered the NBA, he was waived as a rookie in Toronto in 2007.

"Right now, while I'm in the playoffs, I don't try to look back at it," Tucker said on Tuesday. "I remember it. It keeps me ticking. It keeps me going. It keeps me strong. But it makes me super humble to be here with every game, every moment. People ask me why I play so hard. I say, 'I'm happy to be here.' For real."

The former University of

Texas star was the 35th overall pick in the second round of the 2006 NBA draft by the Toronto Raptors. But the 2006 Big 12 Conference Player of the Year averaged only 1.8 points and 1.4 rebounds in 4.9 minutes per game during the 2006-07 season. He also had four stints that season playing in the NBA Development League with the now-defunct Colorado 14ers. Tucker was stunned when he was waived by the Raptors for a roster spot.

Tucker admitted he did "everything wrong" in his rookie year and his ego caused him to believe he was destined for instant NBA stardom.

"That was one of the worst years of my life," Tucker said. "You come from the college, you're the man. I was sec-

ond-team All-American. I got drafted by Toronto, but they just took me because I was the best man on the board. They didn't need me. I didn't get a whole lot of help or guidance.

"I wasn't playing. I couldn't get reps in practice. And it's big-boy basketball. Grown men. You had guys feeding their families. I'm thinking I'm all-world, and that is how every college guy thinks that coming in. You feel like you're better than anybody. But I didn't know what it meant to be a pro."

Tucker played for the Cleveland Cavaliers' summer league team in 2007, but no NBA contract offers followed. So the Raleigh, North Carolina resident went on an international odyssey over the next five years, playing in Israel, Ukraine, Italy, Greece, Montenegro, Puerto Rico, Germany and Russia.

In 2012, he led Brose Baskets Bamberg to a Basketball Bundesliga championship in Germany after averaging 16.2 points and 7.1 rebounds and earned Finals MVP honours.

"It was tough being away from home," Tucker said. "You have to learn how to play over there. Over there, it ain't dropping 30 every night and being the man. Most of the guys who think like that don't last over there. They care about winning over there. If you're a winner, you can play forever over there."

He was making a comfortable living overseas and signed a two-year contract paying at least \$2 million with BC Spartak St. Petersburg of Russia. While his agent Andre Buck put an NBA out clause in the deal, Tucker was content being a star abroad.

"Coming back? I'd rather be the man in Europe and win that respect. I'd rather be here than be the last man on the bench in the NBA and never have a chance. That was a decision I had made."

When he got his second NBA chance, this time, a more mature, humbled and rounded player did not take things for granted. He joined the Phoenix Suns and played with distinction until briefly re-joining Toronto before moving to the Rockets two years ago.

Tucker's influence has been extraordinary against the Warriors. After trailing 2-0 to open the

Western Conference semi-finals, Houston came roaring back, tying the series.

Tucker may be 34 but this is his breakout year in the eyes of casual observers. His game has never garnered such appreciation as it is right now.

And if his play doesn't fully enthuse, his personal life passions will. A pancake aficionado, Tucker's also become a cult hero whose investment in shoes, clothes, and the high-starch breakfast food has been broadcasted to the masses. The pictures of the pancakes he ate pregame were appointment viewing, his cowboy-style fits were taken to mainstream Instagram accounts, and his endless sneaker closet was revealed. 😚

Campbell steps up as World Cup nears

just a few weeks ahead of their World Cup bid.

Left-hander John Campbell with opening partner Shai Hope posted a world-record stand in the opening One-Day International of the Tri-Nations Series against Ireland in Dublin.

while Hope carved out 170, as they posted a record 365 for the first wicket and the second highest partnership ever in ODIs.

The 25-year-old Jamaican, in only his sixth ODI, blasted 15 fours and half-dozen sixes off 137 balls, while Hope stroked 22 fours and two sixes off 152 deliveries, en route to his fifth hundred in the format.





Williams returns after injury

Serena Williams will be back in action next week at the Italian Open in Rome.

The tournament director claimed that Williams "has already reserved her rooms and should be here a few days early" for the event

Williams hasn't played since she withdrew from the Miami Open in March with a knee injury.

The 37-year-old American, currently ranked 11th in the world, has won the Italian Open four times, most recently in 2016. That's also the last time she played in the event.

This year's Italian Open runs May 13-19 and serves as a clay-court warm-up for the French Open, which begins May 26.

Williams has not won a tournament since 2017, when she won the Australian Open. Shortly afterward, she announced she was pregnant and took the rest of the year off from competitive

tennis. While she did not win a tournament in 2018, she did reach the final of both Wimbledon and the US Open. She lost in the quarterfinals of the Australian Open this year.

She has 23 grand-slam titles to her name but as an entrepreneur, Williams is only just getting started. Not only is she the founder and chief executive of her own fashion and lifestyle brand, she sits on the boards of Survey Monkey and Poshmark and has headed up her own venture capital firm to primarily invest in women and small businesses.

Serena Ventures, which has been operating under the radar since 2014, now supports some 30-plus businesses including feminine hygiene brand Lola and online learning platform, Masterclass. Much like her style of tennis-playing, she wanted to come out "with a bang" by developing her portfolio before announcing the company.

Williams' clothing line, S by Serena, has also been a long time in the making. From adapting her on-court "mental toughness" to taking inspiration
