One Name Policy for **British Passports**

The Cayman Islands Government Passport and Corporate Services Office (P&CSO) notifies British passport applicants - including for British Overseas Territories Citizen (BOTC) passports in the Cayman Islands -- of the rules and requirements under the United Kingdom's One Name Policy for all British passports.

This advisory applies particularly to nose applicants who show different names in their British passport applications from their current or expired (but not cancelled) National passport.

The UK's One Name Policy, established in the interest of identity protection, requires individuals to use one name for all official purposes and documentation, and aims to protect the public from criminal and false passport use.

Under the One Name Policy, the following are needed from the necessary authorities of applicants who are una**ble** to present their current or expired (Not Cancelled) National Passport that reads the said name as set out on their British passport application:

- A valid or expired, Not Cancelled, National passport in the name as set out in Section 2 of the BOT Passport Application Form.
- · If name is not aligned, then the National passport must be renewed or replaced if it is not currently available for presentation.
- · If the National passport is lost and has expired and the applicant does not wish to hold a further National passport, provide a letter from the **Nation**al Issuing Authorities confirming they know the applicant in the current name and that all future passports or ID cards would be issued in that name. **Note** - this **has to be** from the **National** authorities; notification from the applicant or any other party/organisation is unacceptable.

Further to this, the Operational Standards and Guidance Bulletin published by Her Majesty's Passport Office details the following:



Alignment of Foreign Documents

Where dual nationals hold a passport or travel document issued by another country in a name different to that set out in Section 2 of the application for a BOTC passport, HMPO will not issue a passport until the names are aligned, therefore the P&CSO will not be able to accept such application.

Applicant does not want another Foreign Passport

Where the foreign passport has expired and the customer has stated that they have no intention of obtaining another passport from their native country, they must engage with the appropriate authorities in their native country. The customer must then obtain and provide written confirmation from these appropriate authorities that they recognise the name or change of name from XXX to YYY, that their records have been updated and that any future passport or ID card would be issued in that name.

Applicant has never held a National **Passport**

If applicant has never held a National passport, then an original Sworn Affidavit from the applicant must be provided explaining such details.

Guidance on the use and change of names, as well as additional security requirements when considering the use of names in British passports can be found on the UK's Home Office website.






through accelerated learning. Mr. Roper and Ms McAffee had to prepare sushi. to source the locally-grown tree from the Trust's Colliers Wilderness Reserve in East End.

"This is the first Arbour Day for the National Trust," said National Trust Marketing Manager, Nasaria Budal. "It is an added event to our annual Earth Month celebrations, but particularly special as we hope to use the event as a platform to promote awareness around our native trees; each year we will focus on a different tree.

"The Whitewood tree was chosen for this year's tree planting because it is so closely tied to our local heritage – the trunk of Whitewood trees was often used to make Cayman Catboats and schooners, and tree limbs were fashioned into slingshots by young children."

The trees were planted in the backyard of the Mission House, the signature historic property of the National Trust, and can be seen from the two bedrooms of the main house. The surrounding garden is a traditional Caymanian sand yard with ornamental and fruit trees as well as medicinal herbs like mint and fever grass.

Under the international Earth Day theme 'Protect Our Species', the National Trust focused on both native flora and fauna. Events included a glow-in-thedark 5k run/walk, a beach and roadside clean-up, a lunch and learn discussing how to conserve native trees by propagation, an Earth Day dress down day and Arbour Day; the last event, Breakfast with the Blues, is scheduled for Sunday April 28.

Arbour Day began in Nebraska City, Nebraska in 1872 when J. Sterling Morton and his wife, who were lovers of nature, proposed a tree-planting holiday; that year, it is estimated that Nebraskans planted one million trees. It is celebrated around the world today on varying dates due to local seasons and species of trees chosen.

Premier, Cayman delegation complete grueling charity bicycle ride in Monaco

Premier Hon. Alden McLaughlin and Eric Bush, Chief Officer of the Ministry of International Trade, Investment, Aviation and Maritime Affairs, on Sunday participated in the annual Princess Charlene of Monaco Foundation annual charity bicycle ride.

Joining the Cayman team were Orrett Connor, host of Radio Cayman's For the Record talk show, and Inspector Andre Tahal of the Royal Cayman Islands Police Service, who travelled to Monaco at their own expense to participate in the 87-mile charity ride from St. Tropez in France to Monaco.

The course, which winds through towns and mountains, took some seven hours to complete. Contending with narrow winding roads, traffic and pedestrians and not knowing the route made the trek challeng-

ing. It was made even more difficult by weather conditions, with temperatures around 60 degrees Fahrenheit and 23 mile-an-hour winds. The Premier was happy to have fellow Caymanian cyclists with him for mutual support and camaraderie over the course of the ride. The Cayman Islands was ably represented in the charity ride with all four successfully completing the course.

In addition to the four Caymanians, more than 100 riders participated, including several professional bicyclists, former athletes and business people; most of whom participate every year.

Prince Albert of Monaco invited the Premier to participate in the event when they met last year. The Prince, unfortunately, was unable to ride as he recently underwent surgery. The

Prince did, however, attend the finish at Monaco's Hercules, where all the riders arrived. The Cayman delegation completed the challenging ride in

good form. This was the first time that a team from the Caribbean participated in the charity ride.

At the finish, Prince Albert and Premier McLaughlin had a moment for a chat where the Prince was introduced to the Cayman delegation. Later that evening at the awards reception the organisers, as well as the Prince, acknowledged the participation by the Premier and the Caymanian team. The highlight of the evening for the Cayman delegation was when Orrett Connor was awarded the 'silver pedal' for being the oldest cyclist to enter and finish the course.

Premier McLaughlin noted that the ride was difficult but rewarding. Not only did a cycling platform allow for building new relationships with high net worth individuals and business people across a diverse range of backgrounds in a key market segment for the Cayman Islands; it also gave both him and Chief Officer Bush an opportunity to firm up relationships with individuals they met last year – Prince Albert amongst them.

On Monday night the Premier and the Cayman delegation were joined by Mr. Joel Walton, CEO of the Maritime Authority of the Cayman Islands (MACI) to host a reception for yacht managers and yacht designers.

MACI operates one of the best regulated shipping registries in the world, accounting for about 50 per cent of the super yacht registration market, which are yachts of 30m (90 ft.) and larger. Within the ultra-large segment of the super yacht industry, which are yachts with a length of 80m (262 ft.) and larger, the

Cayman Islands has over 80 per cent of the market share; making Cayman, by far, the dominating flag state.

Whilst the Cayman Islands is a dominant er in this market segment there are many competitors looking for every opportunity to take our place," said the Premier, who is Minister responsible for International Trade, Investment, Aviation and Maritime Affairs. "In a market where relationships are key, it is important to not only show a presence but to do so consistently and whenever possible at the highest levels of Government. The new Ministry intends to not only strengthen our relationships and market share in this competitive market but to increase



The UK Government's upcoming response to the recently published Foreign Affairs Committee report on the relationship with the Overseas Territories was also discussed; as was the European Union blacklisting process and public registers of beneficial ownership. The Premier also met with Sir Jeffery Jowell, QC, who is advising the Cayman Islands Government on constitutional reform and the appeal of the Chief Justice's judgment that legalised same-sex marriages in the Cayman Islands.



The Premier also sponsored a Cayman Islands All Party Parliamentary Group (CI-APPG) dinner, with cross party attendance, at the House of Lords. The host of the dinner was Lord Northbrook, a member of the CI-APPG, and a long-time supporter of the Cayman Islands. At the dinner, the Premier raised the issue of the worrying trend by some UK parliamentarians to intervene in the affairs of the territories which they felt did not concern them, in particular the imposition of public registers of beneficial ownership by the UK Parliament as well as the approach taken by the

Foreign Affairs Committee in its recent report on the Territories, which he described as "alarming". The Premier said that such intervention, should it continue, would only serve to drive a wedge between the people of the territories and the United Kingdom and in the end will serve neither the interests of the UK nor the territories well.

The Cayman contingent then travelled to Monaco for meetings and engagements with key yacht brokers and industry leaders. The Maritime Authority of the Cayman Islands is hosting those meetings to advance the work of the new Ministry of International Trade, Investment, Aviation and Maritime Affairs. The Pre-



mier was then going on to participate in an annual charity bicycle ride of more than 87 miles to benefit the Princess Charlene of Monaco Foundation. The

Cayman Islands Government has partly sponsored the riding kit for the event and riding jerseys prominently display the Cayman Islands Coat of Arms.

Opposition Objects to Waiving of Backlog of Vehicle Licensing Fees



The Hon. Ezzard Miller, Leader of the Official Opposition, has raised concerns about the Cabinet's announced amnesty for owners of unlicensed vehicles, particularly with respect to the waiving of a backlog of millions of dollars in fees owed to Government.

"I am disappointed to see that the amnesty includes a waiver of the backlog of licensing fees, given that transgressors should be easily trackable in a timely way based on properly maintained file data," Mr. Miller said.

The waiving of fees, he said, is particularly troubling when Government is at the same time prosecuting Caymanians through the courts for unpaid medical bills, Mr. Miller said.

"By waiving the large backlog of licensing fees," Mr. Miller said, "the Government is falling back on the politically motivated non-punitive, forgiving position, because they have found themselves facing the embarrassment of not having insisted on the enforcement of the law as fees become due."

This consistent neglect of duty," Mr. Miller said, "is what leads to the breakdown of respect for the law."

Mr. Miller said, however, that the situation being what it is now, as the Government faces the discomfiture of this huge backlog, he could "accept a waiving of prosecution once outstanding fees are paid up in immediate response to the amnesty, even though in so doing we are turning a blind eye to the fact that operating an unlicensed vehicle on the road is a criminal offence under the Traffic Law."

But, he said, extending the amnesty to the waiving of "all collectable unpaid licensing fees, is beyond unacceptable—it is unconscionable."

"How can we justify prosecuting people through the courts because they were sick and could not pay bills, while we waive unpaid vehicle licensing fees and deprive government of substantial revenue which is needed to maintain the roads?" Mr. Miller asked.

As background, according to press reports on Thursday (April 26) there are some 37,000 unlicensed ve-

hicles, each owing a minimum of \$180 per year, totalling a minimum of \$6 million annually. Reports further indicate that some of the backlog goes back to as far as 2004.


"How did we get into this mess?"
Mr. Miller asked. "Where is the administrative accountability of the Department of Vehicles and Drivers' Licensing for the collection of

the fees and the RCIPS for the enforcement of the law?"

"This demonstrates the perennial problem of successive Cayman Islands Governments—the lack of enforcement of the laws on the books fully and properly and in a sustained way," Mr. Miller said.

Arrests for Bribery, Fraud and Breach of Trust

On Wednesday 24 April 2019 Anti-Corruption Commission Investigators, supported by Officers from the Royal Cayman Islands Police

Service, arrested an individual in connection with an ongoing investigation and previous arrests made on 12 October 2017, 9 May 2018, and 25 June 2018.

Responsible for investigating serious allegations of corruption the Investigators arrested the 55 year old male, from the Newlands area, on suspicion of committing the following offences:



- 1. Bribery of a public officer, contrary to s.10 of the Anti-Corruption Law;
- 2. Fraud on the Government, contrary

East End's sweet potato king

Franklin Smith farms a total of around 80 acres in East End. He has cultivated, fed, and nurtured the soil, year after year. "I am not ashamed of farming. I originally trained as a chef. But I gave up cooking for farming, because it is something I grew up with. My Grandfather and father farmed and I am walking in their footsteps," he said.

Mr. Smith is particularly proud of his massive crop of sweet potatoes: "By March 15 we'll have ten thousand holes of sweet potato planted. Yes sir, ten thousand. There is no other person who has ever planted that amount I'm expecting a return of ten pounds of sweet potato. In April, I am expecting 100,000 pounds of sweet potato," he said.

Mr. Smith sells to the local supermarkets, competing with sweet potatoes brought in from overseas, which aren't so fresh, he says. He has a pump that pumps water from an underground lens and from there over many miles of black pipes laid in long, parallel lines, bringing water right to the root of each plant. "In 1983 when I started this farm, this system was developed in Israel it's the

Israeli micro-jet System," he said. "The pump is only pumping ten gallons per minute so it doesn't allow pull the well down, but you've got all the water you want, pumping 24 hours a day."

One thing Mr. Smith would love to see is more use being made of the brown Sargasso seaweed that washes ashore, sometimes making piles many feet tall, and can be used as fertilizer. He feels very strongly about the importance of using it, because he knows about the benefits first-hand: "I have put sixty loads in here over the years," he said, pointing to a field that has rich, red sandy soil, and was full of young healthy sweet potato plants, and cassava around the outside. "How else do you think I could get this land so level and so good? I put it below the soil, and then put the red soil here on top. The sand comes in with the seaweed, and If you notice the texture its got sand and soil mixed together, so the root system is able to travel much faster and grow larger fruit," Mr. Smith said, adding that he would very much like the government to make the seaweed available to farmers, because it is so good for the soil.

Mr. Smith likes to do what a lot of Caymanian farmers have learnt, to use

the edges of fields to grow a variety of things, some of which are just for his own use. At the side of his field of sweet potatoes and cassava, there is a tall trellis made of sturdy posts and traversed with rows of barbed wire with a number of different young plants waiting to be trained to grow up it, including some tomatoes, passion fruit, and a couple of small dragon fruit plants. There is another fruit-bearing plant in the cactus family which Mr. Smith is not sure of the exact name of, but which can often be found growing over the highlands in East End. "I call it the vine pear. It looks like dragon fruit. Birds they eat it like crazy - it's sweet like honey," he said.

Nearly four decades of commercial growing in the Cayman Islands means that Mr. Smith has learned a few tips and tricks to make the most of Cayman's climate and soil. He digs earth over the runners from his pumpkin: "The reason is that the roots will get down in the moisture; they grow much bigger and much better. If the quality of your pumpkin is good, then you can take a piece of this off and put it somewhere else and as long as you've got good water running to it, it will bear real fast," he said.

"Mangoes are my biggest crop. In the whole Island there has got to be, I'd say, fifty or sixty percent of the island farmers and homeowners have gotten trees from me since 1980, when I introduced top quality mangos to this island. They are all over Grand Cayman I am happy to know that I have left my legacy in the Cayman Islands in Agriculture," Mr. Smith said. 🏵

BVI Premier Gets Multiple Assassination Threats

British Virgin Islands (BVI) Premier Andrew Fahie has revealed that he has received three major death threats and the matter has now been classified as a national security issue.

Fahie, whose Virgin Islands Party (VIP) was swept to power in the general elections earlier this year, said yesterday that Commissioner of Police Michael Matthews has been informed of the threats and law enforcement authorities already have some leads.

He made the disclosure in the House of Assembly. But he made it clear that although he had increased his personal security, he would not be deterred from doing his job.

"Since becoming Premier, it is now documented through authorities that I have received three major threats of assassination. And I want to tell these three entities here today, that you aren't going frighten me from doing the business of the people," Fahie told the House.

Defending the decision to hire bodyguards, which has been the subject of

criticism and ridicule, the Premier said it had to be done.

"We have sat down with the Commissioner of Police, we have sat down with private security...and we have made sure that the security that is needed, that will happen as the Premier of this territory....I don't like to know that taxpayers have to go through that. As a matter of fact, Mr Speaker, I bring it up because I noticed that before I got to make a speech, there are those making fun of it. But I don't take nobody making fun of my life," he said.

"I had to rearrange how my life has been going and it has not been a nice time....One time I even paused and say, is this even worth it? I used to be around this place free, free as a bird representing the people of the First [District] in this House doing what I got to do. Now because of some greedy people – that's who they are, because we have a tip-off what it's about – some greedy people want to see if they can assassinate the Premier."

Fahie said, however, that the threats had been predicted.

He said that before the elections, it had been prophesied by religious leaders that he would lead the BVI, and there was another prophecy that his life would be threatened.

And the Premier said his bodyguards have been advised to use lethal force against any would-be attackers.

"If anybody makes the attempts, I tell them to shoot and kill them," he disclosed.

Fahie's VIP won eight of Parliament's 13 seats in the general election on February 25, 2019.

The National Democratic Party which had formed the previous government won three seats, and the Progressive United and the Progressive Virgin Islands Movement won one each.

More Than 20 Feared Dead After Venezuelan Boat Capsizes En Route to Trinidad

The Trinidad and Tobago Coast Guard has joined the search and rescue mission for a boat carrying 25 people from Venezuela, which overturned on its way to the twin-island republic.

So far, only four of those on board the Venezuelan-registered pirogue have been rescued. The other 21 are unaccounted for and feared dead.

A statement issued by the Coast Guard yesterday said that it had received a report at 11:40 p.m. on Wednesday, that the vessel left Venezuela on Tuesday and reportedly overturned while at sea.

It reported the last known position of the vessel as two nautical miles (3.7

km) east of Patos Island, an island in the north-western Gulf of Paria and a part of Venezuela.

The Coast Guard explained that the coordination of the search and rescue operation in that geographic area is the responsibility of Venezuela, since Patos Island is located within the South American country's Maritime Rescue Coordination Centre.

But it said it is working closely with its Venezuelan counterparts to ensure an search and rescue operation.

Guyana Extradites Fugitive to US to Face Murder Charge

A 33-year-old man wanted for a 2011 murder in the United States is now in the custody of law enforcement authorities there after being extradited from Guyana.

Troy Thomas was arraigned yesterday before Queens Supreme Court Justice Kenneth Holder on an indictment charging him with second-degree murder, and was ordered held without bail. A new court date was set for June 13.

Thomas had allegedly gunned down 20-year-old Keith Frank outside a house party in South Richmond Hill, Queens, New York, just before Christmas 2011.

"The defendant has been on the run for seven years, but today he is in our custody and will answer for the senseless killing....The family of the victim deserves justice for their deceased loved one. The defendant now faces a lengthy term of incarceration for his alleged actions," Queens Assistant District Attorney John Ryan said in a statement.

Thomas faces up to 25 years in prison if convicted.

According to the charges, he became involved in a petty dispute with Frank

and allegedly shot him in the chest just a few blocks from his home. The young man was rushed to a nearby hospital where he was pronounced dead.

Thomas fled New York City but was tracked down and found living in Guyana. Guyana police apprehended the fugitive last year and he had remained in prison until his extradition on Wednesday, hours after he exhausted any further right to appeal the move. His return to the US followed more than a year of coordination between the Guyana government and the US Embassy.

In a statement, the US Embassy in Guyana thanked the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions, the Guyana Police Force, the Guyana Prison Service, the Minister of Public Security, and the staff at Cheddi Jagan International Airport for their close cooperation and commitment to justice.

"The Government of Guyana's actions over the past year clearly indicate its dedication to law and order and established norms of international criminal

justice," said US Ambassador to Guyana, Sarah-Ann Lynch.

"Guyana is moving in the right direction. Establishing a roadmap for future

extraditions, bringing a fugitive to justice, making Guyana a safer place for Guyanese citizens – this is the best example of rule of law existing in Guyana."

Cabinet Changes in Guyana As Resignations of Ministers with Dual Citizenship Take Effect

President David Granger has announced replacements for three of the four ministers who resigned from his Parliament over their dual citizenship.

In an address to the nation, he said the resignations offered earlier this month by Minister of Foreign Affairs Carl Greenidge, Minister of Business Dominic Gaskin, Minister of State in the Ministry of the Presidency Joseph Harmon, and Minister of the Public Service in the Ministry of the Presidency Dr Rupert Roopnaraine took effect yesterday.

"I thank these Ministers for their stewardship as members of my Cabinet and of the National Assembly since May 2015. Their sterling public service has been to our nation's benefit," Granger said in his address yesterday.

Although he announced that Haimraj Rajkumar replaces Gaskin as Minister of Business, Dawn Hamstings-Williams is new Minister of State in the Ministry of the Presidency, and Tabitha Sarabo-Halley takes over as Minister of the Public Service in the Ministry of the Presidency, Granger made no mention of a new Foreign Affairs Minister.

Neither did he say who would replace the four in the National Assembly which meets today. Their resignations came on the heels of a High Court judgment on January 31, which was affirmed by a majority decision of the Court of Appeal on March 22, that it is unconstitutional for a person holding dual citizenship to be elected as a Member of Parliament.

The first declaration came as the Chief Justice upheld the no-confidence motion passed against the coalition government on December 21st last year. The Court of

Appeal, although agreeing on the dual citizenship issue, subsequently ruled that the motion was invalid and the Opposition People's Progressive Party which had filed the motion and got the support of government backbencher Charrandass Persaud to pass it, has appealed to the Caribbean Court of Justice (CCJ) which will hear the matter on May 9 and 10.

President Granger said his acceptance of the resignations of the four ministers and the Cabinet reassignments were in keeping with the rulings of the High

Court and Court of Appeal.

"I have a duty to ensure that the Government acts in accordance with the

Constitution at all times," he said.

"The Constitution of the Cooperative
Republic of Guyana is the country's su-

preme law. Adherence to the Constitution is an essential element of democratic governance and the maintenance of public trust. Your Government is committed to upholding the Constitution unreservedly."

Granger also announced a reassignment of junior ministers.

Annette Ferguson is Minister in the Ministry of Communities, with responsibility for Housing; Simona Charles-Broomes is Minister in the Minis-

try of the Presidency with responsibility for Youth Affairs; and Valerie Patterson-Yearwood is Minister in the Ministry of Agriculture with responsibility for Rural Affairs.

"I assure you that these appointments and reassignments will ensure your Government's continued commitment to serve our people and the nation," the President said.



Lack of Windies spin worries Holding

Michael Holding believes spin bowling will be vital at the upcoming 50over Cricket World Cup in England and Wales, even if conditions are likelier to suit quicker bowlers.

The West Indies 15-member squad for the May 30 to July 14 showpiece relies on pace bowling and looks thin on spin

In the absence — through a reported finger injury — of superstar spinner Sunil Narine, the off-break bowler Ashley Nurse is the sole recognised specialist spinner.

"Talking in theory, one spinner, these days, in a squad of 15 is a little bit low in count. I think most teams would be taking two spinners," Holding, the legendary former pace bowler, said.

The middle-order batsman Fabian Allen, a handy left-arm orthodox spinner, is included mainly for his bowling, while veteran opener Chris Gayle, who bowls

off spin, is the other slow bowling option available to captain Jason Holder.

"The part-time thing doesn't work that well in one-day cricket anymore. Part-timers tend to go for a lot of runs these days," said Holding, 65, who claimed 249 wickets in 60 Test matches in addition to 142 victims in 102 ODI for the West Indies.

The West Indies squad features specialist pacers Shannon Gabriel, Kemar Roach, Sheldon Cottrell and promising youngster Oshane Thomas. Gayle, Evin Lewis, Darren Bravo, Shimron Hetmyer, Shai Hope, Andre Russell and Holder are expected to carry the batting load.

Seam bowling all-rounders Holder, Carlos Brathwaite, and Russell — if he is fit enough to bowl — are also expected to provide vital overs. It is likely that Russell will not be asked to consistently bowl 10 overs in an innings because of long-running knee problems. Nicholas

Pooran, the exciting middle order batsman, and the established Hope are the wicketkeeping options.

Jamaican Holding, whose first-class career ran between 1972 and 1989, agreed with the general perception that pitches will heavily favour batting.

"What I suspect is that the pitches will be quite flat because it's the World Cup — it's not going to be a situation in which England are looking for an advantage. I don't expect the ball to be seaming all over the place.

"How much movement the ball does through the air will depend on overhead conditions, but then again the white doesn't move as much as the red ball. I don't suspect bowler-friendly pitches I expect there'll be quite a few runs scored."

Now a TV pundit, Holding will work on several West Indies games at the World Cup, plus their two official warmup games ahead of the tournament.

Russell is probably the most relieved to be included in the squad. The 30-year-old Jamaican has played only one

one-day international since 2015. A Twenty20 specialist in recent years, his inclusion comes ahead of all-rounder Marlon Samuels.

Russell, who completed a one-year anti-doping whereabouts ban in January 2018, played an ODI against Bangladesh in July last year but a knee injury has limited his appearances since then - although he is currently starring in the Indian Premier League.

Teams can make changes to their squads before May 23 - but can only alter them after that in the event of injuries, with any changes needing to be approved by the International Cricket Council.

West Indies play Ireland and Bangladesh in a triangular one-day series from May 5-13, before starting their World

Cup campaign against Pakistan at Trent Bridge, Nottingham on May 31.

"I'm so hungry now to represent the West Indies," Russell said. "The last time I joined the West Indies team was recently, when I had taken two injections to better my knee and it flared up again. I was so upset. I was watching the game against England and couldn't do anything about it.

"But as I said, I'm so hungry right now to play for West Indies. Like I'm doing here, hit sixes and score centuries."

Kipchoge is marathon king again

Kenyan athlete Eliud Kipchoge stormed to victory in the London Marathon to become the first man to win the event four times and set a new course record in the process.

It's the latest achievement for arguably the greatest marathon runner in history - his time of two hours, two minutes and 37 seconds is the second fastest marathon of all time. He has won 11 of the 12 marathons he's ever entered.

The rest of the field simply couldn't handle the pace as Kipchoge, 34, sped on at the halfway mark and then again with just over a mile left to run.

His time was slightly off his own world record pace of two hours, one minute and 39 seconds - which he set at the Berlin Marathon in 2018.

Meanwhile, Brigid Kosgei was the clear winner of the women's race after dominating the field with a phenomenal run.

It was the Kenyan's first win in the London Marathon and she crossed the line over a minute ahead of second-placed defending champion Vivian Cheruiyot.

The 25-year-old's time of two hours, 18 minutes and 20 seconds highlighted an impressive second-half of the race after a slow start to the women's event.

Prince Harry, Duke of Sussex, was on hand at the finish line to award the winners their medals and watch runners through the streets of London.

His attendance was not confirmed in advance with the birth of his child due any day.

British Olympic legend Mo Farah finished fifth on a breezy day in England's capital, as he continues his education of the longer distances.

His public feud with Ethiopian Olympic gold medallist Haile Gebrselassie did not appear to affect Farah who lapped up the applause from the home support that lined the streets.

He finished in two hours, five minutes and 39 seconds. •

Barcelona secure La Liga thanks to Messi

Barcelona secured the 2018-19 La Liga title ahead of Liverpool's visit to Camp Nou for Wednesday's Champions League semi-final first leg.

Lionel Messi came off the bench at the start of the second half and subsequently scored the only goal of Saturday's home clash with Levante.

The 62nd-minute strike was Messi's 34th league goal of the season and his 46th in all competitions this term.

The result established an unassailable advantage for Barcelona over Atletico Madrid in Spain's top division with three matches remaining in the campaign.

Liverpool take on Ernesto Valverde's team in the opening game of their Champions League last-four tie with the return at Anfield six days later.

It is Barca's 26th league title and nudges them closer to Real Madrid's record of 33 in Spain.

"To win the title with a distance and gap is difficult with the rivals we have. We've done it two years in a row," Barca coach Ernesto Valverde said.

"We're happy and to see people enjoying it makes us proud. But we still have challenges ahead."

Green may leave Warriors

Draymond Green is one of the most underrated NBA stars and when his contract expires after next season he could be in line for a big payday, but it may not come from the Golden State Warriors.

After winning three championships with the Golden State Warriors and a Defensive Player of the Year award in 2017, Green is rumoured to be seeking a max contract or big contract extension.

Green's contract officially expires after the 2019-20 season, where he is expected to hit the open free agency market. And after reportedly taking less the last time he signed a contract extension with the Warriors, in 2015, Green feels that he could be in line for a big contract extension – this time perhaps without taking less.

"I took less so we could go after KD," Green said. "I am a student of this game, and I studied the business side of it and the numbers, where some people don't. They leave it up to their agent to do it."

If Green, 29, played for another team besides the Warriors, there is the possibility that he could be the leader of an NBA franchise player.

What he brings to the Warriors is undeniable. He plays roughly 31 minutes a game and is the team's ultimate utility player.

Offensively, his pass-first nature greatly complements the splash brothers. Green always makes sure Stephen Curry gets the ball at the right time. His ability to set up off-ball screens is essential to the team's success.

His ability to get assists reduces Curry's responsibility on the offensive end of the court. Green is also a threat to score from the 3-point line. However, his shooting is too spotty for any team to count on a consistent basis.

Defensively, he brings a toughness and edge to any team that is essential in winning.

He is the only person in NBA history to get 500 rebounds, 500 assists, 100 steals, and 100 blocks in multiple seasons.
