Cayman Airways Express saves the day

Golson arriving in Grand Cayman at 3.50pm.

The Cayman Airways Boeing 737-300 aircraft arrived 20 minutes early and departed for Grand Cayman ahead of schedule. Passengers were delighted as they were expected to arrive at 3.30pm. Unfortunately, this was not to be. As the George Town runway came into sight the captain advised passengers that he was placed in a holding pattern as the Owen Roberts Airport had just been closed.

The plane circled for 20 minutes off the George Town coast before eventually flying to Cayman Brac to await the re-opening of the Airport. Passengers stayed on the plane at the Charles Kirkconnell International Airport for an hour before being advised that the flight was being terminated in Cayman Brac and all passengers would have to disembark and be processed by customs.

By then due to the efficiency of Social Media and local news agencies, the news of partial damage to a temporary asphalt ramp causing the airport to be closed had circulated to all passengers.

Passengers were professionally accommodated in the Brac and the Cayman Airways staff advised that the airport had been reopened with a re-declared distance, allowing limited flight operations to resume. Plans had been made for the 2 Cayman Airways Express Saabs to travel to the Brac to collect 68 passengers with the remainder returning the next morning on the jet at 7am.

The arrival of the Saab's and return flights were flawless and the first group of 34 arrived in Grand Cayman at 9.30pm bringing a 6-hour journey to a safe and happy ending with applause from all passengers.

Contingency Plan

Beacon Farms: growing crops, ideas, and new lives

The Bridge Foundation, a kind of half-way-house in West Bay for people who have been struggling with substance abuse. The Foundation gives people the opportunity to participate in a 12-step, 6-month programme, similar to Alcoholics Anonymous. After operating for several years, Executive Director Bud Volinsky was concerned that too many people who had completed the program were returning to their old lifestyle: "In the end we nailed it to being an issue of employment," he said. It is OK to go through a programme, but the trouble is, many people still find it hard to find a job, especially if they have a criminal record. For those who come to Beacon Farms, the rate of falling-back has decreased by 90 percent, Mr. Volinsky said.

That is where the 34 acres of land, now known as Beacon Farms comes in.

A couple of years ago, with the help of a kind benefactor, the Foundation was able to buy the overgrown land, and transform it. It is already giving real employment to a dozen people. They are mostly growing tobacco at the moment, and they have their own on-island cigar-rolling factory, all proceeds going back to the Foundation, and plans to market the brand all over the world. They are also working on developing their coconut oil factory, which takes in locally-grown coconuts, producing oil and coconut flour, too. The farm also grows pineapples, bananas mangos sweetsop, soursop, avocado, limes and jackfruit.

It's about growing new ideas which act like a beacon for other farms. One of those ideas is a static-aeration composting system, where green waste, both from the farm, but also from landscaping companies is chipped and composted

down with help from air which is piped into the heap from pipes running through the concrete base. The reactions inside the heap cause it to reach such a high temperature that it becomes sterile and pathogen-free. The result, in just over two weeks, is high-grade organic compost that will be bagged and sold. But there are many other ideas growing there too.

It is also about growing and developing talent. There are many different departments at the farm, ranging from heavy equipment to construction, to plant propagation and cultivation, and many of the people who go there already have some skills to offer, which are nurtured and cultivated. It isn't about short-term, it all about long-term sustainability, with benefits not only for local farming, but for Cayman society.

Robert Ramoon, who works in plant propagation said: "God is the creator. I want to be next to the creator, and see the plants start from seed and grow. I love nature. I love plants and I love growing things. We try not to use any chemical that is not organic. It has to be organic."

"My recovery depends on me. It's what I do at the end of the day. But having a stable job in a place like this, where there are other people like me who are putting their life back together, and saying: "You know what? I've had enough (of the old way of life). It makes me feel good." 🌱

Reopening of Red Cross building

The Red Cross was celebrating the formal opening its refurbished and renovated new building, opposite the Cricket Field in George Town, which acts as headquarters, a hurricane shelter, and a thrift shop, on Wednesday 12 February.

Red Cross Director Jondo Obi outlined some of the Red Cross's international principles, during a short ceremony outside the building which has stood there for more than 30 years, and was in urgent need of extensive renovation. "Those principles are, Humanity, impartiality, Neutrality, Independence, Voluntary Service, Unity, and Universality," she said. "We are worldwide, and we have a network of 192 national Red Crosses. Our mission is always to protect life and health, while preserving human dignity. We are neutral, so we do not take sides in conflicts, or in politics. We are very unique, because under international law, the Geneva Conventions, we have a special, auxiliary status with all our respective governments. Some see this as just a building, but for us, we see this as the embodiment of community support," she added.

The Red Cross was begun in 1961 by National Hero, Ms Ethel Cook Boddan, "There were certain disasters in the region, and she thought it would be a good idea, since she came from the UK," Ms Obi said. In 1973 the first Red Cross Committee was begun. The Chairman

was the late John Gray, and the secretary was Ms. Janilee Clifford, who is here with us today," she said.

Red Cross Chairman Douglas Moffatt said: "After 30 years of service to Cayman, our building was in dire need of renovation and all-round improvement. We needed to bring it in line with current building codes, and we didn't have adequate facilities to provide what we thought was a safe and humane refuge, during the Hurricane season, and most notably it was not accessible to persons with disabilities."

Plans for renovation began in 2015, and work started in 2017. It was a big project, and would not have been possible without many people stepping up to the plate and helping, he said, not only by making donations, but also by donations of services; such as building and architectural services. There was a CI 600,000 budget for the renovations, in the end, he said, some of which was raised by the Shelter from the Storm campaign, run by the Red Cross.

Hon Tara Rivers said: "this is a community effort, and we celebrate the many contributions through cash or kind. The shelter is now a flagship emergency relief centre for the local area, and certainly the centre will provide the community with benefit for many years to come. These upgrades are made possible in part, due to the funding provided

ed by the Government, and I thank Minister McTaggart for being here as well, representing the Government through the Ministry of Financial Services and Home Affairs."

Inside the lovely new interior houses the thrift shop, which not only raises

funds for the Red Cross but also provides people with a means of buying nice clothes, shoes and toys that they might otherwise find difficult to budget for: Upstairs is a hurricane shelter area, and was the scene of lots of photo-ops as well as refreshments. 🌐

Interrogating the concepts of Integrity and Ethics

Confucius - 'To see what is right, and not to do it, is want of courage or of principle.'

On 18 and 19 October 2018, under its Education for Justice (E4J) initiative, the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) organized an Expert Workshop for university lecturers aimed at enhancing their capacity to teach integrity and ethics. The Expert Workshop was held at the Universidad del Rosario, hosted and co-organized by the University's Centre for Ethics and Citizenship.

Having recently completed the development of the Education for Justice (E4J) University Modules on Integrity and Ethics, the UNODC has rolled them out and is engaging as many universities and academics as possible to strengthen integrity and ethics education worldwide.

I had the privilege of attending this event. The teaching of ethics and integrity must be an important component of education itself, and in my view, especially at the tertiary levels.

The University Modules on Integrity and Ethics developed by the experts chosen by the UNODC is a treasure trove of scholarly and practical information on the subject. They cover such areas as ethics and universal values, ethics and society, ethical leadership, ethics, diversity and pluralism, challenges to ethical living, strategies for ethical action, behavioural ethics, gender dimensions of ethics, media integrity and ethics, professional ethics and integrity, ethics and law.

This article discusses briefly the concepts of ethics and integrity. The current preference is towards a shift from 'corruption' studies, to a widening and broadening of the focus to examining integrity and ethics. It is believed that this more 'comprehensive perspective' allows us to move beyond discussions about the difference between right and wrong, in order to focus on relationships and behaviour as well.

Derived from the Greek word ethos, ethics is that branch of philosophy that covers systems of moral principles essentially seeking to answer the question: 'How should we live our lives?'

Considerations of right and wrong must have weighed heavily on the minds of our specie from the most primeval times, however, in the western tradition, the formal study of ethics began with the Greek philosopher, Socrates, who saw morality as a kind of self-discovery to know what is right. Others after him such as Plato, taught character based ethics emphasizing such qualities as courage, temperance, justice and prudence.

Whereas the term integrity is used in various contexts, from the perspective of philosophy, it involves considerations of the ethical and the moral dimensions of our lives. In fact, integrity treats, firstly, with how we see and relate to ourselves, and, secondly, the moral constraints that we place on our behaviours with each other.

The following is a quote from UNODC's module 'Introduction and Conceptual Framework':

'The concept of integrity has been derived from the Latin "integritas" (wholeness). It is defined as consistency between beliefs, decisions and actions, and continued adherence to values and principles. When someone is described as a person of integrity, the suggestion is that such a person is not corruptible as a result of the "wholeness" and "connectedness" of the values and principles that such a person subscribes to.

'Integrity is often used in conjunction with ethics, suggesting that the values and principles that are adhered to should be ethical values. Some of the values that are often mentioned in this regard are honesty, openness, accountability and trustworthiness. Organizational integrity refers to the ability of individual organizations to develop and implement an integrity management framework, and for employees to act in accordance with the values of the organization.'

The concept of ethics always comes back to the question of - how ought we to live? What is right conduct? How do we 'know' what is right conduct? How can we be sure that ethical values such as trustworthiness, responsibility, respect, compassion, fairness, honesty, integrity, transparency, accountability, stewardship and excellence are key universal values that are worth promoting?

With the rise of China as the world's second largest economy, and the international, political and cultural influence that comes with this, ethicists have become particularly interested in Confucianism. Confucius was a famous Chinese thinker and social philosopher whose teachings have deeply influenced East Asia for centuries. He lived approxi-

mately between 551 and 479 BC and was a founder of the Ru School of Chinese thought. He is credited with such quotations as 'He who will not economize, will have to agonize', 'I hear and I forget, I see and I remember, I do and I understand', 'It does not matter how slowly you go, so long as you do not stop', and 'To see what is right, and not to do it, is want of courage or of principle.'

As an ethical and philosophical teaching, the main ethical principle of Confucianism is humanism- the belief that human beings can be taught good qualities, how to respect each other and how good engage in respectful, yet meaningful communication. A fundamental teaching is that organizations, economics, and societies are built on relationships and that the blueprint for fostering trusting healthy is taking seriously the Golden Rule, demonstrating humanity towards others, and seeking the good of others over our own interests.' Everyone, no matter the status is worthy of our respect and should be treated as we would want to be treated.

As the module points out, he also considered ethics to mean questions of how we ought to live, what goes into a worthwhile life, how to weigh duties toward family versus duties toward strangers and whether human nature is predisposed to be morally good or bad. He even considers how one ought to relate to the non-human world, the extent to which one ought to become involved in reforming the larger social and political structures of one's society, and how one ought to conduct oneself when in a position of influence or power.

Clearly, discussions about integrity and ethics address the fundamental distinction between right and wrong. It also considers how we might best arrive at this distinction. As pointed out by the module, arriving at decision is much more difficult than deciding whether we prefer one type of food to another, or whether the answer to a simple mathematical equation is right or wrong.

Ethical theories were developed to help us navigate what are sometimes challenging decisions of a moral nature. We examine a few of these in the next article.

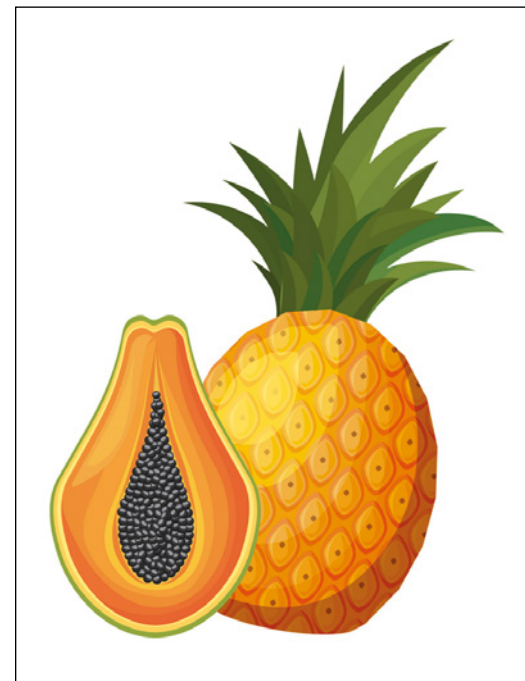

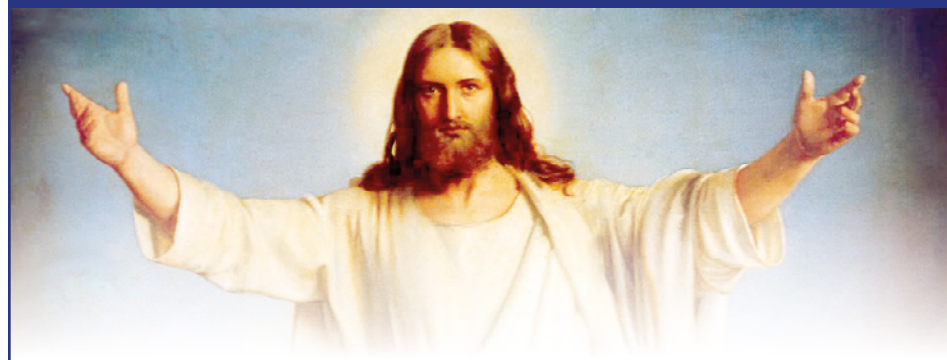
Water-Related Death

Canada's indigenous block new pipeline

Canada has seen protestors block access to road shipping ports and commuter rail lines in support of indigenous groups fighting the construction of a pipeline on their traditional territory.

Police arrested several activists in Vancouver who were part of a group that has blocked access to four shipping ports in recent days.

The protests are part of a nationwide show of support for the embattled Wet'suwet'en hereditary chiefs in the province of British Columbia – and for the 21 Indigenous activists who have been arrested in the past two weeks on Wet'suwet'en lands.

The chiefs have steadfastly refused to allow Coastal GasLink to construct part of its 670km natural gas pipeline through their traditional territory.

But last year, the British Columbia supreme court outraged the Wet'suwet'en, granting an injunction in favour of Coastal GasLink, which it said has suffered irreparable harm as a result of sustained opposition to the project. The chiefs maintain they never ceded land title to the province or federal gov-

ernment and thus maintain jurisdiction over the territory.

The US\$5bn project has the support of 20 elected First Nations councils along the proposed route. Five of the six elected band councils in the Wet'suwet'en nation also support the pipeline. But Wet'suwet'en chiefs say the authority of these groups only applies to reservations – not traditional territory.

On Friday, members of the Tyendinaga Mohawk territory in Ontario parked a dump truck with a snowplough blade near a rail line, halting the Toronto-Ottawa corridor, one of the busiest commuter rail lines in the country. Dozens of trips over the weekend were cancelled. 🌐

Filipinos turn on Chinese over coronavirus

The Philippines announced the first death outside China from the coronavirus on Feb. 2 which originated in the central Chinese city of Wuhan late last year. The news set into motion a considerable public outcry targeting Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte and reignited a long history of racist treatment towards anyone of Chinese heritage.

Duterte's perceived reluctance to respond quickly to the virus, which critics saw as tied to his administration's cordial relations with the Chinese government, led the hashtag #OustDuterte to trend on Twitter.

The virus has not only shaken public trust in Duterte's government, which remains broadly popular, but it has also worsened the already fraught relationship between the majority of ethnic Filipinos and the country's sizable community of Chinese Filipinos, known locally as Tsinoyos, along with hundreds of thousands of Chinese nationals residing in the Philippines. While Chinese Filipinos are well integrated into Philippine society, resentment sometimes arises due to their

relative wealth and their presence among the nation's elite.

Duterte announced an entry ban on Chinese travellers from affected areas on Jan. 31, one day after saying he did not want to restrict the entry of Chinese nationals. Two days later, the ban was expanded to all foreigners traveling from China and Hong Kong.

At press time, several cases have been confirmed in the Philippines, and over 300 people remain under watch for possible infections.

The anti-government backlash was sparked in the days before the travel ban. As Filipinos fretted about the virus's arrival, Health Secretary Francisco Duque rejected the idea of a temporary ban on Chinese tourists, saying it would spark "political and diplomatic repercussions." 🌐

Church campaigns to protect Hondurans

The Christian Lutheran Church of Honduras (ICLH) is sustaining its campaign to denounce the corruption, poverty and injustice that has forced hundreds of thousands of people to flee north towards Mexico and the United States in search of peace and security.

Standing alongside other churches and civil society organisations, ICLH members took part in protests in recent weeks denouncing the policies of a government that they accuse of dragging the country into an acute social and economic crisis.

On Jan. 29 church members took part in an ecumenical action outside the National Congress in the capital of Tegucigalpa. Among the policies they were protesting was the government's decision not to renew the mandate of the Mission to Support the Fight against Corruption and Impunity in Honduras (MACCIH), set up by the Organisation of American States in 2016

to investigate allegations of corruption by public officials and private citizens.

Demonstrators also took part in a protest as part of events marking Honduran Women's Day, denouncing the government of President Juan Orlando Hernandez whose election they have contested since he was declared the winner of the November 2017 ballot. Several people have died in election related protests, while the president has failed to fulfil his promise of tackling organised crime, drug violence and gang warfare. The country continues to have one of the highest murder rates per capita in the world. 🌐

Cuba to trade vehicles in dollars

Cuba's cash-strapped government will start selling cars in tradeable currencies rather than in convertible Cuban pesos from Feb. 24 as it continues to introduce the American dollar in swathes of its retail sector.

The country's inefficient state-run economy is going through a liquidity crisis due to the implosion of ally Venezuela's economy and the tightening of the decades-old US trade embargo under President Donald Trump.

In recent months, the government has opened around 80 "dollar stores" selling some of the items such as home appliances and car parts that it must buy abroad in tradeable currencies.

Finance Minister Meisi Bolaños Weiss said there would be a discount of 10 percent on the current price in convertible pesos, although that means they will remain at a huge mark-up given

the current mark ups of 400 percent or more.

That means modern cars will not crowd out the 1950s vintage Chevys and Soviet-era Ladas that still dominate Cuba's streets any time soon. The profit will go towards a fund for improving Cuba's inadequate public transportation.

The price of imported vehicles is prohibitive for almost all Cubans as they range from \$15,000 to \$110,000 in a country where the average annual salary is less than \$6,000. 🌐

Venezuela still has Russia's support

Russia's foreign minister Sergey Lavrov visited Caracas last Friday in a show of support for Venezuela's President Nicolás Maduro.

United States president Donald Trump met Venezuela's opposition leader Juan Guaidó at the White House two weeks ago. After disputing president Nicolas Maduro's 2018 controversial re-election, Guaidó proclaimed himself the country's interim president, and was backed by almost 60 countries, including the EU, the US and UK.

Lavrov urged the international community to back a "political and diplomatic" solution to Venezuela's troubles and denounced the US campaign to oust Maduro with sanctions. The Trump administration unveiled fresh sanctions against a fleet of commercial planes belonging to the Venezuelan state-owned CONVIASA airlines.

Maduro also condemned Trump's support of Guaidó. Under Maduro's leadership, Venezuela has suffered an economic collapse. More than four million citizens have fled the country, many to Colombia.

"Sadly, Venezuela's crisis is part of a grand campaign with the end goal of overthrowing the legitimate government. We consider this scenario unacceptable", Lavrov said.

He also met with other officials to talk about cooperation in areas such as energy, mining, agriculture, medicine and military-technical cooperation:

"It is important to develop our military technical cooperation to increase the defence capacity of our friends against outside threats," Lavrov added.

Russia and Venezuela have a political, military and economic alliance that began years ago between Russia's president Vladimir Putin and Venezuela's late-president Hugo Chávez. 🌐

Jamaican detainees flown out of UK

The UK Home Office has proceeded with a planned deportation flight to Jamaica of detainees who have committed crimes despite some serving their sentences many years ago and not breaking the law since. Some had even arrived in the UK as children and now have little or no connection with Jamaica. This has led to mass outrage and protests.

The flight left on Tuesday despite a court of appeal judge ordering the Home Office not to deport many of the detainees amid concerns over their access to legal advice.

A Home Office spokesman said: "We make no apology for trying to protect the public from serious, violent and persistent foreign national offenders. The court ruling does not apply to all of the foreign national offenders due to be deported and we are therefore proceeding with the flight."

It was unclear immediately how many people were on board the flight, but it is thought to be around 50.

On Monday night, a court of appeal judge ordered the Home Office not to carry out the scheduled deportation

amid concerns mobile phone outages had prevented detainees from having access to legal advice.

Lady Justice Simler said those detainees should not be removed unless the Home Office was satisfied, they "had access to a functioning, non-O2 Sim card on or before Feb. 3."

The action had been brought because there has been a problem with the O2 phone network in the Heathrow detention centres since last month, meaning many detainees had been unable to exercise their legal right to contact their lawyers.

The Home Office had argued the flight was "specifically for deporting foreign national offenders", adding that "those detained for removal include people convicted of manslaughter, rape, violent crime and dealing class A drugs". But some of those on the flight had been imprisoned for short terms and relatively minor offences. 🌐

Giannis will keep hold of MVP title

Superstar forward Giannis Antetokounmpo is happy the Milwaukee Bucks' front office didn't make any trades at the trade deadline last week. He likes the cohesion and team spirit and feels a newcomer might disrupt the balance.

Antetokounmpo is eager to lead the Bucks to the championship this season after what transpired in the 2019 playoffs. Milwaukee lost to Kawhi Leonard and the Toronto Raptors in six games in the Eastern Conference Finals despite the fact they had a 2-0 lead in the series before the Canadian franchise won four games in a row.

The Bucks were 44-7 this season at press time. Antetokounmpo is averaging 30.2 points, 13.4 rebounds and 5.8 assists while shooting 55.3 percent from the field, 31.3 percent from beyond the arc and 61.2 percent from the free-throw line.

He could win his second straight MVP award since he's putting up stellar numbers once more and the Bucks are cruising through the regular season.

In betting circles, the "Greek Freak" is a prohibitive favourite for the award which makes sense. Luka Doncic of the Dallas Mavericks is the likely second placed candidate, but LeBron James has also been amazing for the Los Angeles Lakers. He admits that Kobe Bryant's untimely death last month has hit him

hard and is probably even more focused in training and games to honour his hero's great legacy.

The Mavericks will not prohibit Doncic from participating in the NBA All-Star Game on Sunday if his ankle feels healthy enough to play. He was ruled out for Monday's game against the Utah Jazz, but Mavs head coach Rick Carlisle said the team would have no issue with Doncic's desire to play "if that's how the timing of his recovery works out".

Monday night marked Doncic's seventh consecutive absence from the line up as he continues to recover from a sprained right ankle suffered during a practice at the end of January. The Mavs are being especially cautious with his health given he suffered the same injury earlier in the season.

Slovenian Doncic has been tremendous in his second season, averaging 28.8 points, 9.5 rebounds and 8.7 assists through his first 43 games while also leading the league in offensive box plus-minus and ranking third in value over replacement player. Quite impressive stats for a 20-year-old.

In the Western Conference, James has led the Lakers to the No. 1 spot in the

standings by leading the NBA in assists with a career-high 10.8 at the tender age of 35. His point production (25.1) is its lowest since his rookie NBA season, but that goes with the territory when playing alongside a second superstar in Anthony Davis.

Who has had the best season for the best team? Giannis and LeBron get the nods there. Doncic, even though he has missed nine of 52 games due to injuries, leads the NBA in triple doubles with 12 for the Mavericks.

Another overachieving team is the Miami Heat, and there is an argument to be made that Jimmy Butler is a more worthy choice than Doncic. That argument is not based upon the big three stats: points rebounds and assists, because Doncic has the edge in all three.

Rather, for those who subscribe to the "winning means everything" mentality will note that the Heat have more victories (34 to 31) than the Mavericks, and Miami are competing for third place in the East during a season in which the traditional discrepancy between the relative strength of the East and the relative strength of the West has disappeared. 🌐

Depressed Pele becomes reclusive through ill health

Legendary Brazil footballer Pele is reluctant to leave his house because he cannot walk unaided, his son has said.

The three-time World Cup winner, widely regarded as the greatest player of all time, was taken to hospital with a urinary infection last year.

Pele, 79, has had problems with his hip for some time and now needs a frame to walk, with many of his recent public appearances in a wheelchair.

"He is very sheepish, reclusive," his son Edinho said. Pele scored a world record total of 1,281 goals in 1,363 appearances during his 21-year career, including 77 goals in 91 appearances for Brazil.

His health has been a concern in recent years and he had prostate surgery

in 2015 after he was admitted to hospital for the second time in six months.

"Imagine, he's the King, he was always such an imposing figure and today he can't walk properly," Edinho explained.

"He's embarrassed, he doesn't want to go out, be seen, or do practically anything that involves leaving the house.

"He's pretty fragile. He had a hip replacement and didn't have an adequate or ideal rehabilitation. So he has this problem with mobility and that has set off a kind of depression."

This June marks the 50th anniversary of Pele's final World Cup title, won in Mexico with what many believe to be the greatest team of all time. 🌐

Hamilton makes up with dad ahead of new season

Lewis Hamilton has spoken candidly about his attempts to repair what he says has been "not the easiest of relationships" with father Anthony. The pair's heritage is Grenadian.

The six-time world champion was managed by his father when he started in Formula 1 in 2007. But that working relationship ended in 2010, after which they did not speak for a time.

"Our journey hasn't been an easy one," said Mercedes driver Hamilton on social media.

"Over time, we lost that father-son bond and it has been something we have both wanted back for so long."

The 35-year-old Brit's Mercedes team unveil their 2020 car on Friday before pre-season testing starts at Spain's Circuit de Barcelona-Catalunya on Wednesday.

It is the machine Hamilton hopes will take him to a seventh world ti-

tle, which would equal Michael Schumacher's record.

Hamilton is also just seven victories short of the German's record 91 wins, a mark he will surpass this season if he keeps up his average of 10 victories a year which he secured since Mercedes started their dominant run in 2014.

Hamilton said: "I'm going to be a machine this year; on another level than ever before." 🌐

Russell: We'll retain our World T20 crown

Andre Russell, the explosive West Indies all-rounder, believes that his team can retain the World T20 crown later this year in Australia.

"We are going to win the World Cup and there are no two ways about it. We have to go into the World Cup wanting to win and having that mindset — you cannot think that some team is better than us," he said.

Under a new, more positive West Indies Cricket regimes, Russell feels the West Indies will be a power again. "A lot needs to be still done. We are looking towards ourselves and trying to bring back the old days of winning series and winning the fans again. This won't happen overnight, and we all have to make sure that whatever tournament we take part, we do our best that we can."

Jamaican Russell believes he can still improve. "I just want to be the best all-rounder but I have been struggling with my knees and I cannot really get to do what I want to do in the middle. With

what I believe I know I can still stand and hit the balls for fours and sixes. I want to leave my name over there so that any youngster can say they want to be like (Andre) Russell and do what he has done.

"I am 31, I still have a long way to go. My goal is try and win at least 13 league championships around the world before I retire. That is lot of championships, to be honest, but those are the goals I have set for myself and I want to score over 10,000 to 12,000 T20 runs."

Russell's approach has made cricket entertaining and he wants the sport to figure in the Olympics. "Cricket needs to be part of the Olympics. It's a big international sport and I am not going to say that some of the sport I have seen in the Olympics are not relevant. I believe cricket is one of the worldwide sports and I am just disappointed that it is still not part of the Olympics. I want to see cricket in Olympics even it is played in T10 or even five-over format, but cricket should be there." 🌐

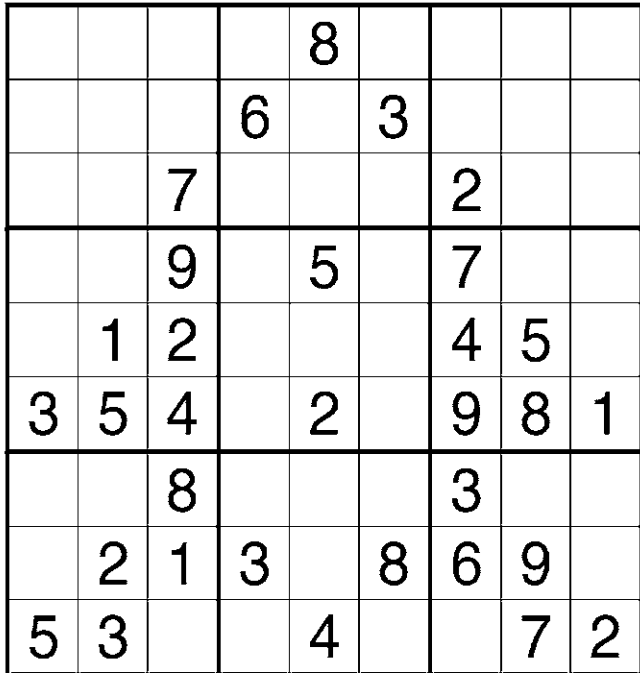
