## Evolution of the National Museum

Sitting proudly on the George Town harbor-front, the Cayman Islands National Museum takes pride of place on this stretch of coastline, a building of significant importance to the Islands that houses memories of time gone by as well as new and changing exhibitions that all speak to tell the tale of the Cayman Islands.

### Early beginnings

The Cayman Islands National Museum is nowadays said to house more than 9,000 historic artefacts. This impressive collection can be traced back to one individual – Mr Ira Thompson, who collected artefacts as a hobby back in the 1930s. In 1979 his collection was recognised by Government as an important source of Caymanian memorabilia and so Government purchased the collection for the people of the Cayman Islands.

The structure itself has had a fascinating history. Built in the 1830s as a building where government business could take place, it is one of only a handful of buildings from the era and the oldest public building in the Cayman Islands. Known as the Old Courts Building, as it

## Bryan blocks Opposition no confidence vote

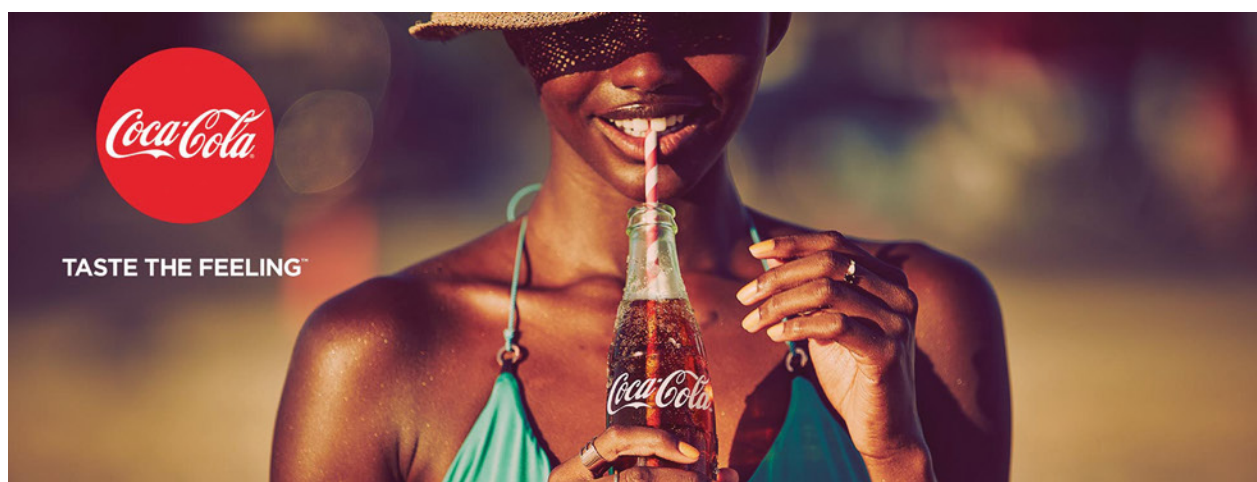

# How to Produce a Marketing Budget

If your marketing budget is just a vague figure floating around in your head, here are some ideas to help you.

Marketing is a necessary business function, akin to finance and customer service — but I'd argue it's equally important as those. Crafting a marketing budget is vital because it forces business owners to consider the cost of getting sales.

Here's some advice for creating a budget that can work for you — and lead to more sales.

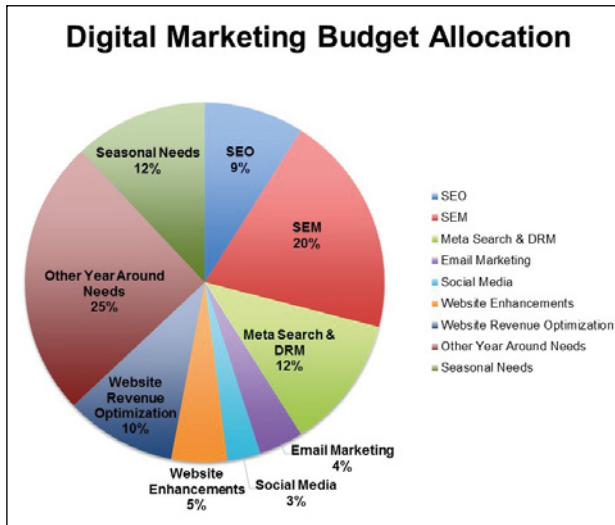
## Have a Plan

Creating a marketing budget requires more than just arithmetic and accounting. Outlining your business goals shapes your thinking about the marketing collaterals and activities you must focus on. Three useful tactics to guide you are:

**1. Define Goals:** Ask yourself and teammates questions such as: Should the company expand or retain market share? Should you seek new customers or focus on getting more revenue from existing customers? Such questions will guide how you apportion marketing dollars and focus your campaigns.

**2. Evaluate Spending:** A common yardstick for defining marketing spend is to use 7% to 10% gross revenues for a small business, 4% to 6% for an established business that wants to expand, and 3% to 4% for an established business that wants to preserve its position. This assumes you have the funds to cover your expenses, including marketing.

**3. Brainstorm Strategies:** Rank all possible means to implement your marketing plan based on available funds and human resources. Focus primarily on tasks that are easy to execute, yield results and are least expensive. Develop your marketing budget from here.



## Measure Success

After implementing your marketing budget, monitor its results so you can fine-tune spending and actions appropriately. Establish a benchmark system, and use it to define the success or failure of each marketing campaign.

You could begin with low-cost strategies such as Google ads or general search engine optimization (SEO), assuming you have a website, then advance to larger-budget campaigns. This might include more expensive activities like radio and/or print ads or trade shows, providing the initial effort is successful.

Try implementing a six-month trial for each approach, after which you should gain enough awareness to know whether to tweak, increase, or cease. Such monitoring shows the costs and outputs of each activity and eases budget impacts. If money is lost on a certain campaign, the total yearly budget may not be adversely affected.

## Be Pragmatic

Producing a pragmatic marketing budget enables you to monitor and compare campaign results on a per project and yearly basis. By using this data, businesses can improve performance by allocating funds to the most effective marketing channels.

## A Call for New Political Leaders



Elected politicians are the only group of Caymanian workers that are protected from competition from qualified expats in the workplace. The Cayman Islands Constitution prohibits expats from serving in the Legislative Assembly (LA). This begs the question: how would Caymanian politicians fare against expat politicians who have the advantage of a first-class education from the top universities of the world and who have that funny accent that Caymanians love so much? On the other hand, the average Caymanian seeking a job in the private sector must face competition in the workplace every day, much of it unfair, yet they are expected to grin and bear it. Based on their performance as representatives, I doubt that some Caymanian politicians would stand much chance of succeeding in the private sector.

Despite protection from competitive employment, too many of today's politicians have failed to provide programs that would lift our people out of poverty so that they can enjoy a better standard of living. Our politicians know that education and technical training are instrumental to lifting people out of poverty. However, they have failed to provide our young people with a good education, while giving away the good jobs to expats and offering Caymanians jobs to clean the streets.

Please don't misunderstand me. I agree that Caymanian politicians should be protected by our Constitution, that is how it should be, but there is downside to this kind of protection. Have the Cayman Islands have been getting the best political leaders possible? Unfortunately, I must conclude no. Too often we get incompetent and nonperforming politicians. This system of politics also gives politicians the wrong incentives to run for office, example big salary. The performance of politicians goes unchecked and despite recent changes to the Cayman Islands Constitution, there is no Code of Conduct to govern the behavior and performance of politicians. Consequently, this is why so many Caymanians have become frustrated with the government and lost hope in the future for the Cayman Islands. Worst of all, our young people believe that whatever they do it will not make a difference to the present political situation.

Unfortunately, greed, love of money and misguided politicians have taken the Cayman Islands in the wrong direction. Sadly, the wealth created in the Cayman Islands does not trickle down to the poor; instead, it flows up to the rich.

The young people, and for that matter all Caymanians, should be inspired and take courage from the recent victories of the Cruise Port Referendum (CPR) group and the group of concerned citizens who have successfully fought to protect the Smith Barcadere. I believe these two groups have changed the dynamics of Cayman politics for the future. The government can no longer think that they can bully small groups of citizens into submission with their propaganda. CPR has demonstrated that where groups are well organized, they can fight the government and win.

The performance of our politicians is public record that speak for themselves.

First, we have the Peoples Progressive Movement (PPM), (should have changed their name to Poor People Mistake) the party that has been in power for eight years. These politicians, including the Hon Premier Al-

den McLaughlin and his Ministers (by their action) are only concerned with themselves and their rich expat lawyer friends and big business. There has been little or no improvement in jobs for Caymanians. Excessive red tape that bars poor Caymanians from business opportunities. Thank you, Governor Anwar. I contend that what makes the best politician is what is in your heart and the ability to have compassion for the less fortunate in society. The PPM party proves that education, while important, does not make you the best politician. The PPM have failed the people.

There are a few independent elected politicians who want to help Caymanians who are suffering, but because of egoism and the inability to organized themselves, they are unable to offer any help. They have failed the people.

Finally, we have the Cayman Democratic Party (CDP), led by the Hon Speaker, Mr. McKeeva Bush. The CDP by their actions may have wanted to do good but just does not know how to do it. Case in point, is the Nation Building Fund. This program, like so many conceived by that party, could have done good for the people, but instead it was poorly planned and mismanaged. It is also questionable whether this party has the moral authority to lead the country. They have failed the people.

What happened to politicians Mr. Jim Bodden, our first National Hero, Ms. Anna Hulda Bodden and Mr. Gilbert McLean who gave us CINICO? Where would poor Caymanians be today without CINICO? Why don't we have more politicians like these and like Mr. Ezzard Miller who has spent his political career fighting for Caymanians and the Cayman Islands? These are politicians who have been brave enough to stand up and fight for the rights of the Caymanian people.

Our politicians have failed us therefore we must a different way forward. There is hope. The Cayman Islands People's Party is based on the principle of participatory democracy. A party by the people for the people. What we need are new political leaders who stand on principle and for the interest of all the people. Leaders like Shirley Roulstone, Johann Moxam, Katrina Jurn, Chris Saunders, Issac Rankin and Dr. Darley Solomon, should join Mr. Miller and his team at the People's Party, which is focused on bringing a new kind of governance to Cayman – governance that invites and supports the active participation of people at the community level, not just at election time. Mr. Miller is smart, hardworking and is a proven leader. There other decent, smart and compassionate Caymanians who in the past did not want to get involved in politics because of its stigma. Now is the time to take a stand for your children and for your country.

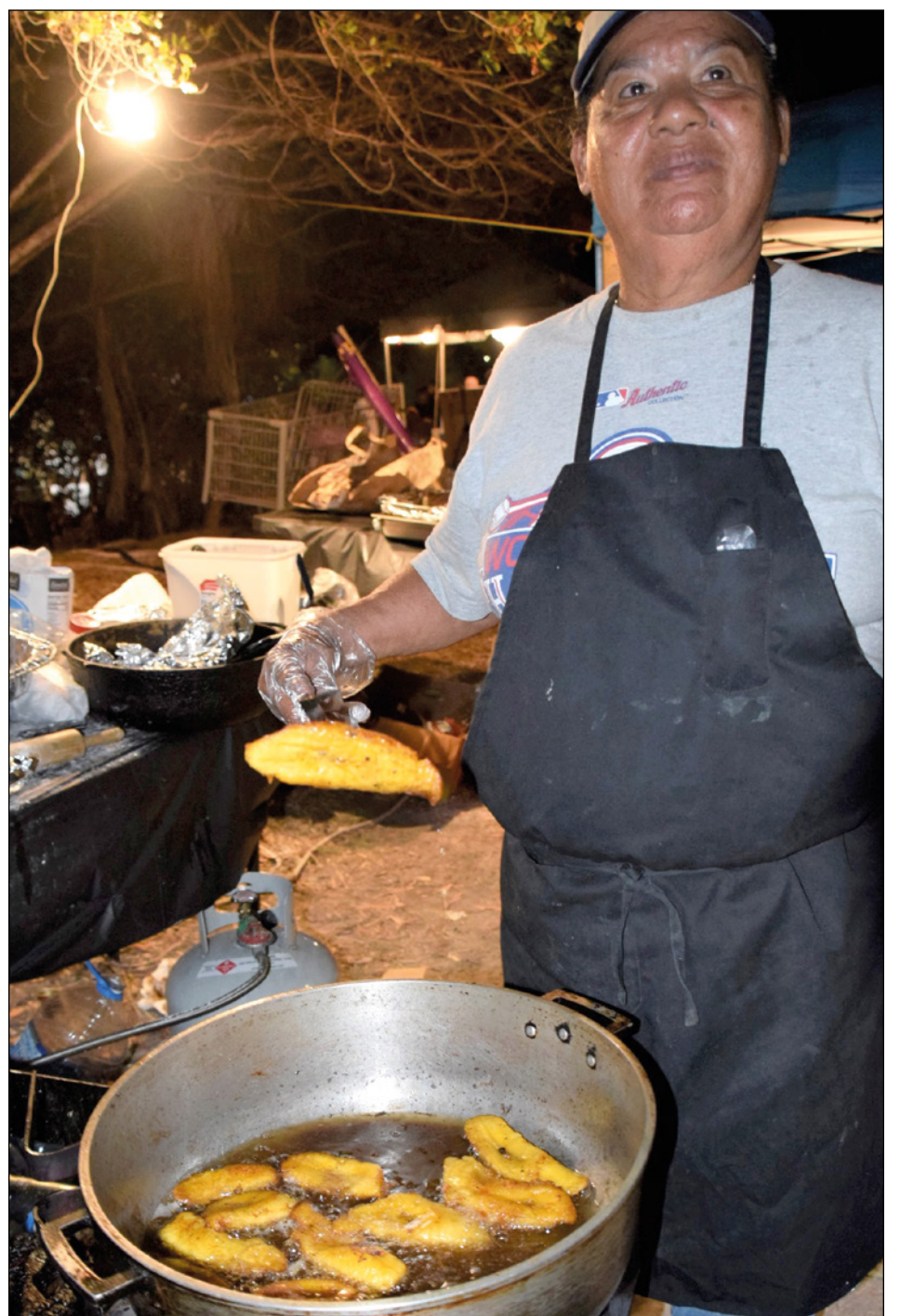

was often the location for Court proceedings as well as the local jail, the main part of the structure is a Caymanian 'upstairs' house, whose ground floor was once made from wattle and daub, a traditional mix of wooden sticks, clay and soil, that was very popular as a building material in the 19th Century. The upper floor, which was added on later, had been made from a timber frame complete with exterior steps to the building. These steps gave rise to the saying "Walking the 12 steps" whereby the accused would walk the steps on their way to Court.

The building also served as an important reference point for sailors and turtlers coming home, as a beacon would be lit and hoisted up the flagpole every evening as a signal for the men to guide them home. Another important element of the building was the notice board in the yard which advised people of current events.

Since it was first built for Government back in the 19th Century and in addition to being the court and jailhouse, the structure has been used as the island's first post office, library, secondary school and dancehall. The main building expanded, with two more buildings added to the main section. In 1990 it

officially opened as the Cayman Islands National Museum.

Sadly, the devastating 2004 Hurricane Ivan forced the museum to close

for a few years while considerable renovations took place, during which time the building was taken down to its bare framework while being sympathetically

restored. It was during these extensive renovations that an interesting discovery was made, some ancient graffiti written on the original walls at the time when the building functioned as a jail (known as the Old Gaol). Recognising the historical importance of this, the museum's renovators preserved this graffiti and it can now be seen behind glass at the location. The Museum was finally reopened again in September 2009, a magnificently preserved curator of culture and heritage.

### Attractions and exhibitions

No visit to the Museum should be complete without starting with the introductory video, which tells a succinct history of the islands. The Cultural History Gallery takes visitors on a tale of daring seafaring adventure, with the help of an animatronic model fisherman in a catboat. Current exhibitions include the Alvin McLaughlin: Steeped in Tradition social history collection and the historically-significant Celebrating 60 years of our first National Symbol: Our Coat of Arms exhibition.

# Cayman represented at Taekwondo training camp in Dominican Republic

Cayman Islands National Taekwondo Team members, Derrick Pascal & Leroy Rodriguez, recently had the opportunity to train at an Olympic Taekwondo Training Camp in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, from February 10-16, along with 50 other participants from other Caribbean countries. The training camp was sponsored by the Pan American Taekwondo Union.

Derrick and Leroy are currently preparing for an Olympic Qualifier in Costa Rica on March 11/12, to attempt to qualify for the 2020 Olympic which will be held in Tokyo, Japan. (See Photo)

At the training camp, they were trained by world-class Taekwondo coaches, including Juan Miguel Moreno, a three-time Olympian and two-time Olympic Silver Medalist, and Master Philippe from France who is Coach of the Peru National Team. (See Photo)



Initially, the athletes worked on agility, footwork and timing, then progressed to learning techniques to score points more efficiently, including counter-attacks, and also blocks. The final days of the camp were "Sparring Days", with the focus on sparring and applying their techniques in competition.

Derrick states, "A typical day had us up at dawn, one hour of running drills, then an hour of conditioning, then evasive footwork, fighting counter-defense drills, kicking combinations including pad work, sparring etc. We did this every day with variations on above for six hours plus. We spent a lot of time on breaking down techniques. The training was intense and informative, and I look forward to working on the knowledge gained and

passing this along to other students in Cayman."

Leroy noted "The training they put us through was intense, 6+ hours a day for a week. We had the opportunity to train with Pan American and Olympic Champions. I took lots of notes and I am excited to bring back home what I learned and put it into practice!"

Before joining this Olympic Taekwondo Training Camp, Derrick and Leroy took part in The Caribbean Taekwondo Championships held in Trinidad on November 9, 2019. They both successfully brought home medals, Derrick winning Gold in Forms and Bronze in Sparring, and Leroy winning Silver in Sparring.

Master Steve Graham, President of the CI TKD Federation stated "we are very pleased and happy for both Derrick and Leroy to have this opportunity to qualify for the Olympics, and become Olympians, an opportunity we want to offer to all Caymanians."

David Reid, General Secretary for the CI TKD Federation added "Derrick and Leroy have been training consistently under Master Instructor Sua Kim, 4th Dan World Taekwondo Blackbelt from

South Korea, since last August. I want to recognize our athletes and Master Kim for their hard work and dedication in preparation for the upcoming Olympic Qualifier in Costa Rica, and also the CI National Olympic Committee for their constant support."

# Bryan blocks Opposition no confidence vote

expect that those who sought, and were privileged to hold public office, should be held to a higher standard of conduct and that they were duty bound to protect the integrity of the people's House.

Late last week Mr Miller asked for support from his fellow Opposition members to call for a special sitting of the House to elect a new Deputy Speaker of the Legislative Assembly, following the resignation of the former Deputy Speaker of the House, Bernie Bush. He also wanted the House to hold a debate on a no confidence motion in House Speaker McKeever Bush, who has taken temporary leave following an incident involving the assault of the female Coral Beach Bar manager on February 21st, in which McKeever Bush was allegedly involved, a matter currently under investigation by the RCIPS.

The Opposition's press release stated that throughout Cayman's recorded history, there had been many examples of people taking responsibility for their actions or inactions.

"It is imperative that all of us, as elected representatives of the people, demonstrate our mettle and let the public know where we stand on this very serious issue," they said. "While we are also aware that there is also an ongoing criminal investigation, we think it would be rather hypocritical of us, as political

leaders, to require members of the Public Service to..."not, at any time, engage in any activity that brings his ministry, portfolio, statutory authority, government company, the public service or the government into disrepute"...but have a different standard for our conduct."

Inaction was therefore not an option, they stated.

They went on to comment that they felt they had to ensure decisions taken about the functioning of the Legislative Assembly were democratic and constitutionally legitimate.

"This is the time for the Legislative Assembly to function at its best," they stated. "Members of the Legislative Assembly have two choices in this matter. Either we rise to meet the demands of our office, or we pull our office down to a lower level. We cannot say we value fairness and accountability and be silent or passive when we were elected to be the voice of the voiceless."

The Opposition said they now urged all elected members of Government to support the opening of Legislative Assembly to address this urgent matter.

They ended their press release with the hashtag #sheissupported, signifying their support for the new movement protesting against domestic and workplace violence which began last Friday outside the Glass House, which was initiated following the assault of the female Coral Beach bar manager.

# Harden: I'm NBA's best, not Gianni

James Harden has stated again that he believes he is the best player in the NBA and deserves recognition for that, not reigning MVP Giannis Antetokounmpo. The rivalry between the two superstars has been building for months but now Harden is openly declaring how he feels.

"I wish I could just run and was 7-feet and run and just dunk," Harden said on ESPN, referring to Antetokounmpo. "Like that takes no skill at all."

Harden, 30, has led the NBA in scoring for three straight seasons which is why he feels he deserves the most props. Retired legend Dwyane Wade referred to Harden as one of the "greatest ever" recently. Harden has been outstanding this season again which is why he feels unappreciated.

What's most irritating for Harden is that he doesn't rank at the top of most MVP lists this season by media members. He claims he has respect where it matters most — through game plans by opposing coaches.

"I feel like I'm the best player," Harden said. "Throughout the course of the year, I don't see double-teams of anybody else. Maybe Dame when he's going on an amazing stretch, but usually you see a double team after you have a 50-point night or a 60-point night. If I have an 18-point night, the next night I'm seeing a double team, which is pretty cool. It's totally different than any other player in this league, or probably that's ever been."

Harden also said he was very confident in his ability to lead the Houston Rockets to the 2020 NBA championship.

"I'm not the type of guy to take stabs at somebody. I'm just trying to do my job which is win games and go back home to my family. At the end of the day, if that's what he believes that's what he believes. I can't say anything about it. I've just got to keep being focused."

Antetokounmpo insists he is not looking for a "back-and-forth" with Harden but defended his style of play.

He mocked Harden's high usage rate and lax defensive game during the All-Star break, prompting a response last week from the Rockets star.

Antetokounmpo, 25, the clear favourite to be named MVP again, put up 32 points and 13 rebounds as his Milwaukee Bucks improved to 51-8 on Friday with a 133-86 thrashing of the Oklahoma City Thunder.

He said: "My game is not just power, for sure. I came in when I was 18, I was 180 pounds, so to power through big guys was kind of tough."

"But obviously, there are going to be times where you've got to power through guys. Like one of the best players, LeBron, Michael Jordan, Kobe and all those guys, Shaq, all those guys, they were extremely physical with their play."

"They made their presence felt in the paint, but obviously I try to work on my game, mid-range shots, threes, being able to screen and roll faster and make the right pass. It's hard to drive full speed and try to make the right pass to the corner."

## Wilder activates third Fury fight

Deontay Wilder will fight Britain's WBC heavyweight world champion Tyson Fury for a third time this summer, according to promoter Bob Arum.

The pair drew their first fight in 2018 and two weeks ago Fury stopped Wilder in the seventh round to win the title.

The American had 30 days to call a rematch and Arum, Fury's US promoter, says he has been "formally notified" by Wilder's team that they are doing so.

Arum told Ringside Reporter the bout will be "before the Olympics - July".

If that match doesn't happen, Anthony Joshua's promoter Eddie Hearn said talks for a heavyweight unification fight between his fighter and Fury were under way.

But with the rematch clause triggered, Briton Joshua, who holds three belts, is now expected to fight Bulgarian Kubrat Pulev in a mandatory IBF bout in London in June.

And Arum said he could "guarantee Pulev will knock out Joshua like Fury knocked out Wilder".

"I will look at a Pulev/Fury fight to unify the belts at the end of the year," he added.

Wilder promised to "rise like a phoenix from the ashes and regain the title" after last week's defeat in Las Vegas. He has back tracked on firing trainer Mark Breland who threw in the towel to stop the fight.

Wilder was floored twice before the towel came in at the MGM Grand Arena, ending his five-year reign as WBC champion, but the American said he was in "great spirits".

The 34-year-old Bronze Bomber took to social media in a video to promise his comeback "in a few months".

"Your king is here and I'm not going anywhere, for the war has just begun," he said. "I'm a king that will never give up and will fight to the death. I am a warrior; I am strong, and I will be back."

In the first statement since his defeat, Wilder blamed his elaborate ring-walk costume for his performance, saying it was too heavy and he "didn't have the legs for the fight" as a result.

## Durant targets Olympics – if it goes ahead

Kevin Durant has Olympic gold medals from the 2012 London games and one from Rio in 2016 and even though he is long-term injured wants to try and add a third from Tokyo.

Despite missing this entire season recovering from a torn Achilles, Durant, 31, is not ruling out another Olympics. He is one of the 44 players USA Basketball has on its list of finalists.

It would be a surprise to see Durant's first games back being in Tokyo for the American team but most likely he waits until next season to step on the court for the Brooklyn Nets.

In early July, USA Basketball will enter training camp with a team of 12 locked in (no try-outs this time around). The team will be coached by Gregg Popovich, and they will ramp up with a series of exhibitions before the games open in Tokyo on July 24.

That is assuming that the Olympics go ahead because of the coronavirus outbreak. Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe on Saturday called on the public to cooperate in a "tough battle" to contain the coronavirus epidemic in coming weeks as the country prepares to hold the Tokyo Olympics.

"To be frank, we cannot win this battle through the efforts of the government alone," Abe said two days after calling for all schools nationwide to be closed for more than a month. The abrupt decision caught teachers, parents and their employers off guard, sparking a fresh wave of criticism.

He said measures, using 270 billion yen (\$2.1bn) in budget reserves, including steps for smaller firms, would be coming in the next 10 days.

The government was also closely watching the global economy and would take fiscal steps as necessary to counter the economic impact of the spreading virus.

## Windies Women out of the T20 World Cup

West Indies Women have failed badly at the Women's T20 World Cup in Australia despite high hopes of retaining the title they won in 2016. They were beaten by England by 46 runs in their group game in Sydney.

With just two points from their opening games against Thailand and Pakistan, West Indies faced must-win scenarios against England, and South Africa on Tuesday, to guarantee a place in the final four.

Opener Natalie Sciver once again starred with the bat for England on Saturday, making 57 from 56 balls as they posted 143-5 from their 20 overs.

In response, West Indies lost three wickets for one run and had injured captain Stafanie Taylor taken off on a stretcher as they slumped to 42-4.

Lee-Ann Kirby hit 20 from 15 balls - and was dropped twice - to give West Indies some hope, but they could only reach 97-9, with Taylor unable to return to the crease despite 17 balls remaining.

But they were ultimately well beaten by a determined England.

## Virus greatly depletes Tokyo Marathon

The Tokyo Marathon took place on Sunday against a backdrop of empty streets and with just a couple of hundred runners due to the coronavirus outbreak.

Organisers had reduced the entries to just elite runners and wheelchair athletes with the mass race, which usually attracts around 38,000 runners, cancelled.

The numbers of volunteers were also reduced, and spectators were advised to "avoid gathering along the course" and were instead encouraged to "support through TV and radio."

Event staff and competitors were given surgical masks and hand sanitizer.

Ethiopian Birhanu Legese won the men's race for the second consecutive

year in two hours and four minutes and 15 seconds, while Israel's Lonah Korlima Chemtai Salpeter won the women's race in a course record time of 2:17.45. Tokyo is due to host the Olympics from 24 July to 9 August.



# Coronavirus Reaches the Caribbean

The Caribbean can no longer say it is Coronavirus (COVID-19)-free, with confirmation of six cases in three countries – the Dominican Republic, St Maarten and St Barthélemy.

Director of the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO), Dr Carissa Etienne made the disclosure last night after CARICOM Heads of Government, Ministers of Health and officials of key agencies met in a special emergency session in Barbados to discuss protocols for addressing COVID-19.

Speaking via video-conference during the meeting, Dr Etienne said there were three cases in the Dominican Republic, two in St Maarten, and one in St Barthélemy.

The first case in the region was recorded the Dominican Republic. It was an imported case – a 62-year-old Italian man who arrived on the island on February 22 and was hospitalized on Saturday. He had displayed no symptoms on his arrival to the country.

Meantime, a French couple who tested positive for the virus are in isolation in the Louis-Constant Fleming Hospital in St Martin, where they will remain for 14 days. They were leaving for Paris from the Princess Juliana International Airport located on the Dutch side of the island, St Maarten, when they were handed over to authorities because they presented symptoms of the virus.

Their son, who they were visiting in St Barthélemy, also tested positive and is confined to his home and under daily surveillance. Officials said the state of health of the three was not worrying.

A statement issued from the Office of St Maarten's Prime Minister Silveria Jacobs yesterday stated that the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) has been activated to continue with the preparedness, response and mitigation

measures that need to be taken, and will continue to function on a heightened level of awareness.

It added that screening processes at ports of entry have been stepped up in co-operation with the airlines which are also following their own screening protocols.

"There is no reason to panic; stay calm and take preventative hygiene measures at home, on the job, in school that have been promoted by the Ministry of Public Health for the past several weeks via the Government's Department of Communication," the statement said. "School boards have been requested to increase hygienic measures at schools and to maintain these at a high level; front line staff of businesses across the business community – customer service reps – as well as all other staff members are also requested to follow preventative measures on a daily basis."

Meantime, two people in St Martin, who were tested after returning from holiday in the L'Oise, France, were yesterday evening found to be COVID-19-negative.

More than 89,000 people have been infected with the COVID-19 that originated in Wuhan, the capital of the Chinese province of Hubei, last December. The death toll has surpassed 3,000.

The PAHO Director said that with COVID-19 already in the wider region, the outlook for the CARICOM region is that "there is a high likelihood that we will see cases in the sub-region".



And she said the World Health Organization is concerned about countries that have "weak health systems".

Dr Etienne noted that several Caribbean countries have the capacity to test for COVID-19 – Barbados, Suriname, Guyana, Trinidad and Tobago, Dominica, Jamaica, Belize, The Bahamas, Haiti, Martinique, French Guiana, Curacao, Aruba and St Martin, Cayman Islands and Bermuda.

"We believe that there is some capacity in the region but there is work that is necessary to ensure maximum capacity in the Caribbean region," she said, adding that PAHO's work in the region is to strengthen member states capacity to detect, to contain and to manage cases.

Confirmation of the Coronavirus cases in the region came just days after the Caribbean Public Health Agency (CAR-

PHA) warned that with transmission of the virus reported in territories with direct flights to Caribbean states, risk of the virus reaching the region's shores had increased to "moderate to high".

In light of the increased risk of importation of the virus to the region, CARPHA Executive Director Dr Joy St John had urged health authorities of CARPHA member states to shift their mindset from preparedness to readiness and rapid response, and continue to do all that is necessary to strengthen their capacity to respond to possible importation of cases.

She also encouraged them to increase their capacity for surveillance and to adapt their national pandemic preparedness plans to the current situation with COVID-19, as a matter of urgency. 🌐

## CARICOM Heads, Ministers Agree on Protocol to Deal with Coronavirus

A regional protocol establishing minimum standards for dealing with the new Coronavirus (COVID-19) was agreed to by CARICOM Heads of Government and Ministers of Health at a special emergency meeting in Barbados on Sunday.

CARICOM stressed that the protocol is critical to avoid an outbreak of panic and fear in the region.

The meeting was attended by the Pan American Health Organisation (PAHO), Caribbean Public Health Agency (CARPHA), Caribbean Disaster Emergency Management Agency (CDEMA), CARICOM Implementation Agency for Crime and Security (IMPACS) and representatives of the leadership of the Cruise Ship industry and their representative bodies, the Florida Caribbean Cruise Associate (FCCA) and the Cruise Lines International Association (CLIA).

"The capacity to manage an outbreak was identified as an area of concern," a CARICOM statement said. "Accordingly, the meeting agreed to establish an expanded Bureau of Heads of Government to continue discussions with the travel and tourism industry, regional financial institutions, international financial institutions and the private sector with respect to the marshalling of resources to augment the region's capacity to deal with a possible outbreak. Against that background, the meeting asked CARPHA and PAHO to assist by conducting a gap analysis of Member States' capacities."

The protocol, drafted by CARPHA following two emergency meetings of the CARICOM Ministers of Health last week, allows for individual states to place additional measures if they so require.

CARICOM Chairman Mia Mottley, Prime Minister of Barbados, emphasized that the leaders were prepared to protect the region's "vital national and regional interest at all times".

"We must act together to get through this," she said.

The protocol defines roles and responsibilities of all parties and seeks to ensure that there is effective communications between CARICOM governments and the cruise line industry with respect to decisions so that there would be a common understanding.

The meeting also recognized that the existing Regional Response Mechanism co-ordinated by CDEMA was already on alert and was actively undertaking scenario planning in partnership with CARPHA, PAHO, IMPACS and Member States' emergency management agencies and Chief Medical Officers.

CDEMA would also provide guidance and share best practices to Member States in their approach to managing an outbreak. A draft framework document has already been shared with regional partners and all CDEMA participating states and this will be built upon.

Cruise industry officials attending the meeting confirmed that they have been doing their part in screening passengers

and stated they were willing to work with the established protocol.

They said they greatly appreciated the commitment and expertise of their partners in CARICOM, PAHO, CARPHA, CDEMA, and IMPACS as everyone works together in their mutual interest of providing the highest degree of safety and health for passengers, crew and the destinations visited.

Screening procedures and protocols for prevention, surveillance and response are integral to industry operations, they noted. The cruise officials

added that clear and practical protocols throughout the Region are essential and look forward to continued co-operation with all stakeholders. They urged everyone to align with the guidance and procedures from the World Health Organization (WHO) and other global medical experts.

More than 89,000 people across 58 countries have been infected with COVID-19 that originated in Wuhan, the capital of the Chinese province of Hubei last December. The death toll has now exceeded 3,000. 🌐

## Carnival Crew Members Cleared of Coronavirus After Testing in Barbados

Two crew members on the Carnival Fascination cruise ship, who were tested in Barbados after exhibiting flu-like symptoms, have been found not to have the deadly Coronavirus (COVID-19).

The vessel had docked in Barbados last Thursday, a day earlier than scheduled, after being turned away from St Lucia, when it was discovered that three crew members had exhibited flu-like symptoms earlier in the week and two had tested positive for Influenza A.

When the ship arrived in Barbados, according to a government statement, local health authorities boarded and took swabs from the "at risk" individuals.

All three were returned negative.

Acting Chief Medical Officer Dr Kenneth George said that as soon as the

results were known, the ship was given the all-clear and the passengers allowed to disembark. The ship was carrying 2,281 passengers, including 37 Barbadians and 896 crew members.

Prime Minister Mia Amor Mottley had explained that the government had allowed the ship to come into the island because, unlike St Lucia, Barbados has the capability to test for COVID-19.

She said that while the ship reported that everyone was asymptomatic by the time it reached Barbados, it was out of "an abundance of caution" that health authorities decided to carry out the tests and to confine the passengers and crew to the ship until the results were known. 🌐
