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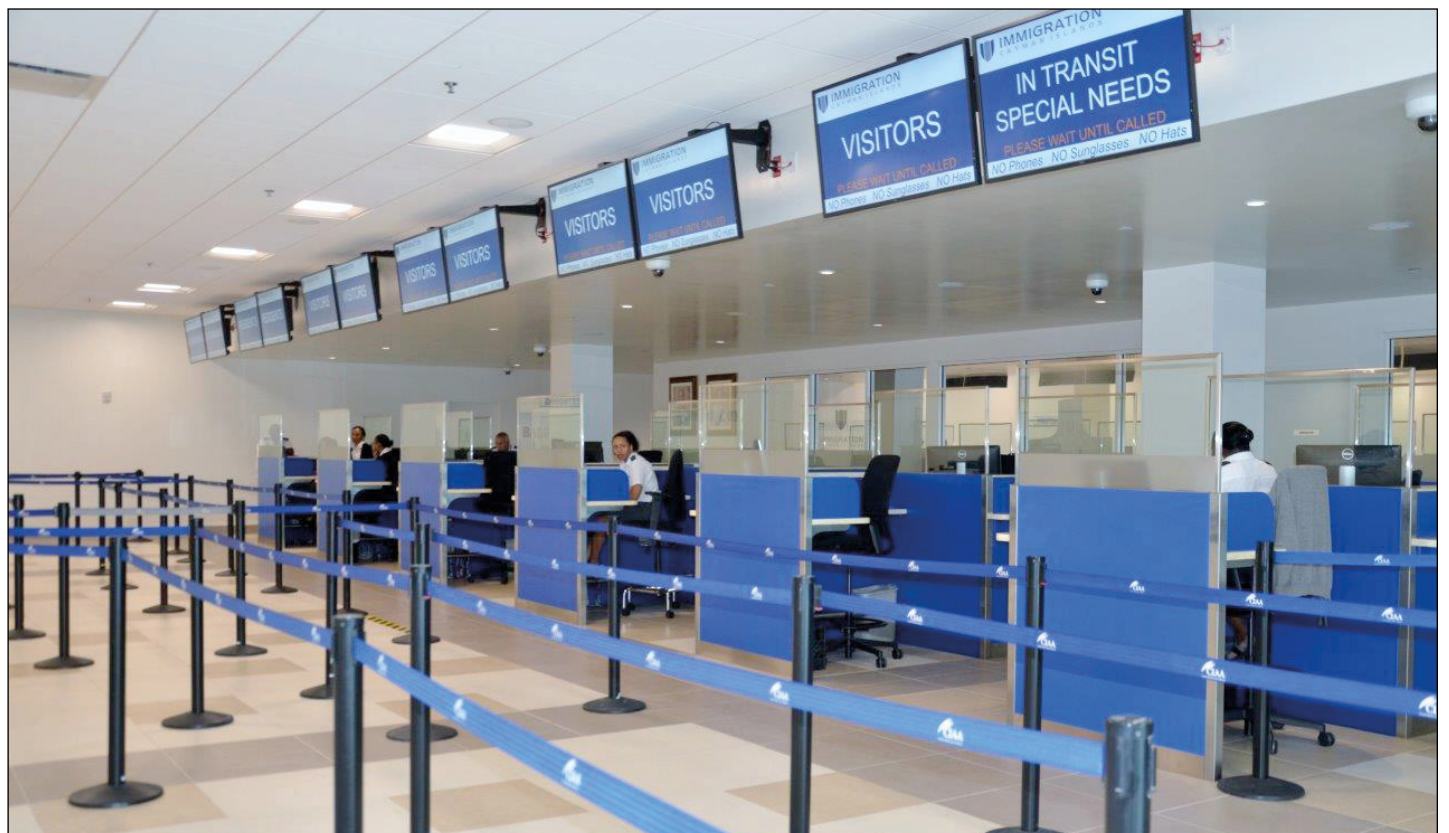

The Cayman Islands could see more rigid screening being put in place once the borders are reopened.

Although precise plans are not yet to be formulated, Chief Medical Officer Dr John Lee has indicated that current requirements for border and immigra-

tion controls might prove inadequate should the borders be reopened around September as has been tentatively suggested.

The CMO was at the time responding to a question looking at what the entry requirements safety protocols might be

once the territory's borders are eventually opened again.

Cayman has been on lockdown for about the past six weeks with the closure of the borders as one of the main

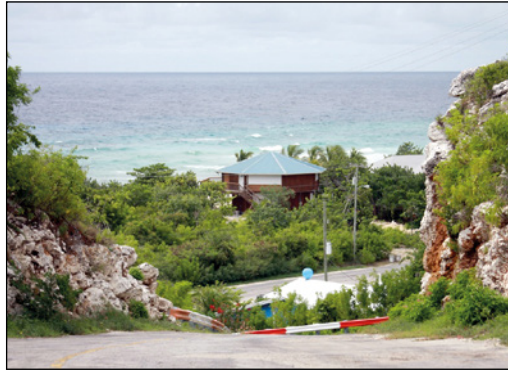
A careful return to 'normal'

Anyone analysing the decision making and leadership style of the Premier would agree that he often errs on the side of caution and appears to give deep contemplation before determining what action to take.

This has been magnified by his management of the Coronavirus pandemic on the Cayman Islands. A notable exception was his decision to close the beaches. It would be reasonable based on observing him in the press conference that he announced the measure that he appeared to do so out of frustration.

Questions have persisted throughout the shutdown, even though he was shown to have an enviable approval rating in an unscientific poll by another media house. But the methodical deliberation appears to have been part of his stewardship of authorities with the decision-making process to return life to normal.

A phased in approach has started to be rolled out to return the Cayman Islands to "life as normal". As expected, Little Cayman was the first to have restrictions lifted, with Cayman Brac in tow. Even in Grand Cayman, more



and more businesses are starting to resume operations.

This process could be akin to watching paint dry for some, as others itch to get back out and about as they did prior to mid-March. However, we urge our readers and other members of the Cayman community to also be very thoughtful in their approach, regardless of any public requirements.

As places like New Zealand have exhibited, ridding your country of this deadly virus can be achieved with clear, thoughtful processes. While New Zealand's leadership have been gaining praise, we should not overlook the careful path to returning relative normalcy in the Cayman Islands. 🌐

Cayman Sundays, a day of rest



Those of us who grew up in the old days of the 1950's and 1960's will know that Sunday was first of all a day of rest and church attendance.

This was the day when everything stopped. We were not allowed to even play the little transistor radio that my brother brought us when he returned from sea in the early 1960's.

Although we loved to go to the seaside in West Bay, my father's rule was if you want to bathe in the sea on Sundays, you would go before church in the morning. Over the years my sisters and I pleaded with our Mama to let us go in the afternoon around 3pm. She would agree reluctantly, telling us that we must come back early as we would be required in the church choir at 7pm. So, many times, we appeared with our wet hair (no blow-dryers dem days, chile) and our Mom's salutation, "your father would turn in his grave, if he could see you".

My Dad, of blessed memory, sadly died in 1960 on what should have been his last trip at sea. He left my Mom with a grocery store, bakery and ice cream shop, the latter of which opened only on Saturday afternoons and evenings, as well as cattle and land. There were five of us, my brother, my three sisters and I, us girls aged between 6 and 15 years, me being the youngest.

My Mom would eventually close the family business and manage Cayman's first drug store, Cayman Drug in George Town, situated at that time, next to the old By-Rite, just opposite the Courts buildings.

And so it was that Sunday was a complete day of rest. After lunch at mid-day, we had Our Sunday rest, our heads on cushions with the front door open to catch the breeze.

In our homes, now, my siblings and I still respect and observe Sundays as do many Caymanians and residents, particularly from the Caribbean and the USA. Sundays are for rest, church and fellowship.

Of late, fifty plus years on, it seems Sundays are for running various races and, biking, boating and even working. This is very strange to many of us and speaks of the great price of "progress".

During the times of Covid-19, many of us love the hush of Sundays, the quiet meandering of life, electronic church services and phone chats with loved ones.

It is, as many of us believe, a time to pause and review what we really would like our post Covid island to look and feel like.

The Leader of the Opposition, in the Caymanian Times article of April 29th refers to resetting the clock on the huge issue of work permits.

I must say that I, too, believe this is timely for the good of our people. We cannot be all things to all people and I am often dismayed at how our population of Caymanians are becoming marginalised in our own country.

Yes, we need economic income but at what price? We cannot get from our homes to town, our transport system is overwhelmed, our infrastructure and essential services like garbage disposal are stressed, and we are caught up in



providing cheap labour for businesses which often pay lip service to the country's needs.

Indeed, one British human resource manager had the mistaken belief to say on a Radio Cayman mid-day show that our culture would actually benefit by increasing work permits. He also demanded to know how we would be able to afford to pay for cultural programmes in our schools unless this was done. According to him, the additional income gained would pay for more cultural programmes in the schools. An increase in the number of work permit holders in our society was therefore, from a cultural perspective, a very positive thing.

It is my view, and that of many educators, that the primary component of a people's culture is first and foremost one of everyday experience. Undergirding this vital experience is the passing down in the home of cultural elements (like cooking Caymanian meals, Caymanian stories and such) and parental expectations and guidance. Also important is the teaching of our culture in more formal settings like schools. But the teaching about our culture in schools, however comprehensive and thorough, cannot ever serve as the primary source of information and understanding, nor can it ever replace an absence of everyday experience.

A rapid diluting of the presence of Caymanian culture in our society can therefore never be viewed as anything positive. Of course societies and the characteristics that go to defining their particular "culture" evolve and change over time. But such changes are best when incremental and natural, and such needs to be the case here in our beloved Cayman islands as for everywhere else.

Our children are bombarded daily more than ever by messages which may cause them to question their own beliefs. The best place to ensure their understanding of themselves must begin in the home.

The recent jingle competition by the Ministry of Culture sets out very culturally sound guidelines and is all inclusive. This is an example of how we can promote our Caymanian culture while inviting those from other cultures to embrace and enjoy it.

It is time that we become bold and stand up for our way of life as Caymanians. We must encourage our government to examine and improve ways of reducing our dependence on a primarily overseas work force.

The time of Covid-19 should be a time of serious reflection and prayerful planning.

As with Cayman Sundays of old, let's pause and think this through. It behoves us to do this at this time of great opportunity.

RFA Argus Arrives in Cayman

RFA Argus, one of the Royal Navy Caribbean task force ships arrived in the Cayman Islands area on Monday 4 May. RFA Argus is the replacement ship for RFA Mounts Bay, which for the past three years carried out hurricane relief exercises on Seven Mile Beach and supported the region after a number of hurricanes hit including Maria, Irma and Dorian.

This year, due to the Covid-19 situation the crew will not be setting foot on the Islands, or receiving visitors on the ship.

Embarked on the vessel are three Merlin Helicopters and one Wildcat helicopter. Today they flew two helicopters on a recce of Grand Cayman and on a drugs interdiction exercise with the RCIPS Marine Unit vessels.

The RCIPS helicopter met the Navy helicopters airborne and conducted a familiarisation over the radio in loose formation. They looked for key areas and landing sites (no landings were made) in preparation for the upcoming hurricane season and the usual general brief of the Islands.

Argus' task is distinct from the mission of the Security Assistance Team (SAT) that recently arrived from the UK.

The SAT are here to assist the Cayman Islands Government to plan and to mitigate against any security issues caused by the coronavirus outbreak. The team are already engaging with local officials

through virtual meetings while in quarantine.

The vessel also has Disaster Relief stores on board, as well as Royal Engineers and other specialist personnel

who can help with repairing and restoring vital services. As standard procedure, the ship will remain in the region during hurricane season as vital support if needed. 🌐

Customers collecting general delivery mail must show ID. At small district post offices, only one customer at a time will be allowed inside to collect general delivery mail.

Registered mail without fees due at collection will be delivered to post of-

fice boxes starting on Wednesday, 6 May 2020. The standard practice of face-to-face delivery of registered mail is being suspended at this time to keep customer contact minimal.

As the Cayman Islands transition to lower COVID-19 suppression levels, following the suppression system recently outlined by Premier, Hon. Alden McLaughlin, the CIPS will open more post offices and increase the services that it offers. The aim is to return to full operations when the Islands are at Level 1- All Clear.

Postmaster General Sheena Glasgow explains that throughout its phased re-opening, the Postal Service has been working to balance the needs of the community with the need of its employees. Around half of these she says are at high-risk from a COVID-19 infection. Nearly three quarters live with someone who is high risk.

Ms Glasgow comments that to manage staff exposure, the CIPS aims to gradually re-open post offices as the official risk and suppression levels are reduced by the Government. To ensure that customers have an updated source of information on such changes, CIPS will provide weekly updates to its hours of operation on the Contact Us page of its website, www.caymanpost.gov.ky.

She stresses that social distancing protocols must continue to be observed by customers and staff alike while at a post office.

"Our commitment to protecting vulnerable staff is part of our commitment to protecting our communities," says Ms Glasgow. 🌐

DEH Announces Landfill Rules

The Department of Environmental Health has implemented new rules at the George Town Landfill in order to comply with the recent changes in the curfew regulations.

In order to enter the landfill, all persons must provide a government issued ID in order to confirm they are complying with the soft curfew hours and the alphabet system.

Only one vehicle at a time will be allowed to enter the drop off area to dispose of garbage.

Members of the public can make drop-offs to the landfill using the alphabetical surname system currently in place.

Exempted businesses can use the landfill outside of movement restrictions. However, a business representative must provide:

- A government issued ID.
- A Cayman Islands Government exemption letter.

- And a letter from their business naming their representative as essential.

The DEH has the right to refuse entry to any person who cannot provide the necessary documentation to comply with the current curfew regulations.

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measures in the fight to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Saying that it was still too early to determine what the situation might be months in advance, Dr Lee said factors such as the global context of COVID-19 at that time, the risk to Cayman, and even emerging technology to combat the virus would need to be factored in.

A new tool being considered globally in the so-called 'new normal' expected once countries start reopening their borders is an 'immunity passport' - a document confirming that the holder is COVID-free.

"I think the safety procedures would really be worldwide," Dr Lee said.

"At this moment, it would be absolutely inadequate at the moment to go through a screening questionnaire or temperature monitor. It would virtually be the same as throwing our doors wide open because there's too much COVID out there compared with the little where we are."

The CMO announced that there have been a further three confirmed cases of COVID-19 bringing the total to 78 out of a further 224 tests carried out - meaning that 221 of the samples were negative.

Of the three new cases, two are front-line staff but not health workers.

This phase of the stepped-up testing programme is currently focusing on frontline staff. Thirty patients have fully recovered from the disease.

Commenting on the latest results, Hon. Premier Alden McLaughlin said it was a "sobering announcement" by the CMO and said it reflected his previous advice not to get "carried away" by the recent low level of increases.

"The virus is still very much among us and in the category of front line workers," the Premier stated, a matter viewed with some concern.

"We can not relax our vigilance. We are not yet out of the woods although we see a clearing.

Mr McLaughlin said it was still too early to celebrate underlining why his administration was proceeding cautiously even regarding Cayman Brac.

"We are not certain that all of Cayman Brac is completely COVID-19 free," he stated.

The Brac was mentioned in the context of relaxation of measures now being put in place for the Sister Islands especially Little Cayman.

The Premier confirmed that the National Hazard Management Executive met on Tuesday to consider the situation of Little Cayman where lifting the lockdown has now been approved and was due to take effect from Tuesday. 🌐

CAYMAN JOINS DISCUSSION OF UK'S COVID-19 SUPPORT FOR OTs

British parliamentarian Andrew Rosindell has appealed for more support from the UK government help the Overseas Territories cope with the COVID-19 crisis.

He was at the time taking part in an online forum on the subject organised by the UK charity, Friends of the British

Overseas Territories (FOTBOT) in which Cayman Islands MLA Austin Harris was also a participant. Mr Harris is the current Honorary President of FOTBOT.

Other panellists were former Bermuda Premier Hon. Michael Dunkley MP, and FOTBOT trustee Albert Poggio OBE (Honorary Rep. of Gibraltar).

"I think that during this time it's really important that we don't forget the Overseas Territories," Mr Rosindell declared during the discussion.

"I think at this time we are all focusing on what's happening in our communities in the UK and it's easy to forget that we have a wider family to think about.

"If we can't come together as a family and help each other now, when can we do so?" asked the British MP who chairs the UK parliament's All-Party Group on the Overseas Territories.

He wondered "if the UK government does have a

plan to be there for Overseas Territories if they need us in a situation like this?"

UK SUPPORT TO DATE

The British Government's website GOV.UK has reported that there has been support for the Caribbean Overseas Territories with the COVID-19 pandemic.

This has been in the form of assistance with specialist medical equipment including the in-demand PPE (personal protective equipment) for healthcare staff, testing kits and other vital medical supplies.

Public Health England has also been involved in the Cayman Islands where a visiting team of experts have assisted with the commissioning of that territory's on-island COVID-19 testing apparatus.

British naval and security teams have also been despatched to the Caribbean OTs for the annual hurricane season preparedness and also this time are assisting with security training and border security issues.

The UK Minister responsible for the Overseas Territories, Baroness Liz Sugg has held teleconferences with leaders of the OTs and has tweeted about assistance being provided in the fight against the virus.

Meanwhile, the UK government's procurement agency Crown Agents have been appointed by the Foreign and Commonwealth Office of the UK Government "to procure goods required to support the response to the Covid-19 outbreak in the UK Overseas Territories."

CAYMAN PERSPECTIVE

From the perspective of the Cayman Islands, MLA Austin Harris reported that there has been a high level of support for Cayman from the UK.

"I think the relationship between the Cayman Islands and the UK has been excellent," he said.

"We've had tremendous UK/Cayman collaboration and partnership particularly through His Excellency Governor Martyn Roper...which has enabled the Cayman Islands to provide assistance to other Overseas Territories."

Commenting on the steps taken in Cayman to manage the crisis and mitigate its effects, Mr Harris reported that the focus here has been on placing "life over economics."

Noting that the crisis has had "a devastating effect on the economy of the Cayman Islands," he said, "if we look at the numbers from the date when the territory's international borders were closed, Cayman has had no tourism whatsoever."

"This creates the knock-on effect of higher unemployment with the need for government to increase its own expenditure to support the recovery of those most affected."

While updating the panel that Cayman was now at Phase One of re-opening its

economy, the Cayman Islands MLA noted that the territory was "very much at the mercy of the success that other jurisdictions have in eliminating the virus which would then give us the confidence necessary to reopen our borders to the larger, wider, international economy."

Barring the reservations expressed, there were also reports from the panellists of Bermuda and Gibraltar on areas of cooperation between the UK and their territories.

LINGERING CONCERNS

UK MP Andrew Rosindell, while stating that he was yet to hear how each OT was handling the crisis, he was nevertheless encouraged to hear from Gibraltar, Bermuda and the Cayman Islands that things are going in the right direction.

He however reiterated what he said was a long term concern:

"If we can't come together as a family and help each other now, when can we?" he asked.

"So I do worry about if the UK actually has a plan to be there for the Overseas Territories when they need us in a situation like this."

Mr Rosindell felt "this will only be known fully when the crisis is over and is properly investigated."

MLA Harris felt it might be too early to give a full assessment of the level of COVID-19 support from the UK to the OTs.

"I think it might be too early to tell just yet," he said, but added, "I think we are off to a great start."

The wide-ranging discussion also addressed the implications of the COVID-19 pandemic for the economies of the OTs, shared experiences of how they are managing the crisis, the healthcare impact - especially on mental health - and support for the vulnerable.

"We are all in the exact same boat together," was the assessment of MLA Harris on how the crisis is affecting the OTs and the UK.

The webinar was hosted by FOTBOT's founder and CEO, Philip Smith. 🌐

Repatriation flight to Costa Rica confirmed

Cayman Airways Limited (CAL) has confirmed a repatriation flight from Grand Cayman to San Jose, Costa Rica, for Friday May 8, 2020, in partnership with the Cayman Islands Government.

Flight KX3080 is scheduled to depart Owen Roberts International Airport (ORIA) on Grand Cayman at 7am and arrive at Juan Santa María International Airport (SJO) at 7:45am (San Jose time).

Persons travelling to Costa Rica must be Costa Rican nationals. All passengers are responsible for ensuring that they have the necessary travel documents for entry.

Additionally, passengers travelling to Cost Rica on this repatriation flight must complete an online medical form prior to travel, by visiting this link: <https://ccss.now.sh/form>

Passengers (except infants) will be allowed two free checked bags up to 55lbs per bag (not exceeding linear dimensions of 62 inches per bag), plus one carry-on bag not exceeding 11" x 16" x 24". Passengers who expect to have additional bags must prepay for excess bags at the time of booking. Passengers'

first two bags will travel confirmed, but any excess bags will be travelling space-available and may take several weeks to reach the passenger should baggage space not be available on the repatriation flight. Pets will not be allowed on this flight.

Additionally, passengers are required to wear their own face mask for check-in and boarding, as well as for the duration of the flight.

• **Flight to Canada confirmed:** A flight to Canada has been confirmed on Friday 22nd May organised privately by Nikole Poirier – here are the contact details: nikolepoirier@yahoo.com / +1 345 517 0628 if you would like to book a seat. Caymanians and permanent residents wishing to come home on that flight should register with the travel helpline www.explore.gov.ky/travel

• **The Security Assistance Team from the UK MOD:** The Security Assistance Team from the UK MOD arrived on 28 April on the BA flight. The team are specialist desk-based planners. They will not be on patrol. The 11 military and one senior police adviser will be in quarantine for 14 days and then tested for COVID-19. We've already set them to work liaising with various entities within CIG. We have asked them to support Hazard Management Cayman Islands (HMCI) who are already fully engaged on COVID-19, on hurricane preparedness. The team's medical planning experts will be able to support us logistically with the procurement of medical supplies. We will also look to them to provide a link with the other UK assets in the region such as the Royal Fleet Auxiliary ship Argus in the region for normal pre-hurricane support. RFA Argus will be off the Cayman Islands next week but will not come ashore because of COVID-19. It will carry out training exercises with the RCIPS Air Operations Unit.

• **Thanks to HSA Lab and Doctos Hospital:** Heartwarming results are occurring daily. My thanks to Angela Tonzillo-Swarts and everyone at the HSA Lab and also to Doctors Hospital who have also helped us ramp up testing. We've reached a milestone with the Sister Islands in soon being able to remove restrictions. But practices such as social distancing, basic hygiene and the wearing of masks in public places are the new normal for all of us until we have a vaccine. They will need to be adhered to

in the Sister Islands and by all of us for many months to come.

• **Investigation into leaked information:** An investigation is underway regarding the leak of the new shelter in place regulations. I am also very concerned about the leak of the map highlighting the districts where victims of Covid-19 live, which will also be investigated. I appeal to everyone not to leak information. It makes it difficult to for the Government to conduct business and it also causes unnecessary harm and distress to those involved.

• **Closure of Philippines border:** The Philippines borders closed suddenly at the weekend. We have been advised that this is temporary and we're still looking at the possibility of flights there.

• **Role of RFA Argus:** RFA Argus, the Royal Navy Caribbean task force ship has arrived in Cayman waters. They will not be landing the helicopters on the Islands and the crew will not be coming ashore due to the Covid-19 situation. On 5 May, they flew two of their helicopters alongside the RCIPS helicopter on a recce of Grand Cayman. They are looking for key areas and landing sites in preparation for the upcoming hurricane season. They will also be conducting a drug interdiction exercise with the RCIPS Marine Unit. They also plan to conduct an overflight of Cayman Brac.

• **The children of the Cayman Islands:** Like the Premier, I too want to acknowledge our children in Grand Cayman, Cayman Brac and Little Cayman during this special time of the year. Our children have experienced such tremendous change and disruption in their lives in such a short period of time. They have done a wonderful job of staying indoors, more than they've ever had to in their lives before and have had their world turned upside down by all the new rules. My thanks to them all and to the adults in their lives who have been supporting them

Cash Remittance Gets 'Green' Light

As the Cayman Islands begin to shift gears into a more relaxed phase of COVID-19 response, restrictions are beginning to make way for commerce to re-emerge.

Money remittance services are the latest category of businesses to get the green light to operate in a push toward more activity in the Territory.

A release on the Government's information portal (www.explore.gov.ky) read, "Starting on Monday, May 4, 2020, money remittance services will open on Grand Cayman at eight locations, and one location in Cayman Brac, from 6AM to 6PM."

Persons seeking to send or receive funds may do so from Monday to Saturday on their respective A-Z (last name) days.

All companies operating remittance services have been required to utilize a pre-booking appointment system, which is limited to 15 appointments per cashier, per hour. Each customer must provide a valid confirmation of his/her appointment before completing a transaction.

Individual locations are also required to operate with strict physical distancing measures according to the Public Health Law (Prevention, Control and Suppression of Covid-19) regulations.

Some services at retail locations will utilize separate entrances to ensure adequate crowd control, according to officials.

With Little Cayman and Cayman Brac showing positive signs from control efforts and Little Cayman set for an eventual all clear soon, the Islands' Premier said there was much to be thankful for at a press conference held on 4th May.

The phased reopening of the Islands' businesses includes lawn services, mobile car washes, retail delivery and pool maintenance services; among other businesses already back in service such as gas stations, supermarkets, banks and liquor stores.



Several businesses were early in making presentations to the Cayman Islands Government with regards to the essential nature of their services and outlining how they planned to control the flow of people/traffic; successfully proffering their plans for approval.

Up until several weeks ago, Cayman Islands Premier, the Honorable Alden McLaughlin noted that he had not seen such a plan from remittance providers.

The Cayman Islands moved from Level 5 Maximum Suppression to Level 4 High Suppression on Monday 4th May based on an evaluation of risk in the community, including continued low positive covid-19 results, low levels of calls to the flu hotline, and low hospital admittance.

"If all goes well, we hope to move to Level 3 in two weeks when businesses such as home depots and hardware stores will become open to the public like supermarkets, maintaining distancing protocols as required," noted a high ranking Government Official, who added that this will depend on test results.

Currently, the nation is in a wider testing and screening mode, results of which inform Government's decisions in the moving between suppression lev-



els and the reopening of community and business activities.

The emphasis is still on maintaining social distancing and other 'shelter at home' restrictions, according to the Premier, who asked for patience in relation to the non-opening of beaches and non-commercial fishing during the next two weeks.

Hours for retail banks, building societies and credit unions have also been extended by three hours now, being allowed to open from 9 am to 4 pm.

"Right now this will make a huge difference for us because our family can send us money to assist with buying food and being able to survive until we

are able to get back to our home country," noted Mayette Palmer of Nicaragua.

She added that much of the money she had been sending home, will now have to be sent right back so she can take care of living expenses.

Theresa Lagu of the Philippines noted that she is happy the remittance services are back up and running because currently she is still being paid a salary and many of her family members in her country are unable to work due to restrictions there.

"I am still lucky to be getting salary from my employer and now I have the opportunity to get something back to my family," she remarked.

The move to reopen the remittance services has meant that people can begin to feel more connected with the world around them again in an effort to try to make life as normal as possible during this time.

Those with families or mortgages in other jurisdictions may stand to lose twice in many instances, as much of their livelihood disappears.

With several persons now being essentially stuck in the Cayman Islands after not being able to make it back to their home countries, the matter of remittance has taken on a more central focus. 🌐

Birth, Death and Marriage Certificates During COVID-19



General Registry is helping members of the public access birth, death and marriage certificates in the face of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

General Registry, the department within the Ministry of Financial Services which oversees this area, will resume issuing hard copies of the certificates on Wednesday, 6 May. The process is as follows:

- All certificates must be ordered via the Registry's online system at www.ciregistry.gov.ky or www.vitals.ky. Persons will not be allowed into Registry's offices to make an application.
- When ordering the certificates, please select the "Hold for Pickup" option.
- The applicant will be contacted via email or phone when the certificates are ready for collection. Please ensure that you have entered a valid phone number and/or email.
- Certificates must be paid for online using a debit or credit card. Cash or check payment upon pickup cannot be accommodated at this time.

- Once contacted, certificates can be collected from the Government Administration Building between the hours of 9:00am and 3:00pm, Monday through Friday.
- To collect your certificates, park on the roundabout by the security booth at the Government Administration Building. Please stay in your car and call 244-3101 or 244-3103.
- A security officer will deliver your certificate to you at the roundabout.
- The alphabetical restrictions in force by the "Shelter in Place" provisions will apply.

Marriage officers should email cigenreg@gov.ky, using the subject line 'MARRIAGE REGISTRATION', for specific instructions on how to file their marriage events.

The Cayman Islands Government is considering legislation to tweak the registration process for new-born children wherein registrations can be legally done via electronic means. Once the legislation has been approved, the resulting changes will be communicated to the public.

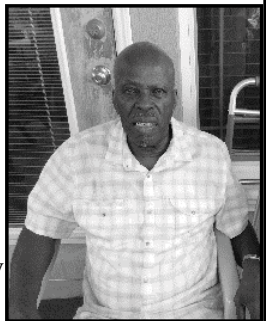

Canada fears record wildfire season

Canada's western provinces are worried that its wildfire season will be well above average. Scientists with the federal government say the problem will be exacerbated by tackling the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

Natural Resources Canada has released new projections showing an elevated fire risk starting in June from British Columbia to Northern Ontario and the territories.

Parts of Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and BC could see an elevated threat of wildfires that stretches into September. Bruce Macnab, the head of wildland fire information systems for the Northern Forestry Centre, said while at least one province now faces a "significant challenge" from wildfires every year, 2020 could see that threat spread across borders.

"It's suggesting we're going to have a fairly active fire season in Canada," he said. Macnab said the models aren't necessarily predicting fire behaviour, but they do show how weather and climate conditions could play a role in prolonging or elevating the wildfire risk.

The news comes as a grim reminder for Alberta, as residents in Fort McMurray just marked the anniversary of a historic evacuation in the northern Alberta city four years ago.

The fire, which started May 1, 2016, ignited a massive blaze that tore across the area and saw more than 80,000 people flee their homes as flames created apocalyptic scenes along the highway out of the city.

The fire devastated the community and destroyed more than 2,600 homes and buildings.

Parts of BC are also still recovering the record-setting 2018 wildfire season, when hundreds of fires burned. The season broke the record held by the one just before it, in 2017.

Provinces will now have to figure out how to fight fires and handle evacuations without spreading coronavirus, which has killed more than 3,800 Canadians and led to governments deploying massive amounts of resources to battle the health and economic repercussions of the pandemic. 🌐

Duterte apologises to tycoons

Philippines President Rodrigo Duterte has shown a rare streak of humility by apologising to business tycoons he once threatened to jail after saying he welcomed their response to the coronavirus crisis.

Duterte, who has had an antagonistic relationship with the country's commercial elite, said during a televised address that he was prepared to talk with owners of conglomerates Ayala Corp and Metro Pacific Investments. Their high-stakes dispute with the president had led to state contracts being reviewed and shares being sold off.

"To the Ayalas and to Pangilinan, I apologize for the hurting words," Duterte said, referring to Jaime Augusto Zobel de Ayala and Fernando Zobel de Ayala, the chairman and president of Ayala, and to Manuel Pangilinan, the Metro Pacific chairman.

"The COVID humbled me. With the kind of response that you gave, showed to the public, it's a humbling experience also for me," he said, thanking big businesses for helping the government's response to the COVID-19 crisis through donations.

The two groups have donated medical equipment such as masks and test

kits and helped set up quarantine facilities.

Shares of the companies rose sharply on Tuesday after Duterte's olive branch, with Metro Pacific surging nearly 13.5 percent. Ayala went up 14.7 percent while its water unit Manila Water climbed nearly 12 percent, outperforming Manila's benchmark index, which rose 1.8 percent during the morning.

On Twitter, Pangilinan thanked Duterte "for his sincerity and kindness." "I wish to assure him that our group is fully committed to being a partner of the government in addressing the heart-breaking moments of COVID-19 on our people," he said.

The Ayala brothers put out a statement thanking Duterte. 🌐

Cuban artists spread rooftop love

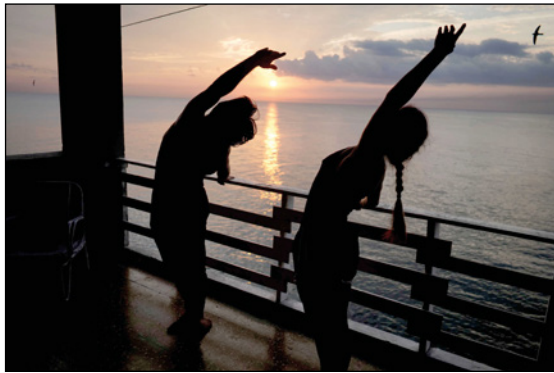
Cuba's artists are rising to the occasion during the coronavirus lockdown, taking to rooftops and balconies to create music and dance.

Throughout cities on the island the artists are performing and lifting spirits in the process.

The Acosta Dance Company had to return home after the troupe's world tour was suddenly cancelled in Britain. Now twins Alejandro and Leticia Silva rehearse ballet on the terrace of their seaside apartment to the sound of the ocean and occasional barking by their two rambunctious dogs.

The siblings, who rarely dance together, have found an unexpected bonus under quarantine. "Now it has been easier for me to collaborate with my sister when it comes to doing choreography," Alejandro said. It has also brought them closer together as a family.

From her rooftop, fellow Acosta artist Arelys Hernandez has also been inspired to choreograph. "I think that the dissatisfaction of being locked up in all

this will motivate creating," she said. "And surely the choreographers are going to take advantage of those feelings that we have accumulated during all this time of confinement."

Cuba reported its first cases of the coronavirus in March and has suspended school, transport and group activities.

The live audiences for Michel Herrera, 36, a saxophonist known all over Cuba, are smaller now that he performs on his rooftop for elderly neighbours, with Old Havana as the backdrop. But he sees this as an opportunity to grow as an artist. 🌐

Honduras economy boosted by avocados

The Honduras government is boosting the economy by backing production of avocados. The initiative to promote avocado production in Honduras is on course to produce 105,000 avocado seedlings this year, as well as the creation of a fully operational seedling traceability and marketing platform.

Three nurseries have been set up under the Avocado Healthy Seedling Project (Proyecto de Plántulas Sanas de Aguacate), in Intibucá, Comayagua and Ocotepeque.

The programme, which is run by the Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock, with the support of the International Cooperation Fund of Taiwan, aims to integrate public nurseries nationwide to ensure that enough plants are produced to satisfy growing avocado demand among the country's farmers.

The Intibucá nursery can produce 35,000 avocado plants, while the nursery in Comayagua, the largest of the three, has the capacity to produce 45,000 plants per year. The nursery in Ocotepeque's San Francisco del Valle covers an area of 6,500 square metres.

The goal of the project is to produce 315,000 seedlings by 2022.

Honduras exported 1,303 tonnes of avocados with a value of US\$2.6m in the year to October 2019, according to Erick Martínez of the Agriculture Ministry's National Agri-food Development Programme.

Shipments for the whole of 2019 rose by 76 percent in value and 61 percent in volume compared to the previous year.

Although it has been growing steadily, the country's production is still too small to meet domestic demand, leading to the development of the National Avocado Plan to boost production. 🌐

UK starts app testing for virus

A National Health Service app that aims to track the spread of coronavirus is being rolled out for the first time, as part of a trial on the Isle of Wight in the UK.

Council and healthcare workers were the first to try the contact-tracing app, with the rest of the island able to download it from Thursday.

If the trial is successful, it could be available nationwide within weeks.

Concerns have been raised over privacy, though ministers say the app has been designed with this "front of mind".

The app aims to quickly trace recent contacts of anyone who tests positive for the virus.

It is part of the government's strategy for coming out of lockdown, which aims to have widespread testing and contact tracing in place to monitor and reduce any future outbreaks.

If the trial is successful, the app will be rolled out across the whole of the UK by the middle of May, Health Secretary Matt Hancock said.

Meanwhile, Labour leader Sir Keir Starmer has called for a "national consensus" on tackling the virus when the UK begins to move out of lockdown.

It comes as the number of coronavirus-related deaths in the UK reached on Tuesday 28,734, an increase of 288.

The daily increase in deaths is lower than at any point since the end of March, but the figures reported at the weekend tend to be lower and are expected to rise, Hancock said.

The new app - published on Apple and Google's app stores - works by using a Bluetooth connection.

It records when two people who have the app are within a certain distance of each other for longer than a specified amount of time.

If one of those people later reports having symptoms, all the other app users they came into significant contact with over recent days will be alerted and, if judged necessary, told to self-isolate. 🌐

Venezuela arrests 'coup suspects'

Venezuelan security forces have arrested at least eight people who they accuse of plotting a coup attempt to overthrow the government. Two Americans were reportedly arrested after a beach invasion aimed at capturing socialist President Nicolas Maduro. The plot allegedly involved the US-backed opposition leader Juan Guaido.

Powerful socialist party leader Diosdado Cabello posted on his social media a video of a Venezuelan identified as Josnars Adolfo Baduel, who was also detained, saying two US citizens were among those detained.

Baduel is shown responding to a security official who asks him about the two Americans captured. Venezuelan state television broadcast the video but did not identify the Americans.

The two US citizens were captured on Monday in a second-day roundup of accomplices and were believed to be in the custody of Venezuelan military intelligence. The source, speaking on condition of anonymity, said the details came from contacts with Venezuelan security forces.

A Florida-based ex-Green Beret, Jordan Goudreau, confirmed that he was working with the two men in a mission launched early on Sunday to "liberate" Venezuela.

Goudreau has claimed responsibility for Sunday's operation, which Venezuelan authorities say left eight people dead at a beach near the port city of La Guaira.

He identified the two former US veterans taken into Venezuelan custody as Luke Denman and Aaron Berry. The two served alongside him in Iraq and Afghanistan, Goudreau said.

Goudreau said the men were part of an alleged mission called "Operation Gideon". 🌐
