## MOTION WITHDRAWN BUT BEACH ACCESS ISSUE STILL 'AT SEA'



When the Hon. Minister for Lands Juliana O'Connor-Connolly invoked legendary Barbados and Caribbean social commentary song 'Jack' by Gabby, it was a signal that the beach access issue is still quite alive in Cayman.

The Legislative Assembly was debating a motion tabled by Hon. MLA for

Savannah, Anthony Eden, calling for obstructing beach access to be made a criminal offence.

As it turned out, it's already a criminal offence and although MLA Eden subsequently withdrew the motion, the issue nevertheless triggered a spirited debate in the LA.

Seconding the motion, Hon. MLA for Newlands, Alva Suckoo, noted the long-standing contentious nature of beach access and right of way.

"As the country continues to develop especially where beach properties are

# MOTION WITHDRAWN BUT BEACH ACCESS ISSUE STILL 'AT SEA'

concerned, we are undoubtedly going to see more disputes.

"We have seen some of these disputes turn violent," he recalled.

Referring to the existing legislation, he quoted: "The public by long use can acquire a Prescriptive Right of access to the beach over road, track or pathway which passes over any adjacent or adjoining land."

The law also states that any dispute arising can be referred to the Grand Court although it was argued that the cost could be prohibitive.

He pointed to Section 4 of the Prescription Law which gives the public "the absolute and indefeasible right" to beach access under certain provisions.

Mr Suckoo, the Deputy Opposition Leader, said the motion was brought "to ask the government to take the necessary steps to remove the onus from the private citizen and put it in the hands of the authorities."

Hon. MLA for Boden Town West, Chris Saunders, observed "this is something we take very serious when it comes to land in Cayman. We are talking about land that many Caymanians feel is not only legal but is also a God-given right to access the beach"

He urged that "we really need to deal with this issue once and for all before it becomes on a different point."

MLA Saunders who was speaking in support of the motion said he was seeking a balance between the rights of the homeowners, including their safety, and the right of Caymanians, handed down through generations and enshrined in the Constitution.

"For some people in the middle of the night if you have people walking down the side of your house (to the beach) there would be some concerns about safety"

"If this is one way of giving people access to justice that they can't afford by having the resources of the government defend it then I'm fully supportive of it," he added.


Hon. MLA for George Town Central, Kenneth Bryan, echoing concerns expressed, stated: "If those warnings are not heard and addressed today or within short order, we may be still in this house, if the good people put us back, having to face a very severe problem."

In that respect, he spoke of "the possibility of unrest in our community, the possibility of somebody getting hurt and potentially even a suit on us because we have a responsibility as legislators to protect the public's interests."

In responding to the issue at hand, the Hon. Attorney General Samuel Bulgin, reminded that legislation already exists making it a criminal offence to obstruct a public right of way.

"I am kind of struggling to see what else needs to be done," he stated, adding, "I am saying that in good spirits, not being critical."

He suggested that "what might have been happening is that some members of the public as concerned citizens are wrestling with how to go about dealing with this issue."

"Unfortunately," he said, "I think they may have been getting conflicting advice about how to treat with the matter."

The Attorney General explained that a lot of the right of ways are not registered and therefore they are not legally recognised.

"And if they not legally recognised, notwithstanding what the Prescription Law said, the only place you can have that resolved is in the Grand Court," he advised.

Mr Bulgin also stated that if the government inspectors dealing with these disputes are obstructed in the source of their duties, that is also an offence.

Regarding legal disputes, he reported that "there's already a public body that is in existence to deal with such matters; the Public Lands Commission, (so) some members of the public are not required anymore to take these matters upon themselves to go to court."

The Hon. Leader of the Official Opposition, Arden McClean, raised the possibility of "cultural insensitivity" on the part of some purchasers of beachfront properties.

"I don't know if it's out of ignorance, or being conservationist, or thinking that their ownership extends beyond where it really should, or where it really does. Culturally insensitive, that may be the case. I find that rather disturbing," he said.

The Hon. Min. of Lands, Deputy Premier Juliana O'Connor-Connolly summed up the situation with her reference to Gabby's enduring song Jack which charts the tricky undercurrent of

beach access for locals against the demands of a tourism economy.

Regarding the motion, she wondered in light of the Attorney General's explanation, of the need to proceed with the motion, but left the option open to the MLAs.

At the same time, she gave a commitment that the government "is very on board with protecting these rights".

Hon. MLA for Savannah, Anthony Eden, who brought the motion to the Assembly, subsequently withdrew the motion.

But in doing so, he wondered: "What I don't understand is in light of knowing all of these mechanisms are in place it seems to be so much confusion and stories coming from different sides."

In calling on the government "to do something about it", Mr Eden characterised the issue of beach access and right of ways as "being around since Jesus was on Rivera Beach."

But amidst the chuckles which that metaphor elicited, the struck a serious tone.

"I am sick and tired of every time there's always some story or the other, but 99 out of a hundred people you talk to want this resolved."

"Come on folks," he implored, "try and talk, communicate, I beg you to communicate."

The motion was withdrawn but the issue continues to recur like the rolling tide on Riviera Beach. 🌊

# Pedro, 'Birthplace of Democracy,' celebrates Constitution Day

... eas shared by others, and the normal Covid-19 social distancing rules were in place. But things were made as easy and relaxed as possible.

One of the biggest highlights in visiting Pedro St James is the wonderful, multisensory 3D story, a video full of live special-effects, which is really magical and atmospheric, and my little girl loved it especially. It begins with thunder, and flashes of lightning as the lights grow darker, and the sound of a stormy sea breaking on Pedro Bluff. This is the story of Pedro's beginnings, and the

beginnings of Cayman's awareness of its own, unique identity and destiny. It is good to see the presentation first, so that you have some idea about the magic and historical significance of the house.

Built by Englishman William Eden in 1780 (or at least, commissioned by him. The thick stone walls were probably built mostly by slaves). The towering three stories of the great house, known later as "Pedro Castle," must have dwarfed the other few wattle-and-daub homes at the time, and looked very impressive indeed. The house is tainted with mystery, and with sadness, as the daughter of one of the owners was killed by a bolt of lightning when trying to catch valuable rainwater, and her brother was badly hurt. "It was here too, on these same steps that the Abolishment of slavery, which was on 31st July at Midnight, took place. The proclamation was read by Captain Anthony Pax of the 85th Regiment of Foot," Tour guide Trisha Richardson Jackson told me.





"On 5 December 1831, on 5 December 1831 where the decision was made to form the first elected parliament," she added. The first parliament met twice a year, on the second floor, and the court was held on the third floor. On the first floor there is the waxworks of a prisoner, who had murdered someone, and you can see him sitting on the bed of his cell.

Another Tour Guide, Stacy Eden Hurlston really brought history alive explained that it was his own grandfather, as a young boy, who was hurt by the bolt of lightning which killed his sister.

He was very friendly and it seemed that there was nothing Mr. Eden Hurlstone didn't know about the great house, and its story.

"The Outpost" is a lovely restaurant and bar, with tables overlooking the majestic bluff falling way to a deep blue sea. Independently owned it serves a mixture of some of the best of local foods, like conch fritters and freshly caught fish, as well as international cuisine, and locally made beer and rum, too. At the back of Pedro's seven acres is a kind of little museum, with displays of old photos showing both Pedro, and George Town in days-gone-by. There is a nice little playground for young kids, too, as well as an old-time caboose you can get inside, showing you all the old-fashioned pots and pans and cooking utensils. It is nice to see how they present the old-time things, in a way that keeps with the spirit of history pervading the house and grounds, but also in a way that makes that spirit come to life, and talk to you.

Admission to Pedro St. James is only \$5 for residents for residents and guided tours are \$10 per person. Kids 5 and under and seniors 65 and older are free. It is open daily from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

# Digital Economy Conference: “Digitization beyond COVID-19”

The third annual Cayman Islands Digital Economy Conference (CyDEC), hosted by FTS, took place on Thursday 25 June. This year, of course, it was a virtual conference, because of COVID-19, but that fact alone was a great illustration, highlighting many of the things that need to change. The conference brought together global and local experts to share exciting new ideas in the world of the digital economy, with a special focus on the impact of COVID-19, which has highlighted the need for secure digital transactions. Social distancing of course demands digital, contactless, hence theme of this year’s conference: “Digitization beyond COVID-19.” The conference covered topics such as payment systems, digital innovation, the progress of AI, big data, and the effects of COVID-19 on cybersecurity. The conference was facilitated by Tammi Suleiman, and Paul Byles.

Two of the speakers, Inma Martinez, and Dr. Chris Brauer focused on the effects of artificial intelligence (A.I) which enables cybernetic systems to think more like human beings, but without their cultural bias. Martinez brought AI into the context of so-called ‘big data,’ which is a term used to help in the analysis of collective demographical, and behavioral mega-trends: “Very recently in just five or seven years we have been beginning to teach machines to behave almost like a human brain, like a neural network,” she said. “Machines have shown us an enormous potentiality and we can predict future events but we can also automate systems and we can also ask those systems to even think for themselves.”

Ms Martinez went on to highlight some key issues: “Inclusion is one of the targets we have at the European Commission: make sure that humans who have analogue lives are also included into digital services, and that they are trained, and they have exactly the same rights as savvy techy people,” she said.

A.I expert Dr. Chris Brauer, who is one of 50 global strategy officers with the



World Economic Forum, explained why A.I. is emerging as a global force in the new geological age characterized by human control of the earth’s resources, which academics have dubbed the ‘Anthropocene’: “A.I plays a prolific role in inclusivity and diversity issues both perpetuating inequalities and address in making them visible, and broadly applications of A.I. have been used to drive the acceleration of the digital economy, in two main ways, one around optimizing and efficiencies, and the other around human factors, and the ability of AI to augment human endeavor, innovation and pursuits,” he said.

“Whether those things are in relation to clean water, or climate change, or some of the issues I talked about before ... the spread of pandemics, the need for greater equality within our societies; virtually any major challenge you look at you see this. We need to work with advanced technologies to address the challenges that the Anthropocene puts forward, and we cannot do that without addressing the politics that surrounds that.” Outlining the nature of such political issues, Dr. Brauer said, “95 percent of the provision of AI is controlled by eight firms, and all eight of those firms are located in the United States or China.”

Focusing on digital issues closer to home, Presenter Jason Butcher spoke on the status of the Cayman Islands payment system, and the urgent need for the jurisdiction to find ways of verifying documents and legal identities online, as well as finding ways of making payments for business transactions, calling such developments a “must,” for Cayman’s financial sector if it is not going to lose out to other jurisdictions where such digital identity requirements have already been streamlined: “The importance of implementing this here in Cayman is, I think, a priority,” he said.

# CI Businesses Begin to Reemerge

Most sectors of Businesses in the Cayman Islands will be open as of Sunday, 21st June, as the Cayman Islands eases to Level 2 of its COVID-19 suppression response effort.

The ease of measures allowing businesses to resume their activities, fortuitously coincides with the recent payout of pensions and will mean that there is plenty of cash around from the injection.

Further softening of restrictions from 21st June to 5th July to 19th July will mean that persons will no longer be subject to shelter in place requirements or to restrictions regarding traveling to certain places on certain days based on their surname.

Masks must be used when in places where persons cannot keep 6ft away from one another however.

There is also no more prohibition of visiting people's homes and people can gather in groups of up to 25 persons in Grand Cayman; the same as in Cayman Brac.

There are no such restrictions in Little Cayman. However, social distancing and wearing of masks is still being practiced there.

All public gatherings will continue to be banned throughout the Cayman Islands.

Establishments such as barbers, spas, masseuse services and dental offices must institute social distancing guidelines and enforce wearing of masks. More than 25 persons may gather at these

places of businesses; provided social distancing can be maintained and mask wearing recommendations are followed.

The Government recommends operating remotely, if businesses are unable to achieve proper social distancing at the office.

"No words can describe the excitement to get back to work after three months. We truly missed our customers and look forward to hearing about everyone's lockdown experience," noted Cindy Oostvogels of Polished Nail Salon and Spa.

"We are so thankful to have such supportive clients, who encouraged us and checked on us during this time. All the staff have tested negative, taken online sanitising courses, and all protocols will be followed as far as social distancing, using of sanitiser, masks and gloves, as well as cleaning before, after and in between all clients to make sure everyone is safe, as that is the top priority", she added.

Restaurants and Bars are also able to operate, though each table must be 8ft apart. There are no limitations on persons at a table but all persons must maintain 6 ft separation.

No person shall be seated or served at an indoor counter in a bar or restaurant and servers shall wear masks or face covering to serve customers.

This bodes well for local favourites such as Cayman Cabana, where the dining experience takes place outside and Owner Luigi Moxam is bringing local/

Caymanian cuisine to the mainstream; creating a platform for local food that appeals to both visitors and locals.

As a result, local farmers and artisans are benefiting directly when person visit Cayman Cabana.

The restaurant's full house on Saturday, 20th June was testament to its mass appeal and a clear indication of how eager people in the community are to enjoy social activities again.

As of 5th July, bars will be allowed to operate within the for hours which they are licensed. However there is to be no karaoke or dancing.

Weddings have also received the green light, though nor more than 25 persons - including bride, groom and marriage officer - are allowed to attend these ceremonies.

Funerals have gone from 10 persons to 25 persons being allowed and persons can exercise at any time as long as social distancing is adhered to.

There are no restrictions on beaches other than social distancing; if persons are from outside/other households.

Strata and public pools can also be accessed by persons from different households, as long as social distancing is practiced.

Scuba diving an snorkelling are allowed however persons are asked to not that they must not reuse snorkels or masks.

Caymanians can go boating again, as long as no more than 10 people onboard

and there is to be no congregating of more than one vessel where number gathered exceeds 10 persons.

Boating activity in areas such as Starfish point, rampant, the Sandbar and Stingray City are prohibited.

In Cayman Brac and Little Cayman, persons can also boat with no more than 10 people.

No inter-island travel to Sister Islands by boat except for transport of freight.

To travel to Sister Islands by air, individuals will have to notify the Medical Officer of Health, remain at place of isolation specified by him for 14 days and receive a negative test result for the virus.

That is the new regime from now till 4th July.

On 5th July, the following changes will hopefully occur: all educational institutions and facilities including summer camps and vacations bible schools will commence full operation, including sporting activities, but no contact sports before 19th July.

5th July will also see indoor and outdoor service for bars and restaurants, with each table 6ft apart and no limitations on persons at a table.

Strata gym and public gym are also expected to open for 5th July.

On 5th July, persons will also only need to notify the Medical Officer of health before travel and upon receiving a negative result must be transported straight to the airport. 📍

the public and private sector, customs waivers, free online access to the territory's laws and funding for a marine protection unit.

## Deferred Retirement Age

"Retirement is wonderful if you have two essentials; much to live on and much to live for" was how MLA for Bodden Town West, Chris Saunders, introduced a motion to increase the retirement age from the current 65 to 70 years of age.

In noting the current retirement options, Mr Saunders said the "the intention is not to force people to work, but to say if you want to continue working and you feel you can contribute something then by all means.

The idea is not to take that dignity away from people who still want to work."

Reporting on consultation he carried out in preparing the motion, MLA Saunders said the objective is for a phased move to 70 years as the upper limit for retirement.

In the ensuing debate, Hon. MLA for Savannah, Anthony Eden, spoke of "representation by some of our brilliant seniors approaching that age of 65 and up, who want to continue to contribute to the welfare of these islands."

"It's not about blocking the younger ones," he stated, "but the pool that we draw from of our Caymanians living here is getting limited, so I would encourage that consideration be given to introducing the change over a period of time."

The Hon Deputy Governor, Franz Manderson whose office oversees the

civil service, reported that the current public administration system already has a system in place to retain civil servants over the age of 65 where there's a demand for their experience and expertise.

He said it showed that "our current provisions to allow for the retention of civil servants who are at or have passed the current age of 65, if and when there's need to retain their services."

The Deputy Governor also said that his office was encouraged by the 'early wins' in an ongoing assessment of the implications of raising the retirement age.

"Allowing those persons to continue contributing their pension plan until age 65 has also had a positive impact on the overall public service pension fund and projected income replacement values for future retirees."

With Cayman being one of the few places which currently does not have a social security system, Deputy Governor Manderson also welcomed the extended retirement age as a worthwhile alternative.

"As Cayman does not have a social security safety net that provides a minimum income in retirement, any proposal that could lead to an increase in retirement savings should be considered," he suggested.

Mr Manderson observed that: "We would not want a system with individuals who are too old to find work but also too young to qualify for retirement."

He also emphasised that "there are dynamics that we have to contend with and the changes need to be looked at to ensure that we implement the best and right solution."

Suggested that more time would be needed to assess the impact of the proposed change, he added: "Such changes are not feasible in the short term with so many other pressing issues confronting the country and the civil service."

The motion which calls for starting the process of moving the outer limit of the retirement age to 70 was carried.

## Customs Waivers

Two motions were tabled in the name of Hon MLA for North Side Ezzard Miller, seeking exemptions from customs duty for warranty replacements and duty-free importation of medicines, medical and surgical supplies.

Mr Miller was absent from the sitting due to the death of his mother.

Responding favourably, the Hon. Minister of Finance Roy McTaggart, said while the accepted the request, he was mindful of the economic constraints at present caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The request by MLA Miller is now expected to be considered alongside measures to be submitted by the Cayman Islands Customs and Border Control(CBC) to make amendments to the customs tariff law, although the details of those were not immediately available.

"I think it's a motion the government can and will accept," the Finance Minister said via video link.

"I think in terms of the timing of any lifting of import duties as well will have to be very much contingent on the recovery of the country's finances considering that we are in a very severe time for reduced economic activity resulting in a 20-25% shortfall in government revenues."

Mr Taggart said if MLA Miller's proposal had come prior to the pandemic it would have most likely been accepted and implemented.

"On a personal note," he said, "I would rather like to see government revenues

restored to much healthier amounts before we actually implement such a recommendation. Had this come six months ago it would have been happily accepted and implemented, but I would just urge some caution there as we move forward."

Finance Minister McTaggart, however assured that the government will give it "due consideration in time."

## Maternity Leave Aligned

Maternity Leave between workers in the civil service and the private sector is to be aligned from next year.

This will come about due to the efforts of Hon. MLA Christopher Saunders, the Deputy Leader of the Official Opposition.

At present private-sector employees receive 60 working days off as maternity leave compared to 90 for their civil service counterparts.

"I believe that this inconsistency between the private sector and the civil service needs to be corrected as a matter of natural justice as we can't have a constitution with Bill of Rights that promotes equality under the law but them we have laws that are applied equally," Mr Saunders stated.

The motion was adopted. Another Saunders-initiated motion, this one calling for all Cayman Islands laws to be made available online free of cost was passed, as was a motion tabled by MLA Eden for the government to set up and fund a marine protection unit. 📍

**RCIPS Responds to Breaches of Regulations by Liquor Licensed Establishments**

Over this past weekend, 3-6 July, the RCIPS has encountered several instances of patrons and staff at liquor licensed establishments breaching the Prevention, Control and Suppression of COVID-19 Regulations that are currently in place.

On Saturday night, 4 July, officers attended a bar on Seymour Drive in George Town and found over 200 persons gathered on the premises. Patrons were socializing at liberty, most not wearing masks, and not maintaining social distancing. Officers also observed staff members at the location not wearing masks. Officers then entered the building, and observed several persons who appeared to be seated inside the bar paying for drinks, a further violation of the regulations.

When officers attempted to speak to the owner of the establishment, several persons in the crowd became aggressive towards the officers and refused to comply with instructions given. Additional officers attended the location and the owner was warned for intended prosecution for the breaches.

Shortly afterward, officers attended an outdoor restaurant and bar on West Bay Road and observed several hundred persons at the location again mingling freely, and committing similar offences. The manager of the establishment was spoken to, informed of the breaches, and warned for intended prosecution.

Shortly after 12:00AM on Monday morning, 6 July, officers attended a bar on Shamrock Road, where they ob-



served over 200 persons gathered on the property, mingling freely without masks and not maintaining social distancing. While the establishment had limited the number of persons inside the bar itself, officers also observed staff-members inside not wearing masks. The manager of the bar was spoken to and warned for intended prosecution for the breaches.

“We are gravely concerned at the level of disregard being shown by the staff and patrons at certain establishments. While most bars and restaurants have been complying with the regulations, the few that do not can potentially put the entire community at risk,” said Superintendent Pete Lansdown. “Our officers will continue actively enforcing these breaches through prosecution,

and are also submitting the details of any breaches we find to the Liquor Licensing Board, who will take the appropriate actions in response. Persons are liable to a fine of \$250 for each offense.”

“While we understand that Cayman is in a relatively safe position worldwide, and that persons are anxious to socialize after the extended period of curfew and restrictions, we implore upon everyone in the community to minimize risks, continue to observe the regulations that remain in place, and stay safe,” added Acting Superintendent Brad Ebanks.

Over the course of the long weekend, officers responded to several other incidents. A total of 25 persons were arrested for various offenses, including 6 for DUI, 4 for other traffic offenses, 1 for illegal gaming and 2 for assault. 🌐



## LIQUOR LICENCE HOLDERS REQUIRED TO HAVE VALID TRADE AND BUSINESS LICENCE

The Department of Commerce of Investment wishes to advise current holders of liquor licences, without a trade and business licence, to submit an application to the Trade and Business Licensing Board before August 31, 2020.

Effective October 1, 2020, all liquor licence holders are required to have a valid trade and business licence along with a liquor licence to sell and distribute intoxicating liquor.

This is pursuant to the Liquor Licensing Law, which was revised in 2016. Included in the changes was the requirement for a liquor licence holder to obtain a valid trade and business license prior to holding a liquor licence. When the law came into effect in 2016, holders



of valid liquor licences were given an exemption for the transitional period.

This exemption expires September 2020.

## Water Authority-Cayman COVID-19 Update

Water Authority-Cayman will waive penalty fees for June 2020, to further assist customers facing financial hardships during the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. This is in addition to waived penalty fees for March, April and May 2020.

The Authority's Wastewater COVID-19 Discount Policy for commercial customers has been extended by an additional three (3) months; which now means customers, may apply for a discount on wastewater bills for April through September. Customers who want to benefit from this temporary discount, must make the request in writing and provide

1) water consumption records for the entire calendar year 2019 and

2) the Cayman Water Company bill for the month under consideration. Requests should be submitted to [info@waterauthority.ky](mailto:info@waterauthority.ky).

The Authority also developed a COVID-19 Payment Deferral Policy to assist persons who may be temporarily out of a job due to the pandemic. This Policy allows customers to defer payment for up to three (3) months and ends 30 June 2020. ## CARICOM looks at replacing LIAT

Prime Minister of Barbados Mia Mottley has revealed that six air carriers have expressed interest in taking over LIAT's travel routes, in wake of the carrier's current financial challenge. They are SVG Air, One Caribbean, Caribbean Airlines, InterCaribbean Airways, Silver Airways and Air Antilles.

The issue of regional air travel was discussed as St Vincent and the Grenadines Prime Minister Dr Ralph Gonsalves assumed chairmanship of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) from outgoing chair Mottley during a virtual handing over ceremony.

Mottley explained that the announcement was made because citizens within the region are concerned over the absence of interregional transport as LIAT is liquidated.

Mottley said: "LIAT has been for us, a critical part of our history, it has allowed Caribbean people to move but there also is a time when those instruments that served us well in the past may not be the right instruments for us going forward."

She explained that if the board of directors did not liquidate the insolvent airline they would then be guilty of fraudulent trading.

Mottley said the CARICOM stakeholders were however, satisfied that the six airlines could more than fill the immediate gap, given the reduced travel due to the COVID-19 measures implemented to contain the spread of the virus.

She said CARICOM hopes to work with the six airlines and other private sector players who also expressed interest in working either on their own or with some of the existing players to fill the gap in airlift.

## Plantation Rum changing its name

A French company that makes rum sourced from Barbados is changing its name from Plantation to a more politically correct one.

The fallout from the protests against racial injustice following the killing of George Floyd and other African Americans by police officers has reached Barbados, leading the company with business ties there to take stock of how it brands its products.

France-based rum-maker Maison Ferrand, whose Plantation Rum uses Barbadian spirit in its blends, announced that it is dropping the trademark, redolent of the economy that dominated the island for 300 years, based originally on the enslavement of Africans for the production of sugar, molasses and rum.

Maison Ferrand's owner and master blender Alexandre Gabriel said: "As the di-

ologue on racial equality continues globally, we understand the hurtful connotation the word "plantation" can evoke to some people, especially in its association with much graver images and dark realities of the past. We look to grow in our understanding of these difficult issues, and while we do not currently have all the details of what our brand name evolution will involve, we want to let everyone know that we are

working to make fitting changes."

The company did not give a timeline on when it will be making the change nor did it allude to what the new name might be."

Maison Ferrand has evolved from a small family-run enterprise in 1989 to a global player in the spirits industry today. Its portfolio includes Citadelle gin and Pierre Ferrand cognac.

## Chef Ramsay makes Guyana sizzle

Guyana's popular chef Delven Adams, proprietor of Georgetown's Backyard Cafe, was featured on the National Geographic TV series Gordon Ramsay: Uncharted on Sunday.

The episode showcased Guyana's marvellous and diverse cuisine. The charismatic Adams, whose culinary tours have mesmerised foodies, and attracted tourists from around the world, said: "We want Guyanese to be open minded because Gordon Ramsay is a superstar, and if we went this big, then there will be others like him, ready to visit Guyana."

Harris added that the country has been in a dialogue with the government of Canada and the United States of America, and they are invited to see the advancements in St Kitts and Nevis.


"We have long said that we are going to be the best and we are going to be the responsible member of the community regardless of the competition that would always come," added Harris.

Investigators said they found 17 spent shells at the house. Roberts was rushed to the Arima Hospital by mem-

Whoever wins the 2019/20 NBA season might have an asterisk against their name, but Giannis Antetokounmpo believes it because of the lockdown whoever win will have overcome the toughest campaign ever.

The Milwaukee Bucks power forward said: "I hear a lot of people saying it could have a star next to it. It's going to be the toughest championship you could ever win."

He also admitted that players will not be at their fittest after coming back after an unplanned break. "Guys are going to be rusty," he said. "You're going to see guys throwing the ball into the stands, turnovers. I think as guys get more comfortable, the level of basketball will get better each game."

Antetokounmpo said that his mother might be concerned health wise but he has full faith in the NBA's protocols.

The 25-year-old Greek has led the Bucks to be one of the top teams. After winning the MVP award last season, his brilliance continued this season and he is one of the favourites to win the award again. He has averaged 29.6 points, 13.7 rebounds, and 5.8 assists this season playing 30.9 minutes per game.

One thing Giannis would want to do better is the team's finish. The Bucks lost to eventual champs Toronto Raptors in the Eastern Conference finals last season. The Bucks are aiming for the title this season. Prior to the league's suspension, they had the best record in the NBA with 53 wins so feel justified in believing their destiny.

The NBA season restarts on July 30. There will be stringent health and safety protocols, a single-site campus at Walt Disney World Resort in Florida and the goal is to take collective action to combat systemic racism and promote social justice.

Several players have decided to sit out the NBA's resumption. They are Wizards forward Davis Bertans, Trail Blazers forward Trevor Ariza, Lakers guard Avery Bradley, Mavericks centre Willie Cauley-Stein, Nets forward Wilson Chandler, Rockets forward Thabo Sefolosha and Nets centre DeAndre Jordan.

Pacers guard Victor Oladipo has joined the list. "I really want to play, and as a competitor and teammate this is tearing me apart," Oladipo said. "I feel like I'm at a great place in my rehab and getting closer and closer to 100 percent. With all the variables, from how I have to build my 5-on-5 workload back up, to the increased risk of a soft tissue injury which could delay my rehab, and the unknown exact set up of the bubble, I just can't get my mind to being fully comfortable in playing. I have to be smart and this decision hasn't been easy, but I truly believe continuing on the course I'm on and getting fully healthy for the 2020-21 season is the right decision for me." 🌐

## LeBron drops \$39m for new pad

LeBron James isn't letting COVID-19 mess with his forever expanding real estate portfolio. He recently bought a 13,000 square foot family home in Beverly Hills, California, for \$39 million. It's on a 2.5-acre plot and has seven fireplaces, a pool house with two baths, a lighted tennis court, and a screening room. No word to if the property has a basketball court.

Amazon CEO Jeff Bezos, the richest man in the world and worth \$170 billion, had previously signed a contract to buy it for \$90 million but backed out from it. LeBron saw the value in having this property and made sure he jumped on Bezos's back out.

This is the third LA County mansion purchase for James since signing with the Lak-

## Mahomes earns \$500m contract

NFL star Patrick Mahomes has signed a 10-year contract extension with the Kansas City Chiefs worth a record \$503m.

The extension will keep the 24-year-old quarterback at the Chiefs until 2031 and is the richest contract in the history of North American team sports.

Mahomes was named Super Bowl MVP for his performance in guiding the Chiefs to their first championship in 50 years in February, producing a stunning fourth-quarter display in a 31-20 win over the San Francisco 49ers.

"Chiefs kingdom, you've been with me since the beginning - from rookie year," Mahomes wrote on Twitter. "You helped us overcome adversity to become Super Bowl champs and we're staying together for a long time. We're chasing a dynasty."

Mahomes was named the NFL's Most Valuable Player in 2018, in

his first full season in the league.

"He's an extraordinary leader and a credit to the Kansas City community, and I'm delighted that he will be a member of the Chiefs for many years to come," said Chiefs chairman and chief executive Clark Hunt.

Chiefs head coach Andy Reid added: "I've had the privilege of coaching a lot of incredible athletes and special people in my career, and Patrick is without question on that list of players."

Mahomes, the 10th overall pick in the 2017 NFL draft, averages 302.4 passing yards per game, including play-offs, which is the most in NFL history.

He completed 319 of 484 passes for 4,031 yards and 26 touchdowns in the last regular season after throwing a league-high 50 touchdowns in 2018. He has also thrown 13 touchdowns in five career post-season games. 🌐

## NFL will play black national anthem

The NFL will play 'Lift Ev'ry Voice And Sing', commonly known as the black national anthem, before every season opener.

Stadiums will have someone perform 'Lift Ev'ry Voice and Sing' before 'The Star-Spangled Banner'.

The NFL is considering other measures to recognize victims of police brutality during the upcoming season. The proposals include listing the names of victims on uniforms through helmet decals or jersey patches, an idea that would come in collaboration with the NFL Players Association.

The NFL also may produce educational programs about victims.

NFL commissioner Roger Goodell admitted in a video last month that the league was wrong for not listening to its players earlier and pledged allegiance in their battle for social justice.

Speculation is that a team signing free agent quarterback Colin Kaepernick like-

ly would be seen as more of a show of faith than anything else the league can say or do.

The NFL is probably planning on doing more than just changing up its pregame routine. It has pledged a \$250 million commitment to social justice causes over the next 10 years. 🌐

Kamaru Usman will face Jorge Masvidal in a welterweight title fight on Saturday at UFC 251 on Yas Island in Abu Dhabi in the United Arab Emirates.

After arriving in Las Vegas on Sunday, both fighters had to take a coronavirus test and then quarantine while awaiting the results. Had they not passed the tests, the fight would not happen.

The UFC worked to salvage welterweight champ Usman's presence on the card after Gilbert Burns was forced to withdraw last week.

Masvidal was keen to step in at short notice. Usman and Masvidal have been embroiled in a feud that saw the duo exchanging abuse at a Super Bowl event earlier this year in Miami.

On Saturday afternoon, Usman tweeted: "Might be time for the pig to squeal."

Masvidal is one of the most popular fighters in the sport, many believing
