## Caribbean Churches reject Domestic Partnership Bill

The Caribbean CAUSE, a grouping of individuals and churches from 17 Caribbean territories including the Cayman Islands, is issuing this Communique in order to express its concerns about the fact and manner in which the Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Cayman Islands are being forced into establishing a legal entity called a "same sex union" because of the ruling in *Oliari v Italy* among other cases by the European Court of Human Rights (ECtHR).

This ruling by the ECtHR is in fact an ideological imposition and no court has the authority to impose its preferred ideology on any society. The ideology within which a society forms its laws and public policy is the prerogative of the people and the people only. It must be noted, that some 90% of the population of the Caribbean islands probed, reject the concept of same-sex marriage.

The ruling is an ideological imposition because the people of the Cayman

## CAYMAN AND TCI MOVE AHEAD WITH REGIMENTS

A UK Ministry of Defence training team has arrived in Cayman to begin training the jurisdiction's Defence Regiment Reservists.

The 14-strong unit landed on Thursday aboard a Royal Air Force (RAF) Voyager aircraft along with training equipment all supplied by the UK.


The two-week training course will provide the first 50 Reservists with a variety of skills including drill, medical training, defence law, navigation/map reading and survival skills.

A team of senior reservists recently completed officer training at the UK's top-notch Sandhurst military training academy.

In a social media post, His Excellency, Governor Martyn Roper, said the UK team who are serving UK military personnel, were all temperature-tested at the airport and have now gone into isolation.

# CITIZENS SURVEYED AND MINISTERS QUESTIONED AHEAD OF LA

With attention focused on the Domestic Partnership Bill in Monday's sitting of the Legislative Assembly, there is a further series of questions that the Official Opposition has tabled on a range of pressing issues.

Hon. Alva Suckoo, Deputy Leader of the Official Opposition and MLA for Newlands, has submitted four questions on matters pertaining to the supply of personal protective equipment (PPE) for medical staff, health insurance premiums and land usage and public safety.

Regarding PPE, the question is directed to the Hon. Minister of Health Dwayne Seymour.

"Can the Honourable Minister say what steps are being taken to ensure the Cayman Islands has adequate current and on-going supplies of masks, gloves and necessary PPE considering the stated hope to re-open to international travel, re-open schools and further lift restrictions related to COVID-19?"

A second question also directed at the Health Minister raises the issue of the government's pledge to cover the health insurance for persons out of work due to the COVID epidemic and unable to pay their premiums.

The issue came up recently when the government had to reassure policyholders as some payments had been late raising concerns that some policies were at risk of defaulting.

There was also some doubt over the validity of the arrangements which were said to have been in place and whether they had been properly formalised.

In that respects, the question from MLA Suckoo asks: "Can the Honourable Minister say whether there is a formal agreement/contract in place between the Government and local insurance companies with regard to the Government initiative to cover health insurance premiums for persons who have been impacted by COVID-19?"

The other two questions are in part directed to Health Minister Seymour and the Hon. Minister for Lands, Julia O'Connor-Connolly.

In the first of the two, Mr Suckoo poses this question on behalf of the Official Opposition:

"Can the Honourable Minister say, what are the Ministry's plans regarding the numerous LPP (Land for Public Purposes) parcels across the Cayman Islands that are not maintained, not fit for purpose and, in some cases, have become health and safety concerns for our communities?"

A related question asks: "Can the Honourable Minister say if the Government is in compliance with Section 41 of the Public Lands Law (2020 Revision)?"

With extensive debate expected on the controversial Domestic Partnership Bill, MLAs have been highlighting the matter with their constituents and the public over the past weeks.

There was a question over whether the degree of public consultation on the bill would have been achieved in the allocated time.

Up to this weekend community contact and feedback was in full flow ahead of Monday's meeting including a survey by the Official Opposition.

In its rationale for the survey, the group of MLAs state:

"We also note that there was no public consultation prior to the bill being Gazetted and the Government has now launched the consultation period but has provided very little information and guidance to the public. They will proceed to debate and vote on the bill starting on July 27th, 2020.

"We feel that with the lack of input from the public and the fast-approaching debate in the Legislature it is imperative that we gather the views of our constituents as quickly and effectively as possible."

In a statement, they said they'd reached 500 responses and were urging people to participate before the survey closes at midnight Sunday.

"Our survey on the Domestic Partnership Bill, 2020 is still open and will be closed at midnight tonight. So far there have been over 500 responses and I am grateful to all of you for taking the time to respond. If you have not yet taken the survey, please consider doing so today as the feedback is very much valued and will guide me this coming week when the bill is debated and voted on."

The bill which is intended to recognise 'domestic partnerships' between same-sex couples is hugely contentious across both sides of the Legislative Assembly and in the community.

MLAs have been taking soundings from their constituents and the community at large in advance of this week's debate and vote in the LA.

## COMMUNITY NOTICE

### DCI URGES PATIENCE WITH TRADE AND BUSINESS LICENCE PROCESSING DELAYS

An increased number of trade and business licence applications over the past few weeks are resulting in delays in processing time by the Trade and Business Licensing Board.

The Department of Commerce and Investment (DCI) has said that some applicants have contacted the office with queries regarding their new trade and business licence grants or renewals. "Before this public health emergency, DCI was focused on improving the customer experience and reducing wait times. We have not lost that focus," said a representative of the DCI. "The Board is working assiduously to keep up with an extraordinary demand at this time alongside some limitations we have due to COVID-19. We are therefore asking members of the public to have some patience when applications are made or when enquiring about applications."

The Department of Commerce and Investment has processed and issued over 4000 trade and business licences since March 25, 2020.

Of that number, 878 have been new trade and business licences, 3083 trade and business licence renewals and 277 trade and business licence amendments.

In April this year, Government approved the Trade and Business Licensing (Temporary Reduction in Fee) Regulations 2020, which temporarily waived the payment of trade and business licensing application fees for businesses, from May 1 to July 31 2020.

In addition, late fees from March 1 to July 31 2020 have been temporarily waived for all applicants.

# Comments on the Domestic Partnerships Bill, 2020 (the "Bill")



We write to provide our comments on the Bill, set out below, in our capacities as Civil Registrars of Marriage.

### Summary Conclusions

In summary, while we appreciate the background and context in which the Bill was drafted, it is our view that the **Bill is not fit for purpose** and ignores practical and commercial considerations of the modern wedding industry in the Cayman Islands. Further, although we do not propose to dwell on legal aspects of the Bill as it relates to legal matters pertaining to Human Rights, it would be remiss of us to ignore the **burdensome and undignified regime** that would be created by the Bill.

### Background to Civil Registrars in the Cayman Islands

A. The local capacity to appoint persons to the office of Civil Registrar first appears in the Marriage Law, 1963. We understand the drafting of this law was typical of marriage laws of the British Commonwealth at the time and was reflective of the Marriage Laws of Jamaica and the earlier Marriage Acts of England. *Thus, the office of Civil Registrar has been enshrined in the laws of the Cayman Islands since the Islands first became a direct dependency of England.*

B. Whilst deemed "Marriage Officers" by virtue of their office, there are marked and important differences between the appointments of Civil Registrar and Marriage Officer. First, only Ministers of religion may be appointed Marriage Officers,<sup>1</sup> whereas Civil Registrars are appointed from persons deemed fit for the office. Secondly, unlike Marriage Officers whose right to refuse to act as such with respect to any marriage which is contrary to the rules of their religious denomination in enshrined since the inception of the Marriage Law, Civil Registrar do not enjoy a similar right of refusal. Thirdly, Civil Registrars are expressly prohibited from incorporating religious service when a marriage is solemnised before them. *Thus, the office of Civil Registrar is an inherently secular one.*

C. We understand the importance of the secular nature of the office of Civil Registrar can be traced back to when marriage ceased to be a religious institution and came under the control of the State, circa the English Marriage Act of

1836. Prior to this, marriages were required to be performed by ministers of the Church of England, and earlier acts were discriminatory of other religious denominations (Roman Catholics, in particular).<sup>2</sup> The 1836 Act thus allowed civil marriages to be held in registry offices in towns and cities across England. The importance of the office of Civil Registrar is supported by a statutory oddity: Civil Registrars have a positive obligation to appoint another person to act as their deputy in the case of their illness or absence.<sup>3</sup> *Thus, the office of Civil Registrar can be said to have an important role in the carriage of the affairs of the State, namely the registration of all marriages.*

### Comments on the Bill

**1. The Domestic Partnerships Register is inherently discriminatory, may deter same-sex unions, and risk the loss of new revenue**

Since the Marriage Act of 1836, it can be said that the policy of the State is to encourage and ensure the recording of all marriages as a matter of public policy. The creation of a new public register, separate from that of births, deaths and marriages, appears directly contrary to nearly two centuries of British public policy, for the following reasons:

(i) Although it appears that domestic partnerships would be available to both opposite-sex and same-sex couples, as it is the *only* union functionally equivalent to marriage that will be available to same-sex couples it can be expected that such persons will comprise the majority of domestic partnerships, essentially creating a *public record of homosexuality*.<sup>4</sup> We can state with some confidence that our clients, domestic and foreign, will balk at the idea of their sexuality existing in a catalogued in a separate and readily searchable public record.

(ii) The Cayman Islands are actively promoted in the tourism industry as a destination wedding jurisdiction such that visitor/tourist weddings make up the majority of all marriages solemnised in the Cayman Islands.<sup>5</sup> There are commercial reasons for this as destination weddings generate substantial economic activity, both direct and ancillary, for local "wedding vendors", including but not limited to florists, musicians, hairdressers, the food and beverage industry, the hotel industry and tourism industry as a whole. Whilst we have received many enquiries over the years about the possibility of performing same-sex marriages, we have received a noticeable increase in these enquiries of late. However, the majority of the

Islands' destination wedding clients are from the United States where 'marriage' between same-sex couples is the *norm*, not the exception.<sup>6</sup> The concept of a public record of homosexuality may discourage destination weddings (and risk tarnishing the Islands' reputation within a crowded field of competitors), with the attendant loss of a new line of revenue for Cayman's destination wedding market.<sup>7</sup>

**2. The office of Domestic Partnership Officer is unnecessary and risks abuse**

In light of the foregoing background to the office of Civil Registrars and the highlighted points which have been distilled for convenience, our most immediate comment would be to question the proposal to create a new and distinct office of "Domestic Partnership Officer", for the following reasons:

(i) Until such time as a religious congregation is locally established (or an existing one develops) that does not object to same-sex unions, Civil Registrars (who are required by law to perform weddings for persons legally entitled) are already suited to perform same-sex weddings. The creation of what is essentially a new category of Marriage Officer, which lacks the statutory certainty attendant with the office of the Civil Registrar, is therefore unnecessary and also presents an undue administrative burden on any Marriage Officer or Civil Registrar wishing to be dually-registered.

(ii) The power of appointment of Civil Registrars (and Marriage Officers) currently resides with the Governor. Such persons are appointed and hold office at the Governor's pleasure. It is unclear why it is therefore proposed that applications for appointment as a Domestic Partnership Officer would be made to the Deputy Governor, and that the criteria for such appointment would differ from that of a Marriage Officer or Civil Registrar- in particular, that such appointment should be qualified by a requirement for the appointment to be "*in the public interest*".<sup>8</sup> Presumably this would have little, if no application to an existing Marriage Officer or Civil Registrar wishing to be registered and, as such, the appointment of those persons should be automatic upon written request.

**3. The Notice regime is unduly onerous and uncommercial**

The Bill seeks to establish a separate and distinct regime from that of the Marriage Law, although it is not clear whether this is due to the misconception that persons may not be willing to apply for appointment as a Domestic

Partnership Officer. Nevertheless, the proposed regime is unduly onerous and commercially unworkable, best illustrated by way of a comparison table with the procedure for marriage by way of a "Civil Registrar's Certificate" (see attached table).

(i) Accordingly, unlike the longstanding regime set out in the Marriage Law where couples are free to apply to their choice of Marriage Officer or Civil Registrar, the Bill proposes that applicants for a domestic partnership *must* apply to the Registrar at the Government Administration Building. This is entirely uncommercial, because couples expect service, and for that service to come to *them*, not to be required to seek out that service.

(ii) Further, the Bill proposes to transform the Registrar into what is essentially an officiant, but only in the case of domestic partnerships, as the Registrar is required to perform their domestic partnership ceremony (provided all legal requirements are met) but there is no Domestic Partnership Officer willing to do so. It is unclear why it was felt that the Registrar should be required to add the performance of domestic partnership ceremonies in addition to their usual administrative duties, especially at private locations, or how the Registrar will be able to schedule more than one ceremony a day. It is also entirely uncommercial as vendor would necessarily have to coordinate their wedding services with the Registrar's office.

(iii) It is also unclear as to what grounds a Domestic Partnership Officer, who has specifically applied for such appointment, should be able to refuse the carrying-out of their public duties. The couple would then be at the mercy of the restrictions on time, date and locations as they await the Registrar. This presents a level of uncertainty which is simply uncommercial for the destination wedding industry.

**4. The introduction of "Maritime Domestic Partnerships" is a transparent assault on the Islands' destination wedding vendors by the cruise ship industry.**

Respectfully, the introduction of the concept of a "maritime domestic partnership" is clearly an attempt to appease the cruise ship industry and entice more Cayman Islands ship registrations (evidenced by the unnecessary involvement of the Registrar of Shipping), to the detriment of the Islands' local wedding vendors. This attempt follows years of abuse by the cruise industry which, having faced local trade and business licensing and work permit requirements, has turned to promoting ship-board ceremonies which can be serviced by ship-board wedding vendors. Not only would this proposed regime be inexplicably more expedient than terrestrial domestic partnerships under the Bill,<sup>12</sup> it would all but guarantee that the cruise industry would be able to ignore local wedding vendors entirely, presenting a potentially catastrophic reduction in domestic revenue and risks bypassing the local destination wedding industry entirely.

### Conclusion

For the foregoing reasons alone, we remain opposed to the Bill and urge the Legislative Assembly to reject its passage. 🌐

<b>Domestic couples – application procedure</b>	
Domestic couples must first give notice of their intended marriage to their Civil Registrar (which need not be in person) in the prescribed form. If satisfactory, their particulars are entered into a "Marriage Notice Book" and the notice posted on the Civil Registrar's external notice board for 7 clear days.	One or both of the persons seeking a Domestic Partnership must first attend the offices of the Registrar at the Government Administration Building to provide (i) notice of their intention, <sup>9</sup> (ii) make a statutory declaration that they satisfy the legal requirements and (iii) pay a notice fee. The Registrar enters their particulars in the Domestic Partnerships Register and the notice posted on the Registrars external notice board for not less than 14 days.
After this period, and provided the Civil Registrar receives no objections to the marriage, the couple is issued a Civil Registrar's Certificate which permits them to get married.	After the period, and provided the Registrar is satisfied there are no lawful impediments to the intended domestic partnership and there is no "caveat" (objection) entered against the couple, the couple is issued with a licence for domestic partnership.
<b>Foreign couple – application procedure</b>	
Foreign couples (i) apply to the Governor's Office for a Special Licence (which is usually arranged by their Civil registrar) and (ii) pay an application fee and separate licence fee	Foreign couples may either: A. (i) send their notice of intention to the Registrar, (ii) make a statutory declaration before the Registrar's licence issued that they satisfy the legal requirements and (iii) pay a notice fee, or B. (i) before a Domestic Partnership Officer (who is not obliged to do so, despite the presentation of the licence), (ii) two "credible" witnesses, (iii) at any place of their choosing, provided there are open doors and (iv) with no restriction on the day or time of the ceremony. <sup>11</sup>

<sup>2</sup> The expansion of British Subjects into the colonies and dominions of the Crown may have also been problematic, as they intermingled with non-British Subjects.  
<sup>3</sup> Per section 9 of the Marriage Law, which appears to be unique amongst public officials/officers, as those terms are defined in the 2009 Constitution.  
<sup>4</sup> Per section 22, the Domestic Partnerships Register would be a public register.  
<sup>5</sup> Prior to Covid-19 pandemic, there were approximately 350 visitor weddings on average in the Cayman Islands each year.  
<sup>6</sup> We note that Schedule 2 of the Bill, which lists "Specified Relationships", 41 of 50 US states have recognized marriages for same-sex couples.  
<sup>7</sup> Per section 7(3), destination weddings, i.e. "parties to an intended domestic partnership are ordinarily resident outside of the Islands", are within the scope of the Bill.  
<sup>8</sup> Per section 25(2)(c) of the Bill.  
<sup>9</sup> Such notice must contain a declaration that neither party is not currently married, in a domestic partnership or in an "overseas relationship".  
<sup>10</sup> The language of the Bill is in this, and other regards, unfortunate. The requirement of witnesses in the Marriage Law is not referred to in this way and has never been ambiguous.  
<sup>11</sup> Per section 14. It is not clear if this break from the norm is intentional, but it would seem to make little sense that access to the ceremony must be permitted if, for example, the ceremony is arranged at an unsociable hour.  
<sup>12</sup> Inexplicably, the regime for applying for a Maritime domestic partnership is much simpler than the application process for a terrestrial domestic partnership. It is unclear why the master of a Cayman Islands registered ship should be given such preferential (and provisional) treatment.







# Government Opens Outbound Travel

Travel Time – run by the Ministry of International Trade, Aviation and Maritime Affairs – was established by the Cayman Islands Government at the beginning of July to manage both outbound and inbound travel, while the Cayman Islands’ borders remain closed and scheduled commercial flights are not available.

In order to streamline the process, those who already applied to Travel Time for outbound travel to locations serviced by Cayman Airways can make their own reservations. For those contracting a charter service or travelling via private aircraft, authorisations for these flights must be granted by the Civil Aviation Authority of the Cayman Islands (www.

caacayman.com). All outbound passengers will be subject to normal Customs and Border Control processes to leave the country.

Persons wishing to travel directly to London via the British Airways air bridge should still register with Travel Time, which works collaboratively with the Governor’s office.

During the border closure, all international flights will continue to leave from Owen Roberts International Airport in Grand Cayman.

Travel Time will continue to manage inbound travel, for Caymanians, permanent residents and work permit holders. Those persons are reminded of the requirement for mandatory isolation over



14 days in a government isolation center upon their return. Demand for these facilities is very high, and inbound travel will be subject to availability of

space in government isolation centres. Therefore, persons who leave the islands are not guaranteed a return on a specified date. Those persons who

intend to return to the Cayman Islands are still required to register with Travel Time: [www.explore.gov.ky/travel-time](http://www.explore.gov.ky/travel-time)

## NEW GOV.KY TO LAUNCH



## HSA celebrates it's 20,000th PCR test for COVID-19

Now four months into the Cayman Islands' response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Health Services Authority (HSA) is celebrating a milestone - its 20,000th Polymerase-Chain Reaction (PCR) test for the SARS-CoV-2 virus.

While the burden of travel restrictions, social distancing, mask wearing and other limitations posed by life during a pandemic have affected everyone on the islands, the HSA staff have been working to extreme lengths to acquire testing kits and laboratory supplies from around the world.

"The HSA has led the national efforts in population testing and has contributed to over 24,000 PCR samples performed since March," said Forensic Technical DNA Specialist Angela Tazillo-Swartz, who also serves as quality manager at Forensics Science Laboratory. "Most noteworthy is that we typically result 2,000 or less tests each year, which means that our lab will have resulted 10 years' worth of tests within just a few months."

"The result of all of our efforts is that the Cayman Islands has ranked third in the world in the number of COVID-19 tests performed per capita, while its businesses can safely re-open," she further stated. "This has come as welcome relief to the nation and stands in contrast to other countries that have lagged in testing and are now sadly facing soaring case numbers and reversals in their decisions to open businesses."

The team at the HSA performing the PCR tests is made up of experts from the Cayman Islands, United States and Canada and spearheaded by its Forensic Science Laboratory and assisted by its Pathology Laboratory. The forensics laboratory has been performing complex DNA and RNA tests for over a decade in criminal cases, paternity DNA testing, and public health screening. It is also the only accredited lab for PCR testing in the Cayman Islands, meaning that it abides by the strictest standards for testing internationally. Notably, the laboratory has also led the Cayman Islands' testing for Zika Virus, Chikungunya, and Dengue fever.

Senior Forensic Scientist Christian Taylor explained, "To really be absolute-

ly certain of our results, we have multiple sets of control samples - those we know to actually contain the virus' genetic material, as well as those that contain no virus - that are run alongside all patient samples. If any of these controls gives an unexpected result, we can then investigate what may have occurred and repeat the testing if necessary. We're also testing multiple genetic markers in every sample, not just one. We also use state-of-the-art robotic systems in our processes, which gives us an added layer of confidence in our results. Due to the importance of this testing, we view it as imperative to have such a meticulous level of control."

Over the past four months, the laboratory staff have been working relentlessly, with a constant intake of patient samples from across the Cayman Islands, having done all the testing for Cayman Brac, Little Cayman, and the vast majority for Grand Cayman. Now the team has accelerated its testing capability with the addition of new staff and the ability to return results within a day of sample collection. Rush samples for patients requiring emergency surgery have been performed in a matter of hours with the GeneXpert machine.

Now, as the Cayman Islands is getting ready to move to its lowest level of containment and considers the future of international travel and tourism, the HSA has added antibody testing to its arsenal of testing procedures. Antibody testing will enable doctors and health specialists to get a clearer picture of how many people in the islands have been exposed to the virus and still carry antibodies to it, even if they no longer have the virus in their system. Just as with its PCR tests, the HSA is focused on using only internationally proven antibody tests that are performed with the highest level of standards. Having set the benchmark for PCR-testing in Cayman, the HSA aims to also lead and support the country in antibody testing to keep its people safe and its businesses ready to work.

# Domestic Partnership Bill in the Cayman Islands

Islands have formulated their laws and public policy within the philosophical framework that design and purpose are necessary features of the universe; hence the definition of marriage in the constitution as a union between a man and a woman. This design defines normality. Any construct which defies design is therefore abnormal.

Homosexuality is not consistent with design and is therefore abnormal. It is illogical to create "rights" to that which is abnormal and such "rights" should not be imposed on any society.

In creating a so-called "right" to same-sex union the ECtHR is either being completely illogical or imposing another philosophy for law and public policy on the citizens of the Cayman Islands. Neither of those positions is tenable.

This is Judicial Activism. It is contrary to the requirement for separation of powers between the Legislature and the Judiciary and sets a dangerous precedent for the governance of all our countries.

It is instructive to note the part that raw political power has played in the current assertion that "homosexuality is a normal variant of human sexuality" which is the basis for the present situation in the Cayman Islands.

The **American Psychiatric Association (APA)** is arguably the most influential psychiatric body in the world. Its final decision to remove homosexuality from its list of mental disorders was by vote in 1973 after the organisation was subjected to severe and sustained po-

litical pressure by the 'gay rights movement'.

Members of the 'gay rights movement' picketed and actually stormed some of the APA meetings seeking the removal of homosexuality as a mental disorder listed in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual (DSM). Eventually after political action by members of the 'gay rights movement' both within and outside of the APA, the organisation responded to the political pressure by first changing its definition of mental illness. The Board of Trustees (BOT) subsequently removed homosexuality from its list of disorders based on the new definition of mental illness. Some members of the profession protested this approach by the BOT, so a decision was taken to have all members of the APA vote on the BOT's decision. 58% of psychiatrists voted in favour of the BOT's decision. After being removed from the DSM, homosexuality was designated a "sexual orientation disturbance." Fourteen years later, homosexuality was declared to be normal.

It should be noted that the process to make homosexuality "normal" was neither medical nor scientific. Barbara Gittings was a member of the 1972 panel that considered removing homosexuality from the list of mental disorders and a proponent for its removal. She is reported to have said that "the decision to remove homosexuality from the list of mental health disorders happened quickly because the decision was not medical..."

The APA cited research by Evelyn Hooker in arriving at its decision. However, this work was heavily criticised by Dr. Thomas Landess former Academic Dean at the University of Dallas and former Policy Analyst at the U.S. Department of Education.

In the conclusion of his critique of her paper and its subsequent use to facilitate prohomosexual legislation through the courts, Dr. Landess warned:

"This unquestioning acceptance of "authorities" on the basis of professional reputation or political correctness threatens the integrity of our legal system. Judges must take greater responsibility for assessing the soundness and accuracy of testimony by so-called


experts; yet, paradoxically, such a task is manifestly beyond the competence of the court. This dilemma is the consequence of the politicizing of the scientific community over the past several decades, particularly in questions of sexuality. The recent exposure of Kinsey's errors indicates just how long researchers have been careless or deliberately misleading in approaching sexual questions. And the widespread acclamation of recent, flawed studies "proving" that homosexuality is inherited genetically is evidence that the problem has only worsened over the years."

Early in the life of the LGBT political movement, its advocates sought to claim that being homosexual was both genetically determined and immutable and in fact, identical to race. This concept has been debunked by science. A report on a large study on genes in the Scientific American has stated, "It's the end of the 'gay gene'." Also, in Position Statement PS02/2014 issued in April 2014 the UK Royal College of Psychiatrists stated that sexual orientation was not immutable.

It is incontrovertible fact that the AIDS pandemic started in 1981 in American cities that had removed their buggery laws. This can be explained by the behaviour of male homosexuals in bathhouses in those cities. We now know that Men who have Sex with Men (MSM) have higher rates of HIV infections than the general population because of the practise of buggery and the fact that they can play both roles in the practise (role reversal). Of all intimate practises buggery carries the highest risk for HIV transmission because of the high concentration of cells of the immune system in the rectum. These cells are the targets of the infection.

The LGBT political ideology is a desire driven political agenda. There is no evidence that this political agenda results in benefit to the society at large but there is considerable evidence of the harm it does. This includes the AIDS pandemic, the suppression of freedom of speech, freedom of conscience, parental rights and the rights of children to grow with their biological parents and siblings.

Some three thousand years ago Aristotle had the wisdom and insight to note that "Law should be reason free





Unfortunately it is a lesson that western democracies have failed to learn as presently in providing legal and political support to a distorted desire western democracies are making "law based on desire free of reason" and the Cayman Islands are being forced to follow suit because of judicial activism and an illogical ruling from the ECtHR.

In consideration of the above we advise the people of the Cayman Islands, through the Members of the Legislative Assembly, to reject what is an illogical and harmful act of judicial activism by the European Court of Human Rights (ECtHR) and the ideology that it represents. The LGBT political ideology is not only illogical but is also totalitarian and a threat to the people of the Cayman Islands.

# OFREG GETS ROUGHED-UP BUT NEEDS MORE RESOURCES



The future of the Cayman Islands agency charged with regulating the jurisdiction's water, electricity, fuel and telecommunications sectors hangs in the balance. But that balance doesn't oscillate between whether Ofreg (The Utility Regulation and Competition Office) is scrapped or continues to operate.

It's more a matter of how OfReg - or something like it - functions.

The point is if OfReg did not exist it would need to be invented; such is the importance of an agency of its kind to fulfil this mandate in Cayman.

It's critical what OfReg states on its own website as its statement of mission:

"While many of the functions previously carried out by the ICTA (Information and Communications Technology Authority) and ERA (the Electricity Regulatory Authority) will continue as usual, in addition, OfReg is endowed with strengthened competition and consumer protection powers, as well as a duty to promote innovation in the sectors for which it has responsibility.

OfReg was also preceded by the Petroleum Inspectorate, which hitherto had been a Department of the Government of the Cayman Islands."

Across four days in July, the extent to which OfReg has been fulfilling its remit was subjected to forensic scrutiny by the Cayman Islands Public Accounts Committee.

That followed an equally clinical and generally critical review of OfReg by the Office of the Auditor General (OAG) on which the PAC sitting - more of an inquiry - was conducted.

OfReg did not go into or emerge smelling of roses, however with the shortcomings exposed of both the regular and the sectors, and significantly the companies, it regulates (or is required to), the future can only be better.

While the PAC's report is awaited, it's clear that OfReg needs the proverbial 'roots and branches' overhaul if the agency is ever going to live up to its mandate.

The evidence from the agency's executive ranged from the contrite; with OfReg admitting to its own serious administrative shortcomings, to the extremely combative; where the PAC had to order that accusations of inaccuracies levelled against the OAG over its report be struck from the record.

But in the defence of OfReg, one could argue that from the outset, the way it was set up (as detailed in the OAG report, the first since OfReg was set up in 2017), it was designed to fail or at best be impotent.

Plagued by inadequate funding streams, an inability to raise adequate funds in regulatory fees, and its own

staffing and resource inadequacies, these almost crippling challenges position OfReg as less a supervisor and more subservient to the very sectors - powerful, influential and well-resourced company and industries - that it's charged with regulating.

Cayman is a veritable gold mine for these companies and has proven attractively so over the years.

And while service has been delivered, it's the consumer who has paid the price; literally and figuratively.

The expert testimony given by company executives who appeared before the PAC gave an insight into the workings of the sectors in Cayman and the global industry in which they operate.

The bottom-line, whether it comes via fuel, electricity, telecoms or water lines tends to get prioritised over consumer lines of concern over price and service, industry expertise and slick public relations notwithstanding.

It might not be stretching it to suggest that OfReg is hardly equipped to (and resourced), despite its mission state-

ment and the laws which underpin its existence, to go head-to-head with these giants of industry that operate in Cayman providing a full range of services across energy, fuel, water and telecoms.

The PAC report is anxiously awaited.

Its recommendations, coupled with the clinical probe carried out by the OAG with its series of recommendation, should provide the basis for the future of OfReg, effecting a better balance - and distance - between the regulator and the regulated.

It's clear that OfReg needs to be better resourced across the board - and across its own board - to be the gatekeeper that it needs to be for the Cayman consumer.

Unless that's done, it will continue to be a paper tiger...and even more paper than tiger. 🐯

## RCIPS FCIU Warns of Potential Government Grant Scams

any such requests should be treated as suspicious and reported to the relevant authorities or RCIPS.

them during hurricane season," Mr Roper stated.

A large majority of the Reservists are Caymanians, the Governor pointed out, adding "I was delighted to see such strong interest in joining the Regiment."

Governor Roper said, "It is a significant achievement to get this far and my thanks to all concerned particularly Lt Col Watson, Commander of the Regiment and his team, the now-departed UK MOD Security Assistance Team, MOD UK and my own staff."

Meanwhile, the UK Military has also been deployed in the Turks and Caicos for training and development for a local regiment there.

A statement on the official social media page of TCI Premier Sharlene Cartwright-Robinson said Major Javed Johl of the UK Military, along with the first Commanding Officer of the TCI Regiment, Lieutenant Colonel Ennis Grant are, with the help of UK Military Officials, overseeing the recruitment and selection process.

The shortlisted candidates will be assessed over several days and through the methodology used by the UK's Army Officer Selection Board. That includes physical assessment, written commu-



nication; led and leaderless command tasks; interviews and the ability to plan and conduct a full appreciation of a complicated task.

The Regiment, once formed, will have two primary roles: to be in direct support of the Maritime Police, and also, to provide a contingent force capable of preparing and supporting the Islands, at time of natural or other disasters.

Premier Cartwright-Robinson called it an important development for TCI, adding that "it will be a symbol of pride for us all."

"The interest from strong applicants is an encouraging sign and my Government looks forward to growing it beyond the initial core officers."

Thanking the TCI Governor Nigel Dakin "and all support systems for mak-

ing this happen, the Premier went on to state:

"There are key investments in national security that will be game-changers for TCI and this is one. I am so very proud of this moment in our history."

"There remains much more on the horizon as we strengthen our national security systems and response," the Turks and Caicos Premier added. [f](#)

# Blood Bank off-site location at Cayman Islands Red Cross to close

The Cayman Islands Blood Bank announces it will resume full operations at the Cayman Islands Hospital as it closes its temporary off-site location at the Cayman Islands Red Cross building on Huldah Avenue on 1 August.

"We understand that it is hurricane season and the Red Cross will need to make necessary preparations if the building is to be used as a hurricane shelter," said Judith Clarke, manager at the Blood Bank and the Health Services Authority Pathology Laboratory. "We are very grateful to them for being so generous and accommodating by providing us with the space we needed at a most critical time during the COVID-19 pandemic. We also thank all of our community partners that have made this initiative possible."

The satellite location at the Cayman Islands Red Cross was opened in March by the Cayman Islands Blood Bank, with the support of community partners Car City, Generali Worldwide, Rotary Central and Hurley's Media, to bolster donations during COVID-19 restrictions. Since then, it has logged record numbers of blood units collected and new donor volunteers.

Data from the Blood Bank shows that 69 units of blood were collected in March, 151 in April and 160 in May totalling the amount of 380 units. Also, there were 11 new donors in March, 87 in April and 96 in May totalling the amount of 194 new donors. Ms Clarke noted that these numbers are "extraordinary" and surpasses the number of new donors the Blood Bank has had around the same period last year and previous years.

Minister of Health Hon Dwayne Seymour stated, "I want to commend those who have taken the time to contribute to these numbers. Your action is a true example of what it means to be Cayman-kind."

"I am also pleased to see the work that has gone into opening this satellite location," he added. "It is community partnerships like this between the public and private sector that is key to

Cayman's success, especially during times like these. Keeping up our national blood supply is critical during this time, so I encourage those who are eligible to donate to do so as this is another way to help save lives in the community."
