

GOVERNOR'S MOVE ON DOMESTIC PARTNERSHIP BILL DIVIDES OPINIONS



Reaction has been swift and varied to the announcement by HE Governor Martyn Roper that he will exercise his reserve powers under the constitution to enact the Domestic Partnership Bill into law by September.

This has also led to a scrutiny of the Governor's authority enshrined in Article 81 of the Cayman islands constitution relative to this issue.

The bill was rejected by the Legislative Assembly last week.

While Hon. Premier Alden McLaughlin has said the Governor's action was to be expected under the circumstances,

EDITORIAL

Christianity, Culture, Heritage and Human Rights

The Cayman Islands have been known to be a God Fearing and Christian community for many years. In recent times, many residents including the Government thanked GOD for his mercy and grace for the Islands' current success in dealing with the COVID 19 pandemic. As of August 5, there were no positive cases and no deaths linked to community transmission.

In a development that's certain to have far-reaching social and political implications for the Cayman Islands, His Excellency The Governor, Martyn Roper, announced on Wednesday that he will assert his constitutional powers and enact the controversial Domestic Partnership law.

This swift action by the Governor was forewarned by Premier Alden McLaughlin, but many residents never expected this decision to take place so soon after the defeat of the Government's bill one week ago.

We believe that this precedent will open the flood gates for further deterioration of the Christian Culture and Heritage as other enacted laws were also linked to the Christian Heritage.

Two examples are the Saturday Midnight closing of Bars which was said to be related to Sunday Worship and also the absence of casinos and gaming laws.

Many residents have publicly criticized the hypocrisy of these laws as Bars currently are allowed to open on Sunday mornings and raffles (a form of gambling) are allowed to be conducted as fund raising events.

One can now expect these arguments to return to the fore front when elected officials will find it difficult to use the excuse of Christian Heritage in these cases.

The Cayman Islands still remain an Overseas British Territory and this cultural shift was inevitable. We would have preferred if it was gradual and not enforced during a pandemic when the future economic success of the

Cayman Islands depends on the unity of its citizens.

We will hear calls for unity, but it will take time for this fire to simmer as people accept the reality that the decision ultimately lies in the hands of the Governor and the UK Parliament.

We believe in Human Rights and that a person's relation and faith is a personal decision that should not be forced on others.

Change is inevitable. The success of change, as we have learnt, is related to the pace of that change and the level of communication. As leaders we must ensure that change management includes the entire team and that all members are important.

We wish the best for this paradise we call home, and we encourage those with strong values, Heritage and Culture to hold tight to their beliefs as we respect the rule of earthly law whilst practicing tolerance for those who hold different values and customs.

The Cayman Islands is no longer a place that time forgot. We live in a global village with no real borders and we must realize that our neighbours may have come from a location far away.

POLICE NEWS

Fatal Collision Involving a Single Vehicle in Bodden Town

Just after 4:30AM on Saturday morning, police and other emergency services were dispatched to a report of a single vehicle collision involving a white Subaru Sunbar. The incident took place along Bodden Town Road in the vicinity of Long Fellow Circle, Bodden Town.



The vehicle was occupied by a 39-year-old man of North Side who was trapped in the vehicle due to the impact of the collision. He was extricated from the vehicle by the Cayman Islands Fire Service and transported to the Cayman Islands Hospital by Emergency Medical Services, where he was pronounced dead by the attending doctor.

Police later confirmed the identity of the deceased in the fatal collision as Gonzalo McLaughlin, age 39, of East End, Grand Cayman.

The RCIPS offers condolences to the family of the deceased.

The matter is being investigated by the Traffic and Roads Policing Unit. Anyone with information about this incident is encouraged to call the 649-6254 during regular business hours.

Police Investigate Serious Incident in West Bay

Just before 9:45PM on Friday 7 August, police and other emergency services were dispatched to a Mini Mart located along Rev Blackman Drive in West Bay. It was reported that a man attended the location seeking assistance for a serious laceration to one of his hands.

The man was attended to by Emergency Medical Services and transported

to the Cayman Islands Hospital where he is currently being treated for a serious but non-life-threatening injury.

The circumstances of the man's injury is being investigated by the police and detectives are appealing for witnesses to come forward. Anyone with information is encouraged to call the West Bay Police Station at 949- 3999.

Two Vehicle Collision with Injuries on Walkers Road

Just before 9PM on Saturday, 8 August, police and other emergency services were dispatched to a report of a two vehicle collision that took place along Walkers Road, in the vicinity of Academy Way.

The driver of one of the vehicles was trapped inside and as a result, he was extricated from the vehicle by the Cayman Islands Fire Service after which he was transported to the Cayman Islands Hospital where he is currently

being treated for what is believed to be serious and life-threatening-injuries. The driver of the other vehicle did not report any injuries to the investigators.

Both north and south bound lanes along Walkers Road are currently closed and traffic is being diverted between Academy Way and Rowley Rise. Motorists are being asked to avoid the area if possible and to exercise caution otherwise, as officers will be on scene carrying out their investigations.

CAYMAN BORDER CLOSURE EXTENDED

The Cayman Islands borders will remain closed for an additional month initially beyond the previously announced September 1st reopening date.

The unexpected announcement only came after office hours on Friday evening.

The government said that "having continually monitored the rate of infection in other countries, particularly in the United States where the pandemic is still widespread, Cabinet has taken the decision to extend the Islands border closure for an additional 30 days, until 1st October 2020, at which time a further decision will be made."

Hon. Deputy Premier and Min. of Tourism, Moses Kirkconnell, stated that "Waiting to open our borders is allowing us to learn from the experiences of other countries and is ensuring that sufficient time is allocated to putting all of the necessary precautions in place to keep our Islands safe and people protected."

TIMING QUESTIONED

Already questions are being raised especially about the timing of the announcement.

It had caught many in the various sectors of industry off-guard, especially those involved in tourism whose plans for a September reopening were already advanced.

Just this week, a major global real estate agency with significant operations in Cayman, issued an advisory to their clients and the international real estate market, about the anticipated September opening that the government had announced in July.

Well balanced in tone, the article stated: "As you may be aware, the Cayman Islands' borders have been closed to visitors, from a general aviation perspective, since March, in the jurisdiction's quest to prevent the spread of Covid-19 within the Islands.

It commended the authorities for the strict approach (which) "has meant Cayman has had very few cases and eventually has led to us becoming Covid-free for the past three weeks, an incredible achievement for the people of these Islands."

And it looked forward to the September opening date:

"But, come 1st September, the Islands will begin a gradual reopening of our borders to allow certain categories of people to come and go, with certain restrictions."

The company reasoned that "this 'soft reopening' of Cayman will allow the Islands to roll back rather than jump back into tourism, which should mean that we are able to better handle the formidable task of allowing overseas visitors back into Cayman."

It went on to say, rather presciently, "it is critical that we open our borders extremely cautiously to ensure that we do not suffer the same fate as some of our neighbours, who experienced spikes in Covid cases once they opened their borders, only to have to close them again."

And sounded this note of caution: "The start/stop process is a huge let-down for those who have committed to visiting or who were thinking of visiting. With proper protocols in place for visitors, it is anticipated that this soft opening will enable us to eventually get back fully to pre-Covid tourism levels in the coming months."

SHOULD REOPENING HAVE BEEN DELAYED EARLIER?

To all intents and purposes, we are indeed at that start/stop just one day after that marketing advice by a private business was published.

They and others will now have to review their plans in light of the government's announcement - released after business hours on Friday - that reopen-

ing the borders has been put on hold for at least another month.

The rationale is not being questioned, although the timing leaves several questions unanswered.

The trend in many of the source tourism and supply-chain countries for Cayman was already cause for concern when the September opening date was formally announced in July after being hinted at before.

While the cautious approach being taken by the government is understandable, the timing of the announcement for something as significant as this - without even a press briefing - raises questions that the government could do well by providing an explanation.

"From the outset of the pandemic the government has placed the highest priority on public health and safety and we are approaching the reopening of the Islands borders with the same degree of due care and attention. It is unfortunate that this decision had to be taken but we believe it is the most prudent thing to do given the environment beyond our shores," Tourism Minister Kirkconnell said in the late-Friday announcement.

While that is commendable, it's noteworthy that the issue came up in an early-July press conference when that very issue was raised as reported by Caymanian Times then.

"A tentative September target re-opening date has been mentioned for the Cayman Islands, but Premier McLaughlin sidestepped a definitive answer when the question was put to him recently.

Asked by Caymanian Times' Ralph Lewis then if a November reopening date would not be more practical given the September slow season, and allowing industry stakeholders more time to plan, the Premier responded: "Well, we are obviously going to have to make that decision relatively soon."

Speaking then on July 3rd he said, "We still have a fair bit of time."

A 'cross-ministerial' advisory committee has been set up to work on a reopening plan, but the Premier accepted that "no matter how good that plan is, we can't open the border when the virus is as rampant as it currently is."

Crucially, the government's announcement on Friday said, "Cabinet has taken the decision to extend the Islands border closure for an additional 30 days, until 1st October 2020, at which time a further decision will be made."

That suggests that depending on trends in Caymans source markets especially for tourism, there could be another deferment.

REOPENING RISKS REINFECTIONS

At present, there is growing concern about reinfections in several major global capitals where they have removed their lockdowns with some affected countries, the UK, France and mainly the US having to institute targeted lockdowns in several cities.

Some tourism-dependent countries in the Caribbean are now also reporting a resurgent in cases after opening their borders.

What's particularly noteworthy is that countries, even some with high infection and mortality rates, are now putting each other on travel warnings advising their citizens to stay away.

Cayman is included in a US list although the territory has not had any new cases for about a month, only one death (the very first case), and one of the leading COVID testing regimes in the world.

CAUTION, THE WATCHWORD

Meanwhile, in Cayman, the government continues to emphasise 'lives over livelihoods' in its continuing efforts to keep the disease under control here.

A cross-departmental committee has been advising on the processes for the planned reopening.

That involves an elaborate system being in place involving a pre-departure approval system before travelling, being required to wear an electronic health-monitoring device, and undergoing a period of self-isolation before being fully cleared to circulate within the community.

Further announcements were expected as the regulations for the new system are currently being finalised.

There's a crucial balance being weighed between opening up the borders to tourism and safeguarding against the risk of spreading the disease in the community.

The government had previously stated that it was adopting a cautious 'lives-over-livelihoods' approach especially judging from the experiences of other tourism-dependent countries in the region.

Several have had to roll back up the welcome mat which they'd rolled out, following a subsequent spike in infections locally linked to reopening their borders.

WARNING ABOUT UNAUTHORISED FLIGHT SALES

A growing area of concern for Cayman is airline websites which are offering flights to the territory and accepting future bookings.

The Cayman Islands government says it's aware of those and reminds the public that while the borders remain closed, "approval has not been granted for the operation of any commercial flights."

Travellers who make reservations directly with any airline while the Islands borders are closed are cautioned that they are doing so at their own risk.

"It should also be noted that airline vouchers issued by other airlines for such flights are not transferrable to the British Airways repatriation flights, nor are they valid for use on Cayman Airways," the government advises.

REPATRIATION FLIGHTS

In the interim, repatriation flights by Cayman Airways will continue to operate on an ad hoc basis and the air bridge between the UK and the Cayman Islands will also remain open, as this provides a vitally important link between the two countries.

With regards to the start of the academic year in September, the government said it recognises that parents are keen to confirm travel plans to accompany students needing to travel overseas to continue their education.

No further details were provided on that aspect.

The Governor's Office has confirmed that a British Airways flight will leave the Cayman Islands for London, Gatwick on 28 August, which is mainly for students and their parents. The Governor's Office is also in advanced discussions

with British Airways to introduce a regular fortnightly service to London, Gatwick. We hope to release more details on this next week.

The Cayman Islands Government, through TravelTime says it's making every effort to assist residents with returning home. However, it advises that travellers should remain aware that we are in uncertain and challenging times and with inbound travel restrictions in place, delays in securing a return flight should be expected.

Furthermore, Government policy stipulates that all persons entering the Cayman Islands must be quarantined for 14 days in a Government facility and will require a negative PCR test before returning to their own accommodations.

CAYMAN AIRWAYS FLIGHT SCHEDULE

Cayman Airways is also providing a series of repatriation flights to Miami, USA; Kingston, Jamaica and Le Ceiba, Honduras which are scheduled to depart the Cayman Islands on dates listed below. Although there are no restrictions on outbound travel from the Cayman Islands, non-essential travel is strongly discouraged, as options to return are limited and travellers may have to remain overseas longer than anticipated.

- Miami, USA: September 1, 4, 11, 18 and 25
- Kingston, Jamaica: September 2, 16 and 30
- Le Ceiba, Honduras: August 19 and September 23

TravelTime procedure for booking flights

While the Cayman Islands borders remain closed, all persons wishing to travel inbound on board a repatriation flight must register their inbound travel request with TravelTime, and complete the online form at www.explore.gov.ky/travelttime in order to receive pre-travel approval. Travellers who have not completed this process will not be permitted to board a repatriation flight. Questions or concerns pertaining to inbound travel should be directed to TravelTime by emailing travelttime@gov.ky or by calling 649-6913 between the hours of 8:30am and 5:00pm, Monday to Friday. 🌐

GOVERNOR'S MOVE ON DOMESTIC PARTNERSHIP BILL DIVIDES OPINIONS

the Opposition is questioning the Governor's motives.

On the other hand, rights organisations which have been campaigning for same-sex marriage have welcomed the Governor's decision.

In his statement after the Bill was voted down in the Legislative Assembly, Mr Roper also announced that after a 21-day consultation period, the Bill, with possible amendments depending on what arises during the consultation, will be made law in early September.

That consultation period is set to start on Monday August 10th.

Hon. Premier Alden McLaughlin, defending his administration's decision to bring the bill to parliament following a court directive in the case at the centre of the issue, has said that this outcome should have been expected.

IMPLICATIONS

"I pointed out several times that if the Legislative Assembly did not do its duty then the UK Government or the Courts would stand in for us and do what is required under law."

"This was entirely to be expected," the Premier said in his statement.

He called it "a very shameful event and one that should have been avoided."

In his assessment of the current situation, Mr McLaughlin went on to say that the matter now has even deeper implications for Cayman.

Referring to ongoing negotiations with the UK to allow Cayman more authority within the constitution, Mr McLaughlin felt now risks being jeopardised.

"The failure of the Legislative Assembly to do its duty last Wednesday has set back our efforts at increased autonomy immeasurably."

"What is also regrettable as a result of this," he said, "is that the UK will undoubtedly now decide to retain Section 81 of the Constitution despite my having gotten them to agree to remove it as part of the pending Constitutional changes."

He went on to state that: "I have always argued that it is unwise to encourage, and even worse to force the UK, as we have done, to act on behalf of the Legislative Assembly as having done so once they may find it easier to do so again in other circumstances."

OFFICIAL OPPOSITION WEIGHS IN

In its first statement on the matter, the Official Opposition said it wants the correspondence between the Governor and the Foreign and Commonwealth Office on the issue to be made public.

The group of MLAs headed by Hon. MLA Arden McLean says they have "written to the Governor requesting copies of the correspondence between his office and the FCO that has resulted in his decision to take the above course of action."

"We feel that for such a divisive, contentious and emotive issue it would be in the interest of good governance to have full and transparent disclosure so that the Caymanian people can have no doubts regarding the position of the U.K. Government."

The statement says they are now awaiting the Governor's response to this request and will issue a further statement once that has been received.

Since then, the leader Arden McLean and Deputy leader Alva Suckoo have been on the air (Radio Cayman's For The Record with host, Orrett Connor) discussing a range of associated issues regarding the powers of the Governor.

Those included a viewpoint that the Governor's announced period of consultation was instead just a matter of a notification pending the enactment of the legislation.

The policy position of the previous UK government of then-prime minister Theresa May that the broad matter of same-sex marriage was a matter for the Cayman Islands and the other Overseas Territories was again brought up.

The issue of independence was also broached in the discussion, as was the timing of the tabling of the Domestic Partnership Bill in the LA relative to the pending issue of same-sex marriage currently before the Privy Council.

In his statement advising that he would be exercising his authority under Section 81 of the Cayman Islands constitution, Governor Roper had pointed out:

"Despite calls in many quarters for the UK to legislate for same-sex marriage, the FCO decided that passing a version of the current Bill would be the right ap-

proach as this would fully comply with the Court of Appeal judgment."

The Opposition was also querying the meaning of "passing a version of the current Bill".

In his own statement, Premier Alden McLaughlin had also raised the issue of the shape of what was likely to emanate from the Governor's intervention.

"The result is that some version of the Domestic Partnership Bill will become law in a few weeks without further reference to the Legislative Assembly. What form this law will take is now beyond our control and will be decided by the UK and the Governor" he noted.

While the issue at hand is that of Domestic Partnership, the overriding issue of same-sex marriage has been referred to the Privy Council and a decision is expected early next year.

MLA BRYAN CONCERNED

Also speaking out on the issue has been Independent Opposition MLA Kenneth Bryan.

Examining the statement by the Governor on the programme Cayman Cross-talk with host Woody DaCosta, Mr Bryan was particularly scathing of the handling of the matter by Premier McLaughlin and Governor Roper.

The interpretation of what's meant by "a version" of the Domestic Partnership Bill was also a prominent feature of Mr Bryan's discourse, while scrutinising the Governor's statement, especially the issue of consultation.

"The Governor is right in line with the Premier selling this narrative to the people of this country that his hands are tied, that there's no other options and we got to do this."

"It's a load of rubbish and its lies!" the George Town Central MLA declared.

In this statement, Governor Roper had outlined that:

"Acting on instructions from the Foreign Secretary, I intend to publish on 10 August the Domestic Partnership Bill and allow 21 days consultation for the public and Members of the Legislative Assembly. My team and that of the Attorney-General will be available to consider any additional comments on the provisions of the Bill."

"At the end of this period, acting under instructions from the Foreign Secretary, I will use my Reserved Powers under Section 81 of the Constitution to assent to the Bill. I expect it to be gazetted and come into law at the beginning of September."

HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION BACKS GOVERNOR

Meanwhile, the Cayman Islands Human Rights Commission has thrown its support behind the Governor on the Domestic Partnership Bill issue.

"Extraordinary times call for extraordinary measures particularly when addressing human-rights infractions," it said in a press release.

"We know that His Excellency the Governor made his decision with due care and concern for the entire jurisdiction. His decision provides for the upholding of our own Bill of Rights under the Constitution as well as the European Convention on Human Rights (ECHR). The Human Rights Commission supports His Excellency in his stance for the furtherance of the Bill to be enacted as Law."

The HRC said the next few weeks are crucial as an additional consultation period will begin on 10 August 2020 to ensure that a sound decision is made for the finalization of the Bill.

"It is paramount, as society, that all review the Bill and provide comments in line with the consultation period to ensure that no one in our country is left marginalised."

The Commission reiterated that "during this time that we are all duty-bound to treat each other with courtesy, dignity and respect and to reject intolerance and discrimination." 🌐

HEALTH CITY TO OPEN CAMANA BAY LOCATION

SMB area specialty medical office to support East End tertiary care hospital

High-quality tertiary medical care is coming closer to residents of George Town, the Seven-Mile Beach area and West Bay – as well as international visitors staying in resorts along Grand Cayman's Seven Mile Beach.

Health City Cayman Islands has announced that the territory's only Joint Commission International (JCI) accredited hospital will be opening a satellite specialty medical care center in Camana Bay on Forum Lane. Centrally located in the Seven Mile Beach corridor and a 10-minute drive from the Owen Roberts International Airport, over 2,000 people work, live and visit the 685-acre community of Camana Bay each day.

Clinical Director Dr. Binoy Chattuparambil explained that the tertiary care facility is committed to making access to specialty medical services more convenient for all residents of and visitors to the Cayman Islands.

"At Health City, we have always taken a patient-centered approach to providing the highest quality medical care. We want to ensure we are making specialized outpatient care and surgical follow-up care as accessible as possible for all patients needing our services," he said.

The state-of-the-art facility in East End will remain fully functional as

Health City's flagship location in the Cayman Islands. Surgical services and major diagnostic services will continue to be based at the main hospital, with outpatient and follow-up care offered at the Camana Bay office in the facility's full range of specialized medical and surgical services.

Chief Business Officer Shomari Scott said, "We are opening this new location at Camana Bay to better serve Cayman Islands residents and the local community, as the majority of the population either live or work on the western side of Grand Cayman. Additionally, when our Islands reopen to medical tourists the Camana Bay center will provide a location closer to the ports of entry and to visitors who prefer to stay in the Seven Mile Beach area before and after their procedures."

Health City's Camana Bay office will not function as a general practice clinic, but will be offering outpatient consultations for a range of specialized medical services including cardiology, neurology, orthopedics, medical oncology, gastroenterology, gynecology, urology, and more.

Dr. Chattuparambil said, "Patients have told us that with their busy work lives and schedules, it is not always convenient to come to the hospital in East End for consultations as they live and

work on the other side of the island. So, we have listened and are coming closer to our valued patients."

Health City's new Camana Bay office is anticipated to be open within the next six to eight weeks.

Mr. Scott said, "We are working quickly as we hope to have the new office operational as soon as possible. We will ensure that we keep the public and our patients informed, and look forward to

welcoming them at both of our locations in the very near future."

Marl Road owner guilty in podcast case

Hon Justice Roger Chapple announced a verdict of “guilty,” in R v Sandra Hill. Hill is the Content Manager of Cayman Marl Road news website. The verdict was in relation to a court case which began in February this year, involving a podcast Hill had put together the previous February, about local businessman Matthew Leslie, accusing him of being “dishonest,” as well as being a “sexual predator.” Hill had pleaded ‘not guilty’ to a charge, under Section 90(1) of the Information and Communications Technology Law 2017. That law states, “A person who knowingly uses an ICT network or ICT service to defraud, abuse, annoy, threaten or harass any other person commits an offence.”

The prosecution’s argument had therefore been that Hill had been guilty because the nature of the podcast showed that she had knowingly used an ICT network to abuse and harass Mr. Leslie. In summing up, and Justice Chapple said that this law had to be balanced with Ms. Hill’s rights of free expression, under the Bill of Rights Constitution Order 2009. This constitutional right to freedom of expression, Justice Chapple said, had to be “Jealously Guarded.”

“At the heart of this case is a podcast on the Cayman Marl Road Website, on 25 February last year, entitled Surviving Matthew Leslie,” Justice Chapple said. There was no dispute, he said, that Ms. Hill had written the podcast and was responsible for its content. The podcast was available for the public at large to view, until Justice Chapple asked Ms. Hill to take it down, when the trial began.

“The Actus Reus (guilty act) is not in dispute,” Justice Chapple said, before explaining that what had been in dispute was Ms. Hill’s intention which relates to the phrase, “Knowingly,” in the ICT law. Hill’s lawyer had argued that her intention had not been to ‘abuse, threaten or harass,’ but had been to report facts that she felt the public should be aware of, Justice Chapple said, and that her ‘target, had not been Mr. Leslie, but the listening public, and so that any discomfiture experienced by Mr. Leslie could be therefore considered as ‘collateral damage.’ However, Justice Chapple didn’t find this explanation satisfactory.

Hill and Leslie had known each other for just over ten years, when they had become involved in business together.

Their business relationship had not lasted. Hill had uploaded a “Wanted,” poster, with Mr. Leslie’s picture on it, in the style of the old Wild West posters of outlaws, Justice Chapple said, and the clear inference was that Mr. Leslie was an outlaw or a criminal of some kind.

“The prosecution must establish that the intention was to abuse, or harass, or that this would be the likely outcome of their actions,” Justice Chapple explained. The hour long podcast contained many accusations against Mr. Leslie, but instead of stating these as unproved allegations, Justice Chapple said, Ms. Hill had presented them as facts. “The Podcast speaks for itself...the comprehensive and enthusiastic character assassination of Mr. Leslie was of course her (Hill’s) intention. She regarded herself as a crusader, and she fervently believed all that she said about him. It seems to me that she had a very sizeable axe to grind,” Justice Chapple said. He also said that Hill had become ‘obsessed’ with this crusade, and in doing so, she had, “Lost all sense of proportion and objectivity.”

Justice Chapple quoted Mr. Leslie as saying that the podcast, ‘blew his mind,’

and that he felt, as a result, ‘everything smashing down on me.’ Even though he admitted he had been a public figure, Mr. Leslie explained that he had since gone back to private life. “Mr. Leslie was seriously abused and Ms Hill’s sustained attack upon him amounts to harassment. Sentencing will be given in October. 🌐



Government full steam ahead with implementation of National Energy Policy

This month sees a step forward for sustainability in the Cayman Islands as the Ministry of Commerce, Planning and Infrastructure (CPI) launches a new public education campaign for its National Energy Policy, Energy Cayman.

The vision of the campaign is to promote energy efficiency and conservation methods to residents and businesses in the Cayman Islands, encouraging a sustainable lifestyle through responsible and innovative energy supply and consumption.

While the word 'energy' may evoke a sub-conscious association with electricity in our minds, it is important to note that the concept of energy actually covers a much broader spectrum of the community. The way we produce and consume energy is relevant in many different aspects of our daily lives, and it is essential for us to plan towards a more sustainable future across the board.

Through the launch of the Energy Cayman Campaign, the National Energy Policy will be addressing the first goal on their action plan, Knowledge and Education. The intention of the public education campaign is to create awareness and equip the community with a better understanding of how energy is supplied and consumed in Cayman, and the goals that have been put in place to improve on these processes.

Originally drafted in 2013 and adopted by Cabinet in 2017, The National Energy Policy has been an ongoing project for the Ministry of CPI for a number of years. With the support of the Government, the policy was initiated as a form of recognition for the importance of sustainability, and a step towards prioritising development in this field.

The multi-faceted National Energy Policy consists of 99 different strategies spanning across a wide variety of sectors such as: electricity; fuels; transportation; land use and buildings; water and wastewater; public education and awareness; and climate change and the environment. The policy has developed these strategies to create a tangible plan for a more sustainable lifestyle through responsible energy supply and consumption in Cayman.

Minister of Commerce, Planning and Infrastructure, Hon. Joey Hew, has welcomed the drive to increase public awareness of the National Energy Policy. Minister Hew noted that it cannot be business as usual if the Cayman Islands are going to achieve the targets set out in the policy. "For us to achieve the targets set out in the National Energy Policy, we will require concerted efforts by all stakeholders, and from every area of our economy that consumes energy. An important component of those efforts will be increasing education on various aspects of the policy so that the general public will have a better understanding of the framework government is using, and therefore make choices that will reduce their own greenhouse gas emissions," he stated.

One of the main focusses of the policy is to support energy security by reducing the reliance on imported fossil-based fuels in the Cayman Islands.

Kristen Augustine, Energy Policy Co-ordinator, commented, "The Cayman Islands is heavily dependent on imported fossil fuels for energy needs, with water, electricity and transport all reliant on imported oil. In 2014, only 0.9% of electricity was generated by renewable energy sources, with 95% of utility scale electricity generated by diesel. There is therefore a great need for Cayman to transition from energy dependency to energy security."

"Over the next few years we will be working with the whole Cayman population to ensure that everyone is able to contribute to a sustainable Cayman. From the transport choices we make, to our energy and water consumption, we all have a part to play in creating a better future for the Cayman Islands. We are committed to helping the population do that", Mrs. Augustine said.

The Ministry had already committed to creating a more sustainable future for the Cayman Islands that is built upon energy security and a dependence on renewable energy sources. This year, Cov-

id-19 has brought the world to a pause, giving the natural environment time to heal. The effects of the pandemic have inspired a renewed focus on sustainability in the Cayman Islands, creating an opportunity to re-ignite the National Energy Policy with the Energy Cayman campaign.

The National Energy Policy has identified goals and high level targets to meet these heightened sustainability aspirations for Cayman. As a first step, the initiative is committed to ensuring the community is well educated and knowledgeable on the impact of energy demand on the environment through the launch of this public education campaign.

"The National Energy Policy sets out a detailed plan that will allow the residents and businesses of Cayman to join forces to create a sustainable future for our future generations. This can be achieved if we all work together. The Policy identifies four goals which, if met, will meet the aspirations of the people of the Cayman Islands and will secure our future", Ms. Augustine said.

The four overarching goals included in the policy are:

Goal 1: Knowledge and Education

The people of the Cayman Islands will be well educated and knowledgeable on the impact of energy demand on the environment of the Islands and continuously embrace opportunities to increase the levels of sustainable energy solutions in the supply mix and improve efficiency in energy usage. The achievement of this goal has been set in motion with the launch of the Energy Cayman campaign.

Goal 2: Destination of excellence

The Cayman Islands will continually strive to demonstrate leadership in the development and implementation of innovative, well researched, environmentally sensitive, and sustainable energy opportunities where appropriate to small-island states and archipelagos.

Goal 3: Energy security

The Cayman Islands will have a modern energy infrastructure ensuring that energy supplies are produced and distributed competitively, safely, reliably,



efficiently and affordably supported by a governance framework of effective and responsive regulation, fuel security, environmental sensitivity and sustainable development.

Goal 4: Socioeconomic and environmental sustainability

The Cayman Islands will foster and promote the development and application of existing and new technologies, practices in sustainable energy solutions and the development of a sustainable energy industry reflecting its commitment to the socioeconomic wellbeing of its people and to its international and local obligations relating to climate change and environmental sustainability.

In order to achieve these goals successfully, the Energy Policy Coordinator is undergoing extensive research to identify opportunities for innovation that are achievable and beneficial for Cayman. Substantial groundwork is underway to develop more sustainable solutions around the following action points:

- Implementing new building codes to improve sustainability and energy efficiency
- Utilising land more efficiently for building and development
- Installing sustainable and environmentally friendly utility scale solar farms
- Finding alternative fuel opportunities to replace diesel
- Developing infrastructure to accommodate more electric vehicles
- Identifying processes for the implementation of renewable energy
- Introducing green loans through banks to support solar installation



DOMESTIC PARTNERSHIP NOW AN ISSUE FOR BARBADOS

While Cayman grapples with the issue of its Domestic Partnership bill, the broader issue now entering the social and political discourse elsewhere in the region to an extent not seen before.

In Barbados, Prime Minister Mia Mottley's high profile Welcome Mat international campaign inviting people to 'work from home in Barbados' is now coming under increased scrutiny and criticism at home and abroad over the country's marriage laws which define marriage as a union between people of the opposite sex.

Barbados Welcome Mat campaign is being heavily promoted as a response to the economic effects of the COVID pandemic.

But as global interest grows in the programme, the government has had to address concerns raised by LGBT campaigners about the country's constitution which does not recognise same-sex unions.

It has forced the government into rapid damage-control with Prime Minister Mottley declaring that there's no place for any form of discrimination in her government, party or country.

Legislation to recognise domestic partnerships has been introduced in the country's parliament, but already an outcry led by the churches is gaining momentum.

The sole parliamentary opposition People's Party for Democracy and Development (PDP) is accusing the Mia Mottley Barbados Labour Party (BLP) administration of attempting to force through domestic partnership legislation without consulting citizens.

The PDP is lead by Bishop Joseph Atherley who was elected on a ticket of the ruling Barbados Labour Party (BLP) but subsequently crossed the floor.

According to the PDP, the government is trying to sneak in the Domestic Partnership law without a promised referendum on the controversial matter.

The new PDP holds the only opposition in the 30-seat Barbados parliament after the ruling BLP trounced the Democratic

about Party (DLP) - its main rival and former government - in the 2018 election.

Domestic Partnerships are seen as a form of compromise legal status in the Caribbean's predominantly Christian societies which resolutely advocate a bible-based view of marriage and any status akin to it, as strictly between a man and woman.

Bermuda has instituted Domestic Partnership although that only came following a tumultuous legal tussle between the courts and the parliament.

While the law is now in place in Bermuda on the order of the courts, the government has challenged it at the Privy Council with a ruling expected later this year.

In Cayman, HE Governor Martyn Roper is embarking on a process of public consultation starting today (Monday 10th August) ahead of passage by decree on September 1st.

The Legislative Assembly earlier this month voted down the Cayman Islands version of Domestic Partnership, fashioned on the Bermuda model.

However, within short order Governor Roper overruled that outcome under his reserve constitutional powers as the bill's rejection was deemed by the UK to have contravened the tenets of the territory's constitution.

The developments in Cayman, Bermuda and now Barbados are being closely watched to see if a template emerges for the rest of the region. 🌐

Suggested Hurricane Supply List

To prepare for the unknown, each home should have a 72-hour Disaster Survival Kit. You will need to pack some essential items to help you and your family survive, whether you stay at home or leave it during a disaster.

Ensure at least three days (72 hours) supply for each person. Do not forget pets where applicable! The following is a minimum suggested list of Survival Kit supplies:

Drinking Water:

- One gallon per person/per day in unbreakable containers, Avoid using containers that will decompose or break, such as milk cartons or glass bottles. A normally active person needs to drink at least two quarts of water each day. Hot environments and intense physical activity can double that amount. Children, nursing mothers, and ill people will need more.
- Don't forget to add additional water for mixing formula if you have children and for your pets. Rotate the drinking water each year.
- Food preparation and sanitation require another two quarts (minimum) per person daily.
- Purchased bottled water that has been sealed is best for storage. It meets FDA guidelines for food and is not as vulnerable to temperature changes as unsealed water
- **Tip:** Purchase water this year and use it for drinking next year. This allows for rotation on an annual basis and keeps the water fresh. **Yes water can go bad!**

Water for sanitation use:

- Store extra containers of water to be used for flushing toilets, cleaning, and bathing.
- Purchase water purification tablets (Halazone) to be used if you still have running water but are told to boil water before using it. This allows you to fill the bathtub and other containers without purchasing expensive drinking water.
- **Tip:** Keep plastic containers (milk jugs and other containers) and fill them with water when a storm threatens. You can put these items in the freezer to keep food cold longer in the event that the electricity goes out.

Non-perishable Food:

- Maintain at least 3-7 days of food for each member of the family.
- Small, preferably single serving cans (should not require cooking or refrigeration). Dried fruit, peanut butter and jelly, coffee, tea, soft drinks and pet foods.
- Ready-to-eat canned meats, fruits and vegetables.
- Canned juices, milk, soup (if powdered, store extra water).
- Staples – sugar, salt, pepper in water proof containers.
- High energy foods like crackers, granola bars, trail mix.
- Raw vegetables that do not need refrigeration.
- Fresh bread.
- Comfort/stress foods – cookies, hard candy, sweetened cereals, lollipops, **instant coffee, tea bags.**
- Sterno for cooking.
- Vitamins
- Food for infants
- Paper cups, plates, and plastic utensils
- Non-electric can opener
- Aluminum foil
- Plastic storage containers
- Lots of ice (you can freeze your water supply)
- Pedialyte (to restore hydration if needed)
- **Tip:** Purchase only items that you like to eat and would eat even without a storm. Rotate these items by using them Dec-May each year and purchasing new items Jan-May. This allows you to reduce the cost of buying items for a hurricane kit at one time and

keeps the items fresh. **Yes even canned goods have a shelf life!**

Baby Needs:

- Special foods (enough for several days)
- Formula (enough for several days)
- Extra diapers
- Medicines (get a copy of prescription)
- Blankets
- Diaper Rash Ointment
- Baby Wipes
- Powder
- Bottles
- Pacifier
- Favorite toy/blanket
- Medicine dropper
- Diaper-rash ointment

Sanitation

- Toilet paper, towelettes, soap, baby wipes, liquid hand sanitizer
- Liquid detergent
- Feminine supplies
- Personal hygiene items (toothpaste, deodorant, shampoo etc.)
- Plastic garbage bags, ties (for personal sanitation uses)
- Plastic bucket with tight lid
- Household chlorine bleach, disinfectant
- Plenty of absorbent towels

First Aid Kit

- Assemble a first aid kit for your home and one for each car.
- Adhesive bandages various sizes – Sterile gauze pads (various sizes)
- Germicidal hand wipes or waterless alcohol-based hand sanitizer
- Non-latex gloves – Adhesive tape – Anti-bacterial ointment – Antiseptic spray
- Cold packs (non refrigerated type) – Scissors – Tweezers – Rubbing alcohol
- CPR breathing barrier, such as a face shield – Thermometer, Safety pins.

Non-Prescription Drugs

- Aspirin or nonaspirin pain reliever, Benadryl, peroxide
- Anti-diarrhea medication, Antacid (for stomach upset)
- Syrup of Ipecac (use to induce vomiting if advised by the Poison Control Center)
- Laxative
- Activated charcoal (use if advised by the Poison Control Center)

Prescription Drugs

- Heart and high blood pressure medication
- Insulin (enough for a 30 day supply)
- Hearing Aid and extra batteries
- Prescription drugs
- Denture needs
- Contact lenses and supplies
- Extra eye glasses
- **Tip:** If your insurance will allow, get a 90 day supply of prescriptions and have at least a 30 day supply on hand. n't wait until a couple of days before a storm to go to the pharmacy you may not get your prescription refilled; the lines are very quickly.

Clothing and Bedding

Include at least one complete change of clothing and footwear per person.



- Sturdy shoes or work boots
- Towels
- Rain gear
- Blankets or sleeping bags
- Pillows
- Hat and gloves
- Sunglasses
- Tent
- Lawn chairs

Entertainment

- Games
- Books
- Cards
- Extra batteries for games Coloring books, crayons.


Miscellaneous

- Wind-up or battery-operated clock
- Paper, pencil
- Needles, thread
- Camping utensils
- Map of the area (for locating shelters) and returning to the area.
- Cash or traveler's checks
- **Tip:** Have enough cash to sustain you through a 2 week period. Without electricity, most businesses (if open) will not accept credit cards and may not accept traveler's checks.
- Emergency preparedness manual
- Citronella candles

Not evacuating and staying home?

- Ensure you have enough food, water, medications, and other supplies in your survival kit to last at least 2 weeks.
- Turn refrigerator to coldest setting and keep closed.
- Turn off propane tanks.
- Unplug small appliances.
- Fill bathtub and other containers with water for cleaning and flushing. Additional water is stored for drinking.
- Cover all windows and other openings with hardened protections. If you do not have manufactured shutters, cut plywood and secure to protect the windows.
- Close all interior doors and brace outer doors.
- Select an interior room to use as a safe room.
- Plan as though you were evacuating and have enough cash on hand to sustain purchasing of gas, food, and other supplies in the days following the storm.
- If you have a generator, ensure you have enough gas on hand to sustain usage for several days.
- Ensure you have sufficient medications in case you are confined to your home for several days. Post-storm there may not be any electricity and pharmacies will probably be closed even with a minor storm.
- Plan to cook on a camp stove or grill in the days immediately after the storm passes. 🌍
