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PREMIER WARNS NEXT GOVERNMENT OF TOUGH TIMES AHEAD

Hon. Premier Alden McLaughlin, leader of the People's Progressive Movement-led coalition government, has thrown down the gauntlet to political aspirants for the 2021 general election, especially anyone seeking the leadership role.

Speaking this week, Premier McLaughlin cautioned that the outlook for 2021 was at best concerning.

He was at the time reflecting on how the jurisdiction has been navigating the turbulent waters of the economic downturn caused by the COVID-19 crisis.

With an assessment that Cayman has done "surprisingly well" both economically and managing the public health aspect of the pandemic, Mr McLaughlin sounded a dire note of caution about the outlook for 2021.

"It is going to be a massive challenge next year and for the next administration," he said.

The government, under Mr McLaughlin's leadership, has been credited for its

MARRIOTT HOSTS TOURISM JOBS OPEN HOUSE





Statement on the Release from the Office of the Premier concerning the Civil Partnership Law 2020

From Bishop Nicholas Sykes

The Statement issued from the Office of the Premier upon the promotion of the Civil Partnership Law by Governor Martyn Roper was unprecedented in its accusatorial character, giving profound concern to those who, in accordance with the Constitution (s.1(2)), recognise "the distinct history, culture, Christian values and socio-economic framework of the Cayman Islands".

While the strong prayer of Our Lord "Thy Kingdom come; Thy Will be done on earth as it is in Heaven" will indeed be fervently joined, we recognise no-

where in it a desire to form a "theocracy" (whatever that term may precisely mean) or any disrespect for the rule of just law. Such implied accusations are alarming, and they should not form part of the public record.

We request those responsible for the Statement of the Office of the Premier to reconsider its text, to discuss it if desired with relevant parties, and to withdraw it publicly as a gesture of good will and good faith.

TOURISM STIPEND REGISTRATION EXTENSION STARTS TODAY

Registration is re-opened today for the extension to the government's tourism workers stipend.

The scheme is being extended for another three months from October to December.

In addition to those already receiving payments, the scheme is now open to other tourism workers who have not previously applied for the stipend.

Eligible persons receive monthly payments of CI\$ 1,000.

The financial support programme was launched with a one-off payment of CI\$ 600 to qualifying workers which was subsequently increased to CI\$ 1,000 per month covering July, August and September.

Over 2,000 persons signed up for the scheme when it was first launched in May.

Documents required are; proof of being Caymanian (either through Voter's Registration, Caymanian Status Certificate or Right to Be Caymanian Certificate) and proof of working in the tourism industry.

Registration is being administered by The Ministry of District Administration, Tourism and Transport which says displaced Caymanian tourism employees who have not registered can register can do so now provided that they meet the relevant criteria.

That includes proof of Caymanian Citizenship (this does not apply to permanent residents), have worked in the tourism sector, are no longer working full-time and that they did not apply for the stipend programme previously.

Other documentation required to complete the process are a copy of the last payslip or official job letter along with a bank letter.

DEH Post Lockdown Operational Hours

The Department of Environmental Health (DEH) wishes to inform the public of its revised post COVID-19 lockdown hours at the George Town Landfill:

- Monday to Friday - 7am to 5pm
- Saturday - 7am to 1pm

The 24-hour landfill drop-off will remain open 24 hours a day accessible to the public for the disposal of small quantities of garbage.

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CAYMAN AMONG THE LOWEST GLOBALLY FOR COVID PREVALENCE

Cayman is ranked among the countries with the lowest incidence of COVID-19 globally relative to population size.

That disclosure was made by Chief Medical Officer Dr John Lee while giving his latest update on cases here.

Cayman currently ranks at 166.

That is far below other countries for the presence of the disease among their population.

The most recent COVID-19 test results on Wednesday resulted in an additional two persons testing positive out of 84 tests done.

The two persons are said to be returning travellers whose positive results were detected as part of the screening of arrivals. They are in isolation.

That brings the number of confirmed cases to have been reported in Cayman to 207, of which 204 have recovered.

The two persons are said to be returning travellers whose positive tests were detected as part of the screening of arrivals. They were asymptomatic and are in isolation.

It's the first time in four weeks that positive results have been shown and over nine weeks since any local transmission.

Chief Medical Officer Dr John Lee reported that 282 persons are in government-managed isolation facilities and 42 are isolating at home.

Cayman is continuing a high PCR testing rate comparatively although the volume of daily tests has dropped.

The CMO put that down to the likelihood that people might not be coming forward to be tested "because they recognise that we are in a quite good position at the minute."

He said front line workers continue to be tested and added that "as we begin to see more travel across the borders we may well increase the number of tests."

Meanwhile, as antibody testing continues to determine who would have had the virus, 61 positives have been recorded out of 2,516 tests conducted which is 3.9% of the populations.

Of the 61 positive results, 37 were persons who had previously tested positive for the virus, six had come into contact with persons who'd caught COVID-19.

For the other 18, it was determined that eight had travelled while the other

10 have had no identifiable COVID-19 contact history, Dr Lee said.

Cayman still retains a high global position for testing being ranked at 11 down from the top five a few months ago.

Meanwhile, the ranking at 166 for the prevalence of the disease relative to the population is considered as a good reflection on the efforts locally according to Dr Lee.

That is far below other countries for the presence of the disease relative to the size of the population.

Looking at Barbados and Bermuda, ranked 126 and 148 respectively, Dr Lee said those countries have opened their borders but with strict protocols have been able to keep their disease rate low.

He said Cayman "was doing even better with a ranking of 166".

Noting that Caricom was showing a "strong uptick in the number of cases in the region" Dr Lee went on to give a run-down of how some other countries were ranked relative to Cayman.

Aruba is now ranked second globally for the rate of prevalence of COVID-19, St Maarten is at 3, with Turks and Caicos Islands at 12, Bahamas at 14, Trinidad and Tobago at 25, Jamaica at 59 and British Virgin Islands at 78.

As explained by Dr Lee "these figures are the backdrop behind the decision-making by the government."

The USA which has seen a spike in numbers is ranked at 26 and the UK 108.

With a noticeable increase in the number of cases in the UK, the British government announced on Thursday that from next Monday, social gatherings will be restricted to six persons per group.

REVISED PHASED REOPENING PLAN

Hon Premier Alden McLaughlin, updating on the Revised Phased Border Opening Plan for September and October, declared that "the Cayman Islands is currently rated as Covid-free".

It's a status he said "which was hard-won by adapting our ways and making tremendous sacrifices for the greater good."

The phased reopening will be tested with a British Airways flight due to arrive on September 17th at which time the new entry protocols will be trialled

before being implemented on October 1st when the borders will be opened.

However, that will only apply to entry at the airport with flights operations restricted to British Airways and Cayman Airways.

Mr McLaughlin emphasised that "the phased opening which commences on the first of October only pertains to air arrivals on Cayman Airways repatriation flights or the BA airbridge flights between London and Grand Cayman."

The (sea)port will remain closed for the remainder of the year except for cargo purposes.

The Premier further stated that during this month there will be no change to the current arrangements for approved

travel to the Cayman Islands, except to trial some aspects of the new arrangements we have planned for the first of October opening of the borders."

He said a small number of pre-selected participants will be involved in the pilot.

The bio-buttons health monitoring device highly touted as a main feature for the new screening protocols might not be used.

Priority might now be given to a 'geo-fencing' tracking technology to ensure that persons remain within the stipulated perimeters of their isolation.

The plan will be reviewed at the end of October. 🌐

stewardship during the crisis especially for its handling of the public health element.

It has also put in place a number of measures to cushion the economic impact especially relief and stimulus support for small and medium-sized enterprises, funding, and training schemes for Caymanian workers.

"If you look at what's happening all around the world, there is going to be real work. We are doing a lot of thinking and planning ourselves," he said of his People's Progressive Movement-led coalition administration.

"Because we did that over the course of these past seven years is why we are as able as we currently are to navigate this very difficult current set of circumstances."

In very sombre tones, the Premier went on to state that "anyone who believes that things are not going to very, very difficult, in the coming years don't quite grasp the gravity of the situation that the world is facing and is going to continue to face."

However, with the 2021 elections looming the PPM-led government's economic policies and general track record are already coming in for close scrutiny.

General election in Cayman is due by May 2021.

Constitutionally, Mr McLaughlin who has been leading the jurisdiction through the health and economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic is barred from another term as Premier having completed two consecutive terms.

With the global economic outlook shrouded in uncertainty, Mr McLean's sombre warning raises many questions as much as it highlights the challenges ahead.

nians get into the tourism-sector. With around 4,500 overseas workers having left the islands, Caymanians are being targeted as a priority to fill the vacancies as the economy gradually reopens. Marriott's Director of Human Resources, Valerie Hoppe said, "We know that there are a lot of people out there right now that aren't working, and we want to help those people gain those skills through training, or network and connect with somebody so that when those borders open and more jobs are available they've met that person and they have that connection to hopefully get a foot in the door." The Marriott is offering a ten-week training course in front-office skills, and Ms Hoppe said that the hotel is prioritizing out-of-work Caymanians including

persons with prior experience and for those who may have the necessary skill-set and attitude to succeed. "We have had a lot of people come in that are recent high-school graduates or recent college graduates, and they want a job but they don't have experience. But we would be happy to train, or even take somebody on board that was a young go-getter," she said. Gail Henry, DOT's Deputy Director of product development said, "The DOT has partnered with our private sector partners, and the objective of the open house is to allow persons to register with WORC so if they are unemployed they can also network with various businesses represented here." She said it is also an opportunity for persons to find out about training courses that are available which the DOT has partnered with the UCCI.



Ms Henry said these funded by the DOT are aimed at getting Caymanians working in the sector again. Latest Deadline for Voter Registration Nears



The next deadline to register to vote in the Cayman Islands is Thursday, 1 October 2020. Those who register by this date will be added to the Register of Electors and be able to vote from 1 January 2021 onwards.

The current Register of Electors stands at 21,903.

After the 1 October deadline, any qualified Individuals wishing to vote in the next General Election, 26 May 2021, have until 4 January 2021 to register to vote if they haven't already done so.

Young persons aged 17 years who otherwise meet the voter eligibility requirements and will turn 18 on or before the date of the next General Election are permitted to register to vote before their next birthday.

Individuals looking to take advantage of this constitutional provision, are encouraged to review their documentation. Those who will lose their right to be Caymanian when they turn 18 will be required to apply for and receive a continuation of their right to be Caymanian before their voter registration process can continue.

"Since the last registration deadline, we have seen encouraging numbers of individuals registering to vote. As we begin to increase our efforts ahead of the next general election, we hope to see more people come forward to register. By registering to vote, you play your

part in maintaining a healthy democracy in the Cayman Islands," said Supervisor of Elections, Wesley Howell.

To register to vote, the following requirements must be met:

- Must be a Caymanian
- Must be aged 18 years or older
- Must be a resident in the Cayman Islands
- Must have resided in the Cayman Islands for no less than a total of 24 months in the last four years

Those wishing to register to vote are reminded of the following registration process:

- Complete an application form (Form 4) available from the Elections Office website (<https://portal.elections.ky/index.php/home/registration-process>)
- Submit the application form along with the required supporting documents either in person to the Election Office or via email to the registering officer for the district or to office@elections.ky

The list of supporting documents required is provided below.

- Caymanian Status Holders:
 - * Birth certificate
 - * Caymanian Status Certificate or letter
- * Photo ID (either passport or driver's licence)
- Caymanian born and have Caymanian parent/s or grandparents:
 - * Birth certificate of applicant, if born on the Islands
 - * Birth certificate of one of his/her parents or grandparents that were born on the Islands



- * An acknowledgement letter (instead of a birth certificate/parental birth certificate)
- * Photo ID (either passport or driver's licence)

Persons who have recently concluded prison sentences of more than 12 months are reminded that they need to re-register to vote using the same process described above.

Individuals who are unsure if they are currently registered can check their details on the Elections Office website or in person at the Elections Office.

The registration deadline is also an opportunity for existing voters to do their part in maintaining the accuracy of the list of electors.

The following individuals are strongly encouraged to contact the Elections Office in order to make the necessary updates.

- Existing voters who have recently moved residence or changed their name or occupation
- Friends or family of a registered voter who has passed away within the last six months, particularly if the individual passed away overseas
- Family members who believe their relative is no longer medically or mentally able to vote (this should be confirmed in writing by a medical doctor)
- Individuals who wish to object to a voter being included in the list on the grounds that they have been living outside the Cayman Islands for more than two years for reasons other than medical, education, work for the government or work on an aircraft or ship.

Cross Government Effort to Eliminate Derelict Vehicles

At the direction of the Deputy Governor, Hon Franz Manderson, JP, a cross-government innovation team has been assembled to address the issue of derelict vehicles.

The team includes the Department of Environmental Health (DEH), the Royal Cayman Islands Police Service (RCIPS) and the Department of Vehicles and Drivers' Licensing (DVDL).

This work directly contributes to the achievement of the Government's Broad Policy Outcomes specifically:

- Stronger Communities and Support for the Most Vulnerable

- Ensuring Caymanians Benefit from a Healthy Environment

"We are aware of the large number of derelict vehicles and have set a goal to reduce the number of derelict vehicles to zero by early 2021. However, it's an opportune time to remind the public that derelict vehicles are a community problem and every member of our community can help by doing their part. In other countries success rates were highest when both government agencies and the community worked together," said the Deputy Governor.

Since July 2020 DEH teams have removed more than three hundred (300) derelict vehicles to date.

It is estimated there are still three hundred (300) to three hundred and fifty (350) derelict cars across the island.

Derelict and abandoned vehicles fall within larger set of problems involving motor vehicle regulation, social disorder, the attraction of rodents who may spread disease and the illegal disposal of bulky, hazardous waste as well as the harm caused to the environment and the people who are exposed to them.

The Director of DEH, Mr Richard Simms reminds the public of section 8 of the Litter Law (1997 Revision) that states, "where a derelict vehicle is left or caused to be left in a public place in such circumstances as to cause, contribute to or tend to the defacement thereof, an officer shall give notice to the person so leaving or causing the same to be left



requiring him, within twenty-four hours of such notice, to remove the derelict vehicle so as to restore the public place to a condition satisfactory to the officer."

In other words a derelict vehicle must be in a public place, have signs of damage or missing parts including windows, tyres, etc and must be expired in registration for 6 months or more.

"It is safer and cheaper to have a car that has reached the end of its serviceable life safely removed from the community. DEH will remove a derelict vehicle

for \$75 per vehicle. That cost is very low in comparison to the dangers that these vehicles cause to our environment and to our health; especially the most vulnerable. We all know that our health and our environment are intrinsically linked. We must work together to protect our islands," said Mr Winston Sutherland, Director Management Support Unit, who is heading up the team.

CAYMAN COPING WELL ECONOMICALLY DESPITE COVID IMPACT

Despite the setbacks caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the finances of the government and the economy of the Cayman Islands have so far withstood the impact relatively well.

That was the message coming from Hon. Premier Alden McLaughlin as the territory moves closer to a phased reopening of its borders after close to six months.

Although the government is running a monthly deficit estimated at CI\$25 million to date, the Premier says this is far below what was previously feared in the original projections.

"I can speak with some confidence of government revenues," he stated reassuringly in a press government press conference on Wednesday.

"Actually government revenues are doing better than we had expected," the Premier said but tempered his assessment by saying, "but that's not saying that we are doing well."

With government finances "significantly in the red", the picture was one of a better-than-expected performance, which was put down to prudent financial management and fiscal policies.

Premier McLaughlin disclosed that the funding buffer was being finalised with government and a consortium of local banks tentatively agreeing on standby credit line.

When it was initially proposed, the amount indicated was for a contingency CI\$ 500 million for government to access if needed.

The details of a are expected to be announced possibly in a matter of days once the agreement is signed.

Stating that "we are going to be in very good shape", Mr McLaughlin suggested that the agreement could be finalised possibly as early as next week.

"If things don't get any worse as they are in terms of government revenue, we

shouldn't need that line of credit during the balance of this term," he added.

INITIATIVES HAVING GOOD IMPACT DESPITE SETBACKS

The government has put in place a range of initiatives to cushion the impact of the economic downturn caused by the pandemic and has announced that some are being extended while new schemes are being launched.

They include an extension for a further three months of the tourism industry stipend provided to Caymanians, retraining and upskilling opportunities in the tourism sector, and a two-year free of charge residential business incubators scheme for up to 12 start-ups at the newly opened Centre for Business Development.

These are in addition to the business support and stimulus programme launched at the height of the lockdown alongside an early pensions withdrawal scheme.

While there are no plans to expand that scheme, a deferral of the paying of pensions contributions will be extended to the end of this year.

Certain sectors of the economy have been performing well as the economy and society adjust to the impact of the crisis.

Among those singles out are the construction industry, bars restaurants and staycations.

The early pensions withdrawal scheme has also seen benefits to the economy and businesses although some anecdotal evidence suggests that much of that might have been spent on overseas purchases.

"It's not enough to make up for the loss of the tourist dollar," the Premier



reminded, but indications are that 'local spending' within the economy has benefited businesses with some reporting that August was a better month than usual.

"Frankly, I think that more of us are a little more than surprised that as a country we are doing as well as we are," he enthused.

Responding to a question from Caymanian Times regarding unemployment, Mr McLaughlin said although exact figures were not immediately available, there was a projection in the region of 6.2% at the end of December this year, falling to 5.1% over the first half of next year.

But he said "those are speculative projections" and would be affected by how quickly a vaccine becomes available and there's a return to some semblance of normalcy globally.

He gave an assurance that "the government is going to continue to do

whatever we can to help to supplement incomes."

The Premier said this was due to "the financial position the government is in and the level of confidence that there is in the administering of the financial affairs of the government."

"We don't see any financial crisis looming for the government in the next year, so government is able to do the things it's being doing such as provide stipends, grants..spend money in helping people get through this."

...BUT THE OUTLOOK IS NOT LOOKING AS GOOD

However, Premier McLaughlin cautioned that the outlook for 2021 was at best concerning.

"It is going to be a massive challenge next year and for the next administration," he said.

General election in Cayman is due by May 2021. Constitutionally, Mr McLaughlin who has been leading the jurisdiction through the health and economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic is barred from another term as Premier having completed two consecutive terms.

"If you look at what's happening all around the world, there is going to be real work. We are doing a lot of thinking and planning ourselves," he said of his People's Progressive Movement-led coalition administration.

"Because we did that over the course of these past seven years is why we are as well as we currently are to navigate this very difficult current set of circumstances."

In very sombre tones, the Premier went on to state that "anyone who believes that things are not going to very, very difficult, in the coming years, don't quite grasp the gravity of the situation that the world is facing and is going to continue to face."

In a response to a query from the local media publication in relation to specific messages being circulated in a group text, the Commissioner stated that, in context, while those particular comments were concerning, and potentially problematic, the specific comments being queried were not in breach of the penal code as they were not implicit or explicitly directed to any specific person(s).

The RCIPS is committed to our values of respect, courtesy, integrity, professionalism and service to all members of our Cayman Islands community. We represent and protect all members and the individual rights of our community. As an organisation we remain committed to our vision to make the Cayman Islands safer while ensuring that all members of our community can go about

their lives without fear of crime within and against our community.

While the Commissioner has not received any complaints of a criminal nature made by any person(s) or group impacted by any posts, as a service we take any complaints regarding any content seriously and any such complaints received will be fully and thoroughly investigated to the full extent of the law. We encourage any person(s) that have been affected directly by any criminal act to contact the RCIPS to report the matter. While there is no specific reference made to 'Hate Speech' contained in our legislation, there are many criminal offences contained in our legislation that provide considerable protection for our community against harassment, alarm, distress etc. which provide the legal basis for the investigation and prosecution of such crimes. This RCIPS wishes to advise the public that the matter will be kept under constant review and monitored on an on-going basis to ensure that the criminal law and penal code is not breached.


Two Men Charged with Burglary Offenses

UCCI's interim VP and Provost, Dr. Mosely Machette said, "I applaud you, all of you who are working adults all of you who have had challenges in



CAYMAN AND LONDON SHOULD TEAM UP ON PROJECTS SAYS UK REP

The Cayman Islands representative in the UK has raised the prospect of the jurisdiction partnering with the UK's City of London financial district, especially on the financing of global climate change sustainable development projects.

Mr Andre Ebanks, Head of the Cayman Islands Government Office UK (CIGOUK), was participating in an international online forum on Saturday looking at how the OTs respond to Brexit.

Addressing possibilities in which the Cayman and the London financial service sectors can work closer together, Mr Ebanks made the proposition of Cayman, "developing a niche area in which we may be one of the domiciles of choice for environmental social governance investment vehicles."

"Climate actions are going to cost money," he said and suggested that "Cayman is well-positioned with its well-regulated investment funding vehicles."

Mr Ebanks feels this could be one of the areas for Cayman's global contributions to

the 'green and blue economy' financing efforts.

He referenced recent remarks by HE Governor Martyn Roper regarding the next global climate summit, COP 26, to be hosted by Scotland.

Mr Roper had spoken of "a UK-Cayman compact on sustainable development setting out areas where we can cooperate."

"This once-in-a century-health crisis is a once-in-a-century opportunity to reshape the world that our children should inherit. Cayman should be a part of that. We should waste it," he quoted Governor Roper as stating at the time in the context of the COVID pandemic.

Mr Ebanks said there's already evidence of this in Cayman working in partnership with the UK on an agenda for environmental protection including identifying the funding streams.

The green economy is concerned with overall sustainable development without degrading the environment while the

blue economy more specifically focuses on the exploitation and preservation of the marine environment.

The World Bank is already promoting a shift towards projects that mitigate climate change and deliver sustainable growth as a future growth strategy.

It's already being viewed as a growth sector.

For example, investors and developers that rely on the Bank's \$30 billion funding programme as leverage for their capital projects will need to demonstrate that future projects are sustainable and meet the new criteria on climate change.

Mr Ebanks also asked whether the Paris Agreement of Climate Action - the global initiative that US President Donald Trump has controversially withdrawn from - should be extended to the Overseas Territories.

Concerning Brexit, Mr Ebanks said what he extrapolates from that is "an opportunity for the UK, Cayman and the OTS to get

together and strive towards collective prosperity where we have strong prospects."

At the same time though, the CIGOUK head also wondered about the impact of Brexit on relations between the OTs themselves, especially through the UK Overseas Territories Association (UKOTA) where common concerns are addressed.

He feared that a valuable resource was at risk.

On the wider bond with the French and Dutch overseas territories, he used the analogy of "the parents are getting divorced and as a result the kids are being split up."

Mr Ebanks said, "that conversation is ongoing now as to how we can continue working together and whether there's some form of informal memorandum of understanding that we could still share insights and analysis and continue to collaborate."

He described this situation as "one of the unforeseen consequences of Brexit."

According to the head of the Cayman Islands office in the UK, "Despite the gloomy forecasts, during this pandemic, there are rays of light that we should focus on and really make Global Britain mean something."

Saturday's forum was organised by the social enterprise and digital media company Island Innovation which links the private sector, government, utilities, NGOs and universities to advance innovation for sustainability and prosperity in islands worldwide.

Meanwhile, as the UK and other other EU overseas territories contemplate their relations post-Brexit, the entire Brexit project has been thrown into disarray with the UK vowing to renege on key aspects of the Withdrawal Treaty it signed with the EU in January.

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

Suggested Hurricane Supply List

To prepare for the unknown, each home should have a 72-hour Disaster Survival Kit. You will need to pack some essential items to help you and your family survive, whether you stay at home or leave it during a disaster.

Ensure at least three days (72 hours) supply for each person. Do not forget pets where applicable! The following is a minimum suggested list of Survival Kit supplies:

Drinking Water:

- One gallon per person/per day in unbreakable containers, Avoid using containers that will decompose or break, such as milk cartons or glass bottles. A normally active person needs to drink at least two quarts of water each day. Hot environments and intense physical activity can double that amount. Children, nursing mothers, and ill people will need more.
- Don't forget to add additional water for mixing formula if you have children and for your pets. Rotate the drinking water each year.
- Food preparation and sanitation require another two quarts (minimum) per person daily.
- Purchased bottled water that has been sealed is best for storage. It meets FDA guidelines for food and is not as vulnerable to temperature changes as unsealed water
- **Tip:** Purchase water this year and use it for drinking next year. This allows for rotation on an annual basis and keeps the water fresh. **Yes water can go bad!**

Water for sanitation use:

- Store extra containers of water to be used for flushing toilets, cleaning, and bathing.
- Purchase water purification tablets (Halazone) to be used if you still have running water but are told to boil water before using it. This allows you to fill the bathtub and other containers without purchasing expensive drinking water.
- **Tip:** Keep plastic containers (milk jugs and other containers) and fill them with water when a storm threatens. You can put these items in the freezer to keep food cold longer in the event that the electricity goes out.

Non-perishable Food:

- Maintain at least 3-7 days of food for each member of the family.
- Small, preferably single serving cans (should not require cooking or refrigeration). Dried fruit, peanut butter and jelly, coffee, tea, soft drinks and pet foods.
- Ready-to-eat canned meats, fruits and vegetables.
- Canned juices, milk, soup (if powdered, store extra water).
- Staples – sugar, salt, pepper in water proof containers.
- High energy foods like crackers, granola bars, trail mix.
- Raw vegetables that do not need refrigeration.
- Fresh bread.
- Comfort/stress foods – cookies, hard candy, sweetened cereals, lollipops, **instant coffee, tea bags.**
- Sterno for cooking.
- Vitamins
- Food for infants
- Paper cups, plates, and plastic utensils
- Non-electric can opener
- Aluminum foil
- Plastic storage containers
- Lots of ice (you can freeze your water supply)
- Pedialyte (to restore hydration if needed)
- **Tip:** Purchase only items that you like to eat and would eat even without a storm. Rotate these items by using them Dec-May each year and purchasing new

items Jan-May. This allows you to reduce the cost of buying items for a hurricane kit at one time and keeps the items fresh. **Yes even canned goods have a shelf life!**

Baby Needs:

- Special foods (enough for several days)
- Formula (enough for several days)
- Extra diapers
- Medicines (get a copy of prescription)
- Blankets
- Diaper Rash Ointment
- Baby Wipes
- Powder
- Bottles
- Pacifier
- Favorite toy/blanket
- Medicine dropper
- Diaper-rash ointment

Sanitation

- Toilet paper, towelettes, soap, baby wipes, liquid hand sanitizer
- Liquid detergent
- Feminine supplies
- Personal hygiene items (toothpaste, deodorant, shampoo etc.)
- Plastic garbage bags, ties (for personal sanitation uses)
- Plastic bucket with tight lid
- Household chlorine bleach, disinfectant
- Plenty of absorbent towels

First Aid Kit

- Assemble a first aid kit for your home and one for each car.
- Adhesive bandages various sizes – Sterile gauze pads (various sizes)
- Germicidal hand wipes or waterless alcohol-based hand sanitizer
- Non-latex gloves – Adhesive tape – Anti-bacterial ointment – Antiseptic spray
- Cold packs (non refrigerated type) – Scissors – Tweezers – Rubbing alcohol
- CPR breathing barrier, such as a face shield – Thermometer, Safety pins.

Non-Prescription Drugs

- Aspirin or nonaspirin pain reliever, Benadryl, peroxide
- Anti-diarrhea medication, Antacid (for stomach upset)
- Syrup of Ipecac (use to induce vomiting if advised by the Poison Control Center)
- Laxative
- Activated charcoal (use if advised by the Poison Control Center)

Prescription Drugs

- Heart and high blood pressure medication
- Insulin (enough for a 30 day supply)
- Hearing Aid and extra batteries
- Prescription drugs
- Denture needs
- Contact lenses and supplies
- Extra eye glasses
- **Tip:** If your insurance will allow, get a 90 day supply of prescriptions and have at least a 30 day supply on hand. n't wait until a couple of days before a storm to go to the pyou may not get your prescription refilled; the lines arevery quickly.

Clothing and Bedding

Include at least one complete change of clothing and footwear per person.



- Sturdy shoes or work boots
- Towels
- Rain gear
- Blankets or sleeping bags
- Pillows
- Hat and gloves
- Sunglasses
- Tent
- Lawn chairs

Entertainment

- Games
- Books
- Cards
- Extra batteries for gamesColoring books, crayons.

Miscellaneous

- Wind-up or battery-operated clock
- Paper, pencil
- Needles, thread
- Camping utensils
- Map of the area (for locating shelters) and returning to the area.
- Cash or traveler's checks
- **Tip:** Have enough cash to sustain you through a 2 week period. Without electricity, most businesses (if open) will not accept credit cards and may not accept traveler's checks.
- Emergency preparedness manual
- Citronella candles

Not evacuating and staying home?

- Ensure you have enough food, water, medications, and other supplies in your survival kit to last at least 2 weeks.
- Turn refrigerator to coldest setting and keep closed.
- Turn off propane tanks.
- Unplug small appliances.
- Fill bathtub and other containers with water for cleaning and flushing. Additional water is stored for drinking.
- Cover all windows and other openings with hardened protections. If you do not have manufactured shutters, cut plywood and secure to protect the windows.
- Close all interior doors and brace outer doors.
- Select an interior room to use as a safe room.
- Plan as though you were evacuating and have enough cash on hand to sustain purchasing of gas, food, and other supplies in the days following the storm.
- If you have a generator, ensure you have enough gas on hand to sustain usage for several days.
- Ensure you have sufficient medications in case you are confined to your home for several days. Post-storm there may not be any electricity and pharmacies will probably closed even with a minor storm.
- Plan to cook on a camp stove or grill in the days immediately after the storm passes. 🌐
