



BREXIT IS BACK ON THE AGENDA AND IT'S AS BAD AS BEFORE

Facing down a tidal wave of resistance, British prime Minister Boris Johnson is digging his heels and pushing ahead with what he calls the Internal Market Bill although his governments accepts that it violates international law.

The bill conflicts with the Brexit Withdrawal Agreement with the European Union which Mr Johnson himself signed in January after four years of tough negotiations and internal political upheaval in the UK.

Brexit resulted from the UK referendum in 2016 when voters narrowly chose to leave the EU by a vote of 52% to 48%.

CAYMAN NATIONAL CLOSSES BUCKINGHAM SQUARE CENTRE AND ENDS SATURDAY BANKING

Cayman National Bank has closed its services at Buckingham Square Customer Service Centre (CSC) effective Tuesday, September 15th.

Also, as of this Saturday, the bank will no longer offer a weekend service. "Though officially closing this location to customers, the Bank has maintained all staff who served at the location by effectively redeploying them within the organisation," the bank says.

Cayman National says it will maintain back-office operations and ATM services, except for ATM deposits, at Buckingham Square.

It advises customers needing access to their safety deposit box to contact the bank by email.

The bank said it "enjoyed serving valued customers during its tenure at the location and continue to cherish customer relationships at our four remaining Customer Service Centres, offering the same services, located throughout Grand Cayman."

It invites customers "to enjoy the same high-quality and convenient services through Cayman National Online and remote banking options."

Fall 2020 Labour Force Survey Starts 27 September

The Fall Labour Force Survey (LFS) conducted by the Economics and Statistics Office (ESO) will begin on Sunday, 27 September 2020.

The LFS seeks to collect data on employed and unemployed persons in the Cayman Islands, as well as those who are not in the labour force.

Trained interviewers with ESO ID cards will administer the surveys to a total of 1,500 randomly selected households. These interviewers will exercise appropriate COVID-19 protocols using personal protective equipment (PPE).

The ESO thanks the households that have already participated in the previous surveys, and is asking for the support of the general public in this Fall 2020 exercise.



The data collected is kept in the strictest confidence as mandated by the Statistics Law (2016 Revision). Individual data will not be published or used outside of the ESO and is exempted from the Freedom of Information Act.

STATEMENT FROM THE CAYMAN MINISTERS' ASSOCIATION REGARDING THE CIVIL PARTNERSHIP LAW AND THE PREMIER'S SUBSEQUENT COMMENTS



1) We believe that the rule of law finds its origin from the Supreme Law Giver as given in the Bible.

2) We are fully aware that the form of government in the Cayman Islands is a democracy, rather than a theocracy, yet we are convinced that legislation which counters the clear biblical, age-old practices and basic biology of human sexuality is not in the best interest of our community - hence our opposition to the Civil Partnership Law.

3) We wish to further point out that the statements in Section 1(2), as well as the Preamble to the Constitution referring to our Christian heritage, should be seen as consequential to legislative actions and meaningful, (not mere "window dressing" that has nothing more than sentimental value), and should therefore influence legislation.

4) Jesus was called "a friend of publicans and sinners" and He welcomed all who came to Him. Let us note, however, that He always pointed people away from a lifestyle of sin and wrong. He never encouraged them to do anything that was contrary to the teachings of God. He always showed them the right way, and never projected the idea that to love a person was to condone their sin.

STORMY 2020 BREAKS WEATHER RECORDS

The 2020 Atlantic Hurricane season is just one storm name away from becoming only the second time in history that the National Hurricane Centre (NHC) will have had to resort to using the Greek alphabet to name storms.

With tropical storm Vicky swirling in the Atlantic east of the northern Caribbean islands it's the earliest named 20th storm on record.

In May, Arthur became the first named storm of the year before the hurricane season has even officially begun. It reached hurricane status early on July 3d before hitting North Carolina as a 100 mph Category 2 hurricane on July 5th.

Wilfred is the only name left on the list of 21 storm names pre-approved for the season by the World Meteorological Organization before the switch to the Greek system kicks in which goes from Alpha to Omega.

The list used this year will be used again in 2026, with the exception of any names retired.

Weather experts have had to review and update their projections several times this hurricane season as the rapid and early development of storms exceeded their earlier predictions.

September is the peak of the hurricane season which runs from June 1st to November 30th.

The three month period from August through October encompasses the majority of named storms (77 per cent) and hurricanes (87 per cent) in an average season, according to weather experts.

The Weather Channel reports that there have been 17 named storms so far this season, five of which became hurricanes.

An average hurricane season would produce another five named storms, including three hurricanes, one of which would reach at least Category 3 intensity.

If that happens, the list of storm names would be exhausted and the Greek alphabet would take over for any names after Wilfred. That would be just the second time on record the Greek alphabet has been used for Atlantic storm names, joining 2005.

WEATHER WATCH

Already, an area of low pressure located a few hundred miles south-southeast of the Cabo Verde Islands is being monitored as weather forecasters say environmental conditions are conducive for development of this system with a tropical depression is likely to form during the next few days.

That system is moving generally westward at 10 to 15 mph.

The National Hurricane centre is projecting a 50 per cent chance of formation within 48 hours rising to 70 per cent chance of development into a full-blown storm over the next five days.

A westward motion was expected to begin on Wednesday followed by a west-southwestward motion by late Thursday.

That's in addition to the active named storms in the Atlantic, Caribbean Sea and the Gulf of Mexico.

Hurricane Sally is battering the southern United States with reports of "historic and catastrophic flooding" from Tallahassee, Florida to Mobile Bay in Alabama.

The storm made landfall early Wednesday morning as a category 2 hurricane with winds of 105 mph.

Residents were warned of a life-threatening storm surge and river flooding inland as far as Georgia.

Alabama, Florida and Mississippi have all declared states of emergency.

Further north in the Atlantic, Bermuda is cleaning up after a brush with Hurricane Paulette with Premier David Burt reporting that "We have weathered the storm."

"After a day and night of high winds, driving rain and exceptional waves, we are on the other side of Hurricane Paulette, thankfully without any loss of life, serious personal injury and less damage to property than we might have expected," he stated.

Meanwhile, Bermuda is still within sights of another hurricane which could be headed its way.

Located in the Atlantic east of the central Caribbean is Hurricane Teddy projected to be in the vicinity of Bermuda by Monday.

Teddy is currently packing winds of 100 mph and is moving towards the north-west at 12mph.

Yet another system being watched is what's called a non-tropical area of low pressure located over the far north-eastern Atlantic Ocean a few hundred miles north-east of the Azores.

The NHC says that system could also acquire some subtropical characteristics while it moves south-eastward and eastward at about 10 mph during the next few days.

THE NAME GAME

The last time NHC had to use the Greek alphabet was in 2005 when it got as far as six letters. Four of those systems reached tropical storm strength (Alpha, Gamma, Delta, and Zeta), while the two other storms reached hurricane strength (Beta and Epsilon).

The NHC does not use the letters Q, U, X, Y, and Z because there aren't enough names to fill those letters.

The Greek alphabet which is made up of 24 letters goes from (a) - alpha to (o) - omega. The current Modern English alphabet has 26 letters from a - z.

(The word alphabet is a compound of the first two letters of the Greek alphabet, alpha and beta).

For several hundred years many hurricanes in the West Indies were named after the particular saint's day on which the hurricane occurred.

The practice of naming hurricanes solely after women came to an end in 1978 when men's and women's names were included in the Eastern North Pacific storm lists.

In 1979, male and female names were included in lists for the Atlantic and Gulf of Mexico.

CAYMAN REMEMBERS IVAN

Here in Cayman, memories are still fresh from the devastation caused by Hurricane Ivan which hammered the islands for two days on September 11th & 12th in 2004 as a monstrous Category 5 hurricane.

Two persons lost their lives and damage to the housing sector alone was calculated at CI\$ 1.4 billion.

The overall economic impact was estimated by the United Nations ECLAC team to be CI\$ 3.4 billion, (183 % of GDP). Approximately 83% or 13,535 units of the total housing stock in the Grand Cayman suffered some degree of damage.

The finance (commerce) and tourism sectors were estimated at around CI\$ 460 million each.

Marking this anniversary this year, Hon. Premier Alden McLaughlin made this post on social media:

"Many of us remember vividly the impact Hurricane Ivan had on Grand Cayman in 2004 and Hurricane Paloma when it hit Cayman Brac in 2008."

Noting that "we're in the peak of storm season", he urged residents that "we all need to be prepared."

"Have you got your plan in place in the event of a hurricane?" the Premier asked and advised the public to visit the Cayman Islands national Emergency website 'Cayman Prepared' for "lots of tips and good information."

At a recent government press conference on the impact of the ongoing COVID-19 public health pandemic, Mr McLaughlin was asked by Caymanian Times about hurricane shelters in light of preventive measures against the virus.


"Oh don't dare mention hurricanes," the Premier responded in mock alarm.

But he went on to outline the measures being put in place mindful of that possibility.

"We know that we have and we've been working very hard to try to increase the shelter facilities to accommodate more people."

Pointing out that "we've lost 4,500 people" who would have otherwise been here (a reference to work-permit holders and others who have returned to their home countries since the outbreak of the pandemic), Mr McLaughlin said in that context "I don't think we are increasing the risk above what would normally be the case."

The question revolved additional people coming into the territory with the borders being gradually reopened from October 1st.



to be done as corruption continues to be a growing concern globally.”

Our mission remains “To enhance the stability, prosperity and reputation of the Cayman Islands by sustaining the confidence and trust of the community in the integrity and good governance of its government and public institutions through fighting corruption with just, fair and effective investigations,” the ACC says.

It adds that it “remains vigilant in its actions to promote awareness and the enhancement of good governance.”

To this end, the ACC says it has supported the Civil Service vision to be a ‘World-Class Civil Service’ in collaboration with the Commission for Standards in Public Life by conducting an informative presentation on the remit, powers and work of the Commission to new recruits of the Customs and Border Control (CBC) cohort.

In addition, it reports that it has finalised the proposed draft amendments to the Anti-Corruption Law which incorporate key provisions to enhance the work of the Commission.

LONG ARM OF THE ACC

Looking back at its 2019-2020 operating period, the ACC reports that it currently has 14 active cases under investigation.

It received four new complaints and conducted 74 interviews with 16 suspects and 58 witnesses. Three arrests were made, 11 persons charged, and four convictions secured.

Furthermore, two search warrants were issued, and nine persons have been charged and are awaiting trial -

The Cayman Islands Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) reports that it’s moving into its phase of operations with a focus on remaining “resolute to maintain and uphold its mission”, this time under new leadership.

Caymanian attorney Sophia Harris will be taking over the helms of the ACC following the departure of Richard Coles of the UK.

In the just-released 2019-2020 annual report under his leadership, Mr Coles states that “whilst the effects of the global pandemic have been far-reaching and brought about unprecedented challenges to the Cayman Islands and the world as a whole, the Anti-Corruption Commission remains resolute to maintain and uphold its mission.”

The report points out that while there have been many notable accomplishments and achievements of the ACC over its 10-year existence, “the Commission casts its focus on the future, on the work

eight in Grand Court and the other in the Summary Court.

Six reports have been sent to the Director of Public prosecutions.

Nine out of twelve defendants received guilty verdicts although the sentencing hearings have yet to be concluded.

“During this reporting period,” it notes, “the final trial in the largest-ever corruption trial in the Cayman Islands Grand Court took place.”

That case which concluded last October involved charges of fraud, and bribery in which the defendants included a number of high-ranking government officers of the then Immigration Department - now Customs and Border Control.

The issue which came to light in 2015 centred the defendants providing fraudulent passing grades to persons taking an English-language test as an immigration requirement.

WIDER POWERS

The Cayman Islands Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) says it also continued to consider desirable amendments to the Law working in collaboration with the Office of the Attorney General.

One of the amendments being considered concerns would give the ACC the ability to retain any proceeds awarded during confiscation proceedings.

The ACC says retention of this funding would assist it as it moves forward with achieving future independence.

The ACC has also declared interest in the Cayman Islands Standards in Public Life Law.

It has also been proposed that ACC should be included generally in all laws “so as to have the same or similar provisions as other law-enforcement bodies.”

The ACC’s scope of operations includes collaborating with the Caribbean Financial Action Task Force (“C-FATF”) and other regional and international agencies. 🌐

It was a night of laughs, a singles' double-bill Comedy show which was actually the culmination of a series of inspirational community faith-based messages aimed at helping and empowering single people. The event was the result of a collaboration of Salt Light City, the Ashley Shillingford Positive Living Foundation and the Ebenezer Singles Ministry, and was accessible by Zoom and it took place on Saturday 12 September. MC's for the night included Ariel Thomas and Quincy Brown.


There had been lots of different seminars for equipping single people throughout August, and helping them find a road-map of all the different twists and turns that life can throw at them. Under the theme, "A Complete package: A Focus on Mind, Body and Spirit," the sessions were all about equipping singles to be spiritually grounded, emotionally stable, financially educated and in healthy relationships.

Singles Ministries Director Dionne Thaxter said, "Being alone is not the worst feeling, its feeling so alone even when you are with someone. Events like this Seminar remind us that when life becomes overwhelming, there's still hope and a community that cares. Have faith and do remember, sometimes - laughter is truly the best medicine!"

During the Zoom event, Pastor Michael Kelly spoke about relationships,

and pointers to where relationships go wrong. With a neat diagram that showed a 'Sound Relationship House,' where foundation of all relationships was friendship, Pastor Kelly said. Pastor Kelly went on to provide insights into helping couples stay together, including the tip that when couples approach a problem together, like a tag-team, they are more likely to stay together than those who always cast the blame and criticize one another instead of building each other up. "69 percent of conflict is perpetual, and 31 percent are solvable, so you have to ask the question, "Is it a conflict that needs to be solved or a problem that needs to be managed?" he said.

Pastor Kelly also identified four red flags of relationships, which, unless addressed, will inevitably lead to that cou-

ple eventually splitting up. The first of these was criticism- verbally attacking one another's character. The antidote, he said, was to talk about your feelings in a way that didn't put down the other person, for example, "I really wish we could spend more quality time together ..." The next big red relationship flag was contempt, insulting and devaluing. The antidote to this was building a culture of appreciation, by spending time each day telling your partner how much you appreciate them, he said.

Trinidad-born comedian Dr Dexter Thomas was born blind, but has overcome adversity to become an author of five books and also a successful businessman. He had the audience in fits of laughter ("so much that my jaw started aching," MC Ariel Thomas said) but like all the funny stories told during the

evening, there were some useful take-home truths, too. Lots of Dr. Dexter's gags revolved around being blind, "we didn't see eye to eye," and, "we went on a blind date," he joked.

Headline act Michael Jr. is an acclaimed International actor and comedian with multiple performances in mainstream comedy areas like Comedy Central. "I used to do comedy for the sake of getting laughs, and then had a shift take place," he said. "I went outside and saw a homeless guy, and I thought, 'What about him, how can I give him an opportunity to laugh?' Since then, he said, he has felt the call to reach out, by giving his gift of laughter at homeless shelters and prisons, and helping empowering people through laughter and through the messages he tells interwoven throughout his funny stories. 🌐

His Excellency the Governor Martyn Roper, OBE invites expressions of interests for appointment to the Commission for Standards in Public Life

Over the past ten years the voluntary members appointed to various statutory and constitutionally created Commissions have worked diligently to enhance governance, reduce corruption, create openness and transparency, and promote education and understanding of the Constitution, amongst many other important matters under each Commissions mandate.

The Commission for Standards in Public Life (the "Commission") has operated since 2015 under the leadership of Mrs. Rosie Whittaker-Myles along with Members Sheenah Hislop and Isatou Smith. As the tenure of Mrs. Whittaker-Myles and Ms. Sheenah Hislop come to an end, His Excellency the Governor is accepting expressions of interest from Caymanians for consideration of appointment to the Commission.

Individuals who would fit the profile of these memberships (Chairman and 3 Members) include persons who are civic-minded, demonstrate the ability to be measured, fair, and politically neutral, and are regarded by their peers/members of the community as maintaining the highest standards of integrity, willingness to advocate for the cause and educate the general public.

Specifically for membership on this Commission the Constitution requires the appointment of individuals who have knowledge of practice in the private or public sector. At least one member of the Commission shall be a chartered or certified accountant of at least ten years' experience and at least one member of the Commission shall be a legal practitioner who has practised in the Commonwealth for at least ten years. The Constitution also states that persons cannot be appointed to the Commission if they:

- are a member of the Legislative Assembly
- hold or has at any time during the preceding three years held a public office,
- have at any time during the preceding five years held office in a political party; or
- are not a Caymanian.

The appointments to this Commission are made by His Excellency the Governor, after consultation with the Premier and the Leader of the Opposition, for a renewable term of four years. These voluntary appointments require individuals to contribute approximately 10-20 hours a month (sometimes a bit more for a Chairman) of service to make a full and effective contribution to the Commission. Members of the Commission receive a small stipend for their service. In addition to the local remit of the Commission, the CSPL has regional involvement with the Commonwealth Caribbean Association of Integrity Commissions and Anti-Corruption bodies (CCAICACB) as a member. The CCAICACB hosts an annual conference and other knowledge exchange endeavors with its regional delegates with the goal of curbing corruption.

"The Commission for Standards in Public Life is an extremely valuable resource in the advancement of good governance. Now that the Standards in Public Life Law has commenced, this Commission has the ability to function at a very high level especially as it relates to reducing conflicts of interest" His Excellency remarked. "Whilst individuals who serve on the Commission have successful and fulfilling careers, they find that it also incredibly rewarding to give back to the community."

It's Summer! Beat the Heat with these Summer Workout Tips

CAL adds extra repatriation flights to Miami and Kingston

For essential travel from Grand Cayman, Cayman Airways Limited (CAL) has added one extra repatriation flight to Kingston in September, and three extra repatriation flights to Miami in October.

Cayman Airways is reminding all passengers travelling on these repatriation flights to please review and follow the policies in place with regards to entry requirements, baggage, pets, the wearing of face masks, and the booking processes. Those policies are as follows:



Immigration Requirements Jamaica

Persons traveling to Jamaica must secure a Travel Authorization from the Jamaican Government prior to checking in for a flight. The application can be completed online via the following links:

- For Jamaican nationals: <https://jamcovid19.moh.gov.jm/immigration.html>
- For non-Jamaicans: www.visitjamaica.com

Passengers who do not present the required travel authorization when checking in for their flight, will not be able to travel. Upon arrival in Jamaica, passengers from Cayman will NOT be required to undergo a COVID-19 test but will be subject to a health screening and risk assessments by Jamaican health authorities. All passengers are required to wear a face mask throughout the airport in Kingston.

USA

Persons travelling to the United States must be US citizens or those legally able to travel to or through the USA. Passengers are responsible for ensuring that they have the necessary travel documents for entry into any country. There are no special COVID-19 requirements for entering the USA at this time, with the exception of Miami Airport requiring all passengers to wear

a face mask throughout the airport.

NOTE: Passengers are responsible for ensuring that they have the necessary travel documents for entry into any foreign country.

Baggage Allowance

Passengers (except infants under 2) will be allowed one free checked bag up to 55lbs per bag (not exceeding 62 linear inches), plus one carry-on bag not exceeding 11" x 16" x 24". A maximum of 2 excess bags per passenger can be accommodated. These additional bags will be at a cost of US\$20 for the first excess bag and US\$50 for the second excess bag. No overweight or oversized bags will be accepted. Passengers who expect to have excess bags MUST prepay for it at the time of booking or at least 24 hours before travel. Please note that the first bag will travel confirmed, but excess bags will travel space-available and may take several weeks to reach the passenger should baggage space not be available on the repatriation flight.

Pets

A limited number of pets can be accommodated on a first-come, first-served basis, aboard each flight to Miami and King-

ston. These must be requested and approved at least 24 hours before travel. Pets without prior approval will be unable to travel. Passengers are responsible for ensuring they meet all necessary customs requirements for the importation of pets to any country.

Health and Safety Measures For Flights

For each flight, various measures will be in place for the health and safety of passengers and crew, including:

- All passengers must present at check-in and boarding with their own face mask, which they must wear for the duration of the flight
- CAL airport staff will be wearing Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for the check-in and boarding process, and check-in counters will be sanitized frequently during the check-in process. Cabin Crew will also be wearing PPE during each flight.
- Social distancing for the boarding process

"Checka buck down dozens of people until mi kinda lost count. Is a good thing mi live good with people or else him



Reggae lovers mourn the loss of Toots

Reggae music lovers worldwide are still coming to terms with the passing of Jamaican superstar Frederick "Toots" Hibbert.

The legendary musician fronted the reggae and ska band Toots & the Maytals from the early 1960s until he died last Friday from COVID-19, aged 77.

Hibbert "passed away peacefully" in Kingston, Jamaica surrounded by his family.

Hibbert is credited with popularising reggae music and even naming the genre - his 1968 single 'Do the Reggay' is the first song to use the term. Other popular tracks include 'Pressure Drop', 'Monkey Man', and '54-46 That's My Number'.

He is survived by his wife of 39 years and seven of his eight children. Hibbert's death comes just weeks before the release of 'Got to Be Tough', the band's first full-length album in more than a decade.

Described as "the world's greatest living reggae singer" in a Rolling Stone profile last month, his vocal style was compared to Otis Redding. The magazine lists him as one of the 100 greatest singers of all time.

Tributes poured in for the legendary musician on social media.

UK actor and comedian Sir Lenny Henry said he was "so sorry" to hear of his death.

"His music was a constant in our house growing up," he tweeted. "His voice was powerful and adaptable to funk, soul, country, AND reggae. Rest in power."

Reggae and pop group UB40 said Hibbert's music "influenced and inspired us to love reggae music from an early age".

And Ziggy Marley - son of Bob Marley - wrote on Twitter that Hibbert was "a father figure to me". 🌐

Bell legacy is lasting Kool

Disco lovers were saddened by the pass of Ronald Bell, one of the founder members of the 1970s and 1980s pop group Kool & the Gang. Bell started the band with his brother Robert "Kool" Bell in 1964.

They became one of the era's most popular and influential soul and funk bands, with hits including 'Celebration', 'Ladies' Night' and 'Get Down On It'.

Their music also featured in several films including 'Saturday Night Fever', for which they received a Grammy in 1978, and 'Pulp Fiction'.

Bell, 68, died at his home in the US Virgin Islands with his wife by his side last week. The cause of death was not given.

As musical director, Bell co-wrote all of their biggest hits, including the wedding disco classic 'Celebration'. He

admitted it was his "favourite song" from the band's extensive back catalogue.

"I had no clue, you know," he said. "I was clueless, thinking that that was going to be a hit. I had no idea."

The group received a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame in 2015 for their contribution to the world of entertainment, and were inducted into the Songwriters' Hall Of Fame in 2018. 🌐

Beyoncé's hairdresser for the last 15 years is a Trinidadian man, Neal Farinah, who has just succeeded in tackling his biggest challenge with the superstar singer.


One of the standout hair moments in Beyoncé's film 'Black is King' is a 30-foot-long braided wig. There is a scene where she stands on a ladder with the braids hanging down. It is a stunning visual moment.

But, as her Trini-born hairstylist tells it, it was also done at great risk. Farinah said: "That wig was so heavy, it could have pulled her off the ladder." But she did it, despite the risk, because the hairpiece helped tell a story.

Perhaps she also did it to help elevate the way black hairstyles are viewed outside of the film set.

The film, or visual album, is a re-telling of the Disney classic 'The Lion King'.

When she told Farinah about her "dream project" he was instantly sold. Born in Arima, Farinah moved to the United States, where he quickly learned that hairstylists there have to make a choice about the type of hair they were going to do, black or white.

BREXIT IS BACK ON THE AGENDA AND IT'S AS BAD AS BEFORE

At the time of affixing his signature to the Withdrawal Agreement in January this year, the Prime Minister called it "a fantastic moment."

But nine months on, there has been a change of mind with the UK government now accusing the EU of unfair negotiating tactics over a trade deal especially regarding the seemingly intractable and thorny issue of trade across the Irish border.

The surprising introduction of a new element in the form of the Internal Market Bill has caused a storm of controversy with all five former UK prime ministers, plus parliamentarians across the political spectrum questioning the government's rationale for reneging on an international agreement.

Particularly concerning for them is the fact the agreement was just signed less than a year ago by Mr Johnson himself.

They argue it that risks damaging the UK's international reputation, not only as a departure from the age-old belief that 'an Englishman's word is his bond', but especially that the Prime Minister's unexpected move violates the rule of law.

Much of the previous fall-out in the talks leading up to the Withdrawal Agreement was about the implications for trade border across the border between EU member the Irish Republic and Northern Ireland which is part of the UK.

Introducing the new Internal Market Bill in parliament, Mr Johnson defended his stance.

"When we renegotiated our Withdrawal Agreement from the EU we struck a careful balance to reflect Northern Ireland's integral place in our United Kingdom while preserving an open border with Ireland with the express and paramount aim of protecting the Belfast (Good Friday) agreement and the peace process."

He added: "In good faith, we accepted certain obligations in the Northern Ireland Protocol in order to give our European friends the assurances they sought on the integrity of their single market while avoiding any change to the border on the island of Ireland."

He now claims that the good faith is at risk due to negotiating tactics adopted by the EU, claiming that "Brussels was attempting to 'blockade' goods travelling between Great Britain and

Northern Ireland and that they were refusing to "take this revolver off the table".

"To take the most glaring example," the Prime Minister said, "the EU has said that if we fail to reach an agreement to their satisfaction they might very well refuse to list the UK's food and agricultural products for sale anywhere in the EU."

"And it gets even worse," according to the prime minister, "because under the Protocol this creates an instant and automatic prohibition of the transfer of our animal products from Great Britain to Northern Ireland."

He accused the EU of "are holding out the possibility of blockading food and agricultural transports within our own country."

"Absurd and self-defeating as that action would be even as we debate this matter, the EU still have not taken this revolver off the table," Prime Minister Johnson added.

The government says the Internal Market Bill is a safeguard to fall back on if negotiations on a future trade deal break down.

Mr Johnson had previously said he was prepared to walk away from the

talks without a deal - the no-deal Brexit scenario.

Despite two resignations and backbench outrage within the ruling Conservative party, the Internal Market Bill has nevertheless cleared its first hurdle in the UK parliament with a majority vote to go through to the next stage of debate.

There are growing rumblings of discontent rippling through the government and the ruling Conservative Party reminiscent of the wave of rebellion that hit it in earlier phases of the Brexit process.

The bill returns to parliament next Tuesday when more acrimony is anticipated.

Meanwhile, the EU has warned of retaliatory action if the UK proceeds with the bill and applies it.

In the US, the developments between the UK and EU are being closely followed by the Congress.

Concerns have been expressed about the risks to the hard-fought Irish peace treaty, the Good Friday Agreement, with members of Congress saying they will block a US-UK trade deal if they feel the British government's move jeopardises that treaty. 🌐

THIS ELECTION IS ALL ABOUT TRUMP - so far

As America more moves inexorably towards the November 2020 election, with each passing day - or with each day being removed from the countdown - a feeling of foreboding for some, elation for others is weeping across the land...and the world.

The level of expectation for this election is already surpassing 2016 when candidate Trump, the maverick outsider, was tearing up the rule book and reshaping US presidential campaigning to his own liking - and ultimately to his advantage. He won.

This time candidate Trump, who as president never ceased campaigning from the time he was sworn in, is on the proverbial warpath again.

It's just that now he has a record to defend. And he is on the defensive inasmuch as he is on the offensive...and many times just being offensive.

His critics - and there are hordes of them - oscillate between "not much of a record" and a "woeful record".

His base - and there are hordes of them - hang on to his every utterance as if their lives depended on it. It does although to a lesser degree than their livelihoods.

Someone recently said that for Mr Trump's base what matters is not his record but that he disagrees with the people they don't like.

The Trump presidency has been to politics what new technology is to the established norm; a disruptor.

Those who want him out of office do so with a passion matched only by the devotion of those who yearn for a Trump second term with almost fanatical religious zeal.

Mr Trump's presidency will do down in modern history as one of the most politically and

socially divisive, propelled by a superlatives-laden rhetoric of a dizzying list of 'achievements'.

A few are real, some of doubtful significance, others of questionable impact, several of worrying consequence, and the rest are simply headline-grabbing utterances and executive orders.

Then there are the scandals, accusations of wrongdoing, jailed accomplices and a seemingly interminably long list of character flaws.

Amidst all that, Mr Trump remains a microphone and camera magnet; never shy to volunteer a comment in which he has the last say, microphone-shy only when he doesn't have his way, but a 'made-for-reality-tv' presidency with all dysfunctional character-flaws that make such programs "must-see-tv".

A product of the genre, Mr Trump knows how to play the



game. It is drama and entertainment.

And the world has been watching a presidency which at one time framed his COVID-19 public health briefings in terms of the TV and online viewing ratings.

The US economy, like the rest of the world, has been thrown into topsy-turvy by the coronavirus pandemic. In the process, it has thrown Mr Trump's oft-repeated and contentious claims of 'creating' the greatest American economy in history into a tailspin and quite possibly off the rails.

Understandably, he wants to lead that recovery effort to 'make America great again-again'.

His hints at needing a third term because his 'MAGA' campaign was disrupted by the coronavirus echoes more than just a bad joke that flies in the face of the US constitution which limits presidents to two consecutive terms.

Mr Trump has more than once openly stated that the election process is already flawed a sign that he will challenge the outcome if he doesn't win.

But what if he does win? Will he then accept victory from the process he claimed from the outset was flawed? Judging from previous situations he will most likely downplay it and claim that he won fairly, squarely and 'bigly'.

When the narrative of an American political campaign is laden with inflammatory labels such as extremists, fascists, communists, and anarchists its clear that the body politics is deeply infected with a radicalism that has no place in American policy as a bastion of democracy.

The American society is riven with social divisions to an extent not seen in decades.

Some argue that it was there all along but subdued in the aftermath of the civil rights movement and that it took phone cameras and live streaming to bring it to the fore once more.

Mr Trump in particular has been accused of exploiting these divisions political mileage.

Rather than being a calming influence given his position, he is portrayed as inflaming and emboldening his adherents to the Trump gospel.

America is at a crossroads more than it has been in recent time and once again, as with 2016, Donald Trump is standing at that fork in the road.

President Trump is up against former Obama-era Democrat vice-president Joe Biden.

It would appear that this election is less about Mr Biden's challenge and all about Mr Trump's record...or the lack thereof.

One to watch indeed. Mr Trump will revel in the ratings. 🌐

Osaka nets props for turning activist

Naomi Osaka is often described as an Asian athlete because her mother is Japanese although her father is black, but judging by her stances on controversies in recent months, there is no doubt where her sentiments lie.

Osaka posted an Instagram story posted from a protest over the death of George Floyd in May. After the killing of Floyd, a black man who died when a police officer knelt on his neck for nearly nine minutes, Osaka flew to Minneapolis with her boyfriend, the rapper Cordae, to join those demonstrating their anger.

"My heart ached. I felt a call to action. Enough was finally enough," she stated.

Since arriving on the tennis scene as one of the world's brightest talents she has generally stayed out of the limelight - until recently.

An endearing character trait is she has described herself as the "most awkward" person in tennis and gave what she said was the "worst acceptance speech of all-time" after winning the 2018 Indian Wells title.

Most onlookers were nevertheless won over - that speech was a giggly and self-deprecating monologue, one of the best - but Osaka has rarely seemed at ease speaking in front of large crowds. At news conferences she would often

shuffle uncomfortably in her seat before giving short answers or making references to Pokémon.

But she is gradually coming out of shell as her celebrity grows. Osaka was born to a Japanese mother, Tamaki, and Haitian father, Leonard, in the city with which she shares her surname, before the family moved to New York when she was three.

Her multicultural background has led to "people struggling to define" her. "I'm Asian, I'm black and I'm female. I'm as normal a 22-year-old as anyone, except I happen to be good at tennis. I've accepted myself as just me: Naomi Osaka," she wrote in Esquire magazine.

Activist is another label she has become known for recently.

On the eve of the US Open, Osaka pulled out of her Western and Southern Open semi-final in protest at the shooting of Jacob Blake, a black man, by police in Wisconsin.

Her move, joining other protests by American sports stars, prompted the entire tournament to "pause" for the day.

"Before I am an athlete, I am a black woman," Osaka said. "And as a black woman I feel as though there are much more important matters at hand that need immediate attention, rather than watching me play tennis."

She decided to play the following day when the event resumed. While she says she is "more of a follower", her actions were decisive and commanding.

"I was waiting and waiting and then I realised I was the one who was going to have to take the first step," she said. "I just wanted to create awareness in the tennis bubble. I think I did my job, I guess."

She used the US Open to continue her stance on racial injustice and police brutality. Before and after every US Open match she wore a face mask bearing the

name of an African-American person killed.

Breonna Taylor. Elijah McClain. Ahmaud Arbery. Trayvon Martin. George Floyd. Philando Castile. Tamir Rice.

Each match she won before Saturday's final meant another chance to display a name. Her coach, Wim Fissette, said it provided her with the extra motivation to succeed.

"It's definitely helping her and giving her more energy," said the Belgian. "She wants to be a role model off court and knows it has to go with being a role model on court. It is a good combination."

Fissette became Osaka's coach in December, replacing American Jermaine Jenkins.

Last summer, Osaka, Jenkins and the rest of her team were in the United Kingdom for the grass-court season and preparing for a Women's Tennis Association tournament in Birmingham.

Together, they watched a Netflix series called When They See Us. The drama is based on the true story of five black,

male teenagers from Harlem falsely accused of a brutal sexual attack in New York's Central Park.

Jenkins believes that was a pivotal moment in Osaka realising she could use her voice more. He said: "She doesn't have to do it; she can easily stay quiet. I think it is brave and it makes me feel good inside."

At the US Open, she learned to cope. Exuding confidence on and off court, she has believed in her game and believed in her principles. Marrying them together has led to an unbeaten run of 11 matches since the sport returned, culminating in a third Grand Slam title.

Though undoubtedly already a superstar, she appears to be moulding into a natural heir to the ageing icons. Talent on the court is what initially told the world she was special - now her actions and words are marking her out as an emerging leader with the power to inspire.

Jenkins agrees: "She is the future of the sport. And she's doing it now." 🌐

'The Last Dance' aired a few months ago. It focused on how Michael Jordan inspired the Chicago Bulls to dominate the NBA.

The Trinbago Knight Riders won their fourth CPL title. Raza said: "It started with one game at a time. We won the first one. We put our focus on

the second one. McCullum challenged all of us. He wanted to create a dynasty out of this TKR team by telling us that this team has a lot in common with Jordan's Bulls."

Archer: Holding is wrong, we do care

Jofra Archer insisted that England has not "forgotten about the Black Lives Matter" campaign after they were criticised by West Indies legend Michael Holding for no longer taking a knee.

England and West Indies cricketers adopted the gesture at the start of each of their three Tests in July to show their support for the campaign to fight racial injustice.

The practice was repeated during England's one-day matches against Ireland but not in subsequent series against Pakistan and Australia.

Holding, an outstanding fast bowler in the successful West Indies teams of the 1970s and 1980s, recalled in July the ugly incidents he experienced as a young cricketer on his visits to Australia and England.

He accused England bosses and Australia Captain Aaron Finch of making "lame" statements over ending the practice of taking a knee.

But Barbadian Archer said that the England and Wales Cricket Board was taking the issue seriously.

"I'm pretty sure Michael Holding doesn't know anything that is going on behind the scenes," he said. "I don't think he has spoken to (chief executive) Tom Harrison. I think that is a bit harsh for him to say that. I've spoken to Tom and we have stuff running in the background."

"We've not forgotten; no one here has forgotten about Black Lives Matter. I think it is a bit harsh for Mikey to not do some research before criticising."

Archer has been subjected to racist abuse on social media and the 25-year-old Sussex quick said tough action was needed to clamp down on such remarks.

The England paceman took 3-34 as the world champions fought back to beat Australia by 24 runs in the second One-Day International at Old Trafford on Sunday to level a three-match series ahead of Wednesday's finale. 🌐

Butler turns up Heat on Celtics

As the Miami Heat went into the Eastern Conference finals against the Boston Celtics, Jimmy Butler and his teammates had the same air of quiet confidence they've shown since the NBA restarted its season.

The All-Star swingman brushed off the idea that the fifth-seeded Heat should feel like an underdog against the third-seeded Celtics when the series began Tuesday night.

"We don't really use 'underdog,'" Butler said. "We may say that we have a chip on our shoulder, but I don't think that we're the underdog. I think that we're a really good team. We play together. Everybody knows their role. We just compete."

The Heat have become the story of the bubble after sweeping the fourth-seeded Indiana Pacers in the first round and beating the top-seeded Milwaukee Bucks in five games in the conference semis.

Their approach is paying dividends on the postseason stage as they continue to believe in the culture that long time Heat president Pat Riley and coach Erik Spoelstra have created over the years.

Butler is buoyed by the work ethic that his teammates and coaches have displayed since he signed with the organisation last summer. That poise -- and the work behind the scenes -- is why he's convinced the group will rise to the occasion against a talented Celtics group that knocked out the defending NBA champions Toronto Raptors in seven games.

"We all think that we're the better team," Butler said. "We all think that we're supposed to be here."

Meanwhile, LeBron James led the Los Angeles Lakers to their first Western Conference in 10 years with a 119-96 win over the Houston Rockets.

The last time they reached this stage was when Lakers legend Kobe Bryant

led them to the 2010 NBA title. Bryant, 41, and his daughter Gianna, 13, were among nine people killed in a helicopter crash in January.

James, who joined the Lakers in 2018, said it was an "honour" to play for the team and continue the "legacy".

Five-time NBA champion Bryant spent his entire 20-year career with the Lakers and is the only player in league history to have two shirt numbers retired with the same team after wearing both for a decade.

"The reason I wanted to be a part of this franchise is to take them back to a place they were accustomed to being," said three-time NBA champion James, 35. "And that's competing for a championship."

"It's an honour for me to wear the purple and gold and for us to try to continue the legacy and just play great basketball for our fans." 🌐
