CUC STAYS THE COURSE DESPITE **COVID**



The impact of COVID-19 on the economy and society is reflected in the latest quarterly report by electricity provider Caribbean Utilities Company(CUC).

1) water consumption records for the entire calendar year 2019 and


2) the Cayman Water Company bill(s) for the month(s) under consid-

CIG Approves Quarantine at Residence for Cayman Brac and Little Cayman

Effective 7 November, 2020 travellers residing in Cayman Brac and Little Cayman will be permitted to quarantine at their residence (QAR).

The Cayman Islands government has today announced that it has extended this option to the Sister Islands based on the success of the pilot programme in Grand Cayman. Consequently, Sister Islands residents who meet the established criteria will be able to spend the mandatory 14 day quarantine period at home,

provided they agree to wear monitoring technology and their homes have been pre-approved by Public Health. If they reside with other people, all members of the household will be quarantined at the same time and are subject to the same requirements as the traveller.

To facilitate the programme's implementation in the Sister Islands, the process currently in place in Grand Cayman will be replicated in Cayman Brac but on a smaller scale, and will be managed by the Ministry of District Administration. Teams are in the process of being trained to undertake the various responsibilities, including PCR testing at the airport; fitting travellers with their wristbands; on-boarding them to the geo-fencing platform; carrying out the monitoring and compliance requirements and conducting random spot checks.

Given that the programme is anticipated to be on a smaller scale than currently pertains in Grand Cayman, the only difference is that travellers will not be transported to their homes via authorized transportation. Instead, they will be permitted to self-drive in their private vehicle and will be accompanied to their residence by an enforcement vehicle, to ensure that stops are not made along the way.

Travel Cayman Application Process

Persons wishing to quarantine at their residence in Cayman Brac or Little Cayman must first register their travel request using the Travel Cayman online

Delivery of Food and Supplies

While a household is in quarantine, food, medication and essential supplies should be ordered from suppliers who offer contactless payment and delivery. This means paying online or over the phone and having the delivery left outside the front door. There should be no face-to-face or direct physical contact.

When receiving supplies, persons in quarantine should wear a mask and must wait until the person making the delivery has left the property. Persons who do not reside in the household should not enter the yard space if someone in quarantine is outside at the same time. Delivery personnel, relatives and friends are not allowed to enter the home or have physical contact with the occupants while they are in quarantine.

Penalties

Any breach of these conditions may result in removal from the programme without notice and a requirement to complete the quarantine period in a government quarantine facility. Additionally, the penalties under Section 71 of the Public Health Law (2002 Revision) were recently increased to a fine of ten thousand dollars and imprisonment for two years, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a further fine of five hundred dollars for every day on which the offence continues after conviction.

The QAR programme is part of the overnments multi-tiered strategy to protect the islands from COVID-19. It was initially trialled with a select group of participants in September, followed by the launch of a pilot programme on 1st October. To date, approximately 70 % of travellers have opted to quarantine at home rather than in a government or privately run facility. Dr. Tasha Ebanks Garcia, Director Travel Cayman, explained that "having to quarantine after travel is a necessary protection for our Islands and being able to spend the time in the comfort of your own home helps to make the sacrifice a little easier. I am very pleased with the success of this programme thus far and commend all of the participants for their compliance and taking the quarantine responsibilities seriously. Since launching the programme our teams have been continually reviewing and evaluating the processes and technology and are largely satisfied with the results. Where necessary, minor tweaks and adjustments have been made to enhance the user experience and improve response times, and feedback from all quarters has been encouraging."

portal and should select Cayman Brac or Little Cayman as their preferred quarantine option. If the traveller will quarantine with non-travelling household members, their details must be entered at the same time. Questions or concerns should be directed to the Travel Cayman team by emailing TravelCayman@gov. ky or by calling 743 8463 between the hours of 8:30am and 5:00pm, Monday through Friday. The web address for the Travel Cayman portal is https://www. exploregov.ky/TravelCayman

Quarantine at Residence Approval

Travellers should note that permission to quarantine at home is not guaranteed and is subject to approval by the Medical Officer of Health. Once approved, the traveller will receive an email from Travel Cayman with an attached Certificate to Travel. If the quarantine location should not be approved, the traveller can re-apply with a suitable location, or will be required to quarantine either at a government sponsored or privately run facility in Grand Cayman. Irrespective of where a person is quarantining, the mandatory quarantine period is 14 days followed by a COVID-19 PCR test on day 15 and a negative result signed off by the Medical Officer of Health is required for the quarantine period to cease.

Travellers quarantining at home are asked to allow 24 -72 hours for the off-boarding process, which includes receipt of the negative test result, removal from the monitoring dashboard and return of the monitoring equipment.

Cayman Airways has scheduled two flights from Miami on Friday Nov 20th and Fri Dec 4th which will stop in Cayman Brac to allow passengers to disembark, prior to proceeding to Grand Cayman. Based on demand, more flights will be added in the future. For health and safety reasons, no passengers will be permitted to board the flight in Cayman





LA ADJOURNED FOR THE LAST TIME

A chapter closed on Cayman's political and Legislative history on Monday and Members of the Legislative Assembly (MLA's) exited the chamber.

When they return for the next sitting it will be as Members of the Parliament (MPs), another historic occasion signalling another phase in the jurisdiction's constitutional maturity.

The change of designation is the result of lengthy negotiations with the British government over constitutional reform. It was one of several concessions secured by the Cayman Islands to amend the constitution although the UK had rejected proposals to curb the powers of the Governor especially his power to impose legislation.

Reporting in September on the outcome of the talks, Hon. Premier Alden McLaughlin had termed the decision to allows Cayman to transition from Legislative Assembly to Parliament as a significant achievement.

"What also caps this off for me," he

The Commission had also pointed out that "a Member of Parliament for the Cayman Islands is clearly understood by more people as it is used by the majority of Commonwealth Countries that have the Westminster system of government, such as Bermuda, Canada, Australia, Jamaica, and New Zealand."

Also linked to the switch from LA to Parliament will be the appointment of Parliamentary Secretaries who will be elected representatives appointed by the Governor acting on the advice of the Premier. Parliamentary Secretaries will assume the roles which Councillors now have.



said, " is the UK's agreement for the Legislative Assembly name to be changed to the Parliament of the Cayman Islands and for the elected members to be called Members of Parliament."

He defined this change as reflecting, "the true standing that we will have in constitutional terms."

For what is likely to be regarded as a key part of his legacy, Mr McLaughlin declared that "this change is hugely important when elected members are dealing with international matters, or indeed when dealing with the UK Government or any other government."

"Government officials", he pointed out, "understand intuitively that a legislative assembly is an inferior body in constitutional terms to that of a parliament."

"I believe that it is less likely that the UK Parliament will seek to deal with another parliament in the way that, on occasion, they have dealt with this Legislative Assembly in the past," he added.

Those points are also reflected by the Cayman Islands Constitutional Commission which had also explained in a briefing note that the change from Legislative Assembly (LA) to Parliament was more than cosmetic.

"This is important," it said, "because often the term Legislative Assembly is considered a lower legislative body to a parliament. The term Parliament better recognises what the Legislative Assembly is and avoids confusion when our Another change that impacts the pending Parliament of the Cayman Islands, will see effective from year's general election, an additional minister in the cabinet, taking it from 6 to 8 including the Premier.

Meanwhile, in addition to the Constitution Order 2020, the outgoing LA recently published a bill in the gazette under the heading of the Legislative Assembly (Management) Bill giving more direct control over it's administrative affairs in what will now be the Parliament of the Cayman Islands.

The objective of that is to to give it more independence away from the current status being a part of the civil service.

Historically, political representation in the Cayman Islands dates back to December 1831 when the Assembly of Justices and Vestry was created at Pedro St. James.

This served as the Legislative body until 3rd July 1959 when Cayman received its first written Constitution the following day on 4th July 1959.

The bi-cameral Assembly of Justices & Vestry was then replaced with a uni-cameral Legislative Assembly comprising "Members of the Legislative Assembly" in place of the term "Vestry" which referred to the elected representatives.

The University College of the Cayman Islands celebrated their best students in their Fall 2020 Honours Convocation. At the same time CUC says it has experienced an increase in accounts receivable during the period and as a result has increased the amount recorded for expected credit losses.

It also disclosed that it has proposed to defer the required base rate increase until January 1, 2021.

CUC which supplies Grand Cayman has a customer base of 30,895 residential and business, an increase of 641 customers, or 2%, compared to 30,254 customers as at September last year.

The utility provider also reports that earnings for the Third Quarter (Q3) this year totalled US\$10.4 million, the same amount that it earned for Q3 in 2019.

Overall for the period between January and September this year compared to last year, CUC's net earnings totalled US\$18.7 million down by US\$4.2 million compared to US\$22.9 million in 2019.

The company attributes this decrease primarily to higher depreciation and finance charges.

Electricity sales for the three months July to September this year was 175.1 million kilowatt hours ("kWh"), a decrease of 9.3 million kWh, or 5%, compared to the 184.4 million kWh it sold for the corresponding period in 2019.

Looking at the nine months between from January to the end of September this year, CUC reports that in all it sold 492.9 million kWh, a decrease of 11.0 million kWh, or 2%, compared to 503.9 million kWh compared to the same time frame in last year.

It also points out that cross the nine months ending in September this year it experienced a 24% decline in average fuel costs when compared to the same period in 2019.

CUC says the savings have resulted in the average rate decreasing over that period to 27 cents per kWh in comparison to 30 cents last year.

This it says means that "customers have paid less per kWh for electricity consumed during the nine months ended September 30, 2020 in comparison to the nine months ended September 30, 2019."

President and CEO, Richard Hew, says, "Although the duration and final impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the Cavman Islands' economy and CUC remain uncertain, Q3 2020 represented a relatively stable quarter for the Company in the circumstances."

The CUC boss also said during the quarter. "the Company continued to deliver on its objectives of health and safety of its employees and the public, reliable electricity service, financial stability and being a good corporate citizen."

Health and safety and reliability performance indicators were as planned, Mr Hew added, and the Company was pleased to reach agreement with its regulator to defer the impact of the rate adjustments on customer bills until 2021.

During the quarter under review, CUC also submitted a utility-scale solar project to the regulator which is permitted under its license and which it said is in keeping with company's and the Cayman Islands' renewable energy goals."

In its Q3 report, CUS notes that at this point, the extent to which COVID-19 may impact its financial condition or results of operations remains uncertain and will depend on certain developments, including the duration and spread of the outbreak, curfew restrictions, impact on customers, employees, and vendors all of which cannot be predicted.

CUC says it continues to "monitor the rapidly evolving situation and guidance from the Cayman Islands Government and local public health authorities" and that it may take additional actions based on their recommendations.

The Company has also applied for recovery of various COVID-19 related expenses, including potential credit losses resulting from suspension of disconnections during the pandemic.

The statement said, if approved, these amounts would be recorded as regulatory assets and recovered through future rates.

The response from the regulator Of-Reg to the proposed COVID-19 cost recovery is expected during the Fourth Quarter 2020. 😚



The spectacle of the polarisation of America along political lines and the cult-like adulation evident amongst the Trump supporters (more like adherents), has been a spectre difficult to observe but impossible to ignore.

Politics by its very nature is adversarial. As in any competitive venture, there will be a winner and a loser.

But where winning becomes an obsession where it's not just everything but the only thing by any means necessary, bringing the process into disrepute can have lasting negative consequences for the body politic - ultimately the society, the people.

So where does the healing of America begin? And when does it start?

What will it take to bridge the gulf of mistrust carved out of weaponising racial differences, social and economic disparities, religious beliefs and cultural divergencies?

In a sense, America's strength which lies in its diversity and its much-vaunted 'dream' of freedom and prosperity that his nation of immigrants has been seized, flipped and used against it.

The proverbial 'enemy' is not external, it's within. And it's been let loose.

It's as if all the hard-fought gains won over the past decades especially in the quest for racial and social equality have been dashed to pieces by an election campaign of unbelievable bitterness that has eclipsed the excesses of the previous one. Considering that just over a decade ago America's beacon was at full brilliance when it not only defied the pessimists by electing its first Black president, with a White running mate...but did it twice!

What has gone so wrong? How did it revert back to this?

America is now more divided than it's ever been in recent history - and not just along racial lines.

A darkness seems to have fallen over the land that's been the leader in the free world.

While American hopefully spends some time in deep reflection trying to put that genie back in the bottle, it's ranking as global leader, already in serious doubt, is faltering further as a perplexed world looks on.

Eta hits Nicaragua

Hurricane Eta, an unusually powerful storm, slammed into Nicaragua on Tuesday, bringing disastrous flooding to one of the country's poorest regions.

The National Hurricane Centre (NHC) said the storm packed maximum sustained winds of 145mph, and passed about 30 miles south-southeast of Puerto Cabezas, Nicaragua. On Tuesday Eta was moving slowly west-southwest at only 5mph towards Honduras and Belize.

The head of the storm began to move inland on Tuesday, wrenching roofs off houses and causing rivers to overflow. In Puerto Cabezas on the Atlantic coast, trees were torn down and power lines were severed, plunging much of the city into darkness. About 10,000 people were in shelters in the city and an equal number in smaller towns across the region, according to city officials.


It is too far away to affect the Cayman Islands but many Caymanians have connections in Honduras and its neighbouring countries. with landslides in areas of higher terrain of Central America," the NHC said.

The storm is a Category 4 hurricane and is gradually losing strength as it moves inland. The storm's wind speed more than doubled over the Caribbean from Sunday evening to Monday evening. It is the latest in an active Atlantic hurricane season.

As the 28th named storm in the Atlantic this season, it ties the record for the number of named storms in a single season, set in 2005. It is the fifth named major storm of the year.

"We're really afraid, there are fallen poles, there's flooding, roofs torn off, some of the zinc on my house fell off," Carmen Enríquez, a Puerto Cabezas resident, said.

"This city of 70,000 people is very vulnerable. We have houses made of wood and adobe. The infrastructure of the residential houses is our main vulnerability," Javier Plat, a Catholic priest in Puerto Cabezas, said. The current forecast has the storm meandering the mountains of Nicaragua and Honduras before heading north toward Belize as a depression by Friday. The track and intensity of the storm remains uncertain after Friday.



Hurricane Eta's expected movement

Torrential rain, and resulting flooding and landslides were the consequence of Eta's passing. The wind and storm surge was diminishing by Tuesday afternoon but heavy rain persisted which will last for some days.

A dangerous storm surge of up to 21 feet above normal tide crashed onshore in parts of Nicaragua. "This rainfall will lead to catastrophic, life-threatening flash flooding and river flooding, along

The storm has the potential to be one of the worst flooding events Nicaragua has seen since Hurricane Mitch in 1998, which killed more than 10,000 people.

The northern indigenous regions directly in Eta's path are some of Nicaragua's poorest. Many people nearby live in flimsy homes that stand little chance against such a powerful storm.

Authorities in Nicaragua and Honduras had moved people on Monday from outer islands and low-lying areas to shelters. Residents scrambled to shore up their homes, but few structures along Nicaragua's remote Caribbean coast were built to withstand such force.

Nicaragua's army moved red-helmeted troops specialised in search and rescue to Puerto Cabezas. Along Honduras's northern Caribbean coast, torrential rains from Eta's outer bands caused some rivers to overwhelm their banks Monday, forcing evacuations.

On television on Monday, Nicaragua's vice-president and first lady, Rosario Murillo, prayed for God to protect the country. She said Nicaragua would apply lessons learned from previous storms. "How many hurricanes have come and we have moved on, thanks to God," she said.

Artist Yonier Powery

Innovative new art show at Camana Bay

A brilliant showcase of two years of hard work, Yonier Powery's 'Innovate' exhibition is currently being held at a pop-up Awardart gallery site where the Mac store used to be, opposite Books and Books, and it is well worth a viewing.

Yonier is a well-known and much-admired artist whose detailed paintings have taken inspiration from his environment but showcase a much deeper understanding of issues of our time, such as pollution, caring for the environment

and the wisdom of the elderly. This latest exhibition has taken his artistic talent to a new level, with 16 pieces of sculpture creating a 3-D study of innovation at all different stages.

► The Great Fisherman

It's not been an easy collection to create, Yonier said.

"They are very complex pieces because I've mixed ceramics with metal and you take a lot of risks. There are some very challenging pieces," he said.

The collection has been a dream come true for the artist, having wanted to experiment with ceramics for a long time. "I had been planning to do sculpture

for about seven years and so I've been trying to find the right time for this," he confirmed. "I bought a ceramics kiln and I learnt a lot more about ceramics and metal. It took me a while to try and see how it all works. I loved the challenge and when I come up with an idea, I really want it to challenge me. I'm trying to put into 3-D all of my ideas that I have for painting. I think people can see more detail; they can move around."

Pushing the boundaries with the seemingly gravity-defying sculptures of innovators on fantasy bicycles, out-of-this-world flying machines and giant creatures from the ocean, Yonier said he had been working outside his comfort zone, with some of the intricate pieces taking months to create. Innovators such as Elon Musk, the space travel and Tesla entrepreneur, have been an inspiration for this creative artist.

"I love the idea of space travel, so, for a long time I've wanted to do something inspired by space using my style. I did the drawings and thought, let me see if I can take it to ceramics," he said.

The artwork displays incredible movement and perpetuation, which Yonier said was a reflection of his own quest to move forwards with his art and do work outside the box.

Yonier followers will note some more traditional pieces in his sculptures that are more reflective of his usual artwork, such as The Great Fisherman, which is a beautifully intricate piece of a fisherman trawling for plastic items from the sea.

"The fisherman isn't only there to get fish, sometimes we have to go to the sea to do some work with all this pollution and contamination," Yonier stated. "That's why I called this The Great Fisherman; it's not only about catching the big fish; it's about clearing the ocean of pollution also."

In a similar vein, The Way of Wisdom depicts a fisherman on top of a giant turtle holding scripts with words that reflect human values, such as 'Love', 'Integrity' and 'Discipline' and virtues such as 'Creativity', 'Knowledge', 'Work' and 'Ideas', all values and virtues that Yonier holds dear.

Gallery owner Avril Ward said as her Awardart Gallery was currently displaced due to issues arising from the Covid crisis, the pop-up location at Camana Bay had been the perfect spot to showcase Yonier's work.

"We'd planned this exhibition from the beginning of the year but with the

lock down happening, I said to Yonier we had better look for somewhere else just in case. It's actually works brilliantly," she said.

This foresight meant she was able to secure the spot for the six weeks that the exhibition will be up and running.

Yonier will be at the Gallery every Saturday working on ceramics and they especially encourage children to come and watch the artist at work.

"It's one thing to come and see the end piece but to actually watch him make it is really exciting," Avril said.

The exhibition is open Thursday to Sunday, 12 noon to 5.30pm until 6th December

Local experts combine for key AML training session: Includes updates to Cayman's anti-money laundering framework over past 12 months

Two of the country's best-known experts on the Cayman Islands' anti-money laundering framework have united to offer a refresher training session for the local compliance and risk management industry, Thursday, 25th November, 9am to 12:30pm.

Ms Angele Mele, Founder of Risk-Pass AML+Compliance Ltd. and Mr Paul Byles, Director of FTS, are former regulators of the Cayman Islands Monetary Authority (CIMA) and have worked in the compliance and risk management sector for the past 15 years. This key training session offers the rare opportunity for attendees to learn from both speakers on the various changes to the country's anti-money laundering regime.

"The purpose of the session is not only to provide an overview of recent legislative and regulatory updates but also to identify the changes that local compliance experts and directors need to incorporate into their existing systems, to be compliant," Paul Byles, Director of FTS and organiser of the seminar said.

Ms Mele will present on the topics of 'Proliferation Financing' and 'Extensions to the Risk-based Approach,' while Mr Byles will address 'Targeted Financial Sanctions' and 'Transaction Monitoring.' "We thought it would be timely to hold a session focusing on material updates since late 2019 and outline how these changes can be added into an existing framework," Ms Mele said.

Kansas State University professor, Mark Haub, ate a diet of pure junk food for 2 months. I'm talking candy bars and packaged snacks - the kinds of things you find in a snack machine.

You'd expect him to gain weight, right?

Well, there was one catch. He was only allowed to eat 1800 calories each day. Yes, those calories were pure junk, but the limit was firmly put at 1800 calories.



Jamaicans hope that the strict coronavirus protocols in place will be eased by Christmas.


While admitting that some Jamaicans were suffering from 'COVID fatigue' and with Christmas fast approaching, Prime Minister Andrew Holness indicated that there could be some relaxation of restrictions over yuletide.

Holness was guarded in his response to questions about whether the government would relax protocols over Christmas. Among the restrictions in place are a daily curfew that runs from 9pm to 5am and limitations on the number of people allowed to gather in public.

Having earlier announced that the existing protocols would remain in place through up to Nov. 30 in some instances, Holness said this was done

LIAT service resumes soon

LIAT returned to Caribbean skies on Sunday following a seven-month absence. The airline operated its first flight from the VC Bird International Airport in Antigua to Dominica.

LIAT 401 departed Antigua at 4pm and arrived at Douglas Charles Airport at 4:45pm. The return flight, LIAT 402 left

Dominica at 5pm and arrived at VC. Bird International Airport at 5:45pm. It was more a symbolic return flight.

LIAT will operate a limited schedule of flights when it launches its commercial schedule later this month which will return connectivity to its network which was impacted by the shutdown. The airline is currently completing all the training and regulatory requirements for the territories it will be flying to and will announce soon its limited schedule and destinations.

Also, several new procedures will be implemented to ensure the safety of passengers as well as reduce the risk of transmission of COVID. These include the mandatory wearing of masks at check-in and on board, enhancement in its cleaning and sanitisation protocols and new boarding procedures.

The airline was forced to suspend services in April due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic which led to several destinations imposing travel bans and closing their borders.

Kid swims for nearly 14 hours

A 12-year-old avid swimmer from Martinique has swam nearly 25 miles from St Lucia to his home island.

Christophe Maleau became the youngest person to swim from St Lucia to neighbouring Martinique a month ago. He completed the 40km (24.8 mile) swim in 13 hours, 50 minutes and 47 seconds. Although not a quick time for adult marathon swimmers, it is incredibly impressive for someone so young.

He joins a very small number of people who have successfully crossed the St Lucia Channel. This group includes two-time Masters world champion Jacques Sicot and French Olympic champion Gilles Rondy. Maleau's dream is to swim at the Olympics. This was not his first long-distance swim. In 2017, aged 9, he completed a 6.5km swim, and in 2018, he swam for 10 hours between Diamant and Schoelcher in Martinique.

This time, Maleau raised money for breast cancer; his mother is in remission after suffering from the disease. The event was difficult to organise because of strict COVID-19 protocols, but Maleau managed it. During the swim, his father canoed beside him, while doctors and divers followed in another boat to ensure his safety.

"I held on by singing songs to myself," said Maleau. "I sometimes wanted to stop because I was tired. But when the idea crossed my mind, I told myself I had no right. I had to continue for the cause I was defending."



Antigua and Barbuda officially observed the independence anniversary on Sunday and in his national address, Browne said that the island did not make of itself a nation with one of the highest per capita incomes globally, to be cowered in the face of a pandemic, however menacing.

For his contribution to the cultural and musical landscape of T&T and taking the art form to the world, the 85-yearold veteran has gleaned numerous honours, including an honorary doctorate from the University of the West Indies in

Adesanya is king but Silva must stop

Israel Adesanya is so dominant as UFC middleweight champ that when he moves up to fight the light-heavy champion the bookies will still have him as favourite. Adesanya moves up to 205 from 185 pounds to challenge Jan Blachowicz in the new year.

UFC president Dana White announced the surprising news with Adesanya expected to leave middleweight for at least one fight to try to become a two-division champion.

Despite Adesanya never competing at light-heavy in the UFC previously, odds makers still have a feeling that "The Last Stylebender" can do it.

Underestimated Blachowicz has found himself in this position before. Ahead of his title fight against Dominick Reyes at UFC 253 in September, Blachowicz closed at similar odds with most making him a 2-1 underdog. He ultimately dominated Reyes before a second round knockout to claim the vacant title.

Meanwhile, Anderson "Spider" Silva won't compete in the UFC again, but Conor McGregor believes there is a place in mixed martial arts for the legend.

In the main event of UFC Vegas 12, Silva was set for what the UFC marketed as his final fight. Unfortunately and quite predictable, for the 45-year-old Brazilian, he suffered a fourth-round TKO loss to Uriah Hall. Afterwards, Silva would not confirm his retirement from the sport.

Now, for Dana White, the UFC president, he is adamant Silva must retire. If another promotion or commission allows him to fight, White believes that would be "disgusting".

"Unfortunately, that is true. (It would be) disgusting that a commission would let him fight again," White said. "He is a grown man; he can do whatever he wants. I like and I respect the guy but I hope his family talks him out of it."

Silva suffered a third straight loss, following previous defeats to Jarod Cannonier and Adesanya. In fact, Silva has only won once in his last nine fights yet for some reason is reluctant to call it a day.

But Conor McGregor urged him to fight again if that's what he wants. "Sad to see tonight, but I say keep going," he said in response to a fan on Twitter asking for his opinion on Silva's display.

"Real fighters never lose that fire so why try to force it out? Simply put time into finding the correct competition and continue on. The right competition is out there, for all levels and ages. Find it and do what you love to do! Forever!"

But it will definitely not be in the UFC, White explained in no uncertain terms.

"He fought a guy that has absolutely zero output," White said. "They're in a fiveround main event on ESPN and they threw (only) 11 punches in the second round.

"You fight any of these other savages, he'll be in big trouble, and he'll take a load of punishment. Uriah Hall is one of the most gun-shy fighters in the UFC.

"And look at Anderson. When the fight was over, he couldn't even stand up to

do his interview. He had to sit down and do an interview.

"I made a big mistake and I shouldn't have let him fight this fight tonight. He's a legend of this sport and he's a legend of this company, and I did something I disagreed with. I knew I was right, and tonight proved I was right, and Anderson Silva should never fight again." 😯

Holder finally makes his **IPL** mark

Jason Holder seems to have been around for ever yet the West Indies captain is still only 28 - and seems to be improving as his spell in the Indian Premier League is proving.

A win in a low-scoring match in Sharjah may have kept slim hopes alive for Sunrisers Hyderabad, but more importantly, these matches are also

throwing up some valuable pointers for the franchises about the mega auction for next season. Holder is not new to the IPL but the Man of the Match against Royal Challengers Bangalore, means he will be much sought after in 2021.

The Barbadian all-rounder, West Inlies Test skipper for the last six years, hadn't created much impact in the star-studded IPL so far - making his debut with Chennai Super Kings in 2013 and then Sunrisers Hyderabad, followed by a stint at Kolkata Knight Riders in 2016. The opportunities were rare and his record is not impressive. In the ongoing IPL in the UAE, Sunrisers drafted him only as a replacement when Mitchell Marsh left with an injury - and it was only after halfway stages of their league campaign that Holder got a look-in. Going about his task without

any fuss, Holder has proved his utility so far - the peak of them coming in the crunch match against Royal Challengers Bangalore on Saturday with figures of 4-0-27-2 and then provided the calmness after the loss of Manish Pandey and Kane Williamson by hammering three huge sixes in his unbeaten 26 to take his team over the line. Holder may not possess the brute force of fellow West Indies stars in the IPL, like Chris Gayle, Andre Russell and Kieron Pollard, but he certainly has the cricket sense and maturity to serve well, much like Dwayne Bravo or Darren Sammy by mixing things up in his slow-medium bowling and provide stability to the lower middle order batting.

Grant's electric run lifts **Dolphins spirits**

Jakeem Grant might be the best returner in the NFL judging by that amazing run. The Miami Dolphins wide receiver definitely believes he's the fastest. And few can argue on the strength of his latest exploits.

Grant insists he didn't even hit top speed during his sensational 88yard punt return for a touchdown Sunday. It wasn't just one of the best runs of the season, but is being hailed as up there with anything seen

in NFL history. His lateral movement, acceleration and the cartoon-like way he evaded tackles was incredible.

"Probably about 80 (percent) to get around the edge and just a little short the NFL this season to return a punt burst to get to the end zone, just to make sure nobody was behind me," Grant said. "Until someone's actually right there, then I'll run full speed. Until then, no point." Grant's score was both impactful — it helped lift a Dolphins team that got little from its offense against the Los Angeles Rams — and mighty impressive, considering whom it came against.

and just the second time in his nineyear career.

But the 28-year-old Texan took it to the house, becoming the first player in for a touchdown. The return was the longest in franchise history. He now owns the team record in total return touchdowns (five) and punt return touchdowns (three).

World class cricketers often don't peak until their thirties, so maybe there is far more to come from Holder. 🔇

"We know that Hekker is a great punter," he said. "It was only one opportunity. I made the most of it."

On the season, Grant averages 14.2 yards per punt return, which also ranks in the top five league-wide. No bad for a player who at 5-ft 7-in and 170 pounds is diminutive in a sport that favours behemoths. 🟈

Woods aims to repeat Masters miracle

Tiger Woods seriously flirted with the idea of playing a tournament in Houston this week for the first time since 2003 but will try to defend his Masters title next week without a warm-up competition.

It does not bode well for Woods, 44, who amazed the sporting world last year by capturing the Masters after years of career-threatening injury and indifferent form. Many of the world's top golfers are in Houston this weekend, including Phil Mickelson, Jordan Spieth, world No. 1 Dustin Johnson, four-time Major winner Brooks Koepka, Tony Finau,

Jason Day, Sergio Garcia and Adam Scott.

Woods has been plagued with more injuries and poor form since that amazing Masters win in April 2019. He isn't close to being the player who was the world's best - and arguably greatest in history - but he found lightning in a Rae's Creek bottle to win a fifth Masters. He is always the biggest story whenever he tees it up, whether his golf game merits it or not. What makes his Masters bid so intriguing is that even if there is only a fraction of the peak Woods left, he is still capable of pulling off another miracle. 😚
