

CAYMAN STUDENTS EXCEL

Provisional results for the 2020 examinations for the government schools are indicating the Cayman's students did well despite the challenges of the COVID-19 crisis.

According to the Ministry and Department of Education, the results indicate an improvement over the past four years as demonstrated by the number of Year 11 and Year 12 students who gained 5 exam passes at Grade I, II or III (Level 2 qualifications).

Hon. Minister of Education, Juliana O'Connor-Connolly applauded the students on their success.

"Our students have performed exceptionally well given the challenges of the lockdown, including the transition to 100% remote learning and the change to the exam schedule," she said.

"This speaks volumes for the level of support provided by our Government School educators, support staff and of course, their

OVER 250 COVID-19 CASES SINCE MARCH

Cayman has now surpassed 250 confirmed COVID-19 cases since the first sign of the disease here in March.

Chief Medical Officer, Dr John Lee, reported Tuesday that of 263 COVID-19 tests been carried out from the last report on Friday, November 6th, three were positive.

That takes the total confirmed to 253.

The individuals are asymptomatic travellers who returned a positive test result following routine screening. They will remain in isolation until considered recovered.

In all, 236 persons have recovered from the disease.

There are 823 persons in isolation, either at a government facility or in their homes as required by the Medical Officer of Health.

Testing for the virus continues with 48,577 screenings done to date.

Globally, many countries are recording an upsurge in cases and deaths in what is being called the second wave of the pandemic.


There's only been one death in Cayman linked to COVID-19.

VACCINE HOPE

But while concerns mount and countries impose new restrictions to contain the second wave of the pandemic, there has been a ray of hope in research to develop a vaccine.

Medical experts and world leaders have been applauding the news on Monday that early tests of one vaccine are showing encouraging results.

DEH Bulk Waste Removal Campaign Begins

The Department of Environmental Health (DEH) will commence its annual bulk waste removal activity on Monday, 16 November 2020 and conclude on Monday, 21 December 2020. Residents are asked to place their bulk waste on the kerbside during the dates specified. Collection will commence immediately thereafter.

- Cayman Brac and Little Cayman:**
- Cayman Brac East — December 9-10
 - Cayman Brac West — December 16-17
 - Cayman Brac South — December 18
 - Little Cayman — December 22

Bulk waste must be placed on the kerbside where it is easily accessible to DEH collection crews but will not obstruct the roadway. Bulk items that are put out after scheduled dates will not be collected.

Metals and vegetative waste must be separated from other bulk waste items.

- Grand Cayman:**
- East End/ Northside — November 16 - 21
 - Bodden Town — November 23 - December 5
 - George Town — December 7-12
 - West Bay — December 14-19



Metal waste includes items such as old appliances, metal furniture and metal roofing while vegetative waste includes plant trimmings and tree branches. Bulk waste refers to large items such as old furniture, household appliances and vegetative waste that are not collected as part of the DEH's weekly residential pick-up services. Construction and demolition debris are not considered bulk waste and will not be collected during the bulk waste removal activity.

Public Notice:
Species Conservation Plan for *Aegiphila caymanensis*

The National Conservation Council (NCC) is seeking public comments on a plan to protect and conserve *Aegiphila caymanensis* which has no traditional name (due to its extreme rarity). Currently listed as Critically Endangered, it is a woody, clambering shrub with soft, downy leaves that is unique to Grand Cayman.

The public consultation period will begin on 20 November 2020 and end on 15 January 2021. The species conservation plan would ban any taking, possession, purchase, sale, or exchange of the *Aegiphila caymanensis* plant without a permit.



parents and guardians. The dedication that our students displayed in persevering through uncharted waters cannot be understated. The resilience and tenacity of our valiant students should be a source of pride for every Caymanian," Minister for Education O'Connor-Conolly declared.

According to the preliminary report, in the core curriculum subject areas of English, mathematics and science, growth has been maintained over time.

Provisional results also indicate that the number of students achieving a Level 2 qualification in English reached an all-time high of 86.4%, up by 8% over the previous high of 78% in 2018.

Performance in mathematics while continuing to be uneven, also realised modest gains reaching 54% over the 2019 figures of 49%.

The number of students achieving at least one science subject at Level 2 reached an all-time high of 71%.

This was a 13% improvement over 2019 which had recorded a dip of 58%.

It also represents a 4% increase over the previous high of 67% obtained in 2018.

Acting Director of The Department of Education Services(DES), Tammy Banks-DaCosta, remarked:

"Overall, we are showing modest gains from year-to-year attributed to strategies and interventions that have been implemented. The success of these

strategies and interventions is proven based on other clear indicators."

Ms Banks-DaCosta also noted that "this cohort's 2019 performance in English was 75.3%, which is slightly higher than the student performance statistics in England which was at 61.8% in 2019."

She singled out several students for their outstanding performance.

"Additionally, we have three students from the Clifton Hunter High School who achieved Top 10 Merit status regionally in the CSEC May - June 2019 examination series. Diamond Chambers ranked 9th in the region in Human and Social Biology and also tied with Joshua Peart for the 7th place rank in Integrated Science. Aaliyah Powell who was an early entry in Year 10, ranked 9th in Electronic Document Preparation."

During October, 330 students successfully graduated from the Government's secondary school system and Light-house School. 157 of those graduates achieved their diploma with Level 2 'Honours' and 'High Honours'.


Level 2 'Honours' indicates that a student achieved 7 exam passes with Grade I, II or III, or the grade equivalent in accepted exams other than CSEC. Level 2 'High Honours' indicates 9 passes at Grade I or II, or the grade equivalent in accepted exams other than CSEC. The subject area passes obtained must include English and mathematics.

Addressing the timing of the official release of examination results this year,

the Acting Director of DES cited some of the setbacks experienced as a result of the pandemic.

"The 2019-2020 academic year was absolutely impacted by the Coronavirus Covid-19 Pandemic," she stated.

"This resulted in delays in the administration and awarding of grades by some external examination bodies. When grades for the CXC were issued in Septem-



ber, a number of candidates across the region voiced concern about the process and the grades received and requested reviews of their grades."

As a result the CXC Chairman commissioned a review of the entire process for the 2020 examinations, and a report titled, 'Report of the Independent Review Team: Review of the Administration of the 2020 CSEC and CAPE Examinations by the Caribbean Examinations Council' was subsequently produced and shared with member territories.


The Cayman Islands Government Schools have submitted a total of 69

requests for review and is awaiting the final review by the CXC.

The deadline for territories to submit reviews was extended until November 6th.

Despite the encouraging news about the exam performance of the students, the DES advises that all results for the Cayman Islands should be considered provisional until the final report is received from the CXC.

However, it points out that any potential changes coming out of the CXC reviews will not affect the results negatively. 🌐



The pharmaceutical companies Pfizer and BioNTech are reporting that a vaccine they are developing could prevent more than 90% of people from getting COVID-19, according to their preliminary analysis.

Laboratory testing is continuing and Pfizer and BioNTech say they expect to have enough safety data by the later this month to seek regulatory approval for mass manufacture of their vaccine.

Other vaccines are also in development in labs around the world.

He was scheduled to appear in court on Tuesday morning, 10 November.

Using Scripture to Answer Pressing Social Issues

Properly exegeted, the Christian Bible, the scriptures, have answers to pressing social and economic situations.

An excellent example of this is the work of David Gushee and Glen Stassen, Kingdom Ethics- Following Jesus in Contemporary Context. It is a most valuable contribution to the field of theo-

logical ethics. This book has deservedly been praised as masterful, innovative, profound, and challenging and Gushee has been hailed as the leading ethicist among evangelicals.

The basic and guiding thesis of the authors is that the coming of Christ heralded the launching of his Kingdom as both

a divine and human work and that the framework of the Kingdom of God must be used as the basis of ethical discussions and analysis, and the Sermon on the Mount as a clear and present guide to ethical behaviour and a tool to interpreting, reforming and revolutionizing society toward the ethic of the Kingdom.

The Nature and Premise of the Kingdom of God

At the very beginning of his ministry Jesus announced that the Kingdom of God was at hand. This 'Kingdom message', the good news of its reality, was the binding theme throughout the gospels, and the message and point of departure of the Pauline epistles and so on. The authors contend that even though there is no uncertainty about the proclamation of this Kingdom, it is the attributes of its nature that has caused considerable debate. They assert that this Kingdom Message 'has often played little real role in Christian life,' but that despite this, they believed that it is from a proper understanding of this, that a 'Christian theology and ethics must begin.'

The explanation is that in the proclamation of Christ, was his understanding that his message was foretold by various prophets of the Old Testament. For Christ, this Kingdom was both here and now and to come, a reality that was both fulfilled and present, yet, in its fullness, was a reality anticipated. Gushee and Stassen insist that the covenant Christian must not only focus on the timing of the Kingdom, but on its characteristics, so that we might fulfil its requirements, its practices, in preparation and anticipation of it.

So, we enter the Kingdom by doing, by practicing an ethic that that Kingdom demands and by so doing transform our lives and the societies in which we engage. Understood in this way, the Christian walk is centred in the here and now, as well as in anticipation of the hereafter.


Sensing the value in moral reasoning, the authors explain that ethical reasoning is accomplished in three 'modes', the characterological, the teleological and the deontological. Special emphasis is placed on the deontological given their belief that 'a Jesus-centered ethic takes divine commands seriously...'

From this premise the authors developed a methodology for interrogating all aspects of society using Christian ethics, grounded in the authority of scripture seen in its totality, without truncation, inclusive of the Old and New Testaments. The point of departure is viewing the Sermon on the Mount as the fullness of the teachings of the Torah and the prophets and as the yardstick from which to measure ethical behaviour and practices.

In the Beatitudes we find the highest expressions of God's will for the practicing Christian. Jesus calls us to rescue the poor, to mourn for our sins and for the sins of the community and to hunger and thirst for justice. He calls us in this sermon to demonstrate steadfast love and compassion in 'covenant loyalty', to eschew duplicity and practice integrity as we devote our entire selves to God.

In this sermon, Christ echoes the call of the Torah and the Prophets, that we nurture peace and be willing to suffer for Christ, if need be. These virtues are echoed by Paul and throughout the New Testament, and so, as the authors explain, are clearly meant to be practiced as the 'heart of the biblical virtues.' In the practice of these virtues our characters are developed.

The explication of the essence of the Sermon on the Mount, demonstrates what the Kingdom proclaimed by Christ

is all about, a Kingdom that is both present and future. The sermon is also, and especially, a call to action to bring Kingdom ethics of justice, peace, inclusivity, etcetera, to the 'great social sins' of our time, if not of all times- 'including peace-making, just war, nonviolence, sexuality and gender roles, marriage and divorce, race, economics, care of creation, prayer and politics.'

Application of the Kingdom Narrative to Issues of Race

The authors apply the Kingdom narrative to the issue of race generally and in particular to the situation in the US. They point out the God created human diversity, and even though Israel was chosen, it was because of its insignificance. Jesus, even though operating within the Judeo-Jewish context, extended his ministry to all.

Critical race theory was used to analyze and interrogate racism in the US. The authors trace this untenable situation from the displacement of the original populations, through to chattel slavery as the socio-economic and politico-cultural context that gave rise to white supremacist assumptions and the development of institutions that cemented this structure and practice.

While the 'economic viability of this nation was built on the enormous wealth created by enslave persons' the post-emancipation situation, was hardly better, as the 'post-emancipation oppression of blacks was 'sanitized, legalized and supported' while Jim Crow laws were passed to maintain separation of blacks in all aspects of life.' It is pointed out the idea of that slavery, though essentially an economic system, nurtured and cemented over four centuries, ideas of race. They use critical race theory as a tool to analyze the situation.

This theory asserts that racism is the result of the 'social construction' or race itself. The science, though available, is ignored for invention of racial categories, which is manipulated and discarded as needed. Out of a particular convergence of historical occurrences, whiteness becomes valued and an entire system now operates to the advantage of a particular race with the intention of perpetuating this reality. The results of this are seen in shortened life expectancy for black peoples especially, race-based hate crimes, income and employment racial gaps, the perpetuation of structured, institutional racism especially in the justice system and frequent episodes of mass protests, among others.

Describing racism as the original sin of the US, the authors call for a range of interventions. These include truth-telling in the form of a full apology for the evil of white racism, an apology for slavery. Viewing racism as both personal and systemic, they recommend racial justice as the appropriate methodology and paradigm, as opposed to racial reconstruction. With the goal of achieving an 'interethnic balanced community' they call for the dismantling of white privilege, through concrete political and social action. Significantly, they also recommend 'the extension of grace of forgiveness' needed for spiritual well-being 'for anchoring racial justice itself.'

I especially enjoyed this analysis which saw the authors bring historical knowledge to clarifying the current situation that obtains the US. The well-known and largely accepted critical race theory was used to very good effect in examining this societal ignominy. This analysis also demonstrates that properly exegeted, the scriptures have answers to pressing social and economic situations. 🌐

The foundation offers a halfway-house for recovering addicts to stay so that they have the chance to get clean and stay clean and put their lives back together, through an established 12-step programme. But all homes have bills, and Hope For Today needs funds to keep going so that all its clients get the support they need when supporting themselves is difficult. There are plenty of people, and companies who step up to the plate and give whatever they can. That is what makes fundraising events like Clash of the Legends – the get-together of football heroes of Cayman's

not-forgotten football Hall of Fame, from East End and West Bay, not just fundraisers but legendary community get-togethers, too. "The Foundation is having a family fun day, where the old footballers are going to play and show their skills. The foundation is trying to give some support to the community for all the support they have gotten over the years," Mr. Hydes said, as hot dogs sizzled and people made the best of the rainy weather, in Grand West Bay style.

There might have been lots and lots of rain but in the end the guys from East End got all the way to the Ed Bush Stadium in West Bay with their coach, Brent McLean. "We want to support it because

I speak to Brent all the time and substance abuse in the community, we believe that we as a community have to do whatever we can to help these people because a lot of these people can't get the help they need, and this is the way forward for them. Everybody that is on my team believes in that same vision so that is why we are always here whenever he

calls and says we want to do this."

Beverly Barnes helps the Foundation whenever she can, because the Foundation helped her. She has been clean for seven years, she says, after the nightmare of 15 years as a crack cocaine addict. "I was addicted to crack cocaine for 15 years. I did anything and everything to get crack cocaine. I would rob and steal, I was in and out of prison," she said. "My life has changed immensely I work at the Pines retirement home now, and it's been wonderful. I love my life today."

The game started late, but the guys put on a great match, with the West Bay team winning against East End, two great goals to legendary goal. It's great to have a win for the home side, sometimes, and Hope for Today is always part of the winning team, because homes win, and the community wins through the work that it does. 🌐

What's Scariest than Ghosts & Goblins? How about Type 2 Diabetes!


When these situations develop, you have Type 2 diabetes.

\$200m coke haul in BVI cop's house

British Virgin Islands has a huge problem with drugs and corruption, highlighted by nearly two and a half tonnes of cocaine seized from a serving police officer's house.

The \$200 million stash is the equivalent to three quarters of the entire national budget of the tiny UK overseas territory. The record breaking raid heaps pressure on ministers to do more to tackle corruption in the troubled region that is central to the South American drug trafficking trade into the United States.

The 2,300 kg stash was discovered on Friday night hidden in 63 bundles across three vehicles during a raid on a house being built by a serving officer of the Royal Virgin Island Police Force. The officer has been named as Darren Davis, 41, who has served for 20 years.

Davis and an accomplice have been arrested and his suspected criminal connections are being probed, along with any other corrupt cops in the force.

Law enforcement sources point to possible side effects of the Covid-19 crisis meaning that large amounts of

cocaine, usually bound for the United States, is being bottlenecked due to a flat drugs market and restrictions on travel.

The BVI is currently under a night time curfew and private boats are not allowed on the waters after dark - meaning nefarious activity has been easier to spot.

BVI Governor Gus Jaspert said: "This is not the work of a few criminals slipping through the crack, but strong evidence of serious and organised criminality in the British Virgin Islands."

He added "there may be pockets of corruption facilitating this activity" and warned "we must act fast" to make sure it does not spread. 🌐

Grenada produces first 'green' chocolate

Grenada has secured a lucrative contract with an upmarket British company to produce the world's first 99 percent carbon-free chocolate.

Fortnum & Mason has introduced what it claims is the world's first 99 percent carbon-free chocolate to increase its sustainability credentials.

The Sailboat chocolate - which retails at roughly \$28 for three 60g pouches - is made and transported using only green energy. The cocoa used is grown and manufactured in a solar-powered factory in Grenada and delivered via non-carbon reliant transport. A wind-powered sailboat takes the cocoa from Grenada to Neary Nógs factory in Newry, Northern Ireland, where it is broken down, tempered and packaged using solar energy.

It is then goes to Fortnum & Mason's Piccadilly flagship store in London via rowing boat, horse and carriage, and the retailer's own fleet of electric vans.

The remaining 1 percent of energy is the emergency allowance of fuel on the sailboat. The organic chocolate comes in 71 percent, 85 percent or 100 percent cacao variants.

Farmers who grow the cocoa beans are also paid a claimed 65 percent more per pound compared with the local price.

The product, which has been created in partnership with the Grenada Chocolate Company and British chocolatier Chantal Coady, is available at Fortnum & Mason in Piccadilly and on its website. 🌐
