




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Cayman Governor and the Premier fly aboard CAL's B737-8

The Honourable Juliana O'Connor-Connolly, Minister for Education, Youth, Sports, Agriculture and Lands (EYSAL), officially renamed the Savannah Primary School, the Joanna Clarke Primary School in honour of the late education stalwart, during a ceremony on the school's grounds on Tuesday afternoon (23 February).

Ms. Clarke served the Cayman Islands as an esteemed educator for almost fifty years, wearing several hats ranging from Savannah Primary School principal and Language Arts Curriculum Officer for primary and middle schools to Education Programme Coordinator for the Young Parents Programme. She was instrumental in re-shaping the future of language arts teaching in primary schools.

Small Business owners to join Incubator



The Cayman Islands Centre for Business Development (CICBD), in the Ministry of Commerce, Planning and Infrastructure, is inviting micro and small business owners to apply to its residential business incubator programme.

The business incubator, which will officially open on March 24, will host twenty micro and small businesses owners who do not currently have a work space from which to operate. The residential business incubator will be free of charge to participants for a period of up to two years.

Principal of the newly named Joanna Clarke Primary School, Mr. Delton Pedley, described the name change as a defining moment. "This name change is a defining moment for our school, community and our nation. In her address, Minister for EYSAL Hon. Juliana O'Connor-Connolly reminded the audience of Ms. Clarke's rich legacy. "Ms. Clarke has gone to rest, but her memory remains etched in ours forever. We are so much better off as a nation, having been the beneficiaries and recipients

of a selfless, Christian, pious, Godly lady who made a difference across the gender-spectrum. May our tribute be lasting and infinite as we try to mirror her characteristics," said Minister O'Connor-Connolly.

Ms. Clarke's niece, Ms. Judith Witter, thanked the Cayman Islands Government and people for acknowledging her late aunt's contributions to education. "It is a great honour to know that the school has been renamed after my aunt. The sixteen years that Ms. Clarke led this school were unequivocally the highlight of her long teaching career. Thank you, Cayman Islands, for welcoming my aunt to your shores many years ago, embracing her and recognising her selfless sacrifice of love and service to your children. Our family is grateful for this memorable and prestigious recognition bestowed upon her, and we are thrilled that her legacy will live on at a place that occupied so much of her heart."

COVID 19 Relief Funding for Farmers Extended Until June

The Ministry of Education, Youth, Sports, Agriculture and Lands (MEYSAL) with support of the Department of Agriculture (DoA) has announced the extension of the Cayman Islands Farmers Assistance and Relief Measures (CI FARM) programme launched back in December 2020. The opportunity for local farmers to apply for funding has been extended to June 2021.

Expounding on the reasoning behind the programme's extension, Minister for Agriculture, Hon. Juliana O'Connor-Conolly explained, "The COVID-19 pandemic


has and continues to have negative effects to all sectors on a global scale. Locally, the effects of the COVID 19 pandemic has contributed to produce loss and losses in revenue. This loss of produce would have significantly impacted full time farmers and part time farmers who have lost their primary source of income."

Earlier in January during an application drive hosted by MEYSAL and DoA in Cayman Brac, Minister Juliana O'Connor-Conolly had also expressed how happy she was that a significant number of local farmers had taken advantage of the opportunity to increase their capacity to yield greater quantities of high-quality produce and livestock.

Since its launch over 500 farmers have benefitted from the programme designed to provide economic relief to the local farming community whom were negatively affected by the COVID-19 crisis. Each successful applicant re-

ceives a voucher card to purchase seeds, fertilisers and other essential agricultural inputs from the Department of Agriculture. The programme is implemented by the DOA with funding and oversight provided by MEYSAL.

Minister O'Connor-Conolly further added, "Through continued investment in infrastructural and agricultural enhancement projects such as this, we will strengthen the resilience of the farming sector which ultimately benefits and improves the lives of all local residents."



advisors, strategic development support and a special advisory panel consisting of legal, accounting and other business professionals.

Director of CICBD, Althea West-Myers said the incubator programme is an extension of the Centre existing business mentoring programme. "It is targeted towards entrepreneurs with high growth potential. We are aiming to harness the creativity of local entrepreneurs to create innovative, sustainable businesses with the potential to employ significant numbers of people and increase global competitiveness," she noted.

Minister of Commerce, Hon. Joey Hew said the programme will identify, nurture and train Caymanian entrepreneurs to make the micro and small business sector more globally competitive.

"This aligns well with the Unity Government's priorities to support small and micro businesses to succeed and also to diversify the economy and support growth in new market sectors. Under this programme, entre-

preneurs will be provided with access to equity capital, opportunity to expand markets and given an opportunity to network with like-minded entrepreneurs through mentorship and training sessions," Minister Hew stated.

Participants in the programme will be selected through a competitive application process. Applicants should favourably fall within the following sectors:

- Animation
- Software Development and Mobile Applications
- Media and Communication
- Industrial Design
- Creative Industries
- Agro-Processing
- Manufacturing
- Support Services such as information technology, marketing and human services, and
- Environmental Innovations

The business incubator programme is open to start-up and existing micro and small businesses that demonstrate an interest in innovation, have a growing market base and provide evidence that they have been able to attract users and made sales of their product or service.

In addition to the identified sectors, businesses must:



- Be a registered enterprise that is at least 60% Caymanian-owned;
- Have a viable product that has been/is ready to be market tested;
- Be actively engaged in the entrepreneurial community for at least 6 months; and

- Be willing to allow for monitoring and evaluation of enterprise for impact assessment up to 24 months after the close of the programme;

The deadline to apply to participate in the residential incubator programme is Friday, March 5, 2021.

All of Stage 2 opens for COVID-19 Vaccine

The Public Health Department has now extended the COVID-19 vaccine to all Groups in Stage 1 and Stage 2 of the National Vaccination Programme. The schedule from Thursday 25th February to Saturday 6th March has been revised to reflect these changes.

Persons in Stage 2 Group C can now receive the vaccine at their allotted times (please see schedule for Surname assignments). This is **individuals living at home with person(s) from Stage 1 of the vaccination programme.**

Stage 2, Group C – persons living with:

- Residents and staff of institutional facilities

- Healthcare workers and first responders
- All frontline staff dealing with incoming travellers
- Adults 60+ or with a relevant health status
- Workers essential to Government continuity

“Caymanians 60 years and older and any families living in multi-generational households are strongly encouraged to get the vaccine,” said Dr Hazel Brown, Health Services Authority Chief Nursing Officer. “We still have vulnerable, elderly Caymanians in our community not yet vaccinated and we ask these persons come forward.

Any home bound person unable to get to a clinic can contact our Flu Hotline to make arrangements for our Public Health nurses to administer the vaccine in your home.”

All persons 60 years and older are encouraged to get the vaccine and are able to do so at any of the times when the vaccinations clinics are open.

The COVID-19 vaccination programme continues to administer Dose 2 vaccinations for persons due from Stage 1, Group A, B and C. Persons who have received

their first dose are reminded to get their second dose 21 days later or no longer than 12 weeks after the first dose during clinic times.



Identification Criteria:

Everyone must now present photo identification to receive the vaccine and demonstrate they are ordinarily and legally resident e.g. with initial permission to remain in the Islands for at least six months. This includes Caymanians, Permanent Residents, people holding Work Permits, as well as Global Citizens and their families.

Accepted ID's include:

- Cayman Islands Driver's License
- Cayman Islands Passport
- Cayman Islands Voters Card
- A Global Citizens Certificate (GCCP)
- Non-Caymanian passport showing approval to be on island for six months from arrival
- Work Permit extension letter
- Work Permit grant letter
- Job letter (from a local organisation)

If a visitor has already received their first dose, they may still receive their second dose.

Update to Vaccination Campaign Stage 2:

Stage 2 is in three groups: Stage 2, Group B will commence on Monday, February 15th. Please see schedule as this Group has been divided by Surname.

Group A

Anyone aged 16-60 with relevant medical conditions predisposing to COVID-19

Group B

Essential workers, teachers, school staff*

Group C

Those living at home with persons from stage one of the programme.

* Essential workers will include the following groups: teachers/school employees, supermarket workers, those working for the utilities, people working at gas stations, cus-

tomers facing people working in retail banking, those working in hotels, restaurants and bars, those working for food delivery companies, caregivers and Civil Servants. **All persons must present a work ID to show proof of employer.**

Stage 2, Group A - Proof of Medical Condition:

Anyone in Stage 2, Group A with a medical condition is required to provide a note from their doctor. Persons requiring a note from their HSA doctor are asked to request this by contacting the Flu Hotline flu@hsa.ky, 1-800-534-8600 or 925-6327.

Electronic and hard copies will be accepted at the vaccination clinics.

These medical conditions include:

- Diabetes
- Hypertension
- Cancer
- Heart disease
- Lung disease
- Kidney disease
- Autoimmune diseases or compromised/weakened immune system
- Asthma
- Down's syndrome (adults)
- Severe mental illness
- People on immunosuppression therapies sufficient to significantly increase risk of infection
- People with solid organ transplants

Caregivers

Public Health continues to vaccinate our most vulnerable population, specifically those 70 and over.

Caregivers of persons 70+ are eligible for the COVID vaccine in the continued effort to keep the most vulnerable safe. The vaccine is available for persons providing care for home bound elderly persons

Caregivers and persons responsible for the elderly in their homes can contact the HSA's Flu Hotline 1-800-534-8600 or 925-6327 to provide the fol-

lowing details: Caregivers full name, phone number, patient name, and date of birth. Once a caregiver has been identified, those persons will be approved for the vaccination and name checked at the vaccination clinic. Please check the schedule for your designated vaccination time.

Overseas University Students

University students who will be attending institutions overseas may also get vaccinated on their assigned day and must present university ID.

As a reminder, persons over the age of 60+ can be vaccinated at **any time** during the published schedule.

The COVID-19 vaccination programme continues to administer Dose 2 vaccinations for persons due from Stage 1, Group A, B and C. Persons who have received their first dose are reminded to get their second dose 21 days later or no longer than 12 weeks after the first dose.

If someone is home bound and unable to attend one of the vaccination clinics, they should contact the Flu Hotline 1-800-534-8600 or 925-6327 or their local HSA District Health Centre and arrangements will be made to with a Public Health nurse to provide the vaccine in their home.

Public Health will announce when Stage 2 Group C may come forward for vaccinations.

History was made on Thursday February 18, 2021 as the Charles Kirkconnell International Airport (CKIA) on Cayman Brac welcomed both of Cayman Airways' new Boeing 737-8 aircraft at the same time, with the Governor, the Premier, and other Government Ministers and officials on board.

"It was a tremendously proud day for our Cayman Airways family, and I was especially thrilled to have the Governor, Mr. Martyn Roper, ride with me aboard the first departure on VP-CIW, while the Cayman Islands Premier, the Hon. Alden McLaughlin, flew on the second departure aboard VP-CIX," said the Chairman of the Cayman Airways Board of Directors, Mr. Philip Rankin, noting that Director-General of the Civil Aviation Authority of the Cayman Islands (CAACI) also flew on a B737-8 to the Brac that day, along with other government ministers and officials. "We are excited to have these aircraft back in the air to continue our national airline's great service for our islands, especially during these challenging times."

Governor Roper said: "Many thanks to Cayman Airways President and CEO, Fabian Whorms, for inviting me to fly to Cayman Brac on one of the B737-8 jets. I even got to join the Captains Adrian Rex Miller, Steven Coe, Perry Pantan and Senior First Officer Geoffrey Conolly in the cockpit. The huge importance Cayman Airways rightly gives to passenger safety was evident throughout. They are an incredible team

and having seen them at close quarter I am full of awe about what they do, their professionalism and skill! These planes are clearly some of the safest in the air. CAL has a great record. They are a national treasure and I would like to congratulate them on their excellent public outreach."

Also on the trip were members of the Cayman media, members of the Cayman Airways Board of Directors, the Cayman Airways President and CEO along with other members of the airline's Executive Team, and Government employees, officials, and ministers, including: Minister of Public Finance and Economic Development, the Hon. Roy McTaggart; Minister of Health, Environment, Culture, and Housing, the Hon. Dwayne Seymour; Member of Parliament and Councilor to the Minister of Tourism, Transport and Sports, Mr. David Wight; and Member of Parliament and Deputy Speaker, Mrs. Barbara Conolly.

Cayman Islands Premier and Minister for Employment, Border Control, Community Affairs, International Trade, Investment, Aviation & Maritime Affairs, the Hon. Alden McLaughlin, said: "I'm pleased that the Cayman Airways Boeing 737-8 jets are now able to return to service. These jets have probably undergone the most scrutiny ever given to an aircraft in civil aviation history. I was happy to share the experience of the flight with our residents on Cayman Brac and they had the opportunity to tour the plane and ask questions of the pilots and crew. His Excellency the Governor and



members of Government travelled on the flight, highlighting the confidence they feel in the airplanes' safety and the ability to return these jets to service. I look forward to the day when we can safely open our borders and put these jets into full service bringing tourists to our shores."

The aircraft were parked at CKIA for about three hours, with pilots and flight attendants offering Cayman Brac students and residents tours of the aircraft interior and flight deck. Residents and students also got the chance to ask pilots questions directly, on board as well as at special informative sessions in the departure

lounge where there were also branded CAL giveaways.

A special Caribbean lunch was provided for all attendees, compliments of the Ministry of District Administration, Tourism, and Transport.

Deputy Premier and Minister for District Administration, Tourism, and Transport, the Hon. Moses Kirkconnell, commented: "We're extremely pleased with the upgrade of the fleet, moving from the Boeing 737-300's to the Boeing 737-8's. As the representative for Cayman Brac West and Little Cayman, it's a very special feeling when you see the Cayman Airways colours land on the runway, and when you see the support staff, when you see the Caymanian pilots come off the planes, it has to make everyone extremely proud. And we're very proud that they flew over today. It's a good day for us, a very proud day with hundreds of people in Cayman Brac, including school students, having the opportunity to walk through the plane and talk to the pilots and crew."

The event was held on the eve of the airline's Boeing 737-8 fleet officially returning to revenue service - the first revenue flight was repatriation flight KX3102 departing Grand Cayman at 10am for Miami on Friday February 19, 2021.
