East End kicks off Chamber Candidates Forums

The Cayman Islands Chamber of Commerce, in association with Foster's, launches the first in a series of 19 virtual candidates' forums on Monday, 8th March at 7 p.m. Incumbent and former Leader of the Opposition Arden McLean, McCleary Frederick and Isaac Rankine will respond to national and constituency specific questions based on the findings of a public survey released by the Chamber in February.

The forums will be streamed live on the Chamber's You Tube and Facebook channels. Cayman Life TV, Government Information Services (GIS), Cayman Marl Road and ICCI-FM will broadcast the forums. The forums conclude on Tuesday, 6th April for the George Town East constituency.

"The Chamber has organised forums before every election and by-election since 1988," said Wil Pineau, the Chamber's Chief Executive Officer. "Each forum gives voters an opportunity to compare the positions of the candidates. This is the first time that we will conduct the forums virtually which allows an online audience. All forums will take place at the Chamber's main offices in Governors Square."

Questions for the forum are based on the results of an online public survey released by the Chamber in February. More than 300 persons responded to the survey. More than 90% of the respondents identified themselves as eligible voters. Candi-

Minister for Education, Youth, Sports, Agriculture and Lands (EYSAL) Honourable Juliana O'Connor-Connolly officially opened new playing fields at Creek and Spot Bay Primary Schools on Saturday (27 February).

During her opening remarks at the opening ceremony held at Creek Primary School, Principal Ms. Claudette Lazzari underscored the importance of sports and thanked the Minister of EYSAL for the welcomed addition to the schools' infrastructure. "Sports are such an important part of our children's lives. It teaches them important values such as teamwork, unity, trust and hard work and helps keep their bodies strong and healthy. I want to say a heartfelt thank you to our Minister of Education, Hon. Juliana O'Connor-Connolly, her team in the Ministry and the Cayman Islands Government for making this vision a reality for our schools," Ms. Lazzari stated.

Jamaica imposes new COVID-19 travel requirements for entry

All travelers must provide proof of negative COVID-19 test

The Jamaican Government has announced that all travelers aged 12 years and older who wish to enter the country, including Jamaican nationals, must provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test (PCR or Antigen test taken within 72 hours of travel), upon check-in for their flight. The new requirement is effective as of Thursday March 4, 2021.

All travelers to Jamaica must also complete an online travel registration and obtain travel authorization approval prior to check-in for their flight.

Cayman Airways reminds passengers that they are responsible for ensuring that they have the necessary travel documents required for entry into any country. Persons not providing the required travel documents, will not be able to travel.

Honours Nominations Deadline Approaching

Persons wishing to recognise members of the Cayman Islands community for notable contributions to public life have less than three weeks left to submit nominations for the Queen's New Year's Honours 2022.

Nomination forms and details of how to prepare them are available from www.gov.uk/honours. The completed forms must be received by the Governor's Office no later than Monday, 22 March 2021.

His Excellency the Governor, Martyn Roper, explains that successful nominees have traditionally made life better for other people, or are outstanding at what they do.

"I urge anyone submitting a nomination to take the time to tell the story of the person they are putting forward, highlighting what makes them stand out from other people performing similar services", Mr Roper said. He added that the achievement or service being recognised might be paid or unpaid, in one field or in several.

Those who have already received Queen's Honours, he noted, remain eligible for nomination to a higher honour.

The Governor will review all nominations before recommending candidates to the Royal, Ceremonial and Honours Unit in the Foreign and Commonwealth Office in London. Final recommendations for honours in The Queen's List are considered in the United Kingdom, while recommendations for the Certificate and Badge of Honour are considered locally.

While all recommendations will be acknowledged, the Governor's Office cannot enter into correspondence about the action taken on them.

Members of the public are further reminded that Queen's Honours are awarded twice a year and the deadline for the Queen's Birthday Honours 2022 is 15 September 2021.

All Electoral Districts to Head to the Polls

Nomination submissions received from all 50 individuals seeking candidacy in the General Election have now been evaluated for eligibility.

The due diligence checks conducted by the Elections Office found that all of the candidates nominated on Monday, 1 March 2021 met the qualifications as set out in section 61 of the Cayman Islands

Constitution and no candidate met the disqualification criteria under section 62 of the Constitution.

The Supervisor of Elections has deemed that all those who submitted nominations are eligible to run for office. As such, elections are being contested in all electoral districts as at least two candidates are running in each.

The notices of contested elections were published on Thursday, 4 March on elections.ky (link provided below) including candidates' names, the locations and times of voting at the polls as well as the time ballots will be counted.

Candidate Reminder About Political Signs

The Elections Office has received a number of public enquiries relating to political signage that have been erected in the lead up to the 2021 General Election.

As such, the National Roads Authority, Planning Department and Elections Office are reminding candidates and their supporters of relevant important safety information.

Planning permission is not required for the placement of signage and therefore there are no limitations regarding size. Approval must be sought from the land owner before any signs are placed.

The placement of signage must not create an obstruction or impede the sightlines of motorists on road bends and at intersections.

No political signage is permitted on roundabouts as they obstruct driver sightlines, are an added distraction and may disrupt buried utilities (e.g. water pipes or electrical cabling).

The use of LED lights on signs is discouraged due to the potential for its glare to distract drivers at night.

"I'm sure every political hopeful would wish to promote road safety throughout the community. We are asking that they do their part by ensuring political signage is properly positioned," said the Managing Director of the National Roads Authority, Edward Howard.

Reports have also been received of political signs being damaged. Damaging private property is an offence and should be reported to RCIPS for investigation.

Signage, including related framing, must be removed prior to Election Day on Wednesday, 14 April 2021 as per the Elections Act.

COVID vaccination campaign opens for all of Stage 3



(25.5% of the estimated population) have received at least one dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine, while 8,805 have completed the two-dose course. "The Cayman Islands has been in an incredibly fortunate position to have been able to vaccinate its population so early on in the global campaign against Covid-19 disease."

Vaccination campaign changes and highlights:

- COVID-19 vaccine will be available to all ordinary and legal residents over the age of 16 (Stage 3) starting tomorrow Friday 5th March (starting with Surname A). Please see schedule for assigned Surname day.

- Vaccination Clinic Hours at ORIA - Monday - Friday 9am-12pm & 1:30-4pm; Saturday 9am-12pm & 1:30-3pm.

- For Dose 1, please fill out the consent form before arrival <https://www.hsa.ky/wp-content/uploads/2021/02/COVID-19-Vaccine-Consent-Form-2020-2021-FINAL-Feb.pdf>

- Everyone must present photo identification to receive the vaccine and demonstrate they are ordinarily and legally resident e.g. with initial permission to remain in the Islands for at least six months.

- Persons may come at **ANY** of the published clinic times for the following:

- Stage 1, Group A, B & C
- Stage 2, Group A, B & C
- Receiving Dose 2

- Persons who have received their first dose are reminded to get their second dose 21 days later or no longer than 12 weeks after the first dose.

- When receiving your 2nd dose, you **MUST** also bring along your vaccination card reflecting your 1st dose.

- Doctors' notes and employer letters are no longer required for Stage 2.

- Vaccination cards are NOT to be laminated.

- Persons 60 years and older will be given priority.

- Facemasks are required.

"We are still urging all persons over 60 years old to come forward to receive the vaccine," said Dr Samuel Williams-Rodriguez, Medical Officer of Health. "Statistics show the older you are, the more likely

you are to have complications if you contract COVID-19. Therefore, it is even more important that persons in this age group get fully vaccinated to protect themselves and those around them."

Dr Williams-Rodriguez confirmed that common side effects from getting the vaccine includes redness or soreness at the injection site, muscle aches, fever, headache, chills and tiredness. "Side effects from the vaccine are proving to be minor compared to the symptoms you could have if you are sick with COVID-19. The benefits of getting the vaccine far outweigh the risk of contracting the virus."

"Persons are urged to come at various times during the opening hours to help avoid long queues," said Dr Williams-Rodriguez. "The line moves quickly and one inside the airport you can expect the process to take 15-20 minutes, as we require everyone to rest at least 15 minutes after receiving the vaccination."

Individuals receiving their second dose are reminded that the date noted on the vaccination card for the second dose is the **earliest date** in which you can receive the vaccine. If you received your first dose at a District Health Centre you can receive your second dose at the airport.

If you are home bound and unable to attend one of the vaccination clinics, please contact the Flu Hotline 1-800-534-8600 or 925-6327 or your local HSA District Health Centre and arrangements will be made to with a Public Health nurse to provide your vaccine in the comfort of your home.

The public is reminded to **adhere to the published schedule** and plan to get the vaccine throughout the day, to limit congestion at the vaccination clinic.
