

CHAMBER CANDIDATES FORUM: EAST END



The Chamber of Commerce kicked off its Election 2021 Candidates Forum with an in-studio live-streamed panel discussion with the three hopefuls vying for the East End seat.

In a first, Caymanian Times will provide regular snapshots of the sessions in addition to live-streaming the events.

For the first encounter, incumbent East End MP Arden McLean and challengers Isaac Rankine and McCleary Frederick exchanged views on their priority issues for the district as well as the wider national agenda.

Mr McLean noted that "the people of East End said that they did not want it to look like Seven Mile Beach."

Quarantine at residence breach

An alleged breach of isolation protocols by a traveller who has been quarantining at residence and a member of the public has been reported to the Royal Cayman Islands Police Service (RCIPS) and is currently under investigation.

The Travel Cayman Mobile Compliance team were completing routine checks and discovered a member of the public in contact with a traveller who was quarantining at their home. As a result of the contact, the member of the public is now required to quarantine under instruction by the Medical Officer of Health.

The Royal Cayman Islands Police Service (RCIPS) noted that this is an ongoing investigation and a completed file will be sent to the Office of the Director of Public Prosecution (DPP) for a decision.

The public are reminded that travellers who quarantine at residence are not al-

lowed to have visitors. Delivery personnel, relatives and friends are not allowed to enter the home or have physical contact with the occupants while they are in quarantine. Persons in quarantine should ask friends, family members, neighbours and individuals providing delivery services for or on behalf of a business to provide contactless payment and/or delivery services. Persons making deliveries should remain in proximity to a quarantine property for the minimum necessary time for delivery and immediately depart. While goods can come into a quarantine location, goods cannot be passed outside a quarantine location. Once a location is being used for quarantine everything inside that location (i.e. inside the physical building and yard space) is to remain in the quarantine location until it has been cleared by the Medical Officer of Health. The only exception is for the disposal of



garbage, which should be double bagged. A mask and gloves should be worn when walking outside to dispose of the garbage, and this should only be done during low peak hours when there will be less human traffic within the area or apartment complex. 6ft of social distance should be maintained with other individuals. You should take garbage directly to the bin then immediately return to your residence.


Public Health confirmed that contact tracing has been completed and would like to reassure the public that there is no cause for public health concern.

The public and travellers are reminded that anyone that is found to be in breach of the mandatory quarantine provisions will be warned for intended prosecution and is liable on conviction to a fine of up to ten thousand dollars and imprisonment for up to two years.

QUARANTINE REDUCED AS CAYMAN REACHES ANOTHER COVID MILESTONE

The period for mandatory quarantining will be reduced from 14 days to 10 from March 22nd.

The announcement was made by Premier Alden McLaughlin in a specially called press conference on Wednesday.

Stating that "as a country we have done extremely well with the vaccine roll-out", The Premier said that Cayman had reached a threshold that now allows the government to make this further significant step in relaxing COVID-19 restrictions.

"I am extremely pleased to announce that we have reached a much-anticipated milestone," Mr McLaughlin announced breaking from campaigning for the April 14th snap elections.

"We have now vaccinated well over 91% of those in our population over the age of 60. This gives us confidence that the most vulnerable have been protected from the worst of the COVID-19 disease."

"With this target having been met," Mr McLaughlin confirmed, "I am able to announce that from the 22nd of March the required quarantine period will be reduced from 14 to 10 days for those who have completed a valid vaccination program at least two weeks before travelling to the Cayman Islands, provided that everyone to their quarantine group also been vaccinated."

Other safety protocols remain in place including a requirement for a negative PCR test taken within 72 hours of travelling as well as a negative test upon arrival in Cayman.

Stating that "we do not believe we have any community transmission" the Premier



described it as "a most enviable position to be in."

But he was quick to add that "we still maintain a degree of caution for three principal reasons."

Premier McLaughlin said the Ministry of Health is closely monitoring the global developments to better understand the effectiveness of the vaccines, and also "monitoring what happens around us for those travellers who wish to come to Cayman."

Meanwhile, HE Governor Martyn Roper announced that three further shipments of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine from the UK; two this month and one in April

Those consignments totalling 63,000 doses will bring the total vaccines sent to Cayman from the British government to 100,000 doses.

Roy McTaggart charts the road ahead

Cayman's pathway through the uncharted waters of the Covid-19 pandemic has been remarkably successful so far, in terms of keeping the population healthy and safe. While some countries will be grappling with the economic impact of the pandemic for decades to come, Cayman's Finance Minister Roy McTaggart, said, so far, the country's finances had been spared the worst. Considering the hit the economy has taken to its tourism industry, its second most important driver, Mr McTaggart was satisfied that Cayman's finances were in pretty good shape.

He said he felt he had done a credible job in keeping the country's finances secure and safe and managed in a fiscally responsible way, despite the considerable financial impact the pandemic could have had.

As Minister for Finance and Economic Development, Mr McTaggart, who is the MP for George Town East, has led the country's finances for the past four years, having served as Councillor to the Ministry of Health before that, following his

retirement as Managing Partner of KPMG Cayman Islands.

Up until the pandemic, Cayman's finances were going well, with debt being paid, no new taxes introduced and wise spending, he stated.

"We did that right up until the pandemic, when everything went into disarray," he said.

Government then saw a huge upswing in additional demands in order to assist people who were displaced and out of work and who, he said, were "in quite dire need" of assistance from the Government. The Government was then forced to repurpose considerable amounts of funding, as a result.

"Just through the end of last year we had spent more than CI\$65 million on Covid-related expenditures, a good portion of that was for tourism displaced workers," Mr McTaggart said. "But we still continued to manage the affairs of the country well to see it through the crisis and at the end of the year they ended up at a far better position than expected."



Right now, the country is in as good a place as it can be from a financial standpoint, Mr McTaggart said.

"We still have significant cash reserves and we are now benefitting from the period January to March when revenues from financial services and licensing of businesses, etc. are coming in. It's a very substantial sum, in excess of CI\$100 million this year for the first time. At our current rate of spending we think we have a safe cushion that will see us through most of the year," he said.

Of course, the economy needed to be continued to be carefully managed so that in a worst-case scenario Cayman was still able to assist those who were back at work and protect and support the most vulnerable among us, he said.

Mr McTaggart said it was clear what the immediate issue would be, should he be reelected.

"First and foremost, the focus for us will be on keeping our people safe, healthy and secure and so we plan to manage the reopening of the country to tourism in basically the same way as we have managed ourselves through the Covid crisis," he said. "We are treading in uncharted waters and we have not seen a country yet that has been completely successful in reopening, and so we will tread carefully learning from others what has worked and what has not."

Mr McTaggart said the Government would be led by the science and by the

medicine, and this stance had stood them well through the pandemic. Once the country opened up again and tourism started to return, the focus would be on getting people back to work and having them earn a productive wage as soon as they could.

"Then we will start to return the country's finances back to the stability that we had in the months leading up to the pandemic," Mr McTaggart stated. "That is going to take some time for us because I do not anticipate that once the borders reopen its going to return to normal; that's not going to happen."

Instead, he anticipated a gradual building of the process, with the primary focus being stayover tourism, with cruise tourism expected to return more slowly.

"There are indications that won't happen until 2022," he believed. "But stayover tourism is where Government gets a lot of its revenues. That's the most important element for us. There will be pent up demand for travel and it is hoped that with the vaccine rollouts in our source markets and here at home that there will be greater confidence in the safety to travel. I hope by the middle of the year we see tourism return to the country and people can return to work."

Malcolm Eden runs for election in Savannah

Malcolm Anthony Eden, son of Savannah MLA and former Minister of Health, Anthony Eden OBE, is following in his father's footsteps and running for election in the district of Savannah. On 6 March he held a public meeting in a Savannah public park, where between 50 and 100 people came to see why they should vote for him. His father, Anthony Eden introduced began by explaining why he had chosen not to contest the election this year:

"Together we have accomplished much...I have decided not to contest the upcoming election, because of my age, so I think It's time to turn it over to the younger ones," he said. "I am very pleased to introduce and endorse my eldest son, Malcolm, I feel that Malcolm is more than ready to take up the challenge of becoming your next Member of Parliament. Malcolm has worked in the Public Sector, as the former head of banking supervision at the Monetary Authority. His years of dedicated service to our islands include being past president of the Clifton Hunter High School PTA, and Past President of the Rotary Club of Grand Cayman," he said.

Malcolm Eden began by asking: "What makes a country great? In my view, it is actually our people. Its people like you, our concerned citizens, who come out to make your voices heard. Its our seamen, who went to sea to make a living for our families, and it's people like the mothers

who held the family unit together... those people that build the foundation of our islands.

"Savannah and the Cayman Islands are near and dear to my heart. I am passionate about my country and helping my people. As such I intend to make a real difference in this upcoming election. Cayman at the moment is at a crossroads and we have a generation who will be lost if immediate intervention is not made to strengthen the family unit. We also need to ensure that education is given priority and we need to address the high cost of living. I have always abided by certain core principles which include selflessness, integrity, objectivity accountability openness, honesty and leadership," Mr. Eden said.

Proposed local improvements to the Joanna Clarke Primary School included a larger school hall, improved canteen facilities, more classrooms and restrooms, more teachers including teachers for special needs children, a dedicated school nurse, an improved playground, more sporting facilities, access to technology for online learning, a generator, and more parking space. "I will also lobby for an upgrade of the track, with bathroom facilities and security making it more accessible in the evenings so that families can enjoy it," he said.

Mr. Eden also listed infrastructural improvements to Savannah including the expansion of the East-West Arterial road; installation of pedestrian crossings between countryside shopping village, Savannah Plaza and the Tall Tree. Other proposals included regular community events, to better utilize Pedro Castle and the Agriculture Grounds; enhancement of community parks in order to strengthen the family unit, and more community parks; additional public beaches; encouraging and supporting local farming; Increased police presence; more Neighbourhood Watch areas; creation of incentives for more businesses to be established in the district such as lower government fees and more marketing support.

National priorities included: "The establishment of an identity for our country when we emerge from covid; increased working relationships with the private sector and continued efforts to meet international regulatory standards to get Cayman off the FATF grey-list; and "an upgrade to Health Services Authority facilities and its service."

McCleary Frederick proposed a 10-year development plan and a District Council made up of constituents.

Traffic woes was a recurring theme among the three along with access to services, job opportunities and social issues among the top concerns.

Challenger Isaac Rankine said, "We have a major traffic problem in this country, and it affects East End more than affects almost any other district."

For him, the remote working triggered by the pandemic offered a solution alongside a reliable public transportation system with dedicated bus lanes.

But Mr McLean felt that some people "should not be allowed to drive their own private vehicles" and use public transport instead.

He also suggested a park-and-ride system in George Town to compensate for the lack of parking spaces.

Mr Frederick proposed a transportation master plan as a way forward.

The competing candidates were broadly in agreement on the cost of living and decentralising some government and business operations from the capital to East End and other eastern districts.

Regarding education, especially comparing the achievements of public and



private school students, Mr Frederick lamented that "we keep changing the goalposts."

Mr McLean called for a balance between schools' responsibility and parental involvement" and he was concerned that technocrats were encroaching into the role of teachers.

Mr Rankine said the education budget is adequate and suggested that "what we need to do is use those resources properly."

Strong views were expressed on a question about large undeveloped tracts of land in East End.

Mr McLean rejected that pointing out that "60 to 80 per cent of the agricul-

tural products that we sell in Georgetown comes from East End and North Side." And he felt any development in the area should be sustainable.

Mr Rankine was adamant that the people of the district should be involved in any development planning.

The three candidates criticised insurance companies for "cherry-picking clients" especially for health coverage with McLean and Rankine opting for universal or national health insurance scheme respectively.

There was also agreement on the need for affordable housing especially for young Caymanians, while suggestions of popula-

tion growth to 100,000 were dismissed as impractical and risked marginalising Caymanians.

The three East End candidates felt that opening the economy should be done cautiously, with land-based tourism prioritised over cruises, and all strongly defended the financial services sector.

And on the divisive issue of the Civil Partnership law, the three candidates said they respected other people's sexuality. Mr Mclean who had voted against the original bill said his opposition to it "was on the method in which it was done."

The forums continue with the candidates for North Side next.

THE FIGHT FOR NORTH SIDE

North Side was the focus of Round Two of the Candidate Forums organised for the 2021 elections by the Cayman Islands Chamber of Commerce.

Incumbent Ezzard Miller lined up against challengers Debra Broderick, Justin Ebanks and Jay Ebanks.

Mr Miller had to defend his longstanding stewardship as several areas in need of improvement were highlighted by his opponents ranging from wealth creation including jobs, setting up a local market, and care and support for the districts elderly. Substance abuse was also a matter of concern.

On the wider national agenda, job creation, healthcare, the cost of living and the perennial traffic woes were key issues.

Debra Broderick wants the \$6 per hour minimum wage increased saying it was "not feasible to live on in this country."

Education, cost of living and healthcare topped the national agenda for candidate Jay Ebanks who proposed a Consumer Protection Board and advocated for a universal health care system.

Education was the priority for Justin Ebanks, a point he emphasised vigorously throughout the discussion across several other topics.

"You do not have jobs or entrepreneurship, or anything else without education," he stated.

But for the North Side incumbent Ezzard Miller, corruption is "the most serious national issue" along with opportunities for nationals to progress in the job

market, better access to health care, and "sorting of the health insurance morass that exists."

On the choice of ministries, pharmacist Mr Miller opted for health and argued that ministers should bring some relevant experience into their portfolios.

Jay Ebanks: "It would be housing planning infrastructure and agriculture because that's all in my background."

Education would be the choice for Justin Ebanks while Debra Broderick chose the Community Affairs portfolio.

The long-planned 'Go-East' strategy for selected government and business services in North Side and other eastern areas was again put on the agenda.

The theme of education saw Mr Miller rebuffing comparisons between private and public schools.

Jay Ebanks and Debra Broderick agreed on a trade school, while warming to the subject Justin Ebanks voiced concerns over the worrying level of poor performance of some children saying "it's unacceptable in a country with this much wealth."

He also proposed that education should be free from kindergarten to college.

All four condemned discrimination regarding the controversial same-sex Civil Partnership law.

On being part of a government, the four independent candidates said they are open to coalition alliances but Mr Miller insisted that he would "not compromise his integrity just be in government."



The PPM-led government was criticised for allowing personal pension withdrawals as a means of cushioning the financial impact of the pandemic.

Debra Broderick suggested that contributions should now be increased to cover the gap, Ezzard Miller called for a national pension plan, while Jay Ebanks felt investing pension funds locally would yield better returns.

Justin Ebanks concluded that while the pension withdrawals "kept the economy afloat", the entire system should be changed.

Caution was advised on reopening the economy.

"Putting together a timeline on what we want to reopen will be key to success," Justin Ebanks said, a point echoed by Debra Brodericks who said: "We need to ensure

safety measures remain in place as we gradually open."

Mr Miller said luck has been on Cayman's side. "We have been very, very lucky in this country," he said noting that the vaccination programme was key to eventually reopening the economy.

For Jay Ebanks at least 75% of the population vaccinated was a target along to open the borders "starting with at least 10 to 15% of the hotels."

There was broad agreement on protecting the environment with the dump being a primary concern along with the pressures brought by over-population and over-development.

The North Side also said a process to recall parliamentarians and ministers who had breached official codes of conduct should be put in place.



HSA offers free health screenings and consultations to kidney disease patients and public

The Health Services Authority (HSA) will be offering free health screenings and consultations with its physicians and die-

ticians to mark the annual observance of World Kidney Day. The public event will take place Thursday, 11 March 2021 7am

- 12:30pm in the Cayman Islands Hospital Atrium.

The health screenings will include weight, height, total cholesterol, glucose levels, HbA1C (for those with high glucose levels) and blood pressure checks.

This year's theme, "Living Well with Kidney Disease" aims to both increase education and awareness about effective symptom management and patient empowerment among those affected by kidney disease, with the goal of encouraging life participation.


"This event is beneficial to those who have been diagnosed with kidney disease just as much as it is to persons attending for preventative purposes," advised Dialysis Unit Nurse Manager Erlin McLeod. "The physicians and dietitians available will discuss with you, your care-partners or family members specific ways to become meaningfully involved in the management and treatment of your disease.

"They can discuss more effective and more integrated and holistic symptom management for kidney disease beyond traditional kidney therapies including ef-

fective strategies to identify and manage symptoms that cause suffering including pain, sleep issues, anxiety, depression, stress, mobility, frailty, and others," she explained. "You can also ask for more education and management strategies to alleviate these symptoms so that you and your care-partners can have a better health-related quality of life."

The International Society of Nephrology (ISN) and the International Federation of Kidney Foundations (IFKF), founders of the global campaign, states that whilst effective measures to prevent kidney disease and its progression are important, patients with kidney disease - including those who depend on dialysis and transplantation - and their care-partners should also feel supported, especially during pandemics and other challenging periods, by the concerted efforts of kidney care communities.



REDUCING OVERSEAS ROUTING OF LOCAL INTERNET TRAFFIC



The Cayman Islands Utility Regulation and Competition Office (OfReg) reports that it's pressing ahead with plans for the jurisdiction to have more control over how local internet traffic is routed.

At present, local internet traffic first goes via a third-party network or switching centre overseas before it then returns to Cayman and is delivered to the intended local user.

According to OfReg, placing such data on third-party networks in theory increases the cost of delivering service and also could make the traffic/data vulnerable and susceptible to interception.

The agency advises that it is vital that Cayman regulates the terms and conditions under which infrastructure and services are provided through the use

of what's known as 'PeeringPoints' or 'IXPs.

Not to be confused with ISPs (Internet Service Providers) which are the companies providing internet service, IXPs and Peering Points are critical pieces of internet technology involving the physical locations where different networks connect and how internet traffic is routed.

Consultation has been carried out to get feedback and input into a range of aspects of technology including regulations and cost implications.

OfReg says having this service based and processed in Cayman would be to the advantage of the jurisdiction in many respects including a Cabinet directive to ensure local internet communication remains onshore, and the Government's overall vision for innovation and development of the ICT sector.

Malike Cummings, CEO at OfReg, says, "This should generate cost savings for the local internet service provision, resiliency and improved internet performance for customers."

According to the agency, the peering system and the use of IXPs "through balanced regulation, encourages secure and efficient use of infrastructure and increases the attractiveness of the local digital ecosystem in support of facilitating investment, innovation, and development for the country."



Sonji Myles, (Acting) Executive Director of ICT at OfReg states:

"We intend to promote public awareness of the contributions that peering and IXPs can make to the development of the Cayman Islands' Internet and its digital economy. The presence of IXPs is likely to reduce local dependence on digital infrastructure and enterprises outside of the jurisdiction."

CEO Cummings further states that: "OfReg is committed to exploring and implementing appropriate regulatory frameworks to promote and enable growth and development in the ICT sector and all sectors under our purview, being cognisant especially in this case, to make provisions for technological innovation in today's ICT converged world."

CELEBRATING CAYMAN WRITERS, WRITINGS, & THE ARTS

Nasaria Suckoo Chollette: Songs of NCFA Innocence. Part One

Her very name is poetry. Her very name is art. I first met this name when my then 5-year-olds came home from Kindergarten, excited to say their first poem at the National Cultural Festival of the Arts (NCFA). "Say your poems for me", I encouraged, and they said the title easily enough, then added, "by Natharia Thuckoo Chollay". They spent a few hours learning the poems, but days learning the poet's name.

Nasaria Suckoo Chollette grew up right here in Cayman, studied at Howard University, then returned home to fill various roles - at the National Museum and NCVO, for example. However, it is her 17 years of teaching Theatre in high school that Chollette speaks of with passion. When she could not find Caymanian works for her classes, she wrote skits so her students could perform using language and expressions that were authentically theirs. Later as she assisted with the NCFA syllabus, she again noticed that students were being asked to study a lot of European men's works, so she again wrote poems for NCFA's use. According to Chollette, "I wrote because I wanted Cayman's kids to access our culture and history. I wanted them to access our writings at a young age. I turned to other writers, and for each of

the poems on the NCFA syllabus, I stated where the poets were from so that the kids could relate".

If you have studied the Romantic poets, you might be familiar with William Blake, celebrated for ushering in Pre-Romanti-

cism. I think of Blake's *Songs of Innocence and of Experience* as I read Chollette's poems. Heavily influenced by both the Industrial and French Revolutions in the latter half of the 1700s, Blake wrote his *Innocence* poems before the revolutions, and his *Experience* poems during. He wrote them to show "the two contrary states of the human soul". Chollette's poems show her two sides. She presents 'experienced', thought-provoking, mature ideas that target the Cayman adult; on the other side are 'innocent' poems, written for the Cayman child.

NCFA Poems

Blake's *Songs of Innocence* poems are rhythmic, childlike, imaginative, curious and questioning, creating a gentle world of childlike innocence. Chollette's poems for NCFA similarly focus on the innocent child. She highlights how cheeky they are in "The Switching", where "Kendrick stole my Christmas present...He stole my Molly Dolly/And pulled off her dolly head". She celebrates their dreams as seen in her poem of heroism where the persona says,

I'd like to be a hero
And live at Heroes' Square
I bought my cape and mask
And my flying underwear

She captures the urgency to be big, and the disgust of adults often felt by the "Little Person" who asks, "Why is it that Grown-ups don't trust us? And treat us like we have no brains ... I didn't spill ink on the floor ... I don't need you to bathe me anymore". And, she encourages the development of a lively imagination in "Fairy Tales" where we meet "Big Bad Wolf and his moods ... those silly old pigs who told a lie ... little Bo Peep, who lost her sheep ... that egg that fell". Space does not allow a detailed critique of her works, where Chollette in "Fairy Tales" rewrites "the stories they told", so that her Big Bad Wolf "was not a meany at all/He just wanted to play"; where "Little Bo peep was naughty and rude ... lazy and odd ... She was quite a slob"; and the story of Humpty Dumpty who "got hushed ... [because] ... he didn't fall, he was pushed". I can't but wonder whether there are bigger messages and commentaries here about Cayman and the Caribbean. When Chollette said, 'the stories they told', who exactly are 'they'? Why is the egg silenced? Who did the pushing? What is the Big Bad Wolf symbolic of? Could Chollette be asking bigger questions behind the façade of innocence?

Influences

Chollette's rewriting of fairytales is suggestive of what Jean Rhys does in *Wide Sargasso Sea* when she tells the story of the one-dimensional Caribbean woman in the attic in Charlotte Bronte's *Jane Eyre*, and the reverse "Miss Lou" speaks of in her poem, "Colonisation in Reverse", showing that this Cayman poet's work is comparable to some leading writers in British and Caribbean literature.

Chollette admits being influenced by several writers like Jamaican poet, "Ms Lou", who Chollette said "gave us permission to write how we speak". Also, Afro-Guyanese writer, John Agard, who writes poems based on common fairytales and confronts social issues and issues of identity through them. Maya Angelou's works "became a doorway to show me I don't have to write a particular way", and Jamaica's Mervyn Morris taught Chollette she does not need so much "connecting flesh" - it is okay to be minimal. Cayman's own Leonard Dilbert urges Chollette to dare to be different and provides a great support system. "His critiques are good for me", she says. "I feel safe with my works in his hands".

Cayman's cultural truths and rituals are seen in Chollette's poems which highlight experiences true to her childhood. Some poems honour Chollette's mom who she said, "told me some of her stories". Her works express "Caymanness" in the images she conjures and the expressions she uses. Illustratively, in "Avocado Fiend", Li'l Tommy who is "so hard of hearing" "ate Pear on bread and biscuit/He ate Pear with Bulla too ... and Pear with Caliloo"; The above-mentioned Kendrick "gets a switching/On his bum-bum" with a switch that "Granny [breaks] off ... From our Tamarind tree"; we meet "Teensy", the tiny Green Sea Turtle; and there are 'Caribbean' titles of poems that need no explanation - like "Hog Pen Blues" and "Duppy Hog".

In content and structure then, Chollette presents and celebrates what is authentically Cayman. This is seen even more in her 'experience' poems, but therein lies our discussion for next week's final article in this two-part series.

Indigo Bay – livable homes to love

The developers of Indigo Bay, one of a string of building projects currently taking place in Grand Harbour, allowed a sneak peek into their progress last weekend, with David Nelson, President of the developers, Charlton Group, taking guests on a tour of these ocean-front properties.

Twenty-nine apartments in total will be built, with 17 going up in the first phase. Phase one is about three months away

from completion, Mr Nelson confirmed, with one building having been dry-walled and about to have wood floors and the tiling installed shortly. Sizes vary, with three main configurations including a larger, 20-foot wide unit that is approximately 2,700 square feet and benefits from an expansive 400 square foot rooftop patio. They alternate with a smaller 18-foot unit that is 2,166 square foot which does not come with a rooftop patio. As far as availability is concerned, Mr Nelson said that they had a few units left.

Each unit is either three bedrooms or three bedrooms plus a den and comes complete with Jack and Jill bathrooms with designer tubs and built-in showers.

The Master suite is large enough to fit a king size bed and enjoys views over the South Sound.

“In most places with an apartment style unit you have a living room with the view and the bedroom looks at the parking lot. Not here,” Mrs Nelson said. Instead, owners will wake to expansive ocean views.

“It’s a great spot to watch the sun go down,” he confirmed. “We’re building livable homes as opposed to just an investment.”

Outside, units enjoy solar paneling that will generate 9.9KW of energy and those with roof top patios will come complete with outdoor kitchens that are comprised of a BBQ, fridge and sink, made from the

same wood as the dock that sits out from the coast line available exclusively for the enjoyment of owners. A hot tub with the skirt made from the same wood will complete the amenities on the sundeck.

While all amenities, fixtures and fittings are at a luxury level, one of the most exciting aspects of Indigo Bay units is the fact that all of the villas come with a Tesla power wall and two batteries as well as an EV car charging station in their individual parking spot. Electric cars made so much sense on a small island, Mr Nelson stated.

“We are still the only development on the island where every unit is wired with an outlet for electric cars,” he confirmed.

Cayman's swimmers set new records

Over 200 of Cayman's fastest swimmers took part in the Cayman National Swimming Championships (Nationals), Thursday 18 – Sunday 21 at the Camana Bay Aquatic Centre pool.

Organised annually by the Cayman Islands Aquatic Sports Association (CIASA), Nationals is the last meet at which eligible Junior Team swimmers can qualify, with the hope that they will be selected for the National Team which travels to the CARIFTA Swimming Championships. This year, COVID-19 has once again caused CARIFTA – scheduled for the Easter weekend in Barbados – to be postponed. This postponement did not slow Cayman's swimmers down. On the contrary 35 new records, both National* and CIASA records were set, some of which were records previously held by Cayman's former Olympians – Andrew Mackay and Shaune Fraser; and most experienced senior swimmers including Lauren Hew (Florida State University).

"The number of records set at Nationals this year is a sign of the strength of our competitive swim clubs," said Michael Lockwood, CIASA President. "Some of these records were set years ago. Will Sellars of Seven Mile Swimmers, broke a 19-year-old 100m backstroke record set by Andrew Mackay, swimming 1:00.22 in prelims and then dropping the record again to 59:81 in finals."

Some impressive numbers from Nationals include:

- 5 swimmers were unbeaten in all their events: Jake Bailey (Stingray Swim Club), Sierrah Broadbelt (Seven Mile Swimmers), Lev Fahy (Stingray Swim Club) Jordan Crooks (Unattached) and Kyra Rabess (Stingray Swim Club).

- 22 eligible swimmers qualified for the Junior Team.

- 35 new records were set – bearing in mind that when a Caymanian sets a CIASA record it also counts as a National record.

- Over 150 volunteer hours invested in Cayman's young swimmers.

Nationals, the largest meet held locally in Cayman each year, would not be possible without the hundreds of volunteer hours which come from the officials, parents who time, concessions stand workers, sound operators, and meet organisers.

Without officials on deck, swimmers would not gain the experience that only comes from swimming under the officials' watchful eye, and the technical requirements established by FINA – and their times would not be official. "A big thank you to Jacky Rowland of the CIASA Technical Committee and all of the officials who volunteered their time," said Duke Sullivan, Meet Director. "Our officials play a critical role in our swim meets and we encourage everyone that is interested in learning more about being an official to contact us at ciasaboard@gmail.com."

Sullivan continued, "2021 Nationals had so many great moments. And while

the records, comradery on deck between all the swimmers and amazing atmosphere were all highlights; an incredible ending was the 50m backstroke showdown at the end of the meet between Will Sellars and Andrew Mackay (CIASA treasurer and former Cayman Olympian). Will broke Andrew's 19-year-old 100m backstroke record. Andrew knew he might not last for a hundred meters but put in a respectful race in the 50m distance."

CIASA is the recognised national governing body of all Aquatic Sports (comprised of competitive swimming, open water swimming, diving, high diving, water polo and synchronised swimming) in the Cayman Islands and is an affiliated member of FINA, UANA, CCCAN, Island Games Association of the Cayman Islands, CARIFTA and the Cayman Islands Olympic Committee. The Commonwealth Parliamentary Association UK (CPA-UK) International Election Observer Mission will be unable to travel to the Cayman Islands for the General Election on Wednesday, 14 April due to COVID-19 related travel disruptions. They will instead be conducting a virtual mission by remotely engaging with stakeholders within the Cayman Islands.

The CPA-UK virtual observer mission will however be supplemented by a larger domestic team. The domestic observer mission will consist of nine members - five selected by the Governor; two by the Premier and two by the Leader of the Opposition.

"On the ground election observation is important for public reassurance, including on election day. This is an exceptional opportunity for anyone resident in the Cayman Islands to serve the community and help to ensure that the upcoming General Election has credible results and is conducted in a free and fair manner," said the Governor.

"We are looking for observers with diverse skills and experiences. They

Red Cross Appreciation Ceremony

The Deputy Governor, Franz Manderson attended the Cayman Islands Red Cross (CIRC) appreciation ceremony on Thursday, 25 February to personally thank volunteers for their hard work and dedication in 2020.

The Deputy Governor who chairs the National Emergency Operations Centre in which CIRC plays a critical role thanked the team for their support throughout 2020 at the event. Expanding on his remarks Mr Manderson: "The Red Cross is an integral part of our response to any crisis because of the closeness of its ties with the community. We could not mount an effective response without them."

Ninety-one CIRC volunteers and 134 COVID-19 national volunteers were recognised for their contribution across a number of emergency responses in the Cayman Islands.

Jondo Obi, Director of the CIRC, stated "The year 2020 was unprecedented, the CIRC assisted the National Emergency Operations Centre in a number of crisis responses. These ranged from the 7.7 magnitude earthquake in January, landfill fire in February and COVID-19 related activities from March onwards. This is on top of the day to day projects the volunteers complete for the thrift shop and event first aid coverage."

The category of awards demonstrated the breath of community work completed by the organisation and included the following.

- Child Protection Programme which recognised the children for their voices in the COVID-19 hygiene handwashing video.
- Mobile Health & Wellness Community Project (in partnership with the Health Services Authority and private mental health practitioners).



- Shelter managers in recognition of the four times CIRC shelters were opened last year in response to the earthquake, landfill fire, Hurricane Eta and Tropical Storm Iota.

- Supporting government-managed quarantine centres for returning travelers.

- Administrative and logistical support for the Health Services Authority (HSA) COVID-19 testing centres.

- Collecting laptops for children to compete online schooling.

- Thrift Shop Programme.

- First aid coverage at events and first aid instructors.

- CIRC admin support including finance and the 60th Anniversary Committee.

UK TERRITORIES CONNECTION

ANGUILLA: VACCINE PASSPORT ON THE CARDS

A vaccine passport is set to become a requirement for travel between the British Overseas Territory of Anguilla and the joint Dutch and French Overseas European Territory of St Maarten/St Martin.

Historically the two neighbouring islands have had strong connections for trade, tourism and family ties linked by airline and popular local ferry services operating mainly out of Anguilla.

However, traffic across the channel that separates them has been severely reduced due to COVID restrictions.

Now, with the EU introducing vaccine passports, it appears highly likely that this would soon be a requirement for travel between the neighbouring islands.

Anguilla's Tourism Minister Hadyn Hughes, notes this is the world that's evolving post-COVID.

"There are certain global regulations and norms that we have to conform to," he said in a government press conference this week.

"When it comes to international travel, we don't make the rules, we follow the rules."

Anguilla is just one of two British territories in the Caribbean impacted by Brexit that shares next door maritime borders with an EU territory.

The other is Montserrat located just north of the French territory of Guadeloupe.

BVI BUSINESSES PROTEST DELAY IN OPENING SEAPORTS

The main business organisation in the British Virgin Islands say their prospects for recovery has again been setback after the government has further delayed the reopening of the seaports.

They will now be opened next month, the second delay from the previous schedule last December.

The BVI Chamber of Commerce and Hotel Association (BVICCHA) says it's disappointed and that "the tourism sector is on life support".



"The seaports are the main point of destination access into the Virgin Islands and a further delay to April 2021 at the end of the regular tourism season is another blow to an already fragile situation," the organisation said in a statement.

It further states that "this would mean that for the second year in a row, the accommodations and food services sector, which accounted for over \$80 million in economic activity in 2016, has suffered another major disruption that could result in permanent business closures."



BRITISH SOCIETY ROCKED BY ROYAL RACISM ALLEGATIONS

British society has been sent into a tailspin following damning claims in an interview in America this week by the Duke and Duchess of Sussex, Britain's Prince Harry, and his American wife Meghan Markle.

Their shocking revelations about what they claim was their torrid time in the royal household came in a two-hour interview - a global media event in its own right - with American television host Oprah Winfrey.

It prompted a rare response from Buckingham Palace on behalf of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in response to the allegations, especially of racism, made by the couple.

After wide speculation of how the Palace might respond, or if at all, a statement came late on Tuesday afternoon following the airing of the interview in the UK on Monday night. (It was first broadcast in the United States to

a record-breaking audience on Sunday evening).

The Palace statement said: "The whole family is saddened to learn the full extent of how challenging the last few years have been for Harry and Meghan.

"The issues raised, particularly that of race, are concerning. Whilst some recollections may vary, they are taken very seriously and will be addressed by the family privately.

"Harry, Meghan and Archie will always be much loved family members."

That has triggered another wave of speculation especially over one sentence in the very carefully worded statement which says: "Whilst some recollections may vary, they are taken very seriously and will be addressed by the family privately."

It is widely interpreted as a subtle challenge to some of the claims made by the couple in their tell-all disclosure with Oprah Winfrey - in which it appears that much was still left unsaid or

edited from the original recording.

Among the more startling disclosures was a claim by the African-American Duchess that while she was pregnant with their son Archie, there were "concerns and conversations about how dark his skin might be when he's born" by unnamed members of the royal family.

Meghan Markle also said that she'd had suicidal thoughts and felt that her concerns were not taken seriously by her in-laws and staff at the Palace.

Prince Harry spoke of strained relations between him and some members of the Royal Family, especially his father Prince Charles, his brother Prince William and even extending to the Queen to a lesser degree.

The continuing probing analysis in the wake of both the interview and the reaction of the Palace has put not just the Royal Family but British society under the microscope, particularly over the racism allegations.



Reaction has been immediate, extensive and varied with opinions are divided. And it's all being played out in the full glare of national and international attention - and curiosity - to see how the Royal family and British society emerge from this.

Sharing centre-stage in this still-unfolding drama, is the British press; and not only for its reporting of the events swirling around the royal household and the national discourse emanating from the issues raised.

Prince Harry and his wife hold parts of the press responsible for the current state of affairs, accus-

BERMUDA PLANS POST-COVID ECONOMIC RECOVERY

The Bermuda government is putting in place a task force to guide economic recovery out of the pandemic.

Making the announcement in the House of Assembly, Premier David Burt said, it was work that could not wait.

The task force will comprise public and private sector experts to devise the recovery strategy.

A 30-point plan is already being developed with an outline of the priority areas to be presented on March 16th targeting key sectors of the economy and society.

What is being touted as a National Recovery Plan is expected to propose a number of initiatives and new policies.

These are said to include lowering interest rates to facilitate affordable housing, universal healthcare, and creating what have been described as 'economic empowerment zones'.

A few hours later it was confirmed that he had left the role permanently.

The fall-out continues.
