

NEEDED: A ROADMAP FOR REOPENING

According to many economists, global economies are poised for another seismic shift coming out of COVID-19 lockdown that could be as traumatically far-reaching as the downward spiral triggered by the pandemic.

Governments are already being warned that the projected 'V-shaped' recovery - a rapid recovery following a steep decline - could spark an out-of-control inflationary firestorm with equally far-reaching economic and social consequences.

How and when to reopen is a very winding road on the path to recovery.

And like our main article in this edition, that winding road, if not carefully and cautiously navigated could end up at a very 'un-merry-go-round' where we end up just fiddling around the edges of the key issues while the burning challenges are


left untouched. Invariably and inevitably forming a path of their own.

Such is the case we are now witnessing with the choking bottleneck and Hurley's Roundabout, a metaphor of sorts deadlock between gridlock and growth.

How to recover the economy, what shape will it take, how to rebalance the economy while at the same time learning to live with the clear and present danger of Covid?

As was the case with its predecessors, and is the case with governments around the world, the current Cayman Islands government is forced to walk the tight-rope of a veritable balance of lives over livelihoods.

No doubt this will occupy the mind and much of the time of the government when the budget is presented in the coming weeks.



No one expert or entity has all the answers to the many questions confronting Cayman as we look at reopening.

It's going to take all hands-on deck if we are to avoid the calamitous gridlock where economic recovery, planned 'developments' - some already in the pipeline - and our very way of life are faced with the biggest challenge we've experienced in recent memory.

On that HE Governor Martyn Roper and Hon. Premier Wayne Panton are both right.

Coming out of lockdown - despite the acknowledged success of the management then by the previous government - is a bigger challenge than going in. And they were only talking about the public health safety aspect.

If ever Cayman needed a long-term plan, it is now. Fortunately, there is a Cayman National Development Plan not quite gathering dust on a shelf or computer file somewhere in government.

It is time to literally and figuratively dust it off. It's needed now more than ever before...and it was urgently needed back then.

It is time for us all to plan the road to reopen Cayman; public sector, private sector and all citizens to have their say and make their input to the reopening road map.

It's not the time to cast blame or claim fame. It is the time for all to step and take responsibility for how we as a society move forward.

The risk and price of being stuck in a reopening roundabout gridlock is too dire to contemplate.

RCIPS PROMOTES ROAD SAFETY WITH OPERATION QUAKER

A spate of traffic accidents last weekend has underlined the need for police to intensify their educational campaigns and enforcement measures.

24 motor-vehicle collisions were recorded last weekend alone, including a collision with serious injuries.

The Royal Cayman Islands Police Service (RCIPS) says under its Operation Quaker, drivers can expect to see more high visibility patrols and vehicle checkpoints especially targeting speeding and drunk driving.

DUI(driving under the influence/drunken driving) and speeding remain the main focus in the ongoing campaign.

"We hope that through our continued educational campaigns and enforcement operations, we will see fundamental changes in driving behaviour across the Cayman Islands," says Chief Inspector Kay, "With the preservation of life being our primary focus, we will continue to persist in our road safety efforts, thus 'Making the Cayman Islands Safer.'"

The RCIPS reports that its joint operations with the National Roads Authority this past weekend included road safety messages in various key locations on their digital billboards across the Cayman Islands.

Traffic enforcement efforts resulted in officers arresting 11 persons for driving under the influence of alcohol and issuing over 50 traffic tickets, the majority of which were for speeding.

Cayman Brac and Little Cayman also came on-board with the operation, increased their enforcements, resulting in a number of prosecutions.

Despite these efforts however, the RCIPS says there were 24 motor-vehicle collisions recorded over the weekend, including one collision with serious injuries.

At about 2:45AM on Sunday, 20 June, officers responded to a report of a collision at the intersection of Shamrock Road and Beach Bay Road where a silver Honda Accord wagon had left the roadway and collided with a tree. Emergency services attended the location and both occupants of the vehicle were transported to the Cayman Islands Hospital to be treated for what appear to be serious but non-life-threatening injuries. They remain in hospital in stable condition.

"Collisions like this are the reason we will not be letting up on our Operation Quaker activities anytime soon," says Inspector Dwayne Jones.



"While we are pleased with the enforcement results this past weekend, we want the public to remember that even a single

instance of poor driving behaviour can lead to tragedy. As always, we ask the public to do their part and drive safely."

HURLEY'S ROUNDABOUT: DEVELOPMENT vs GRIDLOCK

The way things are going - or not going - traffic at the notorious Hurley's Roundabout will soon grind to halt, quite literally, unless something radical is done before the already over-congested intersection becomes deadlocked in gridlock.

It's arguable that the modelling at the time of construction of the otherwise well-intentioned roundabout, could not have anticipated the rapid expansion of commercial and residential developments plus the explosion of traffic at that critical junction.


The fact is, we are at a critical juncture regarding the future of Hurley's Roundabout...and in Cayman's growth.

These new developments will attract their own traffic flow - a sign of their success - but will unwittingly contribute to the strangulating gridlock. A victim of their own success?

Hurley's Roundabout has become a metaphor for the challenges facing Cayman as it navigates its future development strategy and trajectory.

Not only is it a hurdle for the National Roads Authority (NRA) and the traffic po-

lice, it's equally a nightmare for the drivers who hardly have any alternative but to be the hapless victims of its almost permanent state of gridlock.

Realistic long-term (very long term) planning is urgently required for the future of Hurley's and the myriad other 'unmerry-go-round' roundabouts that are popping up like polka dots - or pockmarks - on the Cayman landscape.

More is not always better. In the case of Cayman, more simply seems to attract more of the same.

Despite the lofty ideals espoused again in the most recent election campaign, restricting car imports will be a very hard sell, even with very restrictive import duties. Striking the balance between the car as a transport necessity and a status symbol while selling the concept of quality public transportation is easier said than done.

It calls for a change of mindset and an aspirational readjustment. Not easy considering the modern norms by which aspiration is perceived. And for good measure,

we could toss in the pandemic-induced reality of 'social distancing'.

But even before we get too bogged down in the social science theory of the car as a status symbol in a society that's an exemplar of all that good (and not-so-good) about capitalism, there's a more pressing reality that's demanding practical solutions now.


That too is rooted in capitalism. It's the previously mentioned rapid expansion of residential and commercial developments surrounding Hurley's Roundabout.

The question is; how to get around, over, or perhaps under it?

The solution lies somewhere in that spaghetti soup traffic conundrum.

One thing is certain though; a spaghetti junction is not the way out. Traffic will most probably choke in it.

Our concern is that at the current pace of patching up and adding and subtracting lanes, rapidly developing Cayman - pandemic notwithstanding - will be stuck in the slow traffic lane with gridlock dead ahead...and no place to park.



Appointment of Magistrate

"Magistrates in the Summary Court preside over a wide range of civil and criminal matters including in extremely specialist courts such as the Drug Rehabilitation Court" His Excellency the

Governor Martyn Roper, OBE said. "I am pleased to appoint Ms. Allard as a full-time Magistrate given the generalist experience she has gained during her legal and acting judicial career to date" His Excellency continued.

"Ms. Allard has contributed significantly to the Summary Courts since she was appointed as an Acting Magistrate in June 2020" the Honourable Chief Justice said. "We look forward to formally welcoming Ms. Allard as a full-time member of the judiciary in due course and to her role in the positive growth of the Summary Court under the leadership of Chief Magistrate Foldats" the Chief Justice continued.

Ms. Allard will take up her full-time post on new appointment on 12 July 2021.

Mega walk for women planned

Former Cayman Islands Crisis Centre Chair and board member Denise Powers is aiming to raise funds and increase awareness for the empowerment of women through an impressive walk early next year, undertaking the massive Pacific Crest Trail in America.

At the start of March 2022, Denise will commence her mission at a spot close to the wall between Mexico and the United States at Campo, California. She said she will be armed with just "a good pair of trail runners, a map and a backpack of survival gear", and will hike through California's backcountry desert, the Sierras, and the Cascade Mountains of Oregon and Washington, ending in Manning Park, British Columbia, Canada, a 2,650 miles trail in total.

The hike marks the first in a series of challenges for Denise, which she has named 'Project Further' and which, she anticipates, will build awareness and raise funds for the empowerment of women. Funds will go towards issues such as working towards reducing domestic violence, sexual assault, sex trafficking, workplace inequality and the under-representation of female entrepreneurs.

Denise said she was inspired to take on this huge challenge after meeting Cheryl

Strayed, author of best-selling account of her own Pacific Crest Trail hike, Wild, who she met at the Power of the Purse fundraiser in 2016. After that meeting, Denise hiked three Washington sections (268 miles) of the PCT.

"It was an experience both incredibly demanding on the mind and body but also highly compelling in terms of the challenge, the amazing views, the connection with nature and the people she met along the way," she stated.

Along the hike in March 2022, Denise will be accompanied by her friend Monica, who she met on the PCT in 2016. The women intend to walk 15 to 20 miles a day, taking a few side trips and periodic non-hiking days, she advised, while sleeping in a tent and "the occasional real bed". Food for five to seven days will have to be carried between pre-planned supply stops. As for showering, the freezing lash of a waterfall may be the only option in between pockets of civilisation, she said. The women aim to reach Canada by mid-September 2022 before the snow.

Denise said that while Project Further will launch in the Cayman Islands, it will hopefully continue to grow into further markets, raising funds for specific projects and raising awareness about the issues



and working to create a violence-free and empowered environment for all women.

"The goal of the PCT project is to raise US\$1 million to build a new facility for the Cayman Islands Crisis Centre, Cayman's only women's safe shelter," she said. "The existing centre is a four-bedroom, one-bathroom house, that often accommodates more women and children than its 18-person capacity. While the shelter is homey and safe, it is too small to meet the demands placed upon it."

One hundred per cent of the funds raised in this project will go to the CICC for the new shelter, she confirmed.

Registration for Tourism Stipend Re-opens

Hon Kenneth Bryan, Minister for Tourism has today announced that registration for the tourism stipend will be re-opened to give displaced tourism workers who missed the previous registration deadline a chance to apply.

The tourism stipend application form will be available online at stipend.ourcayman.ky from 9am on Wednesday 23rd June. The registration period closes at 5pm on Tuesday 29th June, 2021.

To qualify for the stipend, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Must be Caymanian, Permanent Resident or married to a Caymanian with an Employment
- Rights Certificate (RERC),
- Must have worked in the Tourism sector,
- Must not have applied for the stipend previously.

• **NOTE:** Persons who are already receiving the stipend should not reapply.

When completing the online form, all applicants will need to provide the following documents / information:

- A copy of your Cayman Islands Voter Registration Card, Caymanian Status Certificate OR Right to be Caymanian Certificate,
- A copy of your last pay slip or official job letter,
- Former Manager's name, email, and phone number,
- A bank letter verifying your full bank account name and account number OR a copy of a stamped bank deposit slip clearly showing your name and account number is also acceptable.

The Ministry of Tourism is currently assisting more than 3,000 displaced tourism workers through the stipend programme, at a cost to government of over \$5M per

month," said Minister Bryan. "Tourism workers have been severely impacted by the closure of our borders and many have no other means of income besides the stipend. Reopening registration will give persons who missed the previous registration periods another opportunity to apply, to help them bridge the gap till our borders open and tourism can resume."

All applications will be verified and applicants are asked to respond to missed calls, voicemails, and emails from the Ministry or Department of Tourism. This will help to avoid delays during the verification process.

Anyone with questions about the programme, or requires assistance completing the online application form can contact the call centre on 949-0623 between 9:00am and 5:00pm Monday to Friday during the registration period.

the setting himself when he said, "This is a great evening and what it is about is doing what it takes so that we can open our borders to provide our amazing Cayman-Kind that we offer; so it was wonderful to have it at a CaymanKind location."

Dr. John Lee expressed his satisfaction with the way that the vaccination drive had gone, and called the event "A celebration of success for the vaccination program in Cayman so far." He continued, "I thank everyone for taking part, whether it be by contributing prizes, or coming forward to get vaccinated. Now the next stage will take us that final mile. We need everyone to go the further distance so that we can have the confidence to securely open our borders."

Minister Bryan added further support to Dr. Lee's sentiment. "With respect to keeping our country safe when we open our borders, this vaccine challenge did a lot for that." He also addressed one concern that some persons had with the challenge. "I know that a lot of people who had gotten the vaccine from the first chance available have expressed that they feel like they were forgotten with this prize draw. 
Ms Claudia Brady, DCI's Head of Compliance and Enforcement, will offer attendees insights into to the way the industry

HSA staff isolating after treating COVID-19 patient

What the Health Services Authority (HSA) described as "a small number of staff" have been isolated due to potential exposure to a COVID-19 positive patient at the hospital said to be "highly symptomatic".

The statement on Tuesday by HSA CEO, Lizzette Yearwood did not state the number of staff, but said the HSA was "acting out of an abundance of caution".

"It is our top priority to keep our patients and staff safe" the statement said, adding that "anyone potentially exposed directly or indirectly has been placed in isolation."

The HSA CEO said the staff members who have been directed to isolate will be monitored and tested following standard Public Health protocol.

In an update on Monday, Chief Medical Officer, Dr John Lee, reported that "a traveller toward the end of the 14-day quarantine

has been admitted to the Critical Care Unit at the Cayman Islands Hospital suffering from symptoms attributed to COVID-19 disease."

The person was said to be in a stable condition.

It has been suggested that the person might not have been vaccinated given that the CMO's report said they were "toward the end of the 14-day quarantine", which is a requirement for travellers who are not vaccinated.

New quarantine regulations come into effect this Wednesday (June 23rd) reducing the mandatory quarantine to five days for verifiably vaccinated incoming travellers alongside the reinstatement of 72-hour pre-arrival PCR testing; and the removal of mandatory sampling and PCR testing on arrival.

All travellers must be tested before exiting quarantine, and un-vaccinated travellers will have to complete a 14-day quarantine period.



Several questions have been raised regarding the circumstances surrounding the "highly symptomatic" patient who is being treated in ICU.

Among them is; where was the patient in quarantine and if any other persons

other than the HSA might have been exposed.

It was also not immediately clear which strain of the virus the patient is infected with.

Further official updates are awaited.

Free HIV tests to celebrate HIV Testing Week 2021

The Health Services Authority (HSA) and the Cayman Islands Red Cross will once again join forces in coordinating free HIV testing to mark HIV Testing Week which will be observed in the Cayman Islands from June 21st-25th.

“Although the COVID-19 pandemic may have set the world back in the fight against ending AIDS by 2030, the AIDS crisis taught us how to handle COVID-19 and many medical experts compared the two pandemics,” said HIV and STI Programme Coordinator Laura Elniski. “The COVID crisis could see an HIV resurgent, therefore we urge persons to come out and take advantage of the free and confidential HIV testing. The COVID-19 pandemic can also shape the future HIV and AIDS response in the Caribbean and impact our move towards reaching the goal of ending HIV and AIDS by 2030.”

A recent UNAIDS report shows that countries with progressive laws and policies and strong and inclusive health systems have had the best outcomes against HIV. In those countries, people living with and affected by HIV are more likely to have access to effective HIV services, including HIV testing, pre-exposure prophylaxis (medicine to prevent HIV), harm reduction, multi-month supplies of HIV treatment and consistent, quality follow-up

and care. The Cayman Islands ensure to provide all the above.

The Cayman Islands join the rest of the world to focus attention on the importance of accelerating the response to HIV over the next five years to set the world on course to end the AIDS epidemic by 2030 as part of the Sustainable Development Goals.

Four decades after the first cases of AIDS were reported, it remains a major public health crisis and only a few countries meet the 90-90-90 UNAIDS target for 2020. At the end 2019, 77% of all people living with HIV in the Caribbean knew their status, 81% of diagnosed people were on treatment and 80% of those on antiretroviral therapy were virally suppressed. A survey conducted by PANCAP (Pan Caribbean Partnership Against HIV and AIDS) in the Caribbean showed that during 2020, facility- and community- based HIV testing services reduced by two-thirds (69%) in countries due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Therefore, HSA and the Cayman Islands Red Cross encourage the public to take advantage of the country’s HIV and AIDS support services and book an appointment to get tested by contacting Laura Elniski at laura.elniski@hsa.ky or 244-2507, or Health Promotion Officer Therese Preh at 244-2632.

HIV Testing week provides an opportunity to educate the public about prevention and protection against HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases as well as free testing to know one’s status. The testing procedure involves a quick and

simple blood test. Persons who are seeking testing or counselling can indicate to the registration clerks that they would like to register for free HIV testing. The results will be available in three working days or less and will be given to the patient only.

Marine Science and hopes to further her education at university next year.

She gave some background as to why she chose Travel & Tourism as one of her A-level choices.

"Having lived in the Cayman Islands all my life, I have always known about tourism and have first-hand experience of watching our islands evolve into a highly sought-after tourist destination," she said. "Therefore, the subject came naturally to me and as I learnt more about the principles and tactics used by tourist destinations globally, as well as locally, my passion for the subject grew."

son given and the wider implications for Cayman as a banking centre.

The client, a member of the Cayman Islands clergy, had complained to the bank over its decision to close the account held with the bank for 40 years.

In correspondence seen by Caymanian Times, the UK bank in question confirms that it had terminated relationships for clients resident in the Cayman Islands, saying its decision was made after reviewing the countries that it can provide banking services to.

"We have found that not all countries are viable considering increasing regulatory and legislation changes. We are no longer able to provide banking ser-

vices to clients resident in the Cayman Islands."

Stating that its June decision "will not be reconsidered" the bank, in which the British government is the major shareholder, advised the client to make alternative banking arrangements.

The aggrieved client has now referred the issue to the Cayman Islands government citing "the reputational damage the reason for this move will do to the Cayman Islands, rather than because of the personal inconvenience it will cause me."

"Accordingly, I'm sending you all this further email which has in it the address of the Channel Islands Financial Ombudsman, should this be of help in anything you may wish to do to mitigate the damage to the Cayman Islands that this new policy is

likely to cause," he said in an email to Hon. Finance Minister Chris Saunders, Hon. Attorney General Samuel Bulgin and the Cayman Islands Monetary Authority (CI-MA).

While the UK bank has included Cayman among countries it considered not viable considering increasing regulatory and legislation changes, it did not specify what the shortcomings are.

Cayman has been under pressure from EU regulators and the Financial Action Task Force and has passed a raft of legislation to meet their compliance demands.

Last October Cayman was removed from the EU's 'blacklist' of 'non-cooperative tax jurisdictions' which it was placed on nine months earlier in February.

However, pressure has persisted from EU and other sources which campaign against what they regard as 'tax-havens', a term rejected by Cayman officials as derogatory.

Cayman's offshore financial services sector, a key pillar that has been propping up the economy especially during the pandemic, was strongly defended against external pressure across the political spectrum during this year's election campaign.

It is not yet known what the government's response has been to the issues raised by the clergyman whose account was closed by the British bank for the reasons stated.

The UK government has over 50 per cent stake in the bank in question resulting from its intervention to save it during the 2008 financial crisis.

One of the most recognizable images in the U.S. is, "HOLLYWOOD," sign in California. People from all over the world come to, "Tinseltown," to gaze at the cement footprints of stars and perhaps catch a glimpse of celebrities who might pass by. It's hard for visitors to miss this.


