



Operation Quaker targets Sunday Brunches

Operation Quaker continues to target drunk driving and speeding island wide. Last weekend the focus was on Sunday brunch events and saw 54 speeding tickets issued and officers arresting 9 persons for driving under the influence. A further 27 traffic offenses were also prosecuted, the majority of which were for using a vehicle with expired registration.

"Sunday brunches are quickly becoming our busiest time of the weekend period, as many drivers take the risk of driving under the influence when returning from brunch activities. We strongly urge people to make a plan to get home after attending such events so that you don't risk your life or the life of others on the roads," says Inspector Dwayne Jones.

As Constitution weekend approaches, Officers will continue Operation Quaker efforts with an increased presence on the roads over the holiday weekend. The RCIPS is aware there are several major sporting events scheduled for the weekend including the UEFA Euro Cup matches and remind public that there will be increased police presence on the road's even at these times.

"Again, our focus will be on DUI and speeding as these driving behaviours continue to be the biggest risk on our roads when it comes to serious crashes

and fatalities. Thankfully, since commencing Operation Quaker we have not seen a fatality, and we ask drivers to drive safely so that we can keep it that way," says Chief Inspector Malcolm Kay.

CAYMAN INCHES TOWARDS VACCINATION TARGET

Cayman continues to edge towards the target of having 70 per cent of the population over 12 years old vaccinated.

Statistics from the Public Health Department earlier this week showed that 63 per cent of the revised population estimate of 71,100 (6,000 more than the often referenced 65,000) have completed the two-dose course.

Over 93,307 COVID-19 vaccinations have been administered of which 48,333 (68 per cent) had at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine and approximately 63% have completed the two-dose course.

Up to press time Cayman had reported a total of 614 cases since last year's outbreak of the pandemic with 596 people recovered from the infection.

One recent case in which a patient was hospitalised was reported this week as

having improved considerably and no longer requires the support of a ventilator.

Over 106,852 people have been tested as both testing and the vaccination campaign continue.

Only two deaths in Cayman have been directly attributed to the virus.

While 63 per cent of the population over 12 years old have been double-vaccinated the target is for between 70 per cent and 80 per cent before serious consideration are given to a phased reopening of the borders.

The PACT coalition government recently indicated a mid-September possibility to begin a phased reopening process for which details are still being worked out.

The government had rejected opposition calls for a September 1st reopening.

An intensified vaccination campaign is continuing.



Inaugural financial services event to bring industry experts and government officials together to focus on the jurisdiction's strategic outlook

Spectrum, a new financial services conference will be launching this year with a focus on the medium term outlook for the Cayman Islands financial services industry.

The inaugural event will be held on July 22nd 2021, in partnership with the Ministry of Financial Services. This year's Spectrum will feature key industry experts and senior government officials in a broad-based forum which will involve discussions surrounding the opportunities and challenges facing the sector as a whole.

The event is organized by local consulting firm FTS. "With our borders closed this first event will take the opportunity to focus inward and add value by assessing how we can make our financial services industry even stronger and more sustainable over the longer term", said Mr. Paul Byles, Director of FTS.

Newly elected Minister of Financial Services, the Hon. André Ebanks, who will be speaking at the event said, "The Spectrum conference is an ideal opportunity for senior industry stakeholders and public sector representatives to take stock and plan the future state of one of the key pillars

This year's Spectrum is aimed primarily at partners and management level staff within the financial services sector and presentations will cover the state of various sub sectors within the financial services industry as well as key policy issues such as the G7's proposed global tax initiative and the long term regulatory outlook

for the Cayman Islands. Panel discussions will zoom in on the challenges and opportunities facing investment funds, trusts, insurance, banking and other areas.

The One Step Closer campaign moves away from the illustrations used in the earlier campaigns and uses photography.



Captain, 'and a gentleman,' Rex Miller's last flight

It was a glorious Sunny Cayman morning, and all the captains, flight stewards and dignitaries had come to welcome Captain Rex Miller's final flight after more than four decades as a Cayman Airways pilot. They had all come because Mr. Miller is equally loved as respected, "A real Pilot's Pilot," said former colleague and friend, Kel Thompson. It was a sentiment shared by everyone. There was the customary water-cannon salute from two firetrucks, and then everyone waited patiently for the passengers on the flight from Cayman Brac to disembark. Captain Miller was the last one to walk down the ramp, but before he did so, he stood for a moment and took his captain's cap off, to honor all those who had come to greet him.

The very first person to shake hands with Captain Miller was the one who gave

him his very first job, Mr. Norman Bodden: "I would go to see Mr. Norman Bodden to ask for a job on the ramp during my summer breaks from school and any other school breaks, just to be able to be close to an airplane. Mr. Norman was then the Managing Director of Cayman Airways," Captain Miller said.

Premier, Hon Wayne Panton was next. The Premier spoke highly of the Captain: "He exuded confidence, and instilled confidence in passengers. People felt he was a very skilled pilot who always operated by the books - by the standards. He was always very quiet and unassuming but a real gentleman at the same time."

CAL employee Chris McCoy said. "I first met Rex in Little Cayman in 1983. I was a little kid, but I admired this man from then, until now. People admire him and

always speak so highly of him, he said, because people feel so comfortable knowing that he is up front there, in charge of the airplane. It's sad to see him go after all these years.

After working briefly with Mr. Linton Tibbetts' Red Carpet Airlines on the Britten-Norman Islander in Cayman Brac from September to December 1978, Mr. Miller was hired by Mr. Jim Boddin in January 1979 as First Officer on the DC-6 Cargo at Cayman Airways, at the age of 20. He was promoted to Captain on a 727 in January 1987.

Expressing his feelings after his last flight, Captain Miller said, "It's hard to

explain. This has been my passion for all of my life, but inevitably it had to come to an end at some point. So you mentally prepare for it." In a prepared statement he said, "I have truly been privileged to have been a part of my National Airline for 47 and a half years overall. And for 42 and a half years as a pilot. I am also honored to know that during my years in the Training Department and as a Captain that I had the privilege of being a mentor to most other young Caymanian Pilots that were hired at Cayman Airways after me. I was also privileged to fly with my brother Jeff as a crew member when he was a First Officer."

of art exhibition tours, galleries events and open studios.

The project, a showcase of all things art, has been a labour of love for its founder, Natalie Urquhart, who is the Director of the National Gallery of the Cayman Islands.

She said the project was a personal project that she developed in response to what was a need for a collaborative hub to share information about Cayman's commercial art sector.

"Cayman Art Week aims to shine a light on the vibrant gallery and studio sector through a comprehensive website, interactive art map and week-long celebration that encourages the sale of art," she advised.

In particular, Mrs Urquhart said the event was being held to assist those in the art field who are small business owners and who have seen their sales heavily impacted by Cayman's closed borders.

"The small creative business owners, who are all heavily reliant on the hospitality sector, have seen their incomes severely impacted by the pandemic. Their venues and the artists that they represent contribute significantly to the unique cultural wealth of the Cayman Islands, and

they remain at risk while the sector begins to rebound. CAW hopes to help sustain the local arts community while we wait for borders to reopen," she said.

Over the four days, the event will focus on a different geographical concentration of galleries and studios daily, starting with the Seven Mile Beach area on Thursday 8th July, George Town on Friday 9th July, and the Eastern districts on the morning of Saturday 10th July, followed by an Art Symposium at the National Gallery in the afternoon. In Cayman Brac, the Solomon Studio will host special events throughout the week, and Artist Talks will take place in Little Cayman in partnership with the Little Cayman Museum. There will also be a tri-island 'Open Studio Day' on Saturday,

where artists across all three islands open their doors to the public.

A lead partner in the project, George Town Revitalisation, which manages the largest concentration of creative spaces in Cayman, will host their new 'Art in the City' initiative that celebrates creativity across the town centre. You can catch all the evolving schedules on the website at www.caymanartweek.com/events.

The push to get more art into people's living rooms will not be stopping at the end of Cayman Art Week, as the website will continue to function as a 'one stop' place to access knowledge about how and where to buy Cayman art with featured local experts, blogs, and news about Caymanian art events. Mrs Urquhart confirmed



that this online component was the first time that all of the venues have been available via a single website. Visit the website and get a glimpse into profiles and artwork samples from featured venues along with their contact and locations details and an easy to use google map.

Longer-term, Cayman Art Week hopes to help support the islands' creative economy and grow into an annual tourism attraction.

Cayman Art Week has already confirmed 25 venues, with more expressing interest. These range from long-running art galleries to cutting-edge spaces and start-ups. Confirmed galleries and studios include: The Gallery at The Ritz-Carlton, Grand Cayman, Kennedy Gallery, Sandon Feat

Gallery, Parcel 110, Guy Harvey Gallery, Pure Art Gallery, Carlos V. Garcia Gallery, Artisan Metal Works Gallery, Gordon J. Solomon Fine Art, John Reno Jackson Studio, David Bridgeman, Al Ebanks, Kay Smith, Charles Long, White Dog Art (Ren Seffer) and Scott Swing. Several artists are also hosting pop-up exhibitions at venues like The Art Collective, Notable Island Gallery and Award Art Gallery at Monaco Towers, Shane 'dready' Aquart at Whitehall Chambers, Davin Ebanks at Palm Heights, along with pop-ups at design firm IDG Cayman and Calypso Grill.

UN REPORT SHOWS MASSIVE TOURISM DECLINE FROM PANDEMIC

With Cayman and other regional and global tourist destinations planning strategies on how best and safest to restart the sector, a United Nations report has estimated the vast economic impact the COVID-19 pandemic has had on the industry.

Vaccine roll-out is already at the heart of this strategy in Cayman and according to the UN report, it's also vital to the global economy especially for tourism-reliant destinations.

The United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) has projected that the global economy could lose over US\$4 trillion across 2020 and 2021 due to the impact of the pandemic.

The report, jointly presented with the UN World Tourism Organization (UNWTO), says international tourism and its closely linked sectors suffered an estimated loss of \$2.4 trillion in 2020 alone due to direct and indirect impacts of a steep drop in international tourist arrivals.

A rebound in international tourism is expected in the second half of this year, but the UNCTAD report still shows a loss

of between \$1.7 trillion and \$2.4 trillion in 2021, compared with 2019 levels.

However, it warns that a similar loss may occur this year, noting that the tourism sector's recovery will largely depend on the uptake of COVID-19 vaccines globally.

"The world needs a global vaccination effort that will protect workers, mitigate adverse social effects and make strategic decisions regarding tourism, taking potential structural changes into account," UNCTAD Acting Secretary-General Isabelle Durant said.

UNWTO Secretary-General Zurab Pololikashvili said: "Tourism is a lifeline for millions, and advancing vaccination to protect communities and support tourism's safe restart is critical to the recovery of jobs and generation of much-needed resources, especially in developing countries, many of which are highly dependent on international tourism."

THE VACCINES FACTOR

With COVID-19 vaccinations being more pronounced in some countries than others, the report points out that tour-



ism losses are reduced in most developed countries but worsened in developing countries.

It shows that countries in the Caribbean - including Cayman - North America and Western Europe are still among the least affected by the tourism crash, while the

brunt of the impact has been felt by North-East Asia, South-East Asia, Oceania, North Africa and South Asia.

COVID-19 vaccination rates are uneven across countries, ranging from below 1% of the population in some countries to above 60% in others.



BILL COSBY TO WALK FREE

Famous African-American actor Bill Cosby is to be released from prison after his conviction on sexual offences was quashed on Wednesday.

His 10-year jail term handed down in 2018 was overturned on Wednesday by the Pennsylvania Supreme Court after it was determined that he'd had an agreement with a previous prosecutor that he could not be charged for the offences.

He was found guilty and sentenced to a three- to 10-year prison term.

Several women had come forward to testify against him for sexual misconduct and he was sentenced over a case brought against him by Andrea Constand.

The news of his conviction being vacated (the legal term) is already being met with relief by those who support Mr Cosby and condemnation by women's rights campaigners. It is certain to ignite a renewed debate over Mr Cosby's guilt or innocence, and the American justice system.

Best known as a prominent African-American actor and comedian, Dr William H Cosby is also an author and academic having earned an M.A. in education.

He is perhaps best known for his role in the tv series *The Cosby Show* in which he played the role of Dr Huxtable in a portrayal of a middle- African-American family.

Bill Cosby was expected to be released from prison on Wednesday.

CAYMAN FURTHER TIGHTENS FINANCIAL SECTOR REGULATIONS

As of June 30th companies in the Cayman Islands registered as general partnerships, limited partnerships, exempted limited partnerships and foreign limited partnerships are now required to 'notify' the Tax Information Authority (TIA) of the Department of International Tax Cooperation.

This follows changes to the regulations governing specific areas of the financial services sector.

An official statement says the regulations bring general partnerships, limited partnerships, exempted limited partnerships and foreign limited partnerships into scope for economic substance requirements.

Under the amendments, if the partnership engages in activity that is relevant for economic substance, it also will be required to file an economic substance return.

It also explains that because investment funds, domestic companies, and local partnerships do not conduct relevant economic substance activities, they must notify the TIA but they are not required to file an economic substance return.

The new regulations also mean that partnerships formed on or after 1st July 2021 are required to meet economic substance requirements from the date on which they commence relevant activity. Partner-

ships formed before that date must satisfy the economic substance test from 1st January 2022.

Hon. Minister for Financial Services and Commerce, André Ebanks, said the regulations address the European Union's tax good governance initiative, which has assessed tax regimes in countries including Cay-

man, Bermuda, Guernsey, Isle of Man and Jersey. Following the assessment, the EU requested these countries to extend economic substance requirements to partnerships.

"These changes ensure that Cayman remains strong and cooperative with international tax compliance", Minister Ebanks said.

me in the last few years, to promote, both inland and overseas, what is produced right here in our small Cayman Islands. It has not been a lonely road, as there is a dedicated body of individuals and organisations that have committed themselves to doing the same, but to what extent has significant progress been made? My area of focus, since an undergrad at the University of the West Indies, Mona, has been on verbal art - literature. It is what I enjoy, what I work hard to ignite a fire in the youth about, what I speak at academic conferences about, what makes me come alive. It is also, interestingly, what I have had a lot of criticism about - "What? You have three degrees, all in English Literature?". This I have heard so many times, with much condescension. Then comes the next question almost always - "Why didn't you study Law?"

There has been an existing stereotype of literary studies and a blatant presumption that this area of study is less favorable for students' futures. Many high school students are not encouraged nor told the advantages of studying literature, nor is it promoted as a prominent area of study that can result in heightened analytical and critical thinking skills. In a 2017 publication, "Why Studying English Literature?" university professor, Tiffani Baihaqi, seeks "to clarify those misconceptions and elaborate the significance of studying English literature" and to establish that studying English Literature would "broaden students' insight to understand life and human being through literary works. By studying literature, students are expected to be familiar in seeing things from diverse perspectives." Sadly, it is society that propagates these misconceptions about English literature as it tells the youth that studying English Literature is tantamount to pleasurable reading and an inadequate means for making a living. English literature students supposedly can only become teachers. Not so, as other career paths include author, translator, lexicographer, journalist, publisher, editor, and public relations. In fact, as the JA Roy Bodden Symposium showed, literature study results in new

knowledge about history and culture, and allows students to perceive and remember information well, be open-minded, see 'hidden' truths, and solve problems.

Undoubtedly, the "JA Roy Bodden Public Intellectual Interrogating the Caymanian Society" symposium which was hosted at the Harquail Theatre, showed how diverse and multifaceted and stimulating and titillating and controversial and inspiring and motivating and absolutely wonderful the written word can be! When I started to prepare for it, I fully expected papers to be presented on politics, history, literature, sociology, and likely education as, after all, Bodden is a former politician, a social historian, an author, and an educator. What I might not have expected is that Bodden's works also inspired discussions of economics, religion, human resources, special needs students, feminism, law, farming, and environment. The diversity of thought that stemmed from Bodden's writings, the true interrogation of the society based on triggers from Bodden's books, as well as the multiple areas in which profundity of thought emerged, proves clearly that literature - the written word - is far more multifaceted than many think.

Thanks to the Cayman National Cultural Foundation (CNCF) and the Committee for the promotion of Research and Cayman Scholarship (CPRCS), Bodden's writings, his fiction and non-fiction, invited discussion from varied local and international presenters. Local presenters included several young Caymanians like Catherine Welds on "The Politics of the Cayman Islands: When Might it Evolve?", Latoya Francis' "A Fresh Look at Education: The Evolving Views of a Young Caymanian", and Mikana Scott's "Revisiting the Cayman Islands in Transition: Caribbean Feminism, Decolonial Praxis and Epistemological Linkages". Other local presenters included CNCF's Henry Muttou on the underappreciation of the artist by society - "Transcending Actuality - Signifying our Mindscape", Dr Christopher Williams - "An analysis of Some Ideas in Bodden's Books - Race and Slavery", Dr Erica Gordon on "The Internationalisation of Education: Implications for Small States", the Hon. Dr Mary Lawrence - "The

Cultural Context of Roy Bodden and His Writings", Mario Ebanks on the "Reform of the Labour and Human Capital Development Framework and Systems in the Cayman Islands", Dr Frank McField's titillating topic, "Madness, Badness, and Fear of God", as well as my own presentation on "Mirrors and Reflections: Seeing Cayman through Bodden's Short Stories and Poems".

The diversity of last week's intellectual discourse is further seen in some of the overseas presenters, many of whom joined via Zoom. Bilika Simamba spoke of the "Accountability of Judges and Government Lawyers:


Falling Short of the Ideal", Dr Monika Lawrence - "A Quest for Self-Definition: An exploration of Bodden's Short Stories", Dr Ian Randle, Bodden's publisher, explored "Bodden Leads the Way - Writing and Publishing as Critical Activities in Nation Building", and Dr Tom Phillips spoke on "The Political Economy foundations of Roy Bodden's Social Analysis".

Whew! Did literature by Bodden inspire all that? Did a writer use mere words to procreate such a plethora of ideas and diversity of views on our Cayman Islands? Arguably, Bodden not only inspired new thoughts on Cayman culture, beliefs, and history, but simultaneously destroyed stereotypes of English Literature as a field worth studying. I have not listed even half of approximately 40 presenters here, but it is hoped that you, like me, feel a sense of pride in what Cayman accom-

WATCHING THE WEATHER: GETTING ACTIVE IN THE ATLANTIC

Two new weather systems in the tropical Atlantic are edging towards the Caribbean chain of islands, and from early indications are on a path that could potentially bring at least one in the vicinity of the Cayman Islands.

The US National Hurricane Centre says environmental conditions appear generally favourable for the development of one of those systems identified as Invest 97L, with a tropical depression likely to form during the next few days.

That system is moving west-northwestward at about 20 mph and residents in the eastern Caribbean Windward and Leeward Islands are advised to closely monitor its movement and development.

It is likely to make its presence felt in their local area by this Friday as it heads into the Caribbean Sea on a general west-north-westerly track.


The probabilities for formation range from a medium level of 60 per cent by this weekend to 80 per cent early next week.

Another system of disorganised showers and thunderstorms continue in association with a tropical wave located just east of the Lesser Antilles.

The National Hurricane Centre says significant development of this system is unlikely while it moves quickly westward to west-northwestward at 20 to 25 mph, passing through the Lesser Antilles and then across the eastern and central Caribbean Sea by this weekend.

Forecasters say regardless of development it could bring heavy rainfall to portions of the Lesser Antilles but its chances of formation are rated as low - around 10 per cent.

While these two systems are being monitored from a distance in Cayman, the National Weather Service(CINWS) and Hazard Management Cayman are updating that current local conditions indicate



cloudiness and showers associated with a tropical wave just west of the Cayman area.

This is expected to continue influencing the local weather but reducing as the wave moves towards the west at five knots.

Local radar images show scattered showers in and around the Cayman area

moving Northwest with partly cloudy to cloudy skies presenting a 40% chance of showers and some thunder.

Winds are blowing east to southeast at 10 to 15 knots and seas moderate with wave heights of three to five feet.

These conditions were forecast to continue through to Friday.

So far in 2021, following last year's record-breaking 2020, there have been four named storms; pre-season Ana which formed on May 22nd, and Bill, Claudette and Danny which developed and fizzled out since the official start of the season on June 1st.

The next named storm will be Elsa.

Suggested Hurricane Supply List

To prepare for the unknown, each home should have a 72-hour Disaster Survival Kit. You will need to pack some essential items to help you and your family survive, whether you stay at home or leave it during a disaster.

Ensure at least three days (72 hours) supply for each person. Do not forget pets where applicable! The following is a minimum suggested list of Survival Kit supplies:

Drinking Water:

- One gallon per person/per day in unbreakable containers, Avoid using containers that will decompose or break, such as milk cartons or glass bottles. A normally active person needs to drink at least two quarts of water each day. Hot environments and intense physical activity can double that amount. Children, nursing mothers, and ill people will need more.

- Don't forget to add additional water for mixing formula if you have children and for your pets. Rotate the drinking water each year.

- Food preparation and sanitation require another two quarts (minimum) per person daily.

- Purchased bottled water that has been sealed is best for storage. It meets FDA guidelines for food and is not as vulnerable to temperature changes as unsealed water

- **Tip:** Purchase water this year and use it for drinking next year. This allows for rotation on an annual basis and keeps the water fresh. **Yes water can go bad!**

Water for sanitation use:

- Store extra containers of water to be used for flushing toilets, cleaning, and bathing.

- Purchase water purification tablets (Halazone) to be used if you still have running water but are told to boil water before using it. This allows you to fill the bathtub and other containers without purchasing expensive drinking water.

- **Tip:** Keep plastic containers (milk jugs and other containers) and fill them with water when a storm threatens. You can put these items in the freezer to keep

food cold longer in the event that the electricity goes out.

Non-perishable Food:

- Maintain at least 3-7 days of food for each member of the family.

- Small, preferably single serving cans (should not require cooking or refrigeration). Dried fruit, peanut butter and jelly, coffee, tea, soft drinks and pet foods.

- Ready-to-eat canned meats, fruits and vegetables.

- Canned juices, milk, soup (if powdered, store extra water).

- Staples – sugar, salt, pepper in water proof containers.

- High energy foods like crackers, granola bars, trail mix.

- Raw vegetables that do not need refrigeration.

- Fresh bread.

- Comfort/stress foods – cookies, hard candy, sweetened cereals, lollipops, **instant coffee, tea bags.**

- Sterno for cooking.

- Vitamins

- Food for infants



- Paper cups, plates, and plastic utensils
- Non-electric can opener
- Aluminum foil
- Plastic storage containers
- Lots of ice (you can freeze your water supply)

- Pedialyte (to restore hydration if needed)

- **Tip:** Purchase only items that you like to eat and would eat even without a storm. Rotate these items by using them Dec-May each year and purchasing new items Jan-May. This allows you to reduce the cost of buying items for a hurricane kit at one time and keeps the items fresh. **Yes even canned goods have a shelf life!**




