Disney Magic Marks the Return of Cruise Tourism

The sun rose on Monday morning the 21st of March to reveal the Disney Magic approaching over the horizon, heralding the return of cruise tourism to the Cayman Islands following the closure of the port in response to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

The Royal Watler Cruise Terminal was buzzing with activity for the first time in two years as vendors prepared to welcome cruise tourists back to Caymanian shores. The 1,493 passengers stepped off the tenders to receive a Cayman Kind welcome, including music and dancing from local artists, as well as appearanc-

es from Sir Turtle and a few of our own swashbuckling buccaneers.

Minister of Tourism Hon. Kenneth Bryan, Parliamentary Secretary Hon. Dwayne 'John John' Seymour, as well as Director of Tourism Rosa Harris and Chief Officer of the Ministry of Tourism and Transport Stran Bodden were the first to greet visitors as they stepped onto the pier.

A visibly emotional Bryan was elated to see cruise passengers back on Caymanian shores. "It's a mix of emotions. I must say that seeing the kids in particular was a bit emotional for me. Not only to see the guest's experiences – so much happiness and so many smiles – but the smiles on my people's faces were



even more pleasing to me, because you can see that Caymanians are so happy to pass on these experiences to the guests."

The arrival of the Disney Magic, which usually carries 2,700 passengers, marks the beginning of Phase One of plans to restore cruise tourism to pre-pandemic levels, something that ministers feel is essential for the prosperity of the local economy. "The fact that I can see people in the industry getting back to work, being excited, and being able to provide for themselves again is really, really, thrilling" stated Minister Bryan.

Despite the festivities, Ministers were quick to acknowledge the concerns of those who have reservations about the return of cruise ships. "We

need to take our time", admitted Parliamentary Secretary Dwayne Seymour. "We really need to work with the stakeholders to ensure that they're ready before we make commitments and overburden them."

Ministers also recognised environmental concerns. "Whenever [the impact] becomes negative, we actually question why we are doing it," said Minister Bryan. "What we have to do is find that balance where everybody benefits."

All told, there was optimism in the air as vendors anticipate the arrival of another 20 cruise ships in the next 4 weeks, signalling the tourism industry's continuing recovery in the wake of COVID-19.



THE PANEL DISCUSSION

CSC - RAISING MANAGEMENT STANDARDS IN THE CIVIL SERVICE

The Director describes it as “probably the biggest provider of further education or the biggest student base on-island at the moment, yet the majority of the island has probably never heard of us.”

Those are the words of Graeme Jackson, Director of the Cayman Islands Civil Service College (CICSC), an apparently little-known but essential link in managing the delivery of services provided by the government.

Mr Jackson appeared on the Caymanian Times programme, The Panel, to discuss the role of the college in equipping public sector staff with the management skills critical to keeping the huge public sector apparatus functioning and fit-for-purpose.

According to its mandate, the Cayman Islands Civil Service College (CICSC) was established in 2007 “to further New Public Management reforms as well as the learning and development needs of the Cayman Islands Civil Service and to carry out research within the Caribbean region.”

Although it functions at the very heart of the government, there’s however no physical infrastructure that identifies the CSC. It’s seemingly only known to those who participate in and benefit from its ongoing programmes from a training room deep within the labyrinthine corridors of Government Headquarters.

While admitting to its relative obscurity, CSC Director Jackson points to its impact as evidence of its success.


“We saw many instances with people reaching leadership and management positions and really struggling. They weren’t always getting the support they need. They weren’t given the coaching and the mentoring. Some of them just weren’t in the training. But training and development and leadership and management isn’t difficult, it’s not complex,” said Mr Jackson who took over the Director’s job in 2019.

“And I really applaud the Deputy Governor (Franz Manderson) when he said, if you’re going to manage civil servants in the civil service, then you must be competent to do that,” he added.

Graeme Jackson leads a six-person team of trainers in the CSC supported by four associate trainers.

On the CSC’s website, his impressive bio reads: Chartered Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Personnel and Development, a Fellow of the Institute for Leadership and Management (ILM) and a member of the Association for Project Management. In addition, he is an accredited City and Guilds ILM tutor and internal verifier.

The CSC conducts much of their training in team sessions for civil service staff including an associate-degree programme with the University College of the Cayman Islands (UCCI). It turns out



between 12 and 20 graduates yearly.

In addition to training civil servants, the CSC is supporting a pilot programme to help high school students get interested in leadership and management at an early stage. The programme leads to an internationally recognised City and Guilds level 2 award.

One of the issues explored by co-host Mario E. Ebanks, a human resources consultant, was promotions through the ranks of the civil service linked to training and qualifications attained via the CSC programmes.

“What we’re seeing is people who are going through the learning and development are getting the skills to be able to answer the questions in that interview environment. And we’re giving them the structure to approach that. We are giving them the confidence that they can be successful,” the CSC Director explained.

Panel co-host and former president of the UCCI (University College of the Cay-

man Islands, Dr Roy Bodden, explored challenges being faced by Director Graeme Taylor and his team in delivering their training curriculum.

“The real big challenge we’ve got is meeting demand,” the CSC Director said while also discussing perceptions to training evident among some senior staff. “One of the criticisms in training from some of the managers is: ‘I wish my manager had done this training, or I wish my manager was here.’”

He said, “We’re six people trying to deliver a lot of programs. One of the ways we are trying to tackle that at the moment is trying to find the best managers and offering to train them as trainers.”

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, CSC has added an online element to their curriculum. That was of particular interest to host of The Panel and Caymanian Times publisher, Ralph Lewis.

“We were shut down for quite some time and there were many opportunities for some people to re-tool and re-

train themselves. Did the students of the Civil Serviced College use that opportunity to educate themselves?” he asked.

According to CSC Director Jackson, being forced to revert to online courses as their training room was converted into the National Emergency Operations Center, may have opened up new opportunities for learning - and not just for the CSC.

“One of the upsides of that, is I think we need to rethink the way we deliver training and education going forward. And I think we’re gonna see a massive transition, especially in the higher education sector, in terms of the way people learn.”

He elaborated that “where we can add value is bringing people into the room and with that knowledge challenge the behaviours, challenge the assumptions and make it much more practical. And I think we need to see that carry over into the future for the education sector.”

Ministry of Education (MOE) Rolls Out Public Schools Meals Programme in Secondary Schools

The Ministry of Education today announced the start of the second phase of the Public Schools Meals Programme (PSMP) on Monday, 21 March 2022.

Under this phase of the PSMP, students enrolled in public high schools, including the Cayman Islands Further Education Centre (CIFEC), will be provided with breakfast, lunch and snacks daily.

“Last August, we introduced the Public Schools Meals Programme in primary schools and at the Lighthouse School. I am pleased that we can now extend this programme to our secondary school students,” remarked Education Minister Hon. Juliana O’Connor-Connolly.

The PSMP will be administered through an interactive meal management system that will allow parents to view menus, order meals (in the case of primary schools and LHS) and view their child/ward’s meal consumption patterns.

Parents and guardians were encouraged sign up the meal management system which was piloted in three primary schools in January and February.

The Education Minister also remarked, “The meals provided must be wholesome, nutritious and delivered on time. Accordingly, a team from the Ministry will work closely with other government agencies to oversee meal provision and ensure that meals that comply with the Cayman Islands Public Schools Standards for Food Provision.”

Cayman Islands Fire Service (CIFS) Acquires New Oshkosh Strikers

Grand Cayman, 14 March 2022 (GIS)- The Cayman Islands Fire Service (CIFS), acquired two additional Oshkosh Striker Aviation Fire Trucks from the Cayman Islands Port Authority, as part of an ongoing fleet modernisation plan.

Speaking to the Ministry's mission to build resilience through partnerships and innovation, Acting Chief Officer for the Ministry of Home Affairs Michael Ebanks stated: "With the increased air traffic expected due to our border re-opening, this investment is an integral component of the Ministry's plan to ensure our CIFS team has the equipment, technology, and professionalism necessary to support international airport operations with cutting edge firefighting and rescue services.

"The enhanced capability is primarily aimed at facilitating larger aircraft like the BA 777, which regularly arrives and departs from Grand Cayman, and is welcomed by the Cayman Islands Fire Service and our key aviation partners, Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) Cayman Islands and Cayman Islands Airport Authority (CIAA)", Mr Ebanks said.

Joining the three existing trucks currently in operation, one of the new Oshkosh Striker Aviation Fire Trucks has been fitted with High Reach Extendable Turret Technology, which significantly improves fire and rescue capabilities as well as Firefighter safety. The 65-foot extendable boom allows the CIFS aerodrome team the versatility to attack a fire from every angle and penetrate an aircraft's fuselage with intense precision.

Speaking to the capabilities of the new strikers, Deputy Chief Fire Officer (Aviation) Brevan Elliott added: "these two new trucks are equipped with state-of-the-art technology that will allow CIFS to provide a more efficient and effective rapid response service to airport operations, with a response time of 0-50 miles per hour in 32 seconds. Acquiring the new appliances will also allow our CIFS Aviation team to meet its 2-minutes response time objectives on either end of the runway. This new firefighting technology will also assist

CIFS in seeking approval of our new Task Resource Analysis TRA which will enable CIFS to provide Category 9 rescue and firefighting at all times. We are working with our Oshkosh partners to ensure our officers are trained effectively with new improved fire and rescue techniques."

Speaking to the significance of the new fleet to airport operations, Cayman Islands Airport Authority, CEO Albert Anderson noted "CIFS are one of our main airside partners, and provide a valuable service to airport operations, the investment of these new trucks complements the recent upgrades to the airport and will enable both agencies to further improve the quality of service and the level of safety."

Acting Minister of Home Affairs Isaac Rankine MP who attended the welcome for the two new Fire Trucks stated:

"This is a great day for Cayman Islands. I understand this investment by Cayman Islands Government will serve our needs for the next 12-15 years and completes the replacement of all of our aviation fire trucks in Grand Cayman and Cayman Brac."

Designate Chief Fire Officer Dwight 'Randy' Rankin stated "I am immensely proud of CIFS colleagues who have worked tirelessly to make this happen and congratulate them on successfully replacing the Aviation Fleet over the past two years. A unified fleet of Oshkosh Strikers delivers operational improvements, servicing and maintenance efficiencies, and above all our improved fire and rescue capabilities should allow for a consistent aviation fire and rescue crewing model at Owen Roberts International Airport."

"Furthermore, with our fleet of five

Oshkosh Strikers we have the equipment and vehicles to provide a first-class aviation fire and rescue service, and support the Cayman Islands Government vision for a "World Class Civil Service", Mr Rankin added.

The Striker with the 65-foot extendable boom will be stationed at Owen Roberts International Airport, the other Striker will be acceptance tested and then delivered to Cayman Brac to provide fire and rescue cover at Charles Kirkconnell International Airport.

Cruise Tourism returns with regulation changes

Changes in the Regulations that govern Cayman's Covid-19 response come into effect on Monday to pave the way for the first cruise ship passengers to arrive on Cayman's shores for more than two years.

Premier Wayne Panton said in a press conference last Friday that government felt confident in opening up the Islands to cruise passengers once again because the number of Covid cases was in decline and the number of severe cases was also low. The Premier did point out, however, that there were never any guarantees that Covid would not return possibly in a new strain.

The return of cruise tourism was a critical part of Cayman's tourism recovery, particularly so for the thousands of Caymanians working in tourism and hundreds of Caymanian-owned business that employed them, he said.

Two regulations in particular would be affected in this phased approach to the re-introduction of cruise tourism. The most important changes were that in order to alight in the Cayman Islands, cruise visi-

tors aged 12 and over must have been vaccinated at least 14 days before cruising. Children under 12 would take the vaccine status of the adult in their group and all crew must be vaccinated.

The Premier confirmed Cayman would not take any Covid positive passengers or crew. At this point Cayman would only be taking about a quarter of the usual volumes of cruise passengers, capping them at 75,000.

At the end of phase one in four weeks' time, and if PH continued to approve cruises, there would be no capacity restraints on cruise vessels but all health protocols would still continue.

The first ship will be the Disney Magic arriving Monday with about 2,700 passengers on board. The Premier called that a fitting start to the reintroduction of cruise ships because it was a family-orientated ship in keeping with Cayman being a family-orientated destination. He called it a milestone, given that Cayman had not seen a cruise ship in more than two years.

No LFTs for cruise arrivals

The Premier went on to explain that

cruise ship passengers will be required to undertake a Covid test prior to embarking on their cruise, however they will not be required to take such a test before they disembark onto Cayman's shores. This is even though people flying into the Cayman Islands must show a negative LFT or PCR to be allowed to travel to Cayman.

"In terms of the vessels we have chosen to come in in this phase one assessment period, we've risk weighted those vessels and we've tried to get the highest number of vessels in with the lowest level of risk. The lowest level of risk is presented by those vessels that are making Cayman their first stop," the Premier stated.

There are about 20 to 30 per cent that are in that situation, but not all, he added.

Cayman's geography means it is not ordinarily the first stop which makes it difficult for the government to insist that it was the first stop. Premier Panton said government had asked the cruise lines to ensure that passengers took a LFT test before they disembarked in Cayman,

but said the cruise lines cited the logistical difficulties that would cause them, so they declined.

"At the end of the day, we accepted that this would be difficult for that to happen," Premier Panton said.

The Premier said it represented a much smaller window of risk because cruise tourists only alight for about five to six hours rather than five days for stayover tourists. In addition, cruise tourists tended to stay in a bubble when going on tours so would not interact that much with the public.

Money available

To ensure that tour operators could get their boats and equipment up to scratch, the government had made available a further \$5 million for that purpose. This is in addition to \$15 million allocated for the stipend budget.

Other changes to the regulations affected Sister Islands travel. Now, children age under 18 do not need to obtain a PCR or LFT prior to travel if they are unvaccinated and who are accompanied by a person who has been vaccinated.

Royal Shakespeare Company heads to Cayman

Budding thespians and their teachers are in for a treat next month as members of the Royal Shakespeare Company are heading to Cayman from the UK to conduct training sessions in schools across the island. The RSC is bringing their professional expertise to Cayman to help students and teachers get better acquainted with the greatest playwright of all time.

Kirsty O'Sullivan, Head of Training and Support with Cayman Drama Society, is spearheading the project and gives some background as to how the Company decided to come to Cayman to share the secrets of their acting skills.

"The project came about when I did my Masters in Shakespeare and Education with the Shakespeare Institute," she advised. "They are based in Stratford-upon-Avon, and partnered with the Royal Shakespeare Company. I did one of the modules on site, and got partnered for an exercise with one of the Education Team from the RSC, so I took the chance to ask them if they would ever consider coming here."

Kirsty had hosted two Shakespeare festivals through her position at the Cayman Drama Society, and realised that young people really loved to connect with Shakespeare. Shakespeare had also recently re-entered the Cayman curriculum, she advised.

"The project was meant to happen in 2020 but for obvious reasons it has been postponed," she explained. "In the week that we have the RSC practitioners with us, they will run a teacher training day for



primary school teachers on their famous rehearsal room pedagogy. This encourages engagement with Shakespeare's text

by removing the desks and getting the class on its feet and has excellent success rates in the classrooms."

Bard to the next level. All the offerings are decided with the school or facility and tailored to the needs of each class.

The RSC fees were generously sponsored by the Aall Foundation which meant all schools were contacted about the availability of these unique training sessions and the fact that they are free of charge.

The project is going to take place from 4 to 8 April. Schools have all been contacted, but Kirsty advised that if anyone would like to see if there is a spot on the primary school pedagogy for teachers, or to enquire if any workshops cancellations leave an open space, they can email training@cds.ky and they will gladly see if they can help. Kirsty also teaches Shakespeare and CDS offers tailored workshops throughout the academic year for schools (two free per school per year) so if a school misses out on this exciting project, the CDS can still offer them a workshop.

Kirsty said she wanted to offer her thanks to The Aall Foundation for making the project possible, the Ritz-Carlton for hosting guests and sponsoring their accommodation, Bread and Chocolate café for the teachers' lunches, and Red Sail Sports for offering a stingray tour to show the visitors the beauty of the island in between all their hard work.

"We are thrilled to be hosting such a unique project, which is the first time we have had something of this kind in Cayman, and the RSC's first project in the Caribbean," Kirsty said.



This will be a full day course, with lunch sponsored by Bread and Chocolate, and is intended to allow teachers to gain confidence and new techniques, in order to engage their students with Shakespeare.

"We are also visiting some schools which are studying Shakespeare texts to give them a tailored workshop, including John Gray High School, Clever Fish for their literacy week, Montessori by the Sea who worked on Shakespeare with us before, and we are in talks with Clifton Hunter and the Lighthouse School to see what we can provide them while we have the practitioners available," Kirsty confirmed.

She said that Cayman Drama Society's own acting classes, at the Prospect Playhouse, will also be getting workshops to push members' acting of the

- (a) he or she was, on the day immediately preceding the date of commencement of this Constitution, entitled to be registered as an elector; or
- (b) he or she—
- is a Caymanian; and
 - has attained the age of eighteen years; and
 - is resident in the Cayman Islands at the date of registration; and
 - has been resident in the Cayman Islands for a period or periods amounting to not less than two years out of the four years immediately preceding the date of registration;
- or
- (c) on the day of the issue of a writ ordering an election, he or she is otherwise qualified under paragraph (b) but has not attained the age of eighteen, but he or she will attain that age on or before the polling day at the election.

Disqualifications of Electors

91(1) A person shall not be entitled to be registered as an elector in any electoral district who—

- (a) subject to subsection (2) is serving a sentence of imprisonment (by whatever name called) exceeding twelve months imposed on him or her by a court in any country or substituted by competent authority for some other sentence imposed on him or her by such a court, or is under such a sentence of imprisonment the execution of which has been suspended;
- (b) is a person certified to be insane or otherwise adjudged to be of unsound mind under any law in force in the Cayman Islands; or
- (c) is disqualified for registration as an elector by any law in force in the Cayman Islands relating to offences connected with elections.


