

At the event, director of DCFS Paulinda Mendoza-Williams addressed the audience and stated:



Prosecution commences for Rubis Tank Incident



The Utility Regulation and Competition Office (OfReg) filed a charge against Rubis Cayman Islands Limited (Rubis), after investigating a spillage that occurred in November 2019 on one of the bulk diesel tanks at their Jackson Point Terminal. While a significant quantity of diesel was released from the tank, there was no significant impact found on the surrounding environment, according to an assessment by Water Authority Cayman.

Immediately following the discovery of the leak, action was taken by Rubis and OfReg upon notification, to minimise the risk to the public. Once the situation was brought under control, OfReg commenced an investigation. The investigation was carried out in accordance with OfReg's mandate under section 19 of the Dangerous Substance (DS) Act to establish the root cause(s) of the incident. The bulk terminals are typically equipped with active site monitoring wells to provide an early indication of hydrocarbon leaks, as a part of their normal operations. The findings pointed to, among other things, factors within Rubis' control that could have prevented the incident, such as actively maintaining their cathodic protection system. This equipment minimises corrosion in areas of the tank which are difficult to visually inspect or access.

The investigation also found that Rubis was in breach of section 12 of the DS Act, which states:

12. (1) The operator of any regulated premises- (a) shall take all reasonable precautions for the prevention of (iii) any release or spillage.

The investigation concluded that Rubis did not take reasonable precautions to prevent the spillage mentioned above. The file was submitted to the Office of Director of Public Prosecutions and charges were laid.

The initial hearing was held on 22 March 2022 and the matter was adjourned.

As the matter is now before the courts, OfReg will update the public once a ruling is issued.

Cabinet Met in Little Cayman for the First Time

History was made on Tuesday, 22 March when a meeting of the Cabinet was held in Little Cayman for the first time ever.

Official and elected members of the PACT Government gathered this week in Little Cayman for three days of meetings and engagement with the Little Cayman community. The attendees included His Excellency the Governor, Mr. Martyn Roper; Premier, Hon. G Wayne Panton; Deputy Governor, Hon. Franz Manderson; Ministers, Attorney General and Parliamentary Secretaries.

They were also joined at the social events by the Speaker, Hon. McKeeva Bush, who was assessing the possibility of having future meetings of Parliament in Little Cayman.

The visit began with a special service on Sunday, 20 March at the Little Cayman Church. Praise and worship were led by Nurse Charmaine Coore and Brother Fernando Yorke.

The congregation enjoyed a special rendition of "He's Got The Whole World in His Hands," sung by the only current students of Little Cayman Education Services Jhade and Miguel Thompson Jr. The siblings represented multiple generations of Little Cayman as the great-grandchildren of tourism pioneers the late Mr. Sam and Mrs. Mary McCoy.

Pastor Randy Von Kanel shared a special message on the importance of service and offered encouragement to the Government delegation. The Premier offered brief remarks on behalf of the Government.

On Monday, 21 March, the elected government gathered in the Grouper Room at the Little Cayman Beach Resort for its weekly Caucus meeting.

On Tuesday, 22 March morning, official members of the Government joined the Premier and elected Ministers for the historic first meeting of Cabinet, which was held at the same venue.

The Premier and Minister for Education, District Administration, Hon. Juliana O'Connor-Connolly, MP for Cayman Brac East, also hosted a special reception that afternoon for the residents of Little Cay-

The most notable part of the evening was the presentation of National Heroes Day awards to three of Little Cayman's Uniformed Services pioneers. The late Mr. Irvin Bruce Eldemire was honoured with the Early Pioneer award for his outstanding contributions to the Little Cayman community through his multiple uniformed posts, including District Officer. His award was collected by his wife, Mrs. Nelvie Eldemire, and a moment of silence was held in his memory.

The first recipient of the Pioneer award was Little Cayman District Officer, Mr. Tate Adonis McFarlane, for his past contributions as a Customs Officer and his work in his present role. The final award was presented to Mr. Robin Levi Walton for his contributions as a member of the Cayman Islands Fire Service.

The Premier expressed pride in the historic achievement on behalf of the PACT Government. "My vision is for a more inclusive Cayman, one that embraces the uniqueness and diversity of all three islands," he added.

"We agreed it was important for the Government to experience for themselves as individuals and collectively, one of the world's greatest treasures - Little Cayman. There was truly no better place to conduct our official business this week."

CHAMBER AND CIG TACKLE THE TOUGH ISSUES

The Cayman Islands Chamber of Commerce and Industry and the PACT administration have initiated a series of ministerial-level meetings to address a range of current matters of concern to the business sector and the wider community.

A statement from the Chamber has described the sessions as “very cordial” with a commitment by both sides to “meet regularly to address the issues that were raised”.

It said to date they’ve discussed a range of business-related topics with the objective of establishing closer working relationships.

Since the start of this year, the Chamber Council has held meetings with the Hon. Deputy Premier and Minister of Finance and Labour Chris Saunders, Hon. Minister of Financial Services & Commerce Andre Ebanks, Hon. Minister of Health & Wellness Sabrina Turner, Hon. Minister of Tourism and Transport Kenneth and Hon. Minister of Planning, Agriculture, Housing, and Infrastructure Jay Ebanks.

Detailing the specific outcomes from these sessions so far, the Chamber reported that topics that their discussions

with Deputy Premier Christopher Saunders included the private sector pensions reform, an upcoming minimum wage review, and labour supply challenges that are impacting many member businesses.

Mr Saunders has also agreed to participate in the Chamber’s annual Economic Forum and quarterly meetings have also been confirmed with Commerce Minister Andre Ebanks.

Matters addressed with Minister Jay Ebanks covered planning matters “focusing mainly on the backlog of building control inspections and its impact on the development and construction sectors,” according to the Chamber.

COVID-19-related concerns dominated the meeting with Health Minister Sabrina Turner. The Chamber Council said it received an update on the pandemic response and the plans to revise some of the testing protocols for the reopening of the tourism sector.

“Overall, the meetings were cordial with the Council and the Ministers agreeing to meet regularly to address the issues that were raised,” the Chamber said in its statement.

Calisthenics Park Now Open and Free for Public Access

Philanthropist Donates State-of-The-Art, Outdoor Fitness Facility at Seven Mile Public Beach

The Ministry for District Administration and Lands (MDAL) officially opened a new Calisthenics Park at the Seven Mile Public Beach. The 5575 square feet, state-of-art, outdoor fitness facility is the brainchild and donation from local businessman, Phillip Schlosstein and is now free for public use. The Park is situated on Crown land and will be maintained and managed by the Cayman Islands Government.

To mark the occasion, a small-scale ceremony was held at the park site and attended by Government officials, members of the local fitness, health and wellness communities and other contributing members of the project.

The Honourable Juliana O'Connor-Connolly gave the opening remarks and expounded her support of the project as the Minister responsible for Lands. "From the onset, Phillip's intention to partner with the Government for the ultimate benefit of the people, rather than to expect or ask for waivers and special dispensations, made his proposal standout. Phillip's love for the Cayman Islands was demonstrated through his dedication to give back to the community in a unique and sincere way. Phillip has produced what he has promised, in a transparent, people-driven and timely manner. We are very grateful and appreciative of Phillip's contribution. The successful delivery of the Calisthenics Park, by way of good public-private partner-

ship, epitomizes our mantra of 'Community makes Country,' explained Minister O'Connor-Connolly.

In her passionate address, Minister O'Connor-Connolly posed a challenge to other members of the community with similar resources, to come together and follow suit by investing in the community and work towards more collaborative national building. The Minister also responsible for education, expressed her delight in Phillip's "locally-minded" encoding with his stipulations that local students, athletes, coaches et al. play an integral role in the Park's opening.

His Excellency, Governor Martyn Roper followed up with a special address echoing his support adding, "Understanding that this project started only three months ago, I congratulate all concerned and am proud of the fantastic work done with the Park. Moreover, I am happy to see this Government's focus on health and wellness epitomized in this state-of-the-art facility."

Phillip Schlosstein who is originally from Germany, expressed his passion for Calisthenics which is a form of strength training that is suitable for all fitness levels. Mr. Schlosstein who wants to be referred to as simply 'Phillip', gave a spirited presentation covering the park's development journey. Phillip shared his vision to give back to the Cayman Islands, by creating a "community square" for all to enjoy.

To those who may be harbouring similar private initiatives for the public good, talk to the relevant departments of the Cayman Islands Government as they are open for business. The CIG has been timely, goal-oriented, cooperative and pragmatic. I am grateful for their support and look forward to future projects towards making this community an even better place to live, work and raise a family," shared the successful entrepreneur, investor and philanthropist.

To demonstrate the park's functionality and to educate key-stakeholders about the park's potentialities, student-athletes, physical therapists, physical education teachers, sports coaches were all invited to participate in the grand opening activities. A highlight of the activities was the captivating, live demonstrations by three, world-champion "Street-workout" athletes—Jay Chris, Sophie Brace and Tony Gastelum from the United Kingdom and

Mexico. The visiting athletes also facilitated a series of free training-workshops for local sports and physical therapy experts during their weeklong stay.

Minister for Health and Wellness, Honourable Sabrina Turner spoke more about how the Calisthenics facility contributed to providing solutions to improve the well-being of residents, adding, "COVID-19 has changed the way we think about health overall. When we were constricted to our homes, persons found simple ways to move their bodies – mostly through calisthenics. By adding this park to one of our most-visited public spaces, we are continuing this enhanced culture of health and wellness here in the Cayman Islands."

With the park site located on Crown land, oversight for the project was assigned to Ministry of District Administration and Lands, with consultation provided by the Ministry of Planning, Agriculture, Housing and Infrastructure (PAHI).

The Honourable Andre Ebanks spoke on behalf of the Minister responsible for PAHI (Hon. Johann Ebanks) and in his own capacity as the representative for West Bay South and Minister for Innovation, Investment and Social Development. Minister Ebanks concluded, "The collaborative approach taken by the private and public sector demonstrates how much we can achieve in a relatively short period of time when we all work together to invest in our islands. The Public Works Department was integrally involved and will act as recipient of the project, by exercising their normal maintenance and upkeep of the park. We look forward to assessing the usage of this park overtime so we can determine how best we can replicate similar versions in other communities."

Phillip Schlosstein has committed to the construction of a second facility of its kind in Cayman Brac. Construction of the second facility will commence after a period of observational study of the Grand Cayman facility.


