

Message from the Minister: New COVID-19 Regulations

As you may have heard, there are long awaited and exciting changes to our COVID-19 regulations and Public Health protocols coming this Thursday 30th of June.

The Ministry of Health and Wellness shares in your excitement as we move even closer to normalcy. We can all agree that arriving to this point did not come easily, and I am truly grateful that the people of the Cayman Islands have remained compliant and patient every step of the way.

Firstly, mask wearing will be discretionary, which means you can choose to wear a mask for your own safety and comfort inside a public place. Certain places, such as prisons and healthcare facilities, may still require persons to wear a mask so keep one with you at all times, just in case.

Another exciting change is the repeal of pre-arrival testing for all persons coming to the Cayman Islands. Traveling already requires many details and removing the pre-arrival testing requirement is truly a step towards normality.

Unvaccinated Caymanians and legal residents will be able to return home without quarantine, but are strongly encouraged to complete lateral flow tests daily for their first seven days back at home.

Our unvaccinated visitors – that is persons with close ties to the Islands – will still be required to quarantine for seven days but will not have to test at the end

of the quarantine period.

Persons who receive a positive lateral flow test result should first report it to Public Health on exploregov.ky. Then, you should get a PCR test to confirm your result and isolate at home. Treat your symptoms at home, and, at the end of your isolation, you will no longer have to do an exit test.

We are happy for relaxed restrictions but we also understand that it does not call for less responsibility. Seek vaccination, for any dose that you may be eligible, to protect yourself and vulner-

able loved ones. Practice proper hand hygiene, and choose to enhance your immunity through nutrition and exercise.

Our Public Health team will continue

surveillance and we will actively monitor the spread of COVID-19 and amend restrictions according to the needs of the community.

I would like to thank you for your cooperation up until this point and for trusting your elected leaders and medical experts to make the best decisions for the people of these blessed Islands.



The Tropics are heating up

SECOND NAMED STORM LIKELY BY THIS WEEKEND




The estimated minimum central pressure is 1009 millibars and the maximum sustained wind speed is 35 knots with gusts to 45 knots.

On the forecast track, the system was expected pass near or over portions of the southern Windward Islands and move over the southern Caribbean Sea or near the northern coast of Venezuela and the northeast coast of Colombia.

The southern Dutch Caribbean islands of Aruba, Bonaire and Curacao are in the storm's path and are preparing for an onslaught of severe weather quite unlike what they would normally experience.

The NHC also advises that regardless of development, locally heavy rainfall is possible over the Windward Islands and the northeastern coast of Venezuela Tuesday night and Wednesday.

Tropical storm warnings have been issued for parts of the Caribbean. The NHC says this is a procedure that allows it to issue advisories, watches and warnings for a



What could possibly be the first hurricane for this year continues an unusual track in the far southern Caribbean islands moving westward toward the coasts of Venezuela and Colombia.

It was expected to be declared a tropical cyclone by midweek as it moves closer to Trinidad and Tobago before being upgraded to hurricane strength and named Bonnie.

The system is forecast to make landfall in Central Amer-

ica but is also expected to bring severe storm conditions to Trinidad and Tobago which is normally not in the path of these storms.

The US National Hurricane Centre reports that conditions appear conducive for development if the disturbance remains over water, and it will likely become a tropical storm near the southern Windward Islands or while moving westward across the southern Caribbean Sea.

system that hasn't yet developed but poses a threat of tropical-storm-force or hurricane-force winds to land areas within 48 hours.

The latest watches and warnings are shown stretch from northern Columbia to the Windward Islands and northern Venezuela to Aruba, Bonaire and Curacao. These areas should see bands of potentially flooding rainfall and strong wind gusts from this system as it tracks through

over the next couple of days.

For what is expected to be another busy hurricane season, there's already been one early storm.

Alex started as a tropical depression early this month in the Gulf of Mexico and grew into a tropical storm. It churned north-northeast into the Atlantic Ocean and brought storm conditions to Bermuda although it turned out to be less severe than initially feared.

Electric buses may be in the pipeline

Minister for Tourism and Transport Kenneth Bryan spoke with *Caymanian Times* publisher Ralph Lewis this week about his thoughts on current tourism and transport issues. In part one of this discussion, the Minister talks about the implementation of electric busses for the Cayman Islands.

Minister Bryan and his team, which included the Tourism Director Rosa Harris who was acting in her capacity as Chairperson for the Transportation Board, recently travelled to Barbados for the International Roads Federation Conference. While the team were involved in presentations on the technical aspects of road creation in the region, Minister Bryan revealed they had some specific goals.

"What we hoped to do on that trip was to examine the Barbados transportation system as they are one of the leading small island states in the Caribbean that is moving forward with electric busses. They have over 40 electric busses and they operate with Wi-Fi/ A/C and are very environmentally-friendly," he advised.

"The good news from what we saw is that we don't have to reinvent the wheel," the Minister said, outlining that such busses were very much in line with the government's desire to have a more environmentally sustainable and reliable transport system.

The Minister said he looked forward to more dialogue with the Barbados government soon in this respect to borrow some of their processes. He said they had an idea of the amount of busses Cayman would need, around two per route, at a total of between 23 and 25 busses.

Minister Bryan said they were already learning from Barbados's mistakes in that they did not charge their busses via solar power. He said the government was looking at building a solar powered station, to become more sustainable. They were looking also at who would oversee the electric busses.

"I don't think the current set up with the transport unit is ideal. I'm looking more to an authority or government-owned company because I think transportation, at least in the initial stages, should be something within the power of the people rather than a company, or a PPP partnership with the private sector," he advised.

Changes to Cayman's legislation was on the cards to make it happen, he said, including giving busses more priority on Cayman's roads. Changes would not take place in this Budget cycle (which ends on 31 December 2023) but would be in place in the Ministry's Budget submission for 2024 to 2025.

When taking into consideration the impact such a new bus system might have on existing bus operators, Minister Bryan said that it was well-known which way they were going on the issue, although they were trying to ensure Caymanian bus drivers would get priority on any new hirings and that they would get a salary, thereby avoiding competition to ensure a comprehensive system that served everybody.

"It's the will of the people," he said. "The public have said its not reliable, its not safe its not what we want."

Government online services better but need improvement

In a new report looking at government eServices issued by the Office of the Auditor General, the Auditor General Sue Winspear says that while many government services are now online, there is still room for improvement.

Ms Winspear said she was pleased that a large number of government services were available online, allowing people to conduct essential government business from the comfort and safety of their homes and that “there has been a marked increase in shifting government services online in the recent past, and Cayman now compares well to the top 20 online services provided by governments globally.”

However, she noted that some services, like environmental permits and land title registration applications, were not available online.

“In addition, some services like applying for a driver’s licence still cannot be fully completed online,” she stated. “I urge the government to work towards providing these, and more services, online.”

The report states that the E-Government Unit has played an integral role in shifting the government services online by providing specialist and technical advice. However, government needed to do more to improve the e-government programme’s strategic direction and oversight.

“The government drafted an e-Government strategy in 2015 but never finalised it,” Ms Winspear advised. “One of the main projects in the 2015 draft strategy was the development of the national identity (ID) database and this project is significantly delayed and still requires primary legislation before it can be introduced.”

At the moment, people have to enter and re-enter personal detail into many separate online systems. Having a national ID system would eliminate this need making it more efficient and effective for the public, she believed.

Ms Winspear added: “In 2021, the government started drafting a new E-Government Strategy, a welcome development. However, the draft strategy has significant gaps, such as any references to driving improved efficiency.”

As a result, she said she had noted a recent increase in software write-offs across the government, and an overarching strategy should help alleviate this.

“I urge the government to further develop, finalise and publish a new strategy as soon as possible.”

She also said that government was starting to collect data on customer satisfaction in using online services, but had not yet started to systematically monitor and report on this.

“This is important to determine how easy customers find online services to use and will help identify what improvements are needed,” the Auditor General

said. “We also found that the government is not capturing the cost of designing, developing and delivering its projects for online services. This is a significant gap as it is essential information for demonstrating value for money.”

In response to the report, the Ministry of Investment, Innovation and Social Development said it welcomed the feedback and recommendations.

Acting Chief Officer Tamara Ebanks said in many cases items related to areas outside the ambit of the eGovernment Unit, however, they were pleased that many of the recommendations specific to the department were already being complied with or were being actioned currently.

Deputy Governor Franz Manderson said he was proud that using benchmarks against other jurisdictions, the report documented that government had launched, or enhanced, a large number of online services since 2010.

“People can now access over 70 different government services online, including many of the top 20 services provided by governments worldwide. Having so

many of our services online to make people’s lives better has been an important accomplishment,” he advised.

The Report’s highlights included that eGovernment’s project management has been effective and the strategy it had pursued largely has aligned with what the United Nations considered to be strategic best practices. Overall customer satisfaction with eGovernment’s projects had been positive. In addition, the report found that eGovernment’s projects had enhanced staff efficiency in the respective departments – including the Department of Commerce and Investment as well as the Royal Cayman Islands Police Service.

Ian Tibbetts, Director of the eGovernment Unit, said that during the time period covered by the report, the eGovernment Unit had laid the technical foundation and framework for a national and digital ID system.

“Initiatives such as these are designed to make the Cayman Islands government increasingly agile and responsive, for the benefit of our residents and businesses,” he said.

Future of Financial Services Forum in Switzerland Yields Strong Local Insights

A global view on the digital economy and sustainable finance, and gaining a better appreciation of the Cayman Islands' strengths and opportunities as a result, were strong outcomes for the Cayman Islands delegation attending the Point Zero Forum in Switzerland.

Minister of Financial Services and Commerce, the Hon. André Ebanks, led the delegation to the invite-only, inaugural forum in Switzerland, from 21 to 23 June. Organ-

isers invited the Cayman Islands following an impromptu discussion between Minister Ebanks and the Monetary Authority of Singapore's Chief Fintech Officer, Sopnandu Mohanty, during the Ministry's May 2022 UK/EU engagement.

Minister Ebanks said valuable insights, from both presenters and during informal discussions, have helped to inform the way forward for the Cayman Islands on several matters related to the digital economy.

"A key takeaway was that, while no jurisdiction has fully mastered the regulation of virtual assets, the Cayman Islands has laid a strong foundation by incorporating global standards into our regulation," he said.

"But we can't sit back, because virtual assets are evolving rapidly," Minister Ebanks noted. "This means the Cayman Islands Monetary Authority (CIMA), which regulates the sector, will work with the Ministry to continue building our compliance framework and capacity."

Accompanying Minister Ebanks was CIMA's Managing Director Cindy Scotland, and Acting Deputy Managing Director, General Counsel, Angelina Partridge; Government's Financial Services Representative to the UK, Gene DaCosta; and Cayman Enterprise City CEO Charlie Kirkconnell.

"It was beneficial to attend the inaugural Point Zero Forum to absorb a range of stakeholder perspectives on the need for suitable policy and regulation in respect of digital as-

sets, and to engage with fellow regulators/policymakers on how to shape oversight of this rapidly developing sector," Mrs Scotland said.

Minister Ebanks said the forum further highlighted strong synergies between the digital economy, ESG and fintech, singling out the vast use of blockchain technology and its potential applications in many other areas.

"It's also apparent that to build our ESG framework successfully and efficiently, fintech can play a pivotal role - for example, through the use of enhanced data analytics," he said.

The Swiss Secretariat for International Finance, and Elevandi (a company set up by the Monetary Authority of Singapore to advance fintech in the digital economy) organised Point Forum. Attendees, including global leaders, founders and investors, agreed that stronger cross-jurisdictional collaboration between regulators is necessary, to keep pace with developments.

Laws to Attract Insurance Business, and to Help Senior Citizens, Now in Force

The Insurance (Amendment) Act, 2022 and the Public Recorder (Amendment) Act, 2022 are now in force following their publication today in the Cayman Islands Gazette.

The Insurance Act amendment is intended to strengthen the Cayman Islands' position in international reinsurance and domestic insurance. The Public Recorder Act amend-

ment is part of Government's initiative to ease senior citizens' financial burdens.

The Cayman Islands Parliament passed both Acts on 8 June, during its First Sitting of the Third Meeting of the 2021-2022 Session. His Excellency the Governor assented to both Acts on 24 June.

Capella Music Festival is returning for a summer show at the Festival Green at Camana Bay on Saturday, July 16, 2022. The festival will be returning for the first time since December 2017, with an extended full-day show providing attendees with an immersive day of music bringing together legendary artists across the music worlds of pop, pop-rock, and reggae.

This year's lineup will feature for the first time in Cayman, British Pop star Charli XCX known for her catalogue of huge hits, faultless synchronised dancing, and seamless costume changes, Charli delivers a mesmerising celebration of all things pop, known for her most commercially successful number one hit with Icona Pop 'I Love It', 'Boom Clap' and 'Doing It' featuring Rita Ora. Charli is no stranger to performing at major music festivals across the world and always delivers a show of true unadulterated fun, currently touring Europe and North America on her 'Crash' Tour, Cayman will experience a taster at Capella.

From pop to pop-rock the show will see the return of multiple Grammy Award-winning singer and songwriter Michael Bolton to Cayman. Bolton who has sold more than

65 million records globally and continues to tour the world headlined the Cayman Islands Jazz Fest in 2008. Bolton's music travels over the decades with his hits such as 'How am I supposed to live without you', 'Soul Provider' and 'How can we be Lovers'. In recognition of his artistic achievements, Bolton has won two Grammys for Best Pop Male Vocal Performance, with four nominations, six American Music Awards, three Emmy Award nominations, and has a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame. As a songwriter, he has earned more than 24 BMI & ASCAP Awards, including Songwriter of the Year and the Hitmakers Award from the Songwriters Hall of Fame, Bolton is a true pop legend.

In good company three-time Grammy award winner and Golden Globe nominee, Wyclef Jean will be performing for the first time in Cayman on the Capella Stage. Wyclef Jean exploded onto the scene as a founding member of legendary hip hop band The Fugees, alongside Lauryn Hill and Pras Michael, and has created meaningful music with substance ever since. In 1996, the Fugees released their monumental album *The Score*, since then, Wyclef has released eight albums

as a solo artist that have sold nearly nine million copies worldwide, while he also released the commercially successful singles '911' featuring Mary J. Blige, 'Sweetest Girl' featuring Akon, Niia and Lil Wayne', he featured on Destiny Child's 'No, No, No', and the US Billboard Hot 100 number one single 'Hips Don't Lie' by Shakira; and wrote and produced the single 'Maria Maria' by Santana. Wyclef is set to bring a high energy performance to the Capella Stage.

As a Caribbean curated festival, Capella will always have a strong focus on reggae music, a favourite of the Island and the world, the show will feature two great Legends of Reggae music; Maxi Priest one of the most successful reggae fusion acts of all time, he released his first major album was in 1988, along with his cover of Cat Stevens' 'Wild World', establishing him as one of the top British reggae singers. He is one of only two British reggae acts, along with UB40 to have an American Billboard number one with 'Close to You' in 1990. Priest had joined UB40 on tour in 2007, culminating in sold-out shows at the National Exhibition Centre, and his 2014 album *Easy to Love* entered the Billboard Top Reggae Albums Chart at number two, Priest's top hits include, 'Close to you', 'Wild World', 'Just a Little Bit Longer' and 'Some Guys Have All the Luck', which he continues to perform at festivals and shows worldwide.



Parents Show Interest in Homeschooling Programmes

Since the start of the 2021-2022 academic year, The Department of Education Services (DES) has approved approximately one hundred and twenty-three homeschooling applications, with scores of parents also expressing interest in engaging their children in homeschooling.

Veteran homeschool teacher Kathleen Spencer outlined why parents were considering taking the step to homeschool their children. "Over the past few years, educational companies have begun offering services, including online tutoring, online live courses and providing additional support for parents who choose to teach their children at home. Similarly, curricula only offered in textbook and teacher guide format are now offered with live instructors online and via zoom meetings, bringing confidence to many parents considering taking the step to homeschool their children."

However, Department of Education Services (DES) Customer Service Manager Mrs. Gloria Bell reminds parents that homeschool arrangements must be approved by the DES.

"Although resources are now readily available, parents interested in homeschooling their children must seek DES' approval before engaging in any homeschool programme," she said. "That way, we can ensure the programmes offered are adequately suited to children's needs."

To apply for homeschooling, parents/guardians must complete the homes-

chool application form online at <https://schools.edu.ky/Pages/SchoolRegistration.aspx>.

Parents must also show proof of the child's immigration status and of enrolment into a Homeschooling programme, along with the completed application form

The DES then reviews the application and issues a Home School certificate to the applicant upon approval.

Mrs. Bell also cautioned parents about withdrawing their children from school before receiving DES' approval. "All school-aged children must be registered in an educational institution as stated in the Education Law, 2016. So, parents who withdraw children from school without proper authorisation are in breach of the law."

DES Customer Service Officers periodically conduct home visits to ensure that persons

adhere to the programme and that students are making progress.

Ms. Spencer expressed her delight about the DES oversight and involvement in the Homeschooling process. "Since the Department of Education Services' involvement in the homeschool process, they have invited us to many inter-school tournaments and activities. Our students have also had a chance to participate in competitions that were out of reach only a few years ago," Ms. Spencer remarked.

She continued, "Some homeschoolers have reached high levels of achievement in these competitions. For example, high school students Nickcoy Stewart and Tayvanna Myles took home medals in four of the events at the 2022 Inter-secondary Athletics competitions."

Homeschool students have also participated in annual events, including the SeaPerch competition, Inter-school Chess Tournament, Rotary Science Fair, Annual Spelling Bee Competition, The National Children's Festival of the Arts, Interschool Math Tournament, and Mentoring Cayman.

Homeschool Award Ceremony

On Friday, June 10, 2022, many of Cayman's homeschool families gathered at the outdoor Amphitheater at Dart Park for the second year to celebrate and applaud students for their hard work during the 2021-2022 academic year.

Over 100 people attended the gathering, including families completing their first year of homeschooling, veterans who had been teaching their children for many years, and other parents interested in learning more about homeschooling.

Customer Service Manager, Mrs. Gloria Bell, and Nicki Samuels, Senior Customer Service Officer were also in attendance representing the Department of Education Services (DES).

The event featured a bouncy castle, ice cream truck, gift cards courtesy of Next Chapter and free products from the Fitness Centre.

The Board is composed of nine elected ad personam (on an individual basis) members from around the globe.

The EMS is an international postal Express Mail Service, for documents and merchandise, offered by postal operators of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) connecting 175 countries and territories worldwide.

With 182 designated operators, EMS transports eight million packages every week and boasts the world's largest international delivery network, according to the EMS website www.ems.post

Postmaster General Sheena Glasgow said, "Being elected as Vice-Chair of this global organisation after just two years' membership on the board is a fantas-

To be able to represent the Cayman Islands Postal Service on an international decision-making body is a tremendous opportunity and privilege. The EMS Cooperative was set up at the 22nd Congress of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) in Beijing, China in

September 1999 to promote enhanced support among members. The UPU is a United Nations specialised agency and the postal sector's primary forum for international cooperation.

The role of the EMS Cooperative is to promote cooperation between its member postal services to provide customers with a high quality, competitive express mail service worldwide.

The EMS Cooperative is structured around three management bodies: the General Assembly, composed of all members of the EMS Cooperative, the EMS Cooperative Board, and the EMS Unit, which is the executive arm of the Cooperative based at the International Bureau of the UPU.

Attendees at the EMS Cooperative General Assembly in May numbered 167, with participants representing 81 countries. The two-day event was in a hybrid format to allow members to meet face to face and remote participation.

A key topic discussed at the 25th EMS Cooperative General Assembly, held at the UPU headquarters in Switzerland, was the need to grow EMS business as global markets recover from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Experts arrive for Restoration of Doppler Radar

Work continues to restore radar service



The Cayman Islands National Weather Service (CINWS) confirms international experts are expected to arrive in Grand Cayman in mid-July 2022 to restore the Kearney Gomez Doppler Radar to full working order.

The weather radar went offline on 21 October 2021 due to issues with the back-up generator; damage to the dome resulting

from Tropical Storm Grace, and a failed radar part.

The back-up generator was repaired in May 2022, and CINWS Director General John Tibbetts says work to fix the radar and seal the dome is expected to commence next month when a representative of the radar manufacturer arrives in Grand Cayman.

"The manufacturing representative will be on-island from approximately mid-July to inspect the radar equipment and the dome before commencing the necessary repairs," he said. "The international expert is expected to remain on-island until the repairs are complete and the radar is in good working order once again."

While the weather radar is an important asset in the CINWS meteorological toolkit, Mr. Tibbetts says it is complimented by other services and tools.

"The radar helps us monitor meteorological conditions as far as Jamaica, and is helpful for providing small-scale predictions. For tracking storms further afield, we use the Cayman Islands Government's GOES-R satellite system," he said.

Ministry of Sustainability & Climate Resiliency Acting Chief Officer Troy Jacob says the Government is looking forward to having the radar system back up and running as soon as possible, and ahead of what is typically the busiest portion of the Atlantic Hurricane Season.

"Even though repairs to the weather radar have been delayed by supply chain issues, caused largely by reduced production during the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as availability of technical expert resources post-pandemic and post-Tropical Storm Grace, the team at our National Weather Service has continued to work to secure the parts and expertise necessary to get this important national asset back up and running, all while continuing to deliver accurate, timely forecasts, advisories and warnings for the country. We intend to keep the country informed of our progress with the repairs, and hope to have another update shortly" Mr. Jacob said.

Government settles with local animal welfare groups

Feral cat control operations resume in Little Cayman



Feral cat control operations in Little Cayman resumed this month following a settlement agreement between the Cayman Islands Government and local animal welfare charities Feline Friends and the Cayman Islands Humane Society.

After more than three years of negotiations, the animal charities agreed to close the matter through payment of their legal costs, which amounted to CI\$25,000.

Cabinet approved the settlement to ensure invasive species management in the Sister Islands could resume in earnest.

Ministry of Sustainability & Climate Resilience Chief Officer Jennifer Ahearn said the control measures are essential to protecting threatened native and endemic fauna in the Sister Islands from the threat of predation, competition and hybridisation.

"At the heart of this matter is the urgent need to protect vulnerable species – such as the Red-Footed Booby and the endemic Sister Islands Rock Iguana – from go-

ing extinct because of invasive predators. A protracted battle through the Courts would have only prolonged the suffering of our native species and the feral cats while amounting significant legal fees for all parties," Mrs. Ahearn said. "We respect the important work our local animal welfare charities do to prevent animal suffering and reduce the number of homeless pets in our community. This settlement allows Government to close out this matter so our environmental experts can progress our conservation aims in the Sister Islands."

Feral cat control operations resume

Following the settlement, a team from the Department of Environment (DoE) and Department of Agriculture (DoA) travelled to Little Cayman to register and microchip domestic, companion cats, prior to recommencing feral cat control operations.

Six nights of trapping resulted in the capture of 40 cats; including four registered domestic, companion cats which were returned to their owners.

Trapped cats were attended by the DoA's Senior Veterinary Officer each morning, with assistance from the DoE. All trapped cats were carefully scanned in the trap to verify their identity. Registered pet cats which were trapped, scanned for a microchip and had their identity verified, were released back to their owner's care.

A representative of the Cayman Islands Humane Society observed all aspects of the control operations, which were conducted humanely.

Invasive species management efforts receive international funding

In 2022, the DoE was awarded a CI\$535,000 Darwin Grant in partnership with the DoA, the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds and the University of Aberdeen to establish more solid biosecurity protocols and implement effective invasive species management in Cayman Brac and Little Cayman through increased capacity, improved knowledge, and community engagement.

Although the legal dispute focused on feral cats, DoE Director Gina Ebanks-Petrie said there are a number of other invasive species negatively impacting Sister Islands' flora and fauna.

"While feral cats and green iguanas are perhaps the most obvious threats to our native and endemic fauna, other species like rats can also have significant, negative impacts. The Darwin Grant funding will allow us to improve our inter-island biosecurity efforts and safeguard our Sister Islands unique biodiversity."

Part of the efforts will include estimating cat population density using wildlife cameras and a feasibility study to determine if eradication of feral cats from Little Cayman is technically, socially and economically possible.

Director of Agriculture Adrian Estwick said the Department is a proud partner in local biosecurity efforts and also encouraged pet owners to be part of the solution.

"We each have a role to play as individuals to support local biosecurity efforts," he said. "One example is not attempting to illegally or improperly import food or plants into the country that could bring with them invasive pests or harmful diseases. Another is responsible pet ownership – please spay and neuter your pets to prevent the creation of feral cat colonies and reduce the burden on local shelters."

Background

In 2018 the DoE and DoA undertook a joint project in the Sister Islands to protect vulnerable native and endemic fauna from predation by feral cats.

The project was halted by a temporary injunction obtained by Feline Friends and the Humane Society.

Efforts to reach an agreement outside of Court were unsuccessful and, in November 2021, the Government moved to have the issue listed for a hearing. In February 2022, Feline Friends and the Humane Society presented the opportunity to bring closure to the matter through payment of their legal costs to date and Cabinet approved the agreement.

The settlement will not impact the Government's forecast financial performance for the 2022 financial year and will not increase overall planned expenditure.

JA's million reasons to smile



► Jamaican tourism has bounced back

Jamaica has already reached one million stopover visitors in 2022, official figures show, a remarkable record considering how dire the tourism industry has been over the last two years.

That number instantly puts the island among the most-visited destinations in the Caribbean so far this year.

Traveller Brian Simmons was the one millionth visitor, arriving at Montego Bay's Sangster Airport on JetBlue flight 1479 from New York's John F. Kennedy Airport.

It's part of a continued tourism rebound for the island, which first reopened for tourism in summer 2020. "This moment is a testament to the confidence that the market shows in Jamaica as well as the strength, resilience and enduring appeal of Jamaica's tourism product as we build

back stronger," said Jamaica Tourism Minister Edmund Bartlett.

The milestone also comes as Jamaica celebrates the 60th anniversary of its Independence.

The figures show Jamaica's strong recovery from earlier pandemic travel restrictions.

Bartlett believes Jamaica is positioned for a strong 2022-23 season. On June 4, the country welcomed new service into Sangster International from Austin, Texas, with Saturday flights.

Bartlett said the new service marks "the strengthening of relations with the south-eastern region of US market," part of "building capacity to drive the arrival numbers and develop a more robust route in the future."

He added: "The projection for summer 2022 is that arrival numbers will be higher than the corresponding period in 2019. Based on bookings we are well ahead of 2019."

Bartlett emphasised that Jamaica's early work to establish a Global Resilience Centre based in Montego Bay was crucial to the country's ability to tackle the pandemic.

Jamaica also worked to maintain its tourism workforce's safety, financial viability and training for to work under new health protocols.

"We were able to fund personal protective equipment for (hospitality and tourism) staff, including many still on furlough. We trained 20,000 workers who were home online. Then we established the first Resilient Corridor, our own bubble that was able to provide a level of safety and security to visitors. All of that allowed us

to have a tourism recovery that was faster than the rest of the world."

Meanwhile, tour operator TUI has significantly ramped up its flight service to Jamaica this summer. The company has increased its flight program there by 10,000 seats this summer, according to Torrance Lewis, of the Jamaica Tourist Board.

TUI has been the leading tour operator for Jamaica for "many years," said Donovan White, Jamaica's Director of Tourism.

"We are proud of our strong partnership with the TUI group and we very much look forward to building and strengthening our relationship," he said, speaking following a familiarisation trip to the island by 20 United Kingdom-based travel agents.

It's another sign of Jamaica and the wider Caribbean's growing position as a year-round destination, a trend that took hold in the heart of the pandemic.

Grenada has new Mitchell as PM

Grenada's longest serving prime minister lost in a tight general elections and was succeeded by a newcomer.

Dickon Mitchell's National Democratic Congress party gained 52 percent of votes compared with 48 percent for Keith Mitchell's New National Party. The incoming party won nine of 15 constituencies.

Keith Mitchell became prime minister in 1995 and served until 2008, then won again in 2018 in a landslide. He had asked voters this year to give him "one for the road."

Keith Mitchell, 75, is a former professional cricketer and a statistician who once worked with the U.S government but returned to Grenada following the 1983 US invasion that occurred just days after the island's pro-Marxist leader was executed.

The incoming prime minister is no relation. Baby-faced Dickon Mitchell is a 44-year-old attorney and former teacher

who became leader of his party in October. He has pledged to improve health care, decrease unemployment and poverty, build affordable housing and boost education.

Grenada has a population of 114,000. It oversees two other small islands. Carriacou and Petite Martinique.

Guyana's law ensures locals will profit

Guyana's new Local Content Law is meant to strike a delicate balance for foreign and local involvement in its nascent oil and gas sector and, according to President Dr Irfaan Ali, the country should accumulate at least US\$650 million from local production by the end of this year.

Ali said that conservative estimates project that local businesses and Guyanese nationals will earn this sum by year-end. Of that figure, some US\$80 million alone will be earned through direct employment costs.

And these benefits and the government's ability to monitor how Guyanese are benefitting from local produce in the new sector is made possible through the new local law, Dr Ali said.

He said: "What local content legislation allows us to do is establish an infrastructure and institutional environment in which we can measure the impact in the local environment."

The new Local Content law was enacted in December 2021, and demands oil-and-gas companies, their contractors and sub-contractors to hire/procure goods, services and employment from Guyanese companies and Guyanese nationals.

Guyana and Suriname are hoping to work together to develop their oil and gas resources and establish a wider energy corridor with northern Brazil. This is expected to ensure that the Caribbean region is energy secure.


