

# Elmslie Memorial Church celebrates 100 years

It was actually 102 years ago, on July 1 1920, that Rev. Robert C. Young laid the cornerstone to a big new church they had decided to build in memory of Rev. Elmslie who had come to Cayman in the mid 1800s after finding out that there was no organized church there. He rode all over Grand Cayman by horseback, preaching the gospel and planting little churches so the congregation who had been meeting on the same spot decided it was time to make a beautiful church for future generations

It's a very special church and for a long time has been much more than just a Church. Before all the big concrete offices and shopping malls overshadowed, it, Elmslie Church was the very heart of George Town. Fragrant flowers filled the church like beautiful memories of all the wonderful people who have made it into a great big family, as the church service began. The bible reading from Mrs. Mary Bowerman was from Joshua Chapter four, and it was all about the Israelites making heap of 12 big stones, taken from the river that God had just dried up to help them


Minister Rev. Christopher Mason used the bible reading for his message. "The memorial stones were to be a reminder of their own personal experience .....verse six tells us the memorial will cause the children to ask, "what do these stones mean to you?" these stones are, first of all to be a reminder to those who are present. It was a reminder for them of their personal experience with God. What they saw, heard and felt. It's a reminder for us to tell our story .....keep a clear memory of what God did for you," he said.

Ms. Evelyn Rockett read out a history of the church. "The church was built by Captain Rayall Bodden and many others. We are still collecting the names of all the people who helped build it. All of the blocks that you see in the walls of this building were built by hand, there was no Flowers block back then. It took approximately two years to complete this building, and it went through the 1932 storm, it went through Ivan, and you know how close we are to the sea so it tells you how well built this church is. The pews that you are sitting on are made of mahogany and are 100 years old Do you see what great condition they are in?," she said.

funds to build this building? Well, they reached out to Caymanians who were abroad, and collected 800 pounds, and

according to a calculator that I was given, that would equate to 38,088 pounds. That's quite a lot of money and most people didn't have much money at that time. This building was important to them. Today it is only fitting that on the anniversary of those stones being laid 102 years ago, that we pay tribute to those who toiled and served in this church. The next thing for us to do is to prepare ourselves to pass the torch on, so we have to make sure not only that the building remains strong, but that our faith and our missionary work continues."

There were many people who have either served in the church, or have close ties to it. Outside Sheila McKenzie was having her photo taken in front of the cornerstone laid by her grandfather, Reve Robert C young. "This has meant a lot to me because it brings wonderful memories of family," she said.

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# New eco-friendly spirits system launched

Agua Hospitality Group is bringing a brand-new eco-friendly spirits concept to Cayman, which they are calling a "huge step forward" for the industry.

The group, which began with Agua Restaurant and now the Next Door Cocktail Bar, is opening three additional venues this year, and is led by Agua partners Walter Fajette, Cristiano Vincentini and Wayne Epple. They have partnered with ecoSPIRITS and believe the new system of how spirits are delivered to the customer, negating the need for glass bottles, will make an important contribu-



tion to preserving the islands' precious natural heritage.

The new system, called a closed loop service, is being brought into Cayman by ecoSPIRITS under a Licensed Operator Agreement with Agua Hospitality Group. ecoSPIRITS Cayman Islands marks the arrival of closed loop spirits in ecoSPIRITS' third island market, following launches earlier this year in Bermuda and the Seychelles. As part of the collaboration, Agua Hospitality Group will begin distribution of a portfolio of craft spirits, starting with True Believers brands. ecoSPIRITS Climate Partner brands Tried & True Vodka, Mackintosh Blended Malt Scotch, Los Arcos Destilado de Agave and Widges Gin will be will be available in an ecoTOTE format across the island from early July, a brilliant eco-friendly container that means glass bottles are not needed to be transported to the island.

The system comprises of a dedicated production and warehouse facility established by Agua Hospitality Group which hosts and operates ecoPLANT No. 027, the first ecoPLANT in the Caribbean region. This will be the location where each ecoTOTE is filled with the brand name spirits and to which the empty ecoTOTEs will then be returned, cleaned, sterilised, and refilled. Bars and restaurants can be supplied with the ecoTOTEs, thereby creating an environmentally-friendly alternative to the thousands of glass bottles which end up in the landfill every year.

Like Bermuda and the Seychelles, ecoSPIRITS Cayman Islands will join the ecoSPIRITS Oceans Program, operating a fleet of blue Ocean Conservation edition ecoTOTEs and funding one kilogramme of ocean waste recovery for each eco-TOTE delivered to bars, restaurants and hotels in the islands. One of ecoSPIRITS Cayman Islands' first venue partners will be the Kimpton Seafire Resort + Spa.

Wayne Epple, Group General Manager, Agua Hospitality Group & Managing Director, ecoSPIRITS Cayman Islands, is proud to be on the cutting edge of such important technology.

"Never had I thought there would be an opportunity for the hospitality and spirits industries to become a major sustainability player by reducing carbon emissions and eliminating single use glass - but this is exactly what ecoSPIR-ITS is doing globally," he stated. "Here in the Cayman Islands, rising sea levels are impacting mangrove and marine life and single use packaging is contributing to landfill waste that burdens our limited landmass. The ecoSPIRITS closed loop technology provides a unique, sustainable solution by reducing CO2 emissions and landfill - as single use glass bottles don't even arrive onshore. This is a huge step forward, something we are extremely proud to be a part of."

# Regiment Successfully Concludes Training Exercise and Beach Clean up

The Cayman Islands Regiment (CIR) concluded a nine-day "enduring response" deployment exercise as the culmination of a series of training exercises aimed to facilitate any future deployment to provide national emergency support.

The exercise was designed to train, prepare and test CIR personnel to endure outdoor living conditions with minimal shelter, power, air conditioning and other essentials and to respond to an emergency or national disaster, in which there might be difficulty with transportation and shelter.

Throughout the training exercise, operating bases were established at the Ed Bush Stadium in West Bay and Barefoot Beach in East End

Commenting on the training exercises, CIR Captain Gabe Rabess explained "CIR personnel received training on preparing personal shelter, how to cook meals using ration packs, and clearing the camp area after setup to ensure limited exposure and risks to the environment from hazards such as fires. They also received training on personal hygiene, hand signals, and casualty evacuation simulations."

"There was torrential rain for the first two to three days at our West Bay deployment base, so conditions were great for training in heavy rain and tropical storm weather like conditions," noted CIR Commanding Officer, Lieutenant Colonel Simon Watson.

In addition to self-sufficiency training, CIR personnel also underwent a 24-hour exercise at Barefoot Beach.

"We dropped off our personnel in North Side, five kilometres away from Barefoot Beach, they then carried out a loaded march with 55lb of kit with all the key necessities they would need. This included a sleeping system, water and food and all the tools, clothing and equipment necessary to survive for 24 – 48hrs. This was done to test personnel on self-sufficiency and endurance in all-weather system scenarios to determine speed, efficiency and resiliency, to provide aid if needed in an emergency. Though it was tough they successfully completed the exercise with 55 pounds in just over 50 mins", explained Lieutenant Colonel Watson.

As a uniformed service, the ethos of the CIR is building on the Cayman Islands' resilience to provide a national reserve service and support to all three islands. As such all CIR training is undertaken in collaboration and partnership with other emergency services, such as Hazard Management (HMCI) and Emergency Medical Services (EMS), Royal Cayman Islands Police Service (RCIPS), Cayman Islands Coast Guard (CICG) and Cayman Islands Fire Service (CIFS). This ensures personnel are trained to provide resilience and support in any national emergency such as an earthquake, pandemic, tropical storm, hurricane or major fire.

"The training exercise was an opportunity to instil teamwork and partnership amongst our personnel building on team strength in the outdoors under difficult conditions. CIR also wanted to take this opportunity to provide an environmental service to our community as it was important for us to leave any training area or environment in a better condition. As such we reached out to Plastic Free Cayman, a fantastic local environmental organization doing great work on our beaches, to collaborate with us on a beach clean-up. Sixty members of the regiment along with Plastic Free Cayman came together to clear debris, litter and plastics previously along Barefoot Beach," commented Lieutenant Colonel Watson.

Claire Hughes, head of Plastic Free Cayman, noted "We joined the Regiment on their beach clean-up today because it's vital to get plastic off our beaches. By doing so we prevent it from breaking up into smaller microplastics which are detrimental to our environment. We found a lot of bottle caps, micro plastics, bottles and straws, fishing line, plastic toothbrushes washed up making up over 600lbs. In addition, a massive metal structure from a dock or part of boat, possibly from Hurricane Ivan was removed from beach."

Commenting on the annual training and the Ministry's overall development plans for the CI Regiment, Minister for Home Affairs Hon. Min. Sabrina Turner noted, "as part of my Ministry introductory meeting I met with Lieutenant Colonel Watson and his team to discuss plans and development of the Regiment, as well as planning for this training exercise."

"Over the weekend, I spent some time with the CIR personnel who were deployed in the training exercise. As they were preparing for the 5km and air simulation exercises, I was able to see how they were doing and what this experience has been like for them. Most importantly, I was able to thank them for their dedication and willingness to support our uniformed service infrastructure in the event of a national emergency, while also supporting the Cayman Islands Government's vision for sustainability and developing on our national reservists in service," Minister Turner continued.


The Williams Family Quartet performed two brilliantly harmonized songs.

"After two years of limited competition and racing because of COVID-19, our swimmers have a number of awesome opportunities this summer," said CIASA President Steve Broadbelt. He continued, "CCCAN does not have the age group lim-

its that CARIFTA does so our swimmers will find themselves facing some older, more experienced swimmers at CCCAN – which will be great for their continued development. CCCAN is a long course – 50m – meet which Cayman will be able to host when our new 50m pool facility is completed."

# NATIONAL SECURITY COUNIL OF THE CAYMAN ISLANDS – POST MEETING SUMMARIES

The National Security Council (NSC) has agreed to His Excellency the Governor's request to publish short updates on its meetings to enhance transparency and accountability. The NSC's regular meeting takes place monthly but it can also be convened at short notice by His Excellency the Governor or at the request of the Hon Premier or other NSC members.

Summaries of the last 4 meetings are below. His Excellency the Governor Mr. Martyn Roper, OBE, chaired meetings of the National Security Council held in the Cabinet Conference Room, Government Administration Building.

At the meeting held on Tuesday, 8th March 2022, the National Security Council:

- received a security briefing from the Acting Commissioner of Police including crime statistics and updates on efforts to address criminal activity and traffic accidents and driving under the influence;
- received a briefing from the Director of Customs and Border Control on significant seizures of illegal drugs including the recovery of fentanyl; and
- received an update led by the Hon Attorney General on Russia sanctions. Representatives from relevant public service entities including the Financial Reporting Authority (the sanctions coordinator), Maritime Authority Cayman Islands, Civil Aviation Authority, General Registry, Land Registry also provided updates on the status of the implementation of Russia sanctions. A number of actions were recommended including the implementation of a proactive communications strategy around Russia Sanctions.

At the meeting held on Tuesday 12th April 2022, the National Security Council:

- received a security briefing from the Commissioner of Police including crime statistics for the first quarter of 2022 and updates on efforts to address criminal activity including the recovery of several illegal firearms, significant drug seizures and the break-up of an illegal gambling ring. The launch of a new Traffic Unit in Bodden Town was confirmed; and
- received a briefing from the Director of Customs and Border Control on new interceptions of fentanyl and plans to conduct multi-agency training on handling fentanyl.

At the meeting held on Tuesday 10th May 2022, the National Security Council:

- received a security briefing from the Commissioner of Police including updates on efforts to address criminal activity including the two recent firearms related murders and the interception and recovery of several illegal firearms;
- received a briefing from the Director of Customs and Border Control on

recent interceptions of illegal drugs and other significant seizures at the airport. The Director also provided an update regarding irregular Cuban migrants and noted the steps being taken to address the rapid increase in arrivals including the convening of the Mass Migration Committee; and

• received a presentation by the Cayman Islands Regiment on its role and mission, disaster relief capacity, ongoing recruitment, training and development and its readiness for the upcoming hurricane season.

At the meeting held on Tuesday 21st June 2022, the National Security Council:

- received a security briefing from the Acting Commissioner of Police on year to date crime statistics, as well as efforts to address criminal activity including arrests for a number of recent firearms incidents including a civilian staff member of the RCIPS;
- received a briefing from the Director of Customs and Border Control on recent interceptions of illegal drugs, an update on the number of irregular Cuban migrants who are on the island and the interception of an attempt to traffic illegal workers to the Cayman Islands; and
- received a briefing by His Excellency the Governor of an offer from a local charity to make a significant financial contribution to fund national security projects as identified by various CIG stakeholders.

Other issues of national security importance discussed by the National Security Council include:

- cyber security and development of a national risk assessment;
- a new policy on security vetting of staff and classification of documents;
- $\bullet$  the negative impact on crime from

widespread illegal gambling and the need to strengthen fines and legislation to enable the confiscation of the proceeds of crime; and


• the worsening road safety situation, and recommendations to lower the DUI limit and introduce speed cameras.

To expand its scope of telehealth services, the Cayman Islands Health Services Authority (HSA) collaborated with

the R3 Cayman Foundation to offer remote medical consultations to people in Little Cayman.

With its HD Zoom Camera, enhanced audio system, and articulating head, the high-end Intouch Teladoc robot will give

patients and staff of the Little Cayman Clinic the experience and familiarity of a face-to-face encounter with the HSA's remote physicians during initial exams, treatments and in post-procedural follow-ups.

Through the interactive device patients will be able to have more convenient and increased access to their physicians and allied health practitioners at the Faith Hospital and the Cayman Islands Hospital. It would also reduce the time and costs associated with patients having to travel to Cayman Brac and Grand Cayman for elective and emergency consultations.

"This partnership has marked an important milestone in healthcare delivery to Little Cayman community," said Director of Sister Islands Health Services Dr. Srirangan Velusamy. "Virtual consultations through the telemedicine robot would give the residents and visitors of the island much needed access to our specialist physicians. This advanced tech-

nology will be of immense value to the HSA, especially during medical emergencies since our physicians could virtually be there to assist our resident nurses to examine and manage our patients."

The telemedicine service is available at the Little Cayman Clinic starting from Friday, 1 July 2022. The frequency of Faith Hospital physicians' visits to the clinic will remain the same (every Wednesday).

'We believe that healthcare should be easily accessible to everyone in this country, regardless of which district or island you are from. We are delighted to partner with R3 on bringing these telehealth capabilities to the Little Cayman community and are grateful for all their generous support in our mission to make high quality healthcare services accessible to the people of the Cayman Islands," noted HSA Chief Executive Officer Lizzette Yearwood. "The addition of our new telemedicine robot, along with the islands' first purpose-built ambulance and the two registered nurses stationed at the clinic, have substantially enhanced healthcare in Little Cayman. We look forward to continuing to integrate innovative solutions and services that will improve the health of the communities we serve."

# DRAMA IN WESTMINSTER AS BORIS JOHNSON IN POLITICAL CARNAGE

British Prime Minister Boris Johnson was fighting for his political survival on Wednesday after his government was rocked by a series of resignations mainly over questions of the prime minister's personal integrity.

A series of scandals, the most recent being Mr Johnson's appointment of a senior party official with a record of previous sexual misconduct who is again accused of such behaviour, have brought the prime minister's judgement into question.

His government, which has previously been hit by resignations over issues surrounding Mr Johnson's conduct as well as policy decisions, suffered a severe blow when two of his top cabinet ministers quit in quick succession on Tuesday.

The resignations of the Chancellor of the Exchequer (Finance Minister) Rishi Sunak and the Minister of Health Sajid Javid set off a flood of resignations which had reached 38 by Wednesday evening UK time.

A tumultuous sitting of the UK Parliament, the House of Commons, for the weekly Prime Ministers Questions on Wednesday saw Mr Johnson adamantly declaring that he will not resign despite a growing crescendo of calls from within his own ruling Conservative Party, the opposition Labour Party and others for him to quit.

A defiant Boris Johnson maintains that a leadership contest now to replace him would prevent the economic growth needed in the country.

Later on Wednesday afternoon before a House of Commons parliamentary committee the beleaguered prime minister was grilled by MPs of all parties over his policies, and issues of his personal integrity.

He was later in a meeting with members of his cabinet, most of whom including his loyalists it was reported had appealed to him to step down. Those pleas were rejected by Mr Johnson who vowed to fight on.

It was speculated that more resignations were forthcoming over Mr Johnson's refusal to quit.

The prime minister has been beset by a long-running series of questions mainly over his personal integrity and conduct in public office.

He has been battling the so-called Partygate scandal for which after denying that there were any illegal parties at his Number 10 Downing Street office during the lockdown, was forced into an embarrassing u-turn after an independent investigation uncovered evidence including Mr Johnson's presence at some of the events.

He had claimed he thought they were work meetings and not parties but was fined for breaking the very law which he had put in place.

Mr Johnson who remains very popular among a core group of supporters for what some have described as his maverick approach to politics, said recently in an interview that he is not going to undergo 'psychological transformation'.

In 2019 he led the Conservative party to its biggest political victory since Margaret Thatcher on a ticket of 'getting Brexit done' - the campaign that resulted in the UK leaving the European Union.

But since then, making Brexit work has been a major change for Mr Johnson in and has seen a spate of resignations over that and losses the party has suf-

fered under Mr Johnson in a number of by-elections.

This latest crisis is the most serious facing the under-pressure prime minister.

With discontent mounting within the Conservative party over his leadership,

Mr Johnson who survived a vote of confidence in June was expected to face another one possibly as early as next week as MPs of the Conservative Party were set to change the rules which currently limit no-confidence votes to one per year.

The drama in Westminster continues.




