Governor Gore was passionate about the environment and biodiversity. As a keen bird-

er he was instrumental in securing the land which is now Governor Michael Gore's Bird Sanctuary in Spotts which is owned by the National Trust for the Cayman Islands and serves as an urban oasis for waterfowl and other birds. He also opened the boardwalk at Tarpon Lake on Little Cayman in 1995.

On behalf of everyone in the Cayman Islands I send my deepest condolences to Governor Gore's wife Monica, family and friends at this sad time.

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Enhanced: Pirates Festivities 2022

Following a two-year festival hiatus, the Ministers for Youth, Sports, Culture & Heritage, Bernie Bush and for Tourism & Transport, Kenneth Bryan outlined plans for this year's Pirates Festivities, running from 3 September - 26 November.

Bush said: "The reintroduction of Pirates Festivities is the start of a process to be continuously held year to year. This event is a long time held tradition which promotes our islands, brings visibility to our culture and provides our local and talented artists a place to showcase their talents. We are looking forward to seeing local crafts, local musicians and certainly, the thing most people look forward to is the difference between foods from different districts. The way certain foods are cooked and how unique they are."

Bush added that the event is no longer one week but been expanded to three months. He emphasised that the five District Days are spaced out to make it more family friendly and affordable for people and it also gave organisers more time to showcase their heritage and culture.

Although the programme is greatly expanded, Bush highlighted the fact that on the 12 November the traditional Pirates Invasion, when they symbolically capture - or save - the Governor will be staged. "I do hope his sword fighting skills are good," he joked.

Old favourite events are returning, such as Pan in the City, the Steel Pan competition, the Cardboard Regatta, a revitalised Float Parade.

There will also be a half-mile sea swim, organised in conjunction with the Flowers Group. "The benefits of this race will go to the newly formed John Gray High School Swim Club. We'll also see a 5k race which will be organised by the Mustang Track Club and it will be named the Jerry Harper 5k."

Bush requested past sponsors to "come and work with us, especially companies on the water front. We are saying to you that the fireworks display depends on all the companies on the water front working with us. We have to have partnerships to make this a successful event and make it so that everyone will start to look forward to it again."

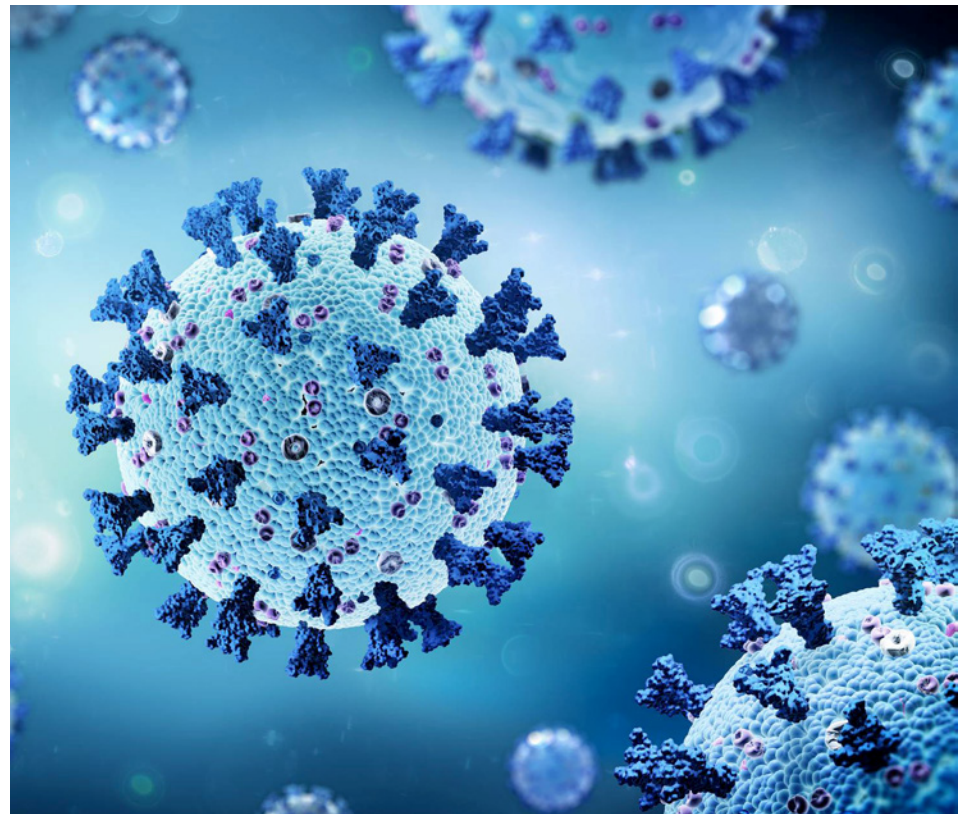
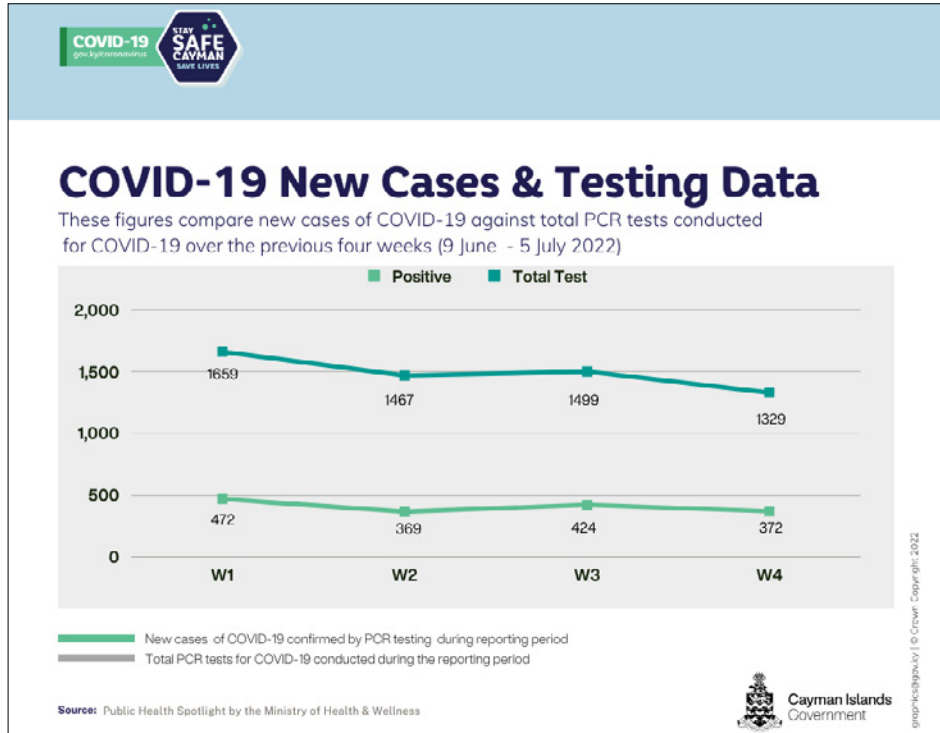

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COVID-19 - Epidemiological Week 26

The Public Health department has published its weekly Public Health Spotlight on Communicable and Non-Communicable Diseases tonight 7 July 2022.

International Situation

Globally, the number of COVID-19 reported cases has increased over the past week by 18%, and the number of reported COVID-19 deaths was similar to the week prior.

Cayman Islands Local Trends

Key indicators have improved over the past week, with the case rate decreasing by

14% from 621 cases per 100,000 population to 535 cases per 100,000. The 7-day rolling average has fallen from 62 to 53 cases and no new deaths were reported. Test positivity has remained stable at 28%, however testing has continued to decline from 1,513 PCR tests conducted in Epi Week 25 to 1,329 PCR tests conducted in Epi Week 26.

Hospital Admissions

Six new hospital admissions were registered during Epi Week 26, a decrease from ten in the previous week. Of the six new admissions, one was admitted due to COVID-19 morbidity, and five were patients detected on screening. A total of 14 patients required inpatient treatment, which increased from 12 patients in the previous week.

Vaccination

During Epi. Week 26, there were 60 adults who received a COVID-19 vaccine (23 first dose and 37 second dose).

Key Message

COVID-19 incidence over the past month has remained around a similar level and the number of PCR tests conducted continues to decline. To understand the impact of the recent changes to COVID-19 regulations, including face masks no longer being mandatory and the removal of a pre-arrival COVID-19 test, it is important that individuals who experience symptoms or have a positive LFT result conduct a confirmation PCR. Without this, we are unable to understand transmission in the community and effectively monitor new variants. Vaccination efforts continue and the vaccine remains our best approach to preventing COVID-19 morbidity and mortality.

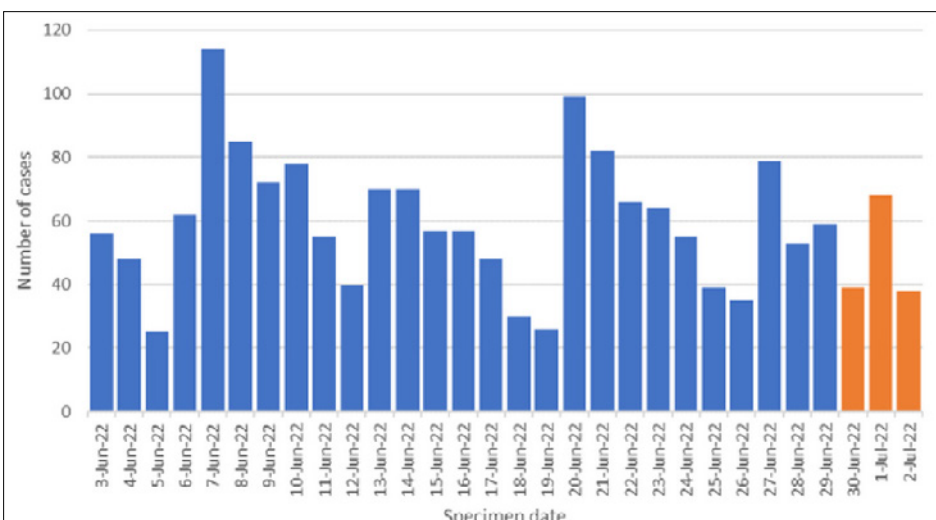

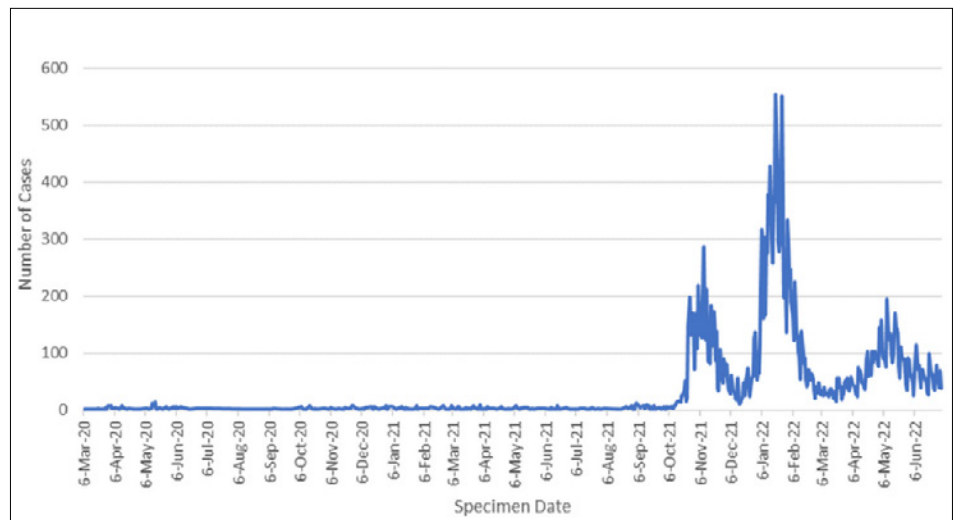

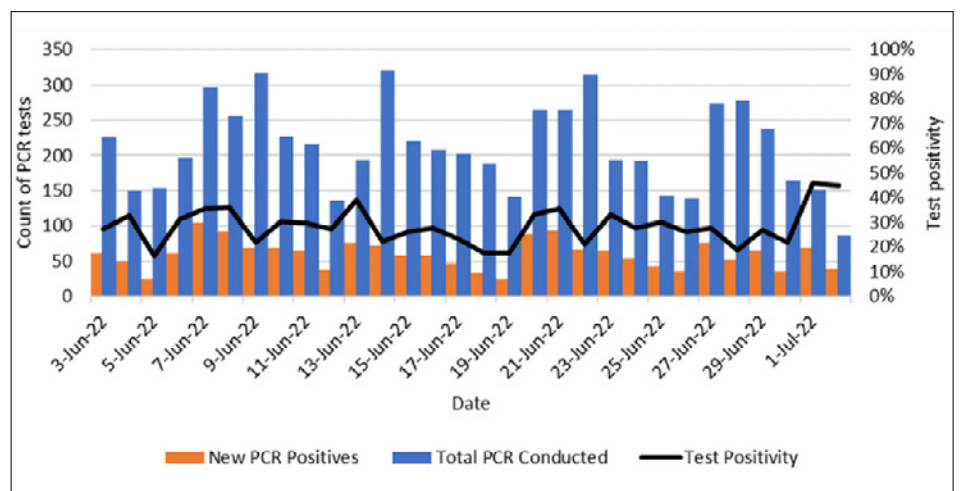
► COVID-19 case numbers

► Total COVID-19 cases since March 2020 by specimen date



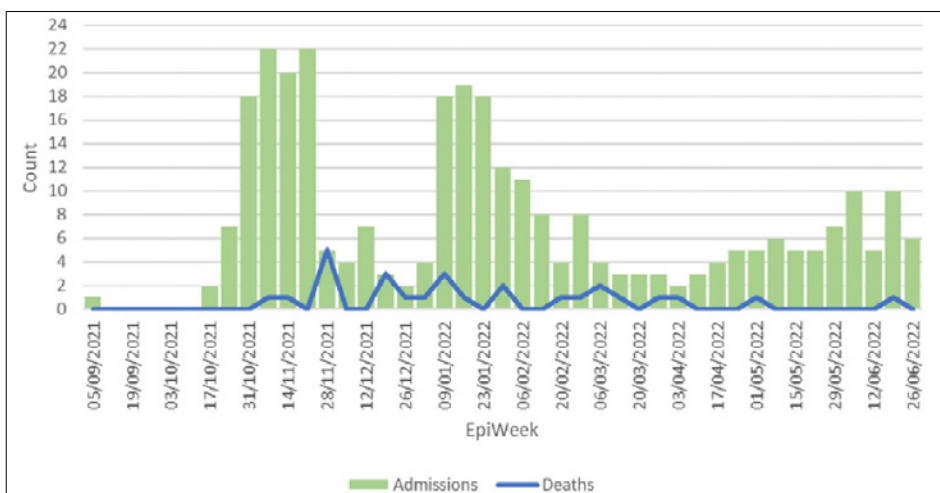

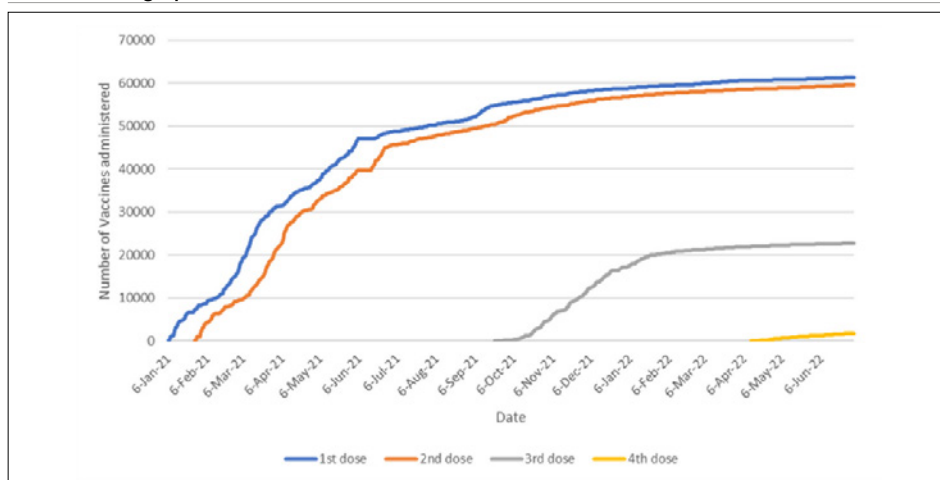

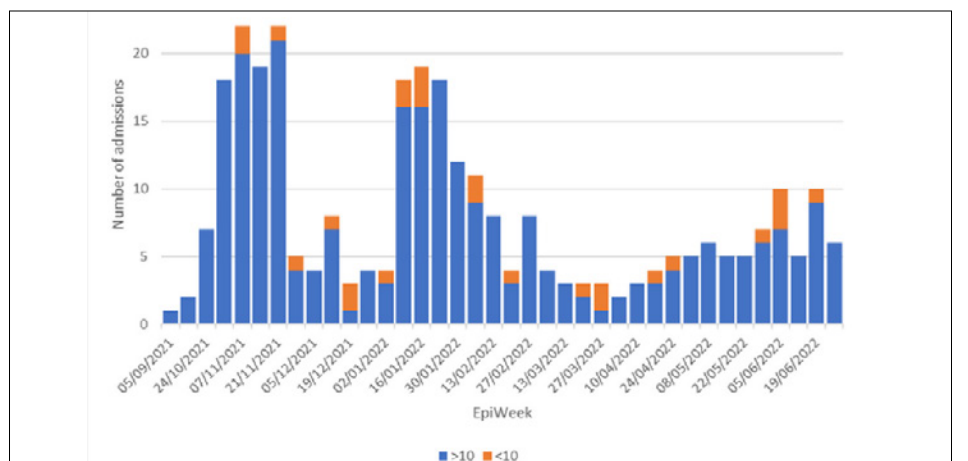

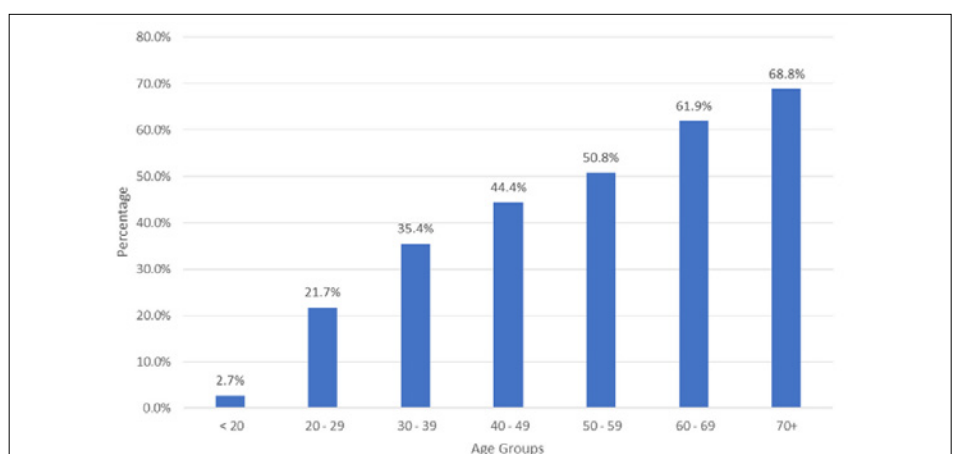

Monkeypox

Overview

Global case counts have not been updated since last week's Spotlight report, however reported cases in the European Region has been updated. Since the beginning of 2022 there have been 4,500 laboratory-confirmed cases of monkeypox across the European Region (data as of 1 July) where the highest proportion of case have been reported. This included 6 new countries in the reporting cases, bringing the total to 31 countries in the European Region. Analyses from these cases indicate nearly 10% of cases have been hospitalised (for treatment or isolation), and 99% of cases have been male.

WHO currently assesses the risk at the global level as moderate, however, the regional risk within the European Region is assessed to be high.

Cayman Islands

There are no known cases of monkeypox virus detected in Cayman Islands.

The Cayman Islands now have the capacity to diagnose Monkeypox at the Cayman Molecular Laboratory.

Cancer

Cancer occurs when abnormal cells in the body grow and multiply in an uncontrolled way. This could lead to a growth which is referred to as a tumour. The cancerous cells can invade healthy tissue, in-

cluding organs, and spread to other parts of the body.

There are over 200 different types of cancer and globally the burden of cancer has increased considerably. The UK National Health Service reports one in two people will develop some form of cancer during their life. Everyone has a level of risk for developing cancer due to their lifestyle, environment and genetics. Around thirty per cent of cancers can be prevented by keeping active, maintaining a healthy diet, not smoking and taking care of your skin in the sun. Early detection of cancer is important to enable more effective treatment.

In the Cayman Islands, the Cancer Registry collates information on cancer survivors, however as this is a voluntary

Registry it does not indicate the national prevalence of cancer. In 2021, 86 individuals registered, 48 (56%) of those were diagnosed that year. Among male registrants, the most reported cancers are prostate (18%), cancers of the blood (12%) and colon cancer (7%). Among females, the most reported cancers are breast cancer (53%), colon cancer (7%) and cancers of the blood (5%). The information provided by cancer survivors to the Cancer Registry is of significant public health importance.

EUROPEAN UNION-FUNDED TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR CAYMANIANS KICKS OFF AT UCCI

programme in sustainable trades, which begins on 18 July 2022.

The stakeholder event brought together the 55 Caymanians, along with industry partners including WORC, the Chamber of Commerce and GreenTech Solar. RESEMBID Programme Manager, Nnyeka Prescod, also delivered remarks marking the commencement of the training programme.

RESEMBID, funded by the European Union and implemented by Expertise France - the development cooperation agency of the Government of France - supports sustainable human development efforts in 12 Caribbean Overseas Countries and Territories (OCTs) - Aruba, Anguilla, Bonaire, British Virgin Islands, the Cayman Islands, Curaçao, Montserrat, Saba, Sint Eustatius, Saint Barthelemy, Sint Maarten and Turks and Caicos.

The RESEMBID grant is intended to provide support to the Cayman Islands after the COVID-19 crisis, which resulted in a substantial number of unemployed persons across the islands. The project will assist Caymanians in moving towards gaining sustainable employment and long-term social and economic resilience in four key sectors: sustainable construction, renewable energy, Information Communications Technology (ICT) and tourism. The programme was initially opened for 50 Caymanians between the ages of 18 and 45. However, due to the high volume of applicants, this was extended to 55.

Training for the 55 persons will commence on 18 July 2022 and will continue until February 2023. Thereafter, participants will undergo a 3-month internship with placements relevant to the chosen field of study.

Leading the RESEMBID project for the University College of the Cayman Islands, is Project Officer, Cleveland Julien. Mr. Julien stated, "We had an extremely high number of applications to the programme and each one was extremely impressive. Well over 100 eligible people applied for the training and it was a difficult task to choose from the applicants, which is why we extended to 55. We can't wait to start the training on 18 July and our industry partners have been phenomenal in their support. A big thank you to all involved in bringing this much-needed project to fruition. Not least to RESEMBID, without whom this would not have been possible."

"We are still actively searching for more business partners and volunteers. Volunteers from all walks of life can help us to create a bright future for these 55 Caymanians. We truly look forward to seeing what their futures hold," he said.

Over the coming weeks the programme will be extended to Cayman Brac so that at least 15 more Caymanians will have the opportunity to be exposed to similar training opportunities based on the needs identified.


RESEMBID Programme Director, Fabian McKinnon provided reflections on




the launch of the training programme, and its practical support to the people of the Cayman Islands.

"It is critical to RESEMBID that we fulfil our function to serve the 12 OCTs in the region and that function is supporting sustainable development. We are happy to see this significant milestone marking the start of this important project but thrilled that even more persons than we had originally anticipated will be trained by the course. These 55 people will soon be better able to contribute to a sustainably skilled work force for the Cayman Islands and RESEMBID is proud to be part of that," he said.

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Former Port Authority director back at the helm

Paul Hurlston has been appointed the new director of the Cayman Islands Port Authority, taking up his position on 27th June, after a “competitive recruitment process”, having already served in the role previously for 14 years, Tourism and Transport Minister Kenneth Bryan announced at a press conference on Thursday.

Minister Bryan said Mr Hurlston comes at the appropriate time to provide the organisation with stability and strategic direction.

In the role of director, Mr Hurlston would oversee all harbour operations and the development of the authority’s multi-million dollar budget, Minister Bryan advised. He would also have the responsibility to ensure the Authority was properly resourced to operate safely and efficiently.

His experience and background made him well suited for the position, Minister Bryan said.

Cline Glidden, Chairman of the Port Authority’s Board of Directors,

said the Authority had not had a permanent director for over three years, which had caused “some level of instability”. When the Board was appointed late last year they did an assessment and undertook a recruitment process but wanted to take a break before appointing a new director in order to assess the deficiencies because that would play an important role in making the decision in terms of the selection. Staffing had been found to be deficient and for over three years they had been operating without an

HR manager, so that will be a priority for Mr Hurlston.

Another concern that had been raised was one of safety and that would be a priority for the new Port Authority director.

In addition, the board had initiated three sub committees: the Audit and Risk sub committee specifically requested by the Attorney General chaired by Jackie Scott; the Importers sub committee designed to deal with the greatest concerns by Cayman’s largest importers, chaired by Irma Arch; and the Enhancement

sub committee chaired by the representative from the Chamber of Commerce, Richard Parchment.

Mr Hurlston said in the short time he had been back he had been reaching out to staff which he felt was important and so far the transition had been quite smooth.

Mr Glidden conceded that there was “discontentment” with Port Authority staff because there were staffing deficiencies at the deputy director level, a “significant concern” for the Board, so they were particularly pleased to hear that Mr Hurlston was intent on creating a strong succession process to put deputies in place to ensure continuity after his three year placement comes to an end.

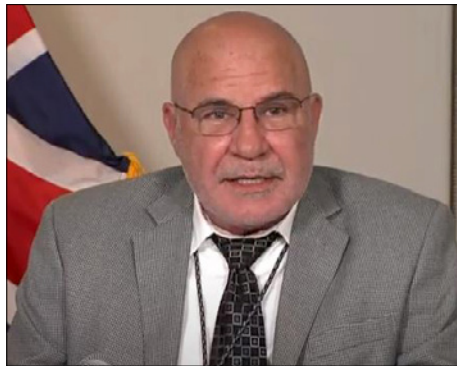
And while a berthing facility for cruise ships is no longer being considered at the port, it was still important that they ensured that the country was equipped with best in class facilities. One example was improving on the customer experience for cruise, such as ensuring that there was shade, as well as make enhancement to the facili-

ties with regard to cargo, such as reducing wait times and improving delivery times. They intended to improve on those facilities in Grand Cayman and also Cayman Brac and Little Cayman.

Mr Glidden added: “I think that one of the points that may have been missed is that the port has been limited for a number of years as to its improvements because there has always been a discussion or a plan for berthing facilities as a part of the bigger picture. With the government coming in and clearly stating its position, it now allows the port to plan instead of waiting.”

This had affected many areas, for example port tenants were only allowed a yearly lease because there was always the chance a decision would be made on the development of a berthing facility, however now the port could make long term plans, such as implementing shading. The Chamber has said it would join the Port Authority to possibly pay for shading via advertising, he said.

GCM to LAX to start 5 November

As reported in the Caymanian Times last week, Cayman Airways will this year begin a non-stop service to Los Angeles, taking about five and a half hours in flight time. In a press conference held on Thursday, Tourism and Transport Minister Kenneth Bryan gave some further details to this new addition to Cayman Airways’ service, including the date on which the GCM – LAX route will start: Saturday 5 November.

Fares could not be promoted or marketed as yet because not all paperwork had been completed, but Cayman Airways CEO Fabian Whorms said they would be “very competitive and attractive”.

“I anticipate that by the end of this month we will have our flights loaded and ready for sale and I ask that everyone keep tuned to our website and our social media platforms,” he said.

Mr Whorms said that while the new service has a WiFi service, as it did not at this point have internet connection travelers could not enjoy streaming services such as Netflix but they could enjoy entertainment via an on board server, which offered movies, TV, games, music and local content. Flights would be once a week, what Mr Whorms

called a “conservative entry” into this market, however a second weekly flight or even three flights a week were likely because of the expected demand.

The flight leaves LAX at 7am on Sunday mornings and arrives at Grand Cayman at 3.30pm in the afternoon. The departure from GCM will be at 3.45pm on Saturdays and arrive in LAX at 7pm, “good comfortable times”, he said. Mr Whorms said that roughly 8,000 people visited Cayman each year from Southern California and when they implemented the Denver flights they saw a doubling in the numbers arriving from that destination, so even a conservative 50% increase would see around 4,000 extra visitors from Los Angeles, putting approximately \$16 million into the economy. The economic impact would be quite significant, especially if they could increase the number of flights per week.

Minister Bryan thought the new route was crucial for the tourism industry because although air arrivals were trending in the right direction, increasing month over month, there was still a long way to go until Cayman got back to pre-pandemic levels.

“There is no question that a direct service between Grand Cayman and Los Angeles presents a lucrative opportunity for Cayman Airways and the Cayman Islands, to increase

stayover visitation,” he said.

The new service was in line with government’s strategic goals to expand into emerging and secondary markets, market Cayman to high net worth visitors and expand Cayman Airways routes.

“Once it becomes operational, it will be a game changer for our destination,” he stated. “By opening up the western United States we will be making it easier for travellers from Los Angeles and other feeder markets such as San Francisco and Seattle, to have easier access to the Cayman Islands.”

This new route would also enhance air connectivity for travelers originating from Asia and Australia, opening up Cayman to even more markets that are currently unserved. This would make our islands accessible and more attractive to a whole new segment of travelers, he said.

“And because Cayman Airways will be the only Caribbean airline providing a direct service from LAX Airport, we have an ideal opportunity to capture the attention of travelers, encourage them to visit our shores and give them such a wonderful experience that they become loyal, repeat visitors to our destination,” he added.

Beginning November, there will be 160 seats on each flight, 16 of those business class and the remainder economy seats. The timing of the route in early November was a strategic decision that the government believed would be instrumental for success, coinciding with the start of the high season for travel and allowing key stakeholders lead time to

build awareness in the market, to ensure potential travelers know the service is available.

Minister Bryan said that the hotels that would benefit from bringing visitors from California would play their part in investing in the exercise.

“I want to congratulate the CITA President Marc Langevin for partnering with the Ministry, Department of Tourism and Cayman Airways on this exercise. So much credit is due to him for brokering the ability to do this,” he said.

In particular, the hotels would be helping with the FAM (familiarisation) trips whereby agents would be brought across from the west coast.

There would also be a trip to LA to market the route.

“The president of CITA along, with many other hoteliers from at least three of the hotels, will be partnering with that with their own international marketing about the announcement of this flight. We are not doing this alone. They are the key beneficiaries of this exercise by filling their rooms, but Caymanians work in those rooms and we get tax on it, so we’re all in this together,” Minister Bryan said.

Mr Whorms said he had never seen this level of desire from the local hoteliers to participate with Cayman Airways.

“There’s a paradigm shift happening here to put more skin in the game for their own benefit...I’m seeing something special here,” he said.

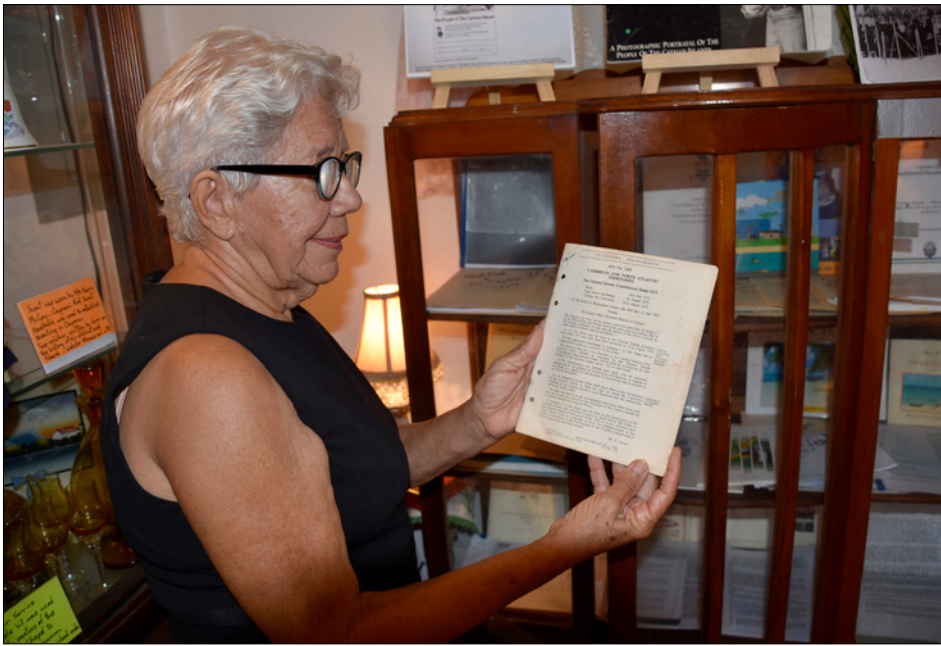

Outside, lots of friends and neighbors were sitting and eating some of the lovely traditional Caymanian food, as they shared memories. Inside the Seniors' Centre as well as in another building nearby, several Committee volunteers were showing visitors around their wonderful display of old photos and artifacts that showed how Caymanians used to live. There was a beautiful display celebrating Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II with lots of photos from her two visits to the Cayman Islands, once in 1983, and the second time in 1994.

In the old days, Caymanians would find a use for everything. There was a lovely bed, filled with the most perfect material for a mattress - plantain leaves. Around the corner in another room, Ms. Mary Lawrence M.B.E, founder member of the Committee was showing a small party around. She stated that all the members are volunteers. "We don't charge anyone to come and see it, but we have built up a

substantial exhibition of Caymanian history in both houses," she said.

There was an old sewing machine, worth its weight in gold in the old days when skilled hands knew how to use it to make old dresses new again. Over in a corner of one of the rooms was a collection of copies of all of Cayman's official constitution documents, going back to the very first written constitution. "We didn't have a written constitution until 1959 but before that we had things like that Handbook that the commissioner put together," Ms. Lawrence explained as she pointed out the documents. "This is the '72 constitution, this is the 65

constitution and this is the 62 constitution and this is the 2009 constitution, all the different stages of the constitution are here."

What makes a visit to the display charming is all the fun things, like home-made dolls and rabbits next to serious historical photos. Some of the photos went back to World War II and beyond and showed many brave Caymanians who had signed up for military service, either for the US or for Britain. There was a lovely photo of a very young Charles Keith Jackson in the US army. Lots of other old black-and-white photos showed some of our National heroes, as well venerable Caymanian fami-

lies. A picture of a cart being pulled by a donkey, made you realize just how far Cayman has come in just a few decades.

All around were all kinds of beautiful things from yesteryear including Tilly lamps - the kind that you had to pump up. In the old days - well, not too long ago really, they used to have telephones with big dials on them, and Ms. Lawrence showed a black phone made of plastic, and another heavy one made all of iron. Then there were some old typewriters with keys and levers, which, along with filing cabinet, was the nearest thing that an old office had to a computer.

BORIS JOHNSON RESIGNS AS BRITISH PRIME MINISTER

The British Prime Minister Boris Johnson resigned on Thursday July 7, 2022.

"I'm sad to give up the best job in the world, but them's the breaks," Mr Johnson said in an address outside his office at No. 10 Downing Street at just after midday on Thursday.

"Being prime minister is an education in itself - I've travelled to every part of UK and I've found so many people possessed of such boundless British originality and so willing to tackle old problems in new ways.

"Even if things can sometimes seem dark now, our future together is golden," Mr Johnson said.

The highly anticipated announcement came as Mr Johnson's government has been reeling from an avalanche of resignations this week mainly over issues related to the prime minister's personal integrity.

Much of that is linked to his decision to appoint to a high government office of a man facing current and historical allegations of sexual abuse.

Mr Johnson has been further criticised for not only his judge-

ment on the matter but serious charges by the opposition and members of his own party for lying about how much he knew - and when - about the allegations.

It's not the first time that Mr Johnson has been caught up in the swirl of such controversy where his character and integrity have been cast into doubt.

The scandal had plunged Mr Johnson's government into chaos with many of ministers and party loyalists distancing themselves from the embattled prime minister over what they said were repeated instances of Mr Johnson being less than forthcoming and clear about issues which impacted on his personal integrity and that of his government.

In the space of just two days, 60 ministers including five at cabinet level resigned from their government posts with several others withdrawing their support and calling on Mr Johnson to quit.

Up to late Wednesday night, he was adamantly refusing to do so.

It got to the point that cabinet ministers - including those appointed by Mr Johnson just this

week in place of senior ministers who had abruptly resigned their positions - had themselves called on Mr Johnson to go.

His response was to fire one of them.

One replacement cabinet minister appointed on Tuesday, resigned on Wednesday making her the minister with the shortest tenure in British political history.

History has surrounded the current dilemma gripping the UK political establishment and Mr Johnson in particular.

In a show of defiance against the repeated calls to step down over the growing series of scandals, Mr

Johnson has cited his resounding victory at the polls in the 2019 elections - largest margin since Margaret Thatcher won her first victory in 1979, and making history by formally taking the UK out of the European Union after he was elected.

"I regret to not be successful in arguments and it's painful not to see through so many ideas and projects," he said in his resignation speech.

On the other side of the historical spectrum, Mr Johnson will be remembered for having the shortest tenure as British prime minister in modern times and the

ignominious collapse of his government where focus on criticism his character flaws are being seen as overshadowing any achievement he will lay claim to.

Before his resignation announcement on Thursday, Mr Johnson was facing the prospect of being thrown out of office in a second no-confidence as early as next week. Mr Johnson had survived a no-confidence motion this past June and as the crisis around him worsened, the Conservative Party was already in the process of changing the rules which restricted such motions to one per year.

The process of selecting a new British prime minister and leader of the Conservative Party has begun.

In the interim Mr Johnson will remain as caretaker prime minister.

"I've agreed with Sir Graham Brady, the chairman of our backbench MPs, that the process of choosing that new leader should begin now - and the timetable will be announced next week and I've today appointed a cabinet to serve, as I will, until a new leader is in place."

Western Union pays more victims

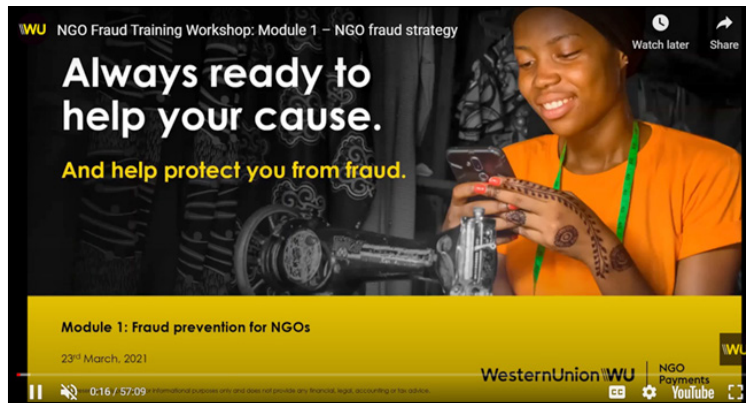
More victims of a mass Western Union fraud will soon start receiving compensation.

The United States Department of Justice has begun phase two of the remission compensation process to compensate fraud victims of Caribbean money transmitter Western Union. Western Union is a particularly popular remittance broker throughout the English-speaking Caribbean.

The DOJ said that, in 2017, Western Union entered into a deferred prosecution agreement to forfeit US\$586 million. The DOJ said has already distributed over \$366 million to over 148,000 victims and that additional forfeited funds remain available in this case. The average compensation of the first wave was \$2,473, a considerable amount for the average victim.

It has since reopened the petition process to potential victims who did not previously submit a petition for remission.

The DOJ said victims of fraud who sent a money transfer through Western Union between 1 January 2004, and 19 January 2017 can file a petition for remission and receive compensation for their fraud losses. The deadline to file a petition for remission is 31 August 2022.

According to court documents, fraudsters targeted consumers, including seniors, through multiple scams and convinced their victims to send money through Western Union.

The DOJ said certain owners, operators or employees of Western Union locations were complicit in the scheme. Under the deal, Western Union admitted that it did not do enough to prevent criminals from using its services for fraudulent purposes, deceiving people into sending payments by posing as suitors or family members in need of cash or promising prizes, loans, jobs, discounted products or other financial rewards in exchange for money up front.

Along with reimbursing victims, Western Union was ordered to take several steps to beef up consumer protection, including comprehensive anti-fraud training for its employees, improved monitoring to detect suspicious transfers, conspicuous fraud warnings on money transfer forms and more avenues for people to file fraud complaints with the company.

Damon E Wood, inspector in charge of the US Postal Inspection Service's Philadelphia Division, said: "The US Postal Inspection Service is very pleased and honoured to have been part of this cooperative effort in providing over US\$366 million in financial relief to so many victims."

"Scammers used Western Union's money transfer system because they knew the company turned a blind eye," said Director Samuel Levine of the Federal Trade Commission's Bureau of Consumer Protection. "With our law enforcement partners, we continue to return money to those harmed by the company's failures, and people still have until August 31 to submit claims."

"Western Union aided and abetted the scheme by failing to suspend or terminate complicit agents and by allowing them to continue to process fraud-induced monetary transactions," the DOJ said, adding: "Western Union has fulfilled its obligations under the DPA, and the court granted the motion to dismiss the criminal information against Western Union."

Trinis create novel heart treatment

Trinidad and Tobago believes it has developed a world first for non-surgical heart surgery.

Patients with severe heart problems, particularly tricuspid regurgitation, now have an option other than open heart surgery for treatment which is being acclaimed as a breakthrough.

The Advanced Cardiovascular Institute has assembled a multi-disciplinary team who have

successfully done minimally invasive, non-surgical heart procedures to treat valve disease and to review candidates.

Managing director at ACI Christopher Camacho is happy to know patients no longer have to travel abroad to have heart treatment, needing a minimally invasive procedure to treat severe tricuspid regurgitation, as a successful procedure was done in Trinidad.

The procedure involves the implantation of two valves through a small cut in the patient's upper thigh. They are deployed using catheters and guidewires under X-ray guidance, all conducted in a special procedural room called a catheterization laboratory.

Camacho said: "This is personal to me because my mom passed from valve disease. I saw a patient who was very close to me while I am in the cardiac arena - I know surgeons nationally and internationally - and yet there was no option for her because no surgical option was available. She could not have her valve replaced.

"So seeing how we are maturing to where more and more patients like my mom now have an option here in Trinidad is important. It's gratifying to me to see us make that step forward as a society."

The breakthrough procedure was successfully performed for the first time in TT and the Caribbean region on 30 November 2021 at West Shore Private Hospital, Port of Spain.

It was done on a patient suffering from severe tricuspid regurgitation - a leaking heart valve condition associated with severe heart failure - and the patient was showing a promising outcome after six months of medical follow-ups.

US sanctions Cuban officials

Cuban officials who imposed astonishing punishments on last year's peaceful protestors are being sanctioned by the United States State Department.

It announced visa restrictions on Saturday against 28 Cuban officials that it said were implicated in a crackdown on largely peaceful protests in Cuba last July.

In a statement, the department said the restrictions would apply to high-ranking members of the Cuban Communist Party and officials who work in the island's state communications and media sectors.

Cuba's Foreign Minister Bruno Rodriguez fumed at the US measures and policy toward Cuba on social media, saying they are vio-

lating international law.

"In view of failed attempt to provoke popular uprising in Cuba in 2021, the US government and its Secretary of State are seeking to discredit people's victory over imperialist aggression," Rodriguez said.

Cuba has said the US Cold War-era economic embargo, combined with alleged efforts to foment protests on the island, are aimed at toppling the communist-run government.

Cuban authorities sentenced hundreds to jail time on charges from public disorder to sedition after the protests, the largest anti-government protests in decades. Other dissidents have fled the island to exile.

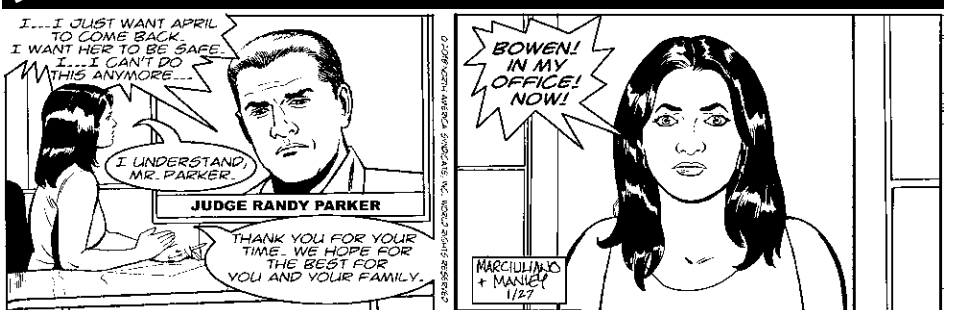
