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Caymanian Appointed as Deputy Solicitor General

Caymanian Mrs. Marilyn Brandt has been promoted to Deputy Solicitor General in the Portfolio of Legal Affairs (PoLA).

This is the first time that a Caymanian attorney has been appointed as the Deputy Solicitor General. Mrs. Brandt brings to the job 14 years' experience gleaned as a practising public sector attorney, following being called to the Cayman Islands Bar.

She gained professional practical experience by being an articled clerk within the Attorney General's Chambers and the Portfolio of Legal Affairs.

Deputy Governor and Head of the Civil Service, Hon. Franz Manderson, MBE, Cert. Hon., JP commented on the recent appointment: "I am delighted that a Caymanian civil servant, who is also a public sector practising attorney, has been promoted for the first time to this senior position. This is certainly a testimony to the capabilities, qualifications and work of this hardworking and dedicated career civil servant."

Recalling that Mrs. Brandt worked as a colleague at the Immigration Department (when he was the head of Immigration), the DG added, "Her work ethos of giving her best and pursuing excellence struck me as stellar qualities. I am pleased she will also lead the clerkship programme for Caymanians seeking to become lawyers, who will learn about work behind the scenes on behalf of CIG. I wish Mrs. Brandt well in her current role."

Attorney General, Hon. Samuel Bulgin, QC commented that "Mrs. Brandt's promotion within the Portfolio is timely" and he looks forward to her continuing growth and professional development as an invaluable member within the Chambers of the Attorney General.

The promotion is also an endorsement of succession planning within the Cayman Islands Government, in particular at PoLA under the leadership of the Attorney General and the Solicitor General, Ms Reshma Sharma, QC. Mr. Manderson commented: "I am equally elated that succession planning played a part in the promotion of Mrs. Brandt. I laud the Attorney General and Solicitor General in this regard."

Solicitor General, Ms Sharma QC said, "I have had the pleasure of working with

Mrs. Brandt throughout her tenure with the Attorney General's Chambers, both as an Articled Clerk and thereafter, as a practising attorney following her admission to the Bar. During that time, she was exposed to a broad range of work within the Chambers and provided sound legal support to her clients. The role of Deputy Solicitor General is an important one but equally, a demanding one and I wish her continued success with the new challenges that lie ahead. I hope that her journey within the civil service will inspire a new generation of young Caymanians to consider a similar path."

Mrs. Brandt's core legal work within the Portfolio work includes providing extensive advice on behalf of the Attorney General to the Cayman Islands Government (CIG) on matters concerning immigration, children's law, planning, contract and employment.

Additionally, she prepares and represents CIG before both the Grand Court and the Court of Appeal. She also appears on CIG's behalf before statutory tribunals including the Health Appeals Tribunal, Planning Appeals Tribunal and Civil Service Appeals Commission.

Mrs. Brandt is also the Chairperson of the Expungement Board which deals with the erasing of criminal records for eligible persons who have committed minor infractions of the law and served their time, as handed down by the Cayman Islands judicial system.

She is also an ex-officio member of the Cayman Islands Development Bank's board of directors as well as the Legal Advisor to the Medical and Dental Council, the Trade and Business Licensing Board, the Liquor Licensing Board and the Builders Board.

The Articled Clerkship programme run by the Attorney General's Chambers will now be overseen by Mrs. Brandt who brings her special brand of lead-

ership and enthusiasm to a programme that is dear to her heart, having herself been a former articled clerk within the Chambers.

Mrs. Brandt's 14 years of experience as an attorney in CIG's employ began in the then Legal Department headed by the Attorney General, (which included the criminal division, now Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions or ODPP). She joined after completing her Bachelor of Laws (Hons.) degree from the University of Liverpool through the Truman Bodden Law School (TBLS).

This was followed by a Professional Practice Course at TBLS and her articledship within the Chambers of the Attorney General, leading to admission to the Cayman Islands Bar in 2008. She has also acquired, within her busy work schedule, a Master's degree in Business Administration from Walden University.

Previously, Mrs. Brandt served as Crown Counsel, rising to Crown Counsel I and later Acting Senior Crown Counsel before taking up the Deputy Solicitor General position.

Commenting on her appointment, Mrs. Brandt said, "I am honoured to be appointed to the post of Deputy Solicitor General. Having been a career civil servant for almost 14 years, it is truly fulfilling to be able to serve the community in this capacity. I am particularly pleased that one of my key responsibilities will be the management of the Articles of Clerkship programme.

"This will provide me with the opportunity to pave the way for budding Caymanian attorneys to consider the Civil Service as a viable career option. I also look forward to supporting the Attorney General and Solicitor General, as part of the senior leadership team, in carrying out the mandate of the Attorney General's Chambers."

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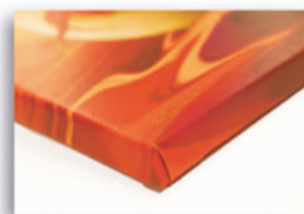
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Hearty Celebration for Parliament Building 50th Anniversary

The Cayman Islands Parliament building will be celebrating its 50th anniversary next week. An exciting programme of entertainment will help mark the 50th “birthday” from 6-8 pm on Thursday, 21 July 2022.

The then Legislative Assembly building was officially opened on 31 July 1972.

Open to the public on Parliament’s steps and in Fort Street, the 21 July celebration features an abundance of music, song and dance.

Speaker, Hon. McKeeva Bush outlined that the full two-hour programme will have performances and a dozen acts as well as a “live” painting of the event, created by a local artist and fireworks to round off the event.

Additionally, there will also be food and beverages available for participants of the festivities, with local caterers providing fare including conch stew as well as fruit juices and sodas. A cash bar accepting card payment only will also be available to guests wanting to buy alcoholic beverages.

The Speaker also recalled the colourful history associated with the iconic building, which is now a fixture at the heart of Central George Town.

“This is a celebration of a precious segment of the evolving history of our beloved islands, which evokes many

fond memories for a large number of people,” Mr. Bush commented.

Prior to the outdoor celebration, Members of Parliament and invited guests will attend a special lecture in the Chamber of the House. The presentation by eminent constitutional attorney, Dr. the Hon. Lloyd Barnett will focus on the “Separation of Powers” of the legislature, executive and judiciary.

Both the celebrations and the lecture will be broadcast live on the Cayman Islands Government YouTube and Facebook channels and on CIGTV channels.

Sidebar: Brief History of the Building

The Cayman Islands Parliament building was officially opened on 31st July 1972 by then-Governor Kenneth Roy Crook.

Dame Hilda Bynoe of Grenada was the distinguished guest at the event and gifted the new Parliament building with a painting on behalf of her island.

An international competition was held in 1970 to choose the architects to design both the Legislative Assembly building and the Court House. The winner was architectural firm Rutkowski Bradford and Partners of Jamaica, who designed both buildings. The firm became Rutkowski Baxter and Houghton on their relocation to Cayman.

The buildings were constructed by McAlpine (Cayman) Ltd., and Arch Construction. The Legislative Assembly was the first “poured-concrete” building in Cayman and it was also McAlpine’s first project in Cayman.

The chosen site of the building was what was once Princess Royal Park, so named for the first British royal to visit Cayman (Mary, Princess Royal), who planted a tree in the park. Two years later His Royal Highness Prince Philip also visited the park.

The building underwent renovations in 2003, adding a Members’ Dining room, as well as refitting the carpeting and furniture in the Chamber.

On 4 December 2020 the Legislative Assembly became an autonomous Parliament and the building was named the House of Parliament.

Cayman Brac, and the group visited the staff at the existing shared office space for both entities.

Related to the expansion, the trip included two separate site visits; the first was to a potential new location for the Needs Assessment Unit. The second site visit was facilitated by Minister O'Connor-Connolly and District Commissioner, who gave a tour to the Minister, Parliamentary Secretary and Ministry staff of a newly constructed, modern building which has been designed to accommodate community events in Cayman Brac, particularly for older persons and youth.

Minister Ebanks expressed his gratitude to all involved with the visit, saying: "To re-imagine social development for the people of the Cayman Islands requires purposeful and creative actions that involve collaboration across distinct subject areas and across Government, with the private and non-profit sectors, and throughout our community."

Parliamentary Secretary Heather Bodden added, "Our visit to Cayman Brac this past Friday is an earnest start to a strong working relationship between the Ministry of Investment, Innovation and Social Development, the District Commissioner, and the Cayman Brac offices of the Department of Children and Family Services, and the Needs Assessment Unit."

The group also visited the nursing staff and residents at Kirkconnell Care Centre. The Minister noted that in the Government's 2022-23 Annual Budget Statement, the nursing staff were converted from wage-based to salaried employees --- including many who served for two or three decades in these positions. Commenting on his interactions at the Centre, he said:

"The dedicated staff of the Kirkconnell Care Centre, and their counterparts in all the care homes in Grand Cayman, work tirelessly to care for the residents - often with little recognition for the truly grueling work involved in this profession. The Ministry will continue to advocate for change and reform on behalf of the residents and staff."

On Friday 8 July, 2022, the Hon. André Ebanks, Minister for Investment, Innovation and Social Development, was accompanied by Parliamentary Secretary Heather Bodden and senior Ministry staff to visit Cayman Brac.

At the District Administration building, the group met with the Hon. Juliana O'Connor-Connolly, Minister for District Administration, District Commissioner Mark Tibbetts, and staff of the District Commission. The two Ministers and Commissioner led a discussion about ongoing and new policy issues relating to social development, with a particular focus on the needs of elderly and vulnerable people in Cayman Brac.

The Minister noted that the Ministry is undertaking an expansion of the Needs Assessment Unit (NAU) and Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) to transform services for their clients in



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Billions of Russian assets frozen



Cayman's task force charged with coordinating the application of sanctions against Russia within the Cayman Islands reports that Cayman entities have frozen Russian assets valued at approximately USD8.4 billion and EUR297.8 million since the sanctions began.

Noting that this represented more than one billion US dollars more than initially reported in April, task force chair and Director of the Financial Reporting Authority, R.J. Berry, commented: "Financial services providers continue to identify and report funds or economic resources owned or controlled, directly or indirectly, by designated persons, and are freezing those assets or economic resources."

In addition, the FRA has received 144 suspicious activity reports related to Russia Sanctions, which have been cross-referenced with 801 Compliance Reporting Forms related to Russian Sanctions received since 1 March 2022.

The task force, which operates across various government agencies, has spent the three months since its formation working steadily to ensure the Cayman Islands gains an understanding of its exposure to individuals and entities that have been designated and are subject to sanctions under the Russia Sanctions Regime. It has also worked to ensure that relevant agencies are effectively implementing the sanctions.

As part of this remit, the task force has been actively monitoring changes made by the UK government to its Russia Sanctions Regime.

Since February 2022, there have been ten amendments covering various measures to the UK's Russia (Sanctions) (EU Exit) Regulations 2019. Of these, seven amendments have since been extended to the Cayman Islands; amendment one was extended automatically with amendments two to seven reflected in the Russia (Sanctions) (Overseas Territories) (Amendment) Order 2022 that came into effect on 14 April 2022.

The UK government has continued to update the Russia sanctions list frequently, with over 1,600 designations since the invasion of Ukraine.

The General Registry which registers local and overseas companies, and the Lands and Survey Department which registers land transfers within the Cayman Islands, also continue to check their databases against the latest lists of sanctioned individuals and entities.

Outreach sessions have taken place to ensure industry is kept abreast of sanctions and their implications for business in Cayman.

Emphasising the importance of the Cayman Islands being seen to be implementing the sanctions in real time, Governor Martyn Roper said the Cayman Islands' effective implementation of sanctions bolstered its strong reputation internationally as a highly responsible, efficient and professional financial services centre.

"My Office will continue to support the Cayman Islands with this vital work," he said.

Members of the Russia Sanctions task force are: the Financial Reporting Authority (Chair), Governor's Office, Portfolio of Legal Affairs, Ministry of Financial Services and Commerce, Cabinet Office, Maritime Authority of the Cayman Islands, Cayman Islands Monetary Authority, Cayman Islands Bureau of Financial Investigations, Cayman Islands Customs and Border Control, General Registry, Civil Aviation Authority of the Cayman Islands and the Lands and Survey Department.

The 4th Annual Heart Warriors & Angels Beach Walk took place on Sunday 3rd July 2022 from 7-9am. Over 300 participants registered for the beautiful morning walk at Seven Mile Public Beach to show their support for Team Nolan, the Pediatric Program of the Cayman Heart Fund, whose mission is to raise awareness of Congenital Heart Disease (CHD) and fundraise for families of babies born with a congenital heart defects.

The walk is organized each year by Sean and Ailian Evans, in memory of their son Nolan who was 7 months 3 days old when he passed away in January 2018 from a complex CHD. This year's event was sponsored by Health City Cayman Islands, Davenport Development, Conyers, MJM, Walkers, and Fosters just to name a few and included refreshments, complementary gourmet coffee sponsored by Paradise Coffee, patties sponsored by Island Taste, and face painting sponsoring by ISE. After the walk participants enjoyed kids and adult raffle.

Ailian Evans expressed her gratitude for His Excellency Governor Martyn Roper's continued support of their initiatives. "It is an honor having him partic-

ipate in our 4th annual beach walk and we thank him and all our loyal supporters for their continued support over the years" said Ms. Evans.

CHDs occurs during the early stages of a mother's pregnancy when a baby's heart is forming. Conditions classified as congenital heart defects include abnormalities in the heart's structure or the heart's electrical system. Every child born with a complex structural heart malformation has a story. It is a journey through a whole host of difficult challenges. Children born with a CHD endure far more than most adults will in a lifetime. When you consider how much adversity some overcome and still have a smile on their face, it is clear that each of them has earned their superhero designation, hence the name Heart Warrior or Heart Angel.

Every 15 minutes a baby is born with a CHD. Many people think of heart problems as conditions that only affect adults, but CHD affects one in every 100 births making this complex condition, with no known cure, the most common type of birth de-

I know Nolan is proud of the legacy that we are creating,” said Ailian Evans, CHF Board Member and Founder of Team Nolan. “We are very grateful to all of our wonderful supporters including His Excellency Governor Mr Martyn Roper Governor, Dr Aritra Mukherji interventional Pediatric Cardiologist at health City Cayman Islands, all of our volunteers, our wonderful sponsors, and all

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Brazil wants Russian diesel

Brazil is negotiating to buy cheaper diesel from Russia as part of a strategy to reduce domestic fuel prices, according to President Jair Bolsonaro.

The deal comes after Bolsonaro visited President Vladimir Putin in February, just days before Russia invaded Ukraine, in a bid to ensure a steady supply of fertiliser exports to Brazil.

"I'll likely buy cheaper diesel from Russia," Bolsonaro announced in Brasilia, adding that gasoline prices are also falling after most state governors agreed to reduce taxes on fuel. "Everything is going well in Brazil."

High fuel prices and inflation have been the main economic challenges for Bolsonaro as he seeks re-election in October. The conservative leader has been trailing leftist former President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva in all major opinion polls.

Despite sanctions imposed by the US and its allies on Russia, the Brazilian government has continued to negotiate with Moscow as it remains neutral about the conflict.

With the UK and European Union both set to eliminate seaborne imports of refined petroleum products - including diesel - from Russia, it should have plenty of spare fuel for other potential buyers such as Brazil. However, setting up the financial and physical logistics to reroute large volumes of clean petroleum product is unlikely to be easy, Russia's refineries may end up producing less.

Bolsonaro, a far-right former army captain, gave no further details. Neither Bolsonaro's office, nor Brazil's Mining and Energy Ministry immediately responded to requests for comment.

"It makes sense and eventually could happen," a senior Economy Ministry official said on condition of anonymity.

A senior official from state-run oil company Petroleo Brasileiro SA, or Petrobras, which supplies most fuel to the domestic market, said the idea

was not surprising but raised concerns, without going into details.

Bolsonaro ignored US entreaties not to meet Putin.

For many Brazilians, Bolsonaro is responsible for the hardship now afflicting Latin America's largest country. In the three years since the far-right populist became leader in 2019, the economy has grown only about 2 percent.

The Covid-19 pandemic killed 670,000 Brazilians, the second-highest death toll worldwide behind America's one million, and inflation has soared

this year to about 12 percent, hurting the poorest most.

A study released this month found more than 33 million Brazilians now suffer from hunger — 14m more than just two years ago. In the run-up to elections, voters are making their unhappiness clear.

Poll after poll shows Bolsonaro trailing Lula da Silva of the left-wing Workers' party, by as many as 20 percentage points. Bolsonaro is a big fan of Donald Trump and like The Don, he has already claimed that if he loses the election he will not accept the results.

COVID jab scare for young Israelis

There has been an increase of over 25 percent in cardiovascular-related emergency calls in young Israeli adults following the rollout of COVID vaccines.

A new study by Israeli researchers and published in 'Nature' has revealed an alarming increase in both young males and females. No similar increase was found due to COVID infection alone.

Israel health authorities and the US Centers of Disease Control acknowledge a link between COVID vaccines and specific cardiovascular complications. The risk of myocarditis after receiving a second vaccine dose is now estimated to be between 1 in 3000 to 1 in 6000 in men aged 16 to 24.

Recent articles in scientific journals, how-

ever, suggest that cardiovascular complications following COVID infection are more common than those following vaccination. But this assertion is contradicted by the findings from a recent study conducted by Israeli researchers, using data from Israel National Emergency Medical Services related to "cardiac arrest and acute coronary syndrome EMS calls in the 16-39-year-old population" between 2019 and 2021. This enabled them to compare pre-COVID epidemic to COVID epidemic without vaccines, to COVID epidemic following widespread vaccine take up.

An increase of over 25 percent was detected in both call types during January-May 2021, compared with the years 2019-2020.

Black Tory hopeful downplays race hate

Eight Members of Parliament are battling for backers in their race to replace Boris Johnson as Tory leader - and Prime Minister.

Rishi Sunak is the early frontrunner and is likely to battle it out against one other contender in a vote by Conservative Party members.

Contenders for that coveted second spot include Jeremy Hunt, Penny Mordaunt, Liz Truss, Nadhim Zahawi and Kemi Badenoch.

But some of the hopefuls will be knocked out before the contest even begins, with the Tories' 1922 Committee discussing a tough threshold to get on the ballot.

MPs could set a minimum 20 backers for each contender before the first knockout vote by MPs. There could also be a threshold of 36 votes to get through the first knockout round.

After that, MPs will vote in rounds, with one candidate being eliminated from the ballot each time until only two are left to put to the wider membership.

Boris Johnson has refused to publicly back any of the people who want to succeed him because it might hinder their chances. The winner will be announced on 5 September.

Business Secretary Kwasi Kwarteng is backing Liz Truss while key ex-Cabinet ally Michael Gove has backed Kemi Badenoch, the only black woman in the race. But her lack of experience and virtual anonymity means she won't make the final two.

The 42-year-old MP for Saffron Walden - who was among those to resign their

government jobs last week - said she would lower taxes, but also have a "tight spending discipline".

During her time as equalities minister, Badenoch was criticised by the government's LGBT+ advisory panel recently over delays in banning conversion therapy.

Nor is she popular in the black community. Badenoch condemns identity politics and "social justice", particularly that based around race and culture, a common theme of her political discourse.

She is a former banker, who grew up in the UK, US and Nigeria. She has faced previous criticism for her overtly trenchant views on cultural issues, particularly her belief that racial disparities are often overplayed and not structural, and are exploited for division by left-wingers.

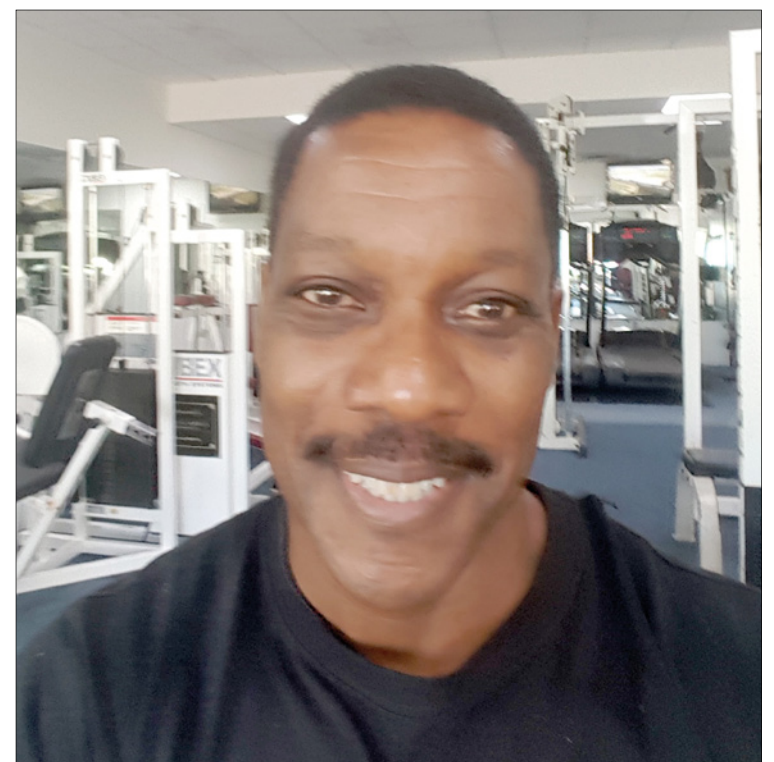
