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# Covid travel restrictions lifted

As from next week Wednesday 24 August 2022, travellers to and within the Cayman Islands will not need to apply to Travel Cayman for a travel declaration or certificate. Neither will people need to be fully vaccinated to come to Cayman, nor will they need to isolate once they arrive. At a press conference, Premier Wayne Panton advised that the government felt it was now safe to eliminate all but a few public health measures. The reasons for lifting the restrictions were largely due to the prevalence of Covid being on the decline globally, he said.

Health Minister Sabrina Turner confirmed this, and said that government

was more than comfortable with the constitutional responsibility to make that decision. Also from 24 August, there would be no restrictions on the numbers of people in public gatherings outdoors or indoors on land or on sea, she said.

Mask wearing remained discretionary in churches, restaurants and bars, however mask wearing would remain in place for healthcare facilities, residential homes and prisons. Restrictions on sporting activities and public transport would be lifted and left to the responsibility to the individual, Minister Turner stated.

The Chief Medical Officer Dr Autilia Newton said that vaccinations and boosters had helped to reduce loss of life due to Covid. Government was waiting for

the next delivery of the booster from the UK and Cayman would be receiving the Moderna vaccine which also includes protection from the new Omicron strain, alongside the Pfizer vaccine which was being used primarily for first and second vaccinations. Positives should still report and a free PCR is then available to people if they test positive via a LFT.

Isolation for people testing positive would, as from 24 August, be seven days, whether the person was vaccinated or not vaccinated. In addition, there would be no need to test after a period of isolation. Close contacts of positive people could continue to go to work and school,

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# Douglas is Cayman's sub pioneer

to swim as a toddler and started scuba diving aged 10.

"The first time I ever went diving, I felt so calm," she said. "It was exactly where I wanted to be, watching the marine life and the whole ecosystem - seeing how every little part does something. From then on, it was marine biology all the way."

Two decades

later, Douglas works for the DoE as a geographic information system and field support specialist. While her education took her abroad - she studied biology at the University of Guelph in Canada, then earned a master's in Marine Resource Development and Protection at Heriot-Watt University in Scotland - Douglas returned home to be close to family.

As a lover of ocean science, she has always been aware of research vessels and the unique studies they facilitate. It was inevitable she would eventually work in one.

"She seemed like a total natural when she started taking imagery and logging observations," Shank said. "She had exceptional situational awareness that you don't often see in first-time divers."

During their dive, the crew traversed

an other-worldly landscape of sulphide mounds teeming with shrimp, large anemones, and squat lobsters.

While she stays focused on her tasks, Douglas also appreciates the sheer beauty of the bizarre landscape and the plentiful animal life. She listened closely as Shank described the distinctive biology found there.

"This species of shrimp only lives here in Cayman waters - we haven't found them anywhere else," Shank said. "It's one of the things that makes this place so special - a different evolutionary lineage exists here."

This vent site also contains a higher copper content than any other known vent site in the world.

Douglas said of Shank: "Tim is great because you ask him any question and he's happy to answer it. It's just easy to talk to him. And when you're spending eight hours in a small sub together that's important."

While her dive in Alvin was certainly a highlight, Douglas enjoyed every day of work on Atlantis. After each dive was completed, she created a GIS track to show exactly where Alvin went.

Her interest in ship operations and navigation stems from her seafaring lineage. Her father spent his early career working his way up from able-bodied seaman to chief mate on various cargo vessels and has been involved in the leadership of the Cayman Islands Seafarers Association for years.

"My dad is really proud of me since he's a seafarer," she said. "Both of my parents are thrilled, but I think my brother might be the most excited. When I told him about the dive, he said, 'it's like you're going to the moon!'"

She added: "This seems like a really nice mark to make in the world. For such a small nation, it's a big point of pride to say I was the first Caymanian to do this."

so long as they continued to test negative each day via an LFT. Public Health would be ramping up clinics in anticipation of the autumn spike, the Health Minister said.

The Premier said the government would continue to monitor global trends and would always put the health of the community first and if things changed dramatically they could reimplement any protocols, doing so under advice.

### Good news for tourism

Tourism and Transport Minister Kenneth Bryant said he was a “happy Minister” at the announcement. The tourism industry had looked forward to the day for two and a half years when travel restrictions would be lifted. The Minister said he was in full support of these changes, because it had become increasing clear that Cayman was not in step with others when it came to restricting travel to the islands, particularly Cayman’s stance on only accepting vaccinated travellers. Cayman had been finding it hard to compete with similar warm weather countries. The lifting of the restrictions would level the playing

field and would present the Cayman Islands in a much more favourable light and improve its competitiveness, he said. It would help make the processing of travellers quicker and easier and would help the tourism industry get back to normal. He was anticipating an increase in traveller arrivals, citing previous increases in visitors as restrictions were lifted in stages.

The Minister said that a destination report had been produced by the Department of Tourism which showed that stay-over arrivals had trended upwards for the first six months of this year, increasing month after month, with 114,000 stayover visitors and 215,000 cruise passengers in total.

The DOT also looked at airlift capacity and compared the numbers that Cayman had now with what it had in 2019. The airlift capacity report projected that in the fourth quarter of this year, Cayman would have 1,253 more airline seats than the island had in the fourth quarter of 2019, or 1% more.

“This is very encouraging news and a sign of the confidence in our destination by international airlines and it gives us reason to believe we can look forward to 2022/2023 season with some bright figures ahead,” Minister Bryant said.



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

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

den Town East.



# Cuba finally opens trade ban

Cuba has effectively admitted that its decades of communism hasn't worked because it will allow foreign investors into its wholesale and retail trade for the first time in 60 years.

The move is a major shift for the island's communist government, and overturns a Fidel Castro policy of nationalising retail.

But Cuba, facing its most severe economic crisis since the Fifties, with rising prices and public discontent, believes its new policy will tackle shortages of basic goods, like food and medicine - but stops short of fully opening trade.

Government officials said that foreign investors will be able to wholly or partially own Cuba-based wholesalers.

But retail will not be open to international investors without scrutiny, as "a state market has to prevail" foreign trade minister Betsy Díaz Velázquez said.

Economy minister Alejandro Gil said the move will allow for the "expansion and diversification of supply to the population and contribute to the recovery of domestic industry".

In 1969, Fidel Castro nationalised Cuba's private wholesale and retail industry. The new foreign investment bill, however, recognises that the country's centralised government cannot resolve its essential goods shortage without investment from overseas.

Meanwhile, Cuba will send nearly 500 doctors to the Calabria region of southern Italy, part of a broader programme that sends surplus medics from the communist-run island to countries in need.

State-run media outlet Cubadebate said Calabria had been suffering a shortage of doctors since 2010, part of a countrywide healthcare crisis, and had been unable to fill the need any other way.

Around 40 countries across five continents, including Italy, received Cuban medics during the COVID-19 pandemic, as the island - with a population of 11 million - has impacted worldwide in medical diplomacy.

Since its 1959 leftist revolution, Cuba has dispatched its 'army of white coats' to disaster sites and disease outbreaks around the world in the name of solidarity. In the last decade, they have fought cholera

in Haiti and Ebola in West Africa.

Cuba has exported doctors on more routine missions in exchange for cash or goods in recent decades, making it a top source of hard currency. The United States has criticised the programme, saying labour conditions are exploitative, a charge Cuba denies.

## Jamaica's brain drain is still appalling

Jamaica's perennial mass exodus of top professionals and experts looking for work overseas has landed the island in second place on the human and flight and brain drain index.

As an increasing number of citizens flee a mix of low-paying salaries, few development opportunities and the psychosocial implications of a high prevalence of crime and violence, Jamaica's most talented minds are pursuing careers off island in high numbers. Jamaica's nurses are one of the highest professions that move abroad.

Jamaica ranked second behind only Samoa, which received a ten on the list of 177 countries compiled by research site TheGlobalEconomy.com. The index ranks countries based on data collected between

2007 and 2022, with zero being the lowest score and ten being the highest.

Jamaica has a human flight and brain drain index score of 9.1. The data comes from a wide range of sources, including national authorities, the World Bank, United Nations, and the International Monetary Fund.

Elsewhere on the index, Palestine placed third with a score of 8.8, while Micronesia and Somalia rounded out the top five with a similar score of 8.7 index points.

Haiti and Guyana were the only other Caribbean nations in the top 10, being ranked in ninth and tenth place respectively. Haiti scored 8.2 index points, while Guyana received 8.1 although with its newly found oil wealth, the country is likely to see that exodus decrease.

## Javelin champ assaulted on boat trip

Grenada's reigning world javelin champion Anderson Peters was beaten up and thrown overboard from a party boat ride in Grenada last Wednesday.

Peters recently returned home to a grand welcome after also claiming silver at the Commonwealth Games in Birmingham, England.

Grenada is also celebrating its popular Spicemas carnival. A video circulating on social media showed Peters, 24, being beaten by five men and subsequently thrown overboard.

The Royal Grenada Police Force said Peters received medical attention for minor injuries. They said several crew members are in custody assisting with investigations.

The Harbour Master, a Trinidadian pleasure boat, is owned by Adrian Scoon, son of Trade Minister Paula Gopee-Scoon.

Peters said on social media that he is feeling better and faces "a long road to full recovery". He wrote: "Phew ...! The past few days have been a rollercoaster for me —

from being excited to return home after two great competitions, to being quickly ripped of such excitement replaced with pain and discomfort. I know that you're all concerned about my well-being, so please, know that I'm feeling better than I was in the immediate aftermath."

The Royal Grenada Police Force said that six Trinidadians were arrested and charged in connection with the incident.

Five men were charged with one count of grievous harm and stealing and one man was charged with assault on Peters. Five men were also charged with causing harm to Peters' brother Kiddon.

Peters, who got his start in throwing by hurling rocks at mango trees, is a two-time reigning world champion.


