Opposition files 'Lack Of Confidence' in Government

The Leader of the Opposition, Hon Roy McTaggart, advised the public of the following on Wednesday:

"I have today filed in Parliament a motion of 'Lack of Confidence in the Government'. The motion is seconded by the Deputy Leader of the Opposition, Joey Hew, and supported by the entire Opposition.

The Opposition Leader explained, "We have, in the Cayman Islands today,

a government beset by controversies of its own making; mired in confusion and internal division, and incapable of effective action.

"Our Islands are facing significant challenges, and we cannot afford a government asleep at the wheel. There are those in Government whom we believe wish to see the country progress and are very capable if given the opportunity and the right environment. Several of them have

spoken to us about their frustrations with the current leadership, or lack of leadership, and the general unease in their Caucus. I urge them to vote in favour of this motion when it comes to Parliament. By voting in the affirmative, they will be voting for a fresh start and will have taken a patriotic step in helping rescue our Islands from a state of malaise.



STORM WARNING FOR CAYMAN



This is the latest in a recent spate of storm activity in what has to date been a relatively quite hurricane season.

Hurricane Fiona pounded Puerto Rico and the Dominican Republic this past weekend. By Wednesday it had rapidly developed into the season's first Category 3 hurricane battering the Turks and Caicos Islands and southern Bahamas. On its current path Fiona will track near Bermuda and then threaten Atlantic Canada in the coming days, according to the Weather Channel.

Meanwhile, Tropical Storm Gaston formed on Tuesday in the Atlantic well north of the Caribbean and posed no immediate threat to land.

But for Cayman and islands in the southern Caribbean, the concern is now on the new weather system that's showing signs of organisation.

The US National Hurricane Center reports that additional development is expected and a tropical depression is likely to form within the next few days as the system moves westward to

west-northwestward at 15 to 20 mph across the eastern and central Caribbean Sea - in the direction of the Cayman Islands.

Already the NHC is advising "interests in the Windward Islands should closely monitor the progress of this system as heavy rainfall and gusty winds could affect these islands beginning on Wednesday.

From Wednesday, the system's formation chance through 48 hours was rated at medium or 60 per cent. However, the formation chance through 5 days was rated as high at 80 per cent.

Residents of the Cayman Islands have been put on alert for an active tropical wave east of the Windward Islands that's heading our way.

In a Wednesday afternoon update, the National Hurricane Center said that they continue to monitor a very active tropical wave located a few hundred miles east of the Windward Islands. This system continues to show

signs of organization and it will likely become a Tropical depression within the next two or three days with a 90% chance of cyclone formation over the next 5 days. The system is moving westward to west-northwestward at 15 to 20 mph and is forecasted to move over the central Caribbean by weekend.

The Cayman Islands National Weather Service has advised that from the current update, the system is expected to bring fresh

to strong winds with rough seas (Small craft should continue to exercise caution over open waters), and thunderstorms with an accumulation of about 2-6 inches of rainfall mostly over the Sister Islands on Monday.

"Given the time frame, there is still uncertainty concerning the intensity and track of the system. We urge residents to monitor the developments of this system as we will be providing updates on any forecast change and what that would mean for the Cayman Islands."



Files A 'Lack Of Confidence In The Government' Motion In Parliament

"From the outset, we have tried to be constructive and to offer our ideas to a government that lacked experience and had no coherent programme.

"I offered to work with the Premier on the national Covid response and the re-opening of our economy. I gave him a range of suggestions to help families facing the cost-of-living crisis. I warned the

Finance Minister during the budget session that his budget plans ignored the looming dark clouds of increasing inflation. He ignored those warnings, and the country is suffering because of it. We have also brought motions to Parliament seeking to drive forward action that will benefit our people.

"These have been ignored or, at best, taken up grudgingly and after needless delay. But ultimately, with no real action.

"The business of effective Government is proving impossible due to a lack of leadership coming from the current Premier and the apparent divisions within the Cabinet and Government Caucus.

"Meanwhile, the cost-of-living crisis is escalating. Families face considerable hardship while many local businesses grapple with rocketing costs and a squeeze on profits. The Government forecasts that Cayman's economy will still not have recovered to its pre-pandemic level by the end of this year, twenty months after the PACT government took office. It is clear where the accountability for failure needs to lie."

Deputy Opposition Leader Joey Hew said, "These failures to deliver results for our people are further compounded by ineffective governance.

"We have seen Ministers breaking the Code of Conduct that they themselves devised. We have seen Ministers making policy announcements that they have to walk back due to a lack of support from their colleagues and the public.

"In recent days, we have seen the divisions in the PACT Government revealed again, with both the Premier and a Minister claiming credit for supposedly getting Speaker Bush to agree to step down as Speaker; and with the Premier publicly reprimanding his Minister for not showing restraint.

"Members of the public are also concerned about the lack of implementation of many common-sense measures suggested by the Opposition to address the cost-of-living crisis affecting families. The Premier and his Government have done little to assist our people.

And then only after being prodded by the Opposition to act". Mr Hew also lamented the lack of sittings of Parliament to tackle the various problems being confronted by the country and consequently any remedies. He said "The Country deserves better."

Mr McTaggart took up that theme, "Yes, the country deserves better, and we need an alternative government that is ready to step in and take the action our country needs.

"We hope responsible members of the government will be persuaded by the debate that we will put to Parliament and that they will support our motion of no confidence. The Progressives, along with a coalition of the capable, can then look to form a government to take the country forward over the two and a half years that remain before the next general election.

"Given the challenges facing the country, new experienced leadership offers the best route to putting in place the Government and the programme of action that the Cayman Islands need.

"Cayman is crying out for strong, capable leadership. Our people need action from the Government to support them through the challenges ahead. The country needs action that only an experienced Progressives-led government can deliver."

In closing, Mr McTaggart said, "the convention in our Westminster system of Government demands that a motion on a lack of confidence in the Government is a matter which ought to be dealt with expeditiously. Such a motion places the Government in an untenable position and a position of uncertainty. So, we expect this motion to be dealt with when the Parliament next meets on October 5th, 2022."

Motion on

Lack Of Confidence In the Government

WHEREAS; having regard to the general conduct of the Government since it assumed office on 22nd April 2021 and the failure of the Government to take any significant action to tackle the challenges facing the Cayman Islands, particularly with regard, but not limited to:

1. The Premier's lack of effective leadership;
2. The Cabinet's collective lack of collaboration, cohesion, and competence;
3. The lack of any progress in bringing forward a Parliamentary Code of Conduct that would provide an effective means of holding Members of Parliament accountable for their behaviour;
4. The lack of any substantive legislation being brought to Parliament in over a year;
5. In contravention of accepted conventions and norms, the Premier allowed his Ministers to involve the Speaker of Parliament in government business at home and at official meetings overseas;
6. The failure to make any significant progress against the overwhelming majority of the targets the Government set for itself in its Strategic Policy Statement;
7. The failure to recognise and respond quickly and effectively to the cost-of-living crisis, which is impacting families and businesses across the Cayman Islands;
8. The failure to implement the motion passed during Parliament's last sitting to reduce stamp duty paid by Caymanians, especially first-time home and property buyers;
9. The failure to complete the review of the national minimum wage;
10. The ongoing slippage in the delivery of the waste to energy facility (known as Regen) – the sustainable, long-term alternative to landfilling waste and generating electricity from our waste;
11. The failure to make progress with a National Development Plan despite the work of Plan Cayman to establish both development principles and an effective planning framework;
12. The delays in opening the overseas offices that are necessary to support the financial services industry, encourage inward investment and build Cayman's reputation abroad;
13. The failure of Ministers and others to conform to acceptable standards of behaviour in public life, including failure to comply with the Ministerial Code of Conduct;
14. A Minister personally cancelling an order for essential public health supplies, an action he had no authority to take.

BE IT NOW THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT Parliament does declare a lack of confidence in the Government.



BARBADOS PRIME MINISTER SAYS BANK DE-RISKING UNFAIR TO CARIBBEAN

Barbados Prime Minister Mia Mottley has issued a challenge to the United States government to review its policies on bank de-risking which she argues are unfairly harming the economies of Caribbean countries.

In what has been described as "historic" testimony before the US Congressional Committee on Financial Services, the Barbados leader said the policies being pursued by the US government, the Organisation for Cooperation and Development (OECD), Financial Action Task Force (FATF) and other international financial sector watchdogs were counterproductive.

"The reality is that delisting has been recognised by the Bank of International Settlements as the greatest reason why correspondent banks leave and remove their relationships. And therefore these lists are deleterious. We believe that if we can move off these lists, we are in a position to be able to at least have a better chance to make the case that the substantive concerns that we all have to fight crime are being met," she told the committee members.

Ms Mottley made the point that "the reality is that the State Department's report once again - we've been complaining for years - is prepared by junior officers. It is not robust. It does not allow us a rate of response, and it does not take into account improved stability during the course of the year."

"We are here because the delisting process that has taken place whether through

the Financial Action Task Force or the OECD, or further as a result of actions taken for enhanced due diligence by those who take the lessons from the EFF, ATF and the OECD," she argued.

"It means that those correspondent banks over the course of the last 10 to 12 years have made a judgement that we are simply too small as I've just told you in order to get involved because the enhanced due diligence means increased costs of regulation, increased cost of compliance. And rather than do business with us, they say thank you, but no thank you. What it has meant is that almost every country in our region over the last decade, with the exception of two or three, have had a loss of more than 30% of their correspondent banking relationships."

COUNTERPRODUCTIVE

The Barbados Prime Minister also addressed the extent of the economic impact as she said investors are now considering it too costly to do business in the region, because of the hurdles they have to clear due to expanded and excessive due diligence requirements.

"What I haven't spoken about is the millions of dollars that we have to spend as a small state to try to satisfy those considerably larger questionnaires that exist in circumstances where we know that the money isn't in us and that it's not us where the money launderers, money launderers are hiding them in plain sight. But you're coming to us to give yourself a sense of comfort and that is our concern with these lists."



The Barbados Prime Minister argued that the enhanced restrictions are wrongly targeting Caribbean countries while dubious entities exploit loopholes to hide their assets in metropolitan financial centres such as London, New York and other states in the US, along with Luxembourg and other financial centres in Europe.

"When we comply with the list, a new list comes out with different concerns. And we've seen it whether in terms of money laundering, and terrorism financing or in terms of tax transparency with the OECD. If you go back we're continuously on these lists facing the consequences of that withdrawal."

"Therefore, she concluded, "what we face is a situation of everything that you set out to achieve, which is the avoidance of terrorism financing, the avoidance of money laundering, on which we are all agree is likely to happen because you're driving people underground, there is no benefit in driving others or making our countries uncompetitive, such that our economies are at risk of becoming underdeveloped or failed states."

Prime Minister Mottley's testimony to the US House Financial Services Committee on the topic of 'Impacts of De-Risking on the Caribbean', marked the first time in nearly 40 years that a Prime Minister had testified before Congress.

OfReg investigation finds FLOW overcharged business customers

OfReg is investigating the pricing practices of telecommunications service provider FLOW. It has, so far, confirmed that FLOW overcharged all its fixed line business customers from January 2019 onwards, by applying an unapproved rate increase from CI\$30.00 to CI\$35.00 per month.

Restrictions in FLOW's operating licence at the time, included the legal requirement to submit proposed rate increases to OfReg for review and approval. To protect customers and promote competition in the marketplace - for any change in rate charges, increases or decreases - FLOW was required to provide evidence and justification to the regulator, in advance.

At this point in the investigation, FLOW has admitted that it failed to comply with a licence condition to seek OfReg's approval prior to applying the increased rate, which has resulted in its business customers being overcharged by CI\$4.99 per month.

OfReg has issued FLOW with an Administrative Fine Notice in relation to the contraventions, a process which affords Flow an opportunity to provide a formal response to the allegations. After a review of FLOW's response, the Office will issue a decision of its ultimate findings, which will include any appropriate penalties. OfReg will also consider other appropriate directives to be issued to FLOW. The final determination and agreed course of action will be published by OfReg as soon as it is available.

US interest rates rise again

The United States central bank pushed interest rates on Wednesday to the highest level in almost 15 years in a bid to rein in soaring prices in the world's largest economy.

It's a third rise in months, and is the latest in a series of borrowing cost increases, as the central bank tries to dial back near-historic inflation while avoiding an economic downturn.

The Fed raised the benchmark interest rate by 0.75%, repeating the same hike it imposed at each of the last two meetings. It lifts the target range to 3% to 3.25%. The Fed last matched a hike of this magnitude in 1994.

Inflation rates are rising alarmingly, adding woes for American households and sending the S&P 500 tumbling for its worst day of 2022.

The Fed's strategy risks tipping the US into a recession and putting millions out of work just when the American economy was recovering after two years of COVID impact. Borrowing costs are expected to climb more - and remain high, the bank said.

Federal Reserve chairman Jerome Powell has said the rate rises are necessary to slow demand, easing the pressures putting up prices and avoiding long-term damage to the economy.

Banks in nearly every country - with the big exceptions of Japan and China - are taking similar steps to tackle their own inflation problems.

The Bank of England is widely expected to announce its seventh consecutive rate rise at its meeting on Thursday, while Indonesia and the Philippines are also poised for increases.

Fears that the British economy is already in recession after a much bigger-than-expected decline in retail sales triggered heavy selling of the pound on international money markets to a fresh 37-year low against the dollar last week. Even the Cayman Islands dollar is on par with sterling right now, when for years it has been closer to the value of the US dollar.

With average UK wages continuing to fall behind rising prices and the Bank of England expected to push up interest rates next

week, sterling fell by more than 1% against the US currency to \$1.135, its lowest since 1985. On the 30th anniversary of Black Wednesday when the UK crashed out of the European exchange rate mechanism, the pound also hit a 17-month low against the euro, with €1 worth 87.66p.

Analysts worry that the global sweep of the rate hikes, which ripple out to the public in the form of more expensive mortgages, loans and credit card debt, could lead to a global recession. Russia's continuing invasion of Ukraine adds to the economic global downturn.

"That is definitely one of the downside risks - that the synchronised nature of the tightening could make it that much more powerful," said Brian Coulton, chief economist at Fitch Ratings.

In the US, the Fed is raising rates at one of the fastest paces in its modern history, a sharp reversal after years of low borrowing costs.

Wednesday's increase - the fifth in a row - lifts the rate the Fed charges banks to borrow from near zero at the start of the year to 3% for the first time since 2008.

Forecasts released by the Fed on Wednesday show policymakers expect it to reach 4.4% by the end of the year - and rise to 4.6% in 2023, sharply higher than its prior forecasts.

"What is striking is the speed," Mr Coulton said. "They're having to move very quickly ... and it means it's more likely to be a surprise to firms and households."

We have already seen that the Chamber is a catalyst, bringing different groups together to effect change. But the Chamber is also an advocate, effecting change by speaking up for those who may not otherwise have a voice.

Advocacy is just as much part of Chamber's DNA as its role as Catalyst, operating in accord with its mission statement to "support, promote, protect" in the exact same three areas of business, government and community.

The Chamber's advocacy agenda falls under four headings: Education and Workforce Development; Economic Growth and Diversification; Regulatory Efficiencies; and Quality of Life. Each of these will be discussed in more detail in future articles.

How advocacy works

It is hard for one voice to be heard in a crowd, but many voices, acting in unison, will get noticed. In a similar way, the Chamber can speak up for its members, identifying issues of common concern through a process of listening, receiving feedback, before converting the raw data into policy and position statements it can then present to the government.

It's in a strong position to do so, because the Government knows that, unlike other specialised business associations, the Chamber looks out for all businesses, from the smallest mom & pop store to the largest corporation.

Everyone has a say, everyone has a voice. That means when the Chamber identifies an issue, it is likely to affect everyone. Advocacy gives groups or individuals a voice, but it also helps Government, providing feedback on how well its policies are working.

Advocacy of this kind therefore plays a key role in Cayman's democratic landscape. At election-time, the Chamber provides a public platform for candidates at Candidate's Forums, giving the electorate the chance to hear what each representative stands for.

Being an effective advocate must mean that, first of all, you thoroughly understand the position of the person who you represent. The Chamber continually stays in touch with memberships' views and concerns through surveys, meetings, special events, and focus groups.

Raw data gathered is discussed by the Chamber Council, an internally elected body whose job is to identify which issues should be converted to policy, and brought to the attention of elected representatives.

Sometimes the issues are referred on to industry roundtables, special workshops or focus groups, for further consideration, before findings are presented to Government either in the form of a Position Paper, research report, or in person, such as when a Chamber representative sits upon a Government committee.

The CIPLS advises visitors to enter the venue using the ‘original’ main entrance to the old Library on Edward Street, as the side entrances will be fenced off and used as exits.


Mr. Goring continued, “The Library provides access to information and ad-
