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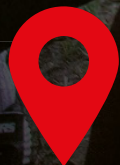

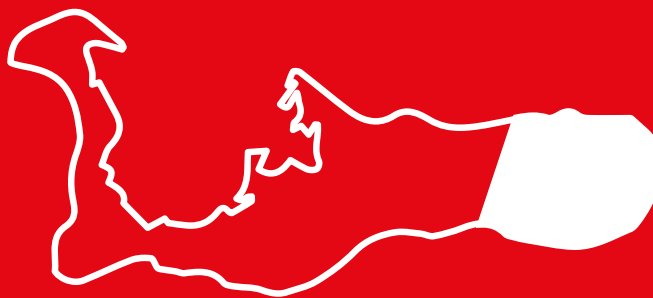

CIBC FIRSTCARIBBEAN ANNOUNCES FOUR NEW FULL SCHOLARSHIPS IN THE NAME OF RETIRING FIRST FEMALE CEO

Scholarships in Business or Banking & Finance tenable at any UWI Campus

CIBC FirstCaribbean has announced four new one-off scholarships for female finance students in honour of retiring Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Colette Delaney, the first woman to head the regional bank.

In making the announcement recently, incoming CEO Mark St. Hill hailed his predecessor as a “champion for women, girls and diversity and inclusion at our bank.”

He said the bank could not think of a more fitting tribute to honour Delaney, a career banker who has been with the bank for the past nine years and CEO for the past four, than to “offer these scholarships to four deserving young women from across the region.”

The Colette Delaney Scholarship for Women in Business Studies will allow four young women across the Caribbean region to realise their dreams of pursuing studies

in the field of Business or Banking & Finance at the UWI campus of their choice.

St. Hill said during her tenure Colette set up the Women’s Network for females in the bank - a support group for senior females in the bank as they navigate the corporate world. She also placed renewed emphasis on developing regional people, evidenced by the number of management training programmes for senior leadership and mentorship programmes for employees at all levels that were established.

He added that she also promoted a number of regional people to the bank’s Senior Executive Team.

St. Hill said Colette, the immediate past Chair of the bank’s charitable arm, the FirstCaribbean International ComTrust Foundation, took a deep satisfaction in the impact the work of the foundation had on communities and institutions across the

region, especially its award of scores of undergraduate and post-graduate scholarships every year to students of the University of the West Indies.

Delaney said she was “touched and truly honoured that four deserving young women across the region will have another route to educational advancement with these scholarships offered by the bank.”

Colette’s appointment as Chief Executive Officer, the first woman to be appointed to the role, was a landmark in the bank’s history. 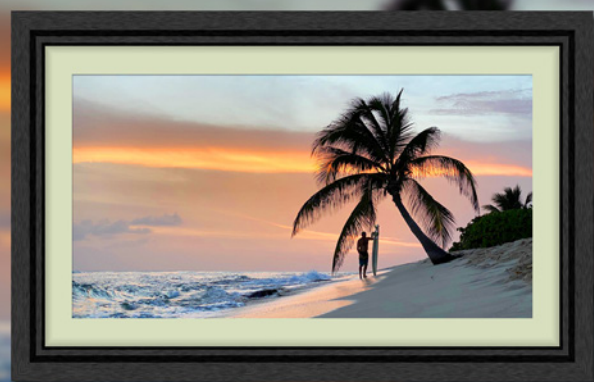

Economy driven by private sector, not government says Deputy Premier

Cayman's economy was "Overall doing pretty good," in its recovery from the pandemic, was the message given by Deputy Premier Hon. Chris Saunders, Minister for Finance, Economic Development, Border Control & Labour at the recent Chamber of Commerce Luncheon. He gave an overview of the current state of the Cayman Islands economy as well as projections for next year. He outlined a number of initiatives that the PACT Government was taking to help people cope with the high cost of living. But the main point he emphasized again and again was that the Government should be the facilitator of economic growth, rather than its driver which should always be the private sector.



With an illustration of how the United States' had become an economic powerhouse with innovators like Henry Ford, and from there become a global superpower, he said that Cayman had followed the same pattern. When the Cayman islands was an outcast in the British Empire, that forced us to innovate," he said. "When Schooners didn't come here, we created our own schooners and went to the world. We had an industrious never give up attitude."

Just like the United States, there were three pillars of success: Community followed by the economy, and last of all politics. "Because Cayman was left alone we developed organically," he said. "The PACT government is determined to return the political system to its rightful place. The Cayman Islands must be driven at the community level by the private sector if it is to be successful," he said. The PACT government's goal was, "Equal opportunities, not equal outcomes."

Sharing news on the economy, Minister Saunders said that Construction, real estate

and financial services were all doing well, and since the border opening both the cruise sector and stayover tourism were making a strong recovery. The recent Labour Force Survey showed unemployment at just three percent in total.

Turning his attention to the soaring cost of living, Minister Saunders explained that Covid, followed by the war in Ukraine had disrupted the global supply chain. The Government would continue with the energy subsidy: "It's a five million hit to the public purse, but its important...to maintain economic activity." He said

He also justified the Government stepping in to provide free lunches for children in all the public schools for 16 million. It made sense, he said, because the Government was in a position to buy in bulk and so keep unit costs down, but also because, during the pandemic it had become clear that many children here were, 'going to bed hungry,' and that was a situation the PACT government would not allow to continue. It was also a chance for the Government to



provide more nutritious diets for the Nation's children, leading to a positive impact on national health and health care. The Minister confirmed his government's commitment to supporting education at all levels, by reintroducing private school grants, and increasing the amounts for scholarships to make tertiary level education at the UCCI and ICCI available free of charge.

In a move away from his speech, Minister Saunders advocated rules that allowed for much higher rise buildings, only in specified locations "We need to do something about building heights. 10 stories is not going to be enough; we need 20 story or 30 story buildings," he said. He said he would like to see more hotels especially, because hotels create jobs twice, once during their construction, but then again as they look for workers to run them.

"We are taking certain step to increase our own food security," Minister Saunders said, adding that new, more direct shipping routes

between food suppliers Central were being negotiated, and that these would cut out food costs. He also spoke about the need to make sure local farmers are supported.

Government entities should keep control of the two main communications cables that connect Cayman with the outside world, adding that was too important to delegate to delegate to the private sector.

Turning his attention to speeding up work permits, Minister Saunders advocated for the need to transfer such processes online, saying that the system should be, "Fully automated by the first half of next year." Such a transition would help to eliminate human mistakes as well as the possibility of human bias in the decisions being made. Answering a question about PR applications, Minister Saunders talked about the need to shift the present points system away from wealth and land ownership, towards a meritocracy, and that this would help people that the country needed, like teachers.

GOVERNOR ROPER ANNOUNCES HIS DEPARTURE FROM CAYMAN

HE Governor Martyn Roper has announced that he will depart the Cayman Islands in March next year at the end of his tenure.

“Lissie and I arrived in these wonderful Islands 4 years ago on 29 October 2018. We can’t believe how quickly time has flown by, and what a privilege it has been to be so warmly welcomed to Cayman throughout our time here,” he wrote in a Facebook post dated November 1st.

“Over the last four years as Governor I have shared many extraordinary moments and occasions with you all,” he said and highlighted several of those moments including “not to forget we had to contend with a challenging earthquake and numerous tropical storms (one of which - Grace - felt to many like a hurricane!).”

In addition to his official duties and community outreach, Mr. Roper’s tenure in Cayman will also be remembered for his intervention in the deadlocked issue of the legal recognition of same-sex partnerships where he had to resort to using his constitutional powers to override existing legislation and imposed the Civil Partnership law.

“As Governor, I have sought to strike a careful balance between my constitutional responsibilities in fully respecting the domestic autonomy and accountability of our elected leaders and fulfilling my UK obligations for security and good governance,” he wrote in the post.

“I have steadfastly supported the people of these Islands, including the financial services industry at overseas events, in UK and on EU and FATF listings,” he added.

Social media-savvy Governor Roper lists a catalogue of accomplishments and engagements from his arrival in Cayman on 29th October 2018 to current and ongoing official and community involvements over the past four years and counting down to March next year when he leaves office.

Among the highlights chosen by Mr. Roper the constitutional change discussions in 2018 that amongst other revisions changed the Legislative Assembly into the House of Parliament and our elected representatives into Members of Parliament, plus setting up a Police Service Commission.

He also recalls supporting both the PPM Government and the PACT Government, working very closely with two Premiers and

Ministers, the visit of the then Prince of Wales and Duchess of Cornwall - now King Charles III - to the Cayman Islands in 2019, the Cayman Islands Government’s response to the Coronavirus Pandemic, the BA repatriation flights, too many press conferences to mention and my first dose of the UK supplied vaccine in early 2021 (those vaccines saved hundreds of lives), and the formation of the Cayman Islands Regiment and continued UK support to our Coast Guard.

Also listed by the Governor are the Pride March and the passing of the Civil Partnership legislation advancing rights in our jurisdiction, the gun salute following the death of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, and the declaration of Ascension of King Charles III, attending the funeral with Premier Panton

of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth III, and the 2021 Elections and appointment of local election observers, and more recently the swearing in of the new Chief Justice, Margaret Ramsay-Hale

On his social and community engagements, Mr. Roper mentions “a steel pan performance with my teacher Earl La Pierre in front of hundreds of people!, a wide range of interactions with our community from seniors to youth to media to charities to blue iguanas, meeting with the crew of HMS Medway following Hurricane Ian,” adding that “there are so many more I could have included”

He said, “it has been inspiring and uplifting to interact with so many different people across the community and to see



how much community activity and care there is for others.”

Mr. Roper, who has another five months in Cayman, remarked: “Both Lissie and I have come to love and admire so much about the Islands that we have called our home for the last four years. We will be here until the end of March 2023. There is still much to do but I look back with pride and affection at the last 4 years. We emerged stronger from the pandemic. I remain confident about the future success and prosperity of Cayman. God bless the people of these Islands.”

The Ministry and Department of Tourism are delighted to congratulate Captain Arthlee (Atlee) Evans, who received the prestigious Tommy Gifford Award from the International Game Fishing Association (IGFA) on Thursday 27 October.

The Gala Awards presentation was one of the highlights of the 63rd Fort Lauderdale

International Boat Show, which took place from 26th – 30th October, 2022.

Among his many lifetime achievements, Captain Evans is credited as having helped to develop sport fishing in the Cayman Islands, as well as throughout the Caribbean since the 1960s. He helped to place the Cayman Islands on the world's sport fishing

map and was instrumental in developing the Islands pelagic fishery for blue marlin, yellowfin tuna, wahoo and swordfish. He also has set numerous light tackle IGFA world records. Captain Evans lives and fishes in Cayman Brac and is a passionate educator who willingly shares his knowledge and experiences with anyone wishing to learn.

Minister for Tourism Hon. Kenneth Bryan and Parliamentary Secretary, Ms. Heather Bodden were both present at the awards gala, along with President of the Cayman Islands Angling Club Franklin Thompson and other Angling Club members.

"I feel so proud and excited for Captain Arthlee for being recognised by the IGFA in the category of 'Caribbean Offshore Pioneer,' said Minister Bryan. "This is an amazing accomplishment, and I am happy that there was a strong Caymanian contingent in Fort Lauderdale to support him."

Adding to the congratulations, Dr. Guy Harvey, world renowned conservationist and wildlife marine artist noted that Atlee is the first person in the Cayman Islands to join this prestigious group of honorees, and he is also the first person from the English speaking Caribbean to do so. "So it's a great, great honour," emphasised Dr. Harvey.

Recipients of the Tommy Gifford Award are selected by a Committee of internationally renowned fishing Captains and crew, chaired by Captain Frank 'Skip' Smith, President and Tournament Director, who is recognized as being one of the world's finest fishing captains.

Sight-saving eye surgery available in Cayman

The future looks brighter for four individuals who, after receiving a sight-saving operation by HSA's Ophthalmologist Dr Ermanno Scerrati, have either fully recovered their vision or are on the way to a full recovery.

A cornea transplant, also called keratoplasty, is a surgical procedure to replace part of a damaged cornea with healthy corneal tissue from a donor. It can restore or improve vision, lessen pain, and possibly improve the appearance of the cornea if it is white and scarred, all leading to a better-quality life.

Prior to joining the HSA Dr Scerrati had performed over 200 cornea transplant surgeries across several countries. The first patient to receive this operation at the HSA was 63-year-old Caymanian Grace Williams who was experiencing pain and visual deterioration in her left eye. Dr Scerrati saved her eyesight and has since begun repairing the vision of others in Cayman, including Menalia Ramos-Ulloa.

Mrs Ramos-Ulloa was suffering from severe blurred vision, frequent pain and redness of

her eye before her private ophthalmologist referred her to Dr Scerrati, aware of his ability to perform corneal transplant procedures.

After consulting with Mrs Ramos-Ulloa, Dr Scerrati confirmed that her cornea was completely decompensated, a complication from an earlier cataract surgery she had received. In the prior surgery, an artificial replacement for lens otherwise known as intraocular lens (IOL) was implanted in her eye but had become dislocated.

Dr Scerrati successfully performed the challenging procedure, which included a corneal

transplant as well as IOL extraction in September and plans to completely restore Mrs Ramos-Ulloa's vision by replacing her dislocated IOL with a new one.

Although still in the recovery phase, Mrs Ramos-Ulloa expressed her optimism about her surgery and its final outcome. "I think my surgery has been a success. I have faith in God and confidence in Dr Scerrati."

Before being offered at the HSA, the last cornea transplant surgery was performed over a decade ago on island and patients in need of the procedure were referred overseas. After his arrival, Dr Scerrati and the Oph-

thalmic Technician Diane Benson established a continuous partnership with the Florida Lions Eye Bank that helps to supply eye tissue locally to patients who require surgery.

"There are numerous corneal pathologies that can lead to the patient requiring a corneal transplant. These may range from congenital corneal dystrophies and complications from cataract surgeries to corneal scars resulting from infection or corneal penetrating trauma," explained

Dr Scerrati. "Whatever the cause, we want people suffering from these issues to know that a solution is available locally."

"The Lion's Eye Clinic is proud to announce that we have the technology, knowledge, and full capability to perform this surgery. Our team at the HSA, from Ms Benson to the operating room staff, always go the extra mile to ensure the best outcomes for our patients and to this date, all our corneal transplants have been successful."

HMS Medway, the Royal Navy ship that has been in the Caribbean for the 2022 Hurricane Season, and which was in Cayman waters to support the Cayman Islands after Hurricane Ian, has seized more than 400kg of cocaine, with a street value of £24m from a vessel near the Dominican Republic.

The crew of HMS Medway, working in conjunction with a US Coast Guard Law Enforcement detachment, detained three crew members when they boarded the vessel.

It is fantastic to see the excellent work of our Royal Navy, stopping illicit drugs reaching the hands of dealers and users. We all know the devastating effect such substances can have on the lives of individuals and their families.

This achievement not only serves as a victory in the UK's commitment to keep illicit drugs off of the streets, but it also serves to test HMS Medway's versatility, and demonstrates the crew's ability to shift from Disaster Relief Operations to Counter Illicit Trafficking Operations.

It is reassuring to know that the UK has assets such as HMS Medway within the region, positioned to support Cayman and other Overseas Territories, should we

need it during hurricane season.

CUC report more customers but lower usage

For the third quarter of 2022, ending 30 September, CUC saw growing customer numbers and energy sales, but lower average consumption by residential customers in the face of high fuel prices. Consumers have been assisted by CUC's Government Fuel Cost Relief programme which has given cash back to residential customers who use 2,000 kWh or less each month. Earnings increased slightly over the same period last year.

CUC also reported that it had seen depreciation charges increase for the quarter, which they said were related to Seven Mile Beach and Prospect Substations and other growth-related capital projects coming into service. Reliability and safety results were as planned they endured Tropical Storm Ian with minimal physical damage, they said.

Global fuel prices continued to rise in the third quarter impacting CUC's fuel costs. Power generation expenses for the third quarter of 2022 totalled \$52.4 million, an increase of 70% compared to \$30.8 million for the same period last year, due to the 75% increase in the average fuel price per imperial gallon during Q3 2022 in comparison to Q3 2021. The average Fuel Cost Charge rate billed to consumers for Q3 2022 was \$0.29 per kWh, compared to \$0.17 per kWh last year. CUC said it passed through all fuel costs and renewable costs to consumers on a two-month lag basis with no mark-up.



Net earnings for the third quarter of 2022 totalled \$10.4 million, an increase of \$0.3 million or 3% in comparison to \$10.1 million last year, due to an increase in kWh sales by 2% and customer growth of 3%. The net earnings during the period were positively impacted by the decrease of transmission and distribution costs and higher foreign exchange gains and negatively impacted by increase in depreciation expense, general and administration cost and higher finance charges.

After the adjustment for dividends on the preference shares of the Company,

earnings on Class A Ordinary Shares for Q3 2022 totalled \$10.3 million, or \$0.28 per Class A Ordinary Share, in comparison to earnings of \$10.0 million, or \$0.26 per Class A Ordinary Share for Q3 2021. 3 Net earnings for the nine months ending 30 September, 2022 totalled \$24.2 million, an increase of \$2.2 million or 10% when compared to last year. After the adjustment for dividends on CUC's preference shares, earnings on Class A Ordinary Shares for the nine months ending 30 September, 2022 totalled \$23.9 million, or \$0.64 per Class A Ordinary Share, in comparison to

\$21.7 million, or \$0.58 per Class A Ordinary Share, for the same period last year.

Sales for the third quarter of 2022 totalled 184.0 million kWh, an increase of 4.1 million kWh or 2% in comparison last year, driven by the higher commercial customer sales in Q3 2022 compared to Q3 2021 and the 3% increase in customer numbers between Q3 2022 and Q3 2021. Sales in kWh for the nine months ending 30 September, 2022 totalled 504.6 million kWh, an increase of 10.1 million kWh on last year, due to a 3% growth in overall customer numbers for the nine months ending 30 September, 2022 compared to last year. The number of customers at the end of 30 September, 2022 was 32,865, an increase of 901 customers, or 3%, compared to 31,964 customers last year. During Q3 2022, CUC recorded a new system peak load of 113.573 megawatts.

President and CEO, Richard Hew, stated: "The state of the current global fuel markets emphasises the need and our desire to advance activities under the Integrated Resource Plan as quickly as possible, particularly utility scale solar projects, to transition to more sustainable energy solutions that bring price stability and reduce carbon emissions. Tropical Storm Ian also reminds us of the importance of building resilient systems such as our indoor substations to adapt to more frequent storms brought by climate change."

Over the last 50 years the Lions Club of Grand Cayman has been visible in the Cayman Islands with their signature yellow vests seen at many an event. This week we pay special homage to this valuable service club as it celebrates its golden 50th anniversary.

1972 – 2022 History notes

The Lions Club of Grand Cayman was chartered in October 1972, from its inception a strong foundation in Lionism was laid by its chartered members (many of whom have passed on into sunset), from which the club has grown from strength to strength and this year we celebrate our 50th year of service to our community.

The Lions movement got its birth from an idea originating from a gentleman by the name of Melvin Jones, a businessman in Chicago. When he joined a networking luncheon club for businessmen in Chicago

called the Business Circle, he quickly took the lead in recruiting new members and persuading backsliders to rejoin. But something about the club's business-only focus didn't square with Jones' different, larger vision. That vision grew within the USA and came to the Caribbean in the 1960s and shortly thereafter to Grand Cayman.

Lion Peter Balls was among the group who travelled from Jamaica to form this club. Soon a group of local men were recruited, and the club received its charter on 6 October 1972. The Charter President was Lion Thomas Hurlston, who often remarked of it been a great honour to be selected/ elected as president. The Club's first board included Barry Phillips 1st VP, David Arch 2nd VP, Gaston Maloney Secretary, Richard Graham Taylor Treasurer, and Rex Rankine as assistant secretary.

These individuals saw the need and together they have been making a difference



as their legacy continues with new recruits and the commitment to service our community.

The club would have its regular meetings in location that were available with the assistance of the membership connections. Even though this group of men were visionaries not one at that time anticipated huge success over the years as the club grew from strength to strength. The club acquired its permanent home in 1990 and is a testament of commitment and diligence of the membership. The current building was to be developed into a fully enclosed and multipurpose facility to serve the community. The Lions Community Centre was envisioned to be completed in phases with the first being a major task to enclose a newly constructed facility which was completed at a cost of \$650k within ten (10) months consisting of a main hall, modern changing rooms, restrooms and bar service in the main auditorium.

Over the years the membership always wanted to give back not only to our local community but further to our Lions at regional levels as well. Assisting with Lions signature projects and reaching our international headquarters with donations that benefited to various geographical regions of need through the Caribbean and the world over.

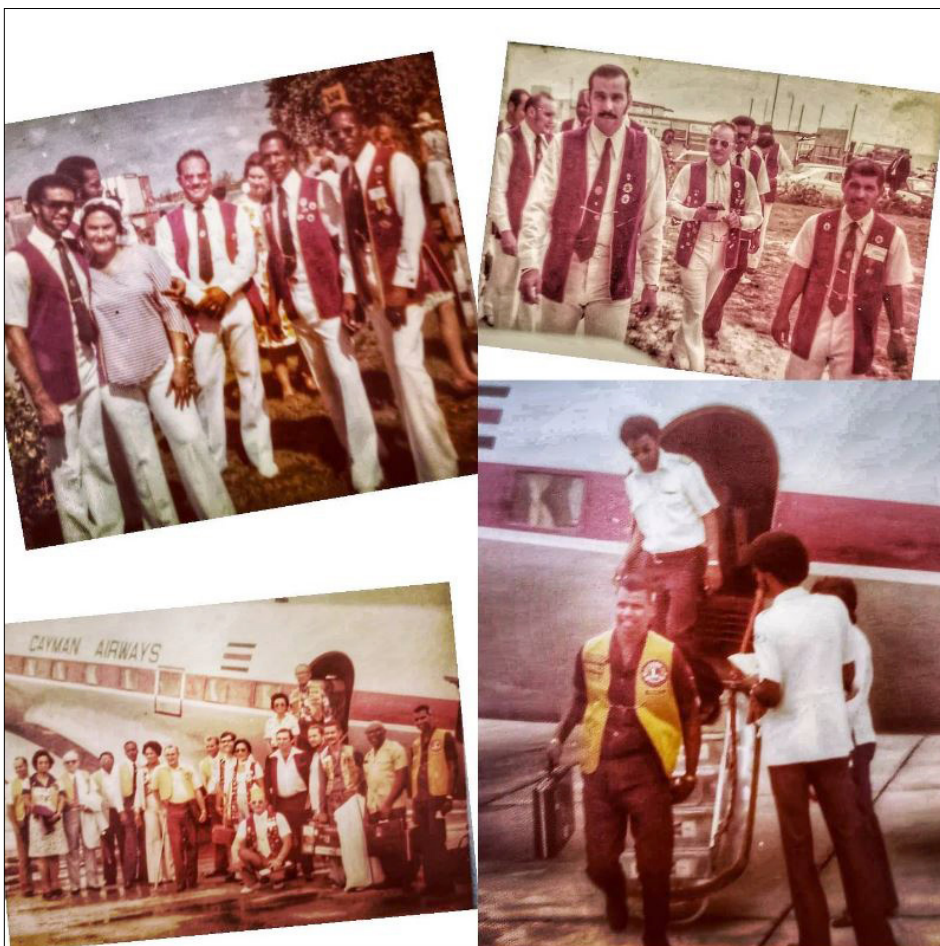

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Elmslie Memorial United Church's 100th Anniversary

Last weekend saw the culmination of several months of celebrating the Elmslie Church building which has reached its 100th birthday. On the Saturday night, 29th of October, a banquet was held at the Lions' Centre, with a concluding service in the sanctuary the following afternoon.

The iconic building on the George Town waterfront was actually the fourth church built on the site, the previous three having been destroyed by successive storms. In 1920, the members of that time determined to build a sanctuary that would withstand a hurricane, and they chose a well-known shipwright Capt. Royal Bodden to build it, although he had never built a building. The architect in Jamaica made the comment, "Anyone who can build a ship can build a church, but not everyone who can build a church can build a ship." They also decided it had to be built of concrete blocks. As there were no brick struc-

tures in Cayman, Capt. Royal was sent to Jamaica to learn how to make the blocks.

Finances were very short so the minister of the day, Rev. R.N. Dixon travelled to

the USA to raise funds from the Caymanian diaspora there.

The foundation stones were laid on 1st July 1920 with completion two years later, the formal dedication taking place on Tuesday, 5th December 1922.

It was decided to name the church after Rev. James Elmslie who had pioneered the work of Presbyterianism on the island. A Scottish missionary serving at the time in Jamaica, he volunteered to come when it was discovered that there was no church on the island, arriving in 1846. Despite considerable challenges - from mosquitoes, ill health, storms and, initially, strongly opposed by the authorities - he lasted 17 years by which time he had established congregations in each of the six districts, with an estimated half of the island's population attending church. The Presbyterian Church, now the United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands, is the longest serving denomination in the islands.

The Sunday anniversary service, which was led by Elmslie's minister, Rev. Chris Mason, was attended by several dignitaries, including His Excellency, the Governor,

Mr. Martyn Roper, and the Premier, Hon. Wayne Panton, who both brought greetings, as well as the Moderator of the United Church, Rt. Rev. Gary Harriott, and the church's General Secretary, Rev. Norbert Stephens, who both came from Jamaica for the occasion. The Moderator delivered the sermon, reminding the congregation that the church's true foundation is Jesus Christ.

The service was preceded by the dedication of a plaque marking the occasion, with a time capsule being placed in the plinth.

The chairman of the 100th Anniversary committee, Terri Merren, commented that the preparation and activities involved a lot of time and hard work. She added, "Without the tremendous support from all of the committee members who worked together as a team, these events would not have been possible. There often did not seem to be enough time in the day, but God said not to worry. He is good, and He made it possible to complete everything on time. At the end, we wanted to ensure that it was He who received the glory."

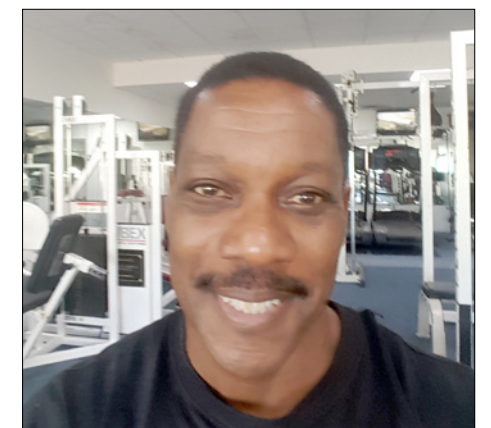

22nd Annual Silent Witness March

“Every1 Knows Some1” was the theme of the 22nd Annual Silent Witness March between the grounds of the Glass House on Elgin Avenue, past the court building to Constitution Hall. More than a hundred people came, silently carrying red silhouettes of women in solidarity with all the people who suffer silently, year after year. His Excellency The Governor, Mr. Martyn Roper and his wife Elizabeth both joined in at the front of the march, along with Deputy Governor, Hon. Franz Manderson, and Premier, the Hon. Wayne Panton, The purpose of the march is to remember and honour those who have suffered as a result of domestic violence and bullying.

The Silent Witness March began in Minnesota in 1990 after a group of women, media and non-profit organizations chose to demonstrate against the growing amount of domestic violence cases in their area. In 2000, The Business and Professional Women’s Club (BPW) of Grand

Cayman brought the initiative to the Cayman Islands. Today, the March is held each October during Domestic Violence Awareness Month in partnership with the Cayman Islands Crisis Centre, the Gender Affairs Unit and the Family Resource Centre.

Cheryl Myles President of BPW said, “Domestic violence affects people around the world. It does not discriminate, it happens to people regardless of age, gender, social or economic status, race or culture. As our nation recovers from the Covid 19 crisis, incidents of domestic violence have increased around the world, and also here in the Cayman Islands, as families face unprecedented stress, and financial uncertainty, while being isolated at home or without a job. The Business and Professional Women of Grand Cayman will continue to support local community groups, NGOs and individuals who are in dialogue about domestic violence, and how we can all contribute to changing the narrative. More prevalent than most people realize, one in four women and one in four

men have experienced domestic violence in their lifetime.”

Bishop Clayton Martin said the opening prayer. As we marched in silence my mind

went back to the Children of Israel as they marched around the walls of the City of Jericho in silence, and just like it happened then where the wall fell, my prayer today is that the wall of domestic violence will crumble under the face of a determined set of people like you are today, young and old march together to see the end of domestic violence.”

Representing the RCIPS, Detective Constable Brian Faint said, “We’ve processed over 100 protection orders we’ve also done our own work to protect, often against the wishes of the victim and in very challenging situations where they don’t want the protection orders taking place.”

Mareisha Spencer of the CICC said, “The mission of the alliance is simple: to eradicate domestic abuse in the Cayman Islands. We hope to do this through a multi-agency coordinated response, advocacy, community education, and support for those impacted. By definition, domestic abuse is any incident or pattern of behavior characterized by an imbalance of power and control, where one person intends to harm or abuse another person who might be their intimate partner, ex-partner or family member.

Domestic abuse survivor Karla Tatum had the courage to speak up about her own nightmare of domestic abuse, which included physical and verbal abuse, over a prolonged period which led to loss of sleep, depression and anxiety.

Messi's last World Cup bid

Lionel Messi has won absolutely everything in a glittering career over the last 18 years. Everything, that is, except the World Cup.

The seven-time Ballon d'Or winner has an enviable list of achievements at club level, but it's that World Cup winner's medal that eludes the brilliant Argentinian.

Messi has suffered much heartache with Argentina. At the 2010 World Cup he watched many Barcelona team-mates grab glory with Spain after Argentina were eliminated in the quarter-finals by Germany. Four years later it was a 113th-minute strike by Germany's Mario Gotze that denied him, despite being awarded the Golden Ball award. The 2018 World Cup was another flop for Argentina, losing to France 4-3 in the Round of 16 before they went on to win it.

Now 35, Messi has confirmed the World Cup in Qatar this month will be his last. "There's some anxiety and nerves at the same time... it is the last one," he said in an interview with Star Plus.

For all his brilliance, critics believe Diego Maradona and Pele's World Cup successes are why Messi cannot claim to be

the Greatest of All Time. (Cristiano Ronaldo is also a candidate.) With that in mind, Messi aims to silence persistent detractors in his last dance on the biggest stage.

When Lionel Scaloni took over from Jorge Sampaoli after the failings of 2018, few predicted Argentina's dramatic improvement. Scaloni took over with no experience in management but has since transformed the South Americans.

Argentina enter the tournament with a magnificent 35-match unbeaten run and are as one of the favourites. They ended a 28-year barren run in winning the Copa America in 2021. And to make it sweeter, that victory was against bitter rivals Brazil inside their iconic Maracana stadium.

Scaloni has cleverly evolved Argentina to no longer be heavily reliant on Messi, as in previous tournaments, although there are no huge names anywhere near his class. He still remains the player the opposition focuses on.

Messi's lost a little speed and wizardry yet last week he broke Pele's record for most goals and assists ever. PSG smashed Macabi Haifa 7-2 in the Champi-

ons League. Messi grabbed two goals and two assists as they sealed qualification to the round of 16.

In doing so, he reached a combined total of 1,127 goal involvements in his career. This overtakes the legendary Pele, who was involved in 1,126 goals. During his remarkable career, Messi has scored 672 goals for Barcelona, 22 for PSG and 90 for Argentina.

Meanwhile, Messi is ignoring calls from Barcelona as he holds talks over a sensational transfer to Inter Miami. The maestro has been linked with a switch to the MLS side when his current PSG contract expires in the summer. This is despite the clear desire of former club Barcelona to bring him back - with their season once again imploding after they crashed out of the Champions League at the group stage.

Giannis sparkles for Bucks again

Early-season NBA MVP metrics have a clear front runner - and it's no surprise.

Giannis Antetokounmpo is in relentless form again for the Milwaukee Bucks. In his first five games, he's averaging 34.4

points, 14.0 rebounds, 5.8 assists and 1.6 blocks while downing 65.2 percent of his twos and 35.3 percent of his threes.

Another contender is Cleveland Cavaliers ace Donovan Mitchell. Though the Cavs have cobbled together a more effective bench rotation than expected, Mitchell is in supreme form. He is averaging 32.2 points and 7.3 assists while knocking down 52.6 percent of his twos and a sanity-shattering 45.5 percent of his threes. Whether Mitchell can maintain this pace is questionable.

Luka Doncic is also in the MVP frame for the Dallas Mavericks. His 36.7 points per game lead the Association. He pairs that distinction with 8.7 assists per game and a jaw-jutting 65 percent conversion rate inside the arc.

Chanderpaul Jr in West Indies squad

There's a new Chanderpaul on the West Indies roster, and he shows as much potential as his legendary father at the same career stage.

Cricket West Indies announced a 15-man squad for their team's two-match Test series against the hosts Australia, scheduled for the next few weeks.

Left-handed batsman Tagenarine Chanderpaul has received a maiden call-up after phenomenal performances in domestic cricket. Son of Windies veteran Shivnarine, Tagenarine has clubbed 2,669 first-class runs at an average of 34.21 with five hundreds. The 26-year-old Guyanese made his first-class debut in 2013 and made steady progress since.

Meanwhile, all-rounder Roston Chase and middle-order batter Shamarh Brooks have been recalled to the Test squad.

Chief selector Desmond Haynes said: "We have a core group of players who have been part of the Test squad and have performed well. We have played two series this year - against England and Bangladesh - and won both. We have been playing good Test cricket and expect to

do well against the Australians on their home turf.

"We have one newcomer to the team in Tagenarine Chanderpaul. He equipped himself very well in the West Indies Championship four-day matches and also did a very good job at the top of the order against Bangladesh A in Saint Lucia this summer. He has what it takes to do well at the highest level."

Pastor Torrance Bobb and his wife, Elsa, celebrate 25 years at First Assembly of God

Pastor Torrance Bobb and his wife, Rev. Elsa Bobb are celebrating 25 years at the First Assembly of God Church on Old Crew Road, George Town. Under Pastor Bobb and Rev. Elsa Bobb's leadership the church has steadily grown from a congregation of around 70 when they first came in September 1997 to around 400 active members today. The couple has been instrumental in establishing two new congregations, each with their own pastors. One is in West Bay, complete with its own church building and parsonage, and the other in the heart of Camana Bay, which meets in the Cinema there, and is the only church in the area.

During those 25 years of faithful ministry they they have touched thousands of lives, and reached out beyond the borders of their church into the community at large to give assistance, counsel and comfort whenever and wherever they could. They believe in spreading the good news of the gospel, and walking by faith.

"I believe our vision has been the vision that the Lord has given to the church, which is to share the gospel in the community, in the region, and around the world. This is what we have been seeking to do, continually reaching out with the gospel," Pastor Bobb said.

Pastor Torrance Bobb was born in Trinidad and has been full-time in the Pastoral ministry for over fifty years. He holds a Bachelor of Theology degree in Bible and Theology from Northwest Bible College in Edmonton Canada. He also has a Masters of Arts degree in Biblical Studies from Briercrest Graduate School in Saskatchewan Canada. He is currently Senior Pastor of the First Assembly of God and the Chairman of the Cayman Ministers' Association

Rev. Elsa Bobb was born in Montego Bay, Jamaica, where she lived until high school then migrated to Canada where she pursued music as well as Business Administration and Secretarial Studies. In 2016 she was ordained by the Florida District of the Assemblies of God. As well as being an ordained minister, Rev. Bobb is a wife, mother, singer, multi-instrumentalist, speaker and author. She co-produced the television program 'Kids Jamboree' that was shown across the United States and Trinidad. After completing her studies, Rev. Elsa Bobb worked at the University of Alberta. Shortly after, she met her husband Torrance Bobb, and they had their first daughter, Kevon, while pastoring a church in Mayerthorpe, Canada. They later migrated to Trinidad where they had two more children, Lorraine and Wendell.

The Assemblies of God arose from the Azusa St. Revival, and

now has churches all over the world. It is part of the Pentecostal tradition, which means that they believe in speaking in tongues and the gifts of the Holy Spirit. "We emphasize the importance of the baptism in the Holy Spirit," Pastor Bobb explained, "Jesus said 'You will receive power and you will be my witnesses.' The baptism of the Holy Spirit means that you are filled with the Holy Spirit and you are empowered to be able to effectively share the

good news of the gospel. Speaking in tongues is the initial evidence that one is filled with the Holy Spirit. It's a continual experience that is available to assist us to be able to pray in the Spirit, because we 'don't know what we should pray for as we ought.' By speaking in other tongues in prayer, we are able to pray in the spirit and pray very accurately. The Word of God, the Bible is very important, that we use the Word of God even as we pray,


because the Spirit of God always works with the Word of God."

Rev. Elsa Bobb said, "I do work along with my husband's plans and I am more in the area of ministry where I like to pray for people and to see God heal them, and do things in their lives. I also work in the areas of music I've only written about two songs, but I like to write Christian drama, like the birth of Christ, and his crucifixion, and different things that I read in the scripture."

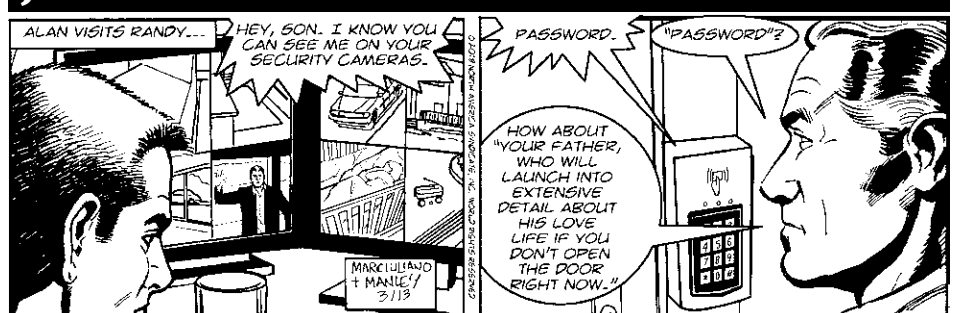
