

Thousands flocked to George Town Waterfront for the Pirates Landing, the official beginning of Pirates' week. It is always the moment everyone looks forward to most of all. Cayman Airways Flies Nonstop to Los Angeles

Cayman Airways' inaugural nonstop service to Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) took off in true Hollywood style on Saturday (5th November) following an Oscar themed celebration at the departure gate at the Owen Roberts International Airport (ORIA).

The new weekly Los Angeles service is the first in the Caribbean, and is the latest addition to Cayman Airways' expanding

network, highlighting the significant role that Cayman Airways continues to play in growing and sustaining the Cayman Islands tourism industry.

The Hollywood-themed ribbon cutting ceremony for the inaugural flight KX480 from Grand Cayman to Los Angeles featured themed desserts and gifts for passengers, while in Los Angeles on Sunday (6th November), a ribbon cutting cele-

bration was held for the inaugural flight KX481 destined to Grand Cayman, with Cayman-inspired entertainment, refreshments and gifts available for passengers.

"Opening an air bridge to new markets such as this one, will drive inbound visitation and grow tourism opportunities for our country because our national airline is making it easier for travelers to get to our Islands," said Minister Bryan. "Over the

longer term however, the routes success will depend on the continued collaboration between the Ministry and Department of Tourism, and our partners in the tourism industry, including the CI Film Commission, the financial services sector, and a host of other essential industry sectors working

collaboratively together to leverage business and leisure opportunities."

The LAX service also brings Cayman closer to Hollywood, one of the largest film hubs in the world, making it easier for LA-based production companies to capitalise on the Cayman Islands as a premier location for film, television, music videos, photoshoots, and advertising productions. In 2019, LAX airport handled 88,068,013 passengers, making it the world's third busiest and the United States' second-busiest airport.

"The launch of this new route has long been a dream for the Cayman Islands, and for Cayman Airways," said the airline's President and CEO, Mr. Fabian Whorms. "The LAX route has been realised thanks to our new Boeing 737-8 fleet; one of the most fuel efficient aircraft ever. Initially, the flight will operate once per week, but based on initial bookings, we are certain that demand will quickly result in increased frequency in the near future," he added.

Passengers on board the historic first flight from Grand Cayman to LAX included a mix of public and private sector officials, including Minister for Tourism Hon. Kenneth Bryan, Parliamentary Secretary Dwayne Seymour and representatives from the Islands major hotels and accommodations sector; along with representatives from other industry organisations such as the Chamber of Commerce, the Cayman Islands Tourism Association, Cayman Airways, the CI Airports Authority, the CI Civil Aviation Authority, the Ministry of Border Control, and the Cayman Islands Department of Tourism, among others.

While in Hollywood the Department of Tourism held a 'Cayman Reception' showcasing local musicians, Carnival models and dancers to promote the new route. The celebratory event facilitated further networking between the various industry stakeholder's present to discuss further opportunities within the Cayman Islands.

Well known Caymanians in attendance included filmmaker and CI Film Commission Chairman, Frank E. Flowers, model and actress Selita Ebanks, and Film & TV Producer Sean Rankine.

During his official remarks at the event, Minister Bryan described the work taking place behind the scenes between the CI Film Commission and Cayman Airways in offering special rates for loca-

tion scouts, production crews, equipment and VIP greeters for talent originating from the California. The Minister later announced a planned introduction of a Production Incentive Rebate Program. This initiative would begin in 2023 with the aim of continuing to strengthen the US film industry's relationship with the Cayman Islands.

To date, the Los Angeles route is Cayman Airways longest commercial flight, pushing the Denver route into second place. The new nonstop West Coast service will operate weekly, departing Grand Cayman on Saturdays and returning from Los Angeles on Sundays. Inbound flight time is just five and a half hours.

"On behalf of the PACT government, I wholeheartedly offer my gratitude to

the teams at Cayman Airways, the Airports Authority, Civil Aviation and the Department of Tourism for all their hard work throughout the process of transforming this new route to Los Angeles from a dream to a reality," said Minister Bryan.

The Cayman Airways Los Angeles route will operate year-round once-weekly service from GCM to LAX on Saturdays and returning from LAX to GCM on Sundays. For details and to book, visit www.caymanairways.com or call Cayman Airways Reservations on 949-2311.

Seafarers to be honoured at district celebrations

Seafarers from the various districts throughout the Cayman Islands will be honoured at special celebrations from 15 – 29 November. Former pioneers of the seafaring industry, or their surviving loved ones, are invited to attend the celebrations in recognition of the nation building contributions made during their times of service.

The Cayman Islands Government has identified eligible recipients based on records retained by the Cayman Islands Seafarers Registry, previous National Heroes Day nominations, The Cayman Islands Seafarers Association, the Southwell Years book, Ms Gwen Bush's notebooks (currently held by the Cayman Islands National Archives), as well as other government records. Celebrate Cayman most recently held a registration drive to ensure the registry captured as many persons, whether alive or deceased, as possible. As a result, the Registry current lists over three thousand names.

Executive Chairman for Celebrate Cayman Alfonso Wright thanked the Cayman Islands community for their response to the recent registration drive and invited the public to attend

the district celebrations. "The Cayman Islands would not be what we know it to be without the seafaring industry, and those brave persons who ventured away from the safety of our shores deserve recognition. I encourage the public to attend the celebrations so they can personally thank these heroes for their service and take a moment to appreciate our rich heritage", he stated.

Ministry of Education (MoE) Provides Project-Based Grant Funding for Government Schools



The Ministry of Education announces its award of approximately ninety-seven thousand dollars (CI \$97,000.00) in grants to four government schools during the 2021/2022 academic year through its Project-based Grant Programme.

"The Ministry of Education introduced its Project-based Grant Programme during the previous academic year to enable schools to implement projects that enhance their usual offerings and positively impact students," remarked Honourable Juliana O'Connor-Connolly, Minister with responsibility for Education.

All Government schools were eligible to apply for funding under the programme. Schools were allowed to submit applications for multiple projects. Nine schools applied with a total of 17 projects.

A committee comprised of senior representatives from the Ministry of Education, the Department of Education Services and members from the Education Council reviewed project applications.

MoE Acting Chief Officer Ms. Lyneth

Monteith chaired the six-member committee.

Ms. Monteith commented, "Having reviewed the project applications, we decided to award funding towards the most detailed project proposals and those not already covered in the Capital budget."

Layman Scott Sr High School was one of four schools awarded funding for the implementation of one of their projects.

The approved project involved the purchase of equipment for establishing a media club. Principal Mr. Devon Bowen remarked, "This project has heightened students' interest in willingly participating and supporting the digital media needs of the school."

Mr. Bowen also noted that the project enabled the capture and live-streaming of two key annual events; the Graduation Ceremony and the internal Awards Ceremony.

The Red Bay Primary School (RBPS) received funding towards the first phase of a project to improve its Reception Outdoor

area. Activities in this phase included the installation of artificial turf and the construction of wooden planter boxes.

Red Bay Primary has since applied for and obtained funding for the project's second phase.

For the Acting Principal of the Edna Moyle Primary School, Ms. Dairdie Tingle, the revitalisation of the school's Reception play area was a worthwhile project. "The renovation of our play area has provided our students with a conducive environment that stimulates growth in all areas: socially, mentally and physically. The resources have provided our students with lots of opportunities to demonstrate learning in the different aspects of the early year's framework. They have made good progress compared to their starting points in August. There is evidence that they are socialising during play," Ms. Tingle remarked.

The project at the EMPS also included purchasing resources towards the school's 'Nurture Hut'.



The Ministry of Education also granted the Clifton Hunter High School funding towards constructing three mobile science laboratories.

Schools approved for a project-based grant must provide the MoE with a Completion Report within three weeks from when the approved project is scheduled for completion.

Project-based grant funding applications for the 2022/2023 academic year opened in September. Six schools applied with a total of 14 projects. Of those, four have been awarded funding for eight projects. For the First Time, Cayman's Financial Services Minister Publicly Debates Tax Subcommittee Members of EU Parliament

Minister for Financial Services and Commerce, the Hon. André Ebanks, today addressed how the Cayman Islands cooperates on tax matters globally, and specifically with the EU, during a meeting with EU Members of Parliament (MEPs).

Minister Ebanks said he accepted the invitation to exchange views with the EU Parliament's Subcommittee on Tax Matters (FISC) to provide a better understanding of the Cayman Islands' partnership with jurisdictions globally to prevent and detect international tax crimes, in accordance with OECD standards.

"Like EU Member States and other countries around the world, the Cayman Islands endeavours to offer the best possi-

ble opportunities for our people to thrive and grow. Similarly, we are concerned about global issues, including climate change and economic stability," he said.

"And like EU Member States and other countries around the world,

we also recognise that every government must collect sufficient tax revenues to deliver public services, such as healthcare, financial assistance, infrastructure and education.

"Therefore the Cayman Islands' firm position is that, as a

global partner in fighting financial crime, we share tax information with relevant law and tax officials. This helps to ensure that taxes are paid where profits are made; and that governments are able to fund the projects and programmes that support their respective citizens."

FISC was established by the EU Parliament to assist in the fight against tax fraud, tax evasion and tax avoidance, as well as for tax transparency purposes.

To help address misunderstandings or information gaps that some MEPs could have, Minister Ebanks shared a graphic detailing the Cayman Islands' progress in improving our regulatory regime; and answered their questions, including on

how the Cayman Islands' indirect tax system is not harmful to other jurisdictions that levy a direct tax.

He also invited FISC's Chair, Paul Tang; and FISC members to visit Cayman Islands, for them to learn more about the Cayman Islands' role in facilitating tax neutral investments.

MEPs expressed their gratitude for Minister's appearance before the FISC committee.

"We have done much to establish ourselves as a global partner. Quite a bit of this is evident in the cooperation frameworks found on our Department for International Tax Cooperation website, and in our assessments by the OECD, which sets the global tax-information exchange standard," Minister Ebanks said. "But, to dispel the legacy misperceptions, we must be willing to engage in respectful, open and frank discussions. I thank Chair Tang and the FISC members for their kind invitation and our fruitful public discourse."

The FISC meeting was a key component of Minister Ebanks' international engagement this month. Prior to this meeting the Premier, the Hon. Wayne Panton, addressed TAXE2 (FISC's predecessor) in 2017, as the-then Minister of Financial Services.

More details on Minister Ebanks' November engagement will be provided shortly.

Police Investigate Serious Assault on Juvenile Male

Just after 7AM, on Thursday, 10 November, police responded to a residence in the Red Bay area, where it was reported that a serious assault has taken place sometime earlier.

It was reported that a juvenile male left home sometime after 1AM and while walking in the Red Bay area, he was approached by a white SUV vehicle. Three juvenile males known to the victim exited

the vehicle and assaulted him, causing him serious facial injuries. His injuries were later discovered by a parent who reported the incident to the police.

Two male juveniles have been arrested on suspicion of assault GBH in relation to this incident. They have both been bailed pending further investigation. This incident is currently being investigated by the Criminal Investigations Unit.

Second Man Charged in Relation to April Murder

Following the arrest and charge of wanted man Justin Kyle Jackson earlier this year, a second man, age 21 of George Town, has been arrested and charged with Murder and Possession of an Unlicensed Firearm in relation to the fatal shooting of Harry Elliott, which occurred on Monday 25 April.

The man appeared in court on Wednesday, 9 November, and was remanded in



custody, pending a further appearance on Friday, 11 November.

Police Respond to Three Robbery Related Incidents in George Town

On Friday 11 November, police were dispatched to two reports of armed robberies and one attempted robbery in George Town.

At approximately 7:45PM, police received a report that someone broke the glass doors of the Uncle Clem's Grocery Store located on Mary Street. The occupants of the store ran through the rear door and one person fell while trying to get away from the incident, sustaining minor injuries.

The investigation revealed that two masked men dressed in hoodies, one armed with a machete, the other with an axe, entered the premise and stole money from the cash register. They then left store, their direction of travel unknown.

A second incident took place at just before 7:50PM, where it was reported that a delivery driver was leaving Diaz Lane, after making a delivery, when someone banged on his car window. Two masked

men, one carrying an axe was seen. The driver said they began banging on his vehicle with the axe and as a result he sped off from the location. Nothing was stolen and no injuries caused, however the vehicle sustained minor damage.

Following this incident, police received a report of an armed robbery at Asian Retailer, located on Sheddon Road just after 8:20PM. It was reported that two men wearing dark coloured clothing and hoodies, entered the store, brandished a firearm and demanded money and assaulted the store keeper. The men made off with a quantity of cash in an unknown direction.

Police Investigate Armed Robbery in George Town

Honouring our Veterans

Remembrance Sunday Ceremony at Elmslie Memorial Church

"They shall not grow old as we that are left grow old. Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will Remember them," His Excellency the Governor, Martyn Roper, said at the Remembrance Day Ceremony on Sunday 13th November. Members of the Cayman Islands Veterans' Association, together with dignitaries from Government, and detachments from all the uniformed services had all come to pay their respects to those who sacrificed their own life for our freedom in front of the Cenotaph at Elmslie Memorial Church. Mr. Loxley Banks, representing the Veterans, responded: "When you go home, Tell them of us and say, For your tomorrow we gave our today."

A gunshot, making the birds fly away into the clear blue sky, heralded the beginning of the two minute silence. They thought about those they had lost, as well as the thousands they have never met, who enabled us to live the life of freedom from tyranny we enjoy

today. They thought about their families, left behind, and about the children they were never able to hold, or see growing up.

Many people from Cayman served in the two world wars and many other conflicts, and lost their lives, and there were children from different primary schools who solemnly laid beautiful wreaths of red, blazing poppies. But remembrance also means remembering Cayman's brave seamen who lost their lives at sea, while sending their money home to their families, and making Cayman a better place, and so the wreath-laying was divided between the Elmslie Memorial Cenotaph and the Seaman's Memorial two hundred yards up the road, by the Royal Watler Terminal.

H.E the Governor laid the first wreath at both locations, followed by Deputy Premier, Hon. Chris Saunders. Next came President of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council, Chief Justice Ramsay Hale, Leader of the Opposition Hon. Roy McTaggart, and Loxley Banks. 
