

# WEST BAY CENTRAL CONSTITUENCY COUNCIL - "IT'S ALL ABOUT 'PEOPLE POWER"

The West Bay Central Constituency Council is up and running, and it could very well set the template for similar groups throughout Cayman.

From its inception a few months ago the WBCCC is at the point now where it's about to transition from an interim organisation to a fully-fledged council.

Giving an update on the success of their progress to date, Member of Parliament for West Bay Central, Katherine Ebanks-Wilks, commended residents of the area for their involvement.

"It wasn't very hard to get members involved. What we did from a constituency standpoint was we actually reached out and asked persons in the community to send in nominations. So there was a nomination period and the applicants were vetted. I got feedback from constituents on what they felt would have been important for this interim body."

The council members are Sharlene Rogers (Deputy Chair), Charles Brown, Alyssa Ebanks (Youth Ambassador), Sophia Bryan, Glenda Lee-Ebanks, Daubreen Maxwell, Roberta Powery, Shemar Harding, Jehu Rivers and Clint Hunter (Chair).

Mrs Ebanks-Wilks, who is also the Speaker of the Cayman Islands Parliament, was keen to point out that the West Bay Central

Constituency Council(WBCCC) is not politically-affiliated. Instead, she stressed, it is made up of people of different political affiliations, age groups, backgrounds, professions and interests who want to see the best for their community.

"What I pride myself with in regards to establishing this because this body is not

political. There may very well be people in this council whose political affiliations may be different. So, as a result of that, it's done in a democratic process that the MP or myself doesn't overstep boundaries and try to dictate to this council what their remit should be. it's really a body that's established to advise the MP on areas that they have collectively been discussing."

The selection of members also followed specific criteria based on the original Advisory District Council Law of 2011. "One of the things was they wanted to ensure that the persons that were on the Council were registered in the electoral boundary for West

Bay Central. The other requirement was for persons who had applied to be in good standing. So we had a number of persons that were nominated, and then there was an evening where we did the selection."

According to MP Ebanks-Wilks, as political representation and the electoral process have further evolved in Cayman since 2011, the law which established the district councils now needs to be reviewed, and she expects the WBCCC to play a role in that.

"There will definitely need to be some sort of amendment or change in the original law as we move forward. The Advisory District Council

Law 2011 was passed when we did not have single-member constituencies. We'll definitely have to consider that and I know we're having discussions right now about electoral boundaries, right? So it will happen reflective of the way in which the electoral boundaries are established."

Among the issues that the WBCCC is expected to address and advise both for the community and nationally, include; finance tourism, employment, community affairs, housing health and other areas as already defined in the scope of the current district council law.

"I know that a lot of times all of us residents are going through periods where we're frus-



trated with a particular matter. This body I feel is a vehicle to help drive change because what it will do is discuss what the issues really are, and then take it to the MP and then the MP would then be responsible for taking this matter to the government."


According to Mrs Ebanks-Wilks, "It's all about people power".

The West Bay Central MP said she hopes to see the WBCCC evolve from an interim council to ultimately influencing government policies for their area and the country. At the same time, Mrs Ebanks-Wilks is encouraging other MPs - whether they are in government or opposition - to do likewise and activate their community advisory councils.

"This is an interim council, but I'm hoping that it will continue to grow and other MPs will eventually establish similar groupings. It could be that the MP is not on the government side, so it will then force that entity to take their concerns to the government at hand to just ensure that the government is aware of the concerns of the relevant constituency."

She also said: "It's so important that the representatives understand that they represent the people and the people should be heard. The people are the voters and should feel comfortable with approaching their representatives."









# Dart collaborates with Lynn University on hospitality training for young Caymanians

Dart has announced a collaboration with Florida-based Lynn University to enhance the syllabus of the Dart Hospitality Training Programme, which provides young Caymanians with three months of paid on-the-job training and exposure across a variety of roles in one of the main pillars of the Cayman Islands economy.

As part of the emerging collaboration, a faculty member from Lynn University's hospitality programme will be delivering two-weeks of valuable curriculum. This allows participants to get training from an accredited institution to bolster the already attractive learning opportunities across Dart's portfolio of hotels, including Kimpton Seafire Resort + Spa, The Ritz-Carlton, Grand Cayman and Hampton by Hilton, Grand Cayman.

"We are thrilled to be able to leverage this emerging relationship with Lynn University to bolster the learning opportunities to create a new generation of Caymanian tourism ambassadors," said Dart Chief of Staff Joanne Lawson. "As we grow this programme, we will continually look at ways to improve and one natural step was to partner with an accredited institution that has a track record of helping students build the intellectual flexibility and experience to fulfil their potential in an ever-changing world."

The collaboration will begin with the second edition of the programme, which is scheduled for 9 August to 3 November

2023. A key addition will be the in-person training by Lynn University's Assistant Professor Dr. Karima Lanfranco designed to expose participants to and improve their understanding of a variety of positions in front and back of house operations. Topics will include hotel etiquette, guest relations, problem solving and others before participants begin formal onthe-job training in each of the hotels.

"At Lynn University, we are thrilled to be collaborating with Dart to further enhance the already robust Dart Hospitality Training Programme by providing world-class instruction to these young people," said Katrina Carter-Tellison, vice president of academic affairs at Lynn University. "Our Hospitality Management curriculum provides a foundation for future success in an ever-changing world. To be able to provide some of this academic expertise alongside the in-house professionals at the Dartowned properties will help create unique learning experiences."

Participants are selected from a pool of Caymanian applicants aged 17-30 years. Over the course of three months, they will receive a minimum of 30 hours of paid work per week and full basic insurance coverage. The programme begins with two weeks of employability training, four weeks of rotation in various roles and six weeks of position-specific training in one of the following areas: guest services, food and beverage, pool, beach, and recreation attendant.

Upon completion of the course, trainees receive a certificate recognising course completion, a bonus, and the opportunity for full-time employment for those who excelled in the programme. This is the second year of the Dart Hospitality Training Programme. A total of 12 students successfully completed the pilot in 2022, with eight of them securing jobs at Dart-owned

"We see this as an excellent opportunity for young Caymanians to learn more about the industry, as we showcase career opportunities that exist. We want to play our part in attracting more Caymanians to the field, as they are the ideal Caymankind ambassadors to enhance the visitor experience to these lovely islands," Lawson said.


# CYDEC 2023: Embracing the Evolution of Technology in the Cayman Islands

On June 28, CYDEC 2023 brought together a diverse group of technology advisors, AI enthusiasts, educators, regulators, students, and government officials under one roof for a full day of exploring the transformative power of technology

in the Cayman Islands' leading industries.

The conference featured five distinguished international speakers who addressed a wide range of topics unfolding in the Cayman Islands. Laura McBain,

who spoke on "AI & ChatGPT: to fear or embrace?", highlighted the multifaceted nature of AI, urging participants to shift from a passive perspective of "AI is happening to us" to actively shaping AI in our work and lives.

Central to the discussions was the importance of educating individuals about upcoming tech trends. It became evident that not only consumers but also society as a whole needs to understand the profound impact technology has on our lives. A significant focus was placed on the implications of AI and emerging technologies across all fields. # 22 Red Poll Cattle Imported under Livestock Development Programme

The Ministry of Planning, Agriculture, Housing and Infrastructure has taken a major step toward growing and strengthening the Cayman Islands domestic livestock capacity by recently importing 22 Red Poll cattle from Jamaica.

The three bulls and nineteen heifers were airlifted to Grand Cayman on 22 June, and after completing quarantine will form the base herd for the Islands' cattle breeding programme managed by the Ministry's Department of Agriculture.

"We have prioritised agriculture and food security during the past two years because improving the well-being of Caymanians means ensuring that safe, nutritious food is accessible, available, and affordable," said Hon Jay Ebanks, Minister of Planning, Agriculture, Housing and Infrastructure. "Importing these cattle will substantially increase domestic cattle production, improve overall cattle genetics. and reduce the need to import beef in the

Minister Ebanks led a mission to Jamaica last year for bilateral discussions with the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Mining, which led to this cattle importation as well as other outcomes.

The Cayman Islands Government has established and developed a National Livestock Development Programme (NLDP), under which the recently imported cattle were procured from the Cattle Breeder's Society Jamaica. The NLDP is focused on developing local livestock to reduce imports of goats, and to improve local cattle herds and beef quality. It is also aimed at implementing a cattle breeding programme to rapidly enhance the local genetics and modernise and improve the livestock sector.

"Importing purebred cattle suited to local conditions is a more sustainable approach to improving domestic livestock and an important component of efforts to enhance local genetics, upgrade domestic herds and support important research," said Brian Crichlow, Acting Director of Agriculture. "These imported cattle are a significant step forward for government's Cattle Breeding Programme and efforts to improve the domestic livestock sector."

Under the NLDP, the cattle breeding programme is designed to enhance animal genetics in Cayman and help modernise the sector and local farming community. Using the imported cattle and the new Cattle Breeding Center in Cayman Brac,



the Department of Agriculture will establish a centre of excellence through which it provides stud bull services, calves for sale and semen for artificial insemination.

Importing cattle is only the latest accomplishment for the National Livestock Development Programme. Future plans

include development of a Livestock Breeding Centre on Grand Cayman, introduction of embryo transfer technology and training of team members in the Veterinary Service Unit at the Department of Agriculture to improve efficiency in animal breeding technology.

## Amplify Cayman launches a national campaign



Within the community, there is widespread support for pro-sustainable development as well as solutions to issues such as traffic. The community also broadly opposes developing the necessary solutions at the expense of our sensitive coastal environments.

In 2023, the Cayman Islands Government announced plans to extend the East-West Arterial highway and the Owen Roberts International Airport, which would require the destruction of mangroves and seagrasses – these fragile ecosystems contribute to a healthy North Sound and vibrant coral reefs, as well as the resiliency of our economy, communities, and resources.

In response, Amplify Cayman has launched a campaign to gather perspectives on these key issues from those who value Cayman and who disagree with capital projects that lead to environmental destruction. Further, this campaign seeks to promote healthy democratic processes, as decision-making in Parliament without data from constituents is poor governance.

The campaign includes a petition to gather data which will be presented to Cabinet, as well as an open letter for constituents to share their perspectives directly with their elected representatives. The petition and open letter will be published on Friday 30th June 2023 on our social media pages.

Amplify Cayman is pro-sustainable development, not anti-development. We recognize that a balance needs to be struck, whereby socioeconomic needs are met within the constraints of our finite environment. Developing with the intent of delivering positive solutions to traffic and promoting more luxury tourism will not result in a positive impact long-term for the nation if it results in the destruction of our natural resources.

We ask Cabinet only to approve developments that meet the nested interdependence framework, explored in Amplify Cayman's People's Sustainability Charter, which was published September 27th, 2021 on the 20th anniversary of the 2001

Environmental Charter and can be read here. Our Charter is a holistic framework to ensure community and nature are balanced with economic growth.



After a dazzling opening ceremony in the capitol, racing took place over 6 days on Lake Ilopango, a volcanic crater lake situated about an hour east of San Salvador. Light and shifty winds throughout the week meant that the conditions were better suited to the rowing regatta at the same venue than competitive sailing. With no racing possible on days 2 and 3 the remainder of the week demanded patience from the sailors as the wind would not materialize until after 4pm, sometimes later. Charlotte lay in 4th place after day 1, a position she never relinquished, with the top order standings staying the same through all 9 races during the week.

"The conditions were very tricky", said Webster, "and the on-the-water judges were very strict when it came to handing out instant penalties for infringements. I benefitted one time, but then lost 3 places in another race when my rolling and steer-

Charlotte Webster produced a best-ever ing was judged to be too much. In another race myself and the Mexican sailor were becalmed at the finish, allowing Cuba to steal



places by ghosting in from the other side of the racecourse."

"Coach Raph [Harvey] helped us our light-wind technique by doing many roll tacks. Sometimes a tedious process in 2 kts of breeze.

As well as Coach Raph, the other member of the sailing team was Cayman's flag-bearer Andres McDermot, competing in his third CAC Games in the ILCA7 (aka Laser standard rig). In a strong fleet in the men's competition Andres placed 13th of 16 boats.

Overall Webster is very happy with how her racing strategies have improved, as this was a small fleet compared to the European events she has been doing for the past year. Charlotte is now training in Cayman for next month's Allianz Sailing World Championships in The Hague. The Olympic qualifier event tests the sailors' skills in the tidal water of the North Sea, a location Charlotte is familiar with from last year's Youth Sailing World Championships at the same site. Further Olympic qualifying opportunities are at the PanAm Games in Chile and the 2024 ILCA World Championships in Argentina.
