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CHHS boys defend Dart Under 13 high school football title

After seven challenging weeks of play, the Dart Under 13 Boys' Cup will not be finding a new home this year as it will remain in Frank Sound for a second year running.

Clifton Hunter High School's (CHHS) boys A team successfully defended their

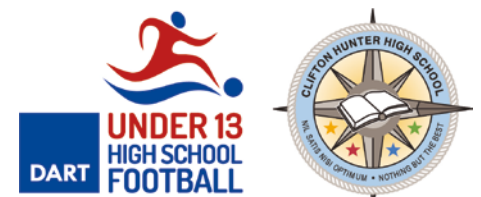
Dart Under 13 boys high school football title by way of a perfect record – eight wins out of eight.

In 2022, the CHHS title win was the first for a government high school in the relatively short history of the Dart Under 13

high school football competition. CHHS A's run to the title began with a slender 3-1 victory over rivals John Gray High School (JGHS) and from there, it was simply securing wins rather than draws.

Even with the loss, JGHS were constantly applying pressure on the defending champions hoping for that one slip, that one slip that would give JGHS a sliver of hope. But it was not to be. The young men from CHHS A held firm and their consistency throughout the season would be the key to their success.

The league title was secured on October 18 after Triple C were unable to field a team in their final game against CHHS A. With wins over JGHS (3-1), Cayman Prep 1 (4-1), Cayman Prep 2 (6-0), CHHS B (4-0), St. Ignatius Catholic High School (6-0) and three points against Triple C (4-0 forfeit), amassing 38 goals in total while conceding only five, the coveted Dart Under 13

Boys' Cup is staying in Frank Sound.

JGHS finished as runners-up only three points behind the champions and Cayman International School rounded off the top three finishers with 18 points.

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WORC Installs New Qlogik Customer Service System

Customers using the services at Workforce Opportunities & Residency Cayman (WORC) now use a new ticketing system that allows for more efficient service.

This new ticketing system called Qlogik, was launched 1st September to help track service delivery times and streamline the footpath of customers while providing a high-level overview of the number of customers served within a month. The system also provides information that will better equip WORC's leadership to implement any necessary operational changes to best serve internal and external stakeholders.

The system is user-friendly; once a customer enters the WORC office lobby, the customer selects an option from the five (5) available services in the Qlogik system. The five (5) service options a customer can select include; general queries, JobsCayman, multiple payments, single payments, and endorsement stamps. Once an option is selected, a ticket is generated, starting the timer. The customer is then guid-



ed to have a seat and is able to see the progress on the Qlogik dashboard screen. When the customer is ready to be served, the Qlogik system calls the number and directs them to the relevant workstation to be served. When the transaction is complete, the ticket is closed and the system calls another customer to be served.

During the soft launch in September, over a period of twenty-one (21) days the Qlogik dashboard report showed six thousand nine hundred and seven (6,907) customers served with an av-

erage wait time of nine minutes and forty-six seconds (9:46) and five minutes and twenty-eight (5:28) average transaction time. Reducing the customer time to complete services at an average of fifteen minutes and fourteen seconds (15:14).

Deputy Director for Business Operations, Allison Lovinggood said "Customers have shared positive feedback about the new system stating that it now feels similar to other Government

offices who use similar systems. They like that they know where to go next and when they will be served. The system allows us to be more efficient in our customer service. For those who are not able to use some of our services online, we want to ensure they are in and out of the office quickly so they can continue on with their day."

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UCCI STEM Conference is back

The incredibly well-supported STEM Carib conference at UCCI is back this November following an unfortunate hiatus of three years due to Covid. Anyone interested in STEM – Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths – especially young people, should head to the UCCI from 1 to 3 November, where a huge array of activities and events will be taking place. Cayman Conversations this week speaks with UCCI's Tracey Hargrave, Dean of STEM and Health, and Antoinette Gayle, Assistant Professor in Chemistry and Biochemistry and also the STEM Co-ordinator, to find out more.

This year's UCCI STEM conference is entitled: Game Changer Time to Level Up, and will be providing Cayman's youth with an holistic overview of some of the foremost happenings in science right now and how these changes are impacting the Cayman Islands, and, crucially, how they can become involved in this incredibly exciting sphere.

Ms Hargrave said the UCCI had held the conference frequently in the past but had had to call a halt over Covid, so they were really pleased it was back and that it would in-

clude many breakout sessions and speakers.

The conference caters primarily to students in the Cayman Islands, up to tertiary level, but they also have breakout sessions geared towards the community as a whole, and have breakout sessions which are hands-on, interactive sessions geared towards children at the primary, secondary and tertiary levels.

The impressive, all-female line up of speakers includes Dr Martha Williams, who was born in Cayman Brac and who has worked in NASA for decades and who is now retired and who continues her journey as a scientist.

"We are so excited to hear her story from Cayman Brac to NASA and back," Ms Gayle advised.

Other speakers include Aditi Joshi, a Google Leader and AI Powerhouse and Vanessa Slowey, a Global tech Trailblazer from Digicel, as further exciting plenary speakers.

Ms Gayle confirmed that the plenary sessions would be informal and the breakout sessions would be interactive, in order to captivate the imagination of the young minds in attendance.

"The students actually get to engage with the material and get their hands dirty!" she said. "They get to build robots, they get to play with liquid nitrogen, they get to be doing AI they are going to do lion fish dissection, it's going to be amazing an amazing event."

Ms Hargrave said that there was going to be such a wide range of activities at the event that there would be something for everyone, no matter what they were interested in.

"We have even got somebody talking about steam, navigating with the stars, many lion fish dissections, they are also very popular," she advised.

Ms Hargrave said young people today had a lot more available to them in terms of exposure to STEM topics, especially with an event such as this completely free event. The schools are all involved and all sending their students.

Ms Gayle talked about a particularly well supported sector of the conference, that of robotics. The robotics at the STEM conference involve students understanding how robots work, getting the chance to build robots, and engaging those robots by programming them to get them to carry out particular functions, she said. It allows them to be able to see how important it is to send correct instructions in the correct way

to ensure the robots to carry out the tasks, she furthered. Students will also get to see how AI and robots work together.

The UCCI STEM Carib conference aims to provide an integrated look at such STEM topics, putting them altogether in one place, showing young people how it all works together, so, if they want to work with robots, they need to know how to build them, how to programme them, how the parts work together, to understand the engineering and how to communicate with robots, she explained. There is also a competition and the winners get to carry home their own programmable robot, Ms Gayle advised.

The plenary and breakout sessions will take place on 1 and 2 November and on 3 November there will be an open day with a Rotary Science fair presentation for students who won the fair and they will have the chance to come and present their workings. That afternoon, the conference is open to anyone without registration who just want to come in and play with robots and learn more about the STEM activities.

Sponsors include the Ministry of Education, CUC, Enterprise Cayman, Health City Cayman Islands, who collectively help the UCCI to put on the conference free of charge.

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R3 'powers' HSA's Little Cayman Health Center with generator donation

The Health Services Authority's (HSA) Little Cayman Health Center was the beneficiary of a standby generator thanks to a partnership with the R3 Cayman Foundation, a charitable organisation focused on disaster readiness, relief, and recovery in the Cayman Islands.

The generator, which is valued at over \$30,000 operates on propane and was installed at the clinic facility in September 2023. The donation was made possible via an R3 grant facility which offers funding to emergency- or disaster-related projects.

The generator will ensure uninterrupted power supply to the health centre during critical periods when power from the main supply grid may not be available. This will enable continuous operation of the island's only clinic and its telemedicine offering. This mitigates the risk of spoilage of essential medicines that require cold storage and improves continuity of care for users of the clinic.

Lizzette Yearwood, CEO at the HSA noted that, "the donation by the R3 Cayman Foundation contributes to the vision of the HSA to provide accessible and convenient healthcare to all residents of the Cayman Islands, regardless of their location. The standby generator will allow continuity of care for users of

This initiative will ensure the clinic can continue to operate in the event of a storm and is another step forward in our mission to ensure our Islands are well-prepared for a natural disaster or emergency".

Last year, R3 donated a high-end Intouch Teladoc robot to facilitate virtual consultations by doctors located on Cayman Brac and Grand Cayman. The robot is equipped with an HD zoom camera, enhanced audio system and

Three Caymanian Apprentices Complete Healthcare Certification

Three Caymanian ladies have completed an intensive Care Certificate Programme within the first year of the 2-year apprenticeship programme and are now fully eligible to practice as Healthcare Assistants in the Cayman Islands.

The trio, comprising:

1. Ashley Swaby, who embarked on this path on May 30, 2022,

2. Latysha Powell, also beginning on May 30, and

3. Tishawana Gauntlett, joining the ranks on September 20, 2022, are now well-prepared to make meaningful contributions to the local healthcare scene.

These significant accomplishments are the fruits of a collaboration between

Workforce Opportunities & Residency Cayman (WORC) and Integra Healthcare. The programme was developed to provide each apprentice with two years of structured on-the-job practical experience and guidance at the end of which, they will have earned a Care Certificate.

“Seeing the success of our apprenticeship programme in collaboration with Integra Healthcare has been truly inspiring. The dedication and growth of these young Caymanians highlight the potential of such initiatives,” remarked WORC Director Jeremy Scott. “We wholeheartedly encourage other Caymanians to seize similar opportunities, ensuring a brighter and more skilled future for our country.”

The apprenticeship initiative with Integra Healthcare is merely one among several opportunities open to Caymanians who sign up with WORC. In 2023, it was among the six (6) training and development contracts facilitated by WORC in collaboration with the following partners; The Wellness Centre, Innovative Management and Professional Training (IMPT), Inspire Cayman Training Ltd (ICT), International College of the Cayman Islands (ICCI), and Cayman Career Academy (CCA).

Currently, there are several training and development opportunities under-

way namely, Inspire Cayman’s Core Curriculum course which starts on October 23rd, along with Cohort 39 of Passport2Success and the Ready2Work programme which are geared toward Caymanians who require tooling and upskilling in accessing and maintaining long-term employment. New course opportunities available for 2024 will be released in November.

Hon. Isaac Rankine, Minister of Labour noted that, “This apprenticeship programme symbolizes the success of the collaboration between WORC and Integra Healthcare which creates opportunities for Caymanians to shine in the healthcare sector. Congratulations to our newest healthcare assistants, embodying the spirit of Cayman resilience and progress.”

“We remain committed to our vision of fostering more such collaborations to open up further training and development opportunities for young Caymanians to take up careers in various industries across the Cayman Islands. Weather Service plans new Operations and Research Centre

is one of the ways the Cayman Islands Government is future-proofing to increase resiliency.

“Our Weather Service is the most advanced of the meteorological agencies in the United Kingdom Overseas Territories in the Caribbean. As the team has grown, so have the services they provide and their needs in terms of equipment and facilities. The new headquarters will ensure our dedicated Weather Service staff have the working conditions and equipment they need to continue to provide timely, accurate forecasts, advisories and warnings for the country. Importantly, the new building will include facilities for 24-hour operations which is essential for providing accurate meteorological observations that support safe air travel and during severe weather events,” he said. “The facilities will also feature sustainability measures, including environmentally friendly building materials, energy and water efficient design elements, with opportunities to utilise renewable energy and rainwater harvesting.”

CINWS Director General John Tibbetts said having a purpose-built, solar-ready facility, that can enable 24-hour staffing and services, is essential to enhancing service delivery for all three Cayman Islands.

“Having a facility that is better designed for our observational processes and having all of our Weather Service staff under one roof is going to improve our efficiency, allow for better collection of data, and reduce response times for accurate weather forecasting,” he said. “The new facility will also allow us to implement a 24-hour monitoring and forecasting programme to support aviation, disaster response and other government agencies. We are very pleased that Government is making the new Operations and Research Centre a priority.”

Additionally the facility will allow a number of our senior staff to better support significant regional roles such as Chief Meteorologist Kerry Powery serving as the Chair of the Regional Association Infrastructure Committee, Director General John Tibbetts and Manager of Research and Media Services Shamal Clarke as members of the World Meteorological Organization Expert Task team dealing with



Multi Hazard Early Warning Systems, and focal points for a number of critical meteorological functions.

Minister for Tourism & Ports, Hon. Kenneth Bryan and Minister for Planning, Agriculture, Housing & Infrastructure, Hon. Johany Ebanks, also attended the groundbreaking ceremony with Premier Panton, Mr. Tibbetts, and representatives from the Ministry of Sustainability & Climate Resiliency, the Weather Service, and the Public Works Department.

The site for the new facilities on Lyndhurst Avenue provides easy access to key emergency and aviation services, ideal conditions for air balloon releases, and enough space to house essential monitoring and observation equipment.

“The site offers a clear view of the airport runway and the horizon from all four coordinates, which is important so we can provide the Cayman Islands Airports Authority with accurate meteorological observations that support safe air travel,” Tibbetts explained.

Currently, the site is home to the Weather Services’ first Automatic Weather Observation Station (AWOS) which records and transmits data - including wind direction, wind speed, temperature, humidity, air quality and rainfall - in real-time to the CINWS team. This is the first in a planned series of AWOS across all three islands.

The contract with Build Cayman, the successful contractor, was signed in September 2023 and construction of the new headquarters is expected to be completed in 2024. The Public Works Department is managing the construction project.

First Response Agencies Engage in Mass Casualty Training at Grand Cayman Airport

A cohort of 43 participants representing diverse first response agencies in the Cayman Islands engaged in an intense week-long training programme focused on Mass Casualty Management (MCM) at the Owen Roberts International Airport. The training programme, which received funding from Hazard Management Cayman Islands (HMCI) and was facilitated with the assistance of the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO), began on Monday, 18 September 2023 and ended on Saturday, 23 September 2023 at 3:00 a.m. Covering a range of topics, including incident command systems, scene assessment and reporting, triage and emergency medical care, field organisation, psychological first-aid, and management of deceased individuals, the programme equips responders with a more coordinated and efficient use of resources. Course Coordinator and HMCI's Operations, Response and Recovery Officer Adan Powell-Jeffries stated that it is important for the response teams to maintain a state of maximum readiness for a major incident. "This training improves our preparedness and response capacity. It is important that we have pre-established procedures in place for mobilisation, incident site management and hospital reception for when we face a major incident, involving multiple victims requiring a multi-agency response." The training programme consisted of participants representing a wide array of

teamwork and communication skills, ensuring that responders can work seamlessly together in high-stress situations where saving lives is the ultimate focus."

ter agencies such as the Red Cross and Community Emergency Response Teams. The training also served as recertification for eight local trainers under the supervision and guidance of Mr. Peter Burgess, a PAHO/WHO Regional Trainer and Subject Area Expert. According to HMCI, the inclusion of trainers within the local community plays a crucial role in promoting resilience within our islands while also guaranteeing the programme's sustainability and ongoing operation.

"Mass casualty incidents can occur unexpectedly and often require a coordinated effort among various agencies and responders in the event of an emergency," said Chief Safety Management Officer Andrew McLaughlin of the Cayman Islands Airports Authority. "Mass Casualty Training fosters

Water-Related Death in George Town

Shortly before 11:15PM on Saturday, 21 October, the 911 Communications Centre received a report of a possible person in distress in the waters off Seafarers Way, George Town. Port Authority staff at the location had seen what appeared to be a person in the water. Police and Fire officers attended the location and conduct-

ed a search, during which fire officers located and retrieved an unresponsive man from the water. Emergency medical services arrived and transported the man to the Cayman Islands Hospital, where he was subsequently pronounced dead.

Efforts are currently underway to ascertain the identity of the man.

Update: A Third Man Formally Charged in Relation to Murder Incident

A 35-year-old man of East End who was arrested on Wednesday 18 October in relation to the murder of Divonte Hernandez has now been formally charged with Murder.

He was scheduled to appear before the court on Monday, 23 October.

The fourth person, a 32-year-old woman of West Bay, who was arrested on suspicion of accessory after the fact, has now been bailed pending further investigation.



Police Investigate Assault Incident in Newlands



Shortly after 4:00AM on Saturday morning, 21 October, officers responded to a report of an incident at an address off Hirst Road, Bodden Town. It was reported that a man had just returned to his residence when he was confronted outside by a man known to him. The victim fled inside the house and was subsequently struck by an unknown object, sustaining a laceration to the forehead. The culprit then appears to have fled the scene. The victim subsequently attended hospital for treatment for the injury,

which appears to be non-life-threatening. He has since been discharged.

Officers attended the scene and observed damage to the door and a window of the residence. Initial examinations indicate that these were damaged by blunt force, and there is no evidence that a firearm was discharged. The matter remains under investigation.

Police are appealing for anyone who may have witnessed the incident or have any information to contact Bodden Town CID at 947-2220.

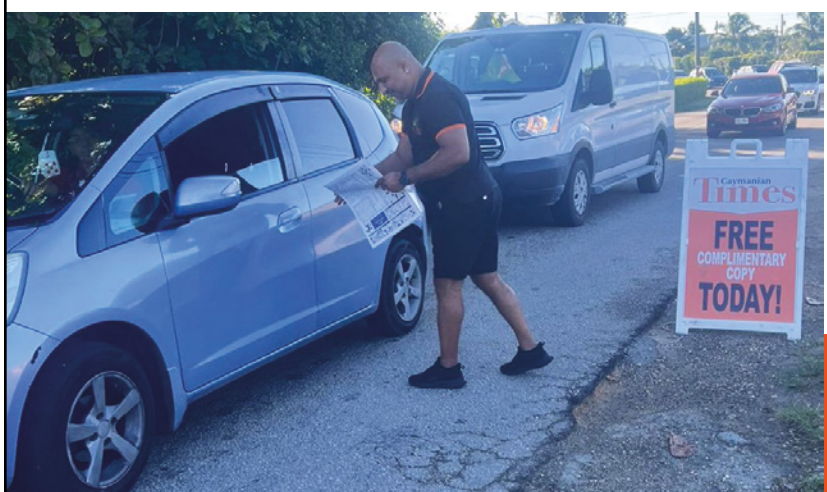
