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


# **CARIFTA Gold and Silver for Cayman**

The Cayman Islands came away with highly coveted gold medals in the Men's Under 20 - 100 meters, thanks to Davonte Howell, who defended his title and also took home the bronze medal in the 200 meters at the 51st CARIFTA Games, held in Grenada. This was Cayman's second gold medal

for the 100 Meters and first bronze medal for the 200 Meters in the CARIFTA Games . Both Davonte and his Cayman Islands Teammate Jaiden Reid blazed their way to the gold and silver medals honours in the race that is usually the highlight of most track and field events.

reflects another phase in the continuing evolution of the local newspaper which publisher Ralph Lewis describes as "at the end of the day, we want to be part of the community. This new Monday edition will demonstrate this commitment as we grow."

With Caymanian Times now offering readers the only multiple days (three-daysa-week) newspaper in Cayman, it brings it a few steps closer to its peak output of a daily paper four years ago in 2020.

That was abruptly halted when the COV-ID-19 pandemic hit and forced the jurisdiction into lockdown.

Announcing the return to three-days-aweek publishing, publisher and editor Lewis said this also coincides with an expansion of the paper's distribution network and maintaining the business model of being complimentary in the hands of readers, especially those in the job market.

The paper currently has over 60 distribution points including all the major supermarkets, pharmacies and other high-traffic areas with other outlets under consideration.

In an interview on Radio Cayman's Business Buzz programme with Anita Khan - coincidentally her final programme - Lewis said the rationale for the relaunched Monday edition of Caymanian Times ties in with the industry standard of having a fresh paper delivered on a Monday morning to start the week.

"The idea is to have the paper available on a Monday morning first thing with the online edition complementing the popular printed edition," he explained.

"The goal is to provide independent balanced news to the community that they can really afford without us having any agenda," Lewis added.

The relaunch of the Monday edition of Caymanian Times also coincides with the business shifting more of its back office processes online to further streamline its operations.

However, Mr Lewis has given an assurance that there are no plans to change from the main output of a printed paper supported by an online presence.

## Data Report for the Academic Year 2022-23

#### INTRODUCTION

Each year, the Department of Education Services (DES) releases a data report to assist education authorities and policymakers make informed decisions. The report offers valuable insights into the current state of education in public schools. It also discusses enrolment trends, compares private and public enrolment provisions, and assesses performance trends within the public education system. This fact sheet shares some of the highlights from that document.

#### HIGHLIGHTS

#### **Upward Trend in Enrolment**



Early Childhood Care & Education (ECCE) enrolment increased by 2.5 percentage points compared to 2021-22.

There is a near-even split between genders 48% female & 52% male.

- Enrolment for compulsory education (primary & secondary schools) saw a modest increase of 1.2%, with near parity between girls (49,99%) and boys (50.01%) compared to 2021-22.
- More than half of students attend government schools (51%), with the remaining students split between private schools (48%) and homeschooling (1%).

#### **Rising Student Attainment**

#### Key Stage 2 (Year 6)

Compared to 2021-22, performance varied slightly across subjects but remained stable overall. Girls outperformed boys by an average of 16 percentage points, particularly in writing, (27pp difference) in alignment with global trends.

#### Key Stage 4 (Year 11) Prior Attainment

CAT4 test scores predicted that 46% of students would perform satisfactorily in the core areas of Mathematics, English and Science. Value-added analysis revealed significant improvement in English and Science (1.84 and 1.2 points) for students with the lowest CAT4 scores, allowing them to obtain satisfactory grades. A 0.74-point improvement was also observed in their performance in Math.

Key Stage 4 (Year 12) Continued positive trajectory in mathematics, with a 15-percentage point increase in students' achievement compared to 2021-22. This year also saw:

- 11 percentage point increase in students achieving the overall national standard of 5+ passes, including Math and English (79%).
- 7.8 percentage point increase in students exceeding the national standard (49%).



A narrowing gender gap showing significant progress in reaching the expected standard.

Value-added analysis revealed a substantial improvement in Math attainment (23.5pp increase) and a notable improvement in English (12.5pp increase).

The 2023 cohort achieved results in English and Math similar to the regional average, and they also exceeded England in English Language while marginally outperforming them in Science.

# **CARIFTA Gold for Cayman, Again!**

Other medalists from the Cayman Islands' Team included Briana Smith, who placed third in the Women's - Under 20 Shot Put event.

The Caymanian Times spoke exclusively with Dave and Kim Howell, parents of Davonte Howell, to learn more about his development and how they fostered his growth as an athlete.

"Davonte showed interest in running from the time he was 4 years old and was always running in the house, saying he was Usain Bolt," noted his mother, Mrs. Kim Howell.

"He would never walk anywhere and would always run and there was even a time he was going so fast through the house that he ended up bumping into furniture and losing a tooth," she added.

After showing great promise and winning the Interscholastic competition, Davonte's parents made the decision to send him to the IMG Academy in Bradenton, Florida, where he continued to excel in both indoor and outdoor competition; making it to the Nationals two years in a row and achieving All American status.

IMG Academy is the world's leading sports education brand and boarding schools for elite athletes.

During Davonte's time at the school, he benefited from the coaching of former Olympian Dwight Thomas, who is known for winning the gold medal in the 4x100meters at the 2008 Beijing Olympics, along with Usain Bolt, Asafa Powell and Nesta Carter.

Mr. Thomas also accompanied Davonte to the previous CARIFTA Games, where he won the Gold.

Much of Davonte's early development and continued success is attributed to his Cayman Islands Coach Tyrone Yen of the Mustangs Track Club however, who his parents, who explained that, "Coach Tony Yen has been the most instrumental in his life and still plays a huge part in his development."

Davonte now attends the University of Tennessee, where he is a 'freshman', (in his first year) and currently trains under the watchful eye of coach Duane Ross.

Having built a widely-respected reputation among the worldwide track & field community, 1995 NCAA champion, 2004 Olympian, and 2021 Co-National Coach of the Year, Duane Ross was appointed to oversee Tennessee's combined men's and women's program as Head Coach and Director of Track & Field on May 24, 2022.

Regarding the natural talent of both Davonte and Jaiden, former Physical Education Teacher at the Prospect Primary Marjorie Scott noted, "Davonte and Jaiden showed promise from the time they were in primary school and were always dedicated.

"It was never a challenge to get them out to practice or on the track," she noted.

Davonte Howell will be returning to the Cayman Islands later this year and has already posted qualifying times to compete in the World Youth Games in Lima, Peru.

Davonte comes from a family of athletes and his siblings are also budding track stars with both his sisters winning Victrix Lodorum interscholastically. His parents were also athletes and successful in the arena of track and field.

They agree that it was not by chance that their children had been involved with sports but it was very much a family trait.



## Cargo Ship SC Montana disabled in Cayman's Waters



On Tuesday April 2nd, The Cayman Islands Coast Guard's Operation Rescue Coordination Centre has reported that efforts were ongoing to coordinate response to a disabled cargo ship, SC Montana, a Liberia freighter vessel that was in Cayman's waters.

Efforts continued throughout the night to render assistance to the stricken cargo ship, SC Montana and divert its course away from Little Cayman. The Liberian freighter vessel suffered engine failure late Tuesday evening and had been drifting towards the western end of the Island.

LEFKES, a bulk carrier vessel, assisted in towing the SC Montana to a safe location, away from Little Cayman.

Navigator, a tug vessel, was also deployed from Grand Cayman.

Representatives of the Cayman Islands Coast Guard expressed gratitude to their counterparts and the crew on LEFKES for their continued assistance throughout the incident noting that neither the docks on Little Cayman nor Cayman Brac have the infrastructure to handle the stricken vessel.

Crew members on SC Montana informed the Cayman Islands Coast Guard that they had generator power and all mechanisms to slow their drift had been employed. The ship's engines remained offline at press time.

All crew members and cargo on SC Montana were re[ported to be safe.

# 100% Completion Rate in Child Safeguarding Training

The Ministry of Education (MoE) is proud to announce that all 52 schools and early childhood institutions in the Cayman Islands have received its mandatory Child Safeguarding Training. This initiative ensures that over 2,500 persons are better equipped to protect the well-being of approximately 11,000 students, fostering a safer learning environment.

"Investing in the safety and well-being of our children is paramount. By equipping those working and volunteering within schools and centres with the knowledge and skills to identify and respond to potential child abuse, we are creating a stronger safety net for our future generation," stated the Honourable Juliana O'Connor-Connolly, Premier and Minister for Education.

The Child Safeguarding Training programme, launched in 2021, has two components. The online module equips participants with foundational knowledge of MoE's child protection policies, local legis-

lation, and identifying signs of abuse. The in-person module further develops practical skills for responding to disclosures and suspicions. Both modules require completion every three years to ensure staff remain current on safeguarding procedures.

"This training allowed me to better understand the different types of abuse children undergo whilst providing ways how I can identify same and get the students needed help," commented one programme participant. "It was good to know the statistics of where we live and teach."

The MoE's commitment extends beyond schools. Training has already been completed in a few post-secondary educational institutions, NGOs, libraries, and a health clinic, and discussions are underway to offer the programme to churches and other community organisations who have expressed an interest.

## WESTMINSTER WELCOMES SPEAKER'S VISIT TO COMMEMORATE 75TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE COMMONWEALTH

The Speaker of Parliament, Honourable Sir Alden McLaughlin, KCMG, MBE, KC, JP, MP, was in London recently to mark the 75th Anniversary of the modern Commonwealth of Nations, and to meet with Speakers and Presiding Officers from across the Commonwealth to discuss key issues facing its member parliaments.

The three-day celebration of the modern Commonwealth began on 10th March with a reception at the residence of the Speaker of the UK's House of Commons, the Rt. Hon. Sir Lindsay Hoyle, MP, which was followed by dinner at the Palace of Westminster with other Speakers and Presiding Officers from nearly two-dozen countries around the world.

Dignitaries joined members of the Royal Family, including Her Majesty the Queen and HRH the Prince of Wales, along with Commonwealth representatives from across the globe on 11th March for the Commonwealth Day Service of Celebration held at Westminster Abbey. Broadcasted on BBC One, the celebration brought together representatives of faith communities with a significant number of songs and hymns from countries within the Commonwealth.

Presiding Officers and Speakers joined together on 12th March in the spirit of collaboration to mark the significant milestone in global history with a round table discussion hosted by the Secretary-General of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (CPA), and a formal dinner at the UK Speaker's residence. Amidst dignitaries from other Overseas Territories, the Speaker of the Cayman Islands Parliament emphasized the enduring importance of the Commonwealth in fostering international cooperation and mutual understanding.

"Our relationship with the UK Parliament is that of family," said Hon. McLaughlin, who has known the Speaker of the UK's House of Commons professionally for nearly two decades. "We come from the legacy of the Westminster

parliamentarians in the UK and across the Overseas Territories."

The Speaker further underscored the Commonwealth's legacy of promoting best practices and parliamentary development across its diverse member nations. Reflecting on the journey of the Commonwealth since its inception, Hon. McLaughlin highlighted its evolution into a robust platform for dialogue, cooperation, and shared prosperity.

However, Hon. McLaughlin reinforced the importance of adequate representation of the Overseas Territories in the broader Commonwealth meetings. Notably, the Speaker emphasized the UK's role as a key partner in advocating for the Cayman Islands and the other Overseas Territories at the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) that takes place every two years and does not include the Overseas Territories.

"I reminded the CPA Secretary General, Mr. Stephen Twigg, and the Hon. Speaker Hoyle, that the Overseas Territories deserve a seat at the CHOGM meeting," he said. "The House of Commons' Speaker has notoriously championed the Overseas Territories and the CPA, and I am confident he will be a strong campaigner for us and our other regional brothers and sisters."

In a communique shared afterwards, the Speakers and Presiding Officers reaffirmed the central role played by parliaments in democratic life in the countries and territories of the Commonwealth, and thanked the CPA for its role in deepening the Commonwealth's "commitment to the highest standards of democratic governance, parliamentary practice," and "fundamental values across our law-making legislative bodies."

"We reiterate our support and commitment," the communique concluded, "to the unique and modern partnership of the Commonwealth and our roles within it."



## Mirikama wins 58th Annual Easter Regatta Braving Big Winds



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The 58th Easter Round the Island Sailing Regatta, sponsored by Harbour House Marina took place as tradition on Good Friday (29th March) and involved seven

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sailboats of various sizes starting off from within North Sound early in the morning. With the stronger than expected winds blowing from the north, the first boat to

start was Lady Jane at 7.50am battling with Mirikama and Cheers staggered starts at 8.05 am. The annual regatta is held as a pursuit race with handicaps determining start times and aligning the boats to probable close finish times.

The seasoned captains battled 22-25mph winds gusting and waves up to 8-10 feet. Exiting the main channel was a challenge due to the large swells generated by the Northerly winds that had been blowing in from Cuba the day before.

Mirikama's skipper Mike Farrington and crew raced to a finish line at Sunset House in six hours and 28 minutes finishing at 2:23pm followed by Arktos in 2nd and Blue Runner in 3rd place. Cheers and Splendour of the Wind followed close behind with Lady Jane behind them. Power Play was the only Catamaran entry and concluded the race at 4:10pm.

Due to small craft warnings the sailors had to forgo the mooring overnight at the finish line on the south coast at Sunset House. Several of the regatta participants circumnavigated 3600 around the island in the same day, approximately 62 miles.

The Cayman Islands Committee Race Officer Peta Adams stated "It was a race in challenging conditions and we were happy to hear of the individual tales at the Prize Giving from the skippers."

Harbour House have been the major sponsor for the event for many years and provided the Top 3 placed boats with engraved trophies and gift certificates. There was also a gallant effort prize for the last boat across the line which was a free haul out and power wash. Sunset House contributed to a well attended prize giving for the 66 brave crew members who made it ashore after the good Friday finish. The regatta route covers 46 miles from North Channel Start clockwise around east end to finish on the south coast at Sunset House. Following the recorded times the boats then cruise 14 miles beyond seven mile beach to a finish back in north sound.

# Once big, always big?

#### Step #1 to Lose it For Good -The Right Mindset

There are only two mindsets to choose from when you approach your quest for weight loss:

1. This is a temporary change in my behavior.

2. This is a new way of life.

There's no middle ground, you either see it as temporary change or you see it as permanent change. It's pretty obvious which mindset produces permanent results.

#### Step #2 to Lose it For Good -New Habits

I'll bet you could draw out the ideal environment for permanent weight loss. You know the path. Now put in the effort to walk the path.


#### Step #4 to Lose it For Good -Good Nutrition






