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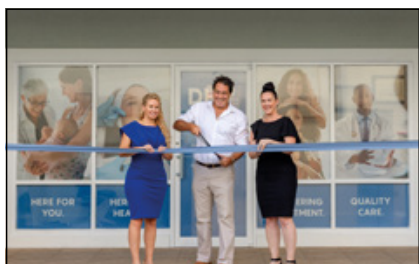

What is Plan Cayman?

Plan Cayman is the name for Cayman's long-range comprehensive development plan, which will be used to guide physical development and overall land use in the Cayman Islands. It is comprised of three key elements:

- 1. Planning Statement:** A high-level policy defining land use zones and identifying land use priorities for Cayman.
- 2. Area Plans and Zoning Map:** Detailed policies for different locations in Cayman and map assigning land use zones.
- 3. Development and Planning Regulations:** Legislation to support the Planning Statement, Area Plans, and Zoning Map.

Advancing the Vision through Community Engagement:

We are inviting feedback on the updated Planning Statement document, which is the first phase of the development plan review process. This document has been drafted to incorporate the policies previously identified within the National Planning Framework (NPF) document. Doppler Radar Resumes Service Ahead of Hurricane Season

After essential repairs and maintenance, the Kearney Gomez Doppler radar system is now fully operational and was set to resume active service on Monday 27 May 2024. Premier and Minister responsible for the National Weather Service, Hon. Juliana O' Connor-Connolly said, "This milestone reflects our government's commitment to ensuring the safety and preparedness of our nation as we approach the hurricane season. The Cayman Islands is adapting a culture of readiness, wherein we are taking frequent inventory of our existing resources and seeking new ones to ensure our country is resilient in weather situations."

The Cayman Islands National Weather Service's (CINWS) doppler radar system is an important tool in tracking storm activity during the Atlantic hurricane season. The radar, located in the

interior of East End, can detect moisture and water droplets up to 250 miles away from the Cayman Islands and the encircling sea.

Experts from the German-based company, LEONARDO, worked with the CINWS team on the doppler's recent repairs. LEONARDO, which also installed the radar, is the only entity qualified to provide the level of scientific expertise necessary for the doppler's maintenance.

The doppler's repair also involved a diplomatic partnership with the Barbadian government and the Barbados Weather Service, which assisted in the sourcing and exporting of critical equipment needed for the radar to resume service.

"Working closely with the engineer from LEONARDO, we have meticulously addressed the technical challenges

faced by the radar", said CINWS Technical Manager Michael Carey. "It is immensely gratifying to see our hard work come to fruition, ensuring that our radar system is functional before the hurricane season."

Mr. Carey's sentiments were echoed by CINWS Director General, John Tibbetts. "We appreciate the public's patience with unforeseen lulls in the radar's service. We remain committed to providing accurate information about our weather and safeguarding our community ahead of natural disasters. Thankfully, we have now reinstated the radar, which serves as our early warning system. This increases our capacity

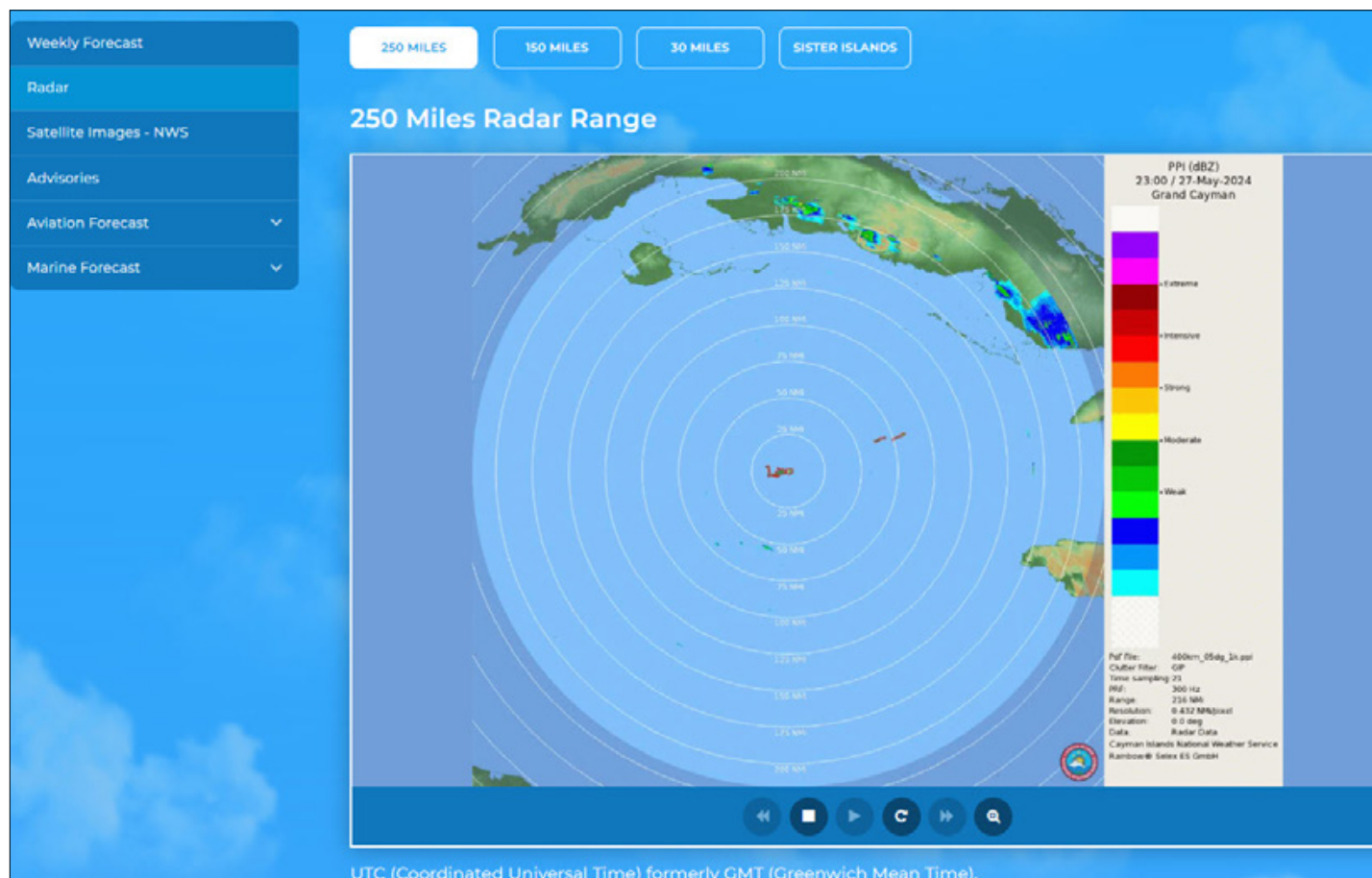
for forecasting, research and accurate reporting in inclement conditions", Director General Tibbetts said.

About the Kearney Gomez Doppler Radar

The Kearney Gomez Doppler radar is a specialised radar system that uses the Doppler effect to produce velocity data about objects at a distance. The system's primary use is measuring the velocity of precipitation in the air which allows meteorologists to determine the speed and direction of precipitation, such as rain. This information is critical for understanding weather patterns, storm formations, and the potential for severe weather systems.

The Doppler radar first became operational in 2013 and has a lifespan of 15 years. The system was built by LEONARDO GmbH, a German manufacturer, and funded through a grant provided by the European Union in 2012. During the system's lifetime it has experienced minor periods of downtime. In 2021, after Hurricane Grace, it received leaking, leading to substantial operation disruption, with repairs completed in 2022. Throughout 2023, the radar experienced several operational interruptions inclusive of the dehydrator being down for 3 months, a 1-day interruption in communications due to lightning and a 4-month service disruption caused by the slip ring and brush block failing. The radar system has been non-operational since 20 October 2023 due to a mechanical failure that was beyond the scope of the local team's expertise and experience.

The Doppler radar has proven to be an invaluable tool in meteorological data collection and weather forecasting. The warranty on the system has now expired and is entering a phase where maintenance and repairs may be greater as the region experiences more active weather systems.

Tree Trimming near Power Lines



Never attempt to prune or trim trees that grow within 10 feet of power lines. Only qualified personnel approved by CUC should trim trees or branches within 10 feet of power lines. Contact with a high voltage power line can result in serious injury or even death.

Always ensure that trees and branches on your property are properly maintained and grow away from power lines. Trees or branches that grow over 10 feet away from power lines can be trimmed by landscapers.

Our tree trimming is aimed at keeping over 400 miles of transmission and distribution lines clear of trees and undergrowth. Through our focus on effective vegetation management, which includes periodic inspections of power lines and information from customers, we can identify trees that are growing too close to power lines and thus, cause concern for public safety and reliability.

If branches on your property are within 10 feet of power lines, please visit our website at www.cuc-cayman.com, navigate to the "Other Services" section under the "Customer Service" tab, click on "Tree Trimming", then "Tree Trimming Request Form" and complete the "Vegetation Management: Job Request Form". After submitting the information, a CUC representative will be in contact with you once the information has been processed.

Nihon, drew in around 150 models. Alana’s talent caught the eye of Sonia S. Brown (founder of Carib-Link and Brown Entertainment Group), a retired model who facilitates the placement of Caribbean models in international markets including Europe, the U.S., and Asia. Carib-Link Model and Talent Expo aims to bridge the gap between Caribbean talent and global opportunities.

Instrumental in Alana’s successful audition was her modelling training, since July 2022, with P.S. O’Brian Consulting’s founder, Chantel O’Brian (a Miss Uni-

verse 2021 top 10 finalist) and training received, in early 2023, by international runway coach, Alva Page.

Reflecting on the day she scouted Alana, Ms. Brown recalled, “I wanted to sign her from the moment I saw her walk on the runway. She has it, that thing that no one can define but cannot deny when they see it.”

In April 2024, merely five months after discovering Alana, Ms. Brown successfully secured international representation for her with HÓP Models, within a few weeks of initially submitting Alana’s comp card and portfolio to the agency.

The past 15 months have been eventful for Alana, who has walked in nearly 25 designer shows on runways in New York, Miami, London, and Milan. Modelling in these fashion hubs was made possible by the runway shows’ producer, The Fashion

Life Tour (TFL), whose CEO is Kiara Belen, first runner-up of America’s Next Top Model - Cycle 19.

Alana also showcased her talent in Cayman InStyle Fashion Week’s 2023 and 2024 runway events, wearing styles by Caymanian designer, Norma Ebanks and international designers Paulette Cleghorn, Cesar Galindo, Sai Sankoh, Adrian Alicéa, and Uzuri International. Notably, she was chosen by Alicéa and Uzuri to close their shows, highlighting her appeal to top-tier designers, such as those she has walked for, whose creations have been worn by A-list celebrities such as Beyoncé, Zoe Saldána and Madonna.

Ms. Brown now aims to continue to turn the young model’s dreams into reality by securing representation for Alana in Eu-

rope or Asia, in her capacity as the European Model Showcase (EMS) Approved

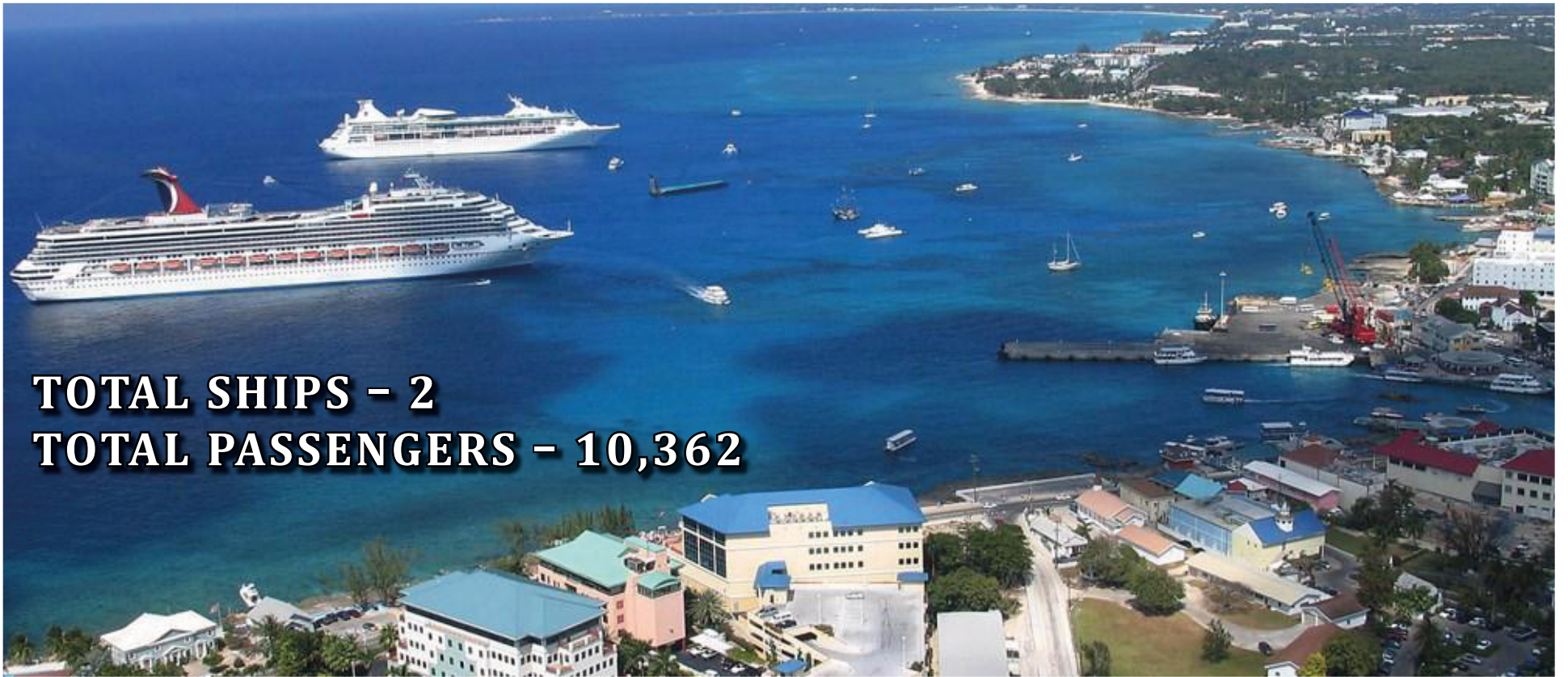
Scouting Director for The Caribbean.

Bulk Waste Collection heading to North Side/East End & Sister Islands

The Department of Environmental Health (DEH) is urging North Side and East End residents as well as those living in Cayman Brac and Little Cayman to get their bulk waste ready for collection as its solid waste team moves to their communities from Monday, May 27, 2024.

During the last week of this year's Bulk Waste Collection Schedule, our collection teams will be deployed to the North Side, East End and the sister islands simultaneously.

Residents are urged to prepare, separate, and get their items ready for collection. Any bulk waste that is put out after the announced dates will not be collected as there will not be any extension of the schedule.

The Department is also reminding Bodden Town residents that Saturday, May 25, 2024, was the last day for the collection in their area and no additional bulk waste must be placed as it will be considered littering or illegal dumping.

Solid Waste Management crews are deployed from Monday to Saturday according to the following schedule:

Bulk waste refers to large items such as old furniture, tyres and metal items that are not collected as part of the

DEH's weekly residential pick-up services.

Metal and vegetative waste must be separated from other bulk waste items. Meanwhile, construction and demolition debris, hazardous material, electronics, and tyres will not be collected

during the bulk waste removal activity. Alternative arrangements must be made to transport these materials to the George Town Landfill or the landfill drop-off facility at the gate which remains accessible to the public and small vehicles 24 hours per day.

The DEH is also reminding residents that following the completion of the Bulk Waste Collection Schedule, arrangements should be made by individuals to transport any additional waste to the landfills and that any illegal dumping and littering should be reported to the DEH or the Royal Cayman Islands Police Service (RCIPS). This unlawful practice can result in a penalty of 6 months of imprisonment and a minimum fine of \$500.

CUC Addresses Generation Capacity and Increased Risk of Load-Shedding Amidst Rising Energy Demand in Grand Cayman



Caribbean Utilities Company, Ltd. ("CUC" or "the Company") wishes to provide an update to the Grand Cayman community regarding the current generation capacity for the island.

CUC's generation reserve margin, the difference between total installed electricity generation capacity and peak customer electricity demand, is presently at lower than normal levels which increases the risk of having to shed customer load in the event of any unplanned loss of generation. The shrinking reserve margin is due to rapidly increasing electricity demand driven by economic growth and record high temperatures and delays in adding new generating capacity to the grid.

In recent years, Grand Cayman has experienced significant growth, resulting in an increased demand for electricity. The latest data from the Cayman Islands Economics and Statistics Office 2022 Compendium of Statistics indicates a 24% growth in population for the Cayman Islands be-

tween 2018 and 2022 alone. Peak electricity demand on Grand Cayman grew by 9% from 113.5 megawatts ("MW") in 2022 to 124.1 MW in 2023 and is expected to grow further in 2024.

CUC last installed significant additional generation capacity in 2016 with a smaller addition in 2022. All generation capacity installations by CUC requires Utility Regulation and Competition Office ("OfReg") approval. In 2019 and 2021 the Company forecasted increased consumer demand and in 2019 proposed a 13 megawatt ("MW") Solar plus storage project to OfReg to meet projected demand with a clean energy option. The proposal was not approved pending the initiation of a competitive bid process by OfReg for such a project.

In 2021, CUC formally requested that OfReg initiate the procurement of 23MW of Solar and Storage capacity to meet increasing consumer demand. This procurement process by OfReg is currently in the

final planning stages.

As a temporary measure the Company leased 10MW of mobile generation in 2023 and an additional 10MW to be installed later in 2024, for which regulatory approval is pending. The customer owned solar programmes have added 16.8 MW to the grid since 2021, however the peak loads are occurring in the evening and cannot be served by solar power without the use of battery storage. The Company's 20 MW Battery Energy Storage System ("BESS") which is expected to be commissioned in June will assist with meeting the evening peak demand.

While the Company and its dedicated operations and maintenance teams are working very hard to keep all generating units available, if on any occasion, customer demand is higher than available generating capacity available, the Company will need to conduct rotating customer outages, known as load shedding.

If load shedding becomes necessary, the

Company will publish schedules as far in advance as possible and provide key updates through the CUC social media pages, press releases, and radio announcements.

In the event that load shedding is necessary, customers may expect the following:

- Where possible, power outages will be for periods limited to approximately thirty minutes to one hour within a twenty-four hour period.

- Outages will be more common during peak hours, which on Grand Cayman is typically between 4:30 pm-8:00 pm, but in the summer can occur as early as 3pm due to the high temperature.

- Customers can keep up to date on power restoration by referring to CUC's Outage Viewer on CUC's website and CUC's social media channels.

CUC expects that reserve margins will be restored to normal levels between June and July when the Battery Energy Storage System comes online and additional leased generation is put in service.

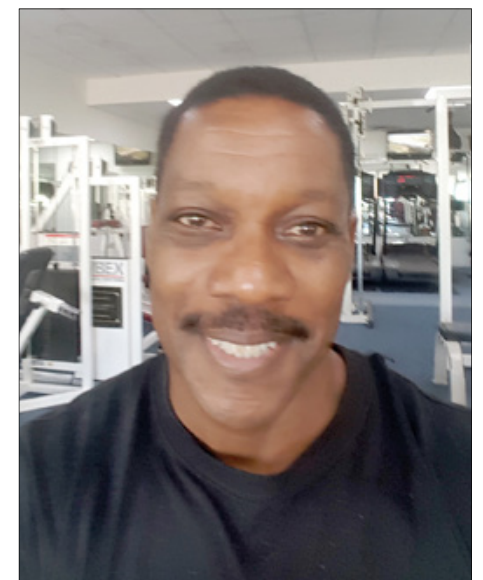



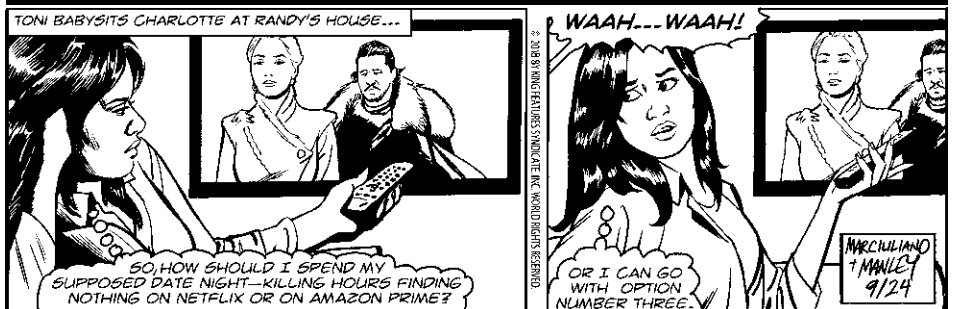
