

NRA Opens Third Eastbound Lane on Linford Pierson Highway







The National Roads Authority (NRA) is pleased to announce the official opening of a third eastbound lane on Linford Pierson Highway, extending just past the Lion Centre. This significant infrastructure enhancement marks another key achievement in the NRA's commitment to improving traffic efficiency and reduce congestion for Cayman's commuters. The third lane eastbound is an interim part of an overall 6 lane (3 in each direction) de-

sign.

As the works are not yet complete (i.e. no formal shoulder/bicycle lane, and median treatments added as yet) motorists are urged to use the lane with extreme caution and drive at 25 mph as this area is still an active work zone.

Designed to alleviate afternoon traffic buildup commonly experienced by eastbound drivers leaving George Town, the expansion increases capacity along this critical road corridor. The additional lane is expected to substantially decrease travel times, particularly during peak hours, enhancing the daily commute for thousands of motorists.

NRA Managing Director Edward Howard emphasized that the upgrade is part of a wider strategy to modernize Cayman's road network and elevate the driving experience. "Our mission is a commitment to build smarter, safer roads for the Cayman

Islands," said Howard. "The opening of this third lane will offer immediate relief to road users while supporting the island's growing transportation needs."

Motorists are reminded to continue exercising caution as works are still taking place in the area.

The NRA encourages all drivers to observe posted speed limits, obey directional signage, and remain alert while using the new lane.

ganisations like the BBC and CBC. Featured topics include women's empowerment, culture and art, fashion and music, current affairs, and most recently, true crime.

She posted on her Instagram page: "What began as a professional invitation to the Cayman Islands unfolded into something deeper: a celebration of sisterhood, sunshine, and soft adventure. Grateful for the joy, the journey, and the gentle reminder that work can very much come with enjoyment."


In a press statement, the Department of Tourism said Ms. Ajala's visit reflects the growing international interest in Cayman's agricultural development and food resilience efforts. During her tour, she attended the official ribbon cutting of the Cayman Islands' first commercial egg facility, explored the Orchid Grounds at the Department of Agriculture (DoA), and engaged in in-depth dialogue with government leaders about the Ministry's vision for a self-sustaining agricultural future.

As part of her visit, she conducted an exclusive interview on Tuesday, July 22, 2025, with Hon. Minister Jay Ebanks, Hon. Deputy Premier Gary Rutty, Hon. Isaac Rankine, and Director of Agriculture Wilbur Welcome. The discussion centred on the future of sustainable agriculture, food security, and regional farming practices in the Cayman Islands.

Minister Jay Ebanks shared: "Food sustainability and food security are among my top priorities. Cayman imports nearly 98% of our food, and that has to change. We've already made strides through initiatives like the National Egg Strategy (NEST) programme, and we are developing others to further reduce our reliance on imports. We're training our youth, one crop at a time. It's about equipping the next generation with the tools to farm and sustain themselves — and this visit helps bring that mission to light."

A GIS statement described the scenic Orchid Grounds providing a fitting backdrop for the upcoming feature on the BBC, which will highlight the Ministry's trans-





formative initiatives in modernising agriculture across the Islands—"a testament to the continued progress under Minister Ebanks' leadership."

During the tour, Mrs. Claudette McKenzie-Bowen, Agronomist Manager with the Department of Agriculture, for over 14 years, guided Ms. Ajala through fruit trees, crop beds, and experimental plantings, even encouraging her to harvest and taste fresh local produce like mangoes and

Mrs. Claudette McKenize-Bowen stated: "The Department of Agriculture provides extension services to farmers, manage propagation materials, and runs small plot crop experiments for issues like pest control. All of what you see here—from bananas and plantains to eggplants—is grown to support Cayman's farming sector."

Minister Isaac Rankine added: "The NEST programme is already making a positive impact—and I've felt that personally. In our early days, Caymanians relied on the land and sea to sustain their families. It's exciting to see the Ministry and the Department of Agriculture helping us

reconnect with those roots through strategic invest-

Deputy Premier Gary Rutty stated: "Agriculture is at the heart of our resilience and self-reliance. We fully support the Minister's work from both a Cabinet and caucus level. Hosting Ms. Ajala allows us to share the Cayman Islands' commitment to sustainability with the world-and reinforces our determination to create a future where our people are nourished by what we produce locally."

Director Wilbur Welcome said: "Cayman has such a unique agricultural product that deserves both protec-

tion and international attention. From education to implementation, our team remains focused on modernising farming in a way that empowers Caymanians. We look forward to sharing that journey with

MoET & DES Announce Hybrid Start for Layman E. Scott Snr. High School

The Ministry of Education & Training (MoET), in collaboration with the Department of Education Services (DES), has announced that Layman E. Scott Snr. High School will begin the 2025–2026 academic year with hybrid instruction. This change aims to facilitate the safe completion of asbestos remediation work scheduled to commence at the institution in the coming days

Hybrid instruction, also known as blended learning, refers to a teaching approach that combines online and in-person learning experiences. It integrates traditional classroom methods with online educational materials and activities, offering students flexibility and a potentially more engaging learning environment.

The announcement follows the identification of asbestos-containing material in

a section of the roof and in the tilework of one classroom during testing conducted in late June.

Although the material remains contained and undisturbed, and there is no indication of immediate risk, the Ministry has elected to act out of an abundance of caution.

"Once I was apprised of the situation, I called for comprehensive testing to be carried out, ensuring that the matter is resolved with the urgency, transparency, and diligence it deserves," said Minister of Education & Training, Hon. Rolston Anglin.

The Minister's message was delivered during a series of virtual briefings held with educators and parents yesterday (Wednesday, 6 August). A recorded version of his message has also been made available online at https://bit.ly/4mwFRPB.

Acting Senior School Improvement Of-

ficer for Cayman Brac schools, Mr. Devon Bowen, also attended the meetings, and committed to sharing the details of the operational changes with parents and staff in the coming week.

The DES is currently finalising discussions with certified environmental professionals to undertake a full remediation and provide oversight, ensuring that service delivery meets the highest industry standards

"Once remediation has begun, no student or member of staff will return to campus until all works are complete and the final air quality results confirm that it is safe to do so," said Minister Anglin. "We understand the inconvenience this may cause to some families, but safety must remain our

JAMAICA VOTES ON SEPTEMBER 3rd!



In a sea of Jamaican flags, campaign paraphernalia and surrounded by hordes of party faithful, Prime Minister Andrew Holness finally disclosed what Jamaicans - and the rest of the region and beyond - have been waiting to hear.

First came the teaser: "I now declare that Nomination Day will be Monday August 18th."

That was followed by the much-anticipated pronouncement: "And the general election," he thundered, "the general election date is fixed at Wednesday September 3!"

Already in campaign mode, both the rul-

ing Jamaica Labour Party(JLP) led by Mr Holness, and the main opposition People's National Party(PNP), now led by Mark Golding, along with other groups and independents expected to contest the election, will now unleash their full campaign machinery.

The announcement of the election date comes just days after elaborate celebrations marking Jamaica's 63rd independence anniversary.

With crime and the economy already top issues, the ruling JLP has already been taking credit for a turnaround in the economy under its stewardship, especially over the



past two terms under Mr Holness.

A tough stance on crime underpinned by new policies, relations with the United States under the Trump presidency with its own tough anti-crime, immigration and economic policies, and lifting struggling Jamaicans out of poverty are also expected to be hallmarks of the JLP's re-election strategy.

For the main opposition PNP, hoping for a political recovery after being hammered in the 2020 polls, new leader Mark Golding will be hoping to turn around his party's fortunes with a platform focusing on the economy, crime and social justice. He assumed the par-

ty's leadership following its disastrous 2020 showing against the incumbent JLP. In that election, Mr Holness guided the JLP to a land-slide over the PNP, then led by Peter Phillips.

On September 3rd the ruling JLP will be defending its 49 seats to the 16 held by the PNP. There are 63 elected seats in the Jamaican national parliament.

Pundits expect this election to be a closer race with a higher turnout compared to 2020's 38 per cent voter participation.

There are 1.2 million registered voters in Jamaica of a population estimated at 2.8 million

Water-Related Death in George Town

Shortly after 12:00PM on Friday, 8 August, the 9-1-1 Communications Centre dispatched police and other emergency services to a report of a person in distress in the waters off North Church Street, south of the intersection with Eastern Avenue. A man had gone snorkelling when his companions on shore lost sight of him. He was subsequently found, unrespon-

sive, in the water nearby. He was brought to shore and Emergency Services attended the location. He was transported to hospital, where he was subsequently pronounced deceased.

The man, age 71, is a visitor from the United States.

The RCIPS expresses condolences to the family and friends of the deceased.

Police Investigate Robbery in George Town

Shortly after 5:20PM on Saturday, 9 August, officers responded to a report of a robbery at a business on North Sound Road, George Town, south of the Butterfield roundabout. It was reported that a masked man had entered the store, brandishing what appeared to be a handgun, and demanded cash from the worker there. He then made off in a vehicle with a pouch containing a quantity of cash. No shots were fired and no one was injured during the incident.

Officers made inquiries and subsequently recovered a vehicle on Whitman Seymour Drive, fitting the description of the vehicle the suspect fled in.

The suspect is described as being tall, slim, and was wearing black pants a hoodie, and mask.

The matter is currently under investigation by George Town CID, and anyone with any information is asked to contact 949-4222.

RCIPS Deploys Police Helicopter to Turks & Caicos for Support

The RCIPS has deployed a police helicopter and flight crew to the Turks & Caicos Islands, to provide support in response to recent serious violent crimes in the British Overseas Territory (BOT).

The deployment of the helicopter and its crew is being funded and supported by the TCI Government and the Foreign & Commonwealth Development Office (FCDO).

The helicopter will provide the Royal Turks & Caicos Police Force with aerial support during their national security operations.

"As I have said previously, it is important that we support

our BOT colleagues whenever possible," says Commissioner of Police Kurt Walton. "Our second helicopter was purchased with additional funding from the FCDO, partly to enable us to provide assistance when needed, while maintaining local se-



curity. We are happy to be able to do so for Turks & Caicos during this critical time."

The second RCIPS police helicopter remains in the Cayman Islands, ensuring continued coverage of local operational needs.

BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS INDEPENDENCE DISCUSSION

Never far from the centre of discussion, especially in recent years, the issue of independence for the British Virgin Islands is trending again in the territory's political discourse.

Premier Dr Natalio Wheatley has been addressing the issue, most recently in an address for the BVI's Emancipation celebration - itself a calendar platform for pronouncements on the territory's constitutional status and future.

However, he has sought to make a distinction between independence from the United Kingdom and self-determination.

"Some in the public have misinterpreted this as taking the BVI to independence without a conversation or the involvement of the people," he stated, stressing that "This is simply not true."


According to the BVI Premier, who currently chairs the United Kingdom Overseas Territories Association(UKOTA), any effort to transition the BVI from its current constitutional status as a British Overseas Territory (BOT) will first go through an exhaustive process of public consultation culminating in a referendum.

But he castigated persons he felt doubted the BVI's ability to manage its affairs outside British administrative oversight.

"They believe that other people in the world should manage our affairs for us, perhaps because we are not smart enough, or we lack enough moral integrity, or we're not civilised enough to manage our own affairs? Why do we feel so inferior when everything in our story says that we have achieved so much with so little assistance from our administering power?"

The BVI is currently undertaking a constitutional review process on its relationship with the UK. That follows a 2021 UK-commissioned inquiry which highlighted a range of severe shortcomings in the territory's administrative and governance processes and made a series of far-reaching recommendations. Implementing those within the specified timeframe has been a point of contention between the BVI and UK governments. Among the main legislative changes are laws impacting the territory's lucrative offshore financial sector, especially accessibility of public registers of beneficial ownership of companies registered in the territory.

Regarding the ongoing constitutional review, Premier Wheatley has characterised





the BVI's current status as a relic of colonialism. "The Virgin Islands is a colony of the United Kingdom. The word 'territory' seems more benign, but we are a colony. What should we say about colonialism? Firstly, let us say, without hesitation, without fear of contradiction, that colonialism is wrong," he argued.

A 2024 UN Decolonisation Committee report on the BVI concluded that full internal self-government should be granted to the BVI but emphasised that a public education campaign on self-determination should be launched as a prerequisite.

That UN report further stated that "more work is needed within communities and among the people, their political leaders

and the administering power to build mutual trust and confidence."

It also linked any move towards independence with a national education programme on the issue, holding a referendum, setting a timeline to achieve independence, and having comprehensive negotiations with the UK for which it offered to provide a mediator.

The BVI Constitutional Review Commission has itself recommended establishing a decolonisation advisory to guide the process locally.

Meanwhile, the Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) in which the BVI is an associate member, earlier this year issued a statemeny extending "its firm support and

solidarity to the Government and people of the British Virgin Islands (BVI) as they continue their journey toward achieving a full measure of self-government and realizing their aspirations for constitutional advancement and political self-determination."

That policy statement in May also said "the OECS commends the BVI on the successful completion of the most comprehensive governance reform programme in its history—an unequivocal demonstration of its commitment to good governance, transparency, accountability, and democratic values." It described the reform agenda as "not only a significant domestic milestone but also a model of responsive leadership that deserves international recognition."

On Wednesday, July 30, North-West University (NWU) in South Africa conferred an honorary doctorate on Professor Sir Hilary Beckles, Vice-Chancellor of The University of the West Indies (The UWI). The award recognises Vice-Chancellor Beckles' formidable academic contributions and his global advocacy for social justice.

On the evening before the ceremony, he delivered a public lecture titled From Durban to Accra: Rise of the Global Reparations Movement.

The honorary doctorate, a Doctor of Philosophy (Honoris Causa) in History, from the NWU's Faculty of Humanities, stands as a testament to Vice-Chancellor Beckles' lifelong effort to use History as a tool for

healing and reform. Vice-Chancellor Beckles described the honorary doctorate as a deeply personal honour.



Vice-Chancellor Beckles recalled meeting Steve Biko in Zambia as a student. "I expressed concern for his safety, and he told me that if I ever had a son, I might name him after him. He lost his life, and I honoured that legacy. My son's name is Biko."

Reflecting on the honorary doctorate, he

added, "To be here, decades later, nearing the end of my career, it means everything. It fills me with joy and gratitude."

Professor Bismark Tyobeka, Principal and Vice-Chancellor of the NWU stated, "We are honoured to have conferred an honorary doctorate upon Professor Sir Hilary Beckles, a distinguished scholar and public intellectual whose life's work is a masterclass in using academic inquiry as a force for societal transformation. As Vice-Chancellor of The UWI, Chair of the CARICOM Reparations Commission, and chairman of the United Nations University, to name but a few roles, Vice-Chancellor Beckles has brought academia to the service of justice, championing reparatory
