

portfolios (as reported in our edition of Wednesday August 20th and online).

Leader of government, Hon. Premier An-

dré Ebanks MP said, "These initial achievements belong to all of us – the committed members of our coalition Government, dedicated civil servants who serve our country and most importantly our people, who have entrusted us with their future. Together, we have shown that a unified Government can take decisive action and deliver real results for our country."

DELIVERING ON CAMPAIGN PRIORITY

The five-partner NCFC coalition came into office on a leading mandate of immigration control and prioritising employment for Caymanians. Reviewing its first 100 days, it pointed to the steps taken to address that main plank of its campaign platform and coalition agreement:

"In employment and immigration, the report highlights the Government's work to implement term limits for non-Caymanian civil servants, with implementation scheduled to start in January 2026. The Government also approved drafting instructions for amendments to the Immigration Act, introducing updates to strengthen immigration rules and promote fairness, accountability and opportunity across all sectors."

DEFICIT RISK LOOMS

Another key area which surfaced towards the latter part of the 2025 election campaign and which commanded the attention of all candidates and electorate was the official Pre-Election Economic and Financial Update (PREFU). The report prepared by the Ministry of Finance and Economic Development and published in April had cautioned about the prospect of the government facing a looming deficit - a situation now inherited by the NCFC.

As outlined within the first pages of the comprehensive 36-page NCFC First 100 Days report, "In 2024, the Government recorded an unaudited Operating Surplus of \$60.4 million. However, there were several factors that were projected to shift this strong position into an Operating Deficit of \$26.2 million in 2025 — a change of \$86.6 million."

It noted that the key drivers of the projected deficit included projected revenues down by approximately \$4.0 million compared to 2024, due to slower growth in certain income streams. The PREFU warned that "without corrective measures, projected deficits will persist in 2025 and 2026."

According to the government: "It became evident that certain expenditure budgets were insufficient to provide funding for a full 12-month period to 31 December 2025."

In its First 100 Days report, the NCFC administration concluded that "in order to regain full compliance with the Principles (of Responsible Financial Management), deliberate actions were required, which include reviewing revenue enhancement measures and re-examining operating and capital expenditure plans to identify reductions."

The details of how that will be accomplished expected to be outlined in the upcoming Strategic Policy Statement, now due by the end of October, after the government extended the timeframe for its presentation from the end of July.

OTHER ACHIEVEMENTS LISTED

In the meantime, reporting on other accomplishments in its first three months at the helm, the NCFC government highlighted several areas across portfolios including:

- Tourism; boosted through additional airlift capacity from Porter and Spirit Airlines, reflecting strong demand from high-value markets and demonstrating successful partnerships with international carriers. On the cruise sector, it said it's "committed to delivering an interim Cruise Tourism Plan by the end of 2025, ahead of a comprehensive, evidence-based National Cruise Tourism Strategy, which addresses the outlook for cruise sector development over the longer-term.
- On the economic front, the Government has supported local families through stamp-duty waivers totalling CI\$1.04 million. Sound financial management also generated CI\$5.80 million in revenue from fixed deposit investments, contributing to fiscal stability.
- Regarding the key economic pillar of financial services and commerce, the government reports that it has reviewed, revised and reinvigorated the Ministry's strategic and operational thrust, on both commercial and regulatory matters.
- Progress in mental health support includes the formation of the Poinciana Mental Health Advisory Council, described as a foundational step in ensuring the mental health system is accountable and responsive to the needs of all. Additionally, standalone legislation has been developed for mental health.
- Notable success in education, including all recent Caymanian graduates who completed education-related degrees successfully placed into roles within the education system. The Government also processed more than 700 student registration applications for the 2025/2026 academic year, with all Caymanian students who applied securing places in Government schools.
- In housing and agriculture, completing the first affordable homes at the Flamingo Point Housing Development in North Side, and launching two key agricultural projects to develop the livestock industry, and the Islands' first Government-operated egg production facility.

The government also detailed its Parliamentary actions including; confirming the new minimum wage of CI\$8.75 per hour, effective 1 January 2026, announcing stable cruise passenger projections for the 2026–2027 period and outlining plans to strengthen the operational capacity of the Community Policing Unit.

India's Consul General Visits Cayman

During an official visit to the Cayman Islands last week, High Commissioner of India to Jamaica and Non-resident Consul General of India to the Cayman Islands, His Excellency Mayank Joshi, met with then Acting Premier and Minister for Tourism and Trade Development Honourable Gary Rutty as part of a series of engagements with government officials and entities. The meeting took place in the Ministry's office at the Government

Administration Building.

Commenting on the meeting with the Consul General, Acting Premier Rutty stated, "It was a pleasure to welcome Mr Joshi for a constructive exchange. Our meeting was an important opportunity to explore practical ways we can work together. We look forward to continuing open dialogue and to deepening the friendship between our countries."

Mr Joshi equally underscored the importance of meeting the Acting Premier, stating, "We had engaging and productive discussions on ways to increase trade and investment and tourism between India and the Cayman Islands. We also talked about digital technologies and public services."

The Consul General also explained that the High Commission of India in Jamaica is accredited to the Cayman Islands for consular services and noted there are over 1500 Indian residents living in the Islands. Mr. Joshi shared that the aim of this most recent visit was "to promote friendly relations between India and Cayman, particularly in areas of trade, tourism, investment and culture."

Consul General Joshi also met with Her Excellency Governor Jane Owen. In the meeting, he formally handed over his letter of appointment as Consul General of India to the Cayman Islands. The meeting featured discussions about the importance of disaster resilience and preparedness, as well as trade and investments in areas such as health, finance and information technology.

Another significant highlight of the Consul General's visit was his participation in a consulate agency hurricane table-top exercise hosted by Hazard Management Cayman Islands to strengthen consulate agencies' preparedness and response to a crisis and to foster dialogue between stakeholders. The exercise included representatives from the Governor's office, Royal Cayman Islands Police Service, Customs and Border Control, Cayman Islands Airports Authority and the Department of Tourism.

Cayman Arts Festival holds Summer **Camp for Instrumentalists**

The Cavman Arts Festival summer camp held 4-8 August offered more than a chance for music students and teachers to get together; it was the perfect setting to forge new friendships while enhancing skills on their instruments. The camp, which was held at the John Gray High School Performance Centre, was for music students aged 7 to 17.

Frances McConvey, who leads Cayman Arts Festival's educational programmes, said the camp provided invaluable benefits to the music students.

"Because of the intensive practice and focus on technique, students showed real improvement by the end of the week," she said, adding that the camp also provided an opportunity for participants to perform together. "Younger students were inspired by more advanced musicians, and the older students took on leadership roles.

The annual summer music camp is an

important part of the CAF music education programme, McConvey said.

"It offers an opportunity for students to make friends with others who share similar interests and for them to become more confident in performing."

Cayman Arts Festivals' teachers also participated and performed with the students. They included Yoan Garcia and McConvey with the violins; Zachary Allen and Dequan Smith with the cellos; Marlon

Cortes with the clarinets and saxophones; Jonelle Ebanks with the flutes; and Cameron Gilson with the pianists.

"Zachary, Dequan, and Cameron are all past students of the Cayman Arts Festival music education programme and Jonelle from before CAF was established." McConvey said. "We are so proud to have our exceptionally talented young Caymanian musicians spearhead the teaching – they bring an unmatched enthusiasm to the programme."

Co-Founder and Artistic Director of Cayman Arts Festival Glen Inanga said the music camp was an opportunity for the student to get the students together and practice with their instruments over the summer break.

"It also enables our alumni to learn on the job and have the experience firsthand on what is involved in teaching the next generation."

The week culminated in a concert on Friday 8 August, which enabled the students to perform and share what they learned at the camp.

"The turnout was great," said McConvey. "We had parents, grandparents, siblings and well-wishers in attendance. There was overwhelming positive feedback as parents were very impressed at what the students achieved in the week."

As approved by the requisite majority of shareholders at the extraordinary general meeting convened on 8 August 2025, Cayman National was voluntarily delisted from the Cayman Islands Stock Exchange effective at the close of trading on 18 August 2025.

Ms. Janet Hislop, Chief Executive Officer of Cayman National and President of Cayman National Bank Ltd., com-



Three Persons Charged for Multiple Violent Robbery Incidents

Two men, both age 34, residing in Bodden Town and West Bay respectively, and one male juvenile, age 17, residing in George Town, have been arrested and formally charged in relation to multiple violent robbery incidents which oc-

cidents which occurred on 14 February 2025, in the George Town area.



Background

On 14 February, officers responded to multiple robbery incidents involving a group of masked men.

Shortly before 8:20PM officers responded to a report of a robbery at a barber shop on Eastern Avenue, near the intersection with School Road. It was reported that masked men entered the location, brandishing machetes and demanded cash from the occupants there. They fled the location with a quantity of cash and personal items, travelling in a small vehicle. One man received a minor injury during the incident, which did not require medical attention.

At about 8:40PM officers responded to a report of a robbery at a convenience store on Prospect Drive. It was reported that three masked men with machetes, entered the location and demanded cash. The men stole a quantity of cash from the register

and then fled the location. One man at the location was struck by a machete and received minor injuries. He was treated on the scene by EMS personnel.

Additionally, at about 7:25PM, officers responded to a report of an attempted robbery and wounding at an address on Holmes Turn, George Town. It was reported that a group of masked men with machetes had attended the location in a vehicle, and attacked a man there. They then ransacked the yard before leaving the location. The man received injuries to his hand and arm and attended the Cayman Islands Hospital for treatment. He has since been discharged.

The three have been charged with three counts each of Robbery, one count of Attempted Robbery, and one count of Wounding each.

They appeared in court on 5th August. The two men were remanded in custody, while the juvenile was granted bail, all pending a further appearance on 27 August.

The RCIPS once again expresses condolences to the family and friends of the deceased.



Cayman Islands Football Association CIFA Refereeing Department Report August 2024 - July 2025





Introduction

This report provides a summary of administrative and development activities of the CIFA Refereeing Department for the period August 2024 - July 2025.

Administrative

Prior to the commencement of the 2024 - 2025 football season, a meeting was convened with the referees and CIFA President Alfredo Whittaker, to discuss the proposed plans for the new season. Also, in attendance at the meeting was CIFA General Secretary Marcos Tinoco and CIFA Referee Committee Chairman Peterkin Berry. The main focus for the new season was improving the standard of officiating in all aspect. The Cayman Islands Football Association currently has 50 male, and 10 female registered active referees. The 2024 - 2025 football season (Senior Games) were officiated by 15 referees and 30 assistant referees.

FIFA Referee Kedeen Foster, Assistant Referees Kedlee Powell, Deean Foster and Dwight Cummings were all re-appointed by FIFA to the International Panel of match officials for 2025. Jonathon Hughes and Micheal Akangou were appointed by FIFA to the International Panel of match officials as new referees for 2025. Benjamin Whitty was reappointed by FIFA as VAR for 2025. Cayman Islands representation at the international level currently stands at six (6) match officials until 31st December 2025.

CIFA President Alfredo Whittaker and CI-FA's Football Executives are indeed proud of this accomplishment. Since 2017, when Alfredo Whittaker took over as President of the Member Association, he has been working assiduously with the CIFA Refereeing Department to focus on the development of young and talented referees to advance to the international level.

Training and Development

The key objectives of the CIFA Refereeing Department for the reporting period were as follows:

- a) To improve the quality of refereeing in the Cayman Islands
- b) To improve the fitness level of the local referees
- c) To focus on quality recruiting and developing younger referees
- d) To improve the standard of Referee Assessors to fully understand their role

In keeping with the development concepts of FIFA and the CONCACAF Refereeing Departments, CIFA's main goals are to improve the quality of refereeing in the Cayman Is-



lands and focus on succession planning by recruiting and developing younger referees to meet the demands of the modern game.


Conclusion





CPL thrills T20 fans again

The Caribbean Premier League is under way with cricket fans around the region enjoying spectacular T20 matches.

The tournament runs across the Caribbean with West Indies' players dominating rotas. It was launched in 2013 as the region's first commercial T20 league.

Jamaica Tallawahs beat Guyana Amazon Warriors to win the inaugural tournament and Saint Lucia Kings are the current champions, champions for the first time last year.

There are six teams involved in the 30 league matches running until September 14. Then comes a series of knockout games before the final on September 22. Group-stage matches are played at: Warner Park in St Kitts, Sir

Vivian Richards Stadium in Antigua, Daren Sammy National Cricket Stadium in St Lucia, Brian Lara Cricket Academy in Trinidad, Kensington Oval in Barbados and Providence Stadium in Guyana. Nicholas Pooran succeeded Ki-

eron Pollard as Trinbago Knight Riders' captain, taking over the role Pollard had held since 2019 - a tenure that included leading TKR to the 2020 CPL title. Pooran, 29, who retired from international cricket earlier this year, most recently captained MI New York to victory in Major League Cricket 2025.

The Antigua and Barbuda Falcons are captained by former Pakistan all-rounder Imad Wasim who was playing for Northern Superchargers in The Hundred before flying into the Caribbean to lead his side.

St Lucia Kings are led by David Wiese who has replaced last year's title-winning captain, Faf du Plessis, who initially chose to play in The Hundred but later withdrew from the competition due to groin surgery.

The Barbados Royals' captain is Rovman Powell who has transformed his team's fortunes, lifting them to a playoff spot last season. Though removed as West

Indies' T20I captain earlier this year, he has retained his franchise leadership role.

Jason Holder's appointment as the new captain of the St Kitts & Nevis Patriots follows the end of his 13-year association with the Barbados Royals. During his previous CPL tenure, which began in the inaugural 2013 season, Holder was part of two title-winning campaigns (2014 and 2019).

At 46, Imran Tahir continues to defy age. After leading the Guyana Amazon Warriors to their maiden CPL title in 2023, he followed it up with a runners-up finish in 2024.

The Royals play the Patriots on Friday and the Falcons take on the Warriors on Saturday. There are two matches on Sunday.

Cayman's flag teams can | Novice Itauma looks set focus on Olympic dreams

Flag football is one of the most popular sports played in the Cayman Islands so sports fans will be inspired by the fact that it will make its debut at the next Olympics

Mexico won their second straight World Games gold medal in women's flag football Saturday night, defeating Team USA in the championship game 26-21 on a buzzer-beating touchdown pass from Diana Flores to Victoria Chavez in Chengdu,

Flag football will debut at the Olympics in 2028, with speculation already building over which NFL players will suit up for the American men's team.

The women's final was a thriller. The two teams traded leads throughout, with Team USA scoring to take a 21-20 lead with just 28 seconds left. But the Americans were called for two penalties on Mexico's final drive to give Mexico 15 yards on a field that's only 50 yards long.

Mexico have now beaten Team USA in back-to-back World Games finals. The 2022 World Games championship in Birmingham wasn't even close winning 39-6.

Mexico were the best throughout, conceding just 78 points during the entire tournament, while Team USA allowed 77 just in the group stage. The two teams played three mutual opponents: Canada, China, and Italy. Team USA beat those teams by 56; Mexico beat them by 91.

Superior defence helped Canada beat Austria 38-20 to claim third place and their first piece of World Games hardware in flag football.

Moses Itauma is currently the most exciting fighter in world boxing. The 20-yearold heavyweight sensation issued his latest statement of intent, stopping Dillian Whyte in the first round of Saturday's main event in Saudi Arabia.

Unbeaten Itauma has made a rapid rise in the pro ranks. This was only the southpaw's 13th bout. Only two have lasted the distance. Itauma was born in Slovakia to a Slovakian mother and a Nigerian father. The family moved to England when he was three. A prodigy, he used to arrive still in his school uniform, aged 15, to spar with the likes of Anthony Joshua and Joe Joyce.

Whyte, 37, a former world title challenger, was expected to give him a stern test but the youngster's fast and precise punches meant he comprehensively overpowered the veteran in a couple of minutes.

It inspired former heavyweight world champion Tyson Fury to tip the youngster to beat the world's best. Every one of them.

Fury has backed Itauma to "wreck" Oleksandr Usyk and the rest of the world's top heavyweights. Fury said on his Instagram feed: "My opinion is not someone who doesn't know boxing. My opinion is someone who has been there and won every single belt. Won everything there is to win in boxing and done very well.

"Moses Itauma will wreck all them all old men out of the division. Usyk, AJ, Miller. Whoever there is that's old. Zhang, whoever else the f^{***} there is, Luis Ortiz. All these big names of the past.

"Even the man who took my belts. Usyk, Moses will wreck him because it's a young man versus an old man. And an old man can't mess with a young man."

Itauma is likely to have one more learning fight before challenging for a title. His chance to become champ may come if Usyk vacates his WBO belt instead of defending against mandatory challenger Joseph Park-

embody the innovation, sustainability, and resilience that will drive the continued growth of Cayman's agricultural sector."

Joining Minister Ebanks at the Agro Park launch were the Deputy Premier and Minister for Tourism & Trade, Hon. Gary Rutty, and the Minister for Youth, Sports, Culture & Heritage, Hon. Isaac Rankine, making this milestone a demonstration of whole-of-government collaboration to strengthen Cayman's food and nutrition security.


The remaining plots will be awarded in phases, with transparent processes and continuous monitoring to ensure fairness, accountability, and sustainability.






