'TAXING TIMES' AS THE UK SEEKS TO BRIDGE BUDGET GAP

The United Kingdom is embroiled in an all-consuming debate about taxes that resonates beyond the UK mainland, with potential implications for some of its Overseas Territories, particularly those receiving UK aid or likely to seek UK support.

Since coming into office last year, the current Labour Party government has made a top priority of tackling what it called an initial £22 billion blackhole in public finances, which it claimed it inherited from previous Conservative party administrations. This issue has been an abiding headline issue in political discourse and news headlines, and shows no signs of abating.

It is speculated that a slew of new and higher taxes, among them a hike in inheritance taxes, other wealth taxes and corporate taxation, are said to be under consideration alongside the government's oft-repeated pledges to grow the economy.

In its manifesto, Labour promised not to raise taxes such as income tax, VAT or national insurance on "working people" and ever since taking office in July 2024 has embarked on a campaign to plug the public finances blackhole, which is now reported to have ballooned to over £50 million.

"We inherited a £22 billion black hole in the public finances, and we set out the detail of that at the time of the Budget," UK Chancellor of the Exchequer/Minister of Finance Rachel Reeves reported to Parliament/House of Commons, in response to questions about the initial series of measures the government had implemented.

The next full UK Budget is due to be presented late October or early November 2025, with the exact date yet to be confirmed. A Spring Statement, which occurred on Wednesday, 26th March 2025, provided an economic forecast.

To date, among the revenue measures



taken have been an increase in several business-related taxes such as the basic rate capital gains tax on profits from selling shares, the share of national insurance paid by companies, and the tax paid by private equity managers on a share of profits from successful deals.

The government is also targeting what it described as "wealthy offshore non-compliance", estimated to be depriving the government coffers of around £100 million per year, to recoup an extra £500m over five years.

Higher charges for water, energy and council tax, coupled with tighter welfare policies accompanied by cuts to some government services, were the hallmarks of that presentation. The Chancellor also authorised more government borrowing for public sector investment, increased funding for the National Health Service and housing plan, as well as clearing the way to increase the defence budget. Increases to capital gains tax and private school fees, and the abolition of the controversial "non-dom" tax regime, have also featured prominently in the Labour government's budget decisions to date.

There have also been several relief measures on personal and business taxes aimed at stimulating economic growth.

But now, with the full annual budget statement looming, the UK government is grappling with further measures to tackle the deficit while seeking to get the economy moving at a time of global economic tensions mainly driven internationally by tariff wars, supply chain disruptions, and national issues.

Some specialist analysts and think tanks are also suggesting that Chancel-

lor Reeves might not have a choice other than to further increase taxes in the upcoming budget.

The influential National Institute of Economic and Social Research (NIESR) has already recommended "a moderate but sustained increase in taxes", including reform of the council tax system to make up the shortfall.

The independent NIESR also suggested the government could raise revenue through changes to the scope of value-added tax(VAT), pensions allowances and prolonging the freeze in income tax thresholds, which is set to end in 2028.

Meanwhile, in Cayman, the Pre-Election Economic and Financial Update (PREFU) released in April had cautioned about a deficit in the territory's public finances this year.

The PREFU had warned that "without corrective measures, projected deficits will persist in 2025 and 2026.

Some observers have privately speculated on the prospect of a rise in certain fees and duties, or the introduction of selected taxation to bridge the revenue gap and diversify the government's income sources beyond the heavy reliance on revenue from the financial services sector, tourism and construction. Stamp duty is currently paid at various rates on transfers of land/property and the execution of certain documents. There are no income or withholding taxes imposed on individuals in the Cayman Islands.

In its recent First 100 Days report, the government concluded that "deliberate actions were required, which include reviewing revenue enhancement measures and re-examining operating and capital expenditure plans to identify reductions."

Cayman Islands Launches 2025-2026 National Risk Assessment

The Cayman Islands has launched its 2025-2026 National Risk Assessment (NRA), a significant step in strengthening the country's framework against money laundering, terrorist financing, and proliferation financing. Importantly, completion of the NRA is also an integral part of preparation for the upcoming 5th Round CFATF Mutual Evaluation, currently scheduled for December 2027.

The NRA is an internationally recognised process that helps countries better understand and address financial crime risks. The findings are used to shape risk-based policies, guide regulatory and supervisory priorities, and ensure Cayman continues to meet the highest global standards.

"The NRA is an essential part of our national strategy to protect the Cayman

Islands' financial system and reputation," Premier and Minister for Financial Services and Commerce, the Hon. André Ebanks said. "It also reflects Cayman's continuing commitment to combating financial crime. By taking a rigorous, transparent, and inclusive approach, we are demonstrating our responsibility as a trusted global financial services centre of excellence and innovation."

The 2025-2026 NRA is being coordinated by the Office for Strategic Action on Illicit Finance (OSAIF), with participation from government agencies, regulators, and private sector stakeholders. Initial meetings were held this week to address the assessment methodology and the ongoing risk evaluations within certain sectors of financial services.

"The NRA gives us the evidence base we need to develop effective, risk-based policies," OSAIF Director Andrea Proctor said. "It brings together government, regulators, law enforcement partners, and industry to identify threats and vulnerabilities so that we can respond decisively. This is about ensuring both compliance and resilience, while showing international partners that Cayman takes its responsibilities seriously."

Next Steps

The NRA process will continue through the rest of the year and into 2026, with findings and recommendations published upon completion. Updates will be provided to stakeholders throughout the process.

ket for around KYD6.9 million, has been purchased by the National Coalition for Caymanians Administration (NCFC) for a reported KYD5.5 million.

Addressing the issue on the Radio Cayman talkshow For The Record with Orrett Connor on Monday (this edition guest-hosted by Dr. Steve McField and Dr. Theresa Pitcairn), Hon. Premier Andre Ebanks disclosed that one consideration for the acquisition was a United Nations guidance on how much green space a country should reserve.

Outline the possibilities for the location under government control, which could include a national park layout, the Premier welcomed the public's supportive feedback on the decision.

Stating that it fits into a balanced development outlook, he said: "The country is looking for a balance. The country knows

that it will have to enhance infrastructure and have the built environment, but I think they want it done in a way that takes account of preservation of land for Caymanians."

Meanwhile, in a post on social media, Hon. Minister for Planning, Lands, Agriculture, Housing and Infrastructure, Jay Ebanks, hailed the decision by stating: "One of Cayman Brac's landmarks has returned to its rightful owner, the Caymanian people."

The 125-acre property, which had been listed for sale by a real estate company and advertised as prime land with "immense potential" for development, had already been subdivided into 44 lots to capitalise on its market value.

In addition to its location as the highest point in the Cayman Islands, the area is also the site of the Cayman Brac lighthouse, a functioning navigational aid for maritime traffic in the area.

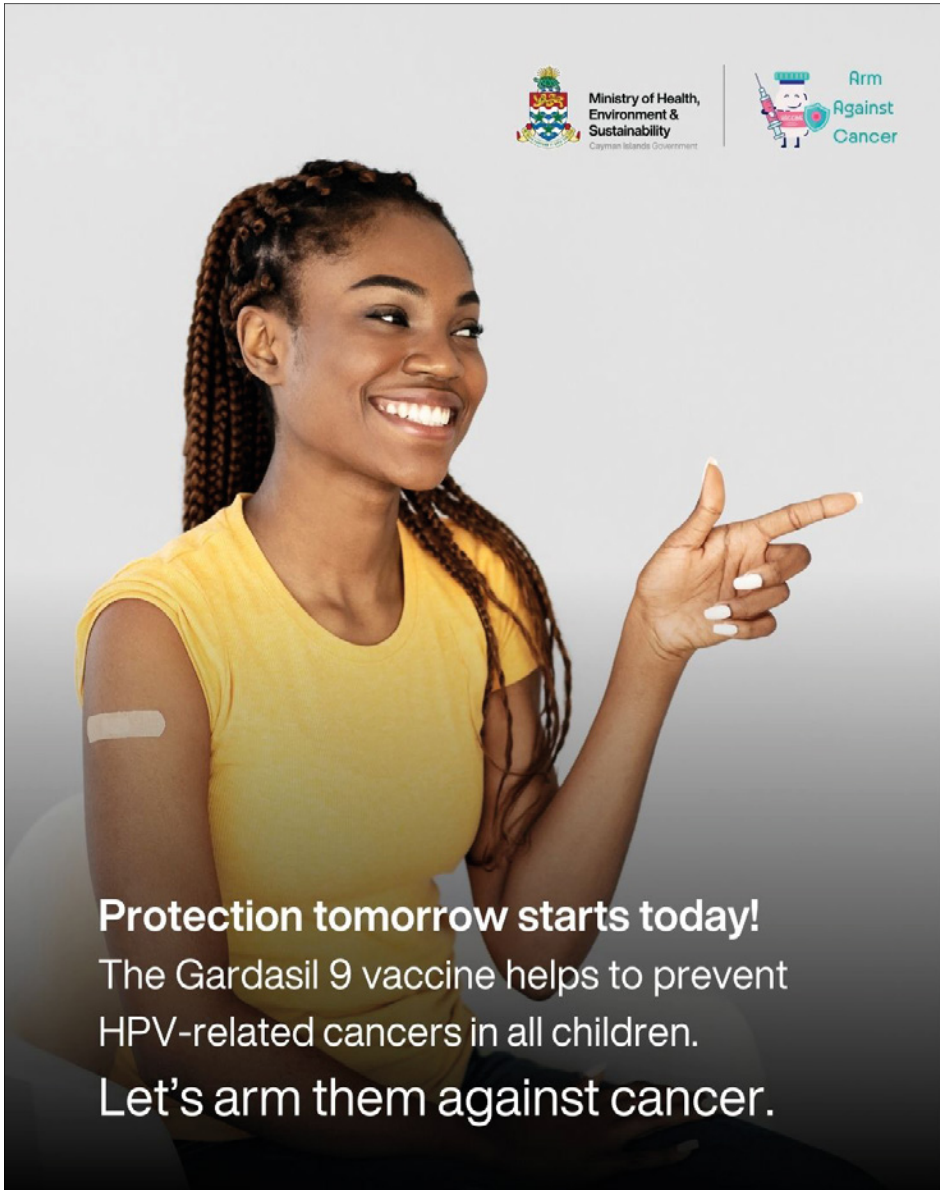

MHES and Partners Launch Annual HPV Vaccination Drive to Eliminate Cervical Cancer in the Cayman Islands



The Ministry of Health, Environment and Sustainability (MHES), the Public Health Department (PHD) and the Cayman Islands Cancer Society (CICS) are pleased to announce the expansion of what has become an annual HPV vaccination drive for school age children and young adults, ages 9-25, via not only the school vaccination programme but also a partnership with six private sector providers — Cayman Clinic, Doctor’s Hospital, Health City Cayman Islands, Integra Healthcare, Savannah Medical Centre and Seven Mile Medical Centre — to enhance access to this vaccine across our Islands.

HPV, or human papillomavirus, is a group of over 200 viruses, which can cause warts as well as various cancers, including but not limited to cervical cancer and some types of oral and throat cancers. “I am very pleased that our efforts to protect our children and young people against the threat of certain cancers is not only ongoing, but expanding,” explains Chief Nursing Officer, Mrs. Felicia McLean. “This year, HPV vaccines will be available free of cost not only from Public Health, but also from participating private sector providers who will be facilitating the administration of these vaccines to their patients and who will be hosting vaccination clinics of their own,” she adds.

While the school vaccination drive will begin in October 2025, participating private sector providers will be able to administer the vaccine as early as 1 September 2025.

“The school vaccination drive remains the same as last year,” Public Health’s School Health Coordinator, Nurse Carvell Bailey, explains. “Parents who wish to have their children vaccinated, and whose school has signed up for the programme, can request that the vaccine is administered at school by a School Health Nurse. To do this, parents must also complete the requisite consent order so that the vaccine can be administered at school.”

In addition to the school drive, Cayman Clinic, Doctors’ Hospital, Health City Cayman Islands, Integra Healthcare, Savannah Medical Clinic and Seven Mile Medical Clinic will also be facilitating access to this vaccine for free at their locations for children and youth ages 9-25. “We are grateful to our private sector partners for helping us to broaden the reach of this work by providing children, youth and their families with additional options of where to access this service,” states Chief Medical Officer, Dr. Nick Gent. “The Ministry will be providing these vaccines free of cost, so other private sector providers who are interested in assisting us and administering the HPV vaccine free of cost in their clinics can contact Ms. Taneil Lee at the Ministry on taneil.lee@gov.ky.”

Efforts to raise awareness and encourage the uptake of the HPV vaccine began in the 2010s by the Cayman Islands Cancer Society, working in partnership with the Public Health Department. “It is great to see how far this effort has come over the last 15 years,” explains Mr. Dave O’Driscoll,

Operations Manager for CICS. “The Cancer Society is thrilled to be able to support this important, life saving, initiative once again, and I sincerely hope that all persons who are eligible — especially parents who are making choices for their children — will take advantage of this opportunity and get vaccinated.”

“HPV vaccination is cancer prevention, plain and simple” states Hon. Katherine Ebanks-Wilks, Minister for Health, Environment and Sustainability. “It gives us an opportunity to be proactive in fighting cancer rather than being reactive. As Minister of Health, my aim is to strengthen our preventative measures in healthcare, ensuring we can prevent cancer diagnoses before they occur. We all understand that prevention is far better than cure, and I am hopeful that our community will support the efforts of all participating healthcare facilities to keep our children safe.”

“The Ministry of Health, Environment and Sustainability remains committed to improving the health of the people of our islands,” emphasises Acting Chief Officer, Mrs. Bobeth O’Garro. “This is one such initiative to maximise prevention across all of our islands. TURKS AND CAICOS IMPOSES LOCALISED LOCKDOWNS TO FIGHT CRIME

A second locality in the Turks and Caicos Islands (TCI) has been placed under a State of Emergency as the UK Overseas

Territory grapples with a serious crime wave.

Just a few weeks ago, TCI was rocked by its first mass shooting in which four people were killed, with several others injured.

At the core of the problem are gang conflicts linked to drug trafficking and illegal immigration, as well as a spate of street crimes and robberies.

In the latest measure aimed at clamping down on the crime surge,

Governor Dileeni Daniel-Selvaratnam has taken the extraordinary measure of placing the area called Five Cays in the capital Providenciales under a weeklong curfew initially from August 20th.

The area is regarded as a crime hotspot with the authorities saying the violence has escalated to the point where it poses a serious threat to national security.

The State of Emergency order restricts residents to “remain indoors during curfew hours unless commuting for essential work, seeking medical care, or carrying out other police-authorized activities.”

There’s also a 6 pm curfew on businesses operating in the area.

An accompanying statement from the Royal Turks and Caicos Islands Police Force (RT&CI) declared: “This measure is in direct response to recent incidents that have posed a threat to public safety and community stability [...] To ensure compliance and maintain public order, police checkpoints will be established throughout the area. Law enforcement presence will be significantly increased within the designated boundaries...”

It also warned that movement within the curfew zone is strictly prohibited during restricted hours, with exceptions for individuals commuting to and from work who show valid identification.

The Five Cays area state of emergency is the second localised shutdown of targeted areas in the TCI in recent times over crime.

Earlier in August, the area known as Blue Hills was placed under similar tight restrictions as the police-led anti-crime initiative, Operation Dragon, intensified.

Governor Dileeni Daniel-Selvaratnam stated: “The threats we face are real. I want to commend the community for standing

with our law enforcement agencies to ensure our islands remain safe. This is partnership in action.”

TCI Police Commissioner Fitz Bailey added that the curfew was proving effective in reducing risk and enabling law enforcement to carry out strategic operations with greater focus and control.

Government agencies have also posted videos showing the demolition of some illegally constructed neighbourhoods, some said to be breeding grounds for criminal activity.

The TCI has been receiving external expert advice and support from the UK with logistical support from the Cayman Islands.

The Royal Cayman Islands Police Service (RCIOPS) recently dispatched a helicopter and crew to bolster tactical operations, support border security and enhance TCI’s aerial surveillance capabilities.

“The deployment, which is funded by the Foreign Commonwealth and Development Office, supports our multi-agency efforts to tackle key threats, ensure public safety and protect our borders,” said a statement from the Cayman Islands Government (CIG).

The crime crisis in the Turks and Caicos Islands was also highlighted during a recent UK-organised international summit which examined the work of the government’s Joint Maritime Security Centre (JMSC).

“The JMSC is harnessing cutting-edge technology and capabilities to provide 24-hour monitoring of UK waters and ensure our borders are secure, by using satellite to provide a better overall understanding of incoming threats to the Turks and Caicos Islands,” a UK government statement outlined.

It said the British government is “working with our partners in Turks and Caicos to support and protect the Island from irregular migration.”

Locally, the TCI government this month imposed an immediate six-month moratorium on the issuance of first-time work permits to Haitians, citing escalating violence in Haiti and a huge rise in visa applications from Haitian nationals. The territory also has a huge Haitian population, aggravated by a continuing flow of illegal migrants from that country and reported crime links.

TCI Premier Charles Washington Misick stated: “In light of the ongoing escalation of violence in Haiti and the steady influx of work permit applications from that country, the Government will immediately implement a six-month moratorium on the issuance of first-time work permits to Haitian nationals and a six-month moratorium on visas that will take effect immediately.”

Meanwhile, the U.S. government has had a Level 2 travel advisory in place for Turks & Caicos for nearly three years due to high levels of crime.

Level 2 means travellers should “Exercise Increased Caution.” A Level 3 alert would advise reconsidering travel, while Level 4, the most serious, is a ‘Do not travel’ warning.

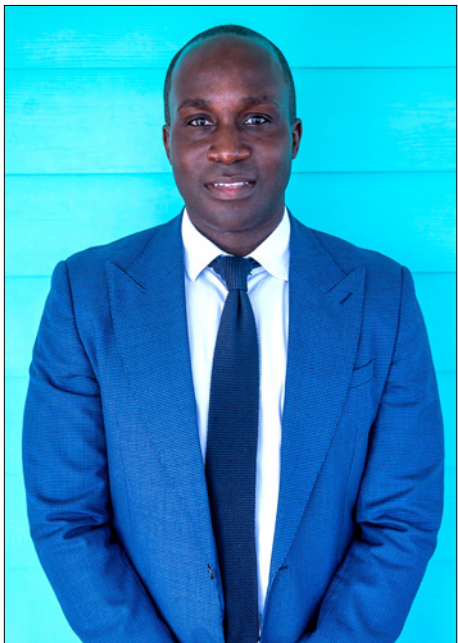

CIIPA Director speaks at regional CFATF training

Cayman Islands Institute of Professional Accountants (CIIPA) Director of Regulatory Affairs and Policy, Alfred Tweneboah, was invited to participate in a collaborative discussion at a recent Caribbean Financial Action Task Force (CFATF) training event in Trinidad and Tobago, focussed on the specific money-laundering & terrorist financing risks and vulnerabilities associated with firms of accountants in the Cayman Islands.

The two-day course was the inaugural CFATF training provided to supervisors of Designated Non-Financial Businesses and Professions (DNFBPs), which includes a wide range of sectors, such as casinos, lawyers, notaries and other independent legal practitioners and accountants, real estate agents and dealers in precious metals and stones. Tweneboah represented CIIPA and the Cayman Islands, joining other Cayman Islands and regional DNFBP supervisors.

“This was CFATF’s first DNFBP supervisor training and it was important to share

Cayman’s perspective and understand those of our peers in the region,” Tweneboah said. “CIIPA is unique in the region in being a self-regulatory body with AML supervisory responsibility, so there was much interest in our experience and approach.”

CIIPA is designated the Supervisory Authority for firms of accountants in the Cayman Islands. In this role, the Institute is responsible for monitoring and ensuring compliance with Cayman’s Anti-Money Laundering Regulations among firms of accountants conducting relevant financial business and adopts a risk-based approach to its supervision.

In his discussion, Tweneboah covered CIIPA’s supervisory strategies and discussed challenges in compliance, monitoring and enforcement as well as the use of technology.

He said, “Participants were particularly interested in how CIIPA engages with the private sector and our views on the use of third parties in supervision”.

“It’s vital for jurisdictions to share experiences and learn from each other,” he added.

“We’re all at different stages in the assessment cycle, but by coming together we strengthen AML/CFT efforts across the region. The goal is to ensure that, collectively, the region delivers on its global commitments and responsibilities.”

“Taking part in regional and international discussions is part of the Cayman Islands’ proactive and transparent approach that demonstrates

where we are today— not only complying with international standards but striving to anticipate the evolving global standards,” CIIPA Chief Executive Officer Sheree Ebanks said.

The invitation follows previous international engagements for CIIPA, including

Tweneboah’s participation in a panel discussion at the Financial Action Task Force Private Sector Collaborative Forum in Mumbai, India and Ebanks’ presentation at a recent Institute of Chartered Accountants of the Caribbean (ICAC) conference in Miami, Florida.

Police Investigate Armed Robbery in George Town

Shortly before 12:20PM on Saturday, 16 August, officers responded to a report of an armed robbery at a jewellery store on Albert Panton Street, George Town. It was reported that two masked men, one of whom was carrying what appeared to be a handgun, entered the store and made demands of the workers there. The men then made off in a vehicle with a quantity of jewellery and cash. No one was injured and no shots were fired during the incident.

Police made enquiries and subsequently located and recovered a vehicle which appeared to fit the description of the vehicle used by the suspects.

The suspect who was carrying the handgun is described as being tall and of slim build and was wearing a long-sleeved shirt, long pants and slippers, along with a mask and sunglasses.

The other suspect is described as being about 6" in height, of slim build and

was wearing a long-sleeved shirt, long pants and shoes. He was also wearing a dark-coloured head covering and a cloth over nose and mouth, but appeared to be of dark complexion.

Both men were dressed in neon orange construction type shirts and were wearing gloves.

The matter is currently under investigation and the public should be wary of any jewellery being offered for sale in questionable circumstances, or not through the usual retail sales channels, and avoid purchasing jewellery, or any other items, in such circumstances. Traffic Stop Leads to Recovery of Substantial Quantity of Ganja



Shortly after 9:40PM on Thursday night, 21 August, officers were conducting a vehicle checkpoint along Yacht Drive when they detected the strong scent of ganja coming from a vehicle which had just been stopped at the checkpoint. Officers conducted a search of the vehicle and its occupants, recovering multiple packets of suspected ganja. The occupants of the vehicle, a woman, age 22, and a man age 23, both residing

in West Bay, were taken into custody

Officers then conducted a search of their residence, and recovered a significant quantity of suspected ganja. Both the man and the woman, and another resident of the address, a woman age 54, were arrested on suspicion of possession of ganja and possession of ganja with intent to supply.

They remain in custody as investigations continue.

UPDATE: Men Charged for Importation of Illegal Drugs

The four men who were arrested following the interception of a vessel suspected of illicit activity on Thursday, 14 August, have now been formally charged.

Three of the men, ages 39, 45, and 64 of Jamaica, have been charged with Illegal Trafficking of Ganja, Possession of Ganja with Intent to Supply, and Conspiracy to Import Ganja.

The fourth man, age 38 of West Bay, has also been charged with the above offenses, as well as three counts each of Illegal Landing and Human Smuggling.

The men appeared in court on Monday, 18 August, and were remanded in custody, pending a further appearance on Wednesday, 20 August.



Police Advise of Phishing Text Message Claiming to be from Local Bank

The RCIPS Cyber Crime Unit has become aware of a phishing SMS text message circulating in the Cayman Islands purporting to be from Cayman National Bank. The SMS claims that the your bank account has been frozen due to unusual activity, and advises to click the link in order to regain access. This text is fraudulent and clicking the link can result in your personal information, including banking details, being

obtained by scammers.

If you receive an SMS text message from CNB, or any other bank, please check via phone call or other means if it is legitimate, and do not click on any links before doing so. Never provide any personal, banking or password details in response to such messages.

If you have clicked on any such links or provided personal information, contact your bank immediately.

HSA statement regarding criminal charge of former practitioner

The Health Services Authority (HSA) is aware of the 22 August 2025 criminal charge regarding a practitioner who previously worked at the Authority.

While we cannot comment on the matter, we wish to reassure the public that the HSA has and will continue to maintain strict requirements for all practitioners, including a compre-

hensive credentialing process, which includes independent verification of qualifications, licensing with the Cayman Islands Medical and Dental Council, and review by HSA's senior

medical staff before practicing at our facilities.
