

REMEMBERING HURRICANE IVAN

Considering the rather tranquil weather conditions currently gracing Cayman a hurricane might be the last thing on the minds of many residents.

It might be easy to forget that we are at the peak of the 2025 Atlantic hurricane season.

But embedded in the collective Caymanian memory are vivid recollections

of Hurricane Ivan of September 12th 2004.

On September 12th 2004 Hurricane Ivan brought its full Category 5 destructive force to bear on these islands.

In its wake, paradise was almost lost. But with true Caymanian courage paradise was regained and rebuilt from the over 2 billion dollars in direct property damage and over half a billion dollars to the economy caused by Hurricane Ivan.

Two people lost their lives.

Lessons have been learnt. Awareness has been heightened, the disaster preparedness and response systems upgraded, and Cayman is better placed to cope (we hope) - as evidenced from the seriousness that most people attach to

the hurricane season.

Some policies are unfortunately still lagging behind despite repeated ministerial pledges and political campaign promises to address them as matters of priority. Among those are upgrading the drainage system which quite literally strains to



cope, coastline encroachments to accommodate property developments, and threats to the natural barrier of the mangrove network.

But as we look around, its clear that Cayman has bounced back economically from the devastation of Hurricane Ivan.

The question is; although lessons have

clearly been learnt, are they all being aplowed are now indelible reminders and plied?

Awareness and preparedness for particular storms can only be as effective as the systems and processes in place to mitigate damage from adverse weather conditions, especially severe storms that venture into the local area.

Many who lived through the hours of horror of Hurricane Ivan and 'weathered' the deprivations of its aftermath will be reminiscing on that period.

Concerns over climate change and the vulnerability of low-lying islands such as the Cayman Islands make heightened awareness an even greater requirement for these islands.

TERRIBLE IVAN REMEMBERED

Hurricane Ivan was a "classical" long lived Cape Verde hurricane. It has been

categorized as one of the most powerful hurricanes to hit the Caribbean in recorded history. On September 2 Ivan developed into a tropical depression, it became a tropical storm on the following day and reached hurricane status on 5 September. On September 7 and 8 it damaged 90 percent of the homes in Grenada and killed 16 people. By Thursday morning on September 9, Ivan's sustained winds reached 160 mph making it a rare category 5 hurricane on the Saffir-Simpson scale. On September 11 Ivan began affecting the Sister islands of Cayman Brac and Little Cayman with tropical storm winds and Grand Cayman began experiencing tropical storm winds later that afternoon.

According to information from the National Weather Service the centre of Ivan was located 113 miles SE of Grand Cayman by 10 pm, and at that time hurricane-force winds of over 100 miles per hour were already being experienced on the island. At 5am on Sunday the storm surge from the North Sound was peaking at 10 feet (National Weather Service).

The hurricane made its closest approach at 10 am on Sunday when the eye passed 21 miles SW of the Grand Cayman with winds of 150 mph and gusts of 220 mph. As the storm continued on its track, storm surge and battering waves heavily affected the south coast of Grand Cayman.

Ivan was a slow moving hurricane which increased the exposure of the Island to hurricane force winds as well as increased the total amount of rain.

Hurricane Ivan took the lives of two persons on Grand Cayman and it temporarily displaced significant proportions of the population.

All persons experienced the loss of electricity, water and access to telecommunications for some period immediately following the disaster.

The three most affected districts were George Town, Bodden Town and East End. Together these three districts account for 75% of the total population on Grand Cayman. 402 people were treated for lacerations, wounds, removal of foreign bodies, fractures and burns as a result of the disaster. However, the general health and wellbeing of the population was good and was well maintained by dedicated health care professionals, first responders and the kindness of neighbours.

The total economic impact to the Cayman Islands was estimated by the United Nations ECLAC team to be 3.4 billion (183 % of GDP). Approximately 83% or 13,535 units of the total housing stock in Grand Cayman suffered some degree of damage. Dwellings which were situated on the seashore, in low lying, or swampy areas suffered the most severe damage. Older and less well-constructed housing was also severely affected.

Four per cent (4%) of homes that were affected were so severely damaged that they required complete reconstruction. 70%, or 9, 475, dwellings suffered severe damage which resulted from sea surge or damage caused by winds to roofs, windows and doors. The remaining 26% or 3,519 dwellings, suffered minor damage caused by partial roof removal, low levels of water inundation, or flying roofs and floating objects such as containers. The total financial effect on the housing sector was estimated at CI\$1,444,868,244. (1.4 billion) The financial effect on the finance (commerce) and tourism sectors were estimated at around CI\$ 460 million each.

Caribbean Haven Residential Centre announces community activities for Recovery Month 2025

In recognition of Recovery Month, Caribbean Haven Residential Centre (CHRC) is hosting a series of community events designed to encourage awareness of substance addiction and mental health and celebrate the hope and transformation of recovery.

Recovery Month, which started in 1989 in the United States, is celebrated in September and aims to tackle the stigma around addiction and mental health and promote the idea that recovery is possible. CHRC has been recognising the month for 16 years, and September's Recovery Month has become a focal-point of the centre's calendar.

The centre specialises in treating individuals who struggle with drug and alcohol addiction, many of whom also have co-occurring mental health concerns and complex histories of trauma. CHRC offers non-medical withdrawal management and long-term residential services for adults who wish to build a life where they no longer use substances.

This year's schedule offers the community a variety of activities that provide learning and education as well as community connection, giving, and plenty of family-friendly fun.

Kimberly Febres, Clinical Supervisor at the Caribbean Haven Residential Centre, said: "Recovery Month is an opportunity for us to engage with the wider community about the realities of addiction and the road to recovery. We know that when people are struggling to overcome addiction or a substance use disorder it can sometimes feel like a never-ending battle. CHRC provides therapeutic support all-year-round and through these Recovery Month events we encourage all members of the community to come out, ask questions and learn more about our services and the path to recovery."

A highlight of the calendar of events is the family fun day, on Saturday 27 September, at the Cayman Turtle Centre, West Bay, an all-day event where families and friends can gather to enjoy a day out, live music and food.

The month-long celebrations also provide the community with opportunities to support CHRC's work, as the centre's donation drive collects clothes and underwear, socks and flip flops, books, art supplies, reusable water bottles and hygiene items for service-users who arrive at the residential centre without basic supplies. Members of the CHRC staff will be receiving donations at 75 Fort Street and the Government Administration Building. Individual and corporate partners who wish to support the drive should contact 947-9992.

Caribbean Haven, which has been a centre of hope and recovery for the people of the Cayman Islands for over two decades, will also be celebrating its 25th Anniversary in November this year. CHRC was opened on 16 November 2000, by the Honourable Anthony Eden who was the Minister of Health at the time. Since opening, the centre's approach to treatment has been person-centred, inclusive, collaborative, and is driven by the client's readiness for change.

Judith Seymour, Director of the Department of Counselling Services, said: "Substance misuse and addiction continues to be a challenge in our community. More people are struggling with addiction and substance use disorders, and the stigma continues to hold some people back from seeking help. We believe that by sharing the stories of hope and transformation, it will encourage people to get help for themselves or a loved one. This centre has provided rehabilitation services to the people of the Cayman Islands for almost 25 years, and we have seen countless people come through the gates struggling to even hope that they can recover, and leave armed with the purpose, skills and abilities they need to be successful in their recovery."

Neyka Webster, Acting Chief Officer for the Ministry of Health, Environment and Sustainability, added: "The Ministry is pleased to support Caribbean Haven Residential Centre's Recovery Month events. The centre is an integral part of our mental health landscape and service provision, and while the road to recovery may be long, it is possible. We hope that this month, and beyond, people across our community — Caymanians and residents alike — that are dealing with substance misuse can reach out and get the help they need."

All donations from the events will go towards supporting the programmes and services of CHRC.





NEW TOP OFFICIAL FOR OVERSEAS TERRITORIES IN UK CABINET RESHUFFLE

A major upheaval at the top levels of the British government this past Friday has resulted in a new Foreign Secretary with direct portfolio responsibilities for Cayman and the other UK Overseas Territories (OTs).

Yvette Cooper, who was the Home Secretary, has replaced David Lammy, who has been appointed Deputy Prime Minister and Justice Secretary.

The wide-ranging Cabinet reshuffle announced by Prime Minister Sir Keir Starmer last Friday followed the sudden resignation of his Deputy Prime Minister Angela Rayner.

Ms Cooper will oversee the Foreign Commonwealth and Development Office(FCDO) which includes the OTs in its remit.

Stephen Doughty remains in place as Minister of State for the Overseas Territories, a vital point of contact between them and the Secretary of State. He will also continue to function as Minister of State for Europe and North America. Other changes within the department which

directly impact the OTs and the Caribbean include Baroness Jenny Chapman of Darlington as Minister of State for International Development, Latin America and the Caribbean.

With new Foreign Secretary Yvette Cooper settling into her first week in office, her intray for the Overseas Territories will be stacked with several common issues across the 14 territories spread across the globe. Among them is the matter of the enactment of UK legislation for Public Access to Registers of Beneficial Ownership(PARBO). Meant to counteract money laundering, tax evasion and terrorist financing, it has been a sore point between the UK as administering authority and several OTs, especially those with a financial services industry, over privacy issues

There are also specific issues regarding governance and constitutional reform - including matters surrounding self-determination and independence recently coming to the fore in some OTs.

Just days before Friday's dramatic Cabinet reshuffle, self-determination for the OTs was in focus during a UK Parliamentary hearing. Minister of State for the OTs, Stephen Doughty, was asked by Conservative Party Shadow Foreign Secretary Priti Patel about the continuing involvement of the United Nations Decolonisation Committee

She had asked specifically "if he will make it his policy to (a) reform and (b) abolish the UN Special Committee on Decolonisation."

Mr Doughty responded: "The Government believes the UN Special Committee on Decolonisation is outdated and no longer has a relevant role to play with respect to the UK Overseas Territories. For those Territories who wish it, the UK will continue to support requests for the removal of the Territory from the United Nations list of non-self-governing Territories and to support the right of the people of the Overseas Territories to address the UN Special Committee on Decolonisation directly."

The recent extensive Labour Party government Cabinet reshuffle was prompted by the sudden resignation of then Deputy Prime Minister and Secretary of State for Housing, Angela Rayner, under pressure over her property tax affairs. She was found to have violated the Ministerial Code by failing to make full declarations of her tax liabilities on her properties.

The issue, which had been the subject of widespread political debate and speculation in the preceding days, came to a head on Friday when Ms Rayner submitted her resignation to Prime Minister Sir Keir Starmer.

Canelo's legacy will rise

Boxing fans are salivating in anticipation of the year's biggest fight so far, sensationally billed as 'Fight of the Century'.

There is an old-school feel to Saturday's huge world super-middleweight unification clash between Mexico's Saul 'Canelo' Alvarez and unbeaten American Terence 'Bud' Crawford.

And it's in Las Vegas, a rarity nowadays considering how dominant Sun City for huge boxing bouts for decades. Super-fights in Vegas are a scarcity now with Riyadh in Saudi Arabia taking over as the epicentre of the boxing universe in recent years.

But this is an absolute blockbuster at the

Allegiant Stadium, with two of boxing's biggest names and 'pound-for-pound' megastars locking horns for the props (WBA belt notwithstanding) at 168lbs. It is live on Netflix.

Crawford has won all 41 bouts, including 31 by knockout. The Nebraska ace is a huge underdog for two main reasons; he is two weight division lighter and inactivity – he has only fought twice in two years.

Alvarez is the undisputed super-middleweight champion and holds a 63-2-2 record, with 39 knockout victories. He has won six consecutive bouts and his last loss was a unanimous decision to Dmitry Bivol three years ago.

Crawford, 37, won his first world title at lightweight (135lbs) in 2014. He is chasing history, but it's such a big ask. Canelo is an established champion at super-middle and naturally the far bigger and stronger fighter. He is also two years younger.

The old adage goes: 'A good big 'un beats a good little 'un' and the contrast in punching power and muscle mass may be significant. Nevertheless, Crawford is supremely confident, mainly because he is slightly taller and has a four-inch reach advantage. He has looked impressive in the gym, bulking up naturally.

Crawford supporters claim that Alvarez has been a pro since he was 15 and the cumulative effect of years of sparring and fighting must inevitably have taken a toll. But he has been far busier in the ring than Crawford, fighting as recently as a routine win in May.

It's still a compelling contest as it is so rare for legends to face each other. As far as Canelo is concerned, this match will confirm his dominance. Despite the hundreds of millions earned in a glittering career, the passion is still there to seal his legacy.

Jamaicans lead charge to upset champ Lyles

The World Athletics Championships get under way in Tokyo on Saturday, beginning nine days of captivating drama featuring the world's biggest track and field stars.

There are 147 medals to be awarded across 49 events in an action-packed schedule in the Japanese capital, with a total prize pot of \$8.5m on offer.

The men's and women's 100 metres are always the highlights of an athletics event. That happens over both days this weekend.

American Noah Lyles seeks a third consecutive global 100m title after following up world glory in Budapest with a dramatic Olympic gold at Paris 2024.

The 28-year-old Floridian edged out Jamaica's Kishane Thompson in the fastest race in history last summer but his season's best of 9.90 seconds ranks just 11th in the world this year. Thompson arrives as 2025's fastest man in 9.75, while fellow Jamaican Oblique Seville beat Lyles comprehensively in August. There will also be attention on Australian teenager Gout Gout, who has been likened to sprint icon Usain Bolt.

St Lucia's Olympic 100m champion Julien Alfred will target a sprint double in the absence of injured American 200m gold medallist Gabby Thomas - the only athlete able to deny her that achievement last summer.

American Sha'Carri Richardson will aim to retain her world title after taking Olympic silver, but it is Paris 2024 bronze

medallist Melissa Jefferson-Wooden who has been the standout performer this season. Not only has Jefferson-Wooden run an unmatched 10.65 seconds, but she also boasts five of the six fastest times this year - with her fourth-fastest tied with Alfred's best of 10.75 secs.

Great Britain's former world 200m champion Dina Asher-Smith, Daryl Neita and Amy Hunt will each hope to be in the medal mix, as will Jamaican legend Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce at her final major championship.

Allen's Buffalo charge caught out early fans

The NFL's week 1 most compelling match was definitely the Buffalo Bills producing a captivating comeback to stun the Baltimore Ravens on an epic opening Sunday.

Recent MVPs Josh Allen and Lamar Jackson exuded their brilliance to produce a classic that will be hard to top this season, with the Bills producing a stunning late rally to win 41-40 after looking destroyed in the fourth quarter.

Some fans had already left Highmark Stadium in Buffalo when the Bills trailed by 15 points in the fourth quarter, before Allen showed why he is the MVP by leading an exhilarating comeback.

Jackson earlier demonstrated why he is a two-time MVP by steering Baltimore into a healthy lead alongside Derrick

Henry, who charged to 169 yards and two rushing scores, only to then spill a crucial fumble.

Allen engineered 16 points in four minutes, capped by a 32-yard field goal as time expired by 41-year-old kicker Matt Prater, who only signed for the Bills on Thursday.

"Our team didn't quit. I think there's some people who left the stadium and that's OK, but have some faith next time," Allen told NBC.

Elsewhere, Aaron Rodgers and Micah Parsons enjoyed winning debuts for their new teams, the Pittsburgh Steelers and Green Bay Packers respectively, while the Indianapolis Colts ended the league's worst opening-day run with a stunning performance.
