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Caymanian physician completes Doctor of Medicine in Family Medicine

Balancing medical school, hospital shifts, motherhood, and personal loss, Caymanian physician Dr. Davina McCoy (BSc, BMedSci, MBBS, PGDip Family Medicine) persevered and successfully completed her Doctor of Medicine (DM) in Family Medicine through the University of the West Indies.

Dr. McCoy, who has served at the Cayman Islands Health Services Authority (HSA) for nearly a decade, currently works in the General Practice Clinic. She describes completing the programme as both “challenging and fulfilling,” having balanced the demanding roles of doctor, student, wife, and mother of four.

Her medical career began in 2015 after earning her MBBS at UWI's Mona Campus, followed by internships and senior house officer positions in Jamaica. She returned home in 2017 to serve within the Women's Health Department at HSA, gaining extensive experience in obstetrics, gynaecology, and family planning care. In April 2024, she transitioned into General Practice, pursuing her passion for Family Medicine.

“I loved my years in Women's Health, guiding patients through pregnancy, childbirth, and complex gynaecological challenges,” she said. “But I wanted to make an even broader impact by caring for patients across every stage of life, from infancy to old age. Family Med-

icine allows me to take a more holistic approach to healthcare while building long-term relationships with patients and families.”

The decision is a timely one as General Practice (GP) is one of the busiest outpatient services at HSA, recording 66,181 visits in 2024 across all district health centres, surpassing Urgent Care (30,466) and Dental (33,578). GP operates at four district health centres and the Smith Road Medical Centre on Grand Cayman, with additional coverage in

Cayman Brac and Little Cayman. To meet rising demand, HSA expanded GP hours and added physician clinic days in Bodden Town, East End, and North Side last year.

GP clinics are also the front line in managing chronic non-communicable diseases (NCDs), such as diabetes, hypertension, asthma, and heart disease. These conditions remain among the island's greatest health burdens and require continuous care. “More adults are living longer, but many are developing long-term health conditions that demand regular, ongoing support,” Dr. McCoy said. “This is where Family Medicine can really make a difference, focusing on prevention, continuity of care, and empowering patients to take control of their health.”

Her path to this achievement came with many challenges. Between 24-hour on-call shifts, long study nights, post-graduate exams, and raising four young children. She even navigated pregnancy during her final year of studies, all while coping with the loss of her grandmother and aunt to COVID-19. “There were moments of exhaustion, but my support system — my family, friends, and colleagues — carried me through,” she said. “Looking back, the journey taught me resilience, the importance of asking for help, and how to persevere while staying focused on the goal ahead.”

Her achievement also speaks to a

broader national need. Caymanians currently make up 52% of HSA's workforce (656 staff). Among clinical staff (physicians, nurses, pharmacists), Caymanians hold 306 positions compared to 535 held by non-Caymanians. Of the 18 GP physicians, 12 are Caymanians, now including Dr. McCoy.

“We are extremely proud to see Dr. McCoy join the ranks of our General Practice physicians,” said HSA's Chief Human Resources Officer, Samantha Bennett. “General Practice is one of the busiest and most fundamental services we provide. Our GP team demonstrates the impact Caymanians can make in frontline care, and we want to see even more Caymanians step into clinical roles like Dr. McCoy.”

Dr. McCoy also had words of encouragement for those interested in pursuing these roles. “A career in medicine is demanding, but it is also deeply purposeful and rewarding. Cayman needs homegrown medical professionals who understand our communities and culture, because that's invaluable in healthcare.”

Looking ahead, she sees Family Medicine as the foundation of Cayman's healthcare system. “With further investment, expanded services, and a stronger emphasis on prevention, we can help reduce chronic diseases and improve quality of life across the population,” she said.

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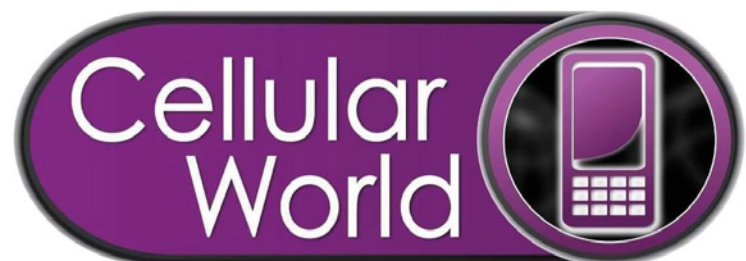

CDB CAUTIONS AGAINST OVER-RELIANCE ON TOURISM

In a message that would resonate with Cayman and other tourism-dependent countries in the Caribbean, the Acting Vice President of Corporate Services of the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) is urging against an over-reliance on the sector as an economic pillar.

In a keynote presentation at the recent Wider Caribbean Regional Risk Conference in Barbados, Ian Durant argued that an over-dependence presents serious risks given the regional tourism industry's vulnerability to external economic downturns.

"Our countries are small, open economies with no reserve currencies. The limited diversity in our export mix results in acute vulnerability. Moreover, the dependence on tourism, which is a very elastic product, deepens the troughs when they occur," he cautioned.

With tourism accounting for more than half of the foreign exchange earnings, the CDB top executive is urging the region to diversify into other growth sectors - a recommendation which Cayman's multi-faceted economic foundation is already well-advanced with financial services being a main economic driver.

Official figures show a close to 6.0 per cent increase (5.9%) in stayover visitors in Cayman from January to May



this year compared to the same period in 2024.

Despite growing concerns over the state and future of the cruise sector, especially in the aftermath of the referendum no-vote on a cruise pier, cruise numbers rose by 2.3 per cent in the first half of this year compared to 2024. However, while visitor numbers from some of the major cruise lines have increased, there has been a notable reduction in numbers from other companies that normally frequent the destination.

New Minister of Tourism, Hon. Gary Ruddy, has committed to developing what he has called "a comprehensive national cruise tourism strategy" with an interim framework expected to be outlined by the end of this year.

But the core message of the CDB Corpo-



rate Services lead will not have been lost on Cayman's government and tourism industry officials.

"We can diversify our economies and reduce risks if we are intentional about creating the ecosystems that would improve competitiveness and exploiting the full potential of the Caribbean Single Market and Economy," Mr Durant stated. Noting that "this will take some time," he however stressed that "if we are going to mitigate the constant risks thrown at us by the global economy, we must take these steps to diversify."

According to the CDB Acting Vice President of Corporate Services, enhanced farm extension services and sanitary and phytosanitary standards, improved transportation infrastructure and cold storage facilities, and modernised port operations are policy steps worth considering. He also suggested better access to credit for micro, small, and medium enterprises, streamlined regulatory processes, and strengthened business support organisations.

Food security plays a major role in the economic diversification being prescribed

by the regional development bank.

During a previous summit earlier this year, the CDB president Daniel Best, stressed the urgency of becoming climate resilient particularly given the vulnerability of tourism-dependent economies. Speaking in March, he stated then that the Bank would support plans for energy transition and food security in line with its climate change agenda. Safeguarding food security by reducing the dependence on imported foods with economic and health benefits is regarded as a region-wide priority.

"Supporting the energy transition is critical for us. We will focus on delivering reliable, sustainable energy to the region while prioritising energy access for underserved communities...We must also devote our attention to addressing food security. We saw first-hand during the COVID-19 pandemic the risk to food security as global supply chains were disrupted, but this is an issue that the region can address," Mr Best stated.

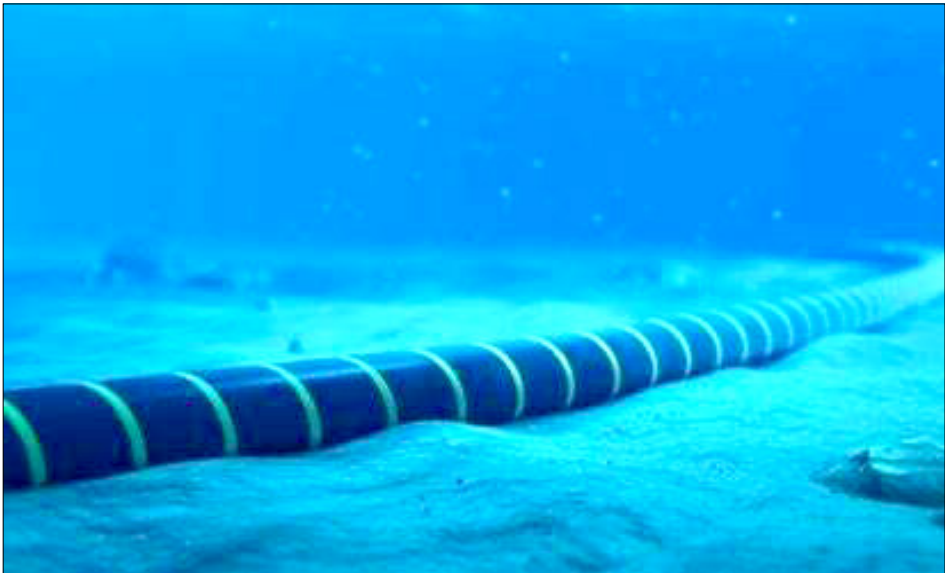

Government Moves Forward with Subsea Cable Modernization to Strengthen Cayman’s Connectivity

The Ministry of Planning, Lands, Agriculture, Housing & Infrastructure (MPLA-HI) is moving forward with a major infrastructure project to modernize the Cayman Islands’ subsea cable systems, a vital step in ensuring the Islands remain connected, competitive, and resilient in an increasingly digital world.

Subsea cables are the backbone of global communications, carrying more than 95% of the world’s internet and data traffic. The Cayman Islands currently rely on ageing systems that require upgrading to keep pace with global standards, safeguard against disruption, and provide the connectivity that Cayman’s residents, businesses, and institutions need to thrive.

The modernization project will ensure the Islands have **reliable, secure, and future-proof connectivity** – essential for education, health care, finance, tourism, and innovation. It also strengthens Cayman’s resilience in the event of natural disasters or emergencies when reliable communication is most critical.



Minister Ebanks: “An investment in Cayman’s future”

Minister for Planning, Lands, Agriculture, Housing & Infrastructure, the Hon. Johany “Jay” Ebanks, JP, MP, highlighted the national importance of the project,

“Modern and resilient connectivity is no longer a luxury – it is a necessity for Cayman. This project is about much more than faster internet. It is about protecting our Islands in times of crisis, supporting our businesses, and ensuring that every Caymanian

has access to opportunities in education, technology, and innovation. By modernizing our subsea cable infrastructure, we are investing directly in Cayman’s future prosperity and resilience.”

To illustrate the impact, the Minister added: *“Whether it’s a student studying overseas, a small business owner trading online, or a family staying in touch with loved ones abroad – every Caymanian depends on strong and reliable connections. The Ministry continues to work closely with international industry partners and local stakeholders to advance the project. Once completed, the upgraded subsea cable will ensure the Cayman Islands remain globally connected, regionally competitive, and nationally secure.

Police Investigate Shooting Incident in George Town

Shortly before 8:50PM on Tuesday 16 September, officers responded to a report of a shooting incident in the vicinity of School Road in George Town. Upon arrival they observed a man suffering from a single gunshot wound to the leg, with members of the public rendering assistance. Emergency services attended the location and the man was transported to

hospital for treatment for what appears to be a non-life-threatening injury.

Initial reports indicate that the man had been at a nearby location when he was approached by two masked men wearing dark clothes, who demanded money. One of the men was carrying a machete while the other was carrying a firearm. A struggle ensued between the men,

during which the firearm was discharged and the first man was shot. The two masked men then fled the location on foot.

The matter is currently under investigation by George Town CID and anyone who was in the School Road area between 8:00 and 9:00PM on Tuesday, 16 September, or has any information, is asked to contact 949-4222.

POMP, PAGEANTRY, POLITICS AND PROTEST DURING PRESIDENT TRUMP'S UK STATE VISIT



The UK rolled out the red carpet this week for an historic second state visit of US President Donald Trump. It was the first time that an American was treated to two state visits; this one at the special invitation of HRH King Charles III. The king's letter of invitation was hand-delivered to Mr Trump by the British Prime Minister Sir Keir Starmer during a visit to the White House in February this year.

The elaborate pomp and pageantry laid on for the presidential visit was also seen

as reaffirming UK-US relations along both diplomatic and trade lines.

New US investments were announced into the UK tech sector and the nuclear industry, while further discussions were aimed at reducing new US tariffs on exports from Britain to its largest trade partner.

On the diplomatic front, a packed agenda included how the two countries align on matters ranging from Russia's war on Ukraine, Israel in Gaza, relations with Chi-




na, NATO(North Atlantic Treaty Organisation), and the European Union(EU).

The high-profile visit was not without its moments of high political drama encompassing several controversial issues in the US and the UK. There were several demonstrations against President Trump over his global and domestic policies, his political ideology and worldview, as well as matters surrounding his social and

business dealings.

The American president was welcomed to the UK by the newly-appointed British Foreign Secretary, Yvette Cooper, who also has portfolio responsibility for Cayman and the other UK Overseas Territories. As an opposition MP she had harshly criticised Mr Trump during his first term for what she called his "aggressive misogyny" and "appalling behaviour."

The National Gallery of Cayman Islands is taking the 4th edition of the Cayman Islands Biennial to new horizons by inviting U.S.-based curators for their themed exhibition, Archipelago. This multi-sited exhibition represents the best submissions from Caymanian artists across all three islands and the Diaspora to showcase the breadth of diversity and creativity in this Caribbean country.

The Biennial runs October 2, 2025-February 18, 2026, with a Press/VIP Preview day on October 1, 2025 at the National Gallery and across several satellite spaces across Grand Cayman, Little Cayman, and Cayman Brac. These sites include the Cayman Islands

National Museum, Gram Bella's, the Mission House on Grand Cayman, the Little Cayman Museum, and Brac Heritage House. Admission is free to the public, as is the suite of programming that will animate the venues throughout the exhibition run.

Inspired by the scattered formation and relative isolation of islands, the theme Archipelago foregrounds the interplay of the individual and the collective, just as an archipelago is simultaneously a single conglomerate and a chain of several distinct land masses. The exhibition will be organised according to multiple subthemes for this interplay of individuals within/

against a collective. These include the 'Culture Shift' of heritage, memory, and belonging; 'Social Dynamics' shaped by communication, politics, and technology; and 'Ecological Legacies' as they pertain to preservation, sustainability, and environmental concerns.

This curated exhibition was juried from 165+ submissions by 100+ artists—a testament to the cultural growth since the first biennial in 2019, with 51 works by 41 artists. At the closing ceremony, artists

5 Sneaky Ways to Burn Calories at Work

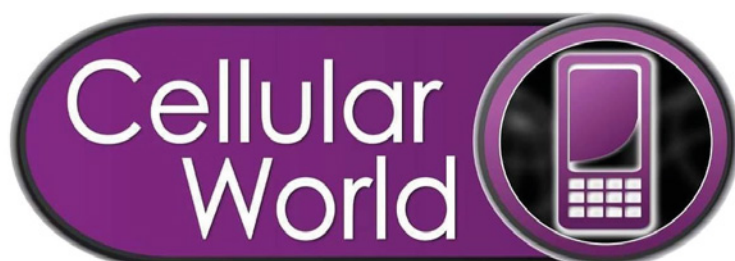
