The Ministry of Youth, Sports, Culture and Heritage has announced a landmark moment in the evolution of Cayman Carnival. After eight years of operating independently, the two major carnival organizations—Batabano and CayMas—have formally unified their carnival road marches and will move forward together

under the banner of One Carnival.

This historic reunification is the result of several months of constructive dialogue and negotiations, supported by input from multiple government departments and agencies. Through this collaborative process, Saturday, 23 May 2026, has been officially confirmed as the date for the

2026 Carnival Road March. The unified approach will also allow for one coordinated road closure, significantly reducing disruption to the public while delivering a seamless and enhanced carnival experience.

Caymanians to Receive Awards at Heroes Day



Several Caymanians whose vision, dedication and leadership have shaped the physical development and growth of the Cayman Islands will receive national recognition awards at the National Heroes Day ceremony, to be held on Monday, 26 January, 8:30 a.m. at Heroes Square, George Town in Grand Cayman.

This year's theme, "Honouring a Nation Built: The Power of Physical Infra-

structure" will recognise individuals and organisations whose work in developing the Islands' physical infrastructure, including roads, ports, airports, utilities and public buildings has had a lasting, transformative impact on the nation's growth, economic activity, social development and quality of life.

Her Excellency Governor Jane Owen, Premier Honourable André Ebanks,

Members of Cabinet, Parliamentarians, other senior government officials and uniformed groups will be in attendance at the event. Members of the public who are also invited to attend the ceremony are asked to be seated no later than 8:15 a.m. in advance of the parade. Given the formality of the occasion, they are also encouraged to wear appropriate formal attire, including closed footwear and clothing that covers the shoulders. Attendees are reminded not to cross the square or parade area during the ceremony.

A celebratory event for the awardees, families and the general public will be hosted by the Ministry of Youth, Sports, Culture and Heritage in the evening on Cardinall Avenue, starting at 4:00 p.m.

It will feature a vibrant programme with several local cultural groups and live performances, kids 'corner, fireworks, drone show and a variety of local cuisine for purchase.

Awards presented to Caymanians as part of the National Heroes Day ceremony was officially changed to national recognition awards last year. The name change aims to distinguish award recipients from those individuals bestowed with the title of national hero.





Q4 Stats Show Cayman's Captive Insurance Sector Ending 2025 with Sustained Growth

The Insurance Managers Association of Cayman (IMAC) has reported another strong overall performance in Cayman's captive insurance industry for 2025, following the release of the Q4 2025 licensing statistics by the Cayman Islands Monetary Authority (CIMA).

For Q4 2025, CIMA issued 10 new international insurer licenses, comprising of three B(i)s, four B(iii)s, one Class C and two Class D. This brings the total number of new international insurer licenses issued in 2025 to 42 for a second year in a row – continuing the record-high licensing trend within the past decade.

As of year-end 2025, Cayman is now

home to 720 Class B, C, and D insurance companies, writing \$51 billion in premiums and holding \$176 billion in total assets – representing a 24% and 15% increase respectively compared to 2024. This growth in new licenses throughout 2025 shows sustained market confidence, with strong activity anticipated to continue in 2026.

IMAC Chair James Trundle said, "Cayman's continued growth reflects the jurisdiction's robust regulatory framework, business friendly environment and depth of professional expertise. The collaborative and pragmatic approach taken by CIMA has been instrumental in supporting this momentum, and we are grateful for their ongoing

engagement and responsiveness within the industry."

Other 2025 statistics show that traditional single-parent captives licensed as Class B(i), spanning a wide range of industries, recorded a growth of 19 new licenses. Third-party writers licensed as B(iii) also saw an increase of 19 new licenses, which includes some reinsurance entities. Class C fully collateralised transactions added 2 new licenses, while 2 open market reinsures licensed as class D was also formed. The growth in reinsurance entities is expected to carry into 2026 and will be highlighted at the CIRCA ReConnect conference from April 16-17, 2026 at The Ritz-Carlton, Grand Cayman.

LifeLine Launches PulsePoint AED App to Map Every Rescue-Ready Defibrillator on Island



A local nonprofit is helping Cayman take a major step forward in public safety — one de-

fibrillator at a time.

LifeLine, the volunteer-run organization behind the island's

rescue-ready movement, has launched the PulsePoint AED app to help the public locate every

accessible and fully functional defibrillator across the islands.

The free app, now available on the Apple App Store and Google Play, displays a live map of rescue-ready AEDs that have been inspected and verified by LifeLine's volunteer network. Users can also submit new AED locations for verification through the app.

"The PulsePoint AED app makes lifesaving information instantly accessible," said Christina Kish, Director of LifeLine. "Every minute matters in a cardiac emergency, and now anyone in Cayman can quickly see where the nearest rescue-ready AED is located."

The app is easy to find — look for the yellow icon with a white

heart and lightning bolt labeled "PulsePoint AED" in the App Store or Google Play. It's free to

download and available to everyone.

Founded by a small group of community members, LifeLine has grown into a national network of volunteers who inspect, track, and maintain AEDs across Cayman. The charity also advocates for AED placement in public spaces, provides CPR awareness education, and works closely with local businesses, government agencies, and 911 to ensure the island is prepared to respond quickly in a cardiac emergency.

Each AED listed in the app has been checked for expired pads or batteries and verified as accessible to the public — meaning that when someone needs help, it's ready to save a life.

LifeLine is always looking for more volunteers to join its Life-Force network — local residents who help inspect AEDs and keep them rescue-ready. Volunteering requires just a few hours each month and can make a life-saving difference in your community.

Jamaica Launches First Ever Multidimensional Poverty Index with Support from the Caribbean Development Bank

The Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) in collaboration with the Planning Institute of Jamaica (PIOJ) and the Oxford Poverty and Human Development Initiative (OPHI), officially launched the country's first ever Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI) - a landmark tool that will transform how poverty is measured, understood, and addressed across the island.

The MPI provides a comprehensive picture of poverty by capturing not only what households earn and consume but also what they lack across dimensions including health, education, housing, access to services, employment security, and overall wellbeing. It complements traditional monetary poverty assessments and strengthens Jamaica's ability to implement targeted, evidence-based social and economic policies aligned with Vision 2030 Jamaica and the Sustainable Development Goals.

Development of the MPI was made possible through grant financing from CDB's Special Fund Resources (SFR) and technical support from the Bank's Enhanced Country Poverty Assessment (eCPA) Programme. The process drew on extensive collaboration among national stakeholders, technical experts, and development



partners. Through this initiative, Jamaica is positioned as a regional leader in adopting multidimensional approaches to poverty reduction.

Mr. Elbert Ellis, Portfolio Manager, Social Sector Division, CDB, emphasised the significance of the moment stating, "Today's launch is an important step forward in how Jamaica prepares interventions to address poverty. The Multidimensional Poverty Index offers a more holistic,

inclusive framework for understanding interconnected deprivations, transforming poverty data into actionable intelligence." He noted that the MPI will also enhance the country's capacity to design gender-responsive policies, as the tool enables sex-disaggregated analysis and highlights the different ways women, men, girls, and boys experience poverty.

Mr. Ellis also commended Jamaica for its strong leadership and stakeholder en-

agement throughout the process and added that the MPI, "stands as a strong example of how CDB's eCPA translates into country-owned, policy-relevant outcomes."

Dr. Wayne Henry, Director General, PIOJ, also underscored the importance of the MPI and the value it brings to Jamaica's development planning explaining, "From inadequate housing and sanitation to being unemployed or excluded from school, the Multidimensional Poverty Index captures these challenges and helps us to make better policy and programme decisions to eradicate them. It enhances our toolkit for planning and sharpens our ability to track development progress."

The launch comes as Jamaica continues to strengthen resilience in the wake of recent climate related shocks, including the impacts of Hurricane Melissa. The MPI will play a critical role in ensuring that recovery and reconstruction efforts respond effectively to the needs of vulnerable populations.

The Caribbean Development Bank reaffirmed its commitment to supporting Jamaica as it integrates the MPI into national policymaking and strengthens its social protection, human capital development, and climate resilience frameworks.

BVI AND USVI 'AT SEA' OVER YACHT CHARTER FEES

An international diplomatic row between the British Virgin Islands and the United States Virgin Islands has been escalated all the way up to the US White House and State Department.

At issue is a new fee structure imposed by the British Virgin Islands for foreign-registered charter vessels using its picturesque Sir Francis Drake Channel.

The expanse of sea located within the territorial boundaries of the BVI is a popular sailing area in the territory's archipelago.

The BVI government last year dramatically increased the fees from US\$800 to US\$24,000 per vessel for annual multi-night charter licences, with day trip fees rising from US\$200 to US\$8,500.

Additional customs and other related fees may incur an additional cost of US\$1,000 or more.

The resulting uproar by mainly charter operators in the neighbouring United States Virgin Islands forced a series of meetings between the local BVI and USVI governments.

No consensus was reached.

BVI Premier Dr Natalio Wheatley has defended his administra-



tion's decision to hike the fees. He told a sitting of the BVI House of Assembly that the decision to increase the fees, which have not been changed for decades, was based on a core principle.

"The government of the (British) Virgin Islands has both the right and responsibility to steward its natural resources in a manner that secures its territory's long-term economic future," he affirmed.

The BVI government has also made the assertion that, unlike its USVI neighbours which get standard specific funding support as a United States territory, it does not have that facility as a British Overseas Territory.

However, efforts to arrive at a mutually acceptable fee structure have so far proven futile, and last December the Governor of the USVI, Albert A. Bryan Jr., referred the issue to Washington.

In a letter addressed to US President Donald Trump and Secretary of State Marco Rubio, he complained of what he described as "economic exclusion" by his neighbours.

The yacht charter business in the waters of the British and United States Virgin Islands, especially the BVI's Sir Francis Drake Channel, is a major revenue earner for both territories.

The USVI government esti-

mates that the BVI action has already cost their territory over US\$14 million in lost revenue since it came into effect last year, with the knock-on effect on jobs and the wider economy.

As this is essentially a foreign affairs issue, despite the close geographical proximity and longstanding family and friendship ties between the two sets of islands, if the matter cannot be resolved locally, it requires the intervention of their respective administrative powers (the British and the United States governments).

BVI Premier Wheatley has doubled down on his position on the basis that his government has already made enough concessions.

"This administration is firmly committed to ensuring that it is governed responsibly, sustainably and in the best interest of the people of these Virgin Islands," he said in the BVI House of Assembly.

The vexing issue has already seen calls from the USVI Chamber of Commerce and charter industry representatives for the BVI to be slapped with reciprocal fees and even a counter-tariff.

US: Grenada has safety issues

Americans visiting Grenada are being warned by the United States Department of State to beware.

It has raised its safety category from Level 1 to 2 because of concerns that the island's crime level is now dangerous.

The advisory was issued on January 5, urging Americans to exercise increased

caution when visiting the island over its increased crime. The updated advisory warns that violent crime can occur anywhere on the Spice Island, with American citizens having been victims of armed robbery, assault, burglary, and rape. According to the State Department's advisory: "In some cases, American citizens have

been killed. Police response times are not as fast as one may expect in the United States. Do not answer your door at your hotel or residence unless you know who it is." Officials also warn travellers to avoid physically resisting any robbery attempt.

This is despite Grenada recently being recognised as one of the Caribbean's safest

destinations. The capital, St George's, is particularly popular. Around 16.8 million Americans visited the Caribbean in 2024.

The Level 2 advisory places Grenada in the "exercise increased caution" category, the second tier in the State Department's four-level system. The State Department advises travellers to keep a low profile, stay alert to their surroundings, and be cautious when walking or driving at night.

Grenada Tourism Authority CEO Stacey Liburd told USA TODAY: "Grenada remains open, safe and fully operational for travellers. Grenada has long been recognised as one of the most peaceful and welcoming destinations in the Caribbean, with a strong record of visitor safety, and we continue to welcome visitors without interruption." Liburd noted the State Department's advisory was precautionary and not a response to a specific incident or change in conditions.

The Grenadian government released a statement on social media emphasising the country's "strong record of public safety, social stability, and effective law enforcement", adding: "Grenada has long been home to a significant and vibrant population of United States citizens, many of whom live, work, study, and invest in our tri-island state. Additionally, hundreds of thousands of visitors travel to Grenada annually, enjoying our renowned hospitality, rich culture, and world-class tourism offerings."

Third World icon Coore was globally respected

Legendary Jamaican musician Stephen 'Cat' Coore is being mourned after passing away suddenly on Sunday.

Coore, 69, had for more than 50 years, been guitarist and cellist for iconic reggae band Third World. He played in the Cayman Islands several times.

Coore was a founding member and musical director of Third World, whose pio-

neering fusion of reggae, soul, funk, pop, and rock helped shape the reggae-fusion sound and propel Jamaican music globally. Under his musical leadership, Third World achieved international acclaim with enduring classics such as 'Now That We've Found Love', '96 Degrees in the Shade', and 'Try Jah Love', becoming one of Jamaica's longest-running and most successful bands.

Dominica announces gospel festival to boost economy

Dominica has launched its National Gospel Festival, 'Glory in Paradise' with the inaugural event next month.

The festival is on February 28 at Windsor Park Sports Stadium in Roseau. It will feature international, regional and local gospel artists, welcoming residents, visitors and members of the diaspora.

Cayman Islands referee panel grows as 2 officials earn FIFA appointments

The Cayman Islands has expanded its presence on the international football stage following FIFA's release of its 2026 International Referees List, with two new assistant referees added and a total of eight Cayman Islands-based officials now holding FIFA appointments.

It marks the most referees Cayman has had on the FIFA list at one time.

Kevon Harris and Anny Arriaga Zuniga have been appointed as FIFA assistant referees, increasing Cayman's representation on the global list for the upcoming cycle. Both joined the Cayman Islands Referee

Association in 2023 and will now be eligible for selection to FIFA-sanctioned international matches.

"It's an absolute pleasure to have been selected for another year on the FIFA list and to have two new additions within our small team fills me with a lot of joy and pride," said Whitty, who serves as CIFA's Competitions, Registrations and Club Licensing Officer in addition to serving as a match official.

Whitty, who retained his place on the FIFA list following a year that included officiating at the 2025 Concacaf Gold Cup and earning a spot on the preselection list for the FIFA World Cup 2026, said the new appointments reflect the strength of development pathways and the value of mentorship in Cayman.

"Becoming a FIFA Assistant Referee is a reward for my dedication, discipline, determination and sacrifice," said Harris,

who became interested in refereeing following his playing career. "It is an absolute honor to represent the Cayman Islands, and I vow to give this opportunity my very best. Stepping into the realm of elite referees comes with high expectations — expectations I fully intend to meet."

Zuniga's appointment represents an important milestone for women's officiating locally and regionally and she hopes her journey in the sport will inspire others.

"As a 35-year-old woman, I'm proud to show that women can be accomplished in football at every level," she said.

Cummings has served as a FIFA assistant referee since 2019.

"I am deeply passionate about contributing to the sport of football, and I am proud to represent the Cayman Islands on the international stage," Cummings said. "I congratulate all my colleagues who have maintained their badge and extend a special welcome to those who have made the FIFA panel for the first time."

With eight officials now on FIFA's International Referees List, Cayman continues to strengthen its footprint within regional and global football officiating.

was more than just a dinner—it was a journey back in time, a chance to relive memories, honor those who had passed, and rejoice in the enduring bonds of friendship.

The reunion had been planned for October of last year, but Hurricane Melissa forced a postponement. "This has been a long time coming," said Allison Bodden, "It's turned out really well. We have a Memorial Wall full of pictures of classmates who have passed away, and a display of items from the 70s—Sugar Daddy, Blow Pops—things that bring back so many fond memories."

That Memorial Wall stood outside the dining room, quietly commanding attention. It was both solemn and celebratory, a reminder of the 29 classmates who are no longer here, but whose presence was felt in every embrace, every laugh, every tear. Inside, the atmosphere was filled with chatter, hugs, and bursts of laughter as classmates reunited after decades apart.

The evening unfolded with live music from Burman Scott their melodies weaving seamlessly into the hum of conversation. Guests were invited to take the microphone, sharing stories that transported everyone back to their school days on Walkers Road, where the current John Gray High School now stands.

For Kathy Bodden, who was Kathy Ebanks back then, the memories were vivid. "We'd go to one classroom and it would already be occupied, or we'd go to another and there'd be no teacher. Some of us even had classes under the trees. But we made it—we survived—and we all graduated." She remembered the dedication of teachers like Mrs. Holts, their drama teacher for whom she and her cousin traveled from North Side on Saturday mornings.

Sherryl Miller echoed that sense of resilience and camaraderie. "We didn't have the kind of facilities you see today, but we were



like one big family." She recalled cooking classes with Mrs. Whitefield, lessons that stayed with her long after graduation.

The reunion was not only about classmates but also about honoring the educators who shaped their journey. Mr. Bland and Rev. John Gray were remembered as principals who guided the school through its formative years. Eight teachers joined the celebration, a testament to the enduring bonds between students and mentors.

Carla McLaughlin reflected on the scale of their class: "We had a class of 99 graduates back in 1975. We started in 1970, though not everyone finished. Tonight, we have 48 classmates and significant others here, along with eight of our teachers. We are ever so thankful to be able to celebrate 50 years since we graduated."

For many, the night was about reconnecting with people they hadn't seen since graduation. "It's nice to see classmates we haven't seen since we graduated," said Judy McTaggart, standing beside Susan Wilson. "We're celebrating life and looking forward to the rest of the evening."



Seahawks focus on Super Bowl

The NFL is down to its final four and the route to Super Bowl 60 now runs through Denver and Seattle.

The Denver Broncos and Seattle Seahawks will retain the home-field advan-

tage they earned as No.1 seeds in their respective conferences. The Broncos defeated the Buffalo Bills 33-30 in an overtime thriller, while the Seahawks destroyed the San Francisco 49ers 41-6.

Now the two favourites will try to hold off competition from their lower-seeded opponents in the AFC and NFC championship games

The Seahawks remain the Super Bowl

60 favourites partly because they have the best defense. Seahawks quarterback Sam Darnold is getting ready for the biggest game of his career against the Los Angeles Rams.

While Darnold has appeared in the Super Bowl before, he was a backup quarterback for the San Francisco 49ers. This weekend, he'll have a chance to start in the NFC Championship against the Rams, who eliminated him last year when he was with the Minnesota Vikings.

The Rams were able to survive freezing conditions in Chicago to earn a 20-17 overtime victory over the Bears on a game-winning kick by Harrison Mevis. Matthew Stafford had a mixed game in the cold but is still playing at an MVP level.

The New England Patriots defense has been dominant in the post-season. The Patriots held the Chargers to three points in the wild-card round before forcing the Texans into five turnovers in a 28-16 divisional-round win. But Drake Maye had four fumbles against Houston. He needs to improve against the Broncos who earned a narrow, overtime win over the Buffalo Bills to earn their first playoff win since Super Bowl 50.

It came at a cost, however, as Bo Nix's season was ended by an ankle injury. Denver will turn to Jarrett Stidham - who hasn't attempted a pass since 2023 - to lead it.

LeBron snubbed but may still earn All-Star inclusion

Los Angeles Lakers' LeBron James has been left out of an NBA All-Star game for the first since 2004, ending a record 21-year run as a starter.

James missed the 2025 NBA All-Star game due to foot and ankle injuries, marking the first time he had been selected but did not play at the event.

James, a four-time NBA champion and the league's all-time leading scorer, was unlikely to be voted a starter after a disrupted start to the season in which he was sidelined for the first 14 games with sciatica.

Despite the snub, James can still earn selection as a reserve. NBA coaches will determine the final seven players from each conference and their selections will

be revealed on February 1.

The All-Star Game this year marks the debut of the US v World format on February 15 at the home of the Los Angeles Clippers.

Five players from each conference were picked: Stephen Curry (Golden State), Luka Doncic (Lakers), Shai Gilgeous-Alexander (Oklahoma City), Nikola Jokic (Denver) and Victor Wembanyama (San Antonio) were selected from the Western Conference.

Giannis Antetokounmpo (Milwaukee), Jaylen Brown (Boston), Jalen Brunson (New York), Cade Cunningham (Detroit) and Tyrese Maxey (Philadelphia) will represent Eastern Conference.

AFCON hero Mane: I'll bow out after World Cup games

Sadio Mane wants to play in the 2026 World Cup with Senegal, then will retire from international football. The former Liverpool and Southampton star played a key role as Senegal won the Africa Cup of Nations with a 1-0 win over Morocco in an action-packed final.

The 33-year-old forward, who plays for Al-Nassr in Saudi Arabia, scored twice and had three assists in the tournament.

Sunday's final in Rabat descended into chaos when the hosts were awarded a penalty in the eighth minute of added time, just moments after Senegal had

been refused what looked like a legitimate goal with the score locked at 0-0.


Fuming Senegal boss Pape Thiaw ordered his players off the pitch, and action only resumed after Mane persuaded his teammates to return.

Real Madrid forward Brahim Diaz's weak Panenka penalty effort was easy for keeper Edouard Mendy, and Senegal claimed the AFCON crown for the second time courtesy of Pape Gueye's spectacular extra-time winner. Thiaw issued an apology for withdrawing the Senegal players from the pitch.


