MIA MOTTLEY WINS AGAIN

Prime Minister Mia Mottley and the Barbados Labour Party (BLP) have secured a historic third consecutive term, following a resounding victory in the general elections on Wednesday, February 11th.

Not only has Barbados's first female prime minister secured a third straight term for her party and government, but she also accomplished it in an unbroken third clean sweep.

The snap general election in Barbados, called a full year ahead of the constitutional end of the five-year governing period, again saw Mottley and the BLP snap up all 30 seats in the country's parliament.



"Our mission first and foremost is to stop poor people from being poor, and to remove injustice wherever it exists to create opportunities for people," the BL

Premier provides update on Cannabis Decriminalisation and Lottery Referendum

Having nearly completed its review into cannabis decriminalisation and establishing a national lottery, the Law Reform Commission will next develop a public consultation paper.

The consultation is expected to commence in mid-2026; and subject to consultation outcomes and resourcing, the final report is expected in Q4 2026, said the Premier, the Hon. André Ebanks MP.

He noted that the Commission's established law reform process involves research and analysis; publication of a discussion paper; public consultation; and a final report with recommendations. Where appropriate, the final report may include draft legislative amendments.

"In June 2025, shortly after the General Election, the NCFC Government asked the Law Reform Commission to provide its learned recommendations and guidance on these two matters; and I'm pleased to have received subsequent updates from the Law Reform Commission chair as to its members' work," the Premier said.

Regarding **decriminalisation of possessing and consuming small amounts of cannabis**, the Commission's initial work has focused on confirming the scope of the review, identifying relevant stakeholders, and preparing a comparative analysis of different regulatory approaches.

Following this, the Commission has ad-

vised that:

- a discussion paper is expected to be developed in early to mid-2026;
- public consultation is anticipated in mid-2026; and
- a final report is expected to be completed later in 2026, subject to consultation outcomes and resourcing.

For the **National Lottery**, the Commission is reviewing options, including

possible regulatory models, governance arrangements, safeguards and public-interest protections. This involves research into legislative and oversight models, market and economic considerations, harm-minimisation measures and integrity and enforcement frameworks.

The Commission has indicated that:

- research and preparation of a discussion paper will continue through mid-2026;

- public consultation is expected to occur in the middle of 2026; and

- a final report and recommendations are anticipated in late 2026 or early 2027.

Government referred both matters to the Law Reform Commission following the 30 April 2025 National Referendum, in which 55.64% of voters supported the decriminalisation of the consumption and possession of small amounts of cannabis; and 51.24% supported introducing a national lottery.

The Premier acknowledged the Commission's previous successful reviews, including its foundational work on the now-published Registered Land (Amendment) Bill 2026.

"Independent review processes are essential in ensuring that future policy decisions are informed by evidence, expert analysis and public input," he said. "The Law Reform Commission consults widely in performing its detailed work, and this Government will consider its recommendations once that process is complete."

The anticipated end date for the submission of the report on the decriminalisation of cannabis is October 2026 and January 2027 for the national lottery.

Further updates will be provided as the Law Reform Commission reaches key milestones, including the release of discussion papers and the opening of public consultation periods.

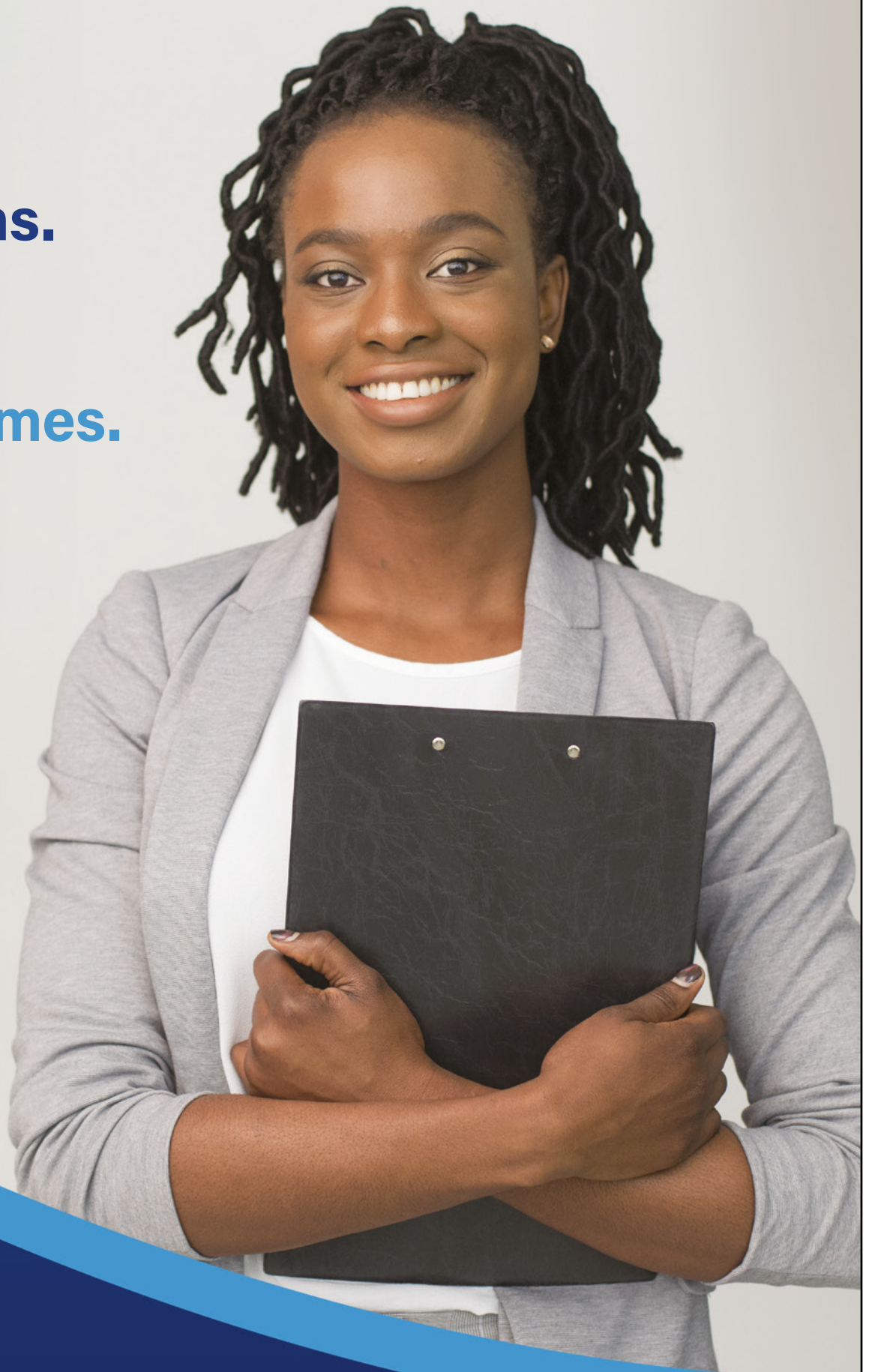

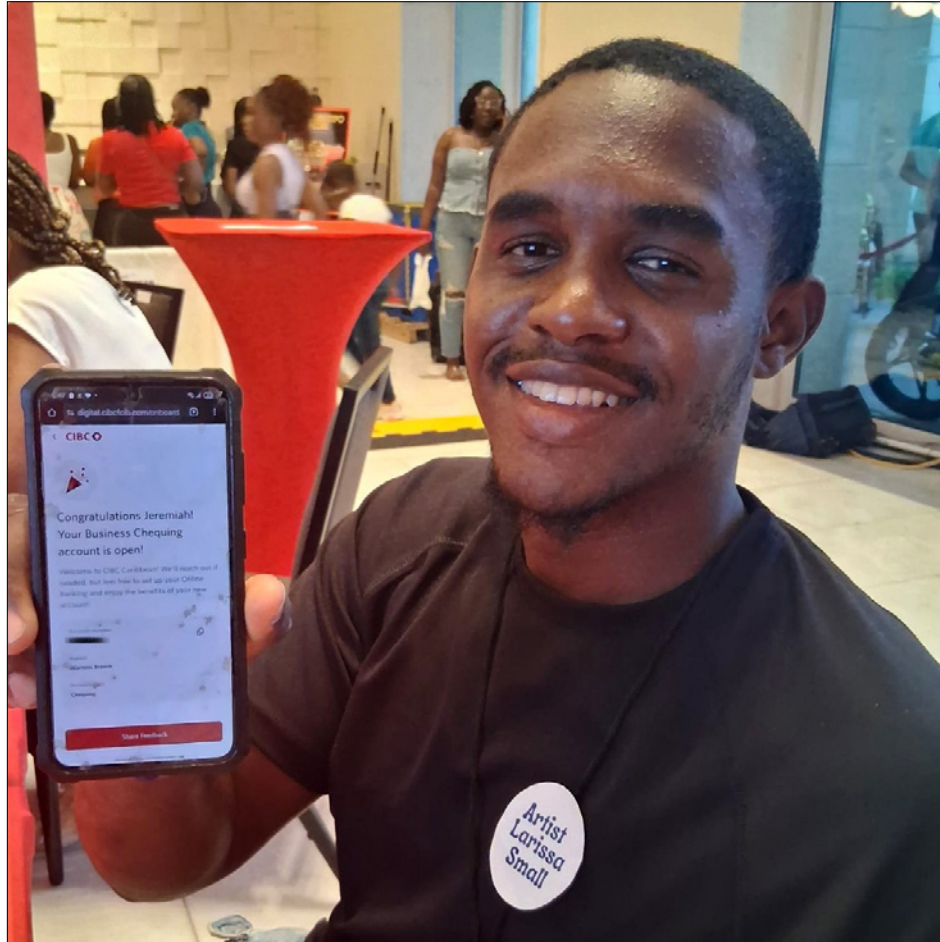

Cayman Islands Parliament Launches Commonwealth Women Parliamentarians Branch to Strengthen Women's Leadership

The House of Parliament proudly announces the official launch of its Commonwealth Women Parliamentarians (CWP) – Cayman Islands Branch, a critical step in strengthening women's leadership and gender-sensitive governance across the Cayman Islands and the wider Commonwealth.

The Commonwealth Women Parliamentarians (CWP) is a global network of women Members of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (CPA) Parliaments and Legislatures. The network works to build the capacity of women elected to Parliament, promote gender-inclusive legislative practices, and support parliament in becoming gender-sensitive institutions. It encourages the full and equal participation of women at all levels of political and parliamentary leadership.

The launch of the CWP Cayman Islands Branch on Friday, 6th March 2026, aligns with International Women's Day, celebrated globally under the 2026 theme "Give to Gain." The theme underscores the importance of collective action, shared responsibility, and inclusive leadership in accelerating progress toward gender equality — particularly within political and decision-making spaces.

In the spirit of Give to Gain, we recognise that inclusive leadership benefits not only women, but our democracy as a whole."

The importance of engaging men as allies in advancing women's political participation was also underscored, echoing the words of a Former Chairperson of Commonwealth Women Parliamentarians, who stated at the closing of the 2016 Africa Regional Conference in Tanzania: "One of the main challenges in all women's participation initiatives is raising the awareness of male party leaders about the need to increase women's political participation and leadership as both the right and politically advantageous thing to do."

The launch event will bring together parliamentarians, government officials, community leaders, and advocates to celebrate achievements, share insights, and chart future priorities for women's political engagement in the Cayman Islands.

The CWP Cayman Islands Branch will work in close collaboration with the wider CPA and CWP networks across the Commonwealth to deliver training, mentorship, and knowledge-sharing initiatives that support women in public service and legislative leadership.

Members of the public are advised that the portion of Fort Street in front of the Parliament Building will be closed from 1:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Friday, 6th March 2026, to facilitate the event. The Royal Cayman Islands Police Service will be on site to manage and divert traffic accordingly.

Consumer protection coming for Sister Islands energy users

The Utility Regulation and Competition Office (URCO) has recently published proposed amendments of Island Energy Limited's (IEL) Transmission and Distribution (T&D) Licence. The consultation period opened on 2 February 2026 and will close at 5:00pm on 16 February 2026. The proposed amendments have been published to allow IEL (which used to be known as Cayman Brac Power and Light) and anyone else interested to comment on proposed licence amendments.

The proposed amendments are intended to strengthen consumer protection in electricity services for Cayman Brac and Little Cayman, establishing clear rules governing how electricity charges are set and adjusted, providing consumers with greater transparency and predictability while ensuring the licensee can maintain reliable service delivery and improve efficiencies in energy production.

It is also intended that the amendments will allow IEL to move forward with planned investments in renewable energy infrastructure. By establishing a transparent and sustainable rate-setting mechanism, URCO aims to facilitate the transition toward cleaner energy sources while protecting consumers from unpredictable price fluctuations.

Included are provisions relating to the Rate Cap and Adjustment Mechanism (RCAM). The proposed RCAM would take effect from 1 January 2026, with annual rate adjustments requiring URCO approval



where necessary and linked to inflation and productivity factors, while incorporating safeguards based on the licensee's allowed return on rate base.

Base rates would be clearly defined and restructured to exclude fuel costs and government or regulatory charges, improving transparency for consumers. Customers will be able to see exactly what portion of their bill reflects the cost of electricity delivery versus pass-through costs beyond the utility's control.

Fuel costs and government and regulatory costs would be shown as separate line items on customer bills, supported by tracker accounts to ensure these costs

are passed through without financial gain by the licensee. This transparency measure protects consumers by ensuring they only pay actual costs without hidden markups.

Enhanced reporting obligations are proposed, including quarterly operational reporting and cost-of-service studies, alongside a five-year review of RCAM and rate design. These measures strengthen URCO's ability to monitor the utility's performance and protect consumer interests through evidence-based regulation.

URCO said it considers consultation to be a fundamental element of regulatory accountability and procedural fairness.

Consumer input is particularly important in ensuring that the proposed framework adequately protects residential and business customers while supporting the investment needed for reliable and sustainable electricity services.

Parties submitting confidential information are required to also provide a redacted version for the public record, together with reasons for confidentiality, in accordance with section 107 of the Utility Regulation and Competition Act. Requests for extensions must be submitted no less than four days before the consultation deadline and must include a full justification. Following consideration of submissions received, URCO will issue a Final Determination. If adopted, the amended T&D Licence will take effect upon approval by URCO's Board of Directors.

Police Investigate Fatal Stabbing in George Town

Police are investigating a fatal stabbing that took place during the early morning hours of Friday, 13 February, at the intersection of Mary Street and McField Lane in George Town.

Shortly after 4:00AM, the police responded to a report of a fight in progress involving multiple people at the location, and subsequently learned that two males had been transported to the hospital with stab wounds, via private vehicle.

Following their arrival at the hospital, one of the men was pronounced deceased by the attending doctor. The second male remains in hospital being treated for what are believed to be non-life-threatening injuries.

Two men, ages 19 and 24 and two women, ages 24 and 25, all residing in George Town, have since been arrested on suspicion of murder and affray in relation to the incident. They remain in custody pending further investigations.

The crime scene was cordoned and Mary Street, between Shedden Road and Fort Street, was closed to facilitate an active forensic examination of the area. The investigation into this incident is currently active and ongoing.



On Sunday Police confirmed the identity of the victim who was fatally stabbed during physical altercation on Friday 13 February, as Jahmoll Davonte Watson, age 20, of George Town.

The 42-year-old man who resides in West Bay and was arrested on Friday evening after surrendering to the CIDC has now been formally charged by the police with Murder, Wounding with Intent and Possession of an Offensive Weapon. The man remains in police custody and will

appear before the court on Monday 16 February, at 10AM.

The four others who were arrested throughout this investigation have since been bailed pending further investigation.

"Our condolences go out to the deceased's family, whom we are working with & supporting closely," says Detective Superintendent Peter Lansdown. "We are aware that a number of people were present during this affray and many left the scene before police arrived. We appeal for

these people to make themselves known to us and explain what happened. We have established methods of protecting witnesses if necessary."

Police are appealing to anyone who was in the area of Mary Street and McField Lane between 4:00AM and 4:30AM and who may have witnessed the incident or has information relevant to the investigation to contact the Major Incident Room at 649-2930.

"This investigation is progressing quickly and I would ask the public & persons involved to assist us & allow my detectives to take all necessary & appropriate actions to bring this matter to justice and protect the public," D/Supt. Lansdown adds. "I am aware that images of people potentially involved have been published in the media and would stress that doing so before official release by the police can cause families to become distressed and could adversely affect legal and possible identification procedures. Once again I would warn media & the public not to take such action."

The public is encouraged to share any relevant material directly with the police at the number provided above or anonymously by the means provided below.

PLAHI Opens Market Opportunity for New Submarine Cable Infrastructure

The Ministry of Planning, Lands, Agriculture, Housing & Infrastructure (PLAHI) today announced the launch of a Notice of Opportunity (NOO) for the Cayman Islands Submarine Cable Modernisation Project, a critical initiative aimed at strengthening the resilience, capacity and long-term security of the country's international telecommunications infrastructure.

The NOO is now live on the Cayman Islands Government's Bonfire procurement portal and invites suitably qualified international organisations and consortia to participate in the next stage of procurement for the development, construction, operation and commercialisation of new submarine fibre-optic cable connectivity serving the Cayman Islands.

The project will deliver additional international connectivity through a new submarine cable connection to Grand Cayman, with an option for an additional link between Cayman Brac and Grand Cayman. The investment is intended to enhance redundancy, improve resilience against outages, and support the continued growth of

the Islands' digital economy and critical national services.

Commenting on the launch, the Minister for Planning, Lands, Agriculture, Housing & Infrastructure, Hon. Johany "Jay" Ebanks, said:

"Resilient international connectivity is essential to the Cayman Islands' economic stability, national security and everyday life. This Notice of Opportunity represents a decisive step towards securing our digital future by attracting experienced global partners capable of delivering critical, long-term submarine cable infrastructure. We are seeking organisations with the technical expertise, commercial capability and financial strength to deliver this nationally significant project with confidence and at scale."

Under the NOO process, prospective bidders are required to demonstrate, on a pass/fail basis:

- Proven experience and capability in constructing and commercially operating submarine fibre-optic cable systems or international telecommunications networks, including sales and marketing, revenue assurance and financial control;
- A corporate structure that evidences the scale, strength and resources necessary to deliver a critical national infrastructure project with a high degree of confidence; and

• Completion of a Non-Disclosure Agreement (NDA).

Organisations that successfully meet the NOO requirements will be granted access to the subsequent Request for Proposals (RFP), which has already been prepared and will be made available immediately to qualified respondents.

The Cayman Islands Government does not intend to enter the telecommunications market directly. Instead, through PLAHI, it is seeking to partner with an experienced international wholesale operator and, in recognition of the strategic importance of the infrastructure, is prepared to offer a one-time grant subsidy as a financial incentive to support delivery of the project.

Interested parties are encouraged to review the NOO documentation carefully and submit their responses in accordance with the published requirements.

New committee to tackle mass migration

To deal with the threat of mass illegal migration into the Cayman Islands, the Mass Migration Committee (MMC) has been set up to support coordination and oversight of such an event.

Ten Cuban nationals arrived in Little Cayman on 1 February, taking the total number of Cuban migrants in Cayman up to 26, and government says it continues to monitor potential migration developments from Cuba and across the wider region, highlighting the need for a more coordinated approach.

Government says it is working with national, regional, and international partners to maintain a measured, responsible approach to border management and national preparedness and that while cross-agency intelligence did not indicate an immediate threat of mass migration, government's actions reflected prudent risk management and its long standing obligations to uphold public order, border integrity, and the safety and security of all three Cayman Islands.

The Minister for District Administration and Home Affairs Nickolas DaCosta said that the government's approach to irregular migration was grounded in lawful control, humanitarian duty of care, and national security considerations.

"Existing facilities, legal frameworks, and operational protocols remain the primary tools for managing any arrivals,



should they occur, and will continue to be applied in a structured and controlled manner," he confirmed.

The MMC had been established within the Ministry of District Administration & Home Affairs to ensure government readiness across relevant agencies in the event of a significant migration incident. The Committee brought together critical national agencies to provide strategic direction and to ensure that any response remained proportionate, legally compliant, and aligned with national priorities.

In the event of migrant arrivals, the Customs & Border Control Service (CBC), supported by the MMC and partner agencies, will activate established protocols. These protocols prioritise identity verification, medical and health screening, and security assessments, consistent with Cayman Islands law and applicable international standards.

Government confirmed that existing facilities would continue to be used as a response tool in the interest of applying the duty of care and upholding public order obligations. Any activation would be

short term, phased, and subject to strict operational controls, with utilisation determined solely by need and capacity at the relevant time, they said.

Following a recent escape by detainees, CBC Director Bruce Smith encouraged the public to "exercise increased vigilance, including securing homes, vehicles, and vessels, avoid leaving keys or valuables unattended, and promptly reporting any suspicious activity. While law enforcement continues to actively manage the situation, we all share responsibility for reducing obvious and preventable risks".

The government warned that a person who knowingly assists, harbours, or facilitates the illegal landing or residence of another is an offence. Under section 105 of the Customs and Border Control Act (2024 Revision), anyone who unlawfully lands, remains or resides in the Islands commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of CI\$20,000 and to imprisonment for five years.

In addition, anyone who assists or causes another to unlawfully land, remain or reside in the Islands commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of CI\$50,000.00 and to imprisonment for seven years. Additional consequences may include forfeiture of assets and other enforcement measures. Members of the public are encouraged to report any suspicious maritime or migration related activity to 911.

'DEEP' RESEARCH UNDERWAY INTO CAYMAN'S MARINE ENVIRONMENT

"An impressive sight in George Town this morning as the RRS James Cook arrived in our waters!" That's how a social media post from the Governor's Office (HE The Governor - Cayman Islands) exuberantly greeted the British research vessel as it docked in the George Town Harbour.

"We proudly waved off our eight Department of Environment experts as they joined this world-class research team," it further stated, listing the various globally recognised research agencies which use the ship as a lab for international maritime surveys.

They are: Centre for Environment, Fisheries and Aquaculture Science (Cefas), The Marine Management Organisation (MMO), British Antarctic Survey, Natural History Museum - London, UK Hydrographic Office and the UK's National Oceanography Centre.

The Cayman team, led by Kelly Forsythe of the Cayman Islands Department of En-



vironment, will participate in the exploration of the jurisdiction's offshore banks and deep-water environments. Specialist equipment include eDNA (environmental DNA) sampling, seafloor cameras, and

acoustics to map and assess our marine environment for conservation and sustainable management.

The RRS (Royal Research Ship) James Cook is one of the world's most advanced

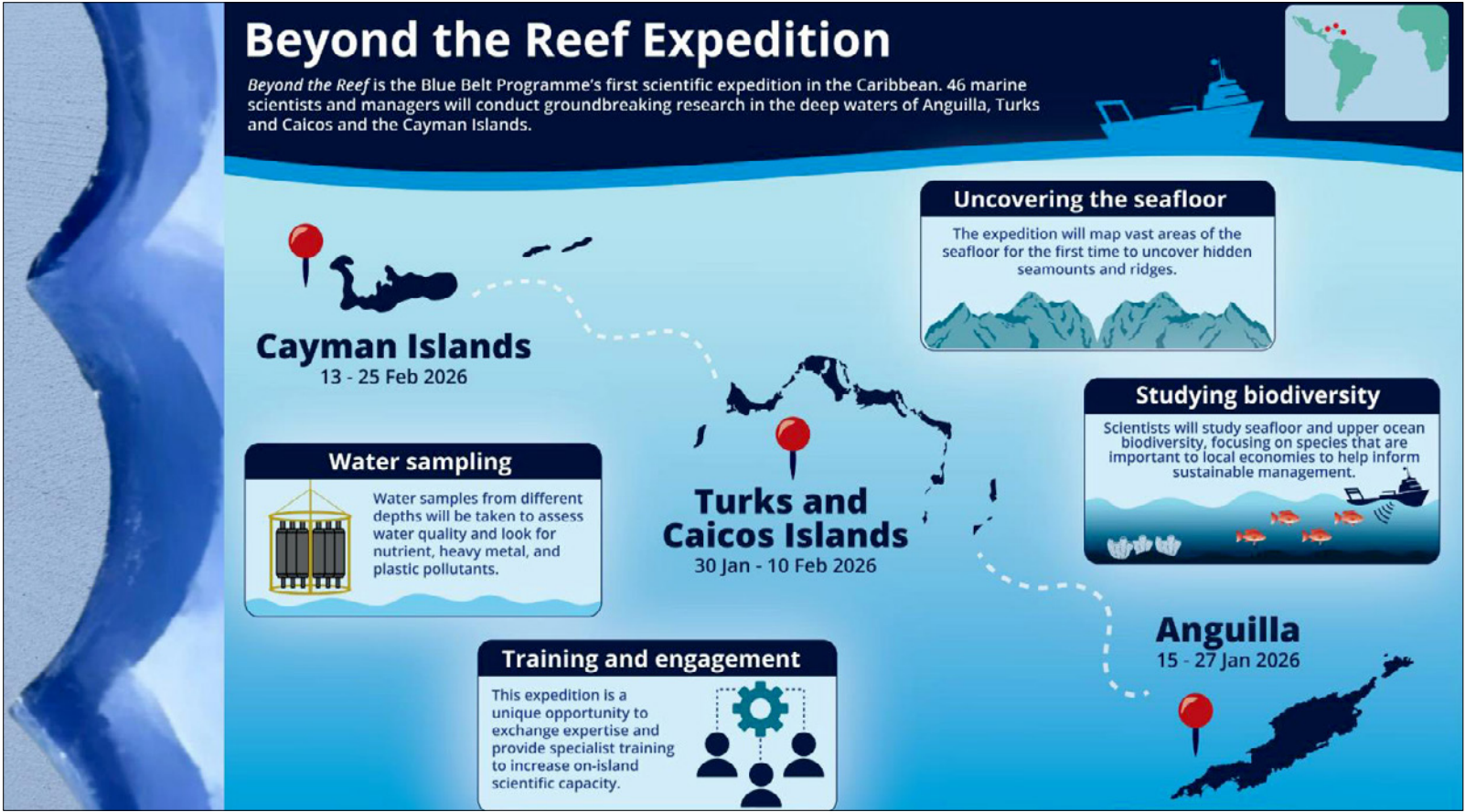
research ships, fitted with cutting-edge scientific instruments. It has been collecting vital data since setting sail on 13 January on a first-of-its-kind mission to explore uncharted waters across three Caribbean Overseas Territories: Anguilla, Turks and Caicos, and the Cayman Islands.

The expedition is part of the UK Blue Belt Programme's 'Beyond the Reef' survey, aiming to improve scientific understanding of the ocean and seabed across approximately 365,000 km² of UK Overseas Territory seas. The data collected will help fill critical knowledge gaps and support evidence-based decisions to strengthen marine protection, sustainable fisheries, and responses to threats, including climate change, over-fishing, and pollution.

A team of 44 world-leading scientists from the UK and UK Overseas Territories have joined forces for this mission. Nineteen scientists and marine managers from the Territories are working directly alongside their UK counterparts aboard the ship, promoting collaboration, knowledge exchange, and increased scientific capacity across the region.

The data collected in Cayman's waters - the last leg of the research tour - will provide the Department of Environment with robust scientific evidence to support sustainable management and targeted conservation efforts. It will also build local scientific capacity through hands-on training for Cayman's marine protection area managers.

The final port call will be at George Town on February 25th, when information will be presented about the findings to support local understanding of Cayman's unique and precious marine environment.

MIA MOTTLEY LEADS BARBADOS LABOUR PARTY TO A THIRD CLEAN SWEEP



leader and returning prime minister said in a victory speech on Wednesday night.

"We did not come simply to hold office. We have come to make Barbados better and to make your lives better," the victorious leader declared.

Tremendously popular on the international stage, Mottley has been a leading global voice speaking out on behalf of small island states - especially on climate change and environmental issues. However, targeting what they felt were weaknesses in her national policies, the main Opposition Democratic Labour Party (DLP) still failed to make a serious impact.

"People empowerment must come before international praise. Accountability and transparency must come before PR (public relations) and optics," said new DLP leader Ralph Thorne when Mottley

launched her third re-election bid on January 17th. He said his party has been in a process of regrouping and rebuilding following its humiliating defeat in the 2022 election.

With Mr Thorne, himself a former member of the BLP, failing to win a seat, it's back to the drawing board for the DLP as it again proved unable to improve its electoral prospects.

In addition to the historically main parties, the BLP and the DLP, eight other

political parties contested the election, fielding a total of 93 candidates. Three of the parties had joined forces: the United Progressive Party (UPP), the New National Party (NNP), and the Conservative Barbados Leadership Party (CBLP), formed a new coalition called the People's Coalition for Progress (PCP). They also failed to win a single seat among themselves.

One of the key cross-party concerns coming out of the 2026 election in Barbados is the historically low voter turnout, said to be around 30 per cent, down from 45 per cent in the previous poll in 2022, which was then the lowest on record.

With the electoral affirmation that it remains the dominant force in Barbados politics after last Wednesday's victory, the ruling BLP has already embarked on its growth and legislative agenda for its new term. It has indicated that one of its top priorities in this governing period - in addition to expanding its social and economic management policies - is to pass legislation which could initiate a dramatic shift in local politics.

The government has committed to tabling legislation - expected to easily pass given its overwhelming majority - stipulating that any member crossing the floor of the Barbados Parliament must first undergo a by-election.

In the last parliament, the current leader of the DLP, Ralph Thorne, who had campaigned with the BLP in 2022, crossed the floor in 2024 to sit as the sole Opposition member, arguing that a Parliament without an Opposition was undemocratic.

Thorne, who had started his political career as a member of the DLP, subsequently rejoined the party as its leader.
