## \$9 Million for UCCI Expansion

Education Minister Rolston Angling, who presided over the check handover, thanked his team in the Ministry and spoke about why the government felt this was an important investment to make at this time.

## CITIZENSHIP PROCESS CLARIFIED

One of the key issues coming out of last week's passage of the Immigration (Transition) (Amendment and Validation) Bill 2026 was the provision regularising the citizenship of some persons born in the Cayman Islands but whose immigration status has remained uncertain.

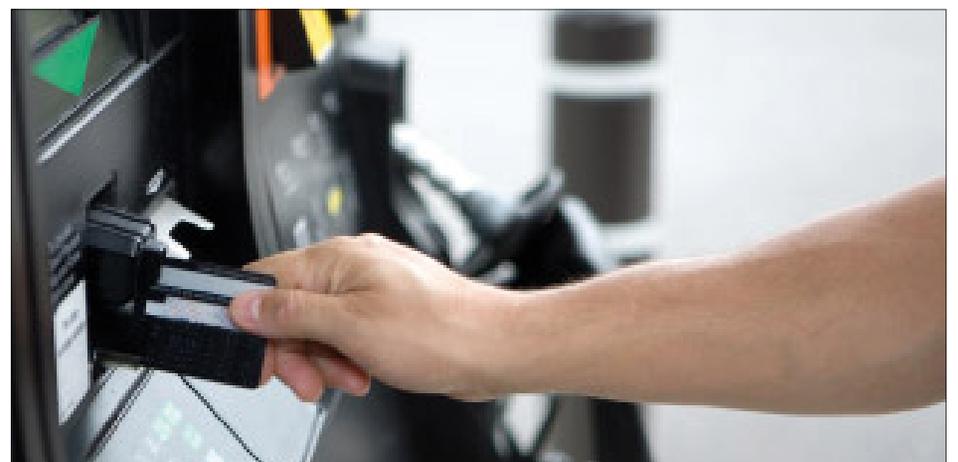
While much time was devoted to debating parliamentary processes to expedite the legislation as an urgent matter outside the standard time-frame, the sensitive status issue over-

shadowed many of the other issues raised.

As outlined by Hon. Minister for Immigration, Michael Myles of the National Coalition for Caymanians (NCFC) government, the March amendments, which come shortly after the previous changes to the law last December, contain critical amendments impacting the issue of citizenship.

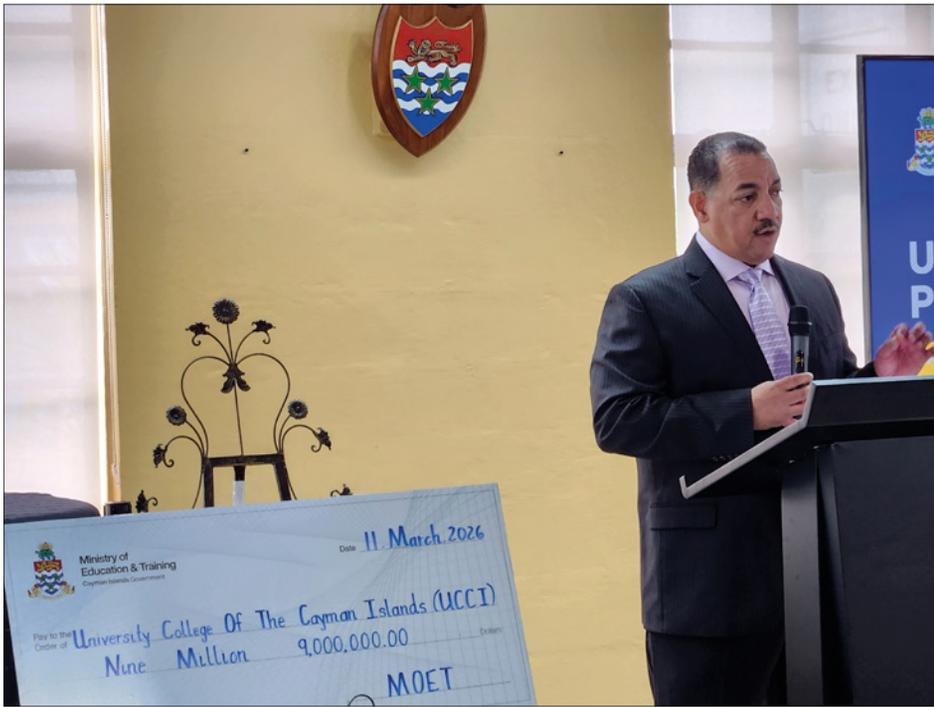
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# Government Invests CI\$9 Million in UCCI Expansion

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"Last year when we were coming toward the end of the financial year and saw that we would not be completing the Cayman Brac High School, the Ministry and the Government looked across all the interests for any strategically important initiatives/projects that ought to be contemplated," he remarked.

The Minister added that when he first took office he was briefed that UCCI had a master plan for expansion, which he saw as a strategic investment.

"We all know how important tertiary education is to our economy and we need to ensure that UCCI maintains and grows its position as a key partner

in up-skilling and having 'future ready' workers," he remarked.

"We have to make sure that we have those programmes to ensure that our workers are nimble, inquisitive, creative and can pivot as the economy develops very quickly," he added.

Mr. Anglin said sitting where he sits with the responsibility for education and economic development, he understands how closely aligned education and economic development are and explained that the vast majority of persons seeking education were doing so to secure better jobs and better pay.

He noted that as a country, the Cayman Islands has not paid enough attention to the interconnectedness between

education and economic development and added that he would be rolling out a Committee in the coming weeks that will develop a 20 year economic development strategy for the Cayman Islands.

"This is the part of the investment that we have to deliver as a part of that strategy," said the Minister, calling the capital investment in UCCI a 'ceremonial gesture'.

Chairman of the Board for UCCI, Mr. Gilbert McLean said, "For the first time in our history, this Minister, the Honourable Rolston Anglin has decided that he would specifically provide 9 million dollars to start the expansion of UCCI.

"The buildings on the campus are now over 50 years old and they have long become inadequate in terms of space and design. So what is happening today is quite a historic and momentous occasion and it will kickstart a move toward expanding the buildings on the campus and providing better facilities."

Mr. McLean added that a part of that would be access for persons with disabilities such as elevators and access ramps and noted that it would cost more than 9 million dollars for all of the upgrades, but the capital investment would be a great start and major help toward that.

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# CARIBBEAN UTILITIES COMPANY, LTD WELCOMES URCO'S APPROVAL OF THE CERTIFICATE OF NEED

Caribbean Utilities Company, Ltd. ("CUC" or the "Company") welcomes approval of the Certificate of Need ("CON") by the Utility Regulation and Competition Office ("URCO" or the "Regulator"), paving the way for increased generation capacity to support Grand Cayman's continued growth.

URCO has approved CUC's revised CON, submitted on February 10, 2026. The CON identifies Grand Cayman's future electricity needs, and establishes the requirements for the development of 94 megawatts ("MW") of additional generation capacity. The required capacity has been structured into three distinct capacity blocks, allowing for the participation of alternate generation technologies and resources in meeting the electricity generation needs.

Under its Transmission and Distribution licence, CUC is required to submit

a CON to the Regulator to outline projected electricity demand. Following this submission, the Regulator will launch a competitive procurement process to secure new generation resources needed to meet future demand.

CUC continues to make significant investments in the reliability and resilience of Grand Cayman's electricity system, investing as much as US\$100 million annually to serve the households, businesses, and communities that rely on it. Since 2020, these investments have contributed to a 50% reduction in outage time.

Electricity demand continues to increase on Grand Cayman, with a record peak load of 129.5MW being recorded on July 31, 2025. Meeting future demand will require timely increases in genera-

tion capacity to ensure adequate generation reserves, as required under CUC's licence, and to maintain a secure and reliable supply.

Mr Richard Hew, CUC President and CEO said:

"Energy is an essential service; the approval of the CON is an important step towards meeting Grand Cayman's growing electricity demand and providing a safe and reliable supply of electricity to the households and businesses we serve in the coming years."

## URCO confirms approval of Certificate of Need for launch of competitive process for new generation capacity

The Utility Regulation and Competition Office (URCO) has approved Caribbean Utilities Company, Ltd.'s (CUC) revised Certificate of Need (CON), confirming the need for additional generating capacity on Grand Cayman and enabling URCO to proceed to the next stage of a transparent, competitive solicitation process.

The CON is a procedural step required under CUC's Transmission and Distribution Licence and Main Agreement, and the Office's approval confirms that the submission now meets the requirements for a Certificate of Need, including identifying a total capacity need of approximately 94 MW and providing three years' advance notice of incremental capacity requirements.

URCO emphasises that the CON approval is not an endorsement of any specific project, configuration, commercial arrangement, or procurement approach. The Office's approval is limited to confirming the CON meets the required criteria so that URCO can initiate a transparent and competitive solicitation process and assess options through the appropriate regulatory steps.

This approach follows public and legal discussions last year regarding proposed capacity additions and reflects a reset agreed between the parties to ensure compliance with licence requirements and that the next phase is driven by an objective assessment of system needs and competition. The Office is focused on ensuring reliability for customers and maintaining an open pathway for new resilient, sustainable and cost effective capacity options.

"Reliable electricity is essential to every household and business, and our priority is keeping the lights on while



ensuring consumers receive value for money," said Sonji Myles, Interim Chief Executive Officer of URCO. "By confirming the capacity need and moving to a transparent solicitation process, we are creating space for a range of solutions, including new and emerging technologies, renewables, storage, efficiency and other lower cost options, provided they can meet our reliability and operational requirements."

Chairman J. Samuel Jackson added, "The Board's decision confirms that the Certificate of Need satisfies the requirements under the licence framework, including that the total capacity is clearly defined and that the licence requirement for giving three years' advanced notice of the anticipated capacity need is also complied with, ultimately enabling the Office to proceed with

a competitive process. At this stage, URCO is not selecting a specific proposal. We are confirming the system needs and setting the conditions for a fair, transparent process that supports competition and long-term resilience."

In its submission, CUC describes a range of considerations and alternatives, including demand side management, extending the life of existing units, utility-scale storage, distributed generation interconnections, and alternative fuel options, alongside reliability and delivery timeframes. URCO will revert separately with the design, timetable, and documentation for the competitive solicitation process arising from the CON.

The new capacity solicitation process timeline is set out in CUC's Licence. It is subject to reasonable delays and may also be affected by any legal challenge.

### Timeline

URCO receives Statements of Qualifications from prospective Bidders = 2 Months

URCO evaluates SOQs, determines Qualified Bidders and Issues RFP = 1 Month

Proposals Received = 4 Months

URCO Evaluates proposals and publishes ranking = 2 Months

CUC completes negotiations on Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) = 2 Months

URCO approves PPA and issues Generation Licence. Generation licensee begins construction = COD minus 2 years

Unit Testing = COD minus 1 month

Commercial Operation Date (COD) = immediately following completion of testing.

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# CITIZENSHIP PROCESS CLARIFIED IN UPDATED IMMIGRATION AMENDMENT

Stating that the new changes are “scheduled to go live on or around April 1st 2026”, Min. Myles added that “additional legislative considerations were the main drivers of the delay in implementation which are being addressed (in the amendments).”

According to the Immigration Minister, “The amendment does not open the gates to new applicants, nor does it broaden the criteria for who may apply. What it does - and only what it does - is to ensure that those persons who had already made an application at the time this amendment commences are properly afforded the benefit of the existing 15-year qualifying period rather than being inadvertently being swept into the new 20-year timeline. Mr Myles said it was a matter of fairness and honouring the reasonable expectations of those who had already lawfully set their foot upon the path.

In a statement published prior to last week’s meeting, the government had referred to the new ‘provision that ‘automatically deems persons to be Caymanian, without the need to apply to the Director of WORC, if they were born

in the Cayman Islands on or before 26 March 1977.”

What is widely regarded as a ‘vexing issue’ according to the statement, was reflected in the sitting meeting during which Hon. Premier Andre Ebanks stressed the need to bypass standard procedures given the urgency of the issue.

“We have over 1600 Caymanians who are in this bind. This is too urgent to delay,” he declared. “We have to get on with it...so let’s get done what we can and come back to scope the rest later. And for those in the House to try to complete this debate, I’ve already conferred with the Minister for Caymanian Employment (Myles). Let’s get on with it. Enough is enough.”

The Premier was responding to remarks by Hon. Deputy Leader of the Opposition, Kenneth Bryan, who had challenged the rapid pace at which the government was pushing through the additional changes.

“The resulting urgency that they call it, is not a product of external crisis. It is internal inefficiencies. If we allow preparation to constitute urgency, we are effectively granting the Executive the power to switch off the public scru-

tiny that is necessary whenever they find it more convenient for them. This is a very bad and potentially dangerous precedent being set,” Mr Bryan argued.

While the amendments were subsequently adopted in wide cross-party support, the debate reflected the depth of concern, as is evident in this snapshot of the impassioned submissions made during the debate.

Hon. Parliamentary Secretary Julie Hunter, MP for West Bay West: “The law must reflect reality, and the reality is that those born here during that constitutional period are Caymanian by right, not by discretion, not by favour, but by law...Certainty restores dignity, and that is one of the things that we are trying to do with this law; trying to restore the dignity to generational Caymanians who somehow feel that they don’t have a place in their own country. Some of us refer to them as ‘nowhererians.’”

Hon. Minister for Youth, Sports, Culture and Heritage, Social Development and Innovation, Isaac Rankine, has been at the forefront of an electronic identity card system, which also includes proof of Caymanian status. “I envision a Cayman where every child’s immigration status is confirmed at or shortly after birth. Where every Caymanian voter is recognised within immigration records; a single reliable source of truth on immigration statuses that supports government decision-making, and that no Caymanian is ever again required to

repeatedly prove that they belong in a country of their birth and in their heritage.”

Hon. Independent opposition MP for Bodden Town East, Dwayne Seymour, previously had to deal with the issue when he served as immigration minister: “Far, far too long to speak of, many Caymanians - who believe they are Caymanians - never had any rights in this country and couldn’t be confirmed as Caymanians. Considered as ghosts, as many have said. I am happy that finally, the NCFC could agree to move forward with this amendment and validation.”

Addressing the technical details of the amendment, Hon. Deputy Governor Franz Manderson, said the change was necessary as it provides overdue clarity. “I think the transitional provisions are correct. It is consistent with what we did with previous legislation. And it’s not opening the floodgates or making it easier. The people who put their applications in are simply being judged by the rules which were applicable at the time they submitted their application.”

Hon. Attorney General, Samuel Bulgin, summed up the objectives of the new amendment, saying: “What is being debated here is not creating any new rights. The law already says these people are entitled. What this piece of legislation is trying to do is remove what I call inconvenience.”

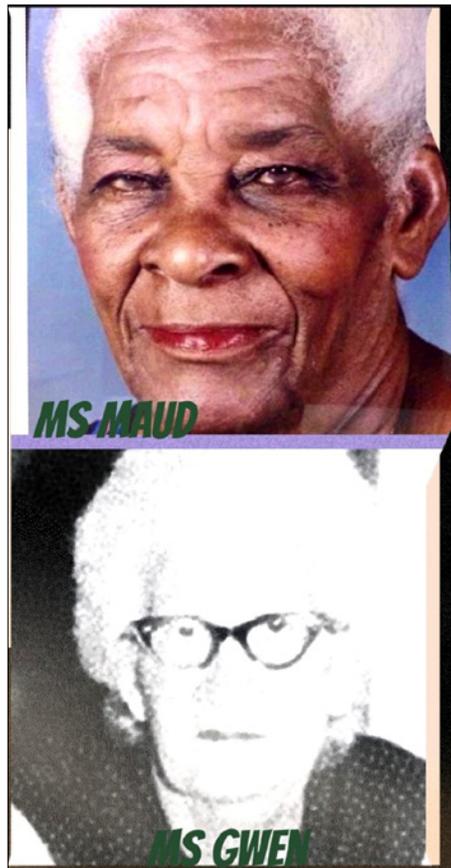
# From Cayman to Sea: Two Women Made It Possible

Both Ms. Maudie—my mother—and Ms. Gwen Bush together contributed to a change in history for Cayman and its remarkable seafarers. They have now passed on, and a new generation is in place, but today I want to remind us all of the importance of these two women to the Southwell years and to strengthening our seafarers' historical legacy. We must remember them because, together, they made such a difference—working with limited modern resources—giving our men a chance.

Today, as we remember them and etch them in our human memory, I ask that we look at both of them as masters of their craft and as nation builders. I invite our younger generations to learn about these Cayman Joans of Arc—together, though engaged in different jobs, they knew exactly what had to be done and did it with honour, helping our men and helping to build a wonderful country. Let us honour them today.

## What they did—side by side, equal in impact

- Ms. Gwen Bush
- Secured documents, arranged travel, and got men to their ships on time.



- Pedalling across George Town—often on her only transport, a bicycle—she carried documents and answers at all hours so men could meet their ships on time.
- Managed the unseen details—papers, dollars, coats for the cold, and urgent

passports before sunrise—so no voyage faltered for want of a plan.

- Became a trusted anchor for families, turning anxiety into order and forward motion.

- Ms. Maudie Seymour

- Stood steady in the clinic: guided checkups with dignity so fit men could travel safely.

- Tested their urine as part of the fitness checks, and in doing so became a beloved character—her firm standards and gentle humour creating moments the men still recount with a smile.

- When it seemed, some men might not be cleared to travel, she quietly guided the doctor with practical insight. He relied on her astuteness and often reminded the seafarers of her steadfast care—her extra efforts and genuine interest in them.

- Kept lines moving with care, encouraged hydration, and—customary for the time—recommended trusted over the counter remedies that helped them be ready to sail.

- Guarded the standard of fitness that protected our men and the reputation of Cayman's seafarers.

## Not one above the other

Too often, our stories elevate one and only mention the other. But the truth is simple: no seafarer could leave Cayman unless both women did their very different jobs exceptionally well. To our seafar-



ers—your courage at sea is unquestioned. This is simply the rest of the truth: many hands made those voyages possible, including these two steadfast women—equal in honour, shared in legacy.

## Closing

Together, they helped change the course of Cayman's history—building a fierce force of seafarers the world had never seen and, with the women and families at home, helping lift these Islands from a place that time forgot to one of the most advanced small nations in our hemisphere. Side by side, they opened the door from Cayman to the oceans, and to the future.

For our remembrance and our children's learning, let us etch them into our living memory as masters of their craft and as nation builders. May the new generation know their names, learn their example, and carry their standard.

The Utility Regulation and Competition Office (URCO) wish to address a message currently circulating which claims that retail fuel prices will increase to C1\$7.00 per gallon this week and urges motorists to rush to filling stations.

This information is not accurate and misleading.

While we do anticipate price increases soon there is currently no indication that retail fuel prices will increase to that drastic level in the immediate term. Consumers are encouraged to rely on official communications and reputable sources for accurate information and to avoid unnecessary panic buying.

International oil markets have experienced volatility following recent developments in the Middle East, and data reflects a continuing upward trend in prices over the past 3 months.

However, fuel pricing in the Cayman Islands is influenced generally by the cost of product at the time it is purchased and shipped to the country. Current pump prices reflect the cost of product already in supply. Recent deliveries received within the past week were purchased prior to the recent escalation, therefore any future adjustments resulting from new deliveries will reflect the gradual introduction of higher-cost product into the country.

Historically, changes in global oil prices take time to flow through the supply chain before affecting retail prices locally. Any future increases would be expected to occur gradually as higher-cost shipments

enter the market, rather than through a sudden and drastic adjustment. While further increases are anticipated to occur in the near term, and those increases are likely to be steeper due to the volatility in

the market, any adjustments will reflect actual replacement costs and normal market processes.

Fuel prices also differ between Grand Cayman and the Sister Islands due to additional transportation and distribution costs associated with supplying the smaller islands. However, even taking these factors into account, an abrupt increase to the level suggested in the circulating message is not anticipated in any of the Islands.

There is currently no shortage of fuel supply, and stations remain adequately stocked to meet normal consumer demand.

We are actively monitoring wholesale and retail fuel prices across all Islands and tracking market conditions closely and warn that any increases that appear inconsistent with underlying supply costs, normal distribution factors, or established pricing practices will be subject to regulatory intervention.

While we do not control the global price of oil, we remain committed to protecting consumers and ensuring that fuel pricing across the Cayman Islands remains fair, transparent, and reflective of actual market conditions.

# Minds Inspired robotics competitions inspire Cayman's next generation of innovators

A weekend of innovation, teamwork and technical creativity highlighted the growing impact of robotics education in the Cayman Islands, as the Dart Minds Inspired programme hosted two interschool competitions that brought together more than 160 students from 19 public and private schools across the islands.

The inaugural VEX IQ Mix & Match Junior Interschool Robotics Competition on 27 February welcomed 79 students under the age of 15 from 11 schools. Designed to introduce younger students to robotics and engineering concepts, the event challenged participants to design, build and operate VEX IQ robots while collaborating with peers from other schools.

The momentum continued Saturday, 28 February with the 8th annual Minds Inspired FIRST Tech Challenge, the programme's flagship robotics event. This year's competition featured 86 students operating 14 advanced competition robots from eight public and private schools.

The 2026 challenge theme, DECODE, required teams to engineer robots capable of launching balls – referred to as “artifacts” –

as part of the competition mission.

This allowed students to experience the complete engineering design cycle: identifying problems, defining constraints, prototyping solutions, testing and refining their robots through repeated experimentation. The challenge emphasised perseverance and resilience – lifelong skills that can be transferred in any area of a person's life – as teams learned from both successes and setbacks.

The competitions continue to expand and enhance access to STEM education and encourage students to pursue careers in science, technology, engineering and mathematics by providing opportunities for students to explore engineering, programming and collaborative problem-solving through hands-on application.

The addition of the junior competition represented a significant milestone for the VEX IQ robotics programme, which launched in 2024 as a pilot with five schools following a US\$50,000 investment by Dart. In just one year, the programme has more than doubled its reach

Glenda McTaggart, senior manager of ed-

ucation programmes at Dart, said the continued growth of the robotics programme demonstrates the strong interest in STEM among Cayman's youth.

“This has been an exceptional year for the Minds Inspired Robotics Programme, marked by the successful launch of the junior competition. The rapid growth of the programme reflects a broader commitment to introducing STEM learning earlier in students' educational journeys and creating opportunities for hands-on, collaborative problem-solving. We are proud to see how it continues to inspire students, strengthen STEM education and foster the next generation of innovators,” McTaggart said.

“Robotics is a really fun sport. It's not just about coding and competing,” said Dezira Tatum of Grace Christian Academy, who competed for her second time this year. “It helps with critical thinking, collaborating, building friendships and making connections for future jobs.” Tatum also shared she'd like to see more girls in STEM. “You never know if you're going to be good at it until you try.”

The FIRST Tech Challenge serves as the

qualifying platform for the Cayman Islands National Robotics Team, which competes annually at the international FIRST Global Challenge. The 2026 national team members, who will be selected for the international competition in South Korea, will be announced in the coming weeks.
