ENT in Cayman Performs First Cochlear Implant

New Beach Signage Installed at Smith Barcadere Promotes Safe and Respectful Public Beach Use

New public beach signage has been installed at Smith Barcadere marking the first phase of a wider Public Beach Signage Project. The initiative is being spearheaded by the Product Development Unit within the Cayman Islands Department of Tourism (CIDOT) and forms part of a broader effort to enhance the experience, safety, and environmental stewardship of the islands' beaches.

The newly installed sign is the first of fourteen planned installations across Grand Cayman and the Sister Islands. Additional signage will be rolled out at other identified locations as planning approvals are finalised.

The double-sided, vibrantly coloured sign has been designed for maximum



visibility. It serves both as a welcoming feature and as an important reminder of the standards of behaviour expected from beachgoers. Key messages include main-

taining respect for others, ensuring a safe and enjoyable environment, and adhering to regulations such as no littering, no loud music, no unauthorised commercial activity, and keeping pets under proper control.

Hon. Gary Ruty, Minister of Tourism and Trade Development commented "Smith Barcadere is one of our most cherished public beaches, and this project reflects my commitment to ensuring it remains clean and welcoming for everyone to enjoy.

As visitor numbers grow and our local communities continue to enjoy the area, it is essential that responsible use is promoted. By clearly communicating expectations in a visually engaging way, we aim to foster a culture of respect, safety, and environmental responsibility across all of our public beaches."

Mrs. Rosa Harris, Director of Tourism added "Providing helpful information is always a good proactive approach for terrestrial destination management. Signs provide context of the location being patronised, relevant protocols as well as celebrating the significance of the area. The signage initiative represents an important step towards enhancing the quality and enjoyment of our coastal spaces and shaping positive behaviours to elevate the overall beach experience."

Government Gazettes Parliament (Management) Amendment Bill 2026

The Cayman Islands Government has gazetted the Parliament (Management) Amendment Bill 2026 which aims to strengthen parliamentary democracy and modernise government institutions by making better provision for Opposition

leadership and constituency offices.

Recognising the essential role that Opposition has in a democracy in holding Government to account and offering alternative perspectives, the Bill provides for an office and adequate staffing for the Leader

of the Opposition to fulfill their constitutional function in the rapid-paced political environment of the twenty-first century.

Premier André Ebanks said the Bill seeks to strengthen parliamentary democracy. "An effective Opposition benefits us all, as it improves policymaking and ensures broader representation of the population in the legislative process. The NCFC administration is committed modernising systems and structures across government as the volume and complexity of the work handled by MPs continues to widen."

The Bill also enhances resources available to all 19 constituency offices which provide an essential link between elected politicians and the citizens they represent. Constituency office staff are responsible for handling a plethora of local cases, from individuals in need of a range of support. The Bill provides an option to upgrade the role and salary of constituency assistant to constituency manager and modestly increases the monthly constituency allowance from \$5,000 to \$6,500 per month to take account of increased costs such as rent, utilities, and other office-related expenses.

"Enhancing resources for constituency offices reflects the value that the NCFC government places on constituency work, which is a crucial component of parliamentary work and our community relations," said Ebanks. "Furthermore, with

the aim of attracting more young people and women to electoral politics, upgrading resources can help attract strong talent and makes a decision to enter parliamentarian service more palatable."

The Parliament (Management) Amendment Bill 2026 was gazetted on 31 March with amendments deemed to have come into effect on 1 January 2026. The original Parliament Management Act 2020 established the Parliament Management Commission as the semi-autonomous entity responsible for the administration of Parliament including budget and resourcing for elected officials. The Act was amended in 2022 to provide for constituency assistants for every Member of Parliament.

Historic Home receives New 'Lease' on Life

A multi-agency effort to move a historic house from the centre of George Town to Bobby Thompson Way was executed in the early hours of Sunday, 5th April.

The National Trust for the Cayman Islands (NTCI), along with the Ministry of Youth, Sports and Culture, Caribbean Utilities Company (CUC), Flow, The National Roads Authority (NRA), One GT, and the Royal Cayman Islands Police (RCIPS) coordinated the move which was done during the Easter Holiday to avoid major disruption to the public.

The prep work, planning and execution of the move were facilitated by contractor Miguel Brown of Cayman Docks and Decks.

Known as the Louise Llewellyn House, the structure was built by Gifford Anderson in 1875 and has stood in George Town as a prominent representation of Caymanian architectural culture and heritage for over 150 years. It was the residence of Mrs. Louise Llewellyn, who the street connecting Elgin Avenue to Goring Avenue was named after (Louise Llewellyn Way).

Many in the George Town community remember Mrs. Louise Llewellyn as an active participant in the community, who could be seen on her porch or in the yard waving at motorists and pedestrians.

The home was also known as one of the boarding houses in George Town, which was a place where visitant sea-men, Pastors and missionaries may have stayed during their time in Grand Cayman.

During recent years, the land the house sits on had been sold to the developers of the One GT residential project in the area and the area is slated to be used as a car park going forward. As a result, the house was in imminent danger of being demolished.

However, the developers at One GT were conscious of the historical significance of the home and made efforts through their real estate agent to contact the National Trust to see if a deal could be brokered with a private/public entity to take the house and move it to a location where it could be saved and enjoyed by present and future generations.

Upon learning of the opportunity to save the house, the National Trust began seeking to broker a deal to save the home via various internal and external channels, as the organisation has assisted in several rescues of traditional Caymanian homes over the years and has come to be sought out for its efforts and expertise in that regard.

Historic Programmes Manager for the National Trust, Stuart Wilson led much of the negotiations with the Ministry of Culture, who stepped up to take the house and also provided a place for it to be placed.

Funds for the move were provided by both One GT and the Ministry of Youth, Sports and Culture.

"This was a team effort and the Ministry of Youth Sports and Culture and One GT really came through to make this exercise a reality. We also had the assistance of several partner agencies in the effort, in what has become a great private and public partnership to save these homes", noted Mr. Wilson.

A similar multi-agency approach was used to save other homes by the National Trust such as the 'Herbert Parsons' House' on Boggy Sand Road to Old Prospect Road in 2024, and the Nixon House from Goring Avenue to the Mission House grounds in Bodden Town.

After receiving a new lease on life, the Louise Llewellyn House will now undergo restoration work to beautify it for passing motorists. This will be undertaken by the Ministry of Planning, Lands, Agriculture, Housing & Infrastructure.

It is situated in an area on the roundabout where cars are not obstructed and there is no impediment or disruption to the vision of motorists, according to government officials.

"We are happy to be working with the National Trust for the Cayman Islands in this effort to save this historic house and to preserve this structure to be enjoyed for many years to come. It is important to safeguard our heritage and have rep-

resentations of what Caymanian architecture was like in those early days," noted Ministry of Youth, Sports and Culture representative, Ms. Tunisia Barnes.

Mr. Wilson added that traditional Caymanian homes are just as endangered as the Blue Iguana, the Brown Bat, the Cayman Boa and other endemic species, due to the fact that the materials used to build the houses from that time can no longer be sourced such as the endemic ironwood that is used for the columns and stilts, or the coral used in the wattle and daub process that can no longer be harvested.

"These homes are traditional in every sense and will likely never be seen in this exact form ever again," noted Mr. Wilson, who explained that though this was the case, there are other methods of wattle and daub that may be used to at least create the aesthetic of the old traditional Caymanian home.

The National Trust for the Cayman Islands is currently building a replica of the home of prominent builder Roland Bodden at the organisation's Blue Iguana Conservation facility and officials for the NTCI explained that it is possible for persons to build replicas and receive Planning permission should they wish to do so.

George Dixon Park Redevelopment Enters Final Phase

UK OVERSEAS TERRITORIES CONSIDERING FULL CARICOM STATUS

Several of the UK Overseas Territories in the region are moving to deepen their relations with the grouping of Caribbean states called CARICOM (Caribbean Community).

Bermuda, the British Virgin Islands, and the Turks and Caicos Islands have announced their intention to further their involvement with the regional integration movement.

The Bermuda government has now circulated a 63-page consultation paper among its citizens to get their feedback on whether the territory should seek full CARICOM membership.

The territory is an Associate Member of the group along with the other UK OTs - Anguilla, BVI, Cayman Islands, and Turks and Caicos Islands. Montserrat is the only UK OT that's a full CARICOM member.

For its full membership bid now under consideration, Bermuda is seeking special derogations from CARICOM where it says "participation is not possible under our constitutional framework".

The territory has already received a 'letter of entrustment' from the UK, which clears the way for it to proceed with its request. However, there will be limitations to its involvement in CARICOM, especially on matters pertaining to foreign relations, which remain the remit of the UK.

Meanwhile, the British Virgin Islands is also accelerating its bid for full CARICOM membership, but with a specific opt-out.



The BVI, currently an associate member of the grouping, says it will not sign on to the free movement component of the CARICOM treaty, which falls under the Single Market and Economy (CSME). The territory, which is also seeking full membership of the sub-regional Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS), cites concerns over immigration control as a key factor.

Similar concerns about free movement have been expressed by the Turks and Caicos Islands in its wish to also become a full CARICOM member.

The territory is in the process of setting up a special committee to oversee local consultations and guide the negotiations with the CARICOM Secretariat. It's aiming to have a formal presentation at the next CARICOM Heads of Government Summits in July.

As with the other UK Overseas Territories, any agreement for full CARICOM membership must be approved by the British government, which retains responsibility for external affairs, defence and security.

While no formal steps have yet been taken in that regard, Anguilla which is also a CARICOM associate member, has not completely ruled out eventually seeking full membership.

For the Cayman Islands, there has also been no formal indication of full CARICOM membership being placed on the priority agenda any time soon.

However, all CARICOM member states - full and associate members - collaborate in a range of areas, including disaster preparedness and response, sharing public administration resources and expertise, and trade.

CARICOM, which started out as a grouping of former English-speaking Caribbean countries, has recently seen its base broaden with the inclusion of French and Dutch territories in the Caribbean.

Montserrat is presently the only UK Overseas Territory that has full membership status in the 15-member bloc. It became a full member in 1974, one year after the original Treaty of Chaguaramas was signed by 11 independent Caribbean countries.

On its website, the CARICOM Secretariat notes that in July 1991, the British Virgin Islands and the Turks and Caicos became Associated Members of CARICOM, followed by Anguilla in July 1999. The Cayman Islands became the fourth Associate Member of the regional grouping on 16 May 2002, and Bermuda the fifth Associate Member on 2 July 2003.

National Weather Service Reps Attend Hurricane Conference

Three members of the Cayman Islands National Weather Service (CINWS) are currently attending the National Hurricane Conference in Orlando, Florida from 30 March to 2 April. Allan Ebanks and Benjamin Harding, Meteorological Forecasters and Dwayne Leslie, Aeronautical Meteorological Observer, joined regional and international partners in discussions to strengthen hurricane preparedness, response and public communication ahead of the 2026 Atlantic Hurricane Season, which begins 1 June.

The annual conference serves as a leading forum for education and professional training in hurricane and disaster preparedness. It brings together senior government officials, disaster management professionals, meteorologists, communicators and policymakers from the United States and Caribbean region to share best practices, enhance coordination and explore emerging approaches to forecasting, early warning systems and disaster response.

Through workshops, technical sessions and panel discussions, the team is deepening their expertise in forecasting advancements, risk communication and inter-agency coordination. This participation supports the CINWS' ongoing efforts to strengthen national early warning systems and ensure the delivery of clear, timely and actionable information to the public.

In highlighting the importance of attending the conference, Acting Director General of the Cayman Islands National Weather Service, Kerry Powery, said, "As a hurricane-prone jurisdiction, it is essential that we remain connected to the latest developments in forecasting, communications and emergency coordination. Op-

portunities such as the National Hurricane Conference allow us to learn from global partners, strengthen our capabilities and ensure that the information we provide to the public continues to support informed decision-making and community safety. This ongoing engagement is key to maintaining high standards of operational

readiness and professional development."

The conference also provides a platform for strengthening collaboration between agencies responsible for disaster preparedness and response, ensuring that the Cayman Islands remains aligned with international best practices and evolving standards in meteorological services and hazard management. Insights gained will inform ongoing work across government to enhance resilience, preparedness and public safety, particularly as the Islands continue to advance efforts under the National Hurricane Plan and wider disaster risk reduction initiatives.

Acting Director of Hazard Management Cayman Islands, Mark Codling, said, "The National Hurricane Conference brings together experts across the full spectrum of agencies involved in hurricane preparedness and response. That level of collaboration is critical, as effective preparedness depends on strong coordination, shared knowledge and a continuous commitment to improving how we support communities in the Cayman Islands. Strengthening these partnerships remains central to how we enhance resilience and readiness across our Islands."

X marks the Spot – The Privy Council confirms protectors may have a substantive fiduciary role – The ‘X Trusts’ case

On 19 March 2026, the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council delivered its judgment in *A and Ors (Appellants) v C and others (Respondents)* [2026] UKPC 11, overturning the Bermuda Court of Appeal and holding that the protectors of the X Trusts had the “wider” role, rather than a narrow supervisory one.

The decision has been closely watched by trust practitioners globally as it resolves a long-running uncertainty, namely, where a trust instrument requires protector consent as a condition to exercise a trustee power but the trust instrument is silent on how such consent is to be exercised, is the protector (a) confined to reviewing the rationality and legality of the trustees’ proposed decision, or (b) may the protector exercise an independent judgment on the merits?

The Privy Council has now made clear that, absent express language imposing narrower constraints in the trust instrument, the protector is not limited to acting as a mere watchdog. A protector may instead have a substantive fiduciary role to play and may withhold consent based on its own independent assessment of the merits of any trustee proposal.

Key takeaways

The decision suggests that where a trust instrument does not expressly limit the protector’s role, a fiduciary protector’s consent power will usually (subject to the terms of the trust instrument) be interpreted as a wider one. The court will not rush in to fill drafting silence with an implied narrow duty.

For existing trusts, trustee and protector provisions should be reviewed carefully. For new trusts, drafting should expressly state whether the protector is intended to have a narrow supervisory role or a wider fiduciary one.

Action points

For trustees

- Review the protector consent provisions in existing trust instruments to try

to identify whether such powers are of a ‘narrow’ or ‘wide’ variety.

- If the protector powers in the trust instruments are silent or unclear, consider implementing clarifying amendments where possible.

- If the protector powers are silent or unclear, assume they are of the ‘wide’ variety.

- Keep a clear record of all protector interactions.

For protectors

- Ascertain whether the protector powers are of the ‘narrow’ or ‘wide’ variety and carry out your duties accordingly.

- If the powers are silent or unclear, consider implementing clarifying amendments to the trust instrument wherever possible in concert with the trustee.

- If the powers are silent or unclear assume they are of the ‘wide’ variety.

- Keep a clear record of trustee interactions.

For settlors

- Ensure the powers vested in protectors clearly indicate whether they are of the ‘wide’ or ‘narrow’ variety.

- Ensure there are deadlock-provisions in the trust instrument in the event a protector and a trustee cannot find common ground on any proposed course of action.

- Ensure any proposed protector fully understands the nature of their role, the expected duties, as well as their fiduciary

responsibilities if their powers vested in them are of the ‘wide’ variety.

The facts and procedural history

In 2017, the trustees of the X Trusts developed proposals concerning the future of the trusts. Certain aspects of these proposals necessitated protector consent. After consultation, the protectors took the view that the proposals were unlikely to serve the beneficiaries’ best interests, and withheld consent. They approached the matter on the basis that their duty was of the wider variety and not a mere ‘rubber stamp’.

In June 2020, the Bermuda-based trustees applied to the Supreme Court of Bermuda for the court’s blessing of their preliminary proposals under the *Public Trustee v Cooper* route. One branch of beneficiaries and the protectors opposed the application, arguing that if protector consent was unlikely, further expense would be unjustified.

The trustees then sought declarations from the Supreme Court of Bermuda as to the basis on which the protectors could withhold consent, and specifically whether the protectors’ function was narrow or wider. One beneficiary branch argued for the narrow role and another for the wider role; the trustees and protectors remained neutral. On 22 November 2021, the Supreme Court of Bermuda held that the protectors had only a narrow role. That conclusion was upheld by the Bermuda Court of Appeal in February 2023.

In doing so, the Court of Appeal declined to follow the Jersey Royal Court’s reasoning in *In the matter of Piedmont Trust & Riviera Trust* [2021] JRC 248, where materially similar trust wording had been interpreted as conferring a wider role on the protector.

The Privy Council’s reasoning

The Privy Council rejected the framing of the issue as a simple binary choice between two default models. Instead, it held that the correct question was what constraints, if any, the trust instrument actually imposed on the protector, read in context and together with the general law.

That approach mattered. The trust deeds conferred clearly defined powers on the protectors, but were silent as to how those powers should be exercised. The Privy Council held that this silence did not justify implying a narrow restriction. On the contrary, where a settlor has deliberately created fiduciary offices and specified powers without prescribing a detailed decision-making standard, that gap may well be intentional.

Relying on principles approved in *Attorney General of Belize v Belize Telecom Ltd.* [2009] UKPC 10, the Privy Council held that if the settlor had intended something further to happen, the instrument would ordinarily have said so. An apparent gap may therefore be a deliberate gap, reflecting a choice to trust the good sense of fiduciaries rather than constrain them with detailed rules.

The Privy Council found nothing in the X Trusts’ deeds that supported the narrow role. By contrast, several features supported the wider role.

First, the deeds permitted the protector powers to be released or waived. That was difficult to reconcile with the suggestion that the protectors were simply there to police legality. As the Privy Council noted, it would be unusual to permit a “watchdog” to abdicate that function permanently.

Secondly, where there was more than one protector, unanimous consent was required; failing unanimity, the trustees could proceed without protector consent so long as they consulted the protectors and took their views into account. The Privy Council considered that structure consistent with protectors having an independent evaluative role. It made little sense if a protector’s task were merely to identify unlawfulness.

Thirdly, consent was required only for a limited category of especially important acts, including appointments of capital and dealings with specified securities. That selective allocation of consent rights strongly suggested that the settlor intended the protectors to exercise real judgment in relation to major decisions.

The Privy Council also emphasised that fiduciary status does not itself narrow the protector’s function. A fiduciary protector must avoid conflicts and exercise powers for proper purposes, but those duties are entirely consistent with a wider role.

Deadlock and practical significance

The Bermuda Court of Appeal had been concerned that a wider role risked duplication and deadlock. The Privy Council rejected that as a reason to prefer the narrow interpretation. The very purpose of a protector with meaningful consent rights may be to stop a major transaction that the protector considers inappropriate. The possibility of deadlock was therefore contemplated.

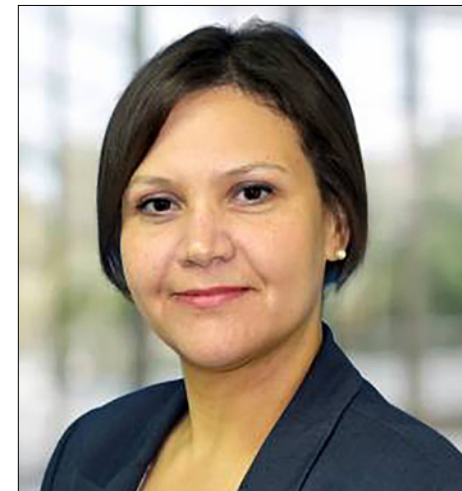

and satisfaction with the care received, highlighting the profound impact of having this service available locally.

The activation was led by audiologist Niamh Kilcoyne, with clinical support from Uta Stewart of MED-EL, Toronto, a global leader in hearing implant technology.

A cochlear implant is a sophisticated medical device designed for individuals with severe to profound hearing loss who receive limited benefit from conventional hearing aids. Unlike hearing aids, which amplify sound, cochlear implants bypass damaged portions of the inner ear and directly stimulate the auditory nerve, enabling patients to perceive sound more effectively.

"This milestone represents a meaningful step forward in expanding access to advanced ENT and audiology services within the Cayman Islands," said Dr Ulrich Ecke, ENT Specialist and Head of ENT in Cayman. "Cochlear implantation has the potential to significantly improve
